QUICK NOTES

- Coastal Carolina enters the match ranked in three national preseason polls, including a high of 18th by TopDrawerSoccer.com.
- The Chanticleers won both their preseason exhibition games -- a 6-1 victory against NC State and 2-0 decision at Wofford.
- Coastal was selected as the preseason favorite to win the Sun Belt Conference in the program's first season as a member of the league. Coastal won 12 regular season and 12 tournament titles during its 32 seasons in the Big South Conference.
- Junior forward Frantzyd Pierrot was voted the Sun Belt Preseason Co-Offensive Player of the Year alongside Hartwick's Jamie O'Grady. Moreover, Chanticleers Elis Bjornsson, Louis Dargent and Einar Einarsson joined Pierrot as preseason all-conference selections.
- 2016 marks the fifth consecutive season the Chanticleers start a campaign ranked in a national top-25 poll. Coastal closed the 2015 season ranked 20th by the NSCAA with a 13-3-4 record after advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

The Chanticleer (SHON-ti-clear) gives Coastal Carolina University one of the most unique nicknames in all of sports. Chanticleer comes from Chaucer's Canterbury Tales and came to Coastal Carolina University when the University was a member of the University of South Carolina system.

A Chanticleer is a rooster who rules the barnyard with cunning and wit. His competitiveness never wanes as he battles to the end, using his brains to come out on top every time.



COASTAL CAROLINA UNIVERSITY JOINS SUN BELT IN 2016

- Coastal Carolina University President David A. DeCenzo announced on Sept. 1, 2015 that the CCU Chanticleers athletic programs will join the Sun Belt Conference effective July 1, 2016.
- The Sun Belt Conference, headquartered in New Orleans, La., was established in 1976 and began sponsoring football in 2001 as a member of the FBS. In addition to football, the Sun Belt Conference sponsors baseball, men's basketball, women's basketball, men's cross country, women's cross country, men's golf, women's golf, men's soccer, women's soccer, softball, men's indoor track & field, women's track & field, men's outdoor track & field, women's outdoor track & field, men's tennis, women's tennis and women's volleyball.
- The Sun Belt Conference has earned ties to seven bowl games since its football beginnings 15 years ago. No football conference in history has ever boasted as many bowl relationships in its first two decades of existence. A worthy football team in the Sun Belt can be in the national championship picture, and the league is a permanent part of the "Group of Five" that will send its highest-rated champion to a premier bowl game.
- CCU sports began competing in Sun Belt conference play as of July 1, 2016, with the exception of the football program, which will transition to its first year of full FBS status in 2018. During the transition, CCU will compete as a Sun Belt member in 2017 and have the opportunity to compete for the conference football championship, but will not be eligible to participate in the postseason.
- Coastal Carolina is the 12th member of the Sun Belt Conference, joining Appalachian State University, Georgia State University, Georgia Southern University, Troy University, University of South Alabama, Arkansas State University, University of Arkansas at Little Rock, University of Louisiana at Monroe, University of Louisiana at Lafayette, University of Texas at Arlington and Texas State University.

- Docking enters the 2016 season as the 21st winningest active coach in the NCAA by percentage (.665) and 32nd by total victories (262).
- Seven-time Big South Coach of the Year (six at Coastal Carolina).
- 12 NCAA Tournament Appearances (11 at Coastal Carolina).
- Docking has directed Coastal to nine Big South regular season championships and seven Big South tournament championships.
- In Docking's 19 years at Coastal Carolina he has coached 14 Big South Players of the Year.
- Directed Coastal to a NCAA-high 16 wins in 2014.
- Docking has led Coastal to three undefeated Big South Conference seasons (6-0 in 2007, 9-0 in 2011 and 10-0 in 2012).
- Docking has coached a total of 102 All-Big South Conference selections, including 63 first team honorees. In addition, Docking has produced 33 NSCAA All-Region selections and eight of Coastal's nine NSCAA All-Americans.
- Docking won his 250th career game with a 2-0 victory over Old Dominion on Aug. 28, 2015. Of those 250 wins, 230 came at the helm of the Chanticleers.
- Docking has sent eight player on to Major League Soccer, including 2003 MLS SuperDraft No. 3 overall selection Joseph Ngwenya and 2014 15th overall selection Pedro Ribeiro.

NOTES

THE COASTAL VS. VIRGINIA SERIES ALL-TIME SERIES

- The Chanticleers and Cavaliers have met once before in men's soccer with Virginia claiming a 3-2 home win on Sept. 2, 1987.
- The last Coastal program to play Virginia was Chanticleer baseball on Feb. 21, 2016. The Chants upset the 2016 College World Series champions 5-4. Coastal went on to finish the season 55-18 and claim the 2016 College World Series title.

PRESEASON RANKED

- Coastal enters the 2016 campaign ranked 21st in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) preseason top 25 poll, the official poll recognized by the NCAA. The Chants are also ranked 18th by TopDrawerSoccer.com and 29th by College Soccer News. Coastal finished the 2015 campaign with the NSCAA's No. 20 ranking.
- This marks the fifth consecutive season the Chanticleers have started the season ranked among the NSCAA's top 25. Coastal checked in at No. 17 to start the 2012 season, No. 13 in 2013 and No. 18 in 2014 and No. 21 in 2015.
- The Chanticleers have been ranked in at least one national poll in 47 of the past 55 ranking periods dating back to the 2012 season.

STARTERS

- Friday's match will mark the start of the 37th season of Coastal Carolina soccer. The Chanticleers own an all-time record of 440-236-49 (.641) since 1978. The .641 winning percentage ranks as the 24th-best in NCAA Division I.
- This will be Coastal's fourth straight season opening on the road at an opponent ranked in the top 25. The Chants traveled to and knocked off No. 17 Wake Forest 1-0 in 2013 and shocked No. 8 UConn by a 3-2 score in 2014 and defeated No. 22 Old Dominion 2-0 in 2015.
- The Chants are 10-7-1 in head coach Shaun Docking's 18 season openers.

ANOTHER TOUGH NONCONFERENCE SCHEDULE

- Coach Docking has again set up a tough nonconference schedule for his squad in 2016. In addition to opening the season at No. 17 Virginia, the Chants also face No. 3 Clemson, No. 16 UCLA, No. 22 Charlotte and No. 24 South Carolina. Coastal's other nonconference opponents include William & Mary, (rv) VCU, UAB, UNC Greensboro, (rv) Radford, College of Charleston and Old Dominion.

ABOUT THE CHANTICLEERS

- The Chants return five starters and 10 letter winners from the 2015 team that won an NCAA Tournament game for the fifth straight season.
- In all, the 2015 Chanticleers posted a mark of 13-3-4. The Chants ended the year ranked 20th in the final NSCAA poll.
- Headlining the list of returnees this fall is are starting midfielders Louis Dargent and Jair Espinoza along with starting defenders Elis Bjornsson Einarsson and Miguel Gutierrez.
- Other key returners include senior defender Ryan Reid along with junior Martin Melchor (MF) and sophomore Ryan Willoughby (MF).
- Coastal welcomes in a recruiting class of 19 for the 2015 campaign. The class includes Division I transfers Frantzy Piorrot (Northeastern), Adrian Welch (St. John's), David Raizes (UCF), Brennan Koslow (Niagara), Michael Peprah (West Virginia) and Wes White (UMKC) along with Alexandre Bouillennec from Division II Saginaw Valley State.



THE PERENNIAL WINNER

- Over the past five seasons no program in the nation has won more than head coach Shaun Docking and his Chanticleers
- Since the 2011 season, Coastal has amassed a 86-21-7 overall record to lead the NCAA in both overall wins and winning percentage (.785). During that time the Chanticleers have averaged 17.2 wins per season, including a 20-win season in 2012.
- Coastal has appeared in the NCAA Tournament in each of the last six seasons, including back-to-back trips to the Tournament's third round of play in 2012 and 2013.
- The Chants have won at least one match in each of the last five NCAA Tournaments.
- In addition, since the 2011 season, the Chanticleers have dominated the Big South Conference to the tune of a 41-3-3 record.

PRODUCING PROFESSIONALS

- Under the direction of Coach Docking, Coastal Carolina has produced its fair share of professionals playing in the MLS and USL. Most recently Coastal fostered MLS talents in Orlando City SC forward Pedro Ribeiro and New York Red Bulls defender Shawn McLaws. In addition, 2013 graduate Justin Portillo and 2014 graduate Ricky Garbanzo are enjoying successful careers with the Charleston Battery of the USL. Also flourishing in the USL is 2015 graduate Uchenna Uzo with Arizona United SC.

SCORING GOALS

- Scoring goals is something the Chanticleers have been exceedingly good at in recent years, piling up 257 counters since the 2011 season. The Chants led the nation with 66 goals in 2011 and finished second for the ensuing three seasons (63 in 2012, 47 in 2013 and 48 in 2014) before slipping to 35th with 33 scoring strikes in 2015.

AND DEFENDING

- Scoring against the Chants has been a difficult task over the past several years. The Coastal backline and goalkeeper have combined to post 31 shutouts over the last three seasons, helping the Chants ranks 10th (2013), 11th (2014) and 12th (2015) in the NCAA in shutout percentage.
