### 1/1 CONNECTICUT (2-0) AT HOLY CROSS (2-1)

### UConn Closes Out Mini Roadtrip

**AT HOLY CROSS:** No. 1/1 Connecticut will look to push its record to a perfect 3-0 when it travels to Worcester, Mass., to take on Patriot League member Holy Cross in a 7:00 p.m. (ET) tip on Friday night at the DCU Center.

Friday night's clash will be televised live on CPTV and will mark the Huskies first visit to Worcester since Dec. 4, 2006 - when Connecticut walked away with a 83-64 victory.

**UConn will enjoy six days off following Friday's game before playing three games in three days beginning Friday, Nov. 27 vs. Hofstra as part of the 2009 WBCA Classic, which will be held at Gampel Pavilion in Storrs.**

The Huskies will face Richmond on Sat., Nov. 28 before closing out the three-day spurt with a meeting against Clemson on Sunday, Nov. 29 at 4:30 p.m. (ET).

**All three of UConn's games at the 2009 WBCA Classic will be televised live on CPTV.**

**HUSKIES IN ROAD OPENERS:** Friday's game against Holy Cross in Worcester will mark UConn's first "true" road game this season.

UConn boasts a 26-9 record in its first game away from home of the season.

The Huskies last "true" road loss to open a season came back on Dec. 5, 1992 - a 75-54 loss to Kentucky in Lexington.

**UConn has won its last 16 "true" road openers entering Friday's meeting with Holy Cross.**

**ROAD SAVVY:** The Huskies are 87-9 on the road since Feb. 1, 2001.

**The Huskies have not lost back-to-back road games since the 1992-93 season when it lost at Miami (2/14) and Pittsburgh (2/24).**

**UConn AS NO. 1:** UConn enters the 2009 NCAA Final Four 234-11 (.955) all-time when playing as the nation's No. 1 ranked team in the Associated Press Top 25.

**The Huskies most recent loss when ranked No. 1 came on April 6, 2008 vs. Stanford.**

**HUSKIES IN NOVEMBER:** The Huskies own an all-time mark of 87-14 (.860) in games played in the month of November.

The last time UConn dropped a game in the 11th month came on Nov. 21, 2004 at the Jimmy V Classic, when the Huskies fell 71-65 to North Carolina.

**UConn has won 22 consecutive games in the month of November.**

**ALL-TIME VS. HOLY CROSS:** Friday's game between UConn and Holy Cross will mark the 20th all-time meeting between the programs in the sport of women's basketball.

The Huskies own an all-time lead of 17-2 in the series with the Crusaders and have won the last 16 meetings by an average of 27.9 ppg.

**UConn's last loss vs. Holy Cross came on Dec. 4, 1986 by a 65-49 margin in Worcester.**

**ALL-TIME VS. PATRIOT LEAGUE:** Friday's game vs. Holy Cross will represent UConn's 32nd all-time against a member of the Patriot League.

The Huskies own an all-time mark of **28-3** against Patriot League opponents with the last loss coming on Dec. 4, 1986 vs. Holy Cross.

*Connecticut has won its last 27 games against Patriot League opponents, entering Friday's meeting with Holy Cross, dating back to the 1986 loss to the Crusaders.*

**THE MARGIN OF VICTORY:** UConn enters Friday's game vs. Holy Cross having won its first two games by an average margin of **47.5** points.

*The Huskies have posted one win by 70 points and one by 25 points in its initial two games in 2009-10.*

**BALANCED SCORING:** UConn has seen each of its five starters register double-figure points in each of its opening two games.

**HUSKIES AT 3-0:** Connecticut will be seeking to open the season **3-0** for the **fifth** straight time and the **13th** time in the last **14** seasons overall.

*The lone exception was in 2004-05, when the Huskies dropped a 71-65 decision vs. North Carolina in Raleigh.*

**CO-CAPTAINS NAMED:** Senior **Tina Charles** and junior **Maya Moore** have been named as the Huskies co-captains for the 2009-10 season.

*Moore is serving as a captain for the second consecutive season, while Charles was elected for the first time in her career.*

**THREE HUSKIES NAMED TO NAISMITH WATCH LIST:** Connecticut junior **Maya Moore** seeks to become the first player ever to win two Naismith trophies in high school and college as the forward headlines the 2009-10 preseason watch list presented by the Atlanta Tipoff Club.

Moore won the Naismith National High School Girl's Player of the Year award in both 2006 and 2007 at Collins Hill High School in Suwanee, Ga., and claimed the college award this past March.

*Moore is joined on the list by teammates senior center Tina Charles and sophomore guard Tiffany Hayes.*

The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2009-10 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2010 NCAA Women's Final Four in San Antonio, Texas.

In late February, the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors will compile a mid-season team of the top 30 players in the nation. Then in March, the Naismith Trophy voting academy will vote to narrow the list to the four finalists.

*Others to accomplish the dual-level feat of winning both a high school and college Naismith Trophy include Connecticut's Diana Taurasi (2000 in high school; and both 2003 and 2004 in college), Tennessee's Tamika Catchings (1997, 1998; 2000), Candace Parker (2003 and 2004; 2008) and Chamique Holdscraw (1995; 1998 and 1999) and USC's Lisa Leslie (1990; 1994).*

**HUSKIES ON THE DEUCE:** The Huskies own an **40-10** record on the "Deuce" since **2001-02** and own a **1-0** mark on the network in **2009-10** following its Nov. 17 win over Texas.

**HUSKIES ON NATIONAL TV:** UConn is **84-18** in nationally televised contests since 2001-02, including an **1-0** mark in **2009-10**.

**ALL-TIME VS. RANKED FOES:** Connecticut has an all-time record of **142-53 (.728)** versus Top-25 AP ranked teams.

UConn is **31-20** all-time on the road against ranked opponents and **9-6** in road games against ranked teams since 2004-05.

UConn is **65-36 (.644)** all-time vs. opponents ranked in the AP Top-10.

**The Huskies are 1-0 against ranked opponents in 2009-10.**

**UCONN IN SEASON OPENERS:** The Huskies are **27-8** all-time in regular season openers entering following their Nov. 14 Northeastern and own a **21-4** mark in such games since Geno Auriemma took over the program's reigns in 1985-86.

**UConn is a solid 18-2 in season openers dating back to 1990-91 and owns a 14-game winning streak in season openers.**

**The Huskies last loss in an opener came on Nov. 19, 1995 - an 83-81 setback vs. Louisiana Tech.**

**UCONN IN HOME OPENERS:** The Huskies always are comfortable in their home base - especially in their first appearance in front of the home folks, as they have compiled an impressive **31-5** all-time mark in home openers following its Nov. 14 win over Northeastern.

**UConn is 24-1 in home openers under head coach Geno Auriemma.**

The Huskies only loss under Auriemma in a home opener came on Nov. 29, 1990 - a 17-point loss vs. Iowa (58-41).

**Connecticut has won its last 19 home openers.**

**BANNER TIME:** Prior to the start of the 2009-10 season opener on Saturday, Nov. 14 vs. Northeastern at Gampel Pavilion, the Huskies were honored for their 2009 NCAA National Championship with the unveiling of the banner commemorating the Huskies sixth NCAA National Championship.

**40 IN A ROW AT HOME:** Connecticut has won **40** consecutive regular-season home games - **the nation's longest active streak.**

UConn's last home loss during the regular season came at the hands of a 70-64 loss vs. Tennessee on Jan. 6, 2007.

**VS. NON-CONFERENCE AT HOME:** Connecticut has won **16** consecutive regular season home games against non-conference opponents dating back to a Jan. 6, 2007 loss to Tennessee.

**CHARLES HITS 1,000 BOARDS:** Senior center Tina Charles became just **the third player in UConn history to reach 1,000 career boards** in the Huskies' Nov. 14 win over Northeastern.

**Charles (1,019) currently ranks third overall among the Huskies all-time rebounding leaders, just 30 behind Janelle Elliott's second-place total and 247 behind Rebecca Lobo's (1,268) school-record total.**

The University of Connecticut women's basketball team, which swept the 2008-09 BIG EAST regular season and tournament titles en route to the program's sixth NCAA National Championship, has been selected as the favorites to win the 2009-10 BIG EAST women's basketball regular season title by a tally of the league's 16 head coaches, which was announced at the league's annual media day at ESPN Zone in New York City's Time Square.

In the 28 years of BIG EAST women's basketball, Connecticut has been crowned the regular-season champion 17 times, has won 15 league tournament titles and has captured both titles in the same year in 13 seasons.

*Connecticut earned 15 first-place votes for a total of 225 points in the poll.* The Huskies went 16-0 in league play a year ago, finished the season with a [perfect 39-0 overall record, earned a berth to the NCAA Championship for the 21st straight year and advanced to their 10th Final Four. UConn returns four of its five starters from last year's NCAA National Championship Team, and lost just three letterwinners from that squad.

**BIG EAST EXTENDS TOURNAMENT AGREEMENT WITH HARTFORD:** The 2010 BIG EAST Women's Basketball Championship will return to the XL Center in Hartford, Conn. for the **seventh straight year.**

The 2010 championship will be held **March 5-9** with five full days of action and 15 games. The BIG EAST's teams will battle for the conference tournament title and one will earn the league's automatic bid to the 64-team NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship.

"We are extremely pleased to have the BIG EAST Women's Basketball Championship remain in Hartford for another two years," said Tranchese "We believe we have one of the premier women's basketball championships in the nation in terms of competitiveness and attendance. Further, we are excited to continue to showcase our nationally recognized programs in a public arena that resides in the heart of a city that supports collegiate women's basketball with such enthusiasm."

**HUSKIES + BIG EAST = 32 TITLES:** Connecticut has amassed an astounding **32 BIG EAST titles** in the program's history following its sweep of both the league regular season and tournament titles in 2009 - **marking the second straight season and the 13th time in the program's history that the Huskies have pulled off the double.**

The Huskies followed a **16-0** regular season conference mark (**17th title**) by winning **three straight** over South Florida, Villanova and Louisville by an average of **35.3** ppg to claim their **15th** BIG EAST Tournament championship.

**BIG EAST DOMINANCE:** The Huskies boast an overall record of 347-84 (.806) in regular season BIG EAST play - and have won either the BIG EAST Regular Season or Tournament title in each of the past 16 seasons - including the 2007-08 BIG EAST Regular Season and Tournament Titles - overall the Huskies have garnered a total of 31 BIG EAST Championships (17 regular season, 14 tournament).

During UConn's amazing run of 11 consecutive BIG EAST regular season titles (1994-2004), the Huskies owned a sterling record of 181-7 (.963).

The Huskies notched their seventh undefeated season in BIG EAST games in 2008-09 - the most of any other team in the league.

UConn had dropped its last four games on the network, dating back to a 68-67 loss vs. Duke at the Hartford Civic Center on Jan. 3, 2004, prior to its 100-50 win at Purdue on Jan. 6, 2008.

He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year for the eighth time in 2008-09, and was recognized as the 2009 WBCA and USBW National Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

Overall in his career, Auriemma has received a total of 22 national coach of the year honors.



LAST TIME VS. HOLY CROSS

STORRS, Conn. (December 3, 2008) – The No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team went on a 32-0 run and held Holy Cross without a field goal for a span of 16:13 en route to a 96-37 win in non-conference action on Wednesday night at Gampel Pavilion.

The Crusaders were scoreless for 10:28, including the last 4:15 of the first half, as the Huskies tacked on the 32-0 burst to extend their lead to 64 points at 78-14. During the 16:13 without a field goal, Holy Cross made just three free throws before UConn's run. The four field goals made by the Crusaders in the first half were the fewest allowed by UConn in a half since December 29, 2007 against Hartford, when they allowed two field goals in the second half.

Tahirah Williams (Montclair, N.J.) led all scorers with 17 points, while adding seven rebounds, as she finished the night with career highs in points and rebounds. Kaili McLaren (Washington, D.C.) added 10 points, tying her season-high performance at BYU one week ago.

With the win, UConn improves to 6-0 on the season while winning 29 consecutive home games, which is the longest streak in the nation. Holy Cross falls to 1-6 on the year, dropping its second consecutive game after its non-league loss to Western Illinois on Sunday.

Four out of the five starters for the Huskies scored in double figures as Maya Moore (Lawrenceville, Ga.), Tina Charles (Jamaica, N.Y.) and Renee Montgomery (St. Albans, W. Va.) each had 13 points. Montgomery's three three-point field goals moved her past Maria Conlon (170) for seventh on the Huskies' all-time list with her current career total of 172. Moore's 13 points marked her sixth game this season with double-figure points and the 42nd of her career. She has now scored in double figures in 42 of 44 career games.

Jacque Fernandes' (Pawcatuck, Conn.) five points and four rebounds were both career highs for the junior as she made her first career three-pointer with 1:51 remaining in the first half. Freshman Tiffany Hayes' (Lakeland, Fla.) seven rebounds tied her career high as she pulled down the same number against Rhode Island on Nov. 22.

A 10-0 run to open up tonight's contest sparked a 22-2 UConn lead as the Crusaders were held to just a single basket in the first 5:16 of play. Moore led the Huskies with 11 points in the first 13:10 of the half as she played just seven minutes of the first 20.

Caroline Doty (Doylestown, Pa.) continued her hot hand as she was 3-for-3 from three-point land in the first half as Williams added eight points and five rebounds, shooting a perfect 3-for-3 from the floor. The UConn bench contributed 19 points as every UConn player saw minutes before the break while holding a 63-14 lead heading into the locker room.

The Huskies continued to add to their lead as they began the second half with a 15-0 run before the Crusaders scored their first points of the half on a three-pointer by Whitney Fremeau at the 13:47 mark.

Briana McFadden was the only Holy Cross player to reach double figures as she finished the night with 10 points. She hit two of the Crusaders' four made three pointers of their 27 attempts.

Holy Cross finished the game with 12 turnovers as the Huskies capitalized with 23 points off those mistakes. UConn also out-rebounded the Crusaders 44-28 as they shot 65.5% (38-for-58) from the floor, including a 42.1% (8-for-19) from behind the arc. The Huskies held the Crusaders to 21.3% from the field on 13-61 shooting, including a 12.9% (4-for-31) performance in the first half. Holy Cross also shot just 4-for-27 from the three point mark for 14.8% on the night.

**UCONN AND CONNECTICUT PUBLIC TELEVISION  
SIGN FOUR-YEAR EXTENSION**

**STORRS, Conn. (March 1, 2008)** – The University of Connecticut Division of Athletics and Connecticut Public Television (CPTV) have signed a new four-year contract extension for CPTV to continue to be UConn's exclusive local market television broadcast partner for women's basketball.

Under the agreement, all local television rights for UConn women's basketball which are controlled by the University are assigned to CPTV. All other UConn games are controlled by the BIG EAST Conference and subject to Conference television contracts.

The agreement runs from the 2008-09 academic year through 2011-12 and calls for CPTV to televise a minimum of 68 UConn women's basketball games over the four-year contract period.

"The UConn Division of Athletics and Connecticut Public Television have the most unique partnership in college sports television today," says UConn Director of Athletics Jeffrey Hathaway, pictured above with Jerry Franklin of CPTV. "We are very pleased to announce that our partnership with CPTV to provide local market television coverage of Husky women's basketball games will continue through the 2011-12 season. UConn receives more media attention on both the national and local level than any other women's basketball team in the country and this agreement with CPTV will ensure that will continue for years to come."

This latest agreement will generate a minimum of \$3,600,000 in cash to the University. CPTV will guarantee UConn seasonal rights of \$1,000,000 for the 2008-09 women's basketball local market television rights and that fee for the following years will be -- \$1,000,000 in 2009-2010, \$800,000 in 2010-11 and \$800,000 in 2011-12.

The \$900,000 average annual rights fee is a 12% increase from the previous contract which averaged \$802,000 per year.

Among the new elements of the agreement is the ability for the University to share in corporate underwriting revenue and to sell a signature sponsorship associated with women's basketball broadcasts on CPTV.

"Connecticut Public Television has set the standard for the televising of college women's basketball," says Hathaway. "CPTV began to televise our women's basketball games in 1994 and has become a very important reason why our women's basketball program enjoys so much success on an annual basis. We appreciate (CPTV President and CEO) Jerry Franklin's leadership and the tremendous support and dedication provided by CPTV's viewers and staff."

In addition to the UConn games on CPTV, the agreement calls for the continuation of The Geno Auriemma Show, which appears on CPTV 12 times during the season.

"We're incredibly pleased to be able to continue our relationship with the University of Connecticut," says Jerry Franklin, President and CEO of Connecticut Public Television. "Our unique programming partnership with UConn Athletics has had a substantial impact on women's basketball across the country. With the support of our viewers, we've been able to showcase the remarkable talents of the women's basketball program and expand the reach of the sport to Connecticut residents and beyond.

"What we've jointly created - UConn Athletics, CPTV and the people of Connecticut - is a tribute to the loyalty of our basketball fans. It's fitting that this women's basketball team, through our landmark partnership, has become recognized as one of the most admired and respected teams in the country."

CPTV began its coverage of UConn women's basketball late in the 1993-94 season, covering the championship game of the 1994 BIG EAST Women's Basketball Tournament and televising three games in the 1994 NCAA Tournament. During the past 15 seasons, Connecticut Public Television has televised a total of 308 UConn women's basketball games. In those 308 games, Connecticut has compiled a stunning 300-8 overall record.

During the 2007-08 season, CPTV carried a total of 24 UConn women's basketball games.

The University and CPTV take great pride in the fact that UConn Women's Basketball on CPTV continues to be the highest-rated locally produced public television program in the nation.

STORRS, Conn. - Senior Tina Charles led all players with 26 points and 13 rebounds as the No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team opened the 2009-10 regular season with a decisive 105-35 victory over Northeastern on Saturday afternoon in Gampel Pavilion.

Charles, who was 11-of-17 from the field in the game, led six Huskies (1-0) in double-figures. She was joined by junior Maya Moore, who added 18 points and 10 rebounds, while sophomore Tiffany Hayes had 14 and senior Kalana Greene had 13. Senior Meghan Gardler and sophomore Caroline Doty each added 10 points for UConn, which improved to 31-5 overall in home openers with the win over Northeastern (0-1).

UConn opened the game on a 28-0 run in the first 5:34 of the contest, including nine points from Charles and eight from Doty. Charles led all scorers at the break with 17 on 7-of-9 shooting from the floor with nine rebounds and one assist. With those nine rebounds, Charles became the third player in UConn history to tally 1,000 career rebounds. Moore had 12 points on 5-of-7 shooting with seven rebounds, two assists and one steal while Hayes also had 12 points to go along with two rebounds, four assists and two steals.

The Huskies led 69-15 at halftime and shot .683 (28-of-41) from the floor while holding Northwestern to just .160 (4-of-25) in the half. The 69 points scored by the Huskies was the most in program history in any half, besting the 68 points scored in the first half against Providence on January 6, 1998.

Northeastern opened the second half with a 3-pointer by Brittany Wilson, but UConn followed that with 11 points to take an 81-18 lead with 13:28 to play and did not look back. Charles added to her 39th career double-double total with nine points and four rebounds in the second half. Moore, who recorded her 28th career double-double in the victory, added six points and three boards in the final half.

UConn finished the game shooting .600 (42-of-70) from the field and also grabbed 61 rebounds, including 41 on the defensive end. Northwestern shot .193 (11-of-57) from the floor in the game.

With her 13 points, Greene became the 33rd player in UConn history to reach the 1,000-point plateau. Red-shirt freshman Heather Buck had four points and 12 rebounds in her first collegiate game.

Rachael Peocota led the way for Northeastern with 10 points and four points, while Kim Carr and Kashaia Cannon each had seven points.

The 105 points scored by UConn in the game marks the 60th time in program history that the team has scored at least 100 points, and the last time it happened was March 22, 2009, a 104-65 victory over Vermont in the first round of the 2009 NCAA Tournament. The 70-point margin of victory for the Huskies on Saturday was the largest for a UConn team since defeating Long Island in the first round of the NCAA Tournament by 72 (101-29) on March 17, 2001.

SAN ANTONIO, Texas - Junior Maya Moore led all scorers with 20 points, while adding 11 rebounds for her 29th career double-double as the No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team defeated No. 10/13 Texas 83-58 on Tuesday night in the AT&T Center.

Moore led the way with 20 points, 10 of which she recorded from the free throw line, while senior Tina Charles added 15 points and 11 rebounds for 40th career double-double. All five starters registered double-figures, as sophomores Tiffany Hayes and Caroline Doty added 10 and 13 points, respectively. Kalana Greene finished the night seven-of-12 from the field for 14 points.

After an opening 3-0 lead was tied by Texas, UConn recorded a 22-6 run in a span of 8:11 to take a 25-9 lead midway through the first half. The Huskies held the Longhorns without a field goal for a period of 7:02 in the half, while holding Texas to a .222 clip (9-of-35). UConn's lead in the first frame was extended to 21 as Doty knocked down a three pointer with seven seconds on the clock before the halftime break.

Doty led all scorers at intermission with 12 points, while Moore added 11 as the Huskies' shot .500 (16-for-32). Greene was four-of-eight in the first half to add eight points to UConn's tally. The Huskies continued to dominate in the second half as they shot .452 (14-of-31) from the field, while holding Texas to a .400 (12-of-30) showing from the floor, including three-of-nine from behind the arc. The Huskies were led by Greene in the second frame, who earned her 51st career game with double-figure points.

UConn finished the night shooting .484 (30-of-62) from the field and outrebounded the Texas 47-36. The Longhorns shot .323 (21-of-65), including a 5-of-18 clip from behind the arc in tonight's contest.

Charles' 15 points moved her past Shea Ralph (1,678) for ninth place on the UConn career scoring list as tonight marked her 86th game with double-figure points.

Moore's 20 points marked her 44th career game in double-figures, while her four blocked shots in the first half matched her single-game best from a year ago.

With the win, the Huskies improve to 142-53 all-time versus Top-25 AP ranked teams. UConn has now won its 41st consecutive game by 10 points or more with the non-conference victory.

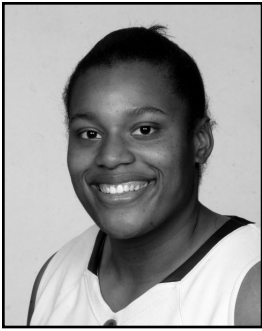
