## GAME #1

### 1/1 Connecticut (1-0) vs. 12/14 Texas (1-0)

### UConn HEADS TO LONE STAR STATE TO BATTLE TEXAS IN SAN ANTONIO:

Connecticut will look to win its 41st consecutive game when it travels to San Antonio to meet No. 12/14 Texas at the AT&T Center in San Antonio on Tuesday night.

Tuesday's game will mark the second time in the last three seasons that Connecticut has played its first game away from home at a neutral site, the last being in 2007, when the Huskies played their first game outside of Connecticut at the Paradise Jam Tournament in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

*UConn has won its first game away from home in each of the last four seasons, with the last loss coming on Nov. 21, 2004 against North Carolina in the Jimmy V Classic in Raleigh, N.C..*

The Huskies will close out the abbreviated two-game road trip on Friday, Nov. 20 when it travels to play Holy Cross in Worcester, Mass., in a 7:30 p.m. tip.

**HUSKIES ON THE DEUCE:** The Huskies own an **39-10** record on the "Deuce" since **2001-02** and posted a perfect **9-0** mark on the network in **2007-08**.

**HUSKIES ON NATIONAL TV:** UConn is **83-18** in nationally televised contests since 2001-02, including an **18-0** mark in 2008-09.

**ROAD SAVVY:** The Huskies are **87-9** on the road since Feb. 1, 2001.

*The Huskies have not lost back-to-back road games since the 1992-93 season when it lost at Miami (2/14) and Pittsburgh (2/24).*

**ALL-TIME VS. RANKED FOES:** Connecticut has an all-time record of **141-53 (.721)** versus Top-25 AP ranked teams.

UConn is **31-20** all-time on the road against ranked opponents and **9-6** in road games against ranked teams since 2004-05.

UConn is **64-36 (.633)** all-time vs. opponents ranked in the AP Top-10.

*The Huskies were 11-0 against ranked opponents in 2008-09.*

**UConn IN SEASON OPENERS:** The Huskies are **27-8** all-time in regular season openers entering following their Nov. 14 Northeastern and own a **21-4** mark in such games since Geno Auriemma took over the program's reigns in 1985-86.

*UConn is a solid 18-2 in season openers dating back to 1990-91 and owns a 14-game winning streak in season openers.*

*The Huskies last loss in an opener came on Nov. 19, 1995 - an 83-81 setback vs. Louisiana Tech.*

**UConn IN HOME OPENERS:** The Huskies always are comfortable in their home base - especially in their first appearance in front of the home folks, as they have compiled an impressive **31-5** all-time mark in home openers following its Nov. 14 win over Northeastern.

*UConn is 24-1 in home openers under head coach Geno Auriemma.*

The Huskies only loss under Auriemma in a home opener came on Nov. 29, 1990 - a 17-point loss vs. Iowa (58-41).

*Connecticut has won its last 19 home openers.*

**BANNER TIME:** Prior to the start of the 2009-10 season opener on Saturday, Nov. 14 vs. Northeastern at Gampel Pavilion, the Huskies were honored for their 2009 NCAA National Championship with the unveiling of the banner commemorating the Huskies sixth NCAA National Championship.

**UP NEXT:** The Huskies will close out the abbreviated two-game road trip at Holy Cross on Friday, Nov. 20 in a 7:30 p.m. tip in Worcester. The game will be televised live to on CPTV and can be heard live on the UConn Radio Network and via the internet at www.UConnHuskies.com.

Live video will also be available via UConnHuskies.com.

UConn leads the all-time series with Holy Cross **17-2** with the most recent meeting coming on Dec. 3, 2008 in Storrs - a 96-37 UConn victory.

**The Huskies are 2803 all-time against members of the Patriot League entering Friday's meeting with the Crusaders.**

**40 IN A ROW AT HOME:** Connecticut has won **40** consecutive regular-season home games - **the nation's longest active streak.**

UConn's last home loss during the regular season came at the hands of a 70-64 loss vs. Tennessee on Jan. 6, 2007.

**VS. NON-CONFERENCE AT HOME:** Connecticut has won **16** consecutive regular season home games against non-conference opponents dating back to a Jan. 6, 2007 loss to Tennessee.

**CHARLES HITS 1,000 BOARDS:** Senior center Tina Charles became just **the third player in UConn history to reach 1,000 career boards** in the Huskies' Nov. 14 win over Northeastern.

**Charles currently ranks third overall among the Huskies all-time rebounding leaders, just 46 behind Jamelle Elliott's second-place total and 260 behind Rebecca Lobo's (1,268) school-record total.**

**GREENE HITS 1,000 POINTS:** Senior Kalana Greene became just the **33rd** player in UConn history to reach the **1,000-point barrier** against Northeastern on Nov. 14.

**She currently boasts 1,012 career points entering Tuesday's game vs. Texas.**

**COUNTDOWN TO 700 FOR GENO:** UConn head coach **Geno Auriemma** enters the season with **697** career wins - **three shy of 700 for his career.**

Auriemma is looking to become the eighth coach in NCAA Division I history to reach 700 career wins - Virginia head coach Debbie Ryan also enters 2009-10 on the verge of 700 - as she currently boasts 699 victories.

**Auriemma's winning percentage of .851 ranks as the best among active NCAA Division I head coaches.**

**116 STRAIGHT VS. NON-RANKED:** Connecticut has won **116** consecutive games against non-ranked opponents.

**UConn last loss to an unranked foe on Dec. 21, 2004 at Arizona State (61-50).**

**BREAKING DOWN THE REGULAR SEASON WIN STREAK:** Connecticut has won **39** consecutive regular season games - dating back to a 73-71 loss at Rutgers on Feb. 5, 2008.

**Over the 39-game skein, the Huskies have average a 29.9 margin of victory (1,166 total point differential).**

**DONT THINK OF SHOOTING OVER .500:** UConn has gone **190** consecutive games without allowing an opponent to shoot over .500 from the field.

**The last time a UConn opponent posted a shooting percentage over .500 was Boston College on March 8, 2004.**

**126 WEEKS ALL-TIME AT NO. 1:** UConn earned the No. 1 ranking for a record 126th time on Oct. 31 - extending its lead over Tennessee (112) for the most weeks at the top spot by any NCAA Division I program.

UConn's longest run as the nation's top ranked squad spanned 30 weeks (Nov. 9, 1999-Jan. 15, 2001), while its shortest stretch at the top spot was a one-week stay (Feb. 24-March 1, 2004).

*The Huskies have been ranked No. 1 in each of the past 20 Associated Press polls.*

**DEFENDING THEIR TURE:** The Huskies boast a record of 284-11 (.963) at home (Storrs & Hartford) since the 1993-94 season.

**GAMPEL DOMINANCE:** UConn is 9-2 in its last 96 games at Gampel Pavilion.

**FRIENDLY GAMPEL CONFINES:** The Huskies boast a record of 202-5 (.976) in Gampel Pavilion since 1993-94.

UConn has won 94 of its last 96 games at Gampel Pavilion and are 245-17 (.935) at the facility all-time and have won its last 29 straight overall.

**HUSKIES BREAK RECORD FOR POINTS IN HALF IN OPENER:** UConn opened the 2009-10 season with a bang as it erupted for a school-record 69 points in the first half of its 105-35 win over Northeastern on Saturday, Nov. 14.

*The 69 first-half points broke the previous record of 68 points, which was accomplished on Jan. 6, 1998 in the first half of a win over Providence.*

**HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE SEASON-OPENER VS. NORTHEASTERN:** Below are some statistical notes and highlights from the Huskies season-opening win against Northeastern on Nov. 14.

- UConn has won 19 consecutive home openers following today's win over Northeastern. - UConn opened the game with a 28-0 run over the initial 5:51. UConn's defense held Northeastern to 0-for-10 shooting from the field during that stretch.

- UConn's 28-0 run was the largest run in a game since a 32-0 spurt against Holy Cross on Dec. 3, 2008.

- UConn's 69 points in the first half marked the most-ever by the Huskies in any half - besting the 68 points scored against Providence in the first half on Jan. 6, 1998.

- UConn shot 68.3 percent from the field in the first half.

-UConn's defense kept Northeastern to shooting 4-for-25 from the floor in the first 20 minutes of play.

-UConn outrebounded Northeastern 61-19, including 41 to 12 on defensive rebounds.

- Senior Tina Charles pulled down her 1000th career rebound in today's win, becoming just the third player in UConn history to tally 1,000 career rebounds.

- Senior Kalana Greene registered her 1,000th career point in today's win over Northeastern, becoming the 33rd player in UConn history to reach the 1,000-point plateau.

- Sophomore Tiffany Hayes' 14 points marks the 18th time in her career that she has posted double-digits in points.

- Tina Charles' 26 points marks the 19th time in her career that she has scored at least 20 points in a game.

-Today's game marks the 39th career game that Tina Charles has recorded a double-double, with 26 points and 13 rebounds.

- Tina Charles' 13 rebounds in today's game is the 43rd time she has had at least 10 rebounds in her career.

- Sophomore Caroline Doty's 10 points today was the seventh time that she has posted double-figures in her career.

- Redshirt freshman Heather Buck grabbed 12 rebounds in her first collegiate game.

- Junior Maya Moore recorded her 28th career double-double today with 18 points and 10 rebounds. It was the 75th time she scored at least 10 points in 78 career games.

- Maya Moore's double-double today marked the 43rd time doing so in her collegiate career.

- Northeastern's 35 points are the fewest points allowed since a 65-34 victory against Cincinnati on Jan. 24, 2009.

- UConn's 105th points in today's game marks the 60th time in program history that the team has scored at least 100 points and the first time this season.

- The last time UConn scored at least 100 points came in the first round of the 2009 NCAA tournament against Vermont, when it won 104-65.

- Today's 70-point margin of victory was the largest for UConn since beating Long Island March 17, 2001 in the first round of the NCAA tournament by 72 points (101-29).

The University of Connecticut women's basketball team, which swept the 2008-09 BIG EAST regular season and tournament titles en route to the program's sixth NCAA National Championship, has been selected as the favorites to win the 2009-10 BIG EAST women's basketball regular season title by a tally of the league's 16 head coaches, which was announced at the league's annual media day at ESPN Zone in New York City's Time Square.

In the 28 years of BIG EAST women's basketball, Connecticut has been crowned the regular-season champion 17 times, has won 15 league tournament titles and has captured both titles in the same year in 13 seasons.

**Connecticut earned 15 first-place votes for a total of 225 points in the poll.** The Huskies went 16-0 in league play a year ago, finished the season with a [perfect 39-0 overall record, earned a berth to the NCAA Championship for the 21st straight year and advanced to their 10th Final Four. UConn returns four of its five starters from last year's NCAA National Championship Team, and lost just three letterwinners from that squad.

**UConn sophomore Maya Moore, was chosen as the 2009-10 BIG EAST Preseason Player of Year, for the second straight season.**

**Joining Moore on the Preseason All-BIG EAST Team is Tina Charles and Kalana Greene was an honorable mention all-league choice.**

### **BIG EAST EXTENDS TOURNAMENT AGREEMENT WITH HARTFORD:**

The 2010 BIG EAST Women's Basketball Championship will return to the XL Center in Hartford, Conn. for the **seventh straight year.**

The 2010 championship will be held **March 5-9** with five full days of action and 15 games. The BIG EAST's teams will battle for the conference tournament title and one will earn the league's automatic bid to the 64-team NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship.

"We are extremely pleased to have the BIG EAST Women's Basketball Championship remain in Hartford for another two years," said Tranghese "We believe we have one of the premier women's basketball championships in the nation in terms of competitiveness and attendance. Further, we are excited to continue to showcase our nationally recognized programs in a public arena that resides in the heart of a city that supports collegiate women's basketball with such enthusiasm."

**HUSKIES + BIG EAST = 32 TITLES:** Connecticut has amassed an astounding **32** BIG EAST titles in the program's history following its sweep of both the league regular season and tournament titles in 2009 - **marking the second straight season and the 13th time in the program's history that the Huskies have pulled off the double.**

The Huskies followed a **16-0** regular season conference mark (**17th title**) by winning **three straight** over South Florida, Villanova and Louisville by an average of **35.3** ppg to claim their **15th** BIG EAST Tournament championship.

**SHOOT THE THREE!!!:** UConn enters Tuesday's meeting with Texas having made at least one three-point field goal in 258 consecutive games - *dating back to the 2002 NCAA National Championship Game vs. Oklahoma on March 31, 2002 - when the Huskies went 0-for-9 from beyond the arc.*

**AURIEMMA TAKES OVER WIN % LEAD:** With Tennessee's loss on Nov. 17, 2008 to Virginia, Lady Vol coach Pat Summitt surrendered the title of winningest active coach to Connecticut head coach Geno Auriemma.

**CHARLES SITS IN THIRD ON CAREER SWAT LIST:** UConn's Tina Charles is wasting no time in making her assault on the UConn career block list.

*Charles currently is third among UConn career block leaders at 211.*

**DOING 100:** UConn's 105 points in its season-opening win vs. Northeastern marked the 60th time in program history that the Huskies have notched at least 100 points.

**HUSKIES AT THE XL CENTER:** UConn boasts an all-time mark of 98-11 (.899) in games played at the XL Center.

UConn was a perfect 11-0 in 2009-10 at the XL Center and has won those games by an average of 32.4 points.

The Huskies are 15-2 in BIG EAST Tournament games at the XL Center since the event moved to the facility in 2004 - over that span UConn has garnered four titles.

*The Huskies have won each of their last 24 games played at the XL Center in Hartford, dating back to a 55-47 loss vs. Rutgers on March 6, 2007 - in the championship game of the 2007 BIG EAST Tournament.*

**VS. THE BIG EAST (EXCEPT RUTGERS):** The Huskies last loss to a BIG EAST opponent in the regular season not named Rutgers came on Feb. 26, 2005 at Boston College, which is now a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

*The Huskies last conference loss to a current league member other than Rutgers dates back to a Jan. 30, 2005 loss to Notre Dame (65-59).*

Connecticut has won 63 straight BIG EAST regular season games against opponents other than Rutgers.

**BIG EAST HOME COURT STREAK:** UConn has won its last 25 BIG EAST Conference home games - dating back to a Feb. 7, 2006 loss vs. Rutgers (60-56).

**AURIEMMA MOVES UP ALL-TIME AP POLL LIST:** UConn head coach Geno Auriemma moved past Kay Yow for fifth all-time in AP Poll appearances with his 330th on Oct. 31.

*Auriemma currently sits six behind Rene Portland for fourth place overall.*

**BIG EAST DOMINANCE:** The Huskies boast an overall record of 347-84 (.806) in regular season BIG EAST play - and have won either the BIG EAST Regular Season or Tournament title in each of the past 16 seasons - including the 2007-08 BIG EAST Regular Season and Tournament Titles - overall the Huskies have garnered a total of 31 BIG EAST Championships (17 regular season, 14 tournament).

During UConn's amazing run of 11 consecutive BIG EAST regular season titles (1994-2004), the Huskies owned a sterling record of 181-7 (.963).

The Huskies notched their seventh undefeated season in BIG EAST games in 2008-09 - the most of any other team in the league.

UConn also holds the record for most consecutive winning seasons in league play - with its current streak of 23 consecutive seasons.

*Since 1986-87, the Huskies have been over .500 for the past 23-straight seasons.*

*The next closest is Notre Dame, which posted 10 winning seasons in a row from 1995-2005.*

**UCONN ON CBS:** Since the 1995-96 season, the Huskies have made 14 appearances on CBS - posting an 8-6 mark in those games during the regular season, following its 76-63 win over LSU on Jan. 3, 2009.

UConn had dropped its last four games on the network, dating back to a 68-67 loss vs. Duke at the Hartford Civic Center on Jan. 3, 2004, prior to its 100-50 win at Purdue on Jan. 6, 2008.

*Prior to that recent losing skid, UConn had won each of its previous four games which were televised nationally on CBS.*

**HUSKIES IN ROAD OPENERS:** Following its No. 25, 2008 win at BYU, UConn boasts a 26-9 record in its first game away from home of the season.

*The Huskies have won 12 of their last 13 initial road (or neutral) games of the season following its Nov. 25 win at BYU with the lone loss coming on Nov. 21, 2004 against North Carolina in Raleigh.*

**SELLOUTS IN HARTFORD:** Since 2000, UConn has played in front of 37 sellout crowds at the XL Center.

**HEAD COACH GENO AURIEMMA:** UConn boss Geno Auriemma is in his 25th season at the helm of the Husky program.

*During his decorated tenure at Connecticut, Auriemma has guided the Huskies to six national championships, 10 Final Fours and 32 BIG EAST titles.*

*Auriemma boasts a career mark of 696-122 (.851) - his career winning percentage of .851 is the best all-time among active NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Coaches.*

He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year for the eighth time in 2008-09, and was recognized as the 2009 WBCA and USBW National Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

Overall in his career, Auriemma has received a total of 22 national coach of the year honors.



LAST TIME VS. TEXAS

BRIDGEPORT, Conn. (March 25, 2008) – Freshman Maya Moore (Lawrenceville, Ga.) recorded her 10th double-double of the season with 24 points and 12 rebounds as the No. 1 seed University of Connecticut women's basketball team earned a trip to the Sweet 16 by defeating No. 8 seed Texas 89-55 in the second round of the 2008 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament on Tuesday night at the Arena at Harbor Yard.

With the win, UConn improves to 34-1 overall and advances to the Greensboro Regional Semifinal Round where it will face No. 5 seed Old Dominion on Sunday, March 30 at the Greensboro Coliseum at 12:00 p.m. (ET) on ESPN. With the loss, Texas closes out its season at 22-13.

With her 24 points scored, Moore ties the UConn freshman record for most points in an NCAA Tournament game, matching Diana Taurasi's 24 points vs. N.C. State in the 2001 Regional Semifinals. Her performance was also the first double-double by a UConn freshman in an NCAA Tournament game since Barbara Turner's 15 points and 10 rebounds vs. Boston University in 2003. Moore finished the game shooting 9-for-14 from the floor as she added three blocked shots and two assists.

The UConn win also marks UConn's 34th victory this season, its highest single-season win total since the 2002-03 campaign when the Huskies posted 37 victories. The Huskies advance to the NCAA Regional for the 15th consecutive season and 16th in program's history.

UConn began the game with a 13-2 run, as it shot .706 from the field (12-for-17) in the first 8:25 of regulation. With 5:18 on the clock, junior Renee Montgomery (St. Albans, W. Va.) dodged two defenders to make a lay-up and give the Huskies their largest lead of the half at 21.

Moore finished the first 20 minutes of play 6-of-8 from the floor, including 4-of-5 from behind the arc for 16 first-half points. The Huskies shot .677 (21-of-31) from the field in the first half while holding Texas to just .345 (13-of-36) from the floor.

The Huskies went on a 21-6 run in a 9:53 span to start the second half and held the Longhorns to just eight shot attempts during that span. UConn recorded its largest lead of the game at 37 with 3:28 left on the clock as sophomore Meghan Gardler (Springfield, Pa.) hit a deep three pointer to add to the UConn advantage.

Montgomery finished the night with 17 points and five assists for her 26th game with double-figure points this season and her 24th over the last 26 games overall. Ketia Swanier (Columbus, Ga.) recorded seven assists for the Huskies to move her career tally to 466, which ranks eighth in program history.

Senior Charde Houston's (San Diego, Calif.) 10 points marked the fourth game that she had registered double-figure points over the Huskies' five postseason games this season. Tina Charles' (Jamaica, N.Y.) 15 points marked her 27th game with double-figure points this season and the 50th of her career. Brittany Hunter (Columbus, Ohio) added 10 points for the Huskies in 13 minutes played.

With tonight's victory, UConn's record improves to 16-2 in NCAA Tournament second round games and also move their mark to 63-15 all-time in NCAA Tournament play.
