Connecticut (0-0) vs. Northeastern (0-0)

HUSKIES TIP OFF SEASON VS. NORTHEASTERN: Connecticut will open the 2009-10 season on Saturday afternoon against Colonial Athletic Conference member Northeastern.

This will mark the **eighth time** in the last **nine seasons** that the Huskies will open the season at Gampel Pavilion.

Connecticut last tipped off the regular season away from Gampel in 2006-07 at the then-Hartford Civic Center.

The Huskies will follow Saturday's game with a meeting vs. Big XII member Texas at the AT&T Center in San Antonio on Tuesday, Nov. 17 in a 9:30 p.m. (ET) tip that will be televised nationally on ESPNU.

UConn IN SEASON OPENERS: The Huskies are **27-8** all-time in regular season openers entering Saturday's meeting with Northeastern and own a **20-4** mark in such games since Geno Auriemma took over the program's reigns in 1985-86.

UConn is a solid 17-2 in season openers dating back to 1990-91 and owns a 13- game winning streak in season openers entering Sunday's contest.

The Huskies last loss in an opener came on Nov. 19, 1995 - an 83-81 setback vs. Louisiana Tech.

UConn IN HOME OPENERS: The Huskies always are comfortable in their home base - especially in their first appearance in front of the home folks, as they have compiled an impressive **30-5** all-time mark in home openers entering Saturday's showdown with Northeastern.

UConn is 23-1 in home openers under head coach Geno Auriemma.

The Huskies only loss under Auriemma

in a home opener came on Nov. 29, 1990 - a 17-point loss vs. Iowa (58-41).

Connecticut has won its last 18 home openers entering Saturday's game.

SATURDAY'S PROMOTIONS: A number of giveaways and promotions are planned for our loyal fans in conjunction with the season opener on Saturday, Nov. 14 vs. Northeastern.

BANNER TIME: Prior to the start of the 2009-10 season opener on Saturday, Nov. 14 vs. Northeastern at Gampel Pavilion, the Huskies will be honored for their 2009 NCAA National Championship with the unveiling of the banner commemorating the Huskies sixth NCAA National Championship.

UP NEXT: Connecticut will take to the road for the first time this season as it heads to San Antonio to face Texas at the AT&T Center.

1995, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2009 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS ▶ 10 FINAL FOURS ▶ 32 BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIPS

UConn leads the all-time series with Texas 4-0 with the last meeting coming in the second round of the 2008 NCAA Tournament - a 89-55 UConn victory.

The Huskies are 15-1 all-time against members of the Big XII contest entering Tuesday's meeting with the Longhorns.

39 IN A ROW AT HOME: Connecticut has won 39 consecutive regular-season home games - *the nation's longest active streak.*

UConn's last home loss during the regular season came at the hands of a 70-64 loss vs. Tennessee on Jan. 6, 2007.

VS. NON-CONFERENCE AT HOME: Connecticut has won 15 consecutive regular season home games against non-conference opponents dating back to a Jan. 6, 2007 loss to Tennessee.

CHARLES EYES 1,000 BOARDS: Senior center Tina Charles enters the 2009-10 season with 995 career rebounds - *just five shy of becoming the third player in UConn history to reach 1,000 career boards.*

Charles currently ranks third overall among the Huskies all-time rebounding leaders, just 59 behind Jamelle Elliott's second-place total and 273 behind Rebecca Lobo's (1,268) school-record total.

GREENE EYES 1,000 POINTS: Senior Kalana Greene enters her senior season with 999 career points - just one shy of becoming the 33rd player in UConn history to reach the 1,000-point barrier.

COUNTDOWN TO 700 FOR GENO: UConn head coach Geno Auriemma enters the season with 696 career wins - *four shy of 700 for his career.*

Auriemma is looking to become the eighth coach in NCAA Division I history to reach 700 career wins - Virginia head coach Debbie Ryan also enters 2009-10 on the verge of 700 - as she currently boasts 699 victories.

Auriemma's winning percentage of .851 ranks as the best among active NCAA Division I head coaches.

COUNTDOWN TO 700 FOR GENO: UConn head coach Geno Auriemma enters the season with 696 career wins - *four shy of 700 for his career.*

Auriemma is looking to become the eighth coach in NCAA Division I history to reach 700 career wins - Virginia head coach Debbie Ryan also enters 2009-10 on the verge of 700 - as she currently boasts 699 victories.

Auriemma's winning percentage of .851 ranks as the best among active NCAA Division I head coaches.

115 STRAIGHT VS. NON-RANKED: Connecticut has won 115 consecutive games against non-ranked opponents.

UConn last loss to an unranked foe on Dec. 21, 2004 at Arizona State (61-50).

BREAKING DOWN THE REGULAR SEASON WIN STREAK: Connecticut has won 38 consecutive regular season games - dating back to a 73-71 loss at Rutgers on Feb. 5, 2008.

Over the 38-game skein, the Huskies have average a 28.8 margin of victory (1,096 total point differential).

DONT THINK OF SHOOTING OVER .500: UConn has gone 189 consecutive games without allowing an opponent to shoot over .500 from the field entering the 2009-10 season.

The last time a UConn opponent posted a shooting percentage over .500 was Boston College on March 8, 2004.

HUSKIES ON THE DEUCE: The Huskies own an 39-10 record on the "Deuce" since 2001-02 and posted a perfect 9-0 mark on the network in 2007-08.

126 WEEKS ALL-TIME AT NO. 1: UConn earned the No. 1 ranking for a record **126th** time on Oct. 31 - extending its lead over Tennessee (112) for the most weeks at the top spot by any NCAA Division I program.

UConn's longest run as the nation's top ranked squad spanned 30 weeks (Nov. 9, 1999-Jan. 15, 2001), while its shortest stretch at the top spot was a one-week stay (Feb. 24-March 1, 2004).

The Huskies have been ranked No. 1 in each of the past 20 Associated Press polls.

DEFENDING THEIR TURE: The Huskies boast a record of **283-11 (.963)** at home (Storrs & Hartford) since the 1993-94 season.

GAMPEL DOMINANCE: UConn is **93-2** in its last **95** games at Gampel Pavilion.

FRIENDLY GAMPEL CONFINES: The Huskies boast a record of **201-5 (.976)** in Gampel Pavilion since 1993-94.

UConn has won 93 of its last 95 games at Gampel Pavilion and are 245-17 (.935) at the facility all-time and have won its last 28 straight overall.

POLE POSITION: The University of Connecticut women's basketball team has been a regular in the Associated Press & ESPN Coaches Top 25 for **303** consecutive weeks.

The Huskies are currently ranked No. 1, the **20th** consecutive week they have been slotted at No. 1 (*released Oct. 31*).

HUSKIES EARN 239th TOP-5 AP POLL APPEARANCE: Connecticut's current No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25, which was released **Oct. 31**, marked the **239th** time that the Huskies have garnered a top-5 ranking in the program's history.

UConn has made 239 appearances (as of Oct. 31) in the AP Top-5 which ranks third-most all-time, behind only Tennessee (414) and Louisiana Tech (279).

UConn has also made the most appearances in the AP Top-10 this decade.

- ▶ Its shortest stretch at the top spot was a **one-week** stay (**Feb. 24-March 1, 2004**)
- ▶ In the six previous seasons that UConn has opened as the No. 1 team in the Associated Press poll, the Huskies have won four national titles (2000, 2002, 2004, 2009) and lost twice in the national semifinals (1996, 2001).

MAYA MOORE AND TINA CHARLES NAMED TO PRESEASON AP ALL-AMERICA:

UConn players **Maya Moore** and **Tina Charles** were each selected to the five-player Associated Press Preseason All-America Team, which was announced Nov. 3.

The pair of UConn players selected marks the third time Connecticut has had multiple players named to the preseason squad and just the fifth time ever in which any program has had more than one player honored.

Connecticut saw Jennifer Rizzotti and Kara Wolters named in 1995-96 and Shea Ralph and Svetlana Abrosimova in 2000-01.

Moore was a unanimous choice, becoming the seventh player in the history of the team to receive all possible votes.

Jayne Appel of Stanford, Jantel Lavender of Ohio State and Monica Wright of Virginia round out the squad selected by a national media panel.

HUSKIES NO. 1 IN BOTH AP AND COACHES POLLS: The University of Connecticut women's basketball team is ranked No. 1 nationally in the 2009 Associated Press Preseason Top-25, which was released Oct. 31 and the ESPN/USA Today Top 25, which was announced Nov. 3.

This marks the second straight season and the seventh time in the program's history that Connecticut has been ranked No. 1 by the Associated Press in the preseason.

The Huskies received all 40 first-place votes and garnered a total of 1,00 from a national media panel in the Associated Press poll, while they received 40 of 40 first-place votes in the coaches poll.

UConn has captured the NCAA National Championship in four of the previous five seasons it opened as the nation's No. 1 team (1999-00, 2001-02, 2003-04, 2008-09).

It also opened the year ranked No. 1 to start the 1995-96 and 2000-01 seasons.

HUSKIES SLOTTED AS FAVORITES IN BIG EAST PRESEASON POLL. MOORE NAMED PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR:

The University of Connecticut women's basketball team, which swept the 2008-09 BIG EAST regular season and tournament titles en route to the program's sixth NCAA National Championship, has been selected as the favorites to win the 2009-10 BIG EAST women's basketball regular season title by a tally of the league's 16 head coaches, which was announced at the league's annual

media day at ESPN Zone in New York City's Time Square.

In the 28 years of BIG EAST women's basketball, Connecticut has been crowned the regular-season champion 17 times, has won 15 league tournament titles and has captured both titles in the same year in 13 seasons.

Connecticut earned 15 first-place votes for a total of 225 points in the poll. The Huskies went 16-0 in league play a year ago, finished the season with a [perfect 39-0 overall record, earned a berth to the NCAA Championship for the 21st straight year and advanced to their 10th Final Four. UConn returns four of its five starters from last year's NCAA National Championship Team, and lost just three letterwinners from that squad.

UConn sophomore Maya Moore, was chosen as the 2009-10 BIG EAST Preseason Player of Year, for the second straight season.

Joining Moore on the Preseason All-BIG EAST Team is Tina Charles and Kalana Greene was an honorable mention all-league choice.

BIG EAST EXTENDS TOURNAMENT AGREEMENT WITH HARTFORD:

The 2010 BIG EAST Women's Basketball Championship will return to the XL Center in Hartford, Conn. for the **seventh straight year.**

The 2010 championship will be held **March 5-9** with five full days of action and 15 games. The BIG EAST's teams will battle for the conference tournament title and one will earn the league's automatic bid to the 64-team NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship.

"We are extremely pleased to have the BIG EAST Women's Basketball Championship remain in Hartford for another two years," said Tringhese "We believe we have one of the premier women's basketball championships in the nation in terms of competitiveness and attendance. Further, we are excited to continue to showcase our nationally recognized programs in a public arena that resides in the heart of a city that supports collegiate women's basketball with such enthusiasm."

HUSKIES + BIG EAST = 32 TITLES: Connecticut has amassed an astounding **32** BIG EAST titles in the program's history following its sweep of both the league regular season and tournament titles in 2009 - **marking the second straight season and the 13th time in the program's history that the Huskies have pulled off the double.**

The Huskies followed a **16-0** regular season conference mark (**17th title**) by winning **three straight** over South Florida, Villanova and Louisville by an average of **35.3** ppg to claim their **15th** BIG EAST Tournament championship.

DOING 80: Connecticut has won its last **67** games in which it has scored at least **80 points.**

The streak dates back to a 89-80 loss vs. Tennessee on Jan. 7, 2005.

HUSKIES AVOID BACK-TO-BACK OVER AND OVER: The Huskies have not lost back-to-back games since the 1992-93 season entering the 2009-10 season.

The last time UConn dropped consecutive games was during the 1992-93 season when they lost against Providence (3/7/93) and Louisville (3/17/93).

Connecticut has gone **577** games without back-to-back defeats.

The Huskies are 45-0 following a loss during the streak.

ROAD SAVVY: The Huskies are **87-9** on the road since Feb. 1, 2001.

The Huskies have not lost back-to-back road games since the 1992-93 season when it lost at Miami (2/14) and Pittsburgh (2/24).

ALL-TIME VS. RANKED FOES: Connecticut has an all-time record of **141-53 (.721)** versus Top-25 AP ranked teams.

UConn is **31-20** all-time on the road against ranked opponents and **9-6** in road games against ranked teams since 2004-05.

UConn is **64-36 (.633)** all-time vs. opponents ranked in the AP Top-10.
The Huskies were 11-0 against ranked opponents in 2008-09.

HUSKIES VS. THE UNRANKED: UConn is **250-3** in its last **253 games** (dating back to Jan. 31, 1999) overall against opponents not ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 - and has won **115** straight such games.

CHARLES SITS IN THIRD ON CAREER SWAT LIST: UConn's **Tina Charles** is wasting no time in making her assault on the UConn career block list as she enters her senior season.

Charles currently is third among UConn career block leaders at 211.

DOING 100: UConn's **104** points in its 2009 NCAA first round win over Vermont marked the **59th** time in program history that the Huskies have notched at least 100 points.

HUSKIES AT THE XL CENTER: UConn boasts an all-time mark of **98-11 (.899)** in games played at the XL Center.

UConn was a perfect **11-0** in 2009-10 at the XL Center and has won those games by an average of **32.4** points.

The Huskies are **15-2** in BIG EAST Tournament games at the XL Center since the event moved to the facility in 2004 - over that span UConn has garnered four titles.

The Huskies have won each of their last 24 games played at the XL Center in Hartford, dating back to a 55-47 loss vs. Rutgers on March 6, 2007 - in the championship game of the 2007 BIG EAST Tournament.

VS. THE BIG EAST (EXCEPT RUTGERS): The Huskies last loss to a BIG EAST opponent in the regular season not named Rutgers came on Feb. 26, 2005 at Boston College, which is now a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The Huskies last conference loss to a current league member other than Rutgers dates back to a Jan. 30, 2005 loss to Notre Dame (65-59).

Connecticut has won **63** straight BIG EAST regular season games against opponents other than Rutgers.

BIG EAST HOME COURT STREAK: UConn has won its last **25** BIG EAST Conference home games - dating back to a Feb. 7, 2006 loss vs. Rutgers (60-56).

AURIEMMA MOVES UP ALL-TIME AP POLL LIST: UConn head coach **Geno Auriemma** moved past Kay Yow for **fifth** all-time in AP Poll appearances with his **330th** on Oct. 31.

Auriemma currently sits six behind Rene Portland for fourth place overall.

BIG EAST DOMINANCE: The Huskies boast an overall record of **347-84 (.806)** in regular season BIG EAST play - and have won either the BIG EAST Regular Season or Tournament title in each of the past **16** seasons - including the **2007-08 BIG EAST Regular Season and Tournament Titles** - *overall the Huskies have garnered a total of 31 BIG EAST Championships (17 regular season, 14 tournament).*

During UConn's amazing run of 11 consecutive BIG EAST regular season titles (1994-2004), the Huskies owned a sterling record of **181-7 (.963)**.

The Huskies notched their **seventh undefeated season in BIG EAST games in 2008-09 - the most of any other team in the league.**

UConn also holds the record for most consecutive winning seasons in league play - **with its current streak of 23 consecutive seasons.**

Since 1986-87, the Huskies have been over .500 for the past 23-



straight seasons.

The next closest is Notre Dame, which posted 10 winning seasons in a row from 1995-2005.

UCONN ON CBS: Since the 1995-96 season, the Huskies have made 14 appearances on CBS - posting an 8-6 mark in those games during the regular season, following its 76-63 win over LSU on Jan. 3, 2009.

UConn had dropped its last four games on the network, dating back to a 68-67 loss vs. Duke at the Hartford Civic Center on Jan. 3, 2004, prior to its 100-50 win at Purdue on Jan. 6, 2008.

Prior to that recent losing skid, UConn had won each of its previous four games which were televised nationally on CBS.

HUSKIES IN ROAD OPENERS: Following its No. 25, 2008 win at BYU, UConn boasts a 26-9 record in its first game away from home of the season.

The Huskies have won 12 of their last 13 initial road (or neutral) games of the season following its Nov. 25 win at BYU with the lone loss coming on Nov. 21, 2004 against North Carolina in Raleigh.

SELLOUTS IN HARTFORD: Since 2000, UConn has played in front of 37 sellout crowds at the XL Center.

HEAD COACH GENO AURIEMMA: UConn boss Geno Auriemma is in his 25th season at the helm of the Husky program.

During his decorated tenure at Connecticut, Auriemma has guided the Huskies to six national championships, 10 Final Fours and 32 BIG EAST titles.

Auriemma boasts a career mark of 696-122 (.851) - his career winning percentage of .851 is the best all-time among active NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Coaches.

He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year for the eighth time in 2008-09, and was recognized as the 2009 WBCA and USBW National Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

Overall in his career, Auriemma has received a total of 22 national coach of the year honors.
