1/1 CONNECTICUT (3-0) AT 2009 WBCA CLASSIC

UConn BEGINS A STRETCH OF THREE GAMES IN THREE DAYS AT GAMPSEL:

No. 1/1 Connecticut will play the first of three games over three consecutive days when it plays host to Hofstra on Friday night as part of the 3-day, 3-team, 2009 WBCA Classic at Gampel Pavilion post-Thanksgiving weekend.

The Huskies will follow Friday's contest with games against Richmond (Nov. 28) and Clemson (Nov. 29).

UConn will enjoy six days off following Sunday's game vs. Clemson before resuming its current seven-game homestand on Thursday, Dec. 3 vs. Vermont at Gampel Pavilion.

All three of UConn's games at the 2009 WBCA Classic will be televised live on CPTV.

UConn has won 42 straight games entering the 2009 WBCA Classic

UConn PLAYERS TO BE HONORED PRIOR TO HOFSTRA GAME:

Two UConn players will be honored for recently reaching historical career milestones prior to Friday's game vs. Hofstra.

Kalana Greene will be presented with a ball commemorating her becoming the 33rd player in UConn history to reach 1,000 career points in the season-opener vs. Northeastern.

In addition, **Tina Charles** will be presented a ball to recognize her becoming just the third player in UConn history to record 1,000 rebounds, which was also accomplished in the season-opening win over Northeastern.

UConn AS NO. 1: UConn is 235-11 (.955) all-time when playing as the nation's No. 1 ranked team in the Associated Press Top 25.

The Huskies most recent loss when ranked No. 1 came on April 6, 2008 vs. Stanford.

COUNTDOWN TO 700 FOR GENO:

UConn head coach **Geno Auriemma** enters Friday's game vs. Hofstra with 699 career wins – one shy of 700 for his career.

Auriemma is looking to become the 11th coach in NCAA Division I history (who have spent a minimum of 10 seasons in Division I) to reach 700 career wins.

Auriemma's winning percentage of .851 (699-122) ranks as the best among active NCAA Division I head coaches.

HUSKIES OWN REGULAR SEASON TOURNAMENT PLAY:

Connecticut enters the 2009 WBCA Classic owning a streak 12 straight titles at in-season tournaments.

The Huskies defeated Washington, Northern Colorado and Florida State en route to the 2008 Caribbean Classic title in Cancun, last season and previously claimed the 20087 Paradise jam Title in St. Thomas, U.S.V.I. with wins over Stanford, Old Dominion and Duke.

Prior to that, UConn claimed the 2005 Preseason WNIT Title with wins over Marist, Indiana State, Boston College and Oklahoma.

The Huskies won the 2002 Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, the 2001 Pre-season WNIT, Four in the Fall Tournament in 1998 in San Jose, Calif., the 1997 Pre-season WNIT, the 1996 Connecticut Classic, the 1995 Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, the 1995 Central Fidelity Invitational in Richmond, Va., the 1995 Connecticut Classic and the 1994 Connecticut Classic.

The last time that UConn failed to claim an in-season tournament title came back during the 1992-93 when it dropped a game to Vanderbilt on Dec. 29, 1992 at the Hilton Head (S.C.) Super Shootout.

UConn has won each of its last 37 games that it has played at in-season tournaments.

An in-season tournament is defined as any event in which Connecticut played more than one game en route to the championship.

HUSKIES IN NOVEMBER: The Huskies own an all-time mark of **88-14 (.863)** in games played in the month of November.

The last time UConn dropped a game in the 11th month came on Nov. 21, 2004 at the Jimmy V Classic, when the Huskies fell 71-65 to North Carolina.

UConn has won 23 consecutive games in the month of November.

ALL-TIME VS. HOFSTRA: Friday's game between UConn and Hofstra will mark the **second all-time meeting** between the programs in the sport of women's basketball.

The Huskies own an all-time lead of **1-0** in the series with the Pride with the lone previous meeting coming on Dec. 22, 2005 - an 86-49 Connecticut win.

ALL-TIME VS. RICHMOND: Saturday's game between UConn and Richmond will mark the **second all-time meeting** between the programs in the sport of women's basketball.

The Huskies own an all-time lead of **1-0** in the series with the Spiders with the lone previous meeting coming on Nov. 13, 2006 - an 84-50 Connecticut win.

ALL-TIME VS. CLEMSON: Sunday's game between UConn and Clemson will mark the **fourth all-time meeting** between the programs in the sport of women's basketball.

The Huskies own an all-time lead of **2-1** in the series with the Tigers with the most recent meeting coming on March 19, 2000 - an 83-45 Connecticut win in the second round of the 2000 NCAA Tournament.

UConn lone loss to the Tigers also came in NCAA play - a 61-59 setback on March 17, 1990 in the second round of the 1990 NCAA Tournament - which also marks the Huskies' last NCAA Tournament loss at Gampel Pavilion.

Sunday's game between UConn and Clemson will mark the first time the programs have met outside of the NCAA Tournament.

ALL-TIME VS. COLONIAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION: Friday's game vs. Hofstra will represent UConn's **14th** all-time against a member of the CAA and its second this season following its 105-35 win over Northeastern in the season opener on Nov. 14.

The Huskies own an all-time mark of **13-1** against CAA opponents with the last lone loss coming against Old Dominion on Feb. 13, 1999.

ALL-TIME VS. ATLANTIC-10: Saturday's game vs. Richmond will represent UConn's **70th** all-time against a member of the A-10.

The Huskies own an all-time mark of **32-37** against A-10 opponents with the last lone loss coming against Old Dominion on Feb. 13, 1999.

While the A-10 in the lone league that boasts an all-time winning record against Connecticut, the Huskies have not dropped a contest to an A-10 opponent since losing to St. Joseph's 65-52 on Dec. 28, 1987.

ALL-TIME VS. ACC: Sunday's game vs. Clemson will represent UConn's **43rd** all-time against a member of the ACC and its first of four games scheduled against ACC opponents this season (Florida State, North Carolina, Duke).

The Huskies own an all-time mark of **29-13** against ACC opponents with the last lone loss coming against North Carolina on Jan. 15, 2007.

40 IN A ROW AT HOME: Connecticut has won 40 consecutive regular-season home games - *the nation's longest active streak.*

UConn's last home loss during the regular season came at the hands of a 70-64 loss vs. Tennessee on Jan. 6, 2007.

VS. NON-CONFERENCE AT HOME: Connecticut has won 16 consecutive regular season home games against non-conference opponents dating back to a Jan. 6, 2007 loss to Tennessee.

THE MARGIN OF VICTORY: UConn enters Friday's game vs. Hofstra having won its first three games by an average margin of 49.3 points.

BALANCED SCORING: UConn has seen each of its five starters register double-figure points in two of the first three games this season.

HUSKIES AT 4-0: Connecticut will be seeking to open the season 4-0 for the fifth straight time and the 13th time in the last 14 seasons overall.

The lone exception was in 2004-05, when the Huskies dropped a 71-65 decision vs. North Carolina in Raleigh.

117 STRAIGHT VS. NON-RANKED: Connecticut has won 117 consecutive games against non-ranked opponents.

UConn last loss to an unranked foe on Dec. 21, 2004 at Arizona State (61-50).

BREAKING DOWN THE REGULAR SEASON WIN STREAK:

Connecticut has won 41 consecutive regular season games - dating back to a 73-71 loss at Rutgers on Feb. 5, 2008.

Over the 41-game skein, the Huskies have average a 30.3 margin of victory (1,244 total point differential).

DONT THINK OF SHOOTING OVER .500:

UConn has gone 192 consecutive games without allowing an opponent to shoot over .500 from the field.

The last time a UConn opponent posted a shooting percentage over .500 was Boston College on March 8, 2004.

128 WEEKS ALL-TIME AT NO. 1: UConn earned the No. 1 ranking for a record 128th time on Nov. 23 - extending its lead over Tennessee (112) for the most weeks at the top spot by any NCAA Division I program.

Moore won the Naismith National High School Girl's Player of the Year award in both 2006 and 2007 at Collins Hill High School in Suwanee, Ga., and claimed the college award this past March.

Moore is joined on the list by teammates senior center Tina Charles and sophomore guard Tiffany Hayes.

The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2009-10 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2010 NCAA Women's Final Four in San Antonio, Texas.

In late February, the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors will compile a mid-season team of the top 30 players in the nation. Then in March, the Naismith Trophy voting academy will vote to narrow the list to the four finalists.

Others to accomplish the dual-level feat of winning both a high school and college Naismith Trophy include Connecticut's Diana Taurasi (2000 in high school; and both 2003 and 2004 in college), Tennessee's Tamika Catchings (1997, 1998; 2000), Candace Parker (2003 and 2004; 2008) and Chamique Holdsclaw (1995; 1998 and 1999) and USC's Lisa Leslie (1990; 1994).

She currently boasts 1,034 career points entering Friday's game vs. Hofstra.

HUSKIES BREAK RECORD FOR POINTS IN HALF: UConn opened the 2009-10 season with a bang as it erupted for a school-record 69 points in the first half of its 105-35 win over Northeastern on Saturday, Nov. 14.

The Huskies only two exhibition losses in that span, include a 90-74 loss vs. the U.S. National Team in 2007 and a 79-73 decision to the Houston Jaguars on Nov. 13, 2002 at Gampel Pavilion.

Connecticut has won 14 of its last 15 exhibition games overall.

Moore was a unanimous choice, becoming the seventh player in the history of the team to receive all possible votes.

Jayne Appel of Stanford, Jantel Lavender of Ohio State and Monica Wright of Virginia round out the squad selected by a national media panel.

HUSKIES NO. 1 IN BOTH AP AND COACHES POLLS: The University of Connecticut women's basketball team is ranked No. 1 nationally in the 2009 Associated Press Preseason Top-25, which was released Oct. 31 and the ESPN/USA Today Top 25, which was announced Nov. 3.

This marks the second straight season and the seventh time in the program's history that Connecticut has been ranked No. 1 by the Associated Press in the preseason.

The Huskies received all 40 first-place votes and garnered a total of 1,00 from a national media panel in the Associated Press poll, while they received 40 of 40 first-place votes in the coaches poll.

UConn has captured the NCAA National Championship in four of the previous five seasons it opened as the nation's No. 1 team (1999-00, 2001-02, 2003-04, 2008-09).

It also opened the year ranked No. 1 to start the 1995-96 and 2000-01 seasons.

HUSKIES SLOTTED AS FAVORITES IN BIG EAST PRESEASON POLL. MOORE NAMED PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR:

The University of Connecticut women's basketball team, which swept the 2008-09 BIG EAST regular season and tournament titles en route to the program's sixth NCAA National Championship, has been selected as the favorites to win the 2009-10 BIG EAST women's basketball regular season title by a tally of the league's 16 head coaches, which was announced at the league's annual media day at ESPN Zone in New York City's Time Square.

In the 28 years of BIG EAST women's basketball, Connecticut has been crowned the regular-season champion 17 times, has won 15 league tournament titles and has captured both titles in the same year in 13 seasons.

Connecticut earned 15 first-place votes for a total of 225 points in the poll. The Huskies went 16-0 in league play a year ago, finished the season with a [perfect 39-0 overall record, earned a berth to the NCAA Championship for the 21st straight year and advanced to their 10th Final Four. UConn returns four of its five starters from last year's NCAA National Championship Team, and lost just three letterwinners from that squad.

UConn sophomore Maya Moore, was chosen as the 2009-10 BIG EAST Preseason Player of Year, for the second straight season.

Joining Moore on the Preseason All-BIG EAST Team is Tina Charles and Kalana Greene was an honorable mention all-league choice.

BIG EAST EXTENDS TOURNAMENT AGREEMENT WITH HARTFORD: The 2010 BIG EAST Women's Basketball Championship will return to the XL Center in Hartford, Conn. for the **seventh straight year.**

The 2010 championship will be held **March 5-9** with five full days of action and 15 games. The BIG EAST's teams will battle for the conference tournament title and one will earn the league's automatic bid to the 64-team NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship.

"We are extremely pleased to have the BIG EAST Women's Basketball Championship remain in Hartford for another two years," said Tringhese "We believe we have one of the premier women's basketball championships in the nation in terms of competitiveness and attendance. Further, we are excited to continue to showcase our nationally recognized programs in a public arena that resides in the heart of a city that supports collegiate women's basketball with such enthusiasm."

HUSKIES + BIG EAST = 32 TITLES: Connecticut has amassed an astounding **32** BIG EAST titles in the program's history following its sweep of both the league regular season and tournament titles in 2009 - **marking the second straight season and the 13th time in the program's history that the Huskies have pulled off the double.**

The Huskies followed a **16-0** regular season conference mark (**17th title**) by winning **three straight** over South Florida, Villanova and Louisville by an average of **35.3** ppg to claim their **15th** BIG EAST Tournament championship.

CHARLES SITS IN THIRD ON CAREER SWAT LIST: UConn's **Tina Charles** is wasting no time in making her assault on the UConn career block list.

Charles currently is third among UConn career block leaders at 214.

HUSKIES AT THE XL CENTER: UConn boasts an all-time mark of **98-11 (.899)** in games played at the XL Center.

UConn was a perfect **11-0** in 2009-10 at the XL Center and has won those games by an average of **32.4** points.

The Huskies are **15-2** in BIG EAST Tournament games at the XL Center since the event moved to the facility in 2004 - over that span UConn has garnered four titles.

The Huskies have won each of their last 24 games played at the XL Center in Hartford, dating back to a 55-47 loss vs. Rutgers on March 6, 2007 - in the championship game of the 2007 BIG EAST Tournament.

VS. THE BIG EAST (EXCEPT RUTGERS): The Huskies last loss to a BIG EAST opponent in the regular season not named Rutgers came on Feb. 26, 2005 at Boston College, which is now a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The Huskies last conference loss to a current league member other than Rutgers dates back to a Jan. 30, 2005 loss to Notre Dame (65-59).

Connecticut has won **63** straight BIG EAST regular season games against opponents other than Rutgers.

BIG EAST HOME COURT STREAK: UConn has won its last **25** BIG EAST Conference home games - dating back to a Feb. 7, 2006 loss vs. Rutgers (60-56).



AURIEMMA MOVES UP ALL-TIME AP POLL LIST: UConn head coach **Geno Auriemma** moved past Kay Yow for **fifth** all-time in AP Poll appearances with his **331st** on **Nov. 23**.

Auriemma currently sits four behind Rene Portland for fourth place overall.

BIG EAST DOMINANCE: The Huskies boast an overall record of **347-84 (.806)** in regular season BIG EAST play - and have won either the BIG EAST Regular Season or Tournament title in each of the past **16** seasons - including the **2007-08 BIG EAST Regular Season and Tournament Titles - overall the Huskies have garnered a total of 31 BIG EAST Championships (17 regular season, 14 tournament).**

During UConn's amazing run of 11 consecutive BIG EAST regular season titles (1994-2004), the Huskies owned a sterling record of **181-7 (.963)**.

The Huskies notched their **seventh undefeated season in BIG EAST games in 2008-09 - the most of any other team in the league.**

UConn also holds the record for most consecutive winning seasons in league play - **with its current streak of 23 consecutive seasons.**

Since 1986-87, the Huskies have been over .500 for the past 23-straight seasons.

The next closest is Notre Dame, which posted 10 winning seasons in a row from 1995-2005.

UCONN ON CBS: Since the 1995-96 season, the Huskies have made **14** appearances on CBS - posting an **8-6** mark in those games during the regular season, following its 76-63 win over LSU on Jan. 3, 2009.

UConn had dropped its last four games on the network, dating back to a 68-67 loss vs. Duke at the Hartford Civic Center on Jan. 3, 2004, prior to its 100-50 win at Purdue on Jan. 6, 2008.

Prior to that recent losing skid, UConn had won each of its previous four games which were televised nationally on CBS.

SELLOUTS IN HARTFORD: Since 2000, UConn has played in front of **37** sellout crowds at the XL Center.

HEAD COACH GENO AURIEMMA: UConn boss **Geno Auriemma** is in his **25th** season at the helm of the Husky program.

During his decorated tenure at Connecticut, Auriemma has guided the Huskies to six national championships, 10 Final Fours and 32 BIG EAST titles.

Auriemma boasts a career mark of 699-122 (.851) - his career winning percentage of .851 is the best all-time among active NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Coaches.

He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year for the **eighth** time in 2008-09, and was recognized as the 2009 WBCA and USBW National Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

Overall in his career, Auriemma has received a total of **22 national coach of the year honors.**



LAST TIME VS. HOFSTRA

HARTFORD, Conn. (Dec. 22, 2005) - Sophomore Mel Thomas (Cincinnati, Ohio) scored a career-high 25 points as the No. 8/8 University of Connecticut women's basketball team defeated Hofstra, 86-49, on Thursday evening in the Hartford Civic Center. It was the second-consecutive game in which Thomas had matched or eclipsed her career-high scoring total.

With the win, which marks the Huskies third-straight, UConn improves to 9-1 on the season while Hofstra falls to 4-4.

Thomas topped her previous career high of 23 points, which she had registered twice this season, most recently in the UConn win over Holy Cross on Dec. 19. She has now scored in double figures in seven games this season and 13 times in her career.

The Huskies quickly took control of the game as they opened up a 10-2 lead with 13:15 left to go in the first half. The lead jumped up to 20 in the half before UConn closed out the half with the score standing at 37-22.

For the game, UConn shot 45.7 percent from the field, including going 20-34 in the second half of play. They made 32 field goals in the game and the forced the Pride to turn the ball over 33 times. UConn capitalized on those turnovers, scoring 41 points off of them.

It was the sixth time in 10 games this season in which the Huskies have limited their opponent to under 50 points and it was also the sixth contest in which UConn has held the opposing team to a shooting percentage of less than 35 percent.

For the game, Thomas was joined in double figures by three other Huskies. Senior Ann Strother (Castle Rock, Colo.) had 12 points while senior forward Barbara Turner (Cleveland, Ohio) posted her second-straight double-double with 10 points and a career-high 16 rebounds. Turner now has nine career double-doubles and three this year.

Freshman Renee Montgomery (St. Albans, W.Va.) scored 11 points for her third double-figure scoring game of the season. Montgomery also registered eight steals. It was a career-high for the guard and is the third-most in UConn history. For the game, Montgomery dished out five assists.

Hofstra was led by a pair of double-figure scorers as Lana Harshaw came off the bench to score 12 points and Vanessa Gidden added 10. Amaka Aguga had 11 rebounds to lead the Pride.

UConn will return to action on Thursday, Dec. 29 when the Huskies will host Albany at the Hartford Civic Center at 7:00 p.m. The game will be televised on CPTV.

SIGN FOUR-YEAR EXTENSION**

STORRS, Conn. (March 1, 2008) – The University of Connecticut Division of Athletics and Connecticut Public Television (CPTV) have signed a new four-year contract extension for CPTV to continue to be UConn's exclusive local market television broadcast partner for women's basketball.

Under the agreement, all local television rights for UConn women's basketball which are controlled by the University are assigned to CPTV. All other UConn games are controlled by the BIG EAST Conference and subject to Conference television contracts.

The agreement runs from the 2008-09 academic year through 2011-12 and calls for CPTV to televise a minimum of 68 UConn women's basketball games over the four-year contract period.

"The UConn Division of Athletics and Connecticut Public Television have the most unique partnership in college sports television today," says UConn Director of Athletics Jeffrey Hathaway, pictured above with Jerry Franklin of CPTV. "We are very pleased to announce that our partnership with CPTV to provide local market television coverage of Husky women's basketball games will continue through the 2011-12 season. UConn receives more media attention on both the national and local level than any other women's basketball team in the country and this agreement with CPTV will ensure that will continue for years to come."

This latest agreement will generate a minimum of \$3,600,000 in cash to the University. CPTV will guarantee UConn seasonal rights of \$1,000,000 for the 2008-09 women's basketball local market television rights and that fee for the following years will be -- \$1,000,000 in 2009-2010, \$800,000 in 2010-11 and \$800,000 in 2011-12.

The \$900,000 average annual rights fee is a 12% increase from the previous contract which averaged \$802,000 per year.

Among the new elements of the agreement is the ability for the University to share in corporate underwriting revenue and to sell a signature sponsorship associated with women's basketball broadcasts on CPTV.

"Connecticut Public Television has set the standard for the televising of college women's basketball," says Hathaway. "CPTV began to televise our women's basketball games in 1994 and has become a very important reason why our women's basketball program enjoys so much success on an annual basis. We appreciate (CPTV President and CEO) Jerry Franklin's leadership and the tremendous support and dedication provided by CPTV's viewers and staff."

In addition to the UConn games on CPTV, the agreement calls for the continuation of The Geno Auriemma Show, which appears on CPTV 12 times during the season.

"We're incredibly pleased to be able to continue our relationship with the University of Connecticut," says Jerry Franklin, President and CEO of Connecticut Public Television. "Our unique programming partnership with UConn Athletics has had a substantial impact on women's basketball across the country. With the support of our viewers, we've been able to showcase the remarkable talents of the women's basketball program and expand the reach of the sport to Connecticut residents and beyond.

"What we've jointly created - UConn Athletics, CPTV and the people of Connecticut - is a tribute to the loyalty of our basketball fans. It's fitting that this women's basketball team, through our landmark partnership, has become recognized as one of the most admired and respected teams in the country."

CPTV began its coverage of UConn women's basketball late in the 1993-94 season, covering the championship game of the 1994 BIG EAST Women's Basketball Tournament and televising three games in the 1994 NCAA Tournament. During the past 15 seasons, Connecticut Public Television has televised a total of 308 UConn women's basketball games. In those 308 games, Connecticut has compiled a stunning 300-8 overall record.

During the 2007-08 season, CPTV carried a total of 24 UConn women's basketball games.

The University and CPTV take great pride in the fact that UConn Women's Basketball on CPTV continues to be the highest-rated locally produced public television program in the nation.

Charles, who was 11-of-17 from the field in the game, led six Huskies (1-0) in double-figures. She was joined by junior Maya Moore, who added 18 points and 10 rebounds, while sophomore Tiffany Hayes had 14 and senior Kalana Greene had 13. Senior Meghan Gardler and sophomore Caroline Doty each added 10 points for UConn, which improved to 31-5 overall in home openers with the win over Northeastern (0-1).

UConn opened the game on a 28-0 run in the first 5:34 of the contest, including nine points from Charles and eight from Doty. Charles led all scorers at the break with 17 on 7-of-9 shooting from the floor with nine rebounds and one assist. With those nine rebounds, Charles became just the third player in UConn history to tally 1,000 career rebounds. Moore had 12 points on 5-of-7 shooting with seven rebounds, two assists and one steal while Hayes also had 12 points to go along with two rebounds, four assists and two steals.

The Huskies led 69-15 at halftime and shot .683 (28-of-41) from the floor while holding Northwestern to just .160 (4-of-25) in the half. The 69 points scored by the Huskies was the most in program history in any half, besting the 68 points scored in the first half against Providence on January 6, 1998.

Northeastern opened the second half with a 3-pointer by Brittany Wilson, but UConn followed that with 11 points to take an 81-18 lead with 13:28 to play and did not look back. Charles added to her 39th career double-double total with nine points and four rebounds in the second half. Moore, who recorded her 28th career double-double in the victory, added six points and three boards in the final half.

UConn finished the game shooting .600 (42-of-70) from the field and also grabbed 61 rebounds, including 41 on the defensive end. Northwestern shot .193 (11-of-57) from the floor in the game.

With her 13 points, Greene became the 33rd player in UConn history to reach the 1,000-point plateau. Red-shirt freshman Heather Buck had four points and 12 rebounds in her first collegiate game.

Rachael Pecota led the way for Northeastern with 10 points and four points, while Kim Carr and Kashaia Cannon each had seven points.

The 105 points scored by UConn in the game marks the 60th time in program history that the team has scored at least 100 points, and the last time it happened was March 22, 2009, a 104-65 victory over Vermont in the first round of the 2009 NCAA Tournament. The 70-point margin of victory for the Huskies on Saturday was the largest for a UConn team since defeating Long Island in the first round of the NCAA Tournament by 72 (101-29) on March 17, 2001.

SAN ANTONIO, Texas - Junior Maya Moore led all scorers with 20 points, while adding 11 rebounds for her 29th career double-double as the No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team defeated No. 10/13 Texas 83-58 on Tuesday night in the AT&T Center.

Moore led the way with 20 points, 10 of which she recorded from the free throw line, while senior Tina Charles added 15 points and 11 rebounds for 40th career double-double. All five starters registered double-figures, as sophomores Tiffany Hayes and Caroline Doty added 10 and 13 points, respectively. Kalana Greene finished the night seven-of-12 from the field for 14 points.

After an opening 3-0 lead was tied by Texas, UConn recorded a 22-6 run in a span of 8:11 to take a 25-9 lead midway through the first half. The Huskies held the Longhorns without a field goal for a period of 7:02 in the half, while holding Texas to a .222 clip (9-of-35). UConn's lead in the first frame was extended to 21 as Doty knocked down a three pointer with seven seconds on the clock before the halftime break.

Doty led all scorers at intermission with 12 points, while Moore added 11 as the Huskies' shot .500 (16-for-32). Greene was four-of-eight in the first half to add eight points to UConn's tally. The Huskies continued to dominate in the second half as they shot .452 (14-of-31) from the field, while holding Texas to a .400 (12-of-30) showing from the floor, including three-of-nine from behind the arc. The Huskies were led by Greene in the second frame, who earned her 51st career game with double-figure points.

UConn finished the night shooting .484 (30-of-62) from the field and outrebounded the Texas 47-36. The Longhorns shot .323 (21-of-65), including a 5-of-18 clip from behind the arc in tonight's contest.

Charles' 15 points moved her past Shea Ralph (1,678) for ninth place on the UConn career scoring list as tonight marked her 86th game with double-figure points.

Moore's 20 points marked her 44th career game in double-figures, while her four blocked shots in the first half matched her single-game best from a year ago.

With the win, the Huskies improve to 142-53 all-time versus Top-25 AP ranked teams. UConn has now won its 41st consecutive game by 10 points or more with the non-conference victory.

WORCESTER, Mass. - The No. 1/1 University of Connecticut women's basketball team won its 42nd straight game and outscored the Crusaders 54-4 in the paint as the Huskies cruised to 87-34 victory over Holy Cross on Friday night at the DCU Center in Worcester, Mass.

Junior Maya Moore scored 21 points, while pulling down seven rebounds in 23 minutes of play as senior Tina Charles added 18 points and nine rebounds for the Huskies in tonight's contest. Caroline Doty added 11 points on 4-of-5 shooting for UConn, including a 3-of-4 clip from behind the arc.

In their 18th all-time victory over Holy Cross, UConn opened tonight's contest with a 16-3 run on 14 points from inside the paint as the Huskies established themselves early on both ends of the court. Moore led the charge as she recorded 12 points in a span of 2:19 during the first half, improving her tally to 15 points in the first 12:50 of play as UConn took a 37-14 lead.

The UConn defense dominated from the tip as it recorded 12 steals in the first half and did not allow a point in the paint to the Crusaders until the 4:17 mark. Holy Cross committed 17 first-half turnovers, giving UConn 32 points on those mistakes. UConn shot .556 (20-of-36) before the break as the Huskies held Holy Cross to .364 (8-of-22) from the field.

Moore led both teams with 15 points heading into intermission on 6-of-9 shooting from the floor. The junior captain added six rebounds and four steals. The Crusaders knocked down five 3-pointers in the first half, tying the most given up by the Huskies in an entire game this season.

Charles picked up her 87th career game in double-figures with 12 first-half points as the Huskies led 52-22 at the break.

The Huskies continued where they left off in the first half as they began the second frame with a 15-2 run in the first 5:36. Kalana Greene extended UConn's lead to 54 in the second half with a layup to make the score 87-33 late in the game. With the victory, UConn has now won 42 consecutive games by a margin of 10 points or more as head coach Geno Auriemma earned his 699th career victory.

UConn finished the night shooting .603 (35-of-58) from the floor and out rebounded the Crusaders 37-21. Holy Cross shot .267 (12-of-45), including a 6-of-16 clip from behind the arc after making five of those 3-pointers in the first half. The six made three-pointers marks the most give up by UConn so far this season.
