



MEN'S BASKETBALL: Titans Challenge No. 1-Ranked Bruins

IN A NUTSHELL: Cal State Fullerton takes its 5-1 record and best start since 1998-99 (5-1 before losing at Saint Louis) into Pauley Pavilion to challenge the No. 1-ranked UCLA Bruins (6-0), who are coming off two lopsided wins over Big West teams Long Beach State and UC Riverside. Fullerton is 0-8 against UCLA, all in Pauley Pavilion. Then it's on to Pepperdine Saturday for a likely run-and-gun battle with the Waves.

SERIES HISTORY: UCLA has won all eight meetings, all in Pauley Pavilion, the most recent on Dec. 13, 1997, a 120-91 rout. That's the most points the Titans ever allowed in a game. A brief series synopsis:

- Dec. 29, 1986 - Bruins hang on for 72-71 win (Henry Turner trey at buzzer for CSF for 21 pts.); Charles Rochelin 8-for-9 FGs for 17 points
- Dec. 28, 1987 - Rochelin goes 7-for-7 for 14 points in 74-65 Bruins' win; Titans lead by one early in second half; Turner gets 24
- Dec. 23, 1989 - Don MacLean 26 and Trevor Wilson 23 as Bruins overpower Titans, 87-75; Mark Hill 24, Cedric Ceballos 18 for CSF
- Dec. 23, 1991 - No. 2-ranked UCLA wins, 86-80, after CSF led, 74-73 at 3:19 behind Agee Ward's 30 points; MacLean 23 for UCLA
- Dec. 30, 1992 - Don Leary hits first 5 treys (8 of 15 for game for 25 points); Bruce Bowen gets 25, but UCLA wins, 90-82; Ed O'Bannon 23
- Dec. 10, 1994 - 44-40 UCLA with 18:00 to go; 99-65 final; O'Bannons combine for 41 (Charles 23, Ed 18); Winston Peterson 26 for CSF
- Nov. 28, 1995 - Defending NCAA champs hear boos as CSF leads opener at half, 30-29; final 79-63; J. R. Henderson & Chuck Overton 19
- Dec. 13, 1997 - Game is close for 10 minutes... J. R. Henderson 23 points for UCLA, Chris Dade 26 for CSF

Vs. NO. 1: Fullerton has played the nation's No. 1-ranked team at least six times, all in the form of UNLV. The last meeting was on March 2, 1991, in Titan Gym as Larry Johnson and Stacey Augmon, et al, completed an unbeaten regular season. Fullerton scored a memorable 86-78 victory over the unbeaten and No. 1-ranked Rebels on Feb. 24, 1983, in an overflow Titan Gym. Fullerton's most recent game against a highly ranked team was a Nov. 30, 1996, loss (74-67) in Titan Gym to No. 4-ranked Utah (Keith Van Horn and Andre Miller).

ABOUT THE BRUINS: UCLA Head Coach Ben Howland and Titans' Head Coach Bob Burton are good friends and UCLA assistant Donny Daniels was Fullerton's head coach for the three seasons prior to Burton's arrival. But Howland and Daniels aren't playing. Arron Afflalo (16.7 ppg), Josh Shipp (13.5 ppg), Luc Richard Mbah a Moute (13.3 ppg, 8.8 rpg), Darren Collison (12.0 ppg, 6.8 apg) and Lorenzo Mata (7.3 ppg, 7.0 rpg) are. UCLA rode last year's national runnerup spot and the championship of the Maui Invitational in late November to the top of the polls. Maybe they will be looking ahead to Texas A&M in the Wooden Classic in Orange County on Saturday.

ABOUT THE TITANS: The Titans are trying to post their third consecutive winning season, something that hasn't been done in Fullerton since Coach George McQuarn posted four winning records between 1981-82 and 1984-85. They got off to a 4-0 start for the first time since 1989-90, but then lost at Eastern Washington, 110-100. They came back to complete a home-and-home sweep of Texas-San Antonio on Saturday night, 76-67. They are averaging 90 points a game and have six players averaging in double digits.

The Titans feature three returning "regulars" in seniors Bobby Brown at point guard and Justin Burns at center and junior guard Frank Robinson, who was the Big West Conference's "sixth-man" of the year in 2005-06. Four-year transfers Scott Cutley and Marcus Crenshaw from Kent State and Ray Reed from Georgetown have made an immediate impact along with community college transfers Kenneth Alexander and Marcus Morgan from West Valley, Andrew Green from College of the Sequoias and Chris Minardo from Citrus College. Six different players (Minardo, Reed, Crenshaw, Cutley, Brown and Burns) have led the Titans in scoring in their first six games.

THE COACH: Bob Burton is 53-42 in his fourth year at Cal State Fullerton and career. At .558, Burton has the second best winning percentage of any Titans' head coach, trailing only Bobby Dye (109-78, .583). He is 1-1 vs. the Pac-10 (L at Arizona State and W at Oregon State).

ON THE ROAD: Under Coach Bob Burton, the Titans have made dramatic strides as a road team. In the past two seasons plus so far this year they are 22-18 away from Titan Gym. In the previous 10 seasons the combined road record was 30-115.

BOBBY FOCAL POINT: Senior point guard Bobby Brown is the focal point of the Cal State Fullerton program. An unheralded product of Westchester High School in Los Angeles, he has developed into one of the nation's finest players and an All-America candidate. He tested the NBA

draft waters last summer but opted to return for his senior year. He has been nominated for the Bob Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard and is on CollegeInsider.com's pre-season Mid-Major All-American team. He has made numerous pre-season All-Big West Conference teams and is projected as player of the year by many. Last year he was first-team All-Big West and second-team All-NABC

District. He needs 462 points this season to become the Titans' all-time leading scorer, surpassing All-American, Olympic gold medalist and 6-year NBA veteran Leon Wood. After three games he is averaging 16.3 points and 4.0 assists while making 8 of 20 3-point field goals.

SUPER SUB: Junior Frank Robinson was the key Titan off the bench last year when he was selected the "sixth man" of the year in the Big West Conference. He became a starter for the final three weeks of the season and played to an all-conference level, averaging 16.6 points over the last seven games capped by a 25-point, 12-rebound effort in defeat to Long Beach State in the semifinals of the post-season tournament. Overall, he averaged 11.5 points and 5.1 rebounds and was No. 3 in the conference in 3-point field goal accuracy at .445 (49 of 110). He also led the conference in steals at 1.66 per game. In three starts this year he has twice scored 16 points.

BURNS WINS HONOR: Senior Justin Burns was selected the Big West Conference Player of the Week last week after posting a pair of double-doubles in victories at Texas-San Antonio and Louisiana-Lafayette. He averaged 15 points, 13 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2 blocks for the week. With three double-doubles this season, he has moved into the Titans' career Top 12 list with 8. He had five double-doubles and picked up another one against Cal Maritime with 18 points and 11 rebounds.

SCOTT CUTLEY: Kent State transfer Ray Cutley broke in with a bang, scoring 31 points with 11 rebounds in his Titan debut at Louisiana-Lafayette. It was only the 62nd 30-point game by a Titan at the Div. I level. He scored the game-tying buckets in the final minute of both regulation and overtime. He came back with 19 points at Eastern Washington and a double-double with 12 points and 10 boards vs. Texas-San Antonio.

RAY REED: Georgetown transfer Ray Reed leads the Titans in points (89), assists (25) and steals (18) through the first six games. He just missed a triple-double against Hope International when he had 23 points, 10 rebounds and 9 assists.

MARCUS CRENSHAW: He started the first three games and averaged 18 points. Playing considerably less minutes, he has averaged 6.5 points in the last two games. He leads the team with 11 3-point field goals.

Vs. THE PAC-10: Fullerton is 3-19 vs. the Pac-10 but won its most recent meeting, 85-83 in overtime, at Oregon State on Mar. 16, 2005, in the post-season NIT. The team-by-team breakdown: 1-0 vs. Washington; 1-1 vs. Oregon State; 1-2 vs. Arizona; 0-1 vs. California; 0-2 vs. USC; 0-2 vs. Arizona State; 0-3 vs. Oregon; and 0-8 vs. UCLA.

WESTCHESTER CONNECTION: Westchester High School, one of California's most successful prep basketball programs in recent times, leaves a lot of flavor on the Titans' roster. Current players Bobby Brown, Scott Cutley and Jarrel Lake all played there while Titan Assistant Coach Marlon Morton was on the WHS staff. Last year's team had two more former Comets in Jerard Moret (who transferred to West L.A. College) and John Clemmons (eligibility expired).

ONLY ONE NEW STOP: Lafayette, Louisiana, with its Cajundome is the only stop on the Titans' basketball itinerary this year where the Titans have not previously competed. Conversely, three new opponents are visiting Titan Gym -- California Maritime, Bethune Cookman and Louisiana-Lafayette.

SURVEY SAYS: Cal State Fullerton was a consensus third-place prediction at the annual Big West Conference Basketball Media Day on Oct. 25. Both the media and coaches polls had Fullerton behind Pacific and Long Beach State.

The Titans opened at home for the second year in a row but for only the second time since 1994-95. They got their inaugural look at a sister CSU campus squad -- California Maritime Academy -- and had little problem defeating the Div. II NAIA squad.

Sophomore forward Chris Minardo scored the first points of the season -- a 3-pointer two minutes into the game -- to ignite a 9-0 start. He made three more treys between 15:24 and 12:49 on the clock for a 20-5 advantage and the rout was on.

Cal Maritime committed 15 first-half turnovers -- 27 for the game -- and the Titans turned them into 19 first-half points or one less than the halftime margin. Ray Reed, also making his Titan debut, had 5 steals in the first half alone.

The Titans were playing without suspended Bobby Brown, Frank Robinson, Scott Cutley and Curtis Battles, who were serving the first of 3-game suspensions for misuse of book vouchers.

The visiting Keelhaulers, who came in with a 1-2 record, got 19 points from reserve guard Will Williams and 14 from starter Cody Gatton. They managed only 3 offensive rebounds in the game while Fullerton got 20 caroms on the offensive end.

The 52-point margin of victory equalled Fullerton's best ever. The Titans beat Seattle University, 91-39, on Dec. 16, 1985. The 108-point total has been bettered only 12 times by the Titans, who scored 60 points in the second half.

A second home game against a second NAIA opponent produced a second lopsided victory for the Titans, who ended up with a 2-0 record for the second year in a row but only the third time since 1989-90.

The main difference in this game compared to the Cal Maritime contest was the first 7 minutes. Hope opened an early 7-4 lead and Trent Hardeman's 3-point field goal at 12:54 tied the game at 12-12. But the Titans went on a 14-0 run with Andrew Green buckets bracketing the spurt and only for a few seconds did Hope ever get the margin back down to a single digit at 26-17.

The Royals played the Titans even for the first 11 minutes of the second half and actually outscored them by a point. But a 6-0 spurt in about a minute produced a more comfortable 24-point lead with 8:22 remaining.

Ray Reed was the game's star. With 23 points, 10 rebounds and 9 assists, he came up only an assist shy of the second triple-double in Titan history (Ralph Holmes did it vs. Cal State Northridge on Mar. 5, 2005).

In a strange performance at the foul line, the Titans made 20 of 30 overall. On their first attempts, they were 14 of 17 but on second tries they were only 6 of 13.

Playing on the road and with a lineup still shy of three starters, the Titans seemed an unlikely winner of a pre-Thanksgiving afternoon game in San Antonio. When they fell behind the host Raodrunners, 28-11, 13:33 into the game, it seemed inevitable.

But with a second-half rally spurred by the play of the only veteran of the Titans' loss to San Antonio a year earlier in a Florida Tournament, the Titans came back to win and match their 3-0 start of the previous season.

Justin Burns scored all 16 of his points after intermission including six in the first two minutes to get the Titans thinking more positively. Still down by double digits at 50-39 with 13:56 to play, the Titans embarked on a 12-0 run capped by a 3-pointer by Chris Minardo and two Burns free throws for a 51-50 lead with 8 minutes to play.

The Roadrunners regained the lead on a 3-point basket by leading scorer Isaiah Allen and they led and were tied until the final minute. Marcus Crenshaw's 3-pointer made it a 1-point game at the 3-minute mark and the Titans took the lead for good when Burns fed Kenneth Alexander for an easy bucket with 51 seconds to go. Melvin Smith missed two free throws for UTSA and Ray Reed made a pair for a 66-63 Titan lead at 0:30. Smith missed a jumper, Crenshaw rebounded and made one free throw with 3 seconds left to clinch the unlikely victory.

The cards were definitely stacked against the Titans when they made their first venture to the Cajundome at the University of Louisiana in Lafayette. The host Cajuns had won 52 of their previous 57 home games and 17 non-conference games in a row. The visiting Titans were breaking in three "new" players as Bobby Brown, Scott Cutley and Frank Robinson came off 3-game suspensions.

When the smoke had cleared in overtime, the Titans were 4-0 for the first time since 1989 or when Bruce Bowen was a freshman. Bobby Brown's length-of-the-floor drive to a bank shot with 3.5 seconds to play was the game winner when Ross Mouton missed a 3-point try at the buzzer.

Cutley made an impressive Titan debut. He helped fuel the Titans' run to an early 29-11 lead and then made the shots that tied the game in regulation and overtime on his way to an impressive double-double. The Cajuns used an 18-2 run beginning at the 10-minute mark to get back in the game. Fullerton weathered the charge and led most of the way. But Louisiana led, 54-51, and had a 2-point lead on 3 occasions, the last at 78-76 with 42 seconds left after a bucket by David Dees, who would post the sixth best opponent scoring total against the Titans (since 1980-81).

It took four consecutive missed free throws by the Cajuns in a 4-second span in the final minute of overtime for the Titans to hold on. The Cajuns had made 31 of their first 37. Brown made one of two charities for an 89-87 lead with 28 seconds left but Dees muscled his way into for a tying layup with about 10 seconds to go.

The third leg of the Titans' week-long Thanksgiving Weekend road trip proved the most challenging in every sense.

After a few hours very late Friday night to experience Bourbon Street, the Titans traveled all day Saturday from New Orleans via Salt Lake City to Spokane, where the temperature was 45 degrees cooler. On Sunday they did little but practice that night on Reese Court.

Then they ran into an Eastern Washington team that had just played Top 20 Washington even on the road down to the final minute. And they ran into one of the nation's finest players in sophomore guard Rodney Stuckey, who would get his average of 27 points.

As they did in Louisiana, the Titans got off to a good start. They used an 18-3 run to bolt from a 20-20 tie into a 38-23 lead with 8:22 to go in the first half. But the Eagles came back with a 24-7 surge and the Titans had to spurt for a 2-point halftime lead.

Fullerton scored the first 6 points of the second half but the Eagles came back with the next 12.

The decisive run came in the 34th through 38th minutes. EWU used a 10-run to build a 98-87 lead. Scott Cutley's basket made it a 6-point game with 2:17 to play but the Eagles grabbed two offensive rebounds to set up two Stuckey free throws and the Titans never got closer than 7 points.

**Anatomy of
a 3-Game Road Trip**

On only four previous occasions had a Div. I Cal State Fullerton men's basketball team embarked on a 3-game road trip (also played a pair of 3-game tournaments at one site). None were as ambitious nor as successful on the court, as the Titans came away with a 2-1 record after games in Texas, Louisiana and Washington.

The itinerary called for a 7-night trip to 3 cities in 3 states utilizing 4 hotels and 4 airlines -- all during the hectic Thanksgiving Holiday Weekend. None were familiar sites -- the Titans never had played in Lafayette, only once more than 20 years ago in San Antonio and only once before in Cheney.

A 13-player travel party embarked but only 9 were eligible to play on Nov. 22 in San Antonio. A dozen were available on Nov. 24 in Lafayette and the full contingent suited up in Cheney on Nov. 27 although one was scratched due to a groin pull.

The Titans overcame a 17-point deficit to win at UTSA, 67-63; they blew an 18-point lead before coming from behind both in the second half and overtime for a 91-89 victory at ULaLa and they played a competitive EWU team virtually even for 34 minutes before fatigue took its toll and they lost 110-100, posting the highest losing score in school history.

The Titans and Roadrunners of UTSA played the second half of their in-season home-and-home series and logic dictated that the Titans would be the favorites.

Playing in San Antonio in their first Div. I game against an opponent with four games under its belt and with three CSF starters out, the Titans had overcome all of that plus a 17-point deficit for a 4-point victory. The Titans would complete the sweep but the win did not come easily.

The Roadrunners came out hot in the second half and hit their first three 3-point field goal tries and eventually whittle a 12-point deficit down to 2 at 48-46 with 11:28 to play.

The Titans went on an 11-2 run only to see most of that gain erased when Kurt Attway hit back-to-back treys to make it a 59-54 Titans' lead. But Bobby Brown made a trey and then cashed in two free throws after a technical foul was called on UTSA Coach Brooks Thompson. UTSA never got closer than 8 points again and Fullerton built a 16-point lead before the visitors scored the game's final 7 points.

UTSA dug itself a hole in the first half, making only 3 of 11 free throws. It led only at 2-0 and fell behind 14-3 5:17 into the game.

Marcus Crenshaw was the only Titan substitute to make a serious contribution and he left after an ankle injury.

Justin Burns shared the scoring lead with Brown to become the sixth Titan to be the team's high scorer in 6 games.
