"PLAY BALL!": The No. 9 Cal State Fullerton softball team, 2002 Big West Conference Champions and winners of its last nine consecutive games, kicks off the NCAA's "second season" this week as the Titans travel to Fresno, Calif., to take on five other teams in NCAA Regional play beginning on Thursday (May 16) and continuing through Sunday (May 19) at Bulldog Diamond.

Fullerton is the top-seeded team in the regional and will face No. 6 Evansville (champions of the Missouri Valley Conference) in the first round on Thursday at noon. Future opponents and game times are to be determined.

WITH A LITTLE HELP FROM OUR FRIENDS: Cal State Fullerton did its part this past weekend, sweeping Cal Poly to stay in the race for the Big West title, but the Titans clinched their third consecutive crown outright when Cal State Northridge split its doubleheader with Pacific on Friday (May 10). Fullerton has now won or shared in six Big West titles dating back to the sport's debut in league play in 1986.

CAL STATE FULLERTON REGIONAL HISTORY: The Titans are making their 21st appearance in regional play in the 23-year history of the sport at Cal State Fullerton, including a trip in each of the last four seasons. Fullerton is 34-27 overall in regional play and 56-41 all-time in the postseason.

The Titans are 4-5 this season against this year's regional field, posting a 2-0 record against Fresno State, a 1-0 mark against California, a 1-2 record against Pacific and an 0-3 record against Stanford. Thursday's game against Evansville will mark the first meeting between the two schools in the sport of softball.

In the postseason, the Titans are 1-1 against Fresno State, defeating the Bulldogs, 2-1, in 1987 and losing 4-3 in the 2000 regionals also held at Fresno State. Against California, Cal State Fullerton leads the series 4-3, posting wins in 1981 (3-2 and 3-1 in regional play and 1-0 in the College World Series) and 3-0 in 1986. The Golden Bears prevailed in 1980 by the scores of 1-0 and 4-0 and in the 2000 regionals at Fresno State by the score of 3-2.

HEAD-TO-HEAD: Cal State Fullerton holds a 98-79 all-time record against this week's regional field • The Titans are 21-11 overall against California, including a 2-1 victory earlier this season at the Worth Invitational in eight innings • Fullerton is 45-24 against Pacific as the teams have split their last six meetings • The Tigers took 2-of-3 from the Titans earlier this year • Stanford and Fresno State are two of four schools (who have faced Cal State Fullerton five times or more) who have a winning record against the Titans in the all-time series (Sam Houston State is 4-1 and Washington is 10-5 against the Titans all time) • Fresno State leads the series 35-29, but the Titans have won both meetings between the two schools this year • Stanford leads the all-time series 9-3 and has won the last eight meetings, including three victories this season.

AS THE WORLD TOURNEY'S: Cal State Fullerton has posted a 325-146 (.690) overall record in tournament play (both regular season and postseason) since the program began back in 1980. In regular season tournaments that the Titans have hosted, Fullerton has posted a 117-52 (.692) record in 27 events. The Titans have posted a losing record in a regular season tourney at home only four times.



SCOUTING THE CARDINAL: The second-seeded Stanford Cardinal finished the 2002 regular season with a 43-18 overall record and a 7-14 mark in the Pacific-10 Conference. Stanford began the season with victories in 27 of its first 29 contests, but fell on hard times once conference began, finishing tied for sixth with Oregon State and losing four of its last seven.

Stanford is led at the plate by Sarah Beeson, who is hitting .387 with 13 doubles, six home runs and 45 RBI while also scoring 33 runs and walking 33 times. Jessica Mendoza is hitting .372 with 62 runs scored, 17 doubles, 14 home runs and 44 RBI. She has also stolen 28-of-30 bases with 30 walks.

In the circle, Tori Nyberg has been the Cardinal's ace this year, posting a 25-9 overall mark with a 1.45 ERA. She has tossed 25 complete games with seven shutouts and has struck out 198 in 226.1 innings. Opponents are hitting just .189 against her this year.



SCOUTING THE GOLDEN BEARS: The third-seeded California Golden Bears finished the regular season with a 48-19 overall record and a 12-9 mark in Pacific-10 Conference play to finish fourth. At one point this season, Cal had won 11 in a row and closed out the season with three consecutive victories over the Oregon schools.

The Golden Bears are led at the plate by NCAA career walks leader Veronica Nelson, who is hitting .328 with nine home runs, 36 RBI and a mind-blowing 91 walks this season. Candace Harper is the team's power-leader, hitting .320 with 18 doubles, eight home runs and 41 RBI.

In the circle Cal is paced by Jocelyn Forest, who is 21-12 overall with a 1.25 ERA. She has thrown 27 complete games with eight shutouts to her name while striking out 315 batters in 224.2 innings. Opponents are hitting just .166 against her this season.



SCOUTING THE BULLDOGS: The fourth-seeded Fresno State Bulldogs will play host to the regional field after finishing the year with a 49-18 overall record and an 18-6 mark in the Western Athletic Conference for its fifth-straight title. The Bulldogs closed out the year with victories in 21 of their last 26 contests.

FSU is led at the plate by Lindsay Fossatti, who is hitting .325 on the year with 15 doubles, six home runs and 30 RBI. She has also walked 34 times this year and is slugging .500 on the season.

Jamie Southern is one of the nation's best pitchers, posting a 32-8 overall record with a 0.41 ERA. She has appeared in all but 19 of Fresno State's games this season, striking out 380 batters in 327 innings pitched. Opponents are hitting just .136 against her this year as she has scattered 149 hits and allowed just 19 earned runs to cross the plate (30 overall).



SCOUTING THE TIGERS: The fifth-seeded Pacific Tigers completed the regular season with a 42-15 overall record and a 21-3 mark in the Big West Conference for second place – one game behind Cal State Fullerton. The Tigers ended the Titans' 32-game winning streak and handed Fullerton its only two conference losses of the year.

Pacific is led both at the plate and in the circle by senior Cindy Ball, who is hitting .368 on the year and is 27-9 with a 0.85 ERA as a pitcher this year. Ball led the team with 11 home runs and 46 RBI while finishing second on the team with 11 doubles and 25 walks.

Ball, the Big West Conference career strikeout leader, has struck out 273 batters this year with just over 264 innings. Opponents are hitting .162 against her this year.

Barbara Moody is the team's leading hitter with a .368 average and 28 doubles on the year. She has scored 39 runs and walked 21 times.



SCOUTING THE PURPLE ACES: The sixth-seeded Evansville Purple Aces finished the regular season with a 34-25 overall record and were 16-9 in the Missouri Valley Conference this year. The Purple Aces earned an automatic berth by winning their first-ever MVC tournament title over Illinois State, defeating the Redbirds, 3-2, in the championship game.

Evansville is led at the plate by Emily Wintero, who is hitting .352 with 20 runs scored, 17 walks and five stolen bases in 10 attempts. Brooke Luker is hitting .313 on the year with team high's in doubles (14), home runs (3), RBI (33) and slugging percentage (.455).

In the circle, the Purple Aces are paced by MVC Tournament MVP Katie Markle, who is 19-11 overall with a 1.65 ERA and went 4-0 with a 0.79 ERA in the MVC Tournament. She has struck out 149 in 195.1 innings as opponents are hitting just .220 off her.



TOPPING AND OAKS EARN CONFERENCE WEEKLY HONORS: Cal State Fullerton juniors Jenny Topping and Gina Oaks were named the Big West Conference Co-Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, in the final regular season weekly award handed out on Monday morning (May 13).

Topping (Whittier, Calif./Washington) shared the weekly honor with fellow catcher Breanne Smith from Utah State. It is the third such honor this season for Topping, who also won the award on Mar. 4 and Mar. 18. She hit .600 on the week against Cal Poly, with four runs scored and three RBI. Topping also smacked three doubles and walked twice while raising her batting average 10 points to .485 to lead the conference.



Oaks (Alta Loma, Calif./Rancho Cucamonga HS) clinched the award for the fifth time this year – the most of any player in the conference this season. She earned her 20th win of the season with a 7-1 victory over the Mustangs, allowing just one run, walking one and striking out nine.

AND THE WINS JUST KEEP ON COMING: Cal State Fullerton Head Coach Michelle Gromacki could reach two milestones in the same year should the postseason go well for the Titans.

Earlier this season, Gromacki reached the 100-victory plateau as the Titans defeated Massachusetts, 6-0, behind Jodie Cox's no-hitter in the opening game of the NFCA Lead-off Classic in Columbus, Ga. She is the fastest Fullerton head softball coach to reach 100 career victories, doing so in just 134 games – surpassing legendary Hall of Fame Coach Judi Garman (142 games).

In addition, Gromacki stands just seven wins short of her 150th career coaching victory and has accumulated a 143-40 career record in over two years at the helm of the Titan softball program. She earned her first career victory on Feb. 4, 2000, in a 10-0 win against Texas Tech at the New Mexico Diamond Invitational.

TITANS AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS: Cal State Fullerton ranks among the nation's best in the May 8 installment of the NCAA statistical rankings.

The Titans jumped five spots to No. 24 in the team batting average category (.292) while also ranking 16th in the nation in ERA (1.24), 10th in runs per game (5.36) and 10th in the nation in winning percentage (.810).

Individually, junior catcher Jenny Topping is among the nation's top hitters, ranking fourth in the country with a .475 average. Junior Gina Oaks is seventh in the nation in ERA at 0.73 and teammate junior Jodie Cox ranks tied for 14th in the nation with 9.1 strikeouts per seven innings.

NO OFFENSE? NO, OFF-ENSE...: Sure they are spelled the same, but they have completely different meanings.

The Titan offense (meaning the opposite of defense) has been shattering school and conference single-season records left and right in numerous categories.

Cal State Fullerton slugged 63 home runs in 2002 (breaking the 1999 mark of 54 home runs), scored 326 runs (breaking the 1987 mark of 316) and drove home 288 RBI (breaking last year's total of 279).

The Titans are also closing in on a few more marks, and should approach those should the postseason go well. Fullerton has 472 hits this season, just 94 behind Fresno State's record of 566 in 1989, and has 70 doubles, just 20 behind the 1999 Titan squad which had 99 doubles on the year. Fullerton also has walked 192 times, falling nine shy of UNLV's 1995 record of 201, and the .298 batting average is just 13 points behind Hawaii's record of .311 set in 1996.

TITANS SHATTER SINGLE-SEASON HOME RUN MARK: The Cal State Fullerton softball team doesn't just hit home runs, it crushes them... often.

The Titans have crushed 63 home runs this season, breaking the school and Big West Conference single season mark of 54 set back during the 1999 season. The Titans tied and broke the record in the first game of a Big West Conference series against UC Riverside on Apr. 27 as Gina Oaks led off the first with a solo home run and Jodie Cox broke the record with a three-run blast later in the frame as the Titans sent 17 batters to the plate in an 11-run first inning. The Titans are averaging 1.09 home runs per game this season.

If the season ended today (not counting other school's performances this season), the 63 home runs hit by the Titans would rank 13th all-time in NCAA history and the 1.03 home runs per game would rank tied for 13th all-time with the 1998 Nebraska squad.



UNBLEMISHED: It may not have been as pretty as she would have liked it, but a win is a win.

Cal State Fullerton junior pitcher Jodie Cox, with some help from her pitching teammate Christy Robitaille, won her 17th game of the year on Saturday in the Big West Conference title-clinching 4-3 victory over Cal Poly on Saturday, which also moved her to 9-0 in Big West games this year.

Cox is the only pitcher to go undefeated in conference play this year (Pacific's Jennifer Dacre lost just once to Cal State Northridge, and it happened to be the game which gave the Titans the title), amassing a 0.68 ERA and seven complete games. She scattered just 28 hits in 51.1 innings, surrendering only nine runs (five earned) with 53 strikeouts and 16 walks.

Opponents hit just .153 against her in league play this year to go along with three shutouts and her first career save against UC Santa Barbara.

ANOTHER FIRST FOR OAKS: On Friday (May 10) against Cal Poly, junior pitcher Gina Oaks (Alta Loma, Calif./Rancho Cucamonga HS) became the Titans' first 20-game winner since Jana Oetgen posted a 21-12 overall mark in 1999. Oaks was 20-3 overall during the 2002 regular season with a 0.74 ERA and 177 strikeouts in 151.2 innings pitched.

However, the fun doesn't stop there. Barring an offensive explosion by the opposition, she has a chance to post the first ERA which averages out to less than a run since 1993 when Cheryl Longeway (0.93) and Tiffany Boyd (0.96) accomplished the feat, and the lowest ERA since 1991 when Boyd posted a 0.68 ERA.

In the Polls...

The Cal State Fullerton softball team remained at the No. 9 spot in the nation this week for the second consecutive week as the National Fastpitch Coaches Association released its final regular season poll on Wednesday morning (May 8).

The top nine teams in the nation remained the same as the Titans trail No. 8 Stanford by 20 points and lead No. 10 Texas (which jumped three spots this week) by 31 points.

UCLA retained the top spot in the poll, receiving 23 of the 27 first-place votes. Arizona is second with four first-place votes, followed by Louisiana State, Arizona State and California.

This season, the Titans will have (or have already faced) six of the top eight teams in the nation, 14 of the top 25 teams in the country and one other team receiving votes.

JODIE COX ON A ROLL... HOLD THE MAYO: Cal State Fullerton junior left-hander **Jodie Cox (Lancaster, Calif./Quartz Hill HS)** has won her last 13 consecutive decisions (12 of those starts), allowing seven earned runs over 73.1 innings to post an ERA of 0.67. She has scattered 40 hits and amassed a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.5-to-1, putting up 85 strikeouts to just 19 walks. During that time, Cox has also seen her ERA drop almost a run, from 2.27 to 1.50.

Of those 13 decisions, all but four have been shortened thanks to the eight-run mercy rule.

Among the highlights of her streak: Cox struck out career-high 16 batters – a mark which surpassed the 14 batters she struck out against San Jose State on March 2 of last year at the Worth Invitational – against Rutgers in the opening round of the Kia Klassic, and she has tossed three no-hitters this season against Massachusetts, Pacific and UC Riverside.

GINA OAKS... SETTING THE TABLE: Usually, when one thinks of Cal State Fullerton junior pitcher Gina Oaks, one thinks of the magnificent season she is having as a hurler in the circle. However, she is having a pretty bang-up year as the Titans' leadoff hitter in 2002.

Aside from hitting .315 with 10 home runs and 32 RBI, Oaks (Alta Loma, Calif./Rancho Cucamonga HS) has come around to score 51 times this season, which leads the Big West Conference by nine runs over teammate Jodie Cox. Oaks' mark is just seven short of tying the Big West Conference record of 58 set by UNLV's Kim Rondina in 1995.

Her mark also puts her just four runs short of Jenny Topping's school-record 55 runs scored set during the 2001 season. Oaks currently stands in a tie for fifth all-time in career runs scored with 105, just 44 behind Sue Lewis for the career record.

That makes sense as the junior is hitting .327 with 10 doubles, eight home runs and 26 RBI as the Titans' leadoff hitter in 50 games this season.

ANOTHER "YAZ" SIGHTING IN THE RECORD BOOKS: While Stacey Nuvevan of UCLA is making NCAA home run history up north in Los Angeles, Cal State Fullerton outfielder Yasmin Mossadeghi is doing her fair share to see that Orange County is represented in the NCAA record books.

The senior outfielder from Huntington Beach, Calif. (Edison HS), has notched 46 home runs in her career, which ranks in a tie for 13th all-time alongside UNLV's Kim Rondina, Cal State Northridge's Scia Maumausolo and UNC-Greensboro's Karyn Thompson.

Mossadeghi already owns the school and Big West record for that category, setting both marks early last year at the Chevron Paradise Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii.

THESE CLEATS ARE MADE FOR WALKING: To say that Titan junior catcher Jenny Topping is one of the most feared hitters in the nation, is an understatement. And here is the stat to prove it.

Topping has walked 30 times this season (which ranks second in the Big West) and has amassed 86 walks for her Titan career entering this weekend, which stands three free passes short of tying Sue Lewis' career record of 89 walks set from 1981-84.

In the NCAA record books, her 142 career walks stand in ninth place all time (a total which includes 56 walks in her freshman year at Washington), standing just 19 short of tying Alabama's Kelly Kretschman for eighth.

Her mark at Cal State Fullerton has her in sixth place all time on the Big West charts, just one short of tying Kim Rondina of UNLV for fifth place.

WINNING STREAK COMES TO AN END: Cal State Fullerton's 32-game winning streak, the second-longest in the nation this season (Massachusetts had won 33 in a row this season), ended on April 21 as Pacific came from behind to defeat the Titans, 3-2, in the second game of a doubleheader. The streak ranked second all-time in school history, falling three games short of the record of 35 consecutive victories set in 1987. The 32 consecutive games by the Titans this season ranks in a tie for ninth place on the all-time NCAA list, along with California's 32 wins last season and Southeast Missouri State's 32 consecutive victories in 1996.

THE STREAK, PART 2: How dominating were the Titans during their 32-game winning streak? Glad you asked...

As a team, the Titans hit .317 and outscored their opponents 193-33 while slugging .509 and amassing an on-base percentage of .401. Fullerton knocked 42 doubles, three triples and 37 home runs to go with 170 RBI. The Titans also drew 90 walks and were hit 31 times while fielding an impressive .970.

On the pitching side of things, the trio of Gina Oaks, Christy Robitaille and Jodie Cox posted a 0.69 ERA (21 earned runs in 212 innings) while striking out 219 batters and scattering 133 hits. The Titan staff held opponents to a .178 batting average while tossing 14 shutouts.

PITCHERS KEEPING THE HITTING TO A MINIMUM: The Cal State Fullerton pitching staff has kept opposing hitters off balance this season, leading the conference in opponent's batting average with a .184 mark – leading second-place Pacific in the rankings (.189). The Titans have allowed double digits in hits just once this season (11 to Stanford at the NFCA Leadoff Classic) while allowing nine twice and eight twice.

MEANWHILE, THE HITS JUST KEEP ON COMING FOR THE TITANS: Opposing pitchers might want to watch the hits column on the scoreboard when entering the circle against the Titans this season. When one team has 10-or-more hits in a game, the Titans are 20-1, with wins over such ranked teams as Massachusetts, Ohio State, Florida State, Fresno State and Arizona State.

THIS BEAN BALL SPONSORED BY BAND-AID: Apparently Cal State Fullerton junior shortstop Amanda Hockett isn't the only one with a special attraction for the softball.

Five players currently on the Titans' roster are ranked in the top 10 among the all-time hit-by-pitch leaders as Hockett (40), Gina Oaks (21), Monica Lucatero (10), Jodie Cox (9) and Yasmin Mossadeghi (8) have all broken into the list.

Hockett (Bakersfield, Calif./Stockdale HS) broke her own single-season school record for being hit by a pitch on March 24 against Cal State Northridge as she was plunked for the 14th time this year, surpassing the 13 bean balls her body absorbed as a freshman.

Aside from leading the team with 19 bruises this season, Hockett has been the recipient of 40 bean balls throughout her career – the most among any player to wear a Cal State Fullerton uniform.

On a little tangent, if this were baseball, Hockett would rank fourth on the career list, trailing all-time leader David Bacani (1998-01) by 18 bean balls and trailing Reed Johnson (1997-99) by just one for third place.

SPEAKING OF BEING PLUNKED: This year's Cal State Fullerton squad has more bruises than any other in the history of the sport at the university. The 50 batters hit by opposing pitchers this season surpasses the 39 last year to set a new school record.

TWO TITANS NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR FINALISTS: Cal State Fullerton juniors Gina Oaks and Jenny Topping were named as two finalists for the inaugural USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award, the Amateur Softball Association announced on April 5.

The award is designed to recognize outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players around the country. Oaks and Topping are listed along with 23 other players.

The list was reduced to 10 players on May 3, and the three finalists will be announced on May 31st. The winner will be announced on June 7 and will be presented with the award at the ASA National Council Meeting in Reno, Nev., in November.

A replica of the award will be placed in a permanent display in the ASA National Softball Hall of Fame in Oklahoma City, Okla., along with photos of the winner. An additional replica of the award will be presented to the player's university.

In all, the Titans have faced 16 of the finalists on the field this season.

THREE MORE TITANS SELECTED TO NATIONAL TEAM CAMP: Cal State Fullerton senior outfielder **Yasmin Mossadeghi (Huntington Beach, Calif./Edison HS)** and senior infielder **Monica Lucatero (Santa Ana, Calif./Mater Dei HS)**, along with former Titan catcher Debbie Schneider, were listed among the additional 20 invitees to the USA Softball National Team Camp to be held at the ARCO Olympic Training Center in Chula Vista, Calif.

These selections bring the number of Cal State Fullerton players invited to the camp to five, as they join **Jenny Topping (Whittier, Calif./Washington/La Habra HS)** and **Gina Oaks (Alta Loma, Calif./Rancho Cucamonga HS)**, who were selected to participate in the camp earlier this year. They will be part of a group of 60 athletes competing for spots on teams that will represent the United States in international competition this summer.

In addition, Cal State Fullerton head coach Michelle Gromacki will also be heading to the camp as one of six coaches competing for spots on the coaching staff at the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece.

Two teams will be selected following the team camp in May/June. One

will represent the USA at the U.S. Cup in Honolulu, HI, (July 4-7), the Canada Cup in Surrey, B.C., Canada (July 16-21) and the ISF Women's World Championship in Saskatoon, Canada (July 25-August 4).

The second team selected will be called the USA Softball Elite Team, and will help prepare the World Championship team for international events by competing in scrimmages and exhibition games prior to these events. The Elite Team will also compete in the Canada Cup.

THAT'S WHY THEY'RE RANKED TEAMS: Of Cal State Fullerton's 11 losses this season, eight of those have come at the hands of ranked teams with another coming against a team also receiving votes.

Individually, three of Titan senior pitcher Christy Robitaille's four losses this year came against then-top-ranked Arizona and then-No. 2 Stanford, while all of Gina Oaks' losses have come to ranked teams (Texas A&M, Stanford and Pacific) and all of Jodie Cox's losses have come against ranked teams (Nebraska, Stanford, Texas A&M and UCLA).

DR. NO-NO-NO: Her name is Cox... Jodie Cox, and she likes her softball games short and without hits.

Cal State Fullerton junior pitcher **Jodie Cox (Lancaster, Calif./Quartz Hill HS)** threw her fifth career no-hitter in a 6-o victory against UC Riverside. It was the third this season for the junior as Cox tossed her third career no-hitter in a 6-o victory over Massachusetts at the NFCA Leadoff Classic and shut down the hot bats of Pacific in a 1-o victory on April 21 in the first game of a doubleheader.

Other no-hitters thrown by Cox include her first against Utah as a freshman in 2000 and a perfect game against Minnesota at the 2001 Worth Invitational.

In those five games, Cox has combined to pitch 33 innings, walking just six batters and striking out 27. She has also faced just 12 batters over the minimum combined in those five contests.

TITANS NOT PLAYING SMALL BALL: Bunt or swing for the fences? Ask the Cal State Fullerton batters this season and they will choose the latter.

The Titans lead the conference in slugging percentage by 56 points over second place Pacific and have five of the top 10 players (Jenny Topping, Yasmin Mossadeghi, Gina Oaks, Jodie Cox and Monica Lucatero) in the league in slugging percentage — including three of the top five.

ALMOST PERFECT...AGAIN: What must Gina Oaks do to get a perfect game around here?

In back-to-back games, the Cal State Fullerton junior pitcher took a perfect game into the final inning of play, only to see it broken up by the opposition. On Apr. 27 against UC Riverside, Oaks had set down every batter before a fielding error broke up the perfect game and a single followed to break up the no-hitter.

On Apr. 21 against Pacific, Oaks had the Tigers turning every which way to get a hit, retiring the first 21 batters she faced before surrendering a lead-off single to Cindy Ball in the bottom of the eighth in a 1-o loss to the Tigers to break up what was shaping up to be her first career perfect game.

Oaks, who threw her first career no-hitter earlier this year in a victory over Utah State in Logan, Utah, walked just one and struck out nine batters before Pacific struck for two hits in the eighth to produce the winning run.

The hard-luck loss for Oaks against Pacific was her first since falling to Stanford in another 1-o heartbreaker in the consolation round of the NFCA Leadoff Classic on Feb. 24. In that stretch, she had won 12 of her last 13 (the only bump in the road being a no-decision in the championship game of the Kia Classic against Texas) and posted wins in 14 of her last 15 appearances.

• A freshman infielder with tremendous speed, Saltarelli has appeared in 35 games for the Titans, mostly in a pinch-running role • when she did get to bat, however, she made an impression as her first collegiate hit was a two-run blast over the right field fence at Utah State in an 11-2 Titan victory • Saltarelli was the second player this season to get her first hit as a home run, joining teammate Jocelyn Evans • she has scored 12 runs on the season.

#2 – Monica Lucatero (Sr., IF, Santa Ana, Calif.)

• The senior mainstay at first base missed the first two games of her career this season, but has started every other game in her four years • One of four current Titans to be invited to the US National Team training camp immediately following the College World Series in Chula Vista, Calif. (May 30-June 3) • at press time, is one of only two Titans in the history of the program who could be named all-conference all four years (the other is teammate Yasmin Mossadeghi) • ranks among the top 10 all-time in numerous offensive categories (*Ed. Note: see record book section of this release*) • has three hits in a game three times this season and has driven in four, twice this season • had a season-best five-game hitting streak where she hit .533 (8-for-15) with two HR, three runs and six RBI • she has walked twice in a game six times and ranks second on the team in walks • has made only 28 errors in her entire career in 1839 chances for a .985 fielding percentage • has 12 multi-hit games this season and is second on the team with 12 multi-RBI games.

#6 – Amy LaRocque (Jr., C/IF, Fontana, Calif.)

• One of the more versatile players on the Titan roster, LaRocque has done everything from catch, play third base, pinch-run and fill in as the designated player in her career • one of her best games came against Massachusetts, when she went 3-for-3 with two runs, two RBI and her first collegiate home run • she was also 3-for-4 with three RBI against Utah State and had a 3-for-3 performance with two runs and an RBI against UC Santa Barbara • in the series against Cal Poly, she hit .556 (5-for-9) with a run and two RBI • she has seen her batting average rise more than 60 points in the last two months • she has seven multi-hit and six multi-RBI games.

#7 – Krista O'Hanian (Jr., OF, Norwalk, Calif.)

• A junior transfer from Illinois State, O'Hanian has given the Titans a burst of speed off the bench and has served as a reliable outfielder this season • she has appeared in 33 games this year, mostly as a pinch-runner, but has done well with a bat • she got her first hit as a Titan against Northwestern and busted out against UC Santa Barbara with a 2-for-3 game with a run scored and a two-run double.

#8 – Jennifer Holt (So., C/IF, Roseville, Calif.)

• After missing most of last season as a freshman due to injury, Holt has stepped in nicely as a solid backup behind the plate to Jenny Topping • was 1-for-2 with an RBI and two runs scored in a victory over Northwestern and was 2-for-3 with an RBI against Long Beach State that ended the game due to the mercy rule • two of her five hits this season have been doubles • has made only two errors in 264 chances (.992) all behind the plate • has caught six batters trying to steal in 20 attempts.

#9 – Julie Watson (So., OF, Valencia, Calif.)

• A speedy centerfielder who has hit in numerous positions in the batting order this season, Watson is coming off of a solid freshman campaign • notched her best game on Mar. 9, when she went a perfect 3-for-3 at the plate against Sacramento State with a run and an RBI • has had five multi-hit games this season • one of the Titans most unselfish players, has successfully advanced runners 57 percent of the time (34 advanced in 60 opportunities).

#10 – Amanda Hockett (Jr., IF, Bakersfield, Calif.)

• A strong-armed shortstop who wields a pretty mean bat, this junior is enjoying career power numbers in 2002 • Hockett's eight home runs surpasses her freshman total of seven and her 33 RBI beats last year's total of 31 driven in • is one of only three players on this year's roster to play the entire season at a single position (Monica Lucatero and Yasmin Mossadeghi) • the career leader in hit-by-pitches (40), Hockett has been plunked 19 times this season – breaking her own single-season record set during her freshman season • has had 11 multi-hit games this season (sixth on the team) and nine multi-RBI contests (fourth on the team) • among her best performances this season was a 2-for-2 effort with two runs and three RBI against Texas (2/10), she was 2-for-4 with a grand slam against Missouri (2/23), she was 2-for-3 with two runs and four RBI against Cal State Northridge (3/24), and was 2-for-2 with a run and three RBI against San Diego State (4/4).

#11 – Kristy Halagarda (Jr., OF, Mission Viejo, Calif.)

• Having a career year from the circle and a bang-up year at the plate • One of four current Titans to be invited to the US National Team training camp immediately following the College World Series in Chula Vista, Calif. (May 30-June 3) • named the Big West Conference Player of the Week once (4/29) and Pitcher of the Week five times (3/4, 3/11, 3/18, 4/1, 5/13) • ranks among career and single season leaders as a pitcher and on offense (*Ed. Note: see record book section of this release*) • threw her first career no-hitter against Utah State on 3/29, while striking out eight • has had five games of 10-or-more strikeouts this season and has also pitched four one-hitters • carried two perfect games into the final inning of play, only to see them broken up (Pacific in the eighth on a single and UC Riverside in the fifth on an error) • at one point in the year, won 14 consecutive decisions, 12 of those starts • the Titans are averaging 4.7 runs per game in games in which she has pitched, compared to the opposition's 1.2 • among her brightest performances at the plate: a 3-for-3 game with three runs and an RBI against Ohio State, went 2-for-2 with two runs and four RBI against Florida, was 2-for-3 with two runs and two RBI against LMU • four of her 10 home runs have come when she leads off an inning, while two of those have lead off a game (LMU, UC Riverside) • the Titans are 10-0 when she homers • leads the team with six stolen bases in 10 attempts.

• An all-conference performer as a freshman, Ziegler has been a jack-of-all-trades this season, playing in center and rightfield while also pinch-running • has had four, two-hit games this season and three multi-RBI games this season • was 2-for-3 with two runs against San Diego (1/29), 2-for-2 with two RBI and her first career home run against Texas (2/10), 2-for-3 with her second career round-tripper against Texas A&M (2/23) • was also 1-for-2 with three RBI in the first game of a doubleheader at UC Santa Barbara.

#19 – Jodie Cox (Jr., P/OF, Lancaster, Calif.)

• Jodie Cox is having an outstanding season in her third year as a Titan in the circle and at the plate • was named Big West Pitcher of the Week on Apr. 8 • Cox has thrown three no hitters this season – two of those coming in back-to-back games against Pacific and UC Riverside • the third no-no came against Massachusetts where she missed a perfect game by just one walk • struck out a career-best 16 batters in a victory over Rutgers • has four games of double-digit strikeouts, including three straight starts against Texas (2/10), Stanford (2/16) and Massachusetts (2/22) • has also thrown four one-hitters this season • has won her last 12 consecutive starts with a pair of relief stints thrown in during the last 14 appearances • talk about run support: 10 of her 16 victories this year have come via the eight-run “mercy rule” • the Titans are averaging 5.9 runs per game when she pitches • finished the year as the only pitcher to complete Big West play with an undefeated record at 9-0 • She has a 0.68 ERA in conference play, including seven complete games, three shutouts, and 53 strikeouts in 51.1 innings • Opponents are hitting just .153 against her in Big West action and she has given up just five earned runs (nine overall) and scattered 28 hits • at the plate, Cox has set career highs in numerous offensive categories including, runs (42), hits (61), home runs (9), and RBI (37) • among her best games this season included going 6-for-10 with four runs and eight RBI in the Utah State series, which included a 3-for-3 day with two doubles, a triple and seven RBI • she has 16 multi-hit games (third on the team) this season and eight multi-RBI games (fifth on the team) • has the team’s longest hitting streak of the year at 12 games, during which she hit .378 with 12 runs scored, five RBI, three doubles, a triple, two home runs and six walks.

#21 – Shawna Robinson (Sr., IF, Atascadero, Calif.)

• A solid second baseman completing her final season in a Titan uniform after transferring from Missouri • has four multi-hit games, but has turned it on as of late, hitting .348 with four runs scored and three RBI in her last seven games • had a pair of 2-for-3 games against Northwestern (2/16) and Sacramento State (3/10) • was 3-for-4 with an RBI against Cal Poly (5/10) • has made only six errors this season in 171 chances (.966) and only 10 errors in her career in 330 chances (.971) • had her first career extra-base hit as a Titan with a double against Florida State (3/15).

#22 – Caylin Hornish (Fr., IF, Huntington Beach, Calif.)

• A freshman who was tested early due to injuries to key Titan players, Hornish has played catcher, first base, designated player and has pinch hit this year • smacked her first career hit in a loss to Nebraska and drove in her first career run against San Jose State • recently had her first career extra-base hit, a double, against UC Riverside.

#27 – Yasmin Mossadeghi (Sr., OF, Huntington Beach, Calif.)

• A slugger of mammoth proportions, Mossadeghi (pronounced MOSS-uh-DAY-gee) continues her exploits as the school and Big West career home run queen • One of four current Titans to be invited to the US National Team training camp immediately following the College World Series in Chula Vista, Calif. (May 30-June 3) • one of only three players to play at a single position all season long (Monica Lucatero and Amanda Hockett) • leads the Big West Conference with 12 home runs • at press time, Mossadeghi is one of only two players in the history of Titan softball who could earn all-conference honors all four years (the other being teammate Monica Lucatero) • among her more notable home runs: a two run shot in the top of the seventh to break up Amanda Freed’s no-hitter in a Titan loss to UCLA which traveled well over the scoreboard in left field and a shot at UC Santa Barbara which landed in right field of the adjacent baseball field • five of her 12 home runs have led off

an inning, five have come with two outs and six have been solo shots • the Titans are 11-1 when she homers • notched her first career triple in a win over UC Riverside • ranks second on the team with 17 multi-hit games and leads the team with 13 multi-RBI games • had an 11-game hitting streak this season, during which she hit .406 with six RBI • tied a career high with four RBI against UC Riverside (4/28).

#31 – Jenny Topping (Jr., C/IF, Whittier, Calif.)

• A 2001 First-Team All-American, Topping returned with a vengeance after missing the first 11 games of the year due to a shoulder injury and also missed two games with a bruised heel • One of four current Titans to be invited to the US National Team training camp immediately following the College World Series in Chula Vista, Calif. (May 30-June 3) • helped lead the Titans to back-to-back Kia Classic Championships after hitting .696 (16-for-23) with 11 runs, six home runs and 13 RBI, including the game-winning two-run home run to beat Texas’ Cat Osterman in the ninth inning of the championship game • upon returning from her injury, the Titans would win 32 of their next 33 games, including the nation’s-longest winning streak at the time of 32 consecutive games and a doubleheader split with No. 1 UCLA • leads the team with 19 multi-hit games this season and is third with 10 multi-RBI games • has three hits in a game nine times this season • brought home the game-winning run with a sacrifice fly in the eighth to upset California at the Worth Invitational (3/2) • has been walked 30 times this year to lead the team and rank second in the Big West • ranks second on the all-time Cal State Fullerton career walks charts, just three short of tying the school record • in only two seasons, already ranks among the career and single-season lists in numerous categories (*Ed. Note: see record book section of this release*) • has made just one error behind the plate this season in 226 chances (.996) and has thrown out seven of 18 runners trying to steal and has picked off four batters • has only one passed ball this year.

#35 – Jocelyn Evans (Jr., OF, Valencia, Calif.)

• Coming off of an injury-filled redshirt year, Evans has played in 29 games for the Titans, mostly as a pinch-hitter and designated player • Is one of two players this season to get her first collegiate hit as a home run (joining teammate Heather Saltarelli) when she put a ball over the fence in the seventh inning in a loss to Stanford (2/22) • was 2-for-4 against Utah State (3/29) in her second career start and followed that up with a 1-for-3 day with three runs scored, a double and a walk against the Aggies (3/30) • has walked 11 times this season.

#44 – Christy Robitaille (Sr., P, Irvine, Calif.)

• One of the NCAA’s top relief pitchers in the history of the sport, Robitaille enters her final year in a Titan uniform, ranking in eighth place on the all-time NCAA list with 15 saves • after opening the season 1-3, Robitaille won eight of her next 11 appearances • tied a career high with nine strikeouts against Florida (3/6) • threw her first career no-hitter against UC Riverside on Senior Day (4/28) in her final regular season appearance at the Titan Softball Complex • the Titans are averaging 4.7 runs per game when Robitaille is in the circle • ranks among several career and single-season pitching categories in the Cal State Fullerton record books (*Ed. Note: see record book section of this release*) • has thrown eight games in relief this season.
