Rams off to best start in school history

CSU knocks off UTEP to improve to 7-0 on the season

FORT COLLINS, Colo. -- The Colorado State Rams (7-0) are off to the best start in school history after knocking off the UTEP Miners (4-2), 65-62, at Moby Arena Wednesday night.

With the win, the Rams improved to 7-0 on the season. CSU had previously started a season 6-0 on three separate occasions, most recently in 2012-13, which was Head Coach Larry Eustachy's first year at Colorado State.

"We're just playing ball," senior forward J.J. Avila said of the Rams' unbeaten start to the season. "We're going to keep going. Now we are trying to be 8-0. We're going to come to practice tomorrow and work hard and just keep trying to get better. We are not even close; we were up and we need to learn how to keep the pressure on."

The Rams got off to a hot start, opening up a 16-5 lead in the first seven minutes. Junior guard Gian Clavell was a spark off the bench in the first half, scoring 10 points on four-of-seven shooting, and recording a block and two steals. Senior forward Stanton Kidd had an impressive eight rebounds in the first 20 minutes, including four on the offensive glass.

Colorado State led by as many as 14 in the first half, but UTEP ended the half on an 8-0 run, fueled by senior forward Cedrick Lang, to send the teams to the lockerroom with a 33-28 score in favor of the Rams.

The Rams were able to hold UTEP's sophomore forward Vince Hunter, who came into the game averaging 18.4 points per game and 12.6 rebounds per game, to just four points and four rebounds. Prior to tonight's game, Hunter had registered a double-double in all five contests this year. The impressive defensive effort was led by Kidd, who drew the assignment for matching up against the heralded sophomore for the majority of the game.

"We were well aware of Hunter," Eustachy said. "This was the first time that he hasn't had a double-double. We were talking about it a lot and working hard, and I think it showed up in the game."

Controlling the boards was something that Eustachy emphasized all week to the team, and the Rams did just that by out-rebounding the Miners 39-26. Avila paced the Rams with a team-most nine, while Kidd and senior guard Daniel Bejarano pulled in eight and seven, respectively.

"To hold a team like that (UTEP) to just five offensive boards, six with the deadball, was an outstanding effort," Eustachy said. "That's what rebounding is; it's effort."

Avila finished as the game's leading scorer with 20 points, while Kidd was right behind with 15. Clavell was the third Ram in double-digits as he finished the night with 13 points.

The Rams will be back in action on Sunday at noon as they take on in-state rival Northern Colorado at Moby Arena. The game will be televised on ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain and will be broadcast on 105.5 FM ESPN Radio.

Top Performers



31 | J.J. Avila | SR | F | 6-8/250 lbs.

Recorded his seventh double-digit scoring game to open the season, notching 20 points, nine rebounds, four assists and three steals in the Rams' 65-62 victory over UTEP. It marked Avila's 34th double-digit scoring game of his CSU career, his 14th 20-point game as a Ram, and his 17th game in Green and Gold with at least eight rebounds.



11 | Stanton Kidd | SR | F | 6-8/225 lbs.

Notched 15 points, eight rebounds and a season-best four assists in the Rams' 65-62 victory over UTEP. Kidd reached double-figures scoring for the sixth time in his first seven games with the Rams, tallied his third game of the year with eight or more rebounds, and his third game of the year with at least four offensive rebounds.



3 | Gian Clavell | JR | G | 6-4/185 lbs.

Sparked the Rams with 13 points off the bench to help lift CSU to a 62-65 victory over UTEP. Scored 10 straight for the Rams midway through the first half, a run that pushed CSU's lead to 15 points. Clavell also knocked down a three-pointer in his third-consecutive game, and notched his fourth game of the season with multiple treys.



2 | Daniel Bejarano | SR | G | 6-5/210 lbs.

Posted seven points, seven rebounds, four assists and one block in Colorado State's 65-62 victory over UTEP. Bejarano has recorded at least six rebounds in six of the Rams' first seven games of the season, and tallied his fourth game of the year with four or more assists.



15 | Tiel Daniels | JR | F | 6-7/234 lbs.

Posted four points and six boards, while dishing out a pair of assists in the Rams' 65-62 victory over UTEP. Daniels' six rebounds tied a season high, and his two offensive rebounds marked the fourth time this season that he has recorded multiple O-boards in a contest.

- Colorado State plays the first of back-to-back games against in-state rivals on Sunday afternoon, hosting the Northern Colorado Bears at Moby Arena.
- Tipoff between the Rams and the Bears, whose lineup features former Ram Dwight Smith, is set for 12 p.m. MT.
- The game will air across the Colorado State Radio Network, including flagship 105.5 FM ESPN, with Brian Roth (play-by-play) on the call.
- The contest will also be broadcast live on ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain. Former voice of the Rams Jerry Schemmel (play-by-play) will call the action courtside along with Joe Cravens (color analyst).
- Fans outside of the ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain and Northwest regions will be able to view the game on a free streaming broadcast via the Mountain West Network at CSURams.com/videos and TheMW.com.
- GameTracker live statistics are available at CSURams.com.

Rams quick hits

- The 2014-15 season marks the 112th in the history of the Colorado State men's basketball program. The Rams are 1,178-1,195 (.496) in 2,373 games all-time.
- Colorado State enters the 2014-15 men's basketball season under the direction of coaching veteran Larry Eustachy who begins his third season at the helm of the Rams' program and his 24th as a Division I head coach.
- Colorado State basketball is looking for its fifth postseason appearance in six years, and its third NCAA Tournament berth in four seasons, in 2014-15.
- Colorado State returns a majority of its production from a season ago, a stark contrast to the Rams' transition from 2012-13 to 2013-14 after graduating five senior starters.
- Overall, the Rams' roster breaks down to six returning players, including starters Daniel Bejarano, J.J. Avila and Joe De Ciman, plus nine newcomers. However, three of the nine newcomers - senior Stanton Kidd, junior Tiel Daniels and sophomore John Gillon - practiced with the squad last season while redshirting as Division I transfers from NCAA Division I programs.
- Colorado State's 2014-15 schedule is rated among the toughest in the Mountain West. Based on last season's final RPI rankings for known Division I opponents.
- As of Thursday, the Rams sat at No. 20 in the NCAA RPI, first among Mountain West members.
- The Rams are off to a 7-0 start to 2014-15, breaking the program record for best start to a season previously set three times in 1970-71, 2005-06 and 2012-13.
- Colorado State enters the weekend ranked as 1 of just 18 remaining unbeaten teams nationally, out of 351 programs competing at the Division I level.
- CSU features a balanced scoring attack, with the Rams posting five games in the season's first seven contests with at least four players in double-figures scoring, and four games with five players notching 10+ points.
- Entering play this weekend, there were 11 players in the Mountain West ranked in the top-20 in the league in both scoring and rebounding average. Colorado State is the only program to boast three of those players in senior G Daniel Bejarano, senior F J.J. Avila and senior F Stanton Kidd.

About Northern Colorado

- Northern Colorado enters Sunday's matchup against the Rams with a 4-2 overall record, but the Bears are 0-2 on the road to open the 2014-15 season.
- The Bears are riding a three-game winning streak with home wins over Colorado Christian (93-58), Stetson (82-62) and Florida A&M (95-56).
- Northern Colorado is led by head coach B.J. Hill who is 65-64 in his fifth season as a Division I head coach, all at Northern Colorado where he previously served as an assistant coach under Tad Boyle.
- The Bears return five letterwinners, including two starters (senior G Tevin Svihovc and sophomore G Jordan Wilson), from the 2013-14 team that posted an 18-14 mark.
- UNC is led in scoring by Svihovc, who enters Sunday's contest averaging 12.3 points per game.
- Senior F Dominique Lee ranks as the top rebounder for Northern Colorado, pulling down an average of 5.8 rebounds per contest.
- Former Ram Dwight Smith, in his first season after transferring to UNC from CSU, has played in all six games for the Bears (including starts in the last three games), and averages 2.3 points and 2.3 rebounds per game.
- As a team, the Bears average an impressive 81.3 points per game, while holding opponents to an average of 67.0 points per contest.
- UNC ranks in the top-20 nationally in scoring offense (19th), field-goal percentage (eighth), free-throw percentage (sixth), and turnovers per game (third)

Series vs. Northern Colorado

- Sunday's matchup between Colorado State and Northern Colorado marks the 101st meeting all-time between the programs.
- The first tilt between the Rams and Bears also marked the first official game for the CSU men's basketball program played during the inaugural season of intercollegiate competition in 1901-02. CSU defeated UNC 64-15 in that matchup.
- Colorado State 65-35 all-time against Northern Colorado and has won the last four meetings.
- CSU is 48-13 against UNC in games played in Fort Collins.
- The Rams have won 11 consecutive games over UNC at Moby Arena, last losing to the Bears at home on Dec. 2, 1986.
- The two programs have played every year since the 2003-04 season.

Eustachy vs. Northern Colorado

- Heading into Sunday's matchup, Colorado State head coach Larry Eustachy is 2-0 in his 24-year career against Northern Colorado.
- Both of Eustachy's wins over Northern Colorado have come during his tenure at Colorado State, and both have come at Moby Arena.
- He led the Rams to an 85-69 victory on Nov. 26, 2012, and a 72-65 on Nov. 22, 2013.

Rams vs. the Big Sky

- All-time, Colorado State is 137-73 against current members of the Big Sky and 95-23 against Big Sky opponents at Moby Arena.
- Colorado State has played against every member of the Big Sky at least once, with the exception of Southern Utah.
- The Rams have won 10 consecutive games against Big Sky opponents, with their last loss coming in a 70-63 game at Northern Colorado on Dec. 1, 2009.

Rams on television

A win over Northern Colorado will...

- Give third-year head coach Larry Eustachy his 50th win at Colorado State and the 452nd of his career. Eustachy would become the second-fastest CSU coach to 50 wins behind Boyd Grant (74 games).
- Move the Rams to 8-0 to start the season, extending the program record for consecutive wins to open year.
- Push the Rams' record vs. UNC to 66-35, and give the Rams five straight wins overall in the series, and 12 consecutive victories at home vs. the Bears.
- Move head coach Larry Eustachy's record vs. the Bears to 3-0 all-time.
- Improve CSU's record vs. Big Sky opponents to 138-73 overall, and 96-23 at home.
- Push the Rams to 11-4 under Larry Eustachy in games played in December.

CSU-UNC connection

- Sunday's game marks the return to Moby Arena of former Rams player Dwight Smith.
- Smith spent four seasons (including a redshirt year) at Colorado State, earning a degree in communication studies, before transferring to UNC in the offseason.
- Smith played in 68 career games at CSU with nine starts as a Ram. He scored 237 points and notched 118 rebounds from 2010-11 to 2013-14.

Rams' best start

- Colorado State's 7-0 start to the 2014-15 season has established a new program-record for the best part to a season.
- The Rams had previously started 6-0 on three occasions, first setting the mark in 1970-71 and matching it in 2005-06 and 2012-13, Larry Eustachy's first at the helm of the Rams' program.

Rams 1 of 18 unbeaten

- Colorado State enters Sunday's game vs. Northern Colorado as one of 18 remaining unbeaten teams in NCAA Division I through games played Dec. 5.
- The Rams are the only Mountain West team on the list, after arch-rival Wyoming fell at SMU (66-53) on Friday night.
- The other 17 remaining unbeaten programs are: Arizona, Duke, Eastern Michigan, Gonzaga, Incarnate Word, Kentucky, Louisville, Miami (FL), Northern Iowa, Oklahoma State, Seton Hall, St. Mary's (CA), TCU, UC Davis, Villanova, Virginia and Washington.

Eustachy milestones

- Colorado State's Larry Eustachy continues to reach new milestones in his 24-year career as a head coach.
 - > **Career win No. 450:** Eustachy won the 450th game of his career earlier this season when the Rams captured the Great Alaska Shootout tournament title with a 65-63 win over UC Santa Barbara on Dec. 29.
 - > **CSU victory No. 50:** Eustachy enters Sunday's matchup vs. UNC in search of the 50th win of his career as a Ram. Eustachy, with a record of 49-25 at CSU, is on pace to become the second-fastest coach in program history to reach the 50-win mark, trailing only Boyd Grant, who reached win No. 50 in his 74th game at the helm of the Rams' program.

All-tournament honors

- Three Rams earned all-tournament honors during CSU's run to the GCI Great Alaska Shootout title. The following is a brief look at the stat lines for each player in Alaska.
- Daniel Bejarano - Averaged 10 points and 7.7 rebounds per game, while tallying eight assists and six blocks.
- J.J. Avila - Posted 16.7 points and 8.3 boards per game, to go along with seven assists, three blocks and one steal.
- John Gillon - Averaged 13.7 points and 2.0 rebounds, leading the team with 12 assists and adding a block and a steal.

Bejarano MW Player of the Week

- Colorado State senior guard Daniel Bejarano grabbed his second-career Mountain West Player of the Week honor on Nov. 24 after leading CSU to home victories over Georgia State and Mercer.
- Averaged 19.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals in the Rams' two wins.
- Opened the weekend with a 16-point, six-rebound effort in an 80-70 victory over Georgia State on Friday.
- Poured in a game-high 22 points to go along with six rebounds and seven assists in the Rams' 75-62 win versus Mercer on Sunday.
- Against the Bears, was a perfect 4-for-4 from three-point range, and also made all six of his free-throw attempts.
- For the week, shot 50 percent (11-for-22) from the field, 67 percent (6-for-9) from beyond the arc and 83 percent (10-for-12) from the charity stripe.

- Though the Rams have added several key newcomers for 2014-15, Colorado State returns most of its on-court production from a season ago, resulting in one of the deepest squads in the program's recent history.

MW preseason poll

- The Colorado State men's basketball team was selected to finish fifth in the Mountain West preseason media poll when the standings were released Oct. 14.
- The Rams have proven better than their preseason prediction in three of the last five seasons.
 - > In 2009-10, the Rams were selected eighth in the league, but finished fifth while earning a postseason bid to the College Basketball Invitational.
 - > In 2010-11, the Rams were picked to finish fifth, but notched a fourth-place showing in the league standings, making a run to the NIT.
 - > In 2011-12, the Rams finished in fourth-place in the league standings, just as predicted in the preseason media poll, but the team's resume was good enough for an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament.
 - > In 2012-13, the Rams were expected to finish fourth in the strongest Mountain West races in the league's history, but finished just short of a conference championship, posting a second-place finish en route to the team's second straight NCAA Tournament berth.

Bejarano tabbed preseason All-MW

- Colorado State senior guard Daniel Bejarano, a 2014 second-team all-conference selection, was tabbed by the media covering the league as a preseason all-MW pick.
- Bejarano was joined by player of the year favorite Larry Nance Jr. (Wyoming), Winston Shepard and Dwayne Polee II (San Diego State), and Anthony Drmic (Boise State).
- Bejarano's preseason recognition marks the fifth time since 2003 that a CSU player was named to the preseason all-conference team, and the first since NBA veteran Jason Smith was tabbed in back-to-back seasons in 2005 and 2006. Center Matt Nelson, who led the Rams to the 2003 Mountain West tournament championship, also earned back-to-back preseason all-conference accolades in 2003 and 2004.

Notes (cont.)

Avila in top-100

- Colorado State senior forward J.J. Avila was ranked among the top-100 players in the NCAA by ESPN as part of its preseason #CBBRank countdown.
- Avila came in at No. 92 on the list noting that he ranked among the top-10 in the Mountain West last season in scoring, rebounding, assists, steals, field-goal percentage and free-throw percentage.

Eustachy among the elite

- Colorado State head coach Larry Eustachy has ranked among the best coaches in his sport for nearly two and a half decades, now in his 24th season as a mentor at the NCAA Division I level.
- In his first season at the helm of the CSU program, Eustachy became the only head coach in NCAA Division I history to lead five different programs - Colorado State, Southern Miss, Iowa State, Utah State and Idaho - to 24 or more wins in a single season.
- With a career record of 451-283 (.614), Eustachy ranks as one of just 80 head coaches (out of 352 Division I programs) to have a winning percentage of better than .600. He entered the season ranked 70th on the list, and is one of one of just 33 coaches in the ranking with more than 20 years of NCAA Division I experience.
- Entering the 2014-15 season, Eustachy's 444 total victories ranked 33rd on the list of active coaches nationally. He now has 451 career victories.
- In 2000, during his tenure at Iowa State, Eustachy earned National Coach of the Year honors from both the Associated Press and the U.S. Basketball Writers' Association. In doing so, he became one of just 29 coaches since 1967 (when the AP began handing out its award) to win both.
- Entering the 2014-15 season, he is one of just 15 active coaches to have won both the AP and USBWA National Coach of the Year Awards.

Back to the postseason

- Colorado State enters the 2014-15 season looking to get back to the postseason after missing out at the end of the 2013-14 campaign.
- The Rams are in search of their fifth postseason berth in six seasons, having qualified for the 2010 CBI, the 2011 NIT and back-to-back NCAA tournaments in 2012 and 2013.
- Should the Rams return to the postseason in 2014-15, that stretch would match the best in program history when the squad qualified in four of five seasons between 1960-61 and 1965-66.
- A return to the NCAA tournament would be the Rams' third in four seasons, a stretch that would also reach back to the 60s when the squad qualified for March Madness in 1962-63, 1964-65 and 1965-66.

Noting the Rams' schedule

- Colorado State's 2014-15 schedule is rated among the toughest in the Mountain West, based on last season's final RPI rankings for known Division I opponents.
- The Rams' schedule ranks first atop the MW with an average of 127.6, ahead of UNLV (134.3), Boise State (140.1), Fresno State (140.7) and Wyoming (145.3).
- The Rams also lead the MW with seven non-conference games - Georgia State (78), Mercer (74), Missouri State (93), UTEP (111), Colorado (42), Denver (145), and New Mexico State (77) - vs. RPI top-150 programs.
- The Rams are slated to play at least seven, and as many as nine, non-conference games against opponents that qualified for postseason play in 2014, plus eight games against four MW foes (two each) that also competed in the postseason last year.

- Colorado State travels southwest to nearby Boulder, Colo., for its annual rivalry matchup with the Colorado Buffaloes on Wednesday night at the Coors Events Center.
- Tipoff between the Rams and the Buffs is set for 7 p.m. MT.
- The game will air across the Colorado State Radio Network, including flagship 105.5 FM ESPN, with Gary Miller (play-by-play) and Brian Roth (color) on the call.
- The contest will also be broadcast live on the Pac-12 Networks.

Rams sign 4 to NLLs

- Colorado State men's basketball head coach Larry Eustachy announced the addition of four prospects to the Rams' 2015 recruiting class during the fall early signing period in mid-November.
- Emmanuel Omogbo, a 6-8, 210-pound forward from Hyattsville, Md., will join the Rams from South Plains College in Levelland, Texas, the same program that current Ram Stanton Kidd played for out of high school. In his first season at South Plains, Omogbo - named a preseason junior college All-American by the Sporting News heading into his sophomore campaign - helped the Texans to a 29-6 record and an appearance in the NJCAA National Tournament quarterfinals. As a freshman at SPC Omogbo averaged 16.2 minutes per contest, appearing in all 35 games with five starts. He posted 7.5 points and 4.3 rebounds per game, while shooting 57.5 percent from the floor. Omogbo chose Colorado State over offers from Duquesne, East Carolina, La Salle and Louisiana-Lafayette, Louisiana Tech, UTEP and Wichita State.
- Prentiss Nixon, a four-star recruit according to ESPN.com, comes to the Colorado State as one of the top prep players in his class, rated as the No. 9 player in the state of Illinois, the No. 31 overall recruit in the Midwest region, and the No. 25 point guard in the class of 2015. As a junior in 2013-14, the 6-1, 180-pound point guard from Bolingbrook, Ill, helped the Bolingbrook Raiders to a 22-6 mark, averaging 18.2 points, 3.3 assists and 2.3 steals per game. Nixon chose Colorado State over offers from Bradley, Drake, Northern Illinois, Northern Iowa, Saint Louis, SMU, UIC and Wright State, and was also recruited by several Big Ten schools, including Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Purdue and Wisconsin.
- Anthony Bonner, 6-2, 170-pounder, is a versatile guard who joins the Rams from the same Lawrence (Kan.) High School program that produced CSU great Dorian Green. As a junior in 2013-14, he averaged 16.1 points, 3.8 rebounds and 1.9 assists per game, shooting 49 percent from the field overall, including hitting at a 42 percent clip from beyond the arc. As a sophomore Bonner averaged 10.7 points, 3.7 rebounds and 1.4 assists per game for the Lions. Bonner, rated as a three-star recruit by Rivals.com, chose the Rams over offers from Florida Gulf Coast, Missouri State and UMKC.
- Nico Carvacho, from Frisco, Texas, will come to Colorado State after his senior season at Sunrise Christian Academy in Wichita, Kan. As a junior last season at Frisco High School prior to his transfer to Sunrise Christian, Carvacho, the 6-10, 225-pound forward/center, averaged a double-double, posting 10 points and 10 rebounds per contest, helping the Raccoons to a 19-10 record. Carvacho was born in Santiago, Chile, and also boasts international experience playing with the Chilean national team at the 2013 FIBA U-16 Americas Championships.

Larry Eustachy | Long Beach State (1979) Third season at CSU (49-25); 24th season overall (451-283)

Larry Eustachy, the 2000 Associated Press and U.S. Basketball Writers Association National Coach of the Year, enters his second season as head coach of the Colorado State men's basketball program in 2013-14. He was introduced as the 19th head coach in the history of the CSU basketball on April 12, 2012.

In his first year at the helm, Eustachy led the Rams to arguably the best season in school history, guiding the squad to a program-best 26-9 record, and an NCAA Tournament victory over the Missouri Tigers before bowing out against even-

Eustachy's coaching career began at the age of 22 as an assistant coach at Citrus (Calif.) College, where he played two seasons after a standout prep career at Arcadia High School. From 1981-90 Eustachy honed his skills as an assistant at Division I schools Mississippi State (1981-86), Idaho (1986-87), Utah (1987-89) and Ball State (1989-90) before taking his first head coaching job at Idaho (1990-93).

Following his stint at Idaho, Eustachy spent five seasons (1993-98) as the head coach at Utah State (1993-98). He then took over for close friend Tim Floyd at Iowa State, spending five seasons in Ames, Iowa, and leading the Cyclones to the Elite Eight in the 2000 NCAA tournament.

Eustachy spent the previous eight seasons at Southern Miss, where he resurrected the Golden Eagles program and led USM to four 20 win seasons, including each of his last three campaigns in Hattiesburg.

Eustachy is a native of Alameda, Calif. He and his wife Lana live in Fort Collins. Eustachy has two sons, Hayden and Evan.



tual national champion Louisville.

The Rams cracked the Associated Press top 25 for first time since 1954, and in the process Eustachy became the only head coach in NCAA Division I history to lead five different programs - Colorado State, Southern Miss, Iowa State, Utah State and Idaho - to 24 or more wins in a single season.

A veteran mentor with more than 30 seasons of coaching experience - including 22 seasons as a head coach - Eustachy has amassed an impressive 444-283 record in stops at Idaho (1990-93), Utah State (1993-98), Iowa State (1998-03) and Southern Miss (2004-12) and CSU (2012-present), leading his squads to 11 campaigns of 20 or more victories, eight postseason berths (including five NCAA tournament appearances), and six conference championships.

Eustachy, a native of Alameda, Calif., and a 1979 graduate of Long Beach State University, has garnered numerous coaching honors throughout his illustrious career. In addition to his two National Coach of the Year nods in 2000, he was also the 2001 runner-up for the AP's top coaching honor.

He was twice named the Big West and Big 12 Coach of the Year during stints at Utah State (1995 and 1998) and Iowa State (2000 and 2001), respectively, and joins the Rams after leading his Southern Miss Golden Eagles' squad to 25 wins in 2011-12 to earn the 2012 Conference USA Coach of the Year award. Eustachy is also the reigning National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 11 Coach of the Year.

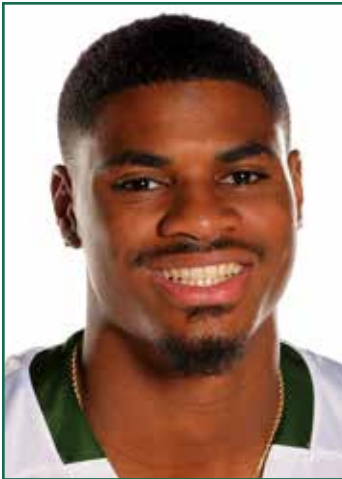

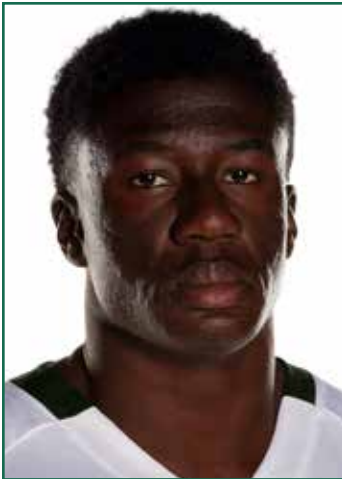

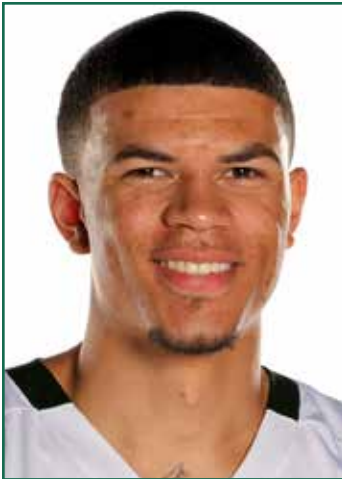
