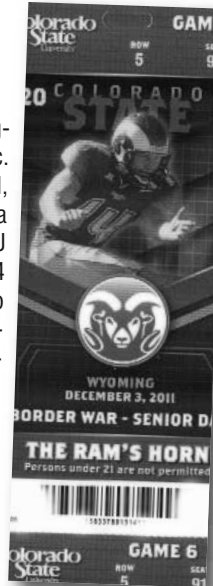

## CSU, WYOMING MEET FOR BORDER WAR

*Bronze Boot on line Saturday in meeting No. 102*

### This week's notable storylines...

- ▶ CSU closes its season with the Border War vs. Wyoming, CSU's latest regular-season game ever played in Fort Collins, two days more than the Dec. 1, 1928, regular-season finale against Colorado College at old Colorado Field, on the east side of campus. It's CSU's latest regular-season game since a Dec. 4, 1987, trip to Melbourne, Australia, where the Rams met BYU. CSU also closed the 2006 regular season at San Diego State (Dec. 2), the 1964 regular season at Hawaii (Dec. 4), the 1956 regular season at New Mexico (Dec. 1), the 1940 regular season at Fresno State (Dec. 5), the 1931 regular season against Nebraska in Denver (Dec. 5) and the 1925 regular season at Hawaii (Dec. 12).
- ▶ Prior to 2011, the latest CSU-Wyoming battle was Nov. 30, 1911, in Fort Collins.
- ▶ Saturday is Senior Day, the final college football game for 15 CSU players, including four current starters (Nuku Latu, Ivory Herd, Jake Gdowski and Paul Madsen) and team captain Mychal Sisson.
- ▶ CSU and Wyoming share the longest continuous rivalry west of the Mississippi, with an unofficial 103rd Border War meeting on tap this week. The teams' first meeting in 1899 was a CSU forfeit win, making this week officially the 102nd meeting. CSU does not recognize forfeits in all-time won-loss records.
- ▶ Head Coach Steve Fairchild is 8-5 with the Rams against Wyoming, 1-1 as a starting QB and 7-4 on the staff.

**Welcome...** The Colorado State athletic media relations office genuinely appreciates your coverage of CSU football, and looks forward to each and every time it can welcome you to Fort Collins. Members of the office, including director Zak Gilbert, assistant directors Danny Mattie and Danielle Marshall, and several student assistants, are available to assist with your coverage. The office is happy to help you however it can.

## Interviews...

- ▶ All interviews with any member of the football program, including the coaching staff and student-athletes, must be coordinated through the athletic media relations office.
- ▶ Head Coach Steve Fairchild is available either in-person or by phone, by appointment through his assistant, Linda Krier (970/491-7818).
- ▶ Telephone interviews with a coach or student-athlete should be arranged at least 24 hours in advance of the requested session, through the athletic media relations office.
- ▶ Phone calls (cell, office or home), text messages or social media contact (FaceBook, Twitter, etc.) to any coach or student-athlete are strictly prohibited, unless previously arranged through media relations. Media should contact media relations, rather than the individual coaches and/or student-athletes, when needing personal contact information, such as phone numbers or e-mail addresses.

## Postgame...

- ▶ All players and coaches must report immediately to the locker room before conducting interviews of any kind. Colorado State does not allow on-field interviews in the minutes following the final gun.
- ▶ Head Coach Steve Fairchild will meet the media, following his radio interview, in a designated area. When Fairchild is finished taking questions, CSU players and assistants will be made available to media upon request. The locker room is closed.

## Injuries...

- ▶ At all times throughout the calendar year, including spring practice, Head Coach Steve Fairchild will serve as the sole source for injury information. All questions related to injuries should be directed to Fairchild. Athletic training staff members will refer injury questions to Fairchild.
- ▶ If Fairchild is unavailable, contact the athletic media relations office.

## Photography/videography...

- ▶ Video cameras are permitted to shoot B-roll of practice as early as the first players arrive (usually 20-30 minutes prior to the start), but are asked to stop filming once the team's stretching period, usually very early in practice, concludes. Still photographers should take only tight shots during any 11-on-11 period, and no formations of any kind should be made public for competitive reasons.

**An effort for the ages:** Most of the Rams' starters are sophomores or younger, and one of their most talented playmakers, RB Chris Nwoke, earned conference recognition Monday morning for one of the top performances in the country this season.

### Game Notes

► Nwoke (pronounced WOH-kay), whose 269 rushing yards Saturday represented the third-best individual rushing effort by any player in the nation this year, earned his second Mountain West Player of the Week award, sharing honors with Air Force QB Tim Jefferson.

**Across the nation:** A 6-foot, 215-pound sophomore from ThunderRidge High School in Highlands Ranch, Colo., Nwoke's 269 yards Saturday vs. Air Force:

- Gave him the third most in a single game this season, behind West Virginia's Dustin Garrison (291 vs. Bowling Green Oct. 1) and Oregon's LaMichael James (288 vs. Arizona Sept. 24).
- Placed him with James, the Ducks' Heisman candidate, as one of two individuals this season with multiple games of at least 232 rushing yards, after Nwoke reached that total Nov. 12 vs. San Diego State. James registered 288 vs. Arizona (Sept. 24) and 239 vs. Cal (Oct. 6).
- Made him one of just six individuals with multiple 200-yard rushing games this season, joining James (3), Western Kentucky's Bobby Rainey (3), Baylor's Terrance Ganaway (2), Pitt's Ray Graham (2) and Wisconsin's Montee Ball (2).
- Vaulted him to 24th in the country with an average of 101.4 yards per game.

**In Mountain West annals:** A strong all-conference candidate, Nwoke also etched his name into the Mountain West record books in multiple categories Saturday, recording:

- The most rushing yards by a non-senior, breaking the mark held by New Mexico's DonTrell Moore, 242, his sophomore season vs. Colorado State (Nov. 7, 2003).
- The most rushing yards by any player in a conference game, eclipsing the record held by Air Force's Chad Hall, 256, at Colorado State (Oct. 13, 2007).
- The fourth-most rushing yards ever by any player, behind the 285 of CSU's Gartrell Johnson vs. Fresno State (Dec. 20, 2008), the 285 of SDSU's Larry Ned vs. Eastern Illinois (Oct. 6, 2001), and the 275 of Air Force's Hall vs. Army (Nov. 3, 2007).
- One of five individual seasons in conference history to include multiple 200-yard rushing efforts, joining SDSU's Ned (three in 2001), Air Force's Hall (two in 2007), SDSU's Ronnie Hillman (two in 2010), and SDSU's Lynell Hamilton (two in 2003).

The leading rusher in conference-only games and No. 2 overall behind Hillman, Nwoke picked up his third career 100-yard game Saturday, with all three efforts coming over the last four games, all in MW contests. Including his 232 yards vs. San Diego State (Nov. 12) and 156 the previous game at UNLV (Oct. 29), since entering the starting lineup over the last five games, Nwoke has averaged 162.0 rushing yards per game, and 6.9 yards per carry (118 attempts, 810 yards, five touchdowns).

Plus, Nwoke became the first CSU player to earn multiple MW Player of the Week honors in the same season since QB Bradlee Van Pelt also won the award twice in 2003. The conference also recognized Nwoke for his game-tying and go-ahead touchdowns in a memorable, 35-34 triumph in double overtime, Sept. 24 at Utah State. Nwoke's 232 rushing yards vs. San Diego State Nov. 12 may have earned him a third honor, if not for the effort of TCU QB Casey Pachall in a 36-35 win at then-No. 5 Boise State earlier in the day. Pachall not only earned MW honors, he also picked up national Offensive Player of the Week recognition from the Walter Camp foundation.

**In CSU history:** A business administration major with a 3.27 grade-point average, Nwoke needed just 154 rushing yards entering the Falcons game to

**Dave Christiansen's** first year as a college head coach in 2009 was filled with highlights. He led the Wyoming Cowboys to a bowl game in his first season, becoming only the second Cowboy head coach to accomplish that feat -- the other being Paul Roach in 1987. Christiansen became the first UW head coach to win a bowl game in his first season, as his Pokes defeated Fresno State, 35-28 in double overtime, in the New Mexico Bowl. He also guided Wyoming to a road win over archrival Colorado State in the regular-season finale, bringing the Bronze Boot back to Laramie.

► In his second season at UW, Christiansen's young team faced one of the nation's most difficult schedules. Wyoming played three teams that were ranked in the Top 5 in the nation at the time the Cowboys faced them (No. 3 Boise State, No. 4 Texas and No. 5 TCU) and played a fourth Top-10 ranked team in No. 10 Utah.

### NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

CSU's wide receivers coach/passing game coordinator Dan Hamerschmidt was an assistant head coach at Wyoming in 2009... Wyoming's roster has 24 players from Colorado, including former Rocky Mountain High School standout Korey Jones, from Fort Collins; Matt Birkeness, who attended Columbine High School in Littleton with CSU's Ben Tedford; Travis Hillen, who attended Thornton High School with CSU's Josh Tashiro; and Todd Knight, who attended Grandview High School in Aurora with CSU's Davis Burl... Injured CSU offensive lineman Joe Caprioglio has two former Highlands Ranch High School teammates on the Wyoming roster, Eric Mitchell (SS) and Mike Purcell (DT), who have played all 10 games for the Pokes this season... Wyoming DB Tashaun Gipson is the cousin of former CSU linebacker Chris Gipson.

### NOTABLE PERFORMANCES AGAINST WYOMING

- In three games vs Wyoming, Mychal Sisson has tallied 31 tackles, four tackles for loss, three sacks and a forced fumble.
- DE C.J. James has three career sacks against Wyoming, two in 2009 and another in 2010. He also forced a fumble in the 2009 contest.
- In 2010, Mike Orakpo tallied seven tackles and a sack.
- In 2009, Lou Greenwood had an 8-yard TD run.

become CSU's first 1,000-yard rusher since MW rushing champion Gartrell Johnson (1,476) in 2008, and the 19th overall.

- ▶ On his 62-yard TD run in the third quarter, he not only topped 1,000, he also became just the seventh CSU player to break 1,000 as a sophomore or younger. He joined sophomores Kyle Bell (2005), Cecil Sapp (2000), Kevin McDougal (1997), Damon Washington (1996) and Leonice Brown (1992), and freshman Steve Bartalo (1983).
- ▶ Nwoke became the first player in CSU history with multiple 200-yard rushing efforts in the same season.
- ▶ He joined a group of four CSU players with multiple 200-yard rushing games in a career: McDougal (1997 and '99), Lawrence McCutcheon (1969, '70) and Bartalo (1983, '85). The three previous players were drafted by NFL teams.
- ▶ His 269-yard effort represented the third-best rushing total ever by a CSU player, topped only by Tony Alford's 310 yards at Utah (Oct. 28, 1989) and Johnson's 285 in the New Mexico Bowl vs. Fresno State (Dec. 20, 2008).
- ▶ His 269 yards were the most ever by any player in 227 all-time games at Hughes Stadium, which opened in 1968. He broke the record held by Air Force's Hall, who had 256 in a Falcons win on Oct. 13, 2007. Among CSU players, he now owns the top two efforts ever at the facility, including his 232 yards vs. San Diego State (Nov. 12).
- ▶ An all-around weapon, he also extended the longest reception streak on the team to 12 games, including a catch in all 11 contests this year. Nwoke's streak started Nov. 20, 2010, at Wyoming.

He has an opportunity this week to break Bell's CSU sophomore rushing record (1,288 in 2005), needing 174 in the season finale Saturday. With 1,115 yards this season, Nwoke's already No. 10 on the Rams' all-time single-season list, and by passing Bell, he would rank fifth on that chart.

- ▶ Injuries this season have ended six significant playing streaks, the latest that of starting QB Pete Thomas, whose sprained knee ended his 21-game starting streak, tied for longest on the team with Weston Richburg and Jake Gdowski. Thomas last missed a game as a freshman in high school, halfway through the 2006 season.
- ▶ Elijah-Blu Smith's shoulder ended a 14-game playing streak at UNLV Oct. 29. Other injuries have ended streaks held by OT Paul Madsen, NT Nuku Latu, LB Mychal Sisson and OT Joe Caprioglio.
- ▶ CSU injuries have combined to prevent 67 starts this season. And among 15 key contributors, health ailments have claimed 88 combined games.
- ▶ Prior to Smith's injury, all-conference tackle Madsen sustained a knee injury vs. Boise State and missed a game Oct. 22 for the first time since Sept. 6, 2009, at Colorado (28-game streak), when he didn't play on a line that featured four eventual NFL players. Madsen also owned the team's longest active starts streak, 25.
- ▶ Latu, who sprained a knee late in the CU game Sept. 17, missed the first game of his life Sept. 24 at Utah State, ending a streak of 40 games. The

streak was tied with Ivory Herd for longest on the team.

- ▶ Sisson also entered the season having not missed a game (since seventh grade), until his broken ankle Sept. 10 forced him out of the CU game the ensuing week. Sisson until his ankle injury had missed just two starts, and no games since seventh grade.
- ▶ Caprioglio also injured his knee in the CU game and saw the end of a 15-game streak. Caprioglio had started 12 straight.

**The Bronze Boot (courtesy John Hirn):** Since 1968, the Bronze Boot has become possibly the most famous piece of footwear in college football history. This U.S. Army combat boot, gilded in bronze, is the traveling trophy that goes to the winning football team every year when Wyoming and CSU square off.

- ▶ In the 43 years the boot has been exchanged, Wyoming owns a 22-21 advantage, making the Border War the most balanced rivalry in terms of wins and losses over the period since the boot was first introduced.
- ▶ Few fans of both schools realize the history behind this famous boot before it became the trophy both schools live for each and every football season. It started as a United States-issued Army combat boot to Captain Dan Romero. Romero, a native of Colorado and 1955 graduate of Pueblo Central High School, attended Pueblo Junior College for two years before he graduated from Adams State College. While at Adams State, he met his wife and played varsity basketball and baseball.
- ▶ As the war in Vietnam heated up and a draft was imminent, Romero joined the Army before he was drafted. He then attended Officer Candidate School (OCS), where he received his commission to become an officer. Romero was then sent to Vietnam for a tour of duty and in the spring of 1968 he returned to the United States, where he was assigned to the Colorado State University ROTC Military Science Department as an assistant professor. Since he was at CSU as an assistant professor, Romero enrolled as a graduate student as expected when officers are assigned to ROTC duty.
- ▶ Romero's son, Jeff, is a Rocky Mountain High School graduate and walked onto the CSU football team in 1982 before following in his dad's footsteps in the Army. Jeff now is an FBI agent.

**Tradition starts with Bronze Boot Run Friday:** This year's Border War pits Colorado State against Wyoming for the 102nd meeting (CSU doesn't recognize the 1899 forfeit, or any forfeit in its all-time records), and extends the battle for the Bronze Boot into its fourth decade.

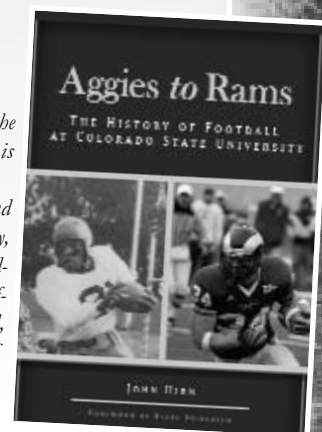

## This month in CSU football history

*Aggies to Rams: The History of Football at Colorado State University*

- ▶ 100 years ago – Nov. 30, 1911, the Aggies play their last football game at Durkee Field, currently the site of the Glenn Morris Field House, and lose 27-0 against the University of Wyoming. The loss gives the Aggies an 0-6 record in Harry Hughes' inaugural season as coach of the Colorado Agricultural College (CSU) football team. Although the Aggies don't score a point in 1911, they go on to win eight conference championships under Hughes between 1915 and 1934.
- ▶ 95 years ago – Nov. 30, 1916, the Colorado Aggies, behind the famed "Million-Dollar Play" executed by Sag Robinson and Linne Klemmedson, defeat the University of Colorado 32-14 to win their second consecutive conference championship. The Aggies do not lose a game in 1915 or 1916 to go 13-0-1 over the two-year span.
- ▶ 70 years ago – Nov. 22, 1941, legendary coach Harry Hughes wins the 126th and final game of his career as head football coach at Colorado State. During his 31-year career, Hughes wins eight conference championships, is a member of the National Rules committee and is given the nickname "Dean of American Football Coaches" by his peers. In April of 1942, Hughes steps down as head football coach, but remains athletic director and track coach until 1953. Hughes has won more football games than any other coach in CSU history.
- ▶ 45 years ago – Nov. 12, 1966, Oscar Reed breaks Wayne Schneider's all-time record for career rushing yards at CSU in an impressive win over West Texas State. Reed rushes for 194 yards in the game, including a 70-yard touchdown on the first play from scrimmage, breaking the school record for most yards in a game set by Jack Christiansen in 1950. He is later honored as the Sports Illustrated Back of the Week, the first Ram to win the award since Gary Glick in 1954.
- ▶ 40 years ago – Nov. 27, 1971, the Rams win their third game in a row to close out a difficult season. Senior running back Lawrence McCutcheon finishes the season with 1,112 yards rushing, the second year in a row he has rushed for more than 1,000 yards. The Clutch finishes his career as a Ram with 2,917 yards and remains fifth on the all-time list.
- ▶ 25 years ago – Nov. 22, 1986, CSU running back Steve Bartalo rushes for 162 yards against UTEP in the final game of his career. Bartalo finishes with 4,813 yards rushing and remains the school leader in career rushing yards, touchdowns and attempts. He runs for 100 yards or more in 16 games during his four-year career at CSU.
- ▶ 15 years ago – Nov. 2, 1996, the Rams perform a miracle comeback at Falcon Stadium, beginning with 5:48 left in the third quarter. Trailing 41-14, CSU scores four unanswered touchdowns, including a clutch fourth-and-10 pass by Moses Moreno to Jeremy Calhoun from the Falcon 20-yard line with less than one minute remaining on the clock, to beat Air Force 42-41. Calhoun's finger-tip catch and the extra point seal an amazing victory over their in-state rivals.

► On Friday, the Wyoming ROTC cadets will run the ball 26 miles from War Memorial Stadium in Laramie to the Colorado-Wyoming border on U.S. Highway 287. Colorado State Army ROTC cadets will then run the game ball the remaining 39 miles to Hughes Stadium.

► In 1968, CSU Army ROTC cadre member Maj. Vic Fernandez came up with the idea of having a trophy fitting of the rivalry between CSU and UW, an authentic, battle-tested combat boot. CSU Army ROTC graduate and cadre member Capt. Dan Romero donated a combat boot he wore during his 1966-67 tour in the Vietnam conflict. Romero had the boot bronzed and mounted on a walnut base in 1968. The base bears a plaque that holds the history of the Bronze Boot series. Close inspection of the boot will reveal small tears and cuts, scars of battle that have remained on the 48-year-old boot through the bronzing process and 42 years of travel between the rival universities.

► Every year Army ROTC cadets from CSU and UW run the game ball from the visiting team's stadium to the site of the Border War game and guard the trophy until the game is over.

**Series history:** The first meeting between CSU and Wyoming was Thanksgiving Day 1899 and ended in a dispute over the rules. The Cowboys forfeited and the game never counted in the official record. The bad blood of 1899 spilled over into 1900 and again the two schools had a disagreement, this time over the eligibility of players. Although the rivalry continued to be cordial until after WWII, the first two meetings between the border schools signaled the beginning of the Border War.

► The 1924 game never occurred because Wyoming Governor William Ross died the week of the contest. Out of respect, both schools decided not to play that Saturday and due to scheduling conflicts were not able to make up the game. Since 1929, CSU and Wyoming have only missed playing one another three times, all during WWII.

► In 1949 and 1958, Colorado Field was the site of two near riots between fans from Fort Collins and Laramie. When the 1949 game ended, Wyoming fans tried to tear down the goalposts mainly because Colorado A&M fans had done so after the 1948 game in Laramie. When Aggie fans tried to prevent the posts from coming down, fights broke out and tear gas was unleashed on the crowd. In 1958, fans from both schools poured onto the field as they disputed a non-touchdown call that made the difference in the game. Again, tear gas had to be used to disperse the crowd.

► CSU Coach Sark Arslanian vowed to his Rams after the 1973 Wyoming game that they (the players in the room that day) would never lose to the Cowboys again. The Rams beat Wyoming in 1974, '75 and '76, winning the Bronze Boot for the first times since the traveling trophy was established in 1968.

**Regular-season finales:** The Rams have won three of their last six regular-season finales, defeating Wyoming in 2007 and 2008, and topping UNLV in 2005. Their losses in that stretch were at San Diego State in 2006 and against Wyoming in 2009 and '10.

Rams shut out in Border War, 44-0  
Colorado State finishes season 3-9

LARAMIE, Wyo. - Alvester Alexander rushed for 147 yards and five touchdowns as Wyoming retained the Bronze Boot and dealt Colorado State a humbling loss, 44-0, at War Memorial Stadium Saturday.

The Cowboys' win ensures their possession of the trophy for a second straight year. The fight between Wyoming (3-9, 1-7 Mountain West) and Colorado State (3-, 2-6) is the longest continuous college football rivalry west of the Mississippi River, and ends each team's season every year.

Offensively, the Rams struggled to find a rhythm as they were riddled with dropped passes, untimely penalties, and the inability to convert on third downs (2-of-15).

Freshman quarterback Pete Thomas statistically had his least productive game of the year. He went 16-of-33 with 97 yards and an interception. However, the game was enough for Thomas to break the Mountain West Conference record for freshman passing yards in a season, set by Ryan Lindley of San Diego State in 2008.

The Rams' defense also had its fair share of struggles Saturday. Missed tackles plagued the unit as CSU allowed 212 rushing yards to the Cowboys.

The loss concludes the 2010 season for the Rams, and sights are set on preparing for 2011. The Rams will have Thanksgiving week off and then begin lifting and conditioning for next season Nov. 29.





# CSU loses to rival Air Force

FORT COLLINS, Colo. (AP) - The Rams lost their seventh straight game, 45-21, Saturday night and their sixth straight to Air Force, despite sophomore Chris Nwoke's career-best 269-yard rushing performance that included TD runs of 62 and 2 yards.

Tim Jefferson threw three touchdown passes to Zack Kauth in the second quarter and Air Force routed rival Colorado State to reach bowl eligibility for the fifth straight season.

The Falcons (7-5, 3-4 Mountain West) were expected to have their best season under fifth-year coach Troy Calhoun but a spate of injuries left them battling for a bowl on their season finale instead. Their resounding win marked the first time in the program's history that Air Force has won seven or more games in five straight seasons.

Kauth came into the game with just one TD catch this season. All three of his grabs Saturday were TDs, covering 33, 40 and 50 yards.

**TEAM NOTES**

**The 200 club:** RB Chris Nwoke became the first player in CSU history with multiple 200-yard rushing efforts in the same season. He joins a group of four CSU players with multiple 200-yard rushing games in a career: Kevin McDougal (1997 and '99), Lawrence McCutcheon (1969, '70) and Steve Bartalo (1983, '85). The three previous players were drafted by NFL teams.

**Third-best:** Nwoke's 269-yard effort represented the third-best rushing total ever by a CSU player, topped only by Tony Alford's 310 yards at Utah (Oct. 28, 1989) and Gartrell Johnson's 285 in the New Mexico Bowl vs. Fresno State (Dec. 20, 2008).

**No. 1 at stadium:** Chris Nwoke's 269 yards were the most ever by any player in 227 all-time games at Hughes Stadium, which opened in 1968. He broke the record held by Air Force's Chad Hall, who had 256 in a Falcons win on Oct. 13, 2007. Among CSU players, he now owns the top two efforts ever at the facility, including his 232 yards vs. San Diego State (Nov. 12).

**From scrimmage:** Nwoke carries now account for three of the Rams' longest four plays from scrimmage this season: 67 and 63-yard runs vs. San Diego State (Nov. 12), and his 62-yard carry vs. Air Force. Garrett Grayson's 66-yard pass to Raymond Carter at No. 19 TCU (Nov. 19) is CSU's second-longest play.

**Across the nation:** After all weekend games, Nwoke's effort emerged as the No. 3 individual rushing performance by an FBS player this season, trailing only West Virginia's Dustin Garrison (Oct. 1 vs. Bowling Green and Oregon's LaMichael James (Sept. 24 vs. Arizona). He also now is one of just six individuals in the country with multiple 200-yard rushing games this season, joining James (3), Western Kentucky's Bobby Rainey (3), Baylor's Terrance Ganaway, Pitt's Ray Graham and Wisconsin's Montee Ball.

- In that group of six, only James and Nwoke have multiple games of 232 yards or more.

**Passing attempts & receiving streaks:** The Rams attempted just 13 passes. Two season-long reception streaks, those held by Crockett Gillmore and Joe Brown, came to an end. However, RB Chris Nwoke extended the longest streak on the team to 12 games, including a catch in all 11 games this year. Nwoke's streak started Nov. 20, 2010, at Wyoming.

**30 front:** CSU opened in a 3-4 defense. The Rams started Nuku Latu at nose tackle, with defensive ends John Froland and C.J. James, in front of inside linebackers Max Morgan and Shaquil Barrett, and outside linebackers James Skelton and Mychal Sisson. Sisson made his first start since breaking his ankle Sept. 10 vs. Northern Colorado.

**First two drives:** CSU forced and recovered a fumble to end the first Air Force drive, then pitched a three-and-out, to keep the Rams in the game.

**Opening drive:** CSU scored on its opening drive for the first time since Sept. 10, when CSU also scored a touchdown, vs. Northern Colorado. CSU was 3-for-3 on third down on that drive.

**In the second quarter:** Air Force in the second quarter outscored CSU 31-0 and outgained the Rams 267-82.

**First lead against Air Force in three years:** Until Byron Steele's first-quarter touchdown reception, the Rams had not led the Falcons since Nov. 8, 2008, when Gartrell Johnson also capped an opening drive with a touchdown to give CSU a 7-0 lead at Falcon Stadium. Air Force went on to win, 38-17.

**Air Force series:** CSU and Air Force met for the 50th renewal of their series, which began in 1957. They've met every season since 1978, Steve Fairchild's first season as the Rams' starting quarterback. Air Force has won six straight.

**First-time starters:** Including LB Max Morgan, who made his first career start, 22 players have made their first Division I starts this season: G Jordan Gragert, FB Joe Brown, WR Marquise Law, TE Crockett Gillmore, DT John Froland, LB Mike Orakpo, S Austin Gray, DE Nordly Capi, TE Blake Jones, FB Austin Gillmore, LB Shaquil Barrett, NT Te'Jay Brown, T Ty Sambrailo, WR Lee Clubb, DT Curtis Wilson, FB Jake Levin, T Mason Hathaway, S Drew Reilly, WR Thomas Coffman, WR Charles Lovett, QB Garrett Grayson and LB Max Morgan.

**First-time starter at higher level:** Caleb Hanie, the CSU quarterback from 2004-07, will make his first NFL start Sunday in place of an injured Jay Cutler, when the Bears travel to meet the Oakland Raiders Sunday. Hanie, who valiantly rallied the Bears in last season's NFC Championship game and nearly secured a Super Bowl berth,

would become the first CSU QB to start an NFL game since Moses Moreno opened under center for San Diego on Nov. 12, 2000, in a 17-7 loss vs. Miami. Moreno that season shared time at quarterback with Ryan Leaf and Jim Harbaugh, the former Stanford head coach who currently has the 49ers sitting at 9-1. Hanie would become the third quarterback from Colorado State to start an NFL game, along with first-round draft selection Kelly Stouffer:

- Moreno, three games (one with Chicago Bears in 1998, two with San Diego Chargers in 2000).
- Kelly Stouffer, 16 games with Seattle Seahawks from 1988-92.

**Injury update:** CSU injuries have combined to prevent 67 starts this season. And among 16 key contributors, health ailments have claimed 88 combined games. Turnover trouble: The Rams during their seven-game losing streak are minus-seven in the giveaway-takeaway category.

**INDIVIDUAL NOTES**

- **RB Chris Nwoke** picked up his third career 100-yard game. All three efforts have come over a stretch of the last four contests. He had 232 yards vs. San Diego State (Nov. 12) and 156 the previous game at UNLV (Oct. 29). Since entering the starting lineup over a five-game stretch, Nwoke has averaged 162.0 rushing yards per game, and 6.9 yards per carry (118 attempts, 810 yards, five touchdowns).
- **RB Chris Nwoke** needed just 154 rushing yards entering the game to become CSU's first 1,000-yard rusher since MW rushing champion Gartrell Johnson (1,476) in 2008, and 19th overall. **BELIEVE**...Steve Fairchild's team-wide focus for his fourth Colorado State football team is *BELIEVE*. Throughout the team's meeting areas and offices are banners presenting the theme, along with the team goals for the season. The following Richard M. DeVos quote appears on the signage:

"The only thing that stands between men and their goals is merely **the will to try** and the faith to **believe it is possible.**"

▶ As part of that theme, team advisor Johnny Square is meeting with players and coaches throughout the season.

**NFL genetics:** Colorado State now has six players, including brothers T.J. and Bobby Borcky, whose fathers played in the NFL.

- ▶ RB Donnell Alexander (Derrick Thomas, Kansas City Chiefs)
- ▶ DE Broderick Sargent (Broderick Sargent Sr., Arizona Cardinals, Dallas Cowboys).

**Coaching staff changes:** Saying, "Change can be good," Steve Fairchild emerged from an intense evaluation of his overall program fol-

lowing a second straight 3-9 season in 2010, and made several changes to the Rams.

- ▶ CSU's cupboard of talent was largely empty when the current staff took over before the '08 season, and most national experts agree that the Rams' coaches have ranked among the best in the country in terms of recruiting over the three classes in which they've worked been able to work the full 17-month period. But patience is no longer on the Rams' side, and Fairchild knows fans expect results this season, saying anything less than a bowl in 2011 would be an obvious disappointment.
- ▶ Believing in the recruiting effort his staff has made, he hired just one new coach, to replace Scott Brown, who departed for Arizona State. But that doesn't mean Fairchild didn't make significant changes. In an effort to curb the team's disturbing third-down struggles on defense, and improve the overall product on that side of the ball, he put a new individual in charge of every defensive unit, shifting Todd Stroud from tight ends to defensive line, and Tim Duffie from cornerbacks to the overall secondary, and hiring Bernard Clark to coach linebackers, replacing Brown, the former DL coach. In turn, he removed the linebackers responsibility from coordinator Larry Kerr, freeing the veteran coach to move to the press box and focus on the defense as a whole.
- ▶ The Rams also made several changes in terms of technique and scheme, after studying the nation's most successful defenses.
- ▶ Fairchild, who became more involved in the defense, also promoted safeties coach Larry Lewis to associate head coach and RB coach and moved Anthony Hill from RBs to TEs. Across the country, only Nebraska is believed to have made as many similar changes to its coaching staff without significant turnover.
- ▶ In fact, CSU is one of just three schools in the MW, and one of only 34 teams in the country, that brought in one or fewer new coaches:

**Player of the Week trio:** CSU linebacker Shaquil Barrett (defense), long-snapper Tanner Hedstrom (special teams) and running back Chris Nwoke (co-offense) earned respective MW Player of the Week honors in the same weekend following the triumph at Utah State (Sept. 24).

► It was the first time the Rams have claimed three Player of the Week honors in the same weekend. On seven previous occasions since joining the Mountain West in 1999, CSU has had at least two such awards after a game, most recently Oct. 24, 2005, when QB Justin Holland (offense) and DB Joey Rucks (special teams) did it.

► The last time a Mountain West team won as many as three Player of the Week awards in one weekend was Nov. 22, 2008, when Utah’s Brian Johnson (offense), Paul Kruger (co-defense with SDSU’s Luke Laolagi) and Louie Sakoda (special teams) accomplished the feat just prior to the Utes’ triumph over Alabama in the Sugar Bowl.

► CSU earned the honors after a remarkable, 35-34 win in double overtime at Utah State, three weeks after USU arguably should’ve beaten the defending national champion, Auburn, at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

► Barrett, a 6-2, 244-pound sophomore from Baltimore, Md., was paramount in the triumph, after helping CSU pull back into the contest in the second half, then win it in double overtime. He gave life to the Rams with USU up 14-3 in the third quarter, scooping up a Michael Smith fumble in the backfield and returning it 15 yards for his first career touchdown. Then, on the next series, Barrett sacked QB Chuckie Keeton, rushing from a DE position, to force a punt. Earlier in the evening, he made a leaping pass deflection to prevent a possible TD, and finished the contest with a team-leading 14 tackles. A 2011 transfer from Nebraska-Omaha, Barrett was immediately eligible because UNO disbanded its football program after the ‘10 season. A key cog in the middle of the Rams’ defense after the fractured ankle sustained by All-America candidate Mychal Sisson, Barrett played at Boys Town High School, a boarding institution in Nebraska, and also had interest from Miami, Fla., before choosing the Rams.

► Hedstrom, a 6-1, 220-pound sophomore from Fort Collins (Colo.) High School, has been CSU’s primary long-snapper for punts and placements since Game 5 of his freshman season, when he replaced an injured Scott Albritton, now with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. On Saturday night, he was life-saving in the win, recovering not one but two muffed punts, one late in the fourth quarter with the Rams trailing 21-13 and only 2:06 left in regulation. By pouncing on an Eric Moats muff at the USU 15, Hedstrom set up Nwoke’s game-tying TD and the ensuing two-point conversion in the final minute that sent the game to overtime. Earlier, Hedstrom recovered another muffed punt to give CSU possession at the USU 35, and made a tackle on a previous punt.

► Nwoke, who shared offensive honors with New Mexico WR Deon Long, also was principal in the win, especially on the Rams’ final three pos-

sessions, when he picked up 47 hard-earned yards on 11 carries, including a career-best two touchdowns. With 42 seconds left in regulation, he helped CSU erase a 21-13 deficit with a 1-yard score (just before Pete Thomas hit Crockett Gillmore for a game-tying two-point conversion to send the game to OT. Then in the extra periods, he ran seven times for 32 yards, setting up Gillmore’s game-tying TD and then scoring the eventual game-winning points with a 2-yard TD of his own. In the first half, Nwoke also converted a pair of third-and-1 attempts, one on an important second-quarter FG drive to put CSU on the board. A 6-0, 215-pound power back from ThunderRidge High School in Highlands Ranch, Colo., Nwoke leads the Rams with four touchdowns this season.

► None of the three individuals had previously earned a Mountain West weekly honor.

**Jackson headlines Hall class:** Colorado State welcomed five new members to its Sports Hall of Fame during induction ceremonies Oct. 14.

► Six-time Olympic gold medalist Amy Van Dyken, one of the most prominent members of the Hall of Fame, returned to emcee the induction ceremonies.

► The Fort Collins Marriott, the home of the Rams, hosted the celebration, in conjunction with the football team’s clash with nationally ranked Boise State that weekend at Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium.

► The 2011 class features Courtney Cox, a former volleyball player; Gerry Glyde, a former standout in cross country and track; Ray Jackson, a former football star who set CSU’s career record with 20 interceptions; Teri Klement, a former softball player; and Don (Lefty) Straub, a former baseball player.

► The headliner is Jackson, who started at cornerback for the Western Athletic Conference champions in both the 1994 and ‘95 seasons. His CSU career accolades weren’t limited to the field, as he was named first-team all-WAC in addition to the 1995 College Football Association (CFA) Good Works Team for leadership and community service.

► After his time in Fort Collins, Jackson played in the NFL from 1996-2001 for the Cleveland Browns and Buffalo Bills. After his playing career, he went on to work for the Browns and the Pittsburgh Steelers, where he currently serves as the AFC champion’s director of player development.

**Offensive line experienced again:** Two years ago, CSU had the most experienced offensive line in the country, returning four starters that combined for more career starts than any other national group. All four of those starters wound up in NFL camps following the season.

► Entering this season, the Rams once again bring back four starters on their offensive front: led by senior G Jake Gdowski and a preseason all-conference selection, senior T Paul Madsen, along with junior T Joe Caprioglio and the anchor of the unit, Freshman All-American C Weston Richburg.

► The other starter is a former grayshirt who lettered as a redshirt freshman last season, G Jordan Gragert. And with three set to return next season, the protectors of Pete Thomas figure to be again among the most experienced in the nation in 2012 and ‘13. Richburg alone, an honorable-mention all-conference choice as a freshman last year, has the opportunity to start every game in his college career.

► This season, CSU’s 62 combined offensive-line starts returning ranks 69th in the nation and fourth in the conference, according to Phil Steele, who considers the category important in determining a given team’s ability to succeed. The MW teams:

**College debuts:** All told, 20 players have made their Division I debuts in 2011: WR Thomas Coffman, WR Charles Lovett, S Austin Gray, WR Lee Clubb, DB Bernard Blake, S Drew Reilly, LB Max Morgan, OL Mason Myers, DT John Froland, OL Mason Hathaway, TE Blake Jones and OL Ty Sambrailo, RB Mark Woodbury, LB Aaron Davis, LB Eric Niederberger, FB Joe McKay, LB Jordan Murphy, LB Ken Hulbert, FB Kivon Cartwright and QB Garrett Grayson. Seven players (Lovett, Clubb, Reilly, Davis, Murphy, Jones and Grayson), are true freshmen.

**CSU debuts:** In addition to the above 20 players, 22 total players have seen their first action in a CSU uniform this year, including two transfers, DL Colton Paulhus and LB Shaquil Barrett.

**First starts:** The following 22 players have made their first Division I starts this season: G Jordan Gragert, FB Joe Brown, WR Marquise Law, TE Crockett Gillmore, DT John Froland, LB Mike Orakpo, S Austin Gray, DE Nordly Capi, TE Blake Jones, FB Austin Gillmore, LB Shaquil Barrett, NT Te'Jay Brown, T Ty Sambrailo, WR Lee Clubb, DT Curtis Wilson, FB Jake Levin, T Mason Hathaway, S Drew Reilly, WR Thomas Coffman, WR Charles Lovett, QB Garrett Grayson and LB Max Morgan.

**True freshmen, CSU history:** WR Charles Lovett, WR Lee Clubb, S Drew Reilly, LB Aaron Davis, FB Jordan Murphy, TE Blake Jones and QB Garrett Grayson are CSU's seven true freshmen who have played in 2011.

► Last season, nine true freshmen made their college debuts: LB Mike Orakpo, QB Pete Thomas, LB Charles Favors, CB Shaq Bell, DE Nordly Capi, RB Tony Drake, DE Crockett Gillmore, FB Jake Levin and WR Bobby Borcky. All except Levin (Sept. 18 at Miami-Ohio) and Borcky (Oct. 9 at Air Force) made their debuts in the 2010 season-opener, Sept. 4 vs. Colorado in Denver.

► Those nine were the most used in a single season by the Rams in 23 years. In 1987, under head coach Leon Fuller, CSU used 15 players fresh out of high school (RB Tony Alford, LB Jon Boyd, CB Andy Byrne, RB Tony Carr, DE Robert Chirico, LB Mike Epley, G Jeff Fixmer, P Alan Glazer, LB Don Hock, CB Craig Jersild, LB David Laskowski, FB Paul MacRenato, LB Ron Martin, TE Keith Sheaffer and LB Eric Tippeconnic).

► The most true freshmen the program has ever used was 24 in 1946. According to team historian John Hirn, there were 47 men on the roster in 1946 and 33 were true freshmen, 24 of which played. In the opener that year against Montana, 19 true freshmen saw the field. Two players in that freshman class, George Jones and future College Football Hall of Famer Fum McGraw, would lead the Aggies to some of the most successful seasons in program annals, including the team's first bowl, the Raisin Bowl at the end of the '48 campaign. McGraw, the first consensus All-American in program history, and Jones are CSU Hall of Famers.

► Colorado State used only three true freshmen in 2009 (P Pete Kontodidakos, RB Lou Greenwood and DE C.J. James).

► The year before, five hit the field: Ben DeLine, Marquise Law, Adam Wilson, Momo Thomas and Michael Kawulok. Thomas and Kawulok started, while DeLine had served as the primary kicker after a Jason Smith injury.

► Over the previous two years combined (2006-07), the Rams used just two, both in 2007 (tight end Eric Peitz and long-snapper Steve Bryan). In 2006, CSU and Wake Forest were the only Division I programs that did not use a true freshman. From 2005-07, the number was just five, including S Klint Kubiak, DT Shaun McGoveran and DE Wade Landers in 2005. The last time CSU used as many as five true freshmen in an entire season was six in 2004 — WR Damon Morton, RB Gartrell Johnson, DE Matt Rupp, TE Kory Sperry, QB Caleb Hanie and RB Kyle Bell.

**Experienced sophomores:** An experienced sophomore class seems to monopolize the majority of the talent on the Rams' roster. That class, led by recently elected team captain Pete Thomas, freshman All-American Weston Richburg and WLB Mike Orakpo, features seven starters, including LB Shaquil Barrett, G Jordan Gragert, DE Nordly Capi and TE Crockett Gillmore. Meanwhile, RB Chris Nwoke, CB Shaq Bell and DTs Curtis Wilson and Te'Jay Brown have seen plenty of playing time in their respective rotations.

**CSU to practice in Denver April 13:** CSU, which has approximately 43,000 alumni and 70,000 former students living in the six-county Denver Metro Area, makes an annual fall appearance in Denver at the Cinch Jeans Rocky Mountain Showdown. Now, the Rams are going to make a Mile High City appearance in the spring.

► The CSU athletic department announced Aug. 24 plans to hold a football practice on April 13 at Infinity Park in Glendale, a Denver suburb. The evening session will take place at Infinity Stadium, near the corner of S. Cherry St. and E. Kentucky Ave. Concessions are expected to be available, as are Ram Town inflatables for kids.

► Also, in conjunction with the practice, the football team will attempt to arrange community-service appearances in the Metro Area. With its Community Service Initiative, CSU is believed to be the nation's only football program that requires 100 percent of its players to make a minimum of three community appearances each year. But those appearances to date have been only in Northern Colorado. This practice gives the Rams an opportunity to expand the initiative to the Denver area.

► Many more details will be announced as they are confirmed at a later date.

**A third straight first-year starter:** Finally in 2011, the Rams have a returning starter at quarterback in Pete Thomas, their first such player in the Fairchild era and first since Caleb Hanie in 2007.

► For the third consecutive season in 2010, the Rams sent out a first-year starting quarterback to begin their campaign. True freshman Pete Thomas followed in the footsteps of fifth-year seniors Grant Stucker (2009) and Billy Farris (2008).

► Only six total programs at the FBS level (Mississippi State, North Texas, Auburn, Buffalo, Purdue and CSU) opened 2010 with a first-year starter for at least a third straight year.

**Who needs fingers, anyway:** CSU technical intern/defensive line assistant Trevor Wikre was a four-year starter (2005-08) at Mesa State, Wikre played his first two seasons as a defensive tackle before moving to offensive guard for his final two years, earning all-conference honors as a junior and All-America honors as a senior. Midway through that 2008 campaign, a compound dislocation of his finger caused ligament damage that doctors told him would prevent his return that season. But to preserve his college career, Wikre chose to have his finger amputated. The surgery forced him to miss the only game of his career, but he returned and played

- ▶ T.J. Borcky, WR (plays as WR, made switch from QB as a redshirt freshman after volunteering to do a test-drive as a scout-team WR, QB at Lake Highland Prep in Orlando).
- ▶ Lee Clubb, WR (QB at Iowa Park High School in Texas).
- ▶ Austin Gillmore, FB (QB at Bushland High School in Texas).
- ▶ Charles Lovett, WR (replaced graduated Tarean Austin, now with New Mexico, as a senior at Hillsborough High School in Tampa, Fla.).
- ▶ Byron Steele, WR (option QB at Arlington Lamar High School in Texas).
- ▶ Weston Richburg, C (QB early in Bushland High in Texas).
- ▶ Matt Yemm, WR (holder on all placements, plays as WR, QB at Fort Collins, Colo., High School).

**New Russell uniforms:** CSU Athletic Director Paul Kowalczyk just before the 2010 season finalized a three-year contract with Russell Athletic. The deal is worth more than \$1 million.

- ▶ CSU kicked off the 2010 season with its first uniform change since 2003.
- ▶ "We are very pleased to extend our relationship with Russell," Kowalczyk said. "They have been a dedicated, long-standing partner and their renewed commitment to CSU – our team's sharp, new uniforms are but one obvious example – will continue to enhance our brand and benefit our image."
- ▶ With four jerseys — green and traditional orange to wear at home, and white and gold for road contests — and three colors of pants (white, green and gold), Head Coach Steve Fairchild and the Rams' player council have several options each week. In fact, including black and white Under Armour shoes, the team has 24 total uniform combinations.
- ▶ Fairchild and equipment manager Kris Young leaned heavily on the upperclass leaders of the team for direction during the design phase.
- ▶ As a tribute to their past, when the school colors were pumpkin and alfalfa, the Rams wore orange tops when they opened their Fort Collins slate on Sept. 10 vs. UNC. Fans also were encouraged to "orange out" the stadium that day. CSU will wear gold at TCU.
- ▶ The Rams are 2-2 with green jerseys and gold pants, 0-1 with green jerseys and white pants, 0-2 with green jerseys and green pants, 0-4 with white jerseys and white pants, 1-3 with white jerseys and green pants, 1-2 with white jerseys and gold pants, 0-1 with gold jerseys and green pants, 0-1 with gold jerseys and white pants, and 2-1 with orange jerseys and white pants.

**Permanent team captains:** CSU on Aug. 26 voted for team captains, naming Mychal Sisson and Ivory Herd defensive captains, Derek Good special-teams captain, and Paul Madsen and Pete Thomas offensive leaders.

- ▶ Thomas, 19, is believed to be among the youngest captains in CSU history.
- ▶ "I take captains very seriously," Fairchild said, "because I was a captain back in 1980 here at CSU."
- ▶ For the first time in since 1992, the Rams began in 2008 voting for permanent team captains. From 1993-2007, captains were selected on a game-by-game basis.

**Four-star backfield:** Raymond Carter, rated the No. 3 running back in the nation out of Crenshaw High School when he signed with UCLA in 2008, joins QB Pete Thomas (Valhalla, El Cajon, Calif.) as former four-star recruits starting together in the CSU backfield. In high school, the two players never played an organized game against each other, but they did meet during summer passing scrimmages.

**Speaking of Crenshaw:** The Los Angeles high school made famous as the setting for the movie *Boyz in the Hood* (Laurence Fishburne, Cuba Gooding Jr.) is famous in the CSU football program for producing new starting RB Raymond Carter and physical FS Elijah-Blu Smith.

- ▶ When Carter was searching for a school after deciding to transfer from UCLA in the spring of 2009, his former Crenshaw teammate Smith was right there to answer his questions about Colorado State.
- ▶ Crenshaw also has produced Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila, who broke Reggie White's career Green Bay Packers sacks record, and several others, including Olympic sprinter Johnny Gray, MLB pitcher Darryl Strawberry, rap artist and actor Ice-T, and several other prominent athletes in football, basketball and track.

**In the polls:** Colorado State's football program, fresh off a resounding 23-17 win at intrastate rival Colorado, received votes in both national polls for multiple weeks early in 2009.

- ▶ Previously, the last time CSU earned votes was after defeating Weber State on Sept. 13, 2003, the week of an eventual loss to Ben Roethlisberger and Miami (Ohio).
- ▶ After their win over Weber State Sept. 12, 2009, and over Nevada Sept. 19, 2009, the Rams continued to receive votes in both polls. They didn't get votes after their first loss, at BYU (Sept. 26).

**\$20 million athletic facilities are open:** Like a proud parent, the Colorado State athletic department formally introduced the public to its new fraternal twins Sept. 18, 2009.

- ▶ A ribbon-cutting ceremony dedicated CSU's new \$13 million Indoor Practice Facility and \$7 million Academic and Training Center.
- ▶ Following the ceremony, the public toured both buildings.
- ▶ Colorado State first announced plans for the new buildings, a \$20 million leap toward a vivid future, in April 2009. The buildings represent CSU's largest commitment toward athletic facilities in four decades, since the construction of Hughes Stadium and Moby Arena.
- ▶ "These buildings show that Colorado State is unmistakably serious about achieving its stretch goals," Director of Athletics Paul Kowalczyk said. "These buildings, combined with the recent renovations at our football stadium, put us where we need to be in terms of offering quality, state-of-the-art facilities to our coaches and student-athletes, those who are here now and those who are thinking about coming here. There has never been a better time to be a Ram."
- ▶ The process began in Oct. 2006, when Kowalczyk and associate athletic director Doug Max made the new buildings a priority within the athletic department's long-term plans. But without the help of the CSU administration and the Board of Governors, the university would not have reached this point.
- ▶ Designed by Aller-Lingle Architects P.C., and RATIO Architects, Inc., the facilities were built by Saunders Construction, Inc. Aller-Lingle, a local firm instrumental in several campus projects, including recent Hughes Stadium renovations, served as the lead architect on both new build-



ings. The firm sought the assistance of Indianapolis-based RATIO because of its recent experience in the design of similar venues at BCS universities such as Illinois, Oregon, West Virginia and Indiana. Saunders has played a significant role in the construction of several prominent Colorado projects, including the Denver Broncos' training center.

**The CSU offense:** In a conference filled with "spread" offenses, Steve Fairchild's system at Colorado State, while one of three offenses currently in use by National Football League teams, is unique in the Mountain West.

- ▶ The system, sometimes called the Coryell Offense, has its roots where Fairchild grew up, in San Diego.
- ▶ Former Chargers head coach Don Coryell, using three future Hall of Famers (Dan Fouts, Charlie Joiner and Kellen Winslow), made the system famous while Fairchild was CSU's starting QB in the late 70s.
- ▶ Disciples of the offense include Ernie Zampese, Joe Gibbs, Mike Martz, Norv Turner and Al Saunders. Martz, Fairchild's coach at Mesa Community College in San Diego before Fairchild signed with the Rams as a JC transfer, also was influenced by Sid Gillman.
- ▶ Gibbs used the Coryell Offense to win three Super Bowls with the Redskins, using a system the Rams follow, with a smash-mouth running game powered by mobile and versatile "hogs" up front.
- ▶ While with the Cowboys, Turner used Michael Irvin, Emmitt Smith and Troy Aikman to win Super Bowls with a similar version of the offense.
- ▶ Led by Martz, the system led the St. Louis Rams to a Super Bowl title and another NFC championship in the last decade.
- ▶ One aspect of the offense that is unique is the flipping of offensive linemen, assigning two players always to the weak side of the formation and the other guard and tackle always to the strong side. The Rams do that to reduce the amount those linemen have to learn, increasing efficiency.

**Brotherly love, from coaches:** Coaches moved Austin Gillmore from linebacker to fullback on Aug. 18. Nine days later, Head Coach Steve Fairchild dubbed Gillmore No. 1 on the depth chart entering opening week.

- ▶ Gillmore's family is used to such moves. His younger brother Crockett, signed in February 2010 as a tight end, shifted to defensive end shortly before his college debut in last season's opener. Then, nine days before the 2011 CSU spring game, coaches moved him back to tight end. He's been the starter at tight end ever since his first snap during that April practice, a reception from Pete Thomas.
- ▶ On Sept. 10, they formed the first pair of CSU brothers to start the same game since Erik and Morgan Pears took up two-fifths of the Rams' offensive line in the Liberty Bowl vs. TCU, Dec. 31, 2002.
- ▶ One year earlier, twins Justin and Jason Gallimore helped lead the Rams to the New Orleans Bowl as fixtures in the starting defensive secondary.

**Band of brothers:** The addition of Joe Kawulok in 2011 gives CSU 17 sets of brothers that have been in the program since Sonny Lubick became head coach in 1993:

**Significant improvements to stadium:** Colorado State in August unveiled the first significant upgrades to the grounds surrounding Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium in the facility's 43-year history.

- ▶ The months-long project, which started in the spring, includes hundreds of trees and shrubs, improved walkways, an 18-hole disc golf course and a new gate that should help ease traffic congestion. The trees and shrubs - including Colorado blue spruce, Rocky Mountain juniper, ponderosa pine, Scotch pine and others - were transplanted from the nursery at CSU's Colorado State Forest Service headquarters on the Foothills Campus.
- ▶ "We wanted to improve the experience for our fans at Hughes by upgrading some of the landscaping and circulation around the stadium," CSU President Tony Frank said. "As home to the Colorado State Forest Service, CSU was fortunate to be able to work with its outstanding nursery to plant more than a mile of seedling trees as part of the overall project. In the end, our goal is to create an environment that is welcoming for the community, complements surrounding neighborhoods and better reflects our status as a major university."
- ▶ More than 300 large trees and numerous shrubs will have been planted when the project is complete. Some will line stadium access roads and pedestrian walkways, while others will beautify the stadium's south side.
- ▶ Many of the project upgrades are focused on Ram Town, an area on the southeast side of the stadium where fans meet prior to games to enjoy food, live music and a variety of inflatable playgrounds for kids. The area will now feature a large plaza with more than two acres of grass, an amphitheater and an arboretum.
- ▶ A fifth gate will be added to the southwest corner of the parking lot, giving fans direct access to County Road 42C, which runs along the south side of the facility. The new gate should improve traffic flow.
- ▶ The new disc golf course should be in place this fall. The 18-hole course is a collaborative project between CSU, the City of Fort Collins and the state, and will be open to the public.
- ▶ CSU Director of Athletics Paul Kowalczyk has been working to launch this project since arriving in 2006. He credited Frank and football Steve Fairchild for their support.
- ▶ "Hughes Stadium is in a beautiful setting, right up against the foothills, but it was built in a scruffy field that was not particularly attractive," he said. "This project will present the stadium and the university in the best possible light. We're showing our fans and supporters that we care enough about what we're trying to accomplish here that we're putting our best foot forward to create a better overall experience."



## TEAM NOTES *continued*

**Close games:** The Rams are now 9-10 under Steve Fairchild in games decided by one score, or eight points or less. They're 4-6 at home, 4-4 on the road, and 1-0 at neutral sites (the 2008 New Mexico Bowl).

- ▶ They registered 2011 wins over New Mexico and Utah State, both on the road, and a 36-34 triumph at home vs. Idaho in 2010. They lost a near-upset at SDSU, 24-19, in 2010, and heartbreakers to San Jose State, UNLV and SDSU in 2011. All seven were decided in the final minutes.
- ▶ The Rams in 2008 played six games decided by one score or less, and posted a 4-2 record in those contests. CSU's only two losses were to BYU (45-42) and TCU (13-7), two ranked teams at season's end.
- ▶ In 2009, the team saw five games decided late, but had only a 1-4 record in those contests (24-23 win vs. Weber State, then four straight losses — 31-29 at Idaho, 24-17 vs. Utah, 29-27 at New Mexico, and 17-16 vs. Wyoming).
- ▶ Finding a way to win close games was one characteristic the Rams lacked during the program's slide in the middle of the 2000s. Prior to Sept. 6, 2008, when the Rams won on a walk-off field goal vs. Sacramento State, the last time the Rams won a game by a field goal or less was Nov. 22, 2003, at UNLV.
- ▶ Against arch-rival Colorado alone, the Rams lost three games by three points each over a four-year stretch, from 2004-07.

**Final minutes:** In Steve Fairchild's tenure, 22 games have been decided in the final three minutes. The Rams are 11-11 in those contests. Overall, 11 of Fairchild's 16 wins as head coach have been sealed in the final moments.

- ▶ CSU was 6-2 in these games during his inaugural season as head coach, 2008, when six of the Rams' seven wins, and eight of the team's 13 overall games, were decided in the final three minutes.
- ▶ The Rams were 2-4 in 2009 and 1-1 in 2010. They're 2-3 so far this season.

**CoachFair.com:** CoachFair.com has been live on the Internet since Sept. 1, 2008. The site houses a multitude of exclusive behind-the-scenes content, including countless video clips assembled by the university's award-winning creative services staff.

- ▶ Each coach is featured in the videos, providing a personal look into his philosophies and assessment of football at CSU under new Head Coach Steve Fairchild. Linebacker Ricky Brewer takes visitors on a tour of the university's facilities, including the Joey Porter Locker Room. And, recent graduate Joey Rucks shares his thoughts on CSU's academic support for student-athletes. Additionally, Fairchild offers a personal blog, providing insight throughout the year.

**The Rams on Twitter:** CSU has two Twitter pages related to its football program. Twitter, a free social networking and micro-blogging service available at [www.twitter.com](http://www.twitter.com), allows its users to send and read other users' updates (also known as "tweets"). Fans can receive updates on CSU football directly from a Twitter page or on their mobile phone.

- ▶ Head Coach Steve Fairchild is believed to be one of the only football coaches in the country who updates his page during halftime of each game (with the help of CSU media relations personnel).

**100 percent of CSU players involved in community:** Colorado State's football team is believed to be one of the only, if not the only program in the nation that involves 100 percent of its players in community service. And not just once during the year.

- ▶ Every calendar year, every player on the CSU roster will make at least three appearances in the community, including the latest round, completed by the Rams over the summer prior to the beginning of fall practice. Round 1 is in the spring and Round 3 will take place every year during the team's bye week(s).
- ▶ "I want our players to think about something other than themselves on a daily basis," said Head Coach Steve Fairchild, whose team likely devotes collectively the most community-service hours in the nation every

year. "We're installing a giving-back mentality. I want our players realize how fortunate they are."

- ▶ Community service has focused on schools, hospitals and those needing medical assistance, rehab facilities and homeless shelters. Leaders in every position group on the roster are responsible for making sure their teammates at that position are accountable in making each appearance.
- ▶ Team advisor Johnny Square and director of football operations Tom Ehlers organized the first annual CSU football community initiative over the winter of 2009-10. All told, members of the football team made 10 appearances across Northern Colorado. To help structure the appearances, most featured a specific position group. Several upperclassmen took the lead in keeping their teammates accountable, and the Rams completed the very rewarding experience in time for the beginning of spring practice.
- ▶ "Pastor Square and Tom were a big help in organizing this for us," Fairchild said in the spring. "They went to work at the beginning of this past semester to come up with some places in the area where our players could be effective in making a difference. I was very proud of the leadership many of our seniors and other players displayed."

**Marriott offering CSU rate for Fort Collins travelers:** CSU Athletics and Nelligan Sports Marketing have entered into a new partnership with Marriott. - ▶ The campaign features a Ram Fan of the Week competition, in which Colorado State fans can submit pictures of their green and gold spirit via e-mail with the chance of winning game tickets and concession coupons. Weekly winners automatically qualify for the Fan of the Year drawing that includes a grand prize of personalized gear, tickets to the MW tournament and a free tailgate spot in Ram Town.
- ▶ Fans will have the opportunity to attend Get Your Green On days held at local corporate partner retail outlets, where Cam the Ram, the Colorado State cheer squad and a wide range of CSU coaches will be on hand to greet fans. Ticket and apparel giveaways will take place in addition to the chance of winning a free tailgate in Ram Town. Giveaways at these locations and other university events will include beads, sunglasses, key chains and much more.
- ▶ Vendors in the Denver and Northern Colorado regions will be provided window clings, buttons for employees and other marketing material to encourage CSU fans to get their green on.
- ▶ CSU supporters will now be able to participate in the newly dubbed Get Your Green On Fridays. Faculty, staff, students, fans and alumni are encouraged to wear green every Friday throughout the year to display the true passion of being a Ram fan.
- ▶ Throughout the year Ram fans are asked to contribute to the Get Your Green On campaign by purchasing green and gold apparel from outlets carrying CSU gear. - ▶ Fans are encouraged to watch every CSU game away from Fort Collins, at Taps Sports Bar and Grill. That's because not only is the venue the official watch party location of the Rams, but Taps also will donate 10 per-

- cent of all net revenue from all food and beverage sales to CSU's Athletic General Scholarship Fund.
- ▶ In other words, fans that cheer on the Rams at Taps, located at 165 Boardwalk Drive in Fort Collins, help fund student-athlete scholarships at the same time.
- ▶ "We are very excited about this year's season and our new partnership with CSU football," said Taps owner Mark Spring. "We are looking forward to this great opportunity. Being an alum and an avid Ram fan myself makes this a perfect match for a winning season."
- ▶ Taps, known for its outstanding selection of beer, is open daily at 11 a.m., with happy hour from 3-6 p.m. each day, and 10 p.m. to 12 a.m. Sunday through Thursday.

### Individual Notes

**Capi makes second All-America team:** Capi in October made his second midseason All-America team, earning second-team honors from CollegeFootballNews.com. The week prior, he earned third-team All-America accolades from Phil Steele.

- ▶ PR Momo Thomas, LB James Skelton, C Weston Richburg and TE Crockett Gillmore also garnered first-team midseason all-conference honors from CFN.

**Capi's NCAA record paves road for honors:** Nordly Capi wrote his name in the NCAA record book Sept. 3, and days later earned the Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week (Football Writers) as well as the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week. With the national honor, he earned a spot on the Nagurski Trophy watch list.

- ▶ A 6-foot-3, 248-pound sophomore from Ocoee, Fla., Capi had four forced fumbles, more than any player ever in a college football game, helping the Rams earn a conference road victory at New Mexico Saturday.
- ▶ The record, established on the road in one of only three conference games across the country this weekend, wasn't enough to earn Capi the national Walter Camp Defensive Player of the Week, as the organization instead chose Michigan LB Brandon Herron. Herron was the first player in Wolverines history to post two defensive scores, in a 34-10, weather-shortened game at home against Western Michigan.
- ▶ Previously, 10 players had recorded three forced fumbles in a game, according to the NCAA Records Book (which is missing TCU's Alex Ibiyole, who had a then MW-record three forced fumbles against Tennessee Tech last year). Others with three in a game: DeLawrence Grant, Oregon St. vs. San Diego St., Sept. 23, 2000; Antwan Peek, Cincinnati vs. La.-Monroe, Dec. 1, 2001; Mason Unck, Arizona St. vs. Stanford, Sept. 28, 2002; Quintin Mikell, Boise St. vs. Hawaii, Oct. 5, 2002; Grant Wiley, West Virginia vs. Cincinnati, Sept. 13, 2003; Derrick Johnson, Texas vs. North Texas, Sept. 4, 2004; Ramel Meekins, Rutgers vs. Navy, Oct. 14, 2006; Cody Grimm, Virginia Tech vs. North Carolina St., Nov. 21, 2009; and Armond Staten, Central Mich. vs. Western Mich., Nov. 5, 2010.
- ▶ Capi's 4½ tackles for loss tied for fourth-most in a single game in MW history. His 3½ sacks ranked fourth in Rams annals, behind the four of longtime NFL players Mike Bell (Nov. 19, 1977) and Brady Smith (Sept. 30, 1995), and the 4½ of Guy Miller, the most recent CSU Player of the Week, Oct. 16, 2010.
- ▶ Replacing Broderick Sargent, who left with a knee injury in the first quarter, Capi wreaked havoc on the New Mexico offensive line and quarterback Tarean Austin. His motor didn't stop until the last defensive snap, when he not only forced his record-breaking fourth fumble, but also recovered the loose ball at the CSU 18-yard line with nine seconds left. That play extinguished the Lobos' final threat and preserved the Rams' first road victory since Sept. 6, 2009.
- ▶ He shared MW weekly honors with Boise State's Kellen Moore (offense) and TCU kick returner Greg McCoy (special teams).
- ▶ Miller in 2010 was the first CSU individual to claim the MW's weekly defensive honor since Robert Herbert on Oct. 31, 2005. The last time the Rams secured more than one Defensive Player of the Week honor less than a year apart was the 2002 season, when they captured four such

awards: Adam Wade (twice), David Vickers and Benny Mastropaolo. CSU that season won the conference and finished 10-4.

- ▶ Capi, an undeclared major, played last season as a true freshman. His unique first name translates to mean strength.
- ▶ A pillar in the Rams' community service initiative, which requires every player to extend time in the Northern Colorado community three times annually, he helped orchestrate Math Night at Fort Collins' Bauder Elementary, working with youngsters to help them learn math. Prior to 2011 fall practice, he interacted with teenagers at the Boys and Girls Club in Loveland, Colo. The Rams are believed to lead the nation in community appearances, combining for more than 345 each season, with 115 players making at least three.
- ▶ Capi is contemplating a career as a firefighter after his playing career

**Unique number:** CSU's 6-foot-3, 241-pound defensive end C.J. James dropped the 1 from his uniform last year, going from 91 to 9.

- ▶ The last CSU lineman to wear a single-digit number was Joey Porter, who donned No. 8 as a senior DE in 1998 before launching his All-Pro NFL career.
- ▶ According to research by Utah State, which has a 351-pound player tied for the nation's heaviest single digit, DT Evan Huahulu (with Georgia NG Jon Jenkins, No. 6), James is among the 25 heaviest single-digit players in the country.

**Matrimony:** Paul Madsen, a preseason all-conference selection, became the team's only married player on June 25, when he married fiancé Ashley on March 12.

**Coffman nominated for GEICO Play of Year:** Colorado State freshman receiver Thomas Coffman's spectacular diving catch against Boise State on Oct. 15 was nominated for the GEICO Play of the Year, Intersport announced Oct. 23. **Sisson led country:** Mychal Sisson entering the year had nine career forced fumbles, more than any active player in the the nation other than Southern Mississippi's Cordarro Law (10) at the time of his injury Sept. 10. # Updated Biographies

## 56 SHAQUIL BARRETT

Linebacker | 6-2 | 244 | Sophomore | TR | Baltimore, Md. (Boys Town, Neb. – Nebraska-Omaha)

**2011 (Sophomore):** Entering Week 14, ranks tied for fourth in the MW at 8.1 tackles per game...Immediately eligible because Nebraska-Omaha disbanded its football program, has quickly adapted to the CSU defensive scheme, playing in 11 games with 10 starts...Made his Division I debut in the opener at New Mexico (Sept. 3), entering late in the first quarter; with just over four minutes left in the game, and CSU protecting a 14-10 lead, combined with C.J. James to sack Tarean Austin on fourth-and-14...A week later in a big win vs. Northern Colorado (Sept. 10), earned his first major-college start, as the Rams' middle linebacker...Broke up a UNC pass on the second play from scrimmage, then forced a third-quarter incomplection, hurrying the pass by launching himself at the quarterback...Started again at MLB in Denver loss vs. Colorado (Sept. 17), making a key play on a first-quarter drive to flush QB Tyler Hansen out of the pocket and into the arms of teammate C.J. James; also played defensive end during several snaps in the second half...Paramount in exhilarating win at Utah State (Sept. 24), earned Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week honors after helping the Rams pull back into the contest in the second half, then win it in double-overtime, 35-34...Gave life to the Rams with USU up 14-3 in the third quarter, scooping up a Michael Smith fumble in the backfield and returning it 15 yards for his first career touchdown, then on the next series sacked QB Chuckie Keeton, rushing from a DE position, to force a punt...Earlier against Aggies, made a leaping pass deflection to prevent a possible TD and finished with a team-leading 14 tackles...Made another game-changing play in 38-31 loss vs. San Jose State (Oct. 1), with the Spartans driving into CSU territory in a 31-31 game and eight minutes remaining in the fourth quarter; sacked QB Matt Faulkner and launched a fumble high in the air, before teammate Davis Burl recovered to set up the Rams at the Spartans' 45; replay officials reviewed the play and upheld the call...In first quarter of loss vs. No. 5 Boise State (Oct. 15), slipped into backfield and stopped RB Doug Martin for no gain on fourth-and-3 from the CSU 17...On one first-quarter drive in loss at UNLV (Oct. 29), posted a tackle for loss on each of the first two snaps, then on the third play picked off QB Sean Reilly and returned the INT, the first of his career, 52 yards for a go-ahead touchdown; became the first CSU player to score twice on defense in a season since Luke Adkins, who returned two interceptions for touchdowns, in 2004...Had 14 tackles in windy, 18-15 loss vs. San Diego State (Nov. 12), helping to limit the nation's second-leading rusher, Ronnie Hillman, to just 80 yards; nearly intercepted a pass in the end zone in the first quarter...In loss vs. Air Force (Nov. 26), alertly pounced on a loose ball in the first quarter, but after his recovery, officials ruled the pass incomplete.

In Denver loss vs. Colorado (Sept. 17), converted a third-and-1, setting up a fourth-quarter TD that cut the Buffs' lead to 21-14...Principal in exhilarating, 35-34 double-overtime win at Utah State (Sept. 24), picked up 47 hard-earned yards on 11 carries, including a career-best two touchdowns, on the Rams' final three possessions...With 42 seconds left in regulation, helped CSU erase a 21-13 deficit with a 1-yard score (just before Pete Thomas hit Crockett Gillmore for a game-tying two-point conversion to send the game to OT)...Then in the extra periods, ran seven times for 32 yards, setting up Gillmore's game-tying TD and scoring the eventual game-winning points with a 2-yard TD...Also converted a pair of third-and-1 attempts, one on an important second-quarter FG drive to put CSU on the board...For his efforts against Aggies, earned Mountain West Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors, the first award of his career, sharing the award with UNM's Deon Long...In 38-31 loss vs. San Jose State (Oct. 1), with four minutes remaining in the first quarter, left after taking a helmet on his leg, but returned to action in the second quarter; left with a leg cramp in the fourth quarter...In loss vs. No. 5 Boise State (Oct. 15), had 74 yards on 15 carries (4.9 avg.), including an impressive 29-yard rumble late in the game, a nice second-effort to convert a fourth-and-short; also finished as CSU's leading receiver, with four catches...In loss at UTEP (Oct. 22), made his first 2011 start and finished just 7 yards shy of his first 100-yard game; converted a pair of third-and-short carries in the first half, the latter on a field-goal drive...Then, in fourth quarter of Miners contest, scored an important touchdown, weaving through defenders and following blocks on a 24-yard run...Got 14 yards on his first carry in loss at UNLV (Oct. 29), en route to a career-best 156 on the ground, his first 100-yard rushing effort; set up a go-ahead field goal late in the first half with a career-long 38-yard gallop...In second half of Rebels contest, picked up 17 yards on one carry, then converted a third-down with a 14-yard reception; later in game, brought the Rams to within a FG with a run for a two-point conversion, then punched in a go-ahead touchdown one play after Shaq Bell's blocked FG and Austin Gray's return...In 18-15 loss vs. San Diego State (Nov. 12), turned in the top individual rushing performance in all of major-college football during Week 11, a career-most 232 yards, the ninth-best total by an FBS player in 2011, and tops among Mountain West competitors; within those top nine rushing performances, only three averaged more per carry than Nwoke (10.55, 22-232): Missouri's Henry Josey (18.79, 14-263 vs. Western Illinois Sept. 17); Oregon's LaMichael James (12.52, 23-288 vs. Arizona Sept. 24); and UTEP's Joe Banyard (10.91, 22-240, vs. Houston Sept. 29)...Also registered then the highest total by a CSU player in 226 all-time games at Hughes Stadium (a mark he surpassed two weeks later), breaking Brian Copeland's standard, 228, vs. New Mexico, Nov. 16, 1991...His 232 yards ranked fifth all-time on CSU's single-game rushing chart, most by a Rams player since Gartrell Johnson's 285 in the New Mexico Bowl, Dec. 20, 2008, vs. Fresno State, and his 67-yard burst – on which he made a perfect cut and wound up breaking four tackles -- in the second quarter, and his 63-yard touchdown in the first, were the Rams' two longest plays from scrimmage at that point in the season...In loss at No. 19 TCU (Nov. 19), against the conference's No. 1 rushing defense, managed 60 yards on 21 carries, converting a pair of third downs, one on a first-quarter run, the other on a 14-yard reception in the third quarter...One week later in loss vs. Air Force (Nov. 26), had a Hughes Stadium-record 269 rushing yards, the third most in Rams history and third most by an FBS player in 2011, becoming CSU's first 1,000-yard rusher since MW rushing champion Johnson (1,476) in 2008, and 19th overall, eclipsing the landmark on his 62-yard TD run in the third quarter; also became just the seventh CSU player to break 1,000 as a sophomore or younger...Additionally against Falcons, became first player in CSU history with multiple 200-yard rushing efforts in the same season, joining a group of four CSU players with multiple 200-yard rushing games in a career: Kevin McDougal (1997 and '99), Lawrence McCutcheon (1969, '70) and Steve Bartalo (1983, '85)...His 269 yards were the most ever by any player in 227 all-time games at Hughes Stadium, which opened in 1968, breaking the 2007 record held by Air Force's Chad Hall, 256.

**2011 (Sophomore):** CSU's first returning starter at quarterback since 2007, had started 21 straight games, including the first nine of 2011 until a Game 9 knee injury sidelined him...Elected Aug. 26 one of five permanent team captains, one of two on offense, among the youngest season-long captains in team history...In season-opening, 14-10 win at New Mexico (Sept. 3), stood in the pocket to take a hit immediately after launching a 33-yard TD pass to Crockett Gillmore late in the second quarter, giving the Rams a 7-3 advantage; enjoyed the second-most accurate day by a CSU passer ever...His .846 completion percentage (22-for-26) against UNM was eclipsed by only Caleb Hanie, who connected on 20 of 23 passes (.870) in another 14-10 win, at Colorado, Sept. 9, 2006...In home-opening win over Northern Colorado (Sept. 10), hit 11 targets, including a 9-yard pass to Lou Greenwood early in the second half to eclipse 3,000 career yards and become the youngest player and first sophomore in school annals to reach that landmark; soon after, found a hole and ran for a career-long 17 yards, helping set up a field goal...In Denver loss vs. Colorado (Sept. 17), scored his first career rushing touchdown, on the opening drive. a 4-yard run; had three carries for 14 yards on the drive, including a 9-yard run to set up his TD on third down...Later in Buffs contest, made his first career reception, a 4-yard loss on a pass from Raymond Carter...Calmly directed CSU to exhilarating, 35-34 triumph in double overtime at Utah State (Sept. 24), orchestrating three touchdown drives in the final minutes...First, with 42 seconds left after CSU had just pulled to 21-19 with a Chris Nwoke TD run, kept the Rams together after a 5-yard false-start penalty, and sent the game to OT with an essentially a 7-yard pass to Gillmore for a two-point conversion; then, in the first overtime period, found Gillmore again, in the back of the end zone, for a 7-yard TD that knotted the score again...Led the Rams on valiant comeback in eventual 38-31 loss vs. San Jose State (Oct. 1), guiding CSU to a 31-31 tie after a 24-7 deficit; finished with a career-best 387 yards, and tied another personal high with three TD passes, in addition to another rushing TD...Hit Lou Greenwood on the first two touchdowns, a perfectly placed, 41-yard strike over the middle to get the Rams on the scoreboard, and a gorgeous 25-yard strike late in the first half; then found Thomas Coffman on a 47-yard streak to bring the Rams within one score late in the third quarter...Also in Spartans contest, led the Rams in rushing, becoming the first CSU QB to do so since Billy Farris (11/25/06 vs. TCU), made a nice move to avoid a tackler and dive poetically into the end zone on a 9-yard run that tied the game, 31-31, with 11:33 left in regulation, capping an eight-play, 80-yard drive...In tough loss at UTEP (Oct. 22), sacked seven times and saw two touchdown passes dropped, but still became the youngest QB and 10<sup>th</sup> overall in CSU history to reach 4,000 passing yards, surpassing No. 10 Mark Driscoll (3,923) on the Rams' career passing-yards list...Left his heart on the field in loss at UNLV (Oct. 29), leading the Rams on three go-ahead drives, one that erased a 31-20 fourth-quarter deficit; capped a 10-play, 77-yard march with a 12-yard run in the final stanza; the score gave him three on the year, most by a CSU QB since Caleb Hanie had four in '06...Early in second quarter of windy, 18-15 loss vs. San Diego State (Nov. 12), injured his left knee and did not return; just after unloading a screen pass, an Aztec defensive tackle, having stunted, plowed into his knee, the same knee protected by a brace required by Head Coach Steve Fairchild to protect against such injuries sustained by Tom Brady in the first game of the 2008 NFL season...Traveled but did not dress in loss at No. 19 TCU (Nov. 19), missing the first game of his college career and first contest since halfway through his 2006 freshman season at Valhalla High School in El Cajon, Calif., snapping a 21-game starts streak, tied for longest active on the team.
