

## GAME DAY EXPERIENCE: ON CAMPUS

February 10, 2017

NOTE: Initial Season Plan, Subject to Refinement based on Actual Game Day Operations

### What we heard:

**Alcohol:** CSU and the City needs to work cooperatively to minimize the effects of alcohol both on and off campus.

**Alcohol:** Students would like to have a designated area that is not a parking lot that allows bringing alcohol onto campus. CSU needs to address whether this will be allowed and how it will be enforced.

**Alcohol & Tailgating:** People would like to have options for tailgating in parking lots on campus - some that will allow alcohol and some that will restrict it. CSU needs to address how alcohol will be allowed on campus between parking lots.

**Tailgating:** CSU needs to designate and help manage where game day events can occur for different Colleges/Departments/Units on campus.

**Noise & Trash:** CSU and the City need to work cooperatively to manage trash and noise impacting neighborhoods.

**Trash:** There are concerns about how trash will be managed on campus on game days.

**Security:** There are concerns about whether university buildings will be locked or secured during and after the game.

### What to expect:

**Alcohol:** CSU is determining where student tailgating will be allowed on campus.

**Alcohol & Tailgating:** CSU is providing programmed “tailgating” to strongly encourage game day attendees to tailgate on campus. CSU is also working on Facilities Game Day Operations plan that details where and how alcohol can be transported on campus.

**Tailgating:** CSU is working with various campus colleges, departments, and organizations to designate game day activities specific to these units.

**Trash:** CSU will be providing temporary trash and recycling containers on game days at major pedestrian exits from campus, to encourage game attendees to dispose of their trash before entering the surrounding neighborhoods.

**Trash and Tailgating:** CSU Ambassadors will be posted at these major pedestrian and bicycle exits to encourage people to respect the surrounding neighborhoods.

**Alcohol, Tailgating, Trash and Noise:** CSU and the City are working cooperatively to create a variety of communications outlets about CSU and City policies and ordinances to communicate to ticketholders, the campus community and City residents. These will include social media, game day fans’ guides, digital messaging boards, etc.

**Noise:** The Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between the City and CSU states that “CSU agrees to explore, and to employ to the extent reasonably practicable, best practices and available technology concerning the mitigation of such noise and lighting impacts. CSU agrees to strive to meet the City’s noise ordinances in connections with non-football game events at the stadium.” CSU has designed a stadium sound system to help mitigate loudspeaker noise. Different methods are being evaluated to help reduce the sound of the canon at games.

**Security:** CSU is currently working on a Game Day Facilities Operations Plan and will work with the campus community determine which campus buildings should be locked on game days.

### What we are working on:

- We’re finalizing the alcohol on-campus policy for students.
- We’re finalizing the Facilities Game Day Operations Plan for alcohol, tailgating, trash and security on campus.
- We’re working on the various communications methods to continue to provide information BEFORE the first stadium event.



## GAME DAY EXPERIENCE: PROGRAMMED TAILGATING ON CAMPUS

January 23, 2017

**What to expect:**

- Most parking lots available for game day parking will allow tailgating
- Most programmed activities open 4 hours prior to kick-off and close 30 minutes prior to kick-off



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### What we heard:

**Alcohol & Tailgating:** CSU and the City needs to work cooperatively to minimize the effects of alcohol both on and off campus.

**Alcohol:** There are concerns about alcohol in the residential neighborhoods on game day.

**Tailgating & Noise from Parties:** There are concerns about tailgating and parties and noise from such events in residential neighborhoods.

**Trash:** There are concerns about who is responsible for trash left over from game day in surrounding neighborhoods.

**Game Day Parking in Neighborhoods:** There has been concerns about game day attendees parking in surrounding residential neighborhoods.

### What to expect:

**Noise/ Tailgating/Alcohol (Off-campus):** CSU is providing programmed events/areas to strongly encourage game day attendees to tailgate on campus. Parties that occur on private property are legal (including business parking lots). There are no restrictions on alcohol, on private property, except in the case of underage consumption. Enforcement under the City's unreasonable noise ordinance, nuisance gathering ordinance, and/or alcohol regulations will be addressed by Fort Collins Police Services. Open containers are not allowed in public places (including any street, sidewalk, alley or other public place, in any automobile or on the grounds or in the facilities of any public or private school).

**Noise (Football parties):** CSU will be installing a state-of-the art sound system and using best practiced design techniques to help mitigate noise impacts to the surrounding neighborhoods. As stated in the IGA, the following noise is excluded from noise enforcement: crowd noise, cannon, announcers, fireworks, music (including ads and other items broadcasted as a part of games), and band/orchestra music. Neighborhood Services Code Compliance staff will not be measuring for sound during football games.

**Noise (Non-football game events):** CSU will be installing a state-of-the art sound system and using best practiced design techniques to help mitigate noise impacts to the surrounding neighborhoods. CSU has agreed to strive to meet the City's noise ordinance for non-football game events. Neighborhood Services Code Compliance staff plan to measure sound for all major stadium events and as needed for other events based on complaints. "Major external events" are defined as a ticketed event, for which tickets are offered for sale to the public, featuring a performance external to CSU, at which attendance is anticipated to exceed 12,000 persons.

**Trash (Off-campus related):** CSU is establishing litter abatement and removal practices for all events held at the new on-campus stadium. The plan will include provision of sufficient recycling and disposal receptacles on campus. The plan will not include trash pickup/abatement within adjacent neighborhoods. Regarding private property, it is the owner's responsibility to take care of trash abatement. Any issues will be enforced under the City's nuisance ordinance and by the Neighborhood Services Code Compliance staff. Code Compliance staff will proactively inspect adjacent neighborhoods the next working day after the game or special events.

**Game Day Parking in Neighborhoods:** See the "Game Day Parking" station for more information.

**Bike and Pedestrian Neighborhood Access:** Bike and Pedestrian neighborhood access: Alternative modes of transportation are being encouraged and bike and pedestrian traffic is expected to increase in neighborhoods close to the stadium. There are no violations, as long as travelers stay on public sidewalks and streets. Cutting through or walking/riding on private property is trespassing and enforced through Fort Collins Police Services when applicable.

**Vehicle Parking on Yards:** Motor vehicles, covered under the City's nuisance ordinance, may park on improved surfaces, such as gravel, rock, concrete or asphalt that are bordered to define the parking area. Only 40% of a front yard may be improved for parking unless on street parking is not allowed. Currently, the code allows for a violation to be corrected in 7 days. Neighborhood Services Code Compliance staff plan to track the number of complaints received during the first season to see if a code change should be recommended.


