## #9 Colorado State Rams (3) Boise State Broncos (0)

25-19, 25-20, 25-13

### Match Notables

- The Rams improved to 20-0 on the season, tying the program's best-ever start. A win Saturday at Utah State would set a new record, surpassing CSU's 20-0 start in 2001.
- Dating back to Oct. 27, 2012, CSU has won 13 consecutive true road matches, extending on their program record. The previous high was 11, set in 2003.
- Overall, CSU has won 20 straight matches, tied for its second-best winning streak (2001). The program's longest winning streak came in 2003, when CSU won 23 consecutive matches.
- The Rams have now won 20-plus matches each season since 1995, the fifth-longest active streak in the country.
- CSU is one of two undefeated teams in the nation. Missouri is currently 25-0. The Tigers' next match is Friday vs. Ole Miss.
- Since the inception of the Mountain West in 1999, CSU has begun MW play 11-0 three times (also 2003 and 2010).
- The Rams improved to 8-0 all-time against Boise State, with each coming via a straight-sets sweep. In six matches with Deedra Foss as setter, CSU has never hit below .374 and has averaged a hitting percentage above .400.
- CSU hit .440 on the night (38-5-75). It marks the second straight match and the fourth time this season that the Rams have hit above .400.
- The Rams committed just five attack errors — a season low — including one unforced error.
- Foss had 34 assists in the three-set match, including 15 in Set 2.
- Marlee Reynolds led CSU with nine kills — all coming in the first two sets. She also added a team-high-tying four blocks — all in Set 1. Four other players had at least four kills, including middle blockers Samantha Peters and Kelsey Snider, with eight apiece on a combined .625 hitting.
- Set 1: CSU led 11-9, but forced Boise State to use both of its timeouts during a 7-3 Rams run (18-12). The Broncos would get within four, but never closer. CSU hit .367 in the set, recording 13 kills and zero unforced attack errors (two overall). Reynolds had four kills and four blocks, as CSU out-blocked Boise State, 5-2.
- Set 2: Following ties at 1-1 through 4-4, CSU used a 15-6 run to gain major separation, holding a set-most nine-point lead (19-10). The Broncos never came within four following that point, as CSU won the set, 25-20. As good as the Rams were in Set 1 offensively, they were better in Set 2, hitting .593 with 17 kills and just one attack error. Peters had five kills on seven swings, while Foss had 15 assists.
- Set 3: CSU never trailed, and turned a 3-2 lead into a 15-5 advantage, holding on for the remainder of the set. The Rams hit .333 to Boise State's -.097.

- Freshman Michelle Lawrence checked in late in Set 3, returning to the court for the first time since Sept. 17 at UNLV (ankle).
- The Rams will depart for Logan, Utah, on Friday, making their first trip to Utah State since 1989. After losing the first 11 matches in the series, and 14 of the first 15, CSU has reeled off 17 in a row dating back to 1983. Utah State is tied for second in the Mountain West and has won six straight matches since losing to CSU on Oct. 10.
