• UD finished third in the Atlantic 10 Conference in 2006. The 14-team A-10 is the largest baseball conference in the nation.

• The Flyers won over 30 games for the fourth time in school history. All four seasons have come since 2001 under the direction of seventh-year Head Coach **Tony Vittorio**.

• Dayton advanced to the Atlantic 10 Championships for the fourth time in the past six years.

• UD held a 16-7 record at Time Warner Cable Stadium including three-game sweeps of A-10 rivals Xavier and Charlotte. The Flyers now have a 45-25 record in three seasons at the home of Flyer baseball along I-75.

• A total of five Flyers were named to the Atlantic 10 All-Conference teams. Second baseman **Galen Schumm**, shortstop **Michael Massa** and relief pitcher **Craig Rohren** were all First Team selections. Outfielder **Bryan Chandler** earned Second Team honors while starting pitcher **Luke Trubee** was an Honorable Mention pick.

• After throwing a complete game shutout in Dayton's 2-0 win over George Washington in the UD's opening game of the A-10 Championship, **Luke Trubee** was named to the A-10 All-Championship Team.

• UD dominated the Atlantic 10 regular season and secured a school-record 18 conference victories. The Flyers swept four of the nine A-10 series during the regular season.

• Dayton also had hot stretches during the non-conference schedule. UD won four or more consecutive games on four occasions throughout the season including a season-best six straight games to begin April. Overall, UD won 14 of 19 games during the month of April.

• Offensively, the Flyers hit for extra bases and used their speed in 2006. UD had the second most doubles (115), fourth most stolen bases (75) and fifth most triples (18) in program history this season.

• Dayton also bolstered a pitching staff that struck out a school-record 343 batters in 2006 while holding its opponents to a .273 batting average.

Head Coach Tony Vittorio

University of Dayton head coach **Tony Vittorio** has solidified himself as one of the baseball program's greatest managers since he took over beginning with the 2000 season.

This claim is backed by a resume that includes three 30-win seasons including a school record 36 victories in 2005 and UD's only three trips to the Atlantic 10 Championship.

However, Vittorio would give many reasons why those numbers represent a starting point rather than a destination for a program that had only one winning season in the decade prior to his arrival.

Vittorio led Dayton to a program record 596 hits in 2005 while ranking second in runs scored (397) and at bats (1,932), third in batting average (.308) and RBI (358). The 2005 Flyers also had a solid pitching staff with 314 strikeouts (third most in school history) and a 4.41 team ERA (fifth best) which included 12th round draft pick **Craig Stammen**.

UD also won two of three games against #19 Notre Dame on Feb. 26 & 27 in Mesa, AZ at HoHoKam Park, the Spring Training home of the Chicago Cubs. It marked the highest ranked team ever defeated by the Flyer in a three-game series.

But as bright as the future appears for Vittorio's Flyers, his past still stands at the top of UD's record books. In 2002, UD shattered record after record, boasting school-highs in strikeouts (332) while winning 32 games, as well as an April 16 win over IPFW that gave Vittorio his 300th career victory.

His ability to mold professional-caliber players was also validated during the year, with four members of the '02 squad going on to play some type of professional ball.

A year earlier, Vittorio guided Dayton to its first winning season in three years, setting a then single season school record for victories with 32, while leading Dayton to its first berth in post-season play since joining the A-10 in 1996. The 32-wins in 2001 was just the second winning season in three years, and gave promise to a program that had eclipsed the .500 mark just one time during the 1990s.

Flyers Fourth In A-10 Preseason Coaches Poll

Dayton surpassed expectations in 2006 by finishing third in the Atlantic 10 standings after being picked to finish fourth in the Preseason Coaches Poll. UD won 30 games for the fourth time since 2001 while finishing among the best in the 14-team Atlantic 10, the largest baseball conference in the nation.

A New Look Atlantic10

With the addition of Charlotte and Saint Louis to the Atlantic 10 Conference this season, Dayton played in a reformatted, 14-team conference without divisions. UD played a 27-game conference schedule against nine different A-10 opponents. Those conference series also played with a different format in 2006 as each weekend was scheduled for three nine-inning games on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Previously, the A-10 played two seven-inning games on Saturday followed by a nine-inning game on Sunday.

A New York State of Mind

Dayton clinched one of the six berths in the 2006 Atlantic 10 Baseball Championships, which was held May 24-27 on the campus of Fordham University. It was the fourth time since 2001 that UD participated in the A-10 Tournament, including the second straight year. The Flyers also made appearances in the 2001 and 2002 A-10 Championships.

Dayton All-Time in the A-10 Championships

The Flyers are made their fourth appearance in the Atlantic 10 Championships in 2006. After going 0-2 in its first two trips to the postseason in 2001 and 2002, Dayton won its first ever game in the A-10 Tournament last year against Duquesne. UD was 2-2 overall in the 2005 A-10 Tourney with both losses coming to the finalists - Rhode Island and George Washington. All-time in the A-10 Championships, UD is 2-0 against Duquesne, 1-4 against GW and 0-1 against Rhode Island, St. Bonaventure, Temple and Xavier. After a 1-2 record in the 2006 Tourney, Dayton is 3-8 all-time in the A-10 post season.

Strength of Schedule

In 2006, the Flyers faced a total of eight teams that placed in the top three in their conference or division in 2005. Also, Ball State, Saint Louis, Virginia and Wright State each advanced to the 2006 NCAA Tournament after facing Dayton during the regular season.

Construction Underway On Courtyard by Marriott, University of Dayton

Construction has started on a new hotel on Edwin C. Moses Boulevard, across from the Time Warner Cable Stadium. It will be the first hotel development within the city of Dayton since the early 1980s and will house 102 rooms. Work should be completed later this year.

Making a Difference for MDA

At each Flyer weekend home game, a collection was taken to benefit the Muscular Dystrophy Association. At the end of the season the total, which will be matched by the UD baseball team, will be presented to the MDA while the Flyers work at the annual MDA telethon on Labor Day Weekend. On May 2, Wright State made collection at its home doubleheader with the Flyers to raise \$410 that will be added to the total to be donated by UD this September.

Trubee Racks Up Pre and Postseason Honors

Senior pitcher **Luke Trubee** earned a number of awards before the start of the 2006 season. He was named to the Louisville Slugger Preseason All-America Second Team by Collegiate Baseball newspaper. Trubee was also placed on the Watch List for the Wallace Award (top collegiate baseball player) and the Roger Clemens Award (top collegiate pitcher). He was recently named to the mid-season Watch List for the Roger Clemens Award. At the conclusion of the 2006 season, Trubee was an Honorable Mention All Atlantic 10 selection as well as a member of the A-10 All-Championship Team.

Four Flyers Picked As "Players To Watch"

Baseball America listed four UD players as "Players To Watch" on its Preseason All-Conference team in its preview of the Atlantic 10 Conference. **Luke Trubee** was selected as a starting pitcher along with **Galen Schumm** (second base), **Michael Massa** (shortstop) and **Bobby Getty** (outfield). At season's end, Trubee was an Honorable Mention All A-10 pick while Schumm and Massa garnered A-10 First Team accolades.

APSU Invitational Honors Four Flyers

Dayton advanced to the Championship game of the APSU Invitational in Clarksville, Tenn. Feb. 24-26. UD beat Illinois State and host Austin Peay before falling to Iowa. **Michael Massa** (INF), **Bobby Getty** (OF), **Luke Trubee** (SP) and **Cale Ort** (RP) were all named to the All-Invitational Team.

Flyers Packing a Pop

Dayton led the Atlantic 10 Conference in doubles this season and was second in triples and fourth in home runs. The Flyers tallied 115 doubles this year which is the second most in school history. UD also has the fifth most triples ever with 18.

Playing 'Small Ball' in 2006

The Flyer offense shifted to a run producing style in 2006 instead of the rally producing style it had in 2005. While UD hit .274 as a team in 2006, the offense averaged 5.86 runs per game on the strength of 27 sacrifice flies and 43 sacrifice bunts. Dayton was also 75 of 105 in stolen base attempts while holding a .366 on base percentage. The Flyers ranked third in the Atlantic 10 in both runs scored and RBI despite having just the fifth best batting average. Dayton also ranked 41st nationally in both doubles and triples as well as 110th in stolen bases.

'Small Ball' Produces Big Results

Dayton had the best back-to-back offensive games in school history on April 4 & 7 in a 28-7 win at IPFW and a 27-17 victory at Richmond respectively. The scoring outputs marked the first time in school history that UD had tallied 25 runs or more in back-to-back games. In the win over the Mastodons, the Flyers scored in every inning but the eighth and were led by a career day from senior **Craig Rohren**. Rohren was 5-for-6 with a double, home run, four runs scored and a school-record nine RBI. Against the Spiders, Dayton came back from a 6-0 deficit at the end of the first inning by scoring in every other at bat behind the trio of **Michael Massa**, **Joe McSoley** and **Galen Schumm** which each tallied five RBI or more.

Streking Flyers

UD won 14 of 19 games during the month of April 2006. The offense carried the Flyers through the stretch as Dayton hit .343 as a team with 53 doubles, nine triples and 20 home runs while averaging 9.05 runs per game.

Five For Fighting

This season, Dayton is 22-4 when scoring more than five runs and 11-20 when scoring five or less.

Comeback Kids

Trailing 7-1 at Austin Peay, Dayton scored eight runs on five hits in the top of the eighth inning to take a 9-7 victory over the Governors on Feb. 25, 2006.

Now That's What I Call A Comeback

Down 14-0 to Butler midway through the third inning, Dayton rallied for a 21-17 win on March 30, 2005 in what was easily the most bizarre game in Time Warner Cable Stadium history. The Flyers scored a run in the bottom of the third, four in the fourth, 10 in the seventh and six in the eighth to complete the come-from-behind win.

Ouch

Dayton batters were hit by pitch a conference-most 76 times during the 2005 including **Bobby Getty** who led the A-10 with 16. In their 21-17 come-from-behind win over Butler, seven different Flyers were plunked marking the fourth most in NCAA Division I history. Also four batters were hit in the seventh inning alone, which was the third most in a single-inning of a NCAA game. In 2006, UD batters were hit by pitch 66 times in 57 games which ranked second in the A-10. Seven batters were hit by pitch in a 27-17 win over Richmond, which tied fourth most in NCAA single-game history also set by the Flyers.

Off To The Races

Dayton recorded 75 stolen bases in 105 attempts this season with a bulk of the speed coming from the trio of **Michael Massa**, **Roberto Ramos** and **Bobby Getty**. Massa had 22 (T-2nd in A-10), Ramos had 14 (6th in A-10) while Getty has swiped 11. The Flyers had the fourth most stolen bases in UD single-season history. The 75 stolen bases also ranked fourth in the Atlantic 10 while Massa's 22 was one shy of the UD single-season record.

In Like a Lamb and Out Like a Lion?

After starting the A-10 season by losing three of its first four games, Dayton won 11 consecutive conference contests beginning with the last week of March 2006. The win streak was the longest ever in Atlantic 10 play by the Flyers. During the streak, UD hit .349 with 27 doubles, six triples and eight home runs while averaging 8.27 runs per game. The Flyer pitching staff had a 4.25 ERA with 84 strikeouts in 130.1 innings pitched while holding opponents to a .271 batting average during the stretch. The streak included three-game sweeps of Richmond, Duquesne and Xavier.

Offense Makes The Difference For UD

The Flyer offense stepped up to help Dayton sweep four of the nine A-10 conference series in 2006. During those weekends, UD hit .324 as a team while scoring 7.92 runs per game. The Flyers had 31 doubles, five triples, nine home runs and 16 stolen bases in those 12 games.

Ready To 'Getty Going

A transfer from Olney Central JC, **Bobby Getty** played on two straight teams that won a school record number of games. He ranked seventh in the NJCAA in hitting in 2004 at .465 while being named to the All-Conference and Academic All-America teams. In 2005, he was second on the team and ranked fifth in the A-10 in RBI. He was also second on the team in runs and fifth in batting average. Getty had 26 multiple-hit games and 12 multi-RBI games in 2005.

Bobby's World

Junior **Bobby Getty** was among Dayton's leaders in nearly every offensive category in 2006. Getty hit safely in 36 of 47 games played including a 3-for-6 effort with three runs scored and four RBI against High Point. Getty smacked the game-winning home run in the victory over the Illinois State. He also had an RBI double and a run scored in an eighth-inning comeback win versus APSU. Getty ripped a walk-off homer with two outs in the 11th inning for a 6-5 win over Charlotte. He had a .342 average (7th in A-10) and a .451 on base percentage (2nd in A-10) to go along with 33 RBI and 39 runs scored.

Massa Makes Things Happen

Shortstop **Michael Massa** hit .325 in 2006 with a .513 slugging percentage (9th in A-10) on the strength of 13 doubles, eight triples (1st in A-10) and five home runs while scoring 59 runs overall (4th in A-10). He has reached base 52 of 114 times (45.6 percent) he started an inning at the plate this season and has scored 44 of those times. His eight triples were the most in the A-10 in 2006 and the most ever in program history. Massa had a 20-game hitting streak ended on May 2 that saw UD win 14 games during the stretch. He ranked 20th nationally in triples. Massa also ranks second all-time at UD with 47 career stolen bases including 22 this season (3rd in A-10) which ranks as the second most in a single-season.

It All Begins With Massa

Junior **Michael Massa** began a big offensive display for the Flyers on Apr. 4 at IPFW. His leadoff home run to right field on the second pitch of the game sparked a 28-run barrage by UD in a 28-7 victory over the Mastodons. The homer was the first of Massa's career to leadoff a game.

Massa Makes A-10 News

Leadoff batter **Michael Massa** was named the Atlantic 10 Player of the Week on Apr. 10 following a four-game stretch that saw the junior hit .421 with two doubles, a triple, a home run, 10 runs scored and nine RBI. He helped Dayton to a 27-17 win in the series opener at Richmond with a 3-for-5 day including a double, triple, two stolen bases, four runs scored and six RBI. Massa was also honored by on the National College Baseball Foundation's National Honor Roll.

Schumm - An All Conference Infielder

Senior **Galen Schumm** has been named to All-Conference teams each of the past three seasons for Olney Central JC and Dayton. In 2004, Schumm led Olney to a school-record 46 wins while earning All-Conference and All-Region honors. Last year, Schumm was named to the Atlantic 10 First Team at second base en route to Dayton's school-record 36 victories. He was an A-10 First Team pick in 2006.

Schumm Breaks Out Against High Point

Second baseman **Galen Schumm** began the 2006 season in a 4-for-23 slump through the first six games entering a weekend series at High Point. Schumm combined to hit .500 on the weekend (10-for-20) with five doubles, six runs scored and four RBI in the three games to earn A-10 Player of the Week honors.

Overall, Schumm hit .332 with 23 doubles (T-2nd in A-10), eight home runs (T-6th in A-10), 38 runs and 31 RBI. He also had a .555 slugging percentage (6th in the A-10). Schumm ranked 32nd nationally in doubles. His 23 doubles are tied for the most in UD history.

Schumm Shows His Power at Richmond

Senior **Galen Schumm** led Dayton to a 27-17 win in the series opener at Richmond with a pair of home runs. The two long balls marked the first time in 2006 that a Flyer recorded a multi-HR game and the first time Schumm had accomplished the task at UD. He added another multi-HR day at BGSU.

McSoley Puts On A Show "At Home"

Junior **Joe McSoley** had one of the best games of his career in front of his hometown crowd in Indianapolis at Butler on Mar. 7. He was 3-for-3 with a double, home run, two runs scored and two RBI to lead UD to a 7-6 victory. In fact, McSoley was 6-for-9 during games played in the "Hoosier State" this year. McSoley was 3-for-6 with four runs scored at IPFW. Overall, McSoley hit .281 with five doubles, a triple, three homers, 28 runs scored and 32 RBI.

McSoley Strikes Again

Joe McSoley gave one Youngstown State freshman a sour taste of collegiate baseball. When YSU's Eric Shaffer came on to begin the fourth inning in relief on Feb. 19, 2005, McSoley hit the reliever's first collegiate pitch for a home run over the left field wall to tie the score at 2-all as UD went on to win 8-5.

A Good Beginning For Benoit

William Benoit hit safely in 38 of 57 games in 2006 and had a .261 average. He also had 13 doubles, 26 walks, 32 runs scored and 37 RBI to his credit this season. He was equally effective in his offense while starting at designated hitter (31-for-105), catcher (21-for-87) or first base (2-for-18) this season.

Benoit Brings Dayton Past Bowling Green

Senior **William Benoit** led the Flyers to a 14-9 come-from-behind win at Bowling Green with a three-RBI double as part of a six-run ninth inning rally. The ninth-inning comeback was the second in a three-game span for the Flyers.

Making The Most Of His Hits

William Benoit came into his junior season hitting just .219 with two doubles and eight RBI during his first two seasons as a Flyer. He finished 2005, with a .335 average, .448 slugging pct. and a .415 on base pct. 13 of his 68 hits went for extra bases and he struck out just 20 times. He also hit safely in 45 of 59 games including nine-games straight to begin the year.

DeLuca Enters The Starting Lineup

Michael DeLuca started 14 games at first base and nine more at third base for the Flyers in 2006. He had 16 hits in 84 at bats overall along with six runs scored while drawing four walks, being hit by pitch 10 times and six RBI.

Burt Steps Up For The Flyers

Senior **Josh Burt** was key for Dayton in a stretch that has saw 14 UD victories in the 16 games during April 2006. Burt hit .288 with six doubles, three home runs, eight runs scored and 14 RBI while playing in 13 of those games at catcher. Overall, he hit .183 with seven doubles, four home runs, 15 runs scored and 21 RBI.

Chandler is Clutch

Not only was **Bryan Chandler** a consistent hitter throughout the 2005 season as he finished second on the team with a .346 average, he was also big in big games. Chandler was named to the 2005 A-10 All-Championship Team after going 6-for-18 with seven RBI in the four games including four RBI and a run scored in UD's wins over Duquesne. In Dayton's first game of the 2006 A-10 Championship, Chandler scored the game-winning run in a 2-0 win over GW.

Chandler Turns The Corner

After beginning the 2006 season with just 7 hits in his first 45 at bats, **Bryan Chandler** was 57-for-160 in his last 44 games including a 3-for-5 day with double, four runs scored and an RBI at IPFW. He also drove in the game-winning run with a bases-clearing triple in the top of the ninth as Dayton beat Richmond 6-4 on Apr. 9. His bases-loaded single in the ninth sent in the game-tying run in a 14-9 win at Bowling Green on Apr. 12. He also ripped a bases-loaded infield single off the foot of a Billiken pitcher in the 10th inning for a 6-5 win on May 19.

Chandler Leads From The Outfield

Bryan Chandler led Dayton with 41 RBI (T12th in A-10) in 2006 to mark his second straight year with over 40 RBI. He hit .290 with 16 doubles (T6th in A-10), four triples, (T6th in A-10), three home runs and 34 runs scored. He also tied for the team lead with three outfield assists.

Ramos On A Roll

Roberto Ramos started 23 games in centerfield, seven in right field and another eight in left field during the 2006 season while collecting a .220 batting average. He had six doubles, two triples, 21 runs scored and 17 RBI while being hit by pitch eight times and stealing 14 bases. His two-RBI double in the fifth inning against St. Bonaventure on April 2 broke open the game during a five-run rally for the Flyers.

Tedesco Leads Flyers To Pair of Wins

Redshirt freshman **Frank Tedesco** made his first collegiate RBI a game-winner for the Flyers against Oakland in the first of a three-game series. Tedesco smacked a walk-off single to the wall in left centerfield which allowed **Max Navalinski** to score from first in the 10th inning for a 6-5 Dayton victory. He also had two doubles and three RBI as UD beat Toledo, 8-6.

Rohren Rips Up Record Books In Win at IPFW

Senior **Craig Rohren** had a career day at the plate for the Flyers in a 28-7 win over IPFW. He was 5-for-6 with a double, home run, four runs scored and nine RBI. The nine RBI in a single game are the most ever by a Flyer and nearly matched the rest of Rohren's career at UD. The senior entered the game with just three RBI on the season and 12 in his Dayton career. Overall, Rohren hit .283 with 15 doubles, three homers, 24 runs scored and 29 RBI in 2006.

Potent Pitching Attack

The Dayton pitching staff struck out 343 batters this season while walking just 188 (1.82 K-to-BB ratio). UD ranks seventh in the A-10 in strikeouts and is averaging 6.02 strikeouts per game. The 343 strikeouts is an all-time record at UD. In a three-game series with La Salle, Dayton pitchers struckout 31 batters in just 27 innings pitched. Opponents hit just .273 off UD pitching in 2006 (4th best in the A-10).

Swing And A Miss

Senior **Luke Trubee** had 82 strikeouts in 2005, which tied for the most in UD history. He now has the most career strikeouts at UD (218). With seven strikeouts on Apr. 22 against Xavier, Trubee surpassed former teammate Craig Stammen('03-05) who had 185. He also had 82 Ks in 2006, the ninth most in the A-10.

"Tru"bee To Form

Preseason All-America pick **Luke Trubee** led Dayton in wins each of the last three seasons. In 2004, he had eight wins - a feat made more impressive when you realize that 2004 MLB Draft pick **Jerry Blevins** had just seven wins for the Flyers. Last year, Trubee led the A-10 with a 12-3 record, which is tied for the most wins of any pitcher who returned to college in 2006. Trubee won nine games in 2006.

Trubee, A Winning Tradition At UD

Junior **Luke Trubee** has accumulated 30 wins as part of a 30-13 career record at Dayton, which is the most career wins of any Flyer pitcher ever. In 2004, he had eight wins, which was the second best single-season total in school history. Last year, he set a new single-season record for wins with a 12-3 mark. In 2006, Trubee was 9-6 with a 3.95 ERA in 17 appearances. He had 82 strikeouts (9th in A-10) and just 22 walks in 107.0 IP (4th in A-10). Trubee struck out a season-high 12 batters in a complete-game loss to La Salle.

Lindsay Delivers For The Flyers

Redshirt Junior **Kyle Lindsay** came out of the bullpen to throw 4.0 shutout innings in the 2006 season opener at Wofford. During the stretch, Lindsay allowed just three hits while fanning three batters and walking just one.

Lindsay Lifts UD To Victory

Overall in 2006, **Kyle Lindsay** struck out 61 in 77.2 innings pitched over 22 appearances including nine starts. He was 6-1 (T-7th in A-10) with a save and a 4.75 ERA. Lindsay was named the A-10 Pitcher of the Week on March 13 after leading Dayton to wins over Butler and Oakland while also earning his first save of the season against the Grizzlies. He also allowed just two runs and four hits over 6.0 innings while striking out three in a 5-4 win over St. Bonaventure.

Ort Enters The Mix For The Flyers

Junior **Cale Ort** joined the UD rotation in 2006 from Grand Rapids CC where he was selected to the All-District and All-Region teams after helping GRCC to the NJCAA Division II National Championship in 2005. Ort earned his first save as a Flyer with two innings of scoreless relief and three strikeouts vs. APSU. Ort had a 5.88 ERA with 30 strikeouts in a UD single-season record 27 appearances.

Rohren Closes The Door

Beginning with the 2004 season, **Craig Rohren** converted 31 of 34 save opportunities. In 2005, opponents hit .278 off Rohren with a 4.72 ERA. He made 13 appearances and converted seven of eight save opportunities. In 2006, Rohren was 10-for-12 in save situations. Overall, he had a 3.00 ERA with 11 runs allowed in 33.0 innings pitched along with 24 strikeouts and just nine walks. His 10 saves were the most in the A-10 and in UD single-season history.

Rohren Saves The Day For Dayton

Senior **Craig Rohren** earned two saves in the series victory over St. Bonaventure at Time Warner Cable Stadium. He is the all-time leader in career saves at Dayton with 17 in just two seasons in a Flyer uniform.

Rohren Closed Out The Lancers

After Longwood began the eighth inning with a leadoff home run, **Craig Rohren** came out of the bullpen to shut down the Lancer offense and help Dayton to an 8-6 win. Rohren retired six consecutive batters in that game. Overall, the righthander pitched more than 1.0 inning in eight of his 25 appearances.

Rubio Ready In The Bullpen For Dayton

Junior **Chris Rubio** has made his way into the bullpen in 2006 after joining the Flyers from Indian River CC. In his UD debut, Rubio allowed just one earned run in 5.1 innings pitched while striking out a pair despite suffering the loss at Wofford as a starter. He earned his first win as a Flyer at High Point after surrendering just one run over 8.0 innings pitched in his second start of the year. At home against IPFW, He recorded a complete-game shutout with six strikeouts. Rubio also pitched 4.1 innings of relief with three strikeouts to earn his third win of the year at Duquesne. Overall, Rubio was 5-9 with a 4.89 ERA and 45 strikeouts. While at IRCC, Rubio led his team to the conference championship and he was invited to the Florida JC All-Star game.

Haselhorst, A Double Threat For UD

Freshman **Quinn Haselhorst** saw time as a pitcher and a designated hitter for the Flyers. The lefthander threw a scoreless inning of relief in against Wofford with his first collegiate strikeout. The lefthander made his first career start against Iowa and recorded nine strikeouts over 7.1 innings pitched while surrendering just one unearned run in a no decision. He earned his first collegiate victory after scattering nine hits over 8.0 innings while striking out seven against St. Bonaventure. Overall, Haselhorst was 4-4 with a 6.05 ERA and 44 strikeouts in 64.0 innings pitched over 17 appearances. He also ripped his first collegiate hit and RBI in the rout at IPFW and finished 2-for-2 on the day.

Sean Finn On The Mound For The Flyers

Dayton basketball fans remember a #54 Sean Finn running up and down the court at UD Arena as a 7 foot center for the Flyers' 2003 Atlantic 10 Champions. Freshman pitcher **Sean Finn** from Marion, IL also wears #54 and hopes to lead UD to an Atlantic 10 Championship. In his Flyer debut, Finn struck out the side in order to close out the first game of the doubleheader on the mound for Dayton against Wofford. He made 18 appearances overall and held a 2.75 ERA with 33 strikeouts and just 27 hits allowed over 36.0 innings pitched to hold his opponents to a .206 average.

Gaietto Shines as a Starter and Reliever at UD

JC transfer **Jordan Gaietto** had a 4-1 record with a 6.89 ERA in 31.1 innings pitched during the 2006 season for Dayton. He started five games and appeared in five others in relief while holding opponents to a .319 batting average and recording 18 strikeouts. He earned his first win in his Flyer debut with 2.0 scoreless innings of relief at Austin Peay. He also threw the first 3.1 innings against Oakland and gave up just two runs on three hits for another victory.
