FLYER SPOTLIGHT
SOPHOMORE SHORTSTOP
COLE TYRELL

Cole Tyrell enters this week's play with a 13-game hitting streak that is the longest by any Flyer this season. Tyrell has hit .400 during the stretch with seven multi-hit performances. Overall this season, he is second on the team with a .307 batting average while ranking second in stolen bases (8) and third in both runs scored (32) and hit by pitch (13).

FLYER FACTS...

With just two weeks left in the regular season, Dayton looks to make a run at its fifth 30-win season since 2001. The Flyers continue that quest with a pair of non-conference games against MAC opponents. UD will travel to Toledo Tuesday for a 3 p.m. ET game before returning home to face Ohio in a 4 p.m. contest on Wednesday.

Seventeen of UD's 27 victories this season have come against non-conference competition. The Flyers hold a 2-1 record against MAC opponents this season with road wins against Miami (Ohio) and Bowling Green and a two-run loss at Ball State. Last season, UD had only 12 wins against non-conference opponents.

Cole Tyrell has been Dayton's hottest hitter of late as he enters this week's action with a 13-game hitting streak, which is the longest by any Flyer this season. Overall this season, Tyrell is second on the team with a .307 batting average and eight stolen bases. He has played both middle infield positions this season, but has flourished since moving over to shortstop in the past few weeks. Tyrell has been part of 21 UD double plays this season and his hard nosed play in the field has translated into his plate appearances as well. The sophomore is third on the team in times hit by pitch with 13.

Overall the Flyers are on track to be hit by pitch 110 times this season, which would rank among the Top 10 totals in NCAA history. UD has been plunked 1.96 times per game this year and has three different players that have been hit at least 13 times. Ryan Nevill ranks among the top five nationally after being hit 18 times in 47 games played. Jacob Spaeth has been drilled 16 times while Tyrell has been hit 13.

Following this pair of non-conference games, Dayton will head to the Keystone State to face Temple in a three-game Atlantic 10 Conference series. The seventh-place Flyers and fifth-place Owls are separated by just two games in the A-10 standings heading into games that are scheduled for Friday (3 p.m. ET), Saturday (1 p.m. ET) and Sunday (1 p.m. ET). **DAYTON HEAD COACH
 TONY VITTORIO**

**Ninth Season at UD (245-243, .503) • A-10 Conference Record (107-107, .500)
 16th Season Overall (469-441, .516)**

University of Dayton head coach Tony Vittorio has solidified himself as one of the baseball program's greatest managers since he took over beginning with the 2000 season.

This claim is backed by a resume that includes four 30-win seasons including a school record 36 victories in 2005 and UD's only four trips to the Atlantic 10 Championship.

However, Vittorio would give many reasons why those numbers represent a starting point rather than a destination for a program that had only one winning season in the decade prior to his arrival.

"If you strive for excellence everyday, you might find perfection along the way," Vittorio said.

The 2007 was a disappointment for Vittorio's Flyers as the team finished 11th in the Atlantic 10 Conference standings and posted an overall record of 21-33. However, UD pitching staff gained valuable experience that it plans to utilize this season as a total of 19 letterwinners including eight pitchers return for the Flyers in 2008.

In 2006, Vittorio took the Flyers to the Atlantic 10 Championships for the second consecutive season and won 33 games including a program best 18 in Atlantic 10 Conference play to finish third in the 14-team A-10. Not only did the UD pitching staff record a school-record 343 strikeouts, but the offense used its speed to record the second most doubles (115), fourth most stolen bases (75) and fifth most triples (18) in program history. He also saw a Flyer selected for the third time in three seasons in the MLB Draft.

Vittorio led Dayton to a program record 596 hits in 2005 while ranking second in runs scored (397) and at bats (1,932), third in batting average (.308) and RBI (358). The 2005 Flyers also had a solid pitching staff with 314 strikeouts (third most in school history) and a 4.41 team ERA (fifth best).

UD also won two of three games against #19 Notre Dame on Feb. 26 & 27 in Mesa, AZ at HoHoKam Park, the Spring Training home of the Chicago Cubs. It marked the highest ranked team ever defeated by the Flyers in school history.

But as bright as the future appears for Vittorio's Flyers, his past still stands at the top of UD's record books. In 2002, UD shattered record after record, boasting school-highs in strikeouts (332) while winning 32 games, as well as an April 16 win over IPFW that gave Vittorio his 300th career victory. His ability to mold professional-caliber players was also validated during the year, with four members of the '02 squad going on to play some type of professional ball. The quartet of players moving on to the next level brought his total to five players in three years.

A year earlier, Vittorio guided Dayton to its first winning season in three years, setting a then single season school record for victories with 32, while leading Dayton to its first berth in post-season play since joining the A-10 in 1996. The 32-wins in 2001 was just the second winning season in three years, and gave promise to a program that had eclipsed the .500 mark just one time during the 1990s.

In his first year at Dayton, Vittorio guided the Flyers to a 23-32 season with a 10-11 record in conference play, paving the way for the record breaking 2001 campaign.

This transformation of Dayton's program has come as no surprise. From the start of his 12-year coaching career as an assistant at Indiana University, Vittorio has been a builder. His first reconstruction was at Lincoln Trail Community College, a junior college in Robinson, IL. Taking over a program that suffered through a 2-48 season before he arrived, Vittorio guided LTCC to 145 wins from 1990 through 1994, including a 45-28 record his final year. While coaching the Statesmen, he mentored two MLB draftees and saw 22 players advance to four-year college teams. He then spent two years as an assistant coach at the University of Kentucky before beginning the revival of Division II IPFW, a team that was 9-41 before he arrived in the fall of 1996.

Vittorio engineered his rebuilding process again and posted a 24-23 mark his first season and an impressive 30-17 record in 1998. Vittorio's Mastodons won 80 games in his three years in Fort Wayne, bringing his then seven-year career head coaching record to 224-198. In 2000, coach Vittorio made the move to UD, bringing with him head assistant Todd Linklater.

A native of Indianapolis, Vittorio graduated from Hanover (IN) College in 1988 with a double major in both business administration and physical education. He went on to earn his master's degree in sports management from the University of Kentucky in 1997. At Hanover, Vittorio was a four-year letterwinner as a middle infielder and was selected into the American College Hall of Fame at the conclusion of his collegiate career.

Vittorio resides in Kettering with his wife Heather and their daughter Taylor Reann and son Nic.

Flyers Seventh in Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll

Dayton baseball is expected to move up four spots to a seventh place finish this season. Dayton finished the regular season with a 9-18 record in the A-10 in 2007. Fifteen letterwinners return to the squad for the 2008 campaign - eight pitchers and seven positional players.

Making a Difference for MDA

At each Flyer weekend home game, a collection will be taken to benefit the Muscular Dystrophy Association. At the end of the season the total, which will be matched by the UD baseball team, will be presented to the MDA while the Flyers work at the annual MDA telethon on Labor Day Weekend. On Sept. 4, 2006, UD presented the MDA with a check for \$3,670 which included \$1,170 from money collected at Flyer baseball home games. Also, included was \$410 from UD's doubleheader at Wright State on May 2 in honor of Vittorio's mother who passed away in 2005 after a battle with ALS. In addition, \$2,500 was donated by Flyer fan David Barth.

Jersey or Bust

The Flyers hope to make a return to the Atlantic 10 Baseball Championship this May, which will be hosted at Campbell's Field in Camden, NJ. The six-team double-elimination tournament will take place May 21-24 with the winner earning an automatic berth to the NCAA Championships.

UD, A Top Offense

The Flyers led the Atlantic 10 Conference in doubles and was second in triples and fourth in home runs during the 2006 season. UD tallied 135 total extra base hits in 2007. Dayton ranked 6th in the A-10 in doubles (94), 8th in triples (10) and 7th in home runs (31) last year.

Extra Credit

After recording 135 of its 525 hits (.257) for extra bases last season, Dayton has tallied a double, triple or home run for 23.7 percent of its hits this season. UD has 74 doubles, seven triples and 22 home runs out of its 434 hits. The Flyers are 10th in the A-10 in doubles, eighth in triples and sixth in home runs despite having the third best team batting average (.296).

UD Puts Up Touchdowns On Its Opponents

While UD is known for having a rich football tradition, the Flyer baseball team nearly outscored its football team in back-to-back games during the 2006 season. Dayton had its best back-to-back offensive games in school history on April 4 & 7 in a 28-7 win at IPFW and a 27-17 victory at Richmond respectively. The scoring outputs marked the first time in school history that UD had tallied 25 runs or more in back-to-back games. In the win over the Mastodons, the Flyers scored in every inning but the eighth. Against the Spiders, Dayton came back from a 6-0 deficit at the end of the first inning by scoring in every other inning including seven runs in the eighth inning alone.

More Big Numbers

Dayton has also scored 20 or more runs in a single game during each of the past two seasons. The Flyers put up 30 runs in a 30-7 victory over New York Institute of Technology (NYIT) on March 16, 2007 at the FGCU Classic in Fort Meyers, FL. UD scored 20 runs on 20 hits for a 20-4 victory at High Point on March 1, 2008.

Five For Fighting

In 2007, Dayton was 13-7 when scoring more than five runs and 8-26 when scoring five or less. UD has continued the trend this season with a 20-1 record when scoring more than five runs and 6-17 mark when scoring five or less. The Flyers have outscored the competition by an average score of 6.16 to 4.68 this season (+1.48 runs per game).

Now That's What I Call A Comeback

Down 14-0 to Butler midway through the third inning, Dayton rallied for a 21-17 win on March 30, 2005 in what was easily the most bizarre game in Time Warner Cable Stadium history. The Flyers scored a run in the bottom of the third, four in the fourth, 10 in the seventh and six in the eighth to complete the come-from-behind win.

Ouch

In 2007, Dayton batters were hit by pitch 104 times in 54 games which led the the A-10 and ranked second in the nation. UD had the 12th highest total for being plunked of any team in NCAA Division I history as five different Flyers were hit 10 times or more. Scott Dunwoody was plunked three times in the series at Wofford. Cole Tyrell drove in the game-winning run after getting hit by pitch with the bases loaded in the seventh inning on Feb. 23 against High Point last season.

Get Some Ice

UD has been hit by pitch seven times in a single-game at least once during each of the past four seasons after being plunked seven times in a 9-1 victory over High Point on Feb. 29, 2008. Seven batters were also hit by pitch in a 27-17 win over Richmond on April 7, 2006, which tied fourth most in NCAA single-game history also set by the Flyers in a 21-17 win over Butler on March 30, 2005 at Time Warner Cable Stadium. The Flyers were hit by pitch seven times in their 2007 home opener, a 15-11 win over Oakland on March 9, 2007. Dayton was also hit by pitch seven times in a 10 inning loss to Wright State on April 24, 2007, which featured 10 hit batters overall - the second highest total in NCAA single-game history. UD was plunked six times in an 8-6 win over Indiana Southeast on April 4, 2007 at Time Warner Cable Stadium.

Take One (or Two) For The Team

The Flyers have continued to be hit by pitches at an alarming rate in 2008. UD has been hit 88 times in just 44 games (2.00 hbp per game) as a team with four different players having been plunked at least nine times. Ryan Nevill has been hit 18 times, Jacob Spaeth has been hit 15 times while Cole Tyrell (12) and Marshall MacDonald (9) round out the group.

Duck and Cover

Dayton leads the Atlantic 10 Conference and is second in the nation in times hit by pitch as a team with 88 in just 44 games played. South Florida leads the nation with 94 batters hit in 44 games played. Flyer third baseman Ryan Nevill has been plunked 18 times in 44 games played (0.41 HBP per game) which is the 7th most overall and 16th most per game in the nation for any individual this season.

Keep 'Em Coming

UD has been hit by pitch 88 times in 44 games played to put it on track to be drilled 112 times this season, which would rank 9th all-time in NCAA history for times hit by pitch in a single-season. The 2005 Notre Dame squad was hit by pitch 130 times in 63 games played. Last season, the Flyers were hit by pitch a school-record 104 times in 54 games played.

Wave 'Em Home

UD is fifth in the Atlantic 10 Conference in RBI and fifth in runs scored this season despite ranking 10th in doubles and sixth in home runs. The Flyers have scored 271 runs in 44 games played this season (6.16 rpg) by playing "small ball". Dayton is third in the A-10 with 35 sacrifice bunts as well as third in the conference with 22 sacrifice flies. The Flyers are also 43-of-61 in stolen base attempts this season, which is 10th in the Atlantic 10.

Cole is Clutch

Sophomore Cole Tyrell has already recorded three game-winning RBI this season and is fourth on the team in overall RBI with 24. He tallied the game-tying and game-winning RBI in the 10th and 11th innings respectively during a 5-4 win over Saint Joseph's. He has a batting average of .303 while adding a .385 on base percentage with eight stolen bases and enters the weekend with a 10-game hitting streak. He also has a .945 fielding percentage with only 12 errors while taking part in 20 double plays.

Mighty Max

Max Navalinski smacked a grand slam home run to ignite an eight-run eighth inning rally that gave Dayton a 20-4 win at High Point on March 1. Overall this season, the junior designated hitter is hitting at a .256 clip with a .369 on base percentage. He posted a career-high seven RBI in UD's 13-3 win over Findlay and has driven in 22 runs so far this season.

A Senior Moment For Miller

Kevin Miller leads Dayton with a .362 batting average. He is also third on the roster with 30 RBI and is one of four Flyers to hold an on base percentage of .400 or better. His .453 on base percentage ranks ninth in the A-10. He is also among the A-10 leaders in sacrifice bunts and sacrifice flies with five each. The senior centerfielder has three outfield assists this season including one in the bottom of the first inning during the season opener against Campbell.

Big Mac

JC transfer Marshall MacDonald stepped into the third spot in the batting order this season for the Flyers in a big way. He is fifth on the team with a .302 average and second in doubles with 9. The junior has also been hit by pitch nine times and walked 24 times for a .419 on base percentage. MacDonald was named the A-10 Player of the Week on Apr. 14 after hitting three home runs in as many games while batting .500 in the series against Saint Joseph's. He tallied a 10-game hitting streak at one point this season including a stretch of five homers in six games that included a walk-off blast against Wright State.

Get Er Dun

Junior catcher Scott Dunwoody is shining in his second year behind the plate for the Flyers. He has scored 26 runs with a .318 batting average (second on team) and an on base percentage of .360. He had three hits to go along with a sacrifice bunt, run scored and a RBI in Dayton's 7-3 win at Miami (Ohio). Dunwoody has also thrown out 17 of 56 (30.7 percent) of would be base stealers.

Hoover Cleans Up For Dayton

Jake Hoover, a JC transfer, is batting .308 with 34 RBI and six home runs. Hoover has tallied eight multi-RBI games this season. His best all-around effort of the season came in the series opener against Tennessee Tech when he homered and doubled twice at the plate before taking the mound to strike out six batters in 3.1 innings pitched to earn his first career save. Hoover also went 4-for-4 with a HBP, walk, two doubles, a homer, run scored and two RBI in the series opener against George Washington.

Nevill Keeps It Rolling

Ryan Nevill is hitting .285 this season while batting sixth in the order with a .401 on base percentage and 37 runs scored. Nevill has also been hit by pitch a team-high 18 times, which is already the second most in UD single-season history. He was plunked twice in wins over High Point on March 1 and Bradley on March 10. Nevill drove in three runs during a 3-for-5 effort against Wittenberg on April 9.

Spaeth Gets it Going

Jacob Spaeth has reached base 26 of 52 times when leading off an inning and has scored 12 of those times. He holds a .387 on base percentage and is a perfect 10-for-10 in stolen base attempts.

Top Flight Pitching

Dayton holds one of the best overall pitching staffs in the Atlantic 10 Conference with a 4.10 ERA and 26 wins in 44 games played. UD is leads the A-10 in ERA, fewest runs allowed (206) and fewest walks allowed (134) while also ranking third in opposing batting average (.271).

Potent Pitching Attack

The Dayton pitching staff struck out 315 batters during the 2007 season while walking just 169 (1.86 K-to-BB ratio). UD allowed the second fewest number of walks of any team in the Atlantic 10 Conference last season (169). In 2008, the Flyers have recorded 277 strikeouts and only 134 walks (2.07 K-to-BB ratio). Dayton has tallied more walks than strikeouts only four times this season.

Closing the Door

UD allowed four runs or less 23 times during the 2007 season and held a 14-9 record in those games. Dayton also had an 11-18 record in contests decided by two runs or less including a 7-12 record in one-run games. This season, the Flyers are 23-6 when giving up four runs or less and are 9-8 in games decided by two runs or less.

Dye Deals For Dayton

Senior Alex Dye has a 4.38 ERA this season despite opponents batting .269 against him. The righthander is 4-1 on the year and has tallied 34 strikeouts in 61.2 innings pitched. He has controlled the opponent's running game by recording two pickoffs. Dye struck out three and gave up three earned runs on six hits in 6.0 innings pitched to earn the win over Richmond in his last start on Sunday.

Finn, A Fine Performer on the Mound

Sean Finn has holds a 5.65 ERA with 30 strikeouts and only 18 walks in 43.0 innings pitched. He gave up just two runs on five hits over 3.2 innings pitched while striking out three in his last start against Butler.

Haselhorst, A Solid Southpaw

Junior Quinn Haselhorst is 4-1 with a 4.37 ERA after eight starts this season. He has struck out 27 batters and is holding his opponents to a .311 average while recording three pickoffs. The lefty gave up three consecutive home runs, but earned a no decision after recording three strikeouts while allowing seven runs on eight hits over 5.1 innings pitched in his last start against Richmond.

Beesley Swarms the Competition

Sophomore Chris Beesley leads the team with a 1.74 ERA this season after giving up only six earned runs in 31.0 innings pitched. He has struck out 21 while walking nine and opponents are batting only .208 off of the righthander, which is also the second best in the A-10. Beesley recorded just one strikeout but earned the save after throwing 3.0 innings of scoreless relief in the finale against Richmond.

Mitchem Provides Relief

Freshman Burny Mitchem has been a solid option out of the bullpen for Dayton this season. The 6-6 righthander has a 1.82 ERA with three saves in 18 appearances, all in relief. He has recorded 39 strikeouts and only 10 walks in 29.2 innings pitched. Mitchem had a save in the first game of the series against Valparaiso, but suffered the loss in the finale after allowing one unearned run in 3.0 innings pitched with three strikeouts. He struck out six batters in 2.2 innings pitched to earn his first collegiate victory over Xavier. Mitchem was named the Atlantic 10 Conference Rookie of the Week on April 28 after earning a save and a win in a pair of relief appearances.

Lucas Lights Up Opponents

Senior Lucas Farden leads Dayton with two saves while holding a 3-6 record and a 3.46 ERA in 18 appearances. He has struck out 57 while surrendering only 18 walks over 62.2 innings pitched and holding opponents to a .242 batting average. Farden fanned nine batters and walked just one over 8.0 innings pitched but suffered the loss in a 5-0 defeat to Richmond in his last start

Grad Rates Great in Dayton

The University of Dayton Division of Athletics maintained its position as one of the top academic achievers in the NCAA in the latest breakdown of the Graduation Success Rate data released in November. UD has an institutional GSR of 95 percent which ranks first among the Atlantic 10 Conference and 16th overall in the nation. The Flyers combined cumulative grade point average is above a 3.0. In addition, UD has had 27 Academic All-Americans in the last six years. Also, at least one Dayton student-athlete has been named an Academic All-American for 22 straight years.
