AT DAYTON: Adebowale "Bo" Balogun walked onto the team as a freshman after a standout career at Fairmont High School. He played wideout in 2004, but moved to tailback in 2005. In 2005, he had five carries for 18 yards.

PERSONAL: Son of Vicky Balogun...Born on September 29, 1983... Majoring in Marketing... He was a three-time MVP in high school, and all-area.

Game 1 FLYER FOOTBALL DOMINATES IN 38-0 WIN AT TIFFIN

TIFFIN, Ohio - Matt Mong had three touchdown runs and Kevin Hoyng passed and ran for scores to lead Dayton to a 38-0 win over Tiffin. The game marked the first game of Flyer head coach Mike Kelly's 25th season at the helm of the Dayton football program. Mong scored on three of his seven carries, with TD runs of 7, 2 and 1 yard. Hoyng scored on a 1-yard run in the first and threw a 50-yard scoring pass to Ryan Wroblewski in the second. In his first career start, Hoyng ran for a team-leading 57 yards on seven carries and completed 12 of 19 passes for 271 yards with an interception for Dayton. Wroblewski caught six passes for 170 yards.

Ten UD players ran the ball, and seven different players caught passes. The Flyers outgained the Dragons 530 yards to 87 and had 25 first downs to just seven for Tiffin. Dayton averaged nearly 5 yards per rush, gaining 252 yards on 51 attempts, while holding Tiffin to 56 yards in 34 carries.

The Dayton defense held Tiffin to minus-three yards in the third quarter. Linebacker John Hoppe led UD with 11 tackles (six solo), including two hits in the backfield. He also blocked a punt. Safety Brandon Cramer added seven hits. All three of nickelback Steve McDonald's tackles were behind the line of scrimmage. Twenty-one Flyer defenders made plays in the game.

Dayton's special teams had a productive, if mostly brief, day. Kicker Josh Heyne nailed all five PAT's and hit a 43-yard field goal on the last play of the first half (his first attempt of 47 yards was blocked). Of his seven kickoffs, three were touchbacks and two others resulted in a tackle inside the Tiffin 20-yard-line.

Dayton has won its last six season-opening games.

Game 2 DAYTON PULLS AWAY FROM WITTENBERG TO WIN 41-23

DAYTON - Behind 296 yards passing and two touchdowns from sophomore quarterback Kevin Hoyng, the University of Dayton football team defeated Wittenberg University, 41-23. Hoyng was 15-for-22 passing as top-ranked UD won its home opener for fifth-straight year and for the 21st time in the last 22 years.

Even before the crowd of 4,175 could be seated, the Flyers and Tigers had already put 13 combined points on the board. Wittenberg scored on its first play from scrimmage, a 96-yard-run by Tristan Murray. The Tigers could not convert the extra point and led 6-0. On UD's first play from scrimmage, sophomore wide receiver Jack O'Dell caught a career-long touchdown pass for 65-yards, making the score 7-6. Both scores came in the first 30 seconds of the ball game.

UD and Wittenberg traded touchdowns again until halftime. Tailback Tim Watson scored his first career TD for the Flyers to knot the score at 13-13. Wittenberg's Derrick Brazziel ended the wild first half with a nine-yard touchdown run with 3:02 remaining and the Tigers took the 20-13 advantage to the break.

The Flyers came back to outscore the Tigers 28-3 in the second half. Dayton scored the first two times it had the ball in the second half. UD tied it after taking the second-half kickoff with Hoyng connecting on a 61-yard TD pass to Ryan Wroblewski just 57 seconds into the third quarter. Four minutes later, the Flyers found the end zone again as Hoyng ran 19 yards to cap a five-play, 67-yard drive. A Wittenberg 24-yard field goal from Mark Porter with 1:32 remaining in the third quarter made the score 27-23, but UD tucked on two more TD's for insurance in the fourth quarter. Matt Champa caught a two-yard pass from Hoyng and Matt Marshall carried from 12 yards out. The Flyer win overcame a tremendous individual effort by Murray, who gained 239 yards on 25 carries with two TD's. Murray's 239 net yards are the most against UD since the Flyers moved to non-scholarship football in 1977. After surrendering 276 yards in the first half, the Dayton defense allowed just 87 more yards in the second half, including just five yards in the fourth quarter. Conversely, the Flyer offense gained 342 of it 554 yards in total offense after intermission.

For the game, Wroblewski caught seven passes for 94 yards. He also carried the ball twice for 75 yards and a TD. Jack O'Dell caught two passes for a 113 yards and a TD.

Defensively, John Hoppe led the Flyers for the second straight game with 12 tackles. He was in on a half a sack and had 1.5 tackles for a loss. Scott Wintering had a sack for a 10-yard loss to go along with seven tackles.

Game 3 DAYTON DOMINATES IN 46-0 WIN OVER AUSTIN PEAY

DAYTON - The University of Dayton football team dominated both sides of the ball in a 46-0 rout of the Austin Peay Governors at Welcome Stadium. The Flyer defense pitched its second shutout of the year in improving to 3-0, and the offense accumulated 517 yards of total offense.

APSU came into the game with the Pioneer Football League's second-best ground attack, averaging 238.5 yards a game. But UD's defense held strong all game, allowing the Gobs just 49 yards rushing and a total of five first downs and 115 yards total offense. Austin Peay's leading rusher, Chris Fletcher, was held 109 yards under his season's average, running for 21 yards on 11 carries.

Cornerback Casey Klaus led Dayton with nine tackles on the day, with five solo hits and two passes batted down. UD did not allow a first down until the score was 21-0 in favor of the Flyers. Linebacker John Hoppe and nickelback Steve McDonald both had five tackles. Hoppe's were all solo hits with two in the Governor backfield.

The Flyers used a strong first half by quarterback Kevin Hoyng, (two passing TD's and one rushing TD) to lead 27-0 at halftime against the visiting Gobs. Hoyng started scoring by hitting tailback with Tim Watson a 20-yard touchdown pass at the 8:28 mark of the first quarter. Hoyng ran one in from 16 yards later in the first quarter, and then hit Ryan Wroblewski from 22 yards out on the first play of the second quarter. Backup QB Robert Dence scored from one-yard out to finish the first half's scoring.

The second half was no different, with UD taking the kickoff to start the third period and driving 79 yards on 12 plays, ending when Watson added a two-yard rushing touchdown for his second touchdown for the day and giving the Flyers a 33-0 lead. The scoring was capped off by touchdown runs by Ben Shappie (24 yards) and Greg Wimberly (16 yards), the first of both their careers at UD.

A total of 15 different players carried the ball for UD, including six tailbacks. Watson was the team's top mover, carrying the ball 13 times for 88 yards (6.8 yards per carry). Dayton quarterbacks Hoyng and Dence combined for 107 yards passing (8 of 13). Hoyng was six of ten for 77 yards and two touchdowns. Wroblewski caught four passes for 54 yards and a TD. Special team play played a big role in the outcome. Austin Peay's average starting position in the first half was its own 19 yard-line, while UD began its six first-half possessions near midfield at its own 47. UD tackled Gobs' kick returner inside the 20 five times in the game. Junior Nick Ruhe returned five punts for 79 yards (15.8 average). Flyers downfield by air. He completed a 10-yard pass to Verhoff and then three consecutive completions to Ryan Wroblewski of 18, 11 and 24 yards to set up the game's final play. From the 15-yard line with 12 seconds on the clock, Staley took the snap in shotgun formation and was forced to scramble after the pocket collapsed.

For the game, Staley was 11-of-18 passing for 158 yards and a touchdown. Kevin Hoyng completed the only pass he threw, before going down with an injury early in the third quarter. Four Flyers racked up double-digit tackles, led by Doug Jones' 12.

Game 4 DAYTON USES BIG SECOND QUARTER TO MASH MOREHEAD 42-7

MOREHEAD, KY - The University of Dayton scored 21 points in the second quarter to turn a close contest into a rout, enabling the Flyers to roll to a 42-7 win at Morehead State. UD scored on all three of its second quarter possessions, out-gaining the Eagles 193 to 26 in the decisive period. Dayton went into the game ranked #1 in both the Sports Network and Football Gazette I-AA Mid-Major rankings.

A pair of redshirt sophomores gave the Flyers an early lead. Wideout Jack O'Dell answered the opening bell by taking the starting kickoff back 54 yards, and eight plays later quarterback Kevin Hoyng ran it in from ten yards out to give Dayton a 7-0 lead that stood up until UD busted out 21 points in the second quarter. Fullback Matt Mong dove over from the one, Hoyng scored on a 49-yard scramble and tailback Steve Verhoff would not be denied from the six to push the Flyers up 28-0.

After a scoreless third, Hoyng hit Matt Champa for a 48-yard TD on the first play of the fourth period, and backup Greg Wimberly scored a 12-yard run to put Dayton up 42-0.

The Eagles came into the game with the second-highest scoring and rushing offense in the PFL, but the Dayton defense held Morehead to one touchdown (29 points under its average) and 136 yards rushing (98 yards under).

Safety Steve McDonald led a strong team effort on defense for UD. McDonald was credited with 8.5 hits (seven solo) and was the game's leading tackler. Close behind were linebacker Brian Kelly (7.0, five solo), linebacker John Hoppe (6.5, six) and nickelback Jared Frank (6.0, five). Cornerback Casey Klaus intercepted two passes, and his partner at the other corner, Chance Walton, intercepted another. Kelly and Tom Jakacki each forced fumbles. Hoyng led the Flyers with 284 yards in total offense. He was 12 of 16 passing for 208 yards with one TD, and carried the ball 13 times for 76 yards and two touchdowns. Senior wide receiver Ryan Wroblewski caught six passes for 95 yards to move into the top five in Flyer career receiving yardage. O'Dell added four receptions for 37 yards. Dayton's second- and third-leading rushers, backup tailback Greg Wimberly (eight rushes for 49 yards) and backup quarterback Robert Dence (2 for 33), only carried the ball in the fourth quarter. Dence was also two-for-two passing for 27 yards.

Game 5 UD TAKES JACKSONVILLE, 49-17

DAYTON, Ohio - Dayton was led by three touchdowns from senior Ryan Wroblewski en route to a 49-17 victory over Jacksonville in a Pioneer Football League crossover game in front of 7,257 fans at the University of Dayton.

Wroblewski finished with 162 yards of total offense for Dayton. The Northville, Mich. native had four receptions for 110 yards including one touchdown catch. He added three rushes for 48 yards and two touchdowns. Overall the Flyers out gained the Dolphins in total yardage 339-279 despite both teams splitting the time of possession 30:01 to 29:59 in favor of Jacksonville.

UD threw for 265 yards on the day as Kevin Hoyng completed 7-of-21 attempts for 246 yards and three touchdowns. Jack O'Dell joined Wroblewski as the only other Flyer to catch multiple passes on the afternoon as he finished with two receptions for 68 yards. The Flyers also rushed for 195 yards on 49 carries as Wroblewski was followed by senior Steve Verhoff with 23 yards on 10 rushes including one touchdown.

Defensively, UD forced six JU turnovers including four interceptions. John Hoppe had two interceptions including one for a touchdown to go along with nine tackles. Steve McDonald picked off another Dolphin pass while tallying eight tackles, and Chance Walton added a pick. Brian Kelly led Dayton with 13 tackles including four solo stops and a fumble recovery as 10 Flyers had five tackles or more on the afternoon. Dayton struck in the first quarter after both team traded turnovers with a 33-yard run by Wroblewski. After JU stuffed UD on first and second down running plays, Hoyng faked an option to the left and pitched it back to Wroblewski who was coming back from left to right to put the Flyers ahead 7-0 after a Josh Heyne extra-point kick.

UD took advantage of a JU miscue to take a 14-3 advantage late the second quarter. Kelly recovered a Dolphin fumble on the on the Jacksonville 26-yard line for the Flyers with 2:55 left in the first half. Then just two plays later Hoyng hit Wroblewski with a 22-yard touchdown pass in the back of the end zone to give Dayton an 11-point lead.

Dayton took a 21-10 lead and control of the game's momentum with a big defensive play early in the second half. After Jacksonville moved the ball to its own 33-yard line with a pair of first downs, Salgado was intercepted by UD's Hoppe at the 47-yard line who followed a host of Flyers along the sideline for a touchdown with 12:28 remaining in the third quarter. UD then stripped the ball from a JU receiver on the very next play from scrimmage and Tom Jakacki on the Dolphins' 29-yard line. Just three plays later Wroblewski found the end zone for the third time on another end around for a 15-yard touchdown run that put Dayton ahead 28-10 with 9:18 left in the third quarter.

The Flyers stretched their lead out to 25 points with long strike from the arm of Hoyng. The junior quarterback threw his second touchdown pass of the afternoon as he connected with classmate Matt Champa for a 69-yard completion down the left sideline for a 35-10 Dayton lead with just under three minutes left in the third quarter. Dayton then capped a 28-point third quarter outburst as a McDonald interception led to an 11-yard Steve Verhoff touchdown run for a 42-10 Flyer advantage at the end of three quarters.

UD's Brandon Godsey closed out the day's scoring as well as a 10-play, 80-yard drive that took 4:52 off the clock with a two-yard rush at the 3:33 mark for a 49-17 Flyer victory.

Game 6 TWO FOURTH-QUARTER TOUCHDOWNS LIFT DAYTON OVER DRAKE, 25-17

DES MOINES, IA - For the second straight year, the football game between the University of Dayton and Drake University came down to one play, and for the second straight year, the road team won. Fortunately for the Dayton Flyers, the game was played in Iowa and UD took the exciting 25-17 come-from-behind win over Drake at Waukeez Stadium in Des Moines.

What promised to be a high-scoring game on paper proved to be anything but on the field, as each team could only muster one first down in the first quarter. The Flyers scored first after catching a break in the second period. A short punt struck a Bulldog blocker, and Dayton linebacker Brian Kelly fell on the ball at the Drake 37. Eight plays later, fullback Matt Mong launched himself over the goal line put Dayton on the board. The extra point was missed, giving UD a 6-0 lead. On UD's next possession, the Flyers needed just three plays to go 73 yards, with wideout Carlton McFadgen catching a 30-yard TD pass (his first career score) from Kevin Hoyng. UD's two-point attempt was no good, giving Dayton a 12-0 lead at halftime.

The 'Dogs made it a 12-10 game with 11:53 on a Ryan Horvath 36-yard field goal, and following a Hoyng interception that was returned to the eight, took a 17-12 lead 22 seconds later when quarterback Connor Jostes ran it in from there. Up to that point, Drake had outgained the Flyers 145 to 11 in the second half, and UD's best sustained drive of the day was a mere eight plays for 37 yards to open the scoring. But Dayton has not earned the #1 ranking in NCAA Division I-AA Mid-Major football without some backbone, and the Flyers showed what they were made of on the next possession.



2005 IN REVIEW

UD drove 80 yards on 12 plays to retake the lead. Hoyng bounced back from his costly interception with five straight completions, including a three-yard pass to tight end Matt Champa out of a short-yardage formation. After the Dayton defense held on downs, the Dayton ground game came to life. After being held to just 90 rushing yards on 38 carries (2.3 avg.) to that point, the Flyers ran the ball eight straight times and drove 55 yards to go up by eight. Verhoff carried three more yards, and then Mong punched it in for his second three-yard touchdown. Josh Heyne's PAT made the score 25-17.

But the Dayton defense had to make one more stand. Jostes moved his team down the field, and when a roughing-the-passer penalty on a fourth down incomplete pass gave Drake new life, the Bulldogs had time for two more plays from the Dayton 20. Jostes fade to Daniel Marx was long on the right sideline.

With the victory, the Flyers clinched their 29th consecutive winning season, extending the own school record and the longest streak in NCAA Division I football (Florida State also entered 2005 with 28 straight winning seasons). Klaus, a junior cornerback, was one of five UD players with at least seven tackles on the day. Dayton's other corner, Chance Walton, led with eight hits (seven solo) and a fumble recovery. Linebackers Brian Kelly and John Hoppe, Klaus and safety Brandon Cramer each had seven. Kelly also recovered two fumbles. Cramer forced two fumbles and broke up two passes, and Hoppe forced another fumble.

Hoyng was 16 of 25 passing for 173 yards and two TD's. He also led UD in rushing, with 47 net yards on 20 carries. Verhoff had 43 yards on seven carries, Steve Watson added 29 yards on 12 attempts from the tailback position, and Mong's two touchdowns came on for carries for 14 yards. Ryan Wroblewski was the team's leading receiver (five catches for 52 yards).

Game 7 FLYERS FALL FROM RANKS OF UNBEATEN, 48-24 VERSUS SAN DIEGO

DAYTON, OHIO - The No. 1 ranked University of Dayton football team suffered its first loss of the season, 48-24, at the hand of No. 2 San Diego Toreros in a match-up of Pioneer Football League powers and the top two teams in the NCAA Division I-AA Mid-Major rankings.

San Diego's defense, ranked No. 1 in Division I-AA, smothered UD in the second half. After giving up 312 yards and 24 points in the first half, the Toreros held UD to just 63 yards of offense in the second half and just four first downs in the final 30 minutes. The Toreros defense shut out UD in the second half, as USD scored 28 unanswered points in the second half. Dayton's 24 points in the first half were more than San Diego had allowed in any game this season.

Quarterback Kevin Hoyng ran for 80 yards on 10 carries to lead the Flyer ground attack, while tailback Tim Watson added 60 on 11 attempts. Senior wideout Ryan Wroblewski caught six passes for 90 yards for the Flyers.

What was billed as a defensive struggle started off with all offense as each team scored on its' first two drives of the game. On the seventh play of UD's first drive, Kevin Hoyng eluded the pass rush, tucked the ball and took off. With the Flyers' wide outs running deep patterns, Hoyng was able to carry the ball 30 yards before coming up into an defenders in the secondary. After cutting to the outside, Hoyng completed the 50-yard TD run to put Dayton up 7-0 just 3:44 into the game.

The Toreros answered on the ensuing drive, starting with a return of the squib kickoff to midfield. USD QB Josh Johnson hit Nick Garton on a 19-yard slant for the game-tying touchdown. Dayton responded with an 80-yard march on the next drive, converting on fourth and goal as FB Matt Mong went over the top of the pile on the one-yard touchdown plunge.

Hoyng completed three-straight passes to three difference receivers, including a 20-yard connection with Matt Champa for a touchdown. The extra point made the score 24-20 UD. The two teams combined for 29 first downs in the first half (UD 15, USD 14), and 585 yards of total offense (UD 312, USD 273).

But in the third quarter, the Toreros surged ahead on a three-yard touchdown pass from Johnson to Rogan. After Dayton punted on the next possession, Rogan broke free from the pile of would-be tacklers for a 35-yard touchdown run to give USD a 34-24 lead. Johnson made the Flyers pay with an 11-yard scamper for his fourth TD of the day on the first play of the fourth quarter. USD missed its second point-after on the day to hold a 16-point lead at 40-24.

Brian Kelly recorded 15 tackles for the Flyers. of the completions going to wideout Ryan Wroblewski for 55 yards.

Game 8 FLYERS ROLL ON SENIOR DAY, BEAT VALPARAISO 52-7

DAYTON, Ohio - Seniors Ryan Wroblewski and Matt Mong each scored two touchdowns in a 52-7 Dayton victory over Valparaiso on Senior Day in front of 6,263 fans in Pioneer Football League North Division action at Welcome Stadium.

The Flyers racked up 368 yards rushing and held the Crusaders to just 59 yards on the ground. Kevin Hoyng led UD with 85 yards rushing - all in the first half. Matt Mong carried eight times for 47 yards and Greg Wimberly added 44 yards on four carries. Robert Dence - who at halftime was named the 50th winner of the Lt. Andy Zulli award - completed two of his three passing attempts for 21 yards, and ran for a 23-yard touchdown late in the third quarter.

The Flyers' opening drive took 10 plays, 80 yards in 5:02 for a 7-0 UD lead. Ryan Wroblewski took an end around 29-yards to pay dirt for the touchdown. After forcing Valparaiso to a three-and-out on their its' first possession, Wroblewski returned the punt 86 yards, cutting back at the 25 to avoid the last would-be tacklers and pull away for the score.

The Flyers responded with a 10-play drive that marched 86 yards down field before Matt Mong punched it in from one-yard out. With the Crusaders knocking at the door just before the half, UD's Chance Walton forced a fumble on the one yard line and Brandon Cramer returned it 98 yards for a touchdown. Cramer crossed the goal with 1:05 remaining in the first half. Dayton began the half with a 20-yard field goal by Josh Heyne just 4:32 into the third quarter. The Flyers then got the ball back on its own 43 yard line just 1:15 later and used a 39-yard pass from Hoyng to Carlton McFadden down to the one-yard line to set up another touchdown run by Mong to put the Flyers ahead 38-7 at the 8:09 mark.

Then with 3:38 left in the third quarter Dence scampered around the left side for a 23-yard touchdown to give Dayton a 45-7 advantage. The score completed a 17-point scoring output by the Flyers and 31 unanswered points over the second and third quarters combined.

In the fourth quarter, Dayton pushed its lead to 52-7 with a Greg Wimberly 32-yard burst through the middle of the Crusader defense with 9:03 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Game 9 DAYTON IMPROVES TO 8-1 WITH 45-15 WIN AT DAVIDSON

DAYTON -- No. 1-ranked Dayton came up just two yards short on Senior DDAVIDSON, NC - The University of Dayton football team turned away a determined Davidson Wildcat team to win 45-15 Saturday at Richardson Stadium on the campus of Davidson College. Dayton scored the first 24 points of the game en route to its eighth victory in nine games.

During the game, senior wide receiver Ryan Wroblewski became the Flyer career receiving yardage leader, breaking Pat Hugar's eight-year-old record. Wrobles

On the offensive side of the ball, Dayton scored 24 unanswered points. A Kevin Hoyng four-yard run put the Flyers on the board and gave them a 7-0 lead after the first quarter. Then UD scored 17 more points before halftime. Hoyng scrambled from one sideline to the other before hitting Nick Ruhe right down the right sideline for a 20-yard TD. Josh Heyne connected on a 25-yard field goal, and Ruhe followed up his first college touchdown with another when he returned a punt 64 yards for another score.

Dayton had three scoring drives of ten or more plays in the second half. The Flyers took the second-half kickoff and drove 70 yards in 10 plays (Matt Mong scoring from the two with 4:05 left). UD also drove 65 yards in 14 plays (Mong from the one with 4:12 left in the third), and 80 yards in 16 plays (Robert Dence scoring on an 11-yard run with 5:31 in the game).

By contrast, Davidson only ran 15 plays the entire second half, but one of them was a doozy. Alexander hit Brett Dioguardi for an 88-yard TD pass on Davidson's first possession of the second half. The Dayton defense limited the Wildcats to just 19 yards the rest of the half. UD had the ball over five times longer than Davidson in the second half, including an amazing 13:36 in the fourth quarter.

Hoyng completed 16 of 27 passes for 283 yards to lead UD. He was also one of five Flyers to gain 25 or more yards on the ground. Dence was the day's leader for Dayton, with six carries for 50 yards. Wroblewski's five pass receptions for 87 yards led the team in receptions. Carlton McFadden added career-high 96 yards on four grabs, and tight end Matt Champa also had four catches for 45 yards.

In addition to his interception, Cramer led UD with six tackles (four solo). Marcus Deja added five hits, and Jared Frank, John Hoppe and Chance Walton each had four. Walton and Casey Klaus also had interceptions. Hoppe and Klaus batted down a pass apiece. Scott Wintering and Pat Weale both had sack and Brian Kelly blocked a punt.

Game 10 DAYTON CRUISES TO 41-7 WIN AT BUTLER TO FINISH SEASON 9-1

INDIANAPOLIS - The University of Dayton Flyers completed the 2005 season with a 41-7 win over Butler at the Butler Bowl. UD finishes the season 9-1 overall, 3-1 in the Pioneer Football League and ranked #2 in the NCAA Division I-AA Mid-Major rankings.

During the game, redshirt sophomore Kevin Hoyng set the Dayton record for total offense in a season. Hoyng was 11 of 16 for 179 yards passing and carried the ball eight times for another 22 yards, giving him 2,547 yards on the season. That broke Steve Keller's old record of 2,460 set in 1991. Hoyng also completed his second season for the Flyers seventh in career total offense, with 3,373 yards.

Butler took the opening kickoff and moved the ball to midfield, UD's Casey Klaus intercepted Ryan Diggins' pass at the 20 and returned it to the Flyer 28. On the very next play, Hoyng hit senior wide receiver Ryan Wroblewski in stride for a 72-yard bomb to give Dayton an early 7-0 lead. On the day, Wroblewski caught six passes for 129 yards, giving him career totals of 117 catches (second all-time at UD) and 2,058 yards (extending his own school record that was set last year).

A pair of ten-play drives resulted in two more Dayton touchdowns (a Matt Mong one-yard run and a Greg Wimberly nine-yarder), giving the Flyers a 20-0 lead at halftime. UD took the second-half kickoff and matriculated the ball down the field on its longest drive of the day - an 11-play, 70-yarder - that took 4:58 off the dock and ended when Hoyng found tight end Matt Champa in the end zone for a four-yard TD.

The Bulldogs put a charge into the crowd when they recovered an onside kick. But Klaus took that excitement with him down the sideline when he picked off Diggins' pass and returned it 71 yards for a touchdown.

Senior Robert Dence ended the scoring with a one-yard run with 3:50 left in the game. UD got the ball back one more time and drove to the Butler 23, but took a knee on the last play.

Dayton's co-captains - linebacker John Hoppe, tailback Steve Verhoff and offensive tackle Ryan Winner - all finished their careers in fine style. Hoppe led both teams in tackles (11), Verhoff led UD in rushing (55 yards on ten carries) and Winner started his 31st straight game as UD averaged 5.5 yards a carry on the day.

Verhoff was one of five Flyers (four of them being tailbacks) to gain at least 35 yards in the game. The exception was senior fullback Matt Mong, who gained a season-high 48 yards on seven carries, and scored his 12th touchdown on the year. Mong led UD in scoring in 2005, and finished his days as a Flyer with the distinction of never having been thrown for a loss in 104 rushing attempts.

UD's 9-1 record in the 100th Anniversary Season of Dayton Football marked just 18th time in school history a team ended the year with no more than one loss. Twelve of those teams have been coached by Flyer coach Mike Kelly.

Harry Baujan



UD Football Coach (1923-1946) • UD Director of Athletics (1947-1964)

Most successful coaches make a splash once they arrive at a job. But Harry Baujan, the University of Dayton head football coach for 21 years between 1923 and 1946, made a splash on the way to the job.

He had to. Spring floods had come to his hometown of Beardstown, Illinois, and he had to row a boat across town to catch the train that would bring him to Dayton for an interview. He made the train, and got the job as an assistant coach under Van Hill. The rest, as the saying goes, is history. Flyer football history, that is.

A standout end for Knute Rockne's Notre Dame powerhouses between 1913 and 1917, Baujan served with the Army in Europe during World War I. After a short professional football career that first brought him to Dayton as a member of the Massillon Tigers, he accepted the position at Dayton.

He served one season as assistant, then was named head coach prior to the 1923 season. This was the beginning for the "modern era" of Flyer football, and it was a success from the very first play. On his first play as a head coach, the "Blond Beast" as Baujan was nicknamed, called a pass from Vince Moir to Walter Achiu that went for a TD.

In 21 years as a head coach, Baujan's teams were never outscored over a season, and he compiled a 124-64-8 record.

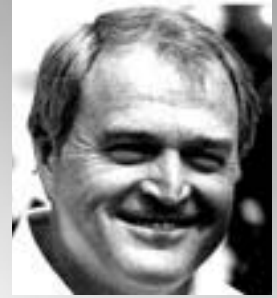
Following his coaching career, Baujan served as UD's Director of Athletics from 1947 to 1964. In 1961, the University bestowed the name Baujan Field on the football stadium that was built in 1925 in time for Baujan's third year as head coach.

Baujan was inducted into the University of Dayton Athletic Hall of Fame in 1968, and was given the top distinction in college football in 1990, when he was posthumously inducted into the National Football Foundation's College Football Hall of Fame.





Chuck Noll



Dayton '53 • Super Bowl Champion • Pro Football Hall of Fame

Chuck Noll, a former University of Dayton co-captain and a starter on UD's only Division I team to play in the post-season, gained the highest honor in the football world on July 31, 1995 when he was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio.

UD went 7-3 in 1951, and played in the 1952 Salad Bowl. Dayton lost to Houston 26-21 in Phoenix, Arizona.

Noll is the only pro coach to win four Super Bowls, but long before anyone dreamed of a Super Bowl, Noll was a standout offensive lineman and linebacker for the UD Flyers. He was a part of Dayton teams that set school records for net offense (3,731), first downs rushing (115), fewest net yards allowed (1,954) and fewest net rushing yards allowed (946). Those records have since been broken, but remain UD's Division I highs in those categories.

He was a team captain in 1952, and graduated from UD in



1953. Noll was selected as a charter member to UD's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1962.

After seven seasons with the Cleveland Browns, Noll spent nine years as an assistant coach with the Los Angeles Chargers and Baltimore Colts before being named head coach of the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1969.

Noll's 23-year record of 209 wins, 156 losses and 1 tie is the sixth-highest win total in the history of the NFL. He retired in 1991 after 40 years in professional football as a player, assistant coach and head coach.

Always a great supporter of the University, Noll served as Honorary Co-Chair of UD's successful Call to Lead National Campaign. He has served on the University's Board of Trustees since 1993.

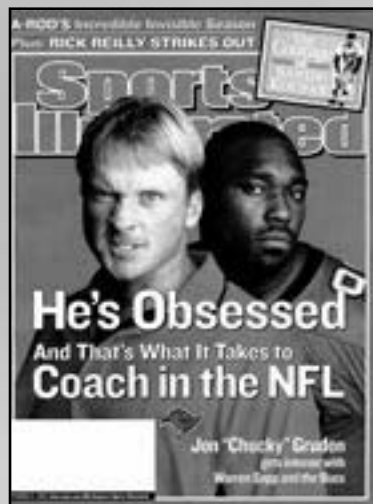
Jon Gruden



Dayton '86 • Super Bowl Champion • Tampa Bay Buccaneers Head Coach

When Jon Gruden was a backup quarterback as a senior at the University of Dayton, he went to Flyer coach Mike Kelly and volunteered to play on special teams. Kelly looked at Gruden and asked him a question: "You want to be coach someday. Would it be a good coaching move for me to risk an injury to my backup quarterback by letting him play special teams?" Gruden grudgingly saw Kelly's point, but even Gruden would probably admit that things worked out okay for him, as his Tampa Bay Buccaneers won Super Bowl XXXVII 48-21.

Gruden is the second University of Dayton graduate to win the Super Bowl. Former UD co-captain and 1993 Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee Chuck Noll won four Super Bowls (IX, X, XII, & XIV) as coach of the Pittsburgh Steelers. Noll started at center and linebacker for the Flyers and graduated from the University in 1953. Gruden played quarterback at Dayton and earned his degree in 1986.



Born August 17, 1963 in Sandusky, Ohio, Gruden attended South Bend Clay High School in Indiana and was a three-year letterman at quarterback at UD and graduated with a degree in Communications. The Flyers had a 24-7 record in Gruden's three varsity seasons there and Gruden was honored with the prestigious Lt. Andy Zulli Memorial Award, given to the senior player who best exemplifies the qualities of sportsmanship and character. Gruden and his wife Cindy, a former University of Tennessee cheerleader, have three sons, Jon II, Michael and Jayson.

Dayton is the fifth school to have two graduates coach their teams to the Super Bowl. The others are: Arkansas (Barry Switzer and Jimmy Johnson), San Jose State (Bill Walsh and Dick Vermeil), Southern Cal (Jeff Fisher and Mike Holmgren) and SMU (Forrest Gregg and Raymond Berry).
