### ROLLER-COASTER SEASON ENDS WITH FOUR-GAME UNBEATEN STREAK

After suffering seven shutouts, head coach Dennis Currier was willing to try anything, even if that meant moving two defenders to the front. It paid off with a four-game unbeaten streak to end an up-and-down 2006 season.

"All season, we had trouble holding the ball up top," said Currier, whose 13-year career record stands at 205-63-18. "Florian (DeCamps) and Simeon (Zaprianov) added an entirely different dimension to our offense. They were able to hold the ball up while releasing pressure off our defense and allowing numbers to get forward."

DeCamps had a hand in the season-ending unbeaten streak with a goal and an assist in the last weekend to earn A-10 Rookie of the Week honors. UD tied Richmond, 2-2, and defeated Charlotte, 4-2, at Baujan Field.

The season-ending unbeaten streak started with a 1-1 tie at George Washington. Atlantic-10 honorable mention selection Ryan Handbury ended UD's seven-game winless streak two days later with a penalty kick in the 35<sup>th</sup> minute at LaSalle.

"I believe the team now fully understands that every A-10 game plays a significant role," said Currier, who notched his 200<sup>th</sup> career in the third game of the season. "When you only play nine of 14 teams, you have very little room for mistakes."

The Flyers started the season with three shutout losses and then four shutout wins. A six-game losing streak preceded the season-ending unbeaten streak. Despite the roller-coaster ride, UD stayed in the A-10 playoff hunt until the final weekend.

The six-game losing streak started with a 1-0 loss to SMU in a tournament at the University of New Mexico. UD outshot the Mustangs, ranked No. 1 for most the season, and posted the most shots and shots on goal of any SMU to that point in the season. SMU, which finished 2006 as the nation's top scoring team, didn't have a shot in the first half and didn't score until the 59<sup>th</sup> minute. UD's Caleb Lindemann hit a post in the 70<sup>th</sup> minute.

"The New Mexico tournament was an excellent experience for a young team. If we are striving to be the best, we have to see how we measure up against the best teams," said Currier, whose UD record is 17-14-6 after two seasons. SMU, which lost to eventual national champion UC-Santa Barbara, was one of six NCAA qualifiers on the Flyers' schedule.

Currier said he expected the team, which had 16 new faces in 2006, to be more productive in goal scoring despite losing more than 90 percent of his offense after the 2005 season to graduation.

"We had a difficult time breaking down defenses and getting in behind," Currier said. "We used six different forwards this season and managed only 11 goals. Our midfield produced nine goals. For our team to experience a high degree of success, we need to score 35 or more (total) goals in a season."

Despite a 6-9-2 overall record, Currier believes the future is bright after the way the team improved and developed throughout the season. He believes the way his team ended the 2006 season will springboard his team with a lot of momentum and energy into 2007.

"By the end of the season, we learned how to compete," Currier said. "The next step for us is to learn how to win. We have a lot of talent. We just have to refine it now."

"Alex Torda, Randy Dennis and Ryan Handbury were standouts in their first year. Handbury and Dennis were an excellent, consistent combination as our two center backs. Torda was our most versatile player and has an incredible work ethic, but his season-ending injury hurt us a bit. Gary Long filled a void for us in the center of the park and was our vocal leader. Ben Murray was solid and showed he can play multiple positions as well."

Among the veteran players, Currier pointed out captain Ian Mulligan, Nick Tarkany, Ryan Hefley and Antti Arst as players who really stepped it up this year.

"I think there were a lot of guys who had to step up because of the youth," Currier said. "In returning players, we only had three players who played significant roles in the past."

With a solid foundation now in place, the Flyers believe they are a step or two away from challenging the best in the Atlantic 10.

"We're looking forward to a tremendous 2007 season," Currier said. "We want to get the team back in the Atlantic 10 Tournament and see how we will do."

Seven former Flyers currently are playing professional soccer. Here is how they did in 2006.

Terry Alvino, Minnesota (USL 1): The midfielder played in 26 games and had four goals and an assist this season.

Denny Clanton, Chicago Storm (MISL): The defender had a goal and four assists in 28 games during the 2005-06 season. The Fire made the MLS playoffs.

Omar Jarun, Atlanta (USL 1): The forward played in 26 games and had a goal this season.

Michael Nsien, Portland (USL 1): The defender played in 18 games this season.

Dasan Robinson, Chicago Fire (MLS): The defender has started 22 games...His first career goal on Aug. 26 gave the Fire a 1-0 win over Colorado...Helped lead the Fire to its fourth U.S. Open Cup title. The Fire currently is in the playoffs against the New England Revolution.

Chris Rolfe, Chicago Fire (MLS): The forward has started 23 games...has seven goals and an assist...he is third on the team in goals...named to the U.S. national team and an alternate to the 2006 U.S. World Cup team....Helped lead the Fire to its fourth U.S. Open Cup title. The Fire made the MLS playoffs.

Mark Schulte, Uruguay: Schulte became the first American to play in Uruguay.

**PROTECTING HOME TURF**

The Flyers are 83-34-9 at Baujan Field since the beginning of the 1992.

**UNITED NATIONS**

Players from Australia, Northern Ireland, England, Bulgaria, Venezuela, France and Estonia were on UD's 2006 roster.

**PEER PRESSURE**

The Atlantic-10 men's soccer coaches picked UD to finished fifth in the conference in 2006. It finished tied for 10th a season after finishing fourth, a game out of first place.

**CHANGE OF SCENERY**

Dayton, which had been a member of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America's Great Lakes Region for quite some time, moved to the Mid-Atlantic Region in 2006. The change was made to better reflect conference lines.



## NICE TO MEET YOU

UD played five opponents — Belmont, IUPUI, Northern Illinois, Northwestern and Tulsa — for the first time in school history in 2006. UD beat Belmont, IUPUI and Tulsa.

## IN THE NICK OF TIME

Goalie Nick Tarkany entered the season second on UD's career goals against average and win percentage lists, and third on the career save percentage list. He finished his career as UD's leader in goals against average (0.94), third in save percentage (.820) and fifth on the winning percentage list (11-6-5, .614). Tarkany also climbed into a fifth-place tie with six career shutouts.

## HONOR ROLL

Ryan Handbury was named to the A-10's honorable mention list. Alex Torda was named A-10 Rookie of the Week (Sept. 4-10) for his first two goals and assist of his career against IUPUI on Sept. 10. Florian DeCamps earned the same honor the last week of the season for his goal against Charlotte (W, 4-2) and assist against Richmond (T, 2-2). Ryan Hefley, Tyler Imbrogno and Handbury made the all-Invite team at the University of New Mexico's TLC Plumbing and Utility Invite. Nick Tarkany, Hefley, Caleb Lindemann and Alex Torda made the all-Dayton Flyer Marriott Classic team. The Flyers won their Dayton Flyer Marriott Classic the weekend of Sept. 8-10 with wins over Western Illinois and IUPUI, both of which had win streaks of three or more games entering that weekend. Hefley was the classic MVP.

## RUNNING THE GAUNTLET

The Flyer faced six teams that made the 2006 NCAA tournament — SMU (L, 1-0), Northern Illinois (L, 2-0), Northwestern (L, 1-0), Rhode Island (L, 2-0), Saint Louis (L, 2-0) and Western Illinois (W, 2-0). SMU was ranked No. 1 in the four national polls for most of the season. It lost to eventual-national champion UC-Santa Barbara in the tournament. UD's regular-season opponents had a 182-138-37 (.562) record in 2006.

## THIS YEAR'S TOUGHEST OPPONENT

Neither UD or Wright State could defeat Mother Nature Sept. 22. The heavens opened up shortly before halftime. Game officials and coaches decided after 75 minutes of heavy rain and lightning to cancel the game. None of the stats count from the game. UD's Oct. 27 match with Richmond (T, 2-2) was postponed to Oct. 28 because of heavy rain and poor field conditions.

## TO BE THE MAN, YOU HAVE TO BEAT THE MAN

UD almost did exactly that in a 1-0 loss on Sept. 17 to SMU, which entered that game ranked No. 1 in all four national soccer polls. Coming out of that weekend, which included a 1-1 tie to New Mexico, SMU dropped to No.3 in three polls and to No. 2 in the other. SMU returned to the top spot in all four national soccer polls a week later and was there for the rest of the season. Dayton held SMU, which finished 2006 with the nation's top scoring offense, without a shot on goal in the first half and posted the most shots of any SMU opponent at that time. The Flyers held 18-14 and 5-2 advantages in shots and shots on goal, respectively. At the time, it was just the third time this season SMU had that few shots on a goal in a game. Before the UD-SMU game, SMU averaged 17.5 shots and eight shots on goal per outing while holding opponents to an average of 8.6 shots and three shots on goal. Randy Dennis drew the assignment of marking the Mustangs' leading shot-taker and leading points producer. Dennis performed admirably while holding Adrian Chevannes and Paula da Silva to a combined three shots, none of which were on goal.

## HOT SHOTS

Freshmen or sophomores took 61 of the team's 92 shots on goal this season and scored 14 of UD's 22 goals.

## SPURTABILITY

Caleb Lindemann scored two goals within 14 minutes against Belmont (W, 3-0) in the fourth game of the season. He had two goals all of the 2005 season. Those came in a span of 1:39. Alex Torda notched the first two goals and an assist of his career against IUPUI (W, 4-0) on Sept. 10. Torda's performance earned him Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week honors for the week of Sept. 4-10. Tyler Imbrogno had a foot in all three goals in a shutout win against Tulsa on Sept. 15. Imbrogno had a goal and two assists, which helped him to a spot on the all-tournament team along with Ryan Hefley and Ryan Handbury at New Mexico's TLC Plumbing and Utility Invite. Antti Arst had a Senior Day to remember with a goal and assist against Charlotte (W, 4-2).

## GIBBENS HIMSELF FOR THE GOOD OF THE TEAM

Goalie Zac Gibbens was pressed into service minutes before the Tulsa game (W, 3-0) when starter Nick Tarkany went down with an injury. He saved all three of Tulsa's shots on goal. Two days later, he had to face SMU, the nation's top team for much of the season. Gibbens saved one shot on goal and helped keep his team in a tightly-contested 1-0 loss. Earlier in the season, he combined with Tarkany to pitch a 3-0 shutout against Belmont. Gibbens faced Northwestern, a 2006 NCAA tournament participant, and saved seven of eight shots on goal in a 1-0 loss.

## FRENCH CONNECTION

Florian DeCamps earned his first career start at Xavier, in the ninth game of the season, and wasted no time getting into the action with two shots. By the 12th game of the season, he was a permanent fixture in the lineup. He moved from his customary spot in the backfield to the front, and finished with two goals and an assist to tie Alex Torda with team-high scoring honors among first-year Flyers.

## I TORDA YOU SO IUPUI

Alex Torda tied Florian DeCamps for team-high scoring honors among first-year players. He tallied his season-total for points with two goals and an assist in a 4-0 win against IUPUI.

## HAND IT TO HANDBURY

Ryan Handbury's penalty kick in the 35th minute at LaSalle gave the Flyers a 1-0 win and ended UD's seven-game winless streak. Handbury, who is not used to scoring, because he is a defender, also notched an assist in a 4-0 win versus IUPUI.

## IRON MEN

Ryan Handbury, Ian Mulligan and Randy Dennis were the only Flyers to start all 17 games in 2006. Two others — Antti Arst and Aaron Swanson — played in all 17 games.

## HELPING HANDS...OR FEET

In UD's 2-0 win against NCAA tournament participant Western Illinois, Caleb Lindemann assisted on Aaron Swanson's goal in the 33rd minute. Six minutes later, Swanson returned the favor by assisting on Lindemann's goal. Eleven Flyers in all assisted on goals in 2006. Antti Arst led the team with three.

## BEN THERE, DONE THAT

Ben Murray was among the Flyers in a scoring mood in a 4-0 win over IUPUI, as he scored a goal and notched an assist. He assisted on another goal, a game later, in a 3-0 victory over Tulsa.
