### UD TAKES TO ROAD FOR BADGERS' INVITATIONAL

UD takes to the road for the first time this season, playing in Wisconsin's Middleton Sports & Fitness Invitational this weekend. The Flyers take on Milwaukee in the first game of the tournament on Friday, Sept. 5 at 6 p.m. ET. Dayton will battle the host Badgers on Sunday, Sept. 7 at 3:30 p.m. ET.

### SERIES INFORMATION

• The Flyers hope to even the series against the Panthers, their all-time mark against Milwaukee standing at 2-3-1. The last meeting was Sept. 3, 2004, a double overtime tie. The Flyers are 33-29-5 all-time against Horizon League opponents.

• Dayton has only bested the Badgers once and is 1-3 all-time against Wisconsin. The last meeting was Sept. 5, 2004 when UW dispatched UD, 4-1. The lone Flyer win against Wisconsin was a 3-2 victory on Sept. 21, 2003 at Baujan Field. Dayton is 23-42-6 all-time against Big Ten opponents.

### SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS

• Milwaukee (0-2) returns six starters and 10 letterwinners from last year's squad that went 5-1-2-3. Nine newcomers made appearances for the Panthers this weekend in the Drake Classic in Des Moines, Iowa. The Panthers fell, 2-0, to host Drake in the opener on Saturday and battled Missouri State to a 1-1 tie Sunday. Freshman Bartzis and sophomore Greg Rosenthal were named to the all-tournament team.

• The Badgers return 16 letterwinners from a squad that went 6-7-6 in 2007. Wisconsin (2-0) and Dayton (2-0) are the only undefeated teams competing in the Middleton Sports & Fitness Invitational. The Badgers used double overtime to defeat Wright State, 2-1, and beat Denver in regulation, 2-1, at the Dayton Flyer Marriott Invitational. The Badgers finished as tournament runners-up on the basis of goal differential, with the Flyers taking the title by outscoring their opponents 4-1. UW junior goalkeeper Alex Horwath and junior midfielders Pablo Delgado and Taylor Waspi were named to the all-tournament team.

### LAST WEEK RECAPPED

UD won the Dayton Flyer Marriott Invitational championship at Baujan Field with a 3-1 victory over Denver and a 1-0 win against Wright State. Freshman Jack Pearson scored the game-winner over the Raiders in the 13th minute of the first half, his first collegiate goal. The lone goal provided all the offense UD would need to claim the Invitational title. UD evened up its series with its local rival Wright State (16-16-3) with the win. The Flyer defense and junior goalkeeper Alex Davis, who notched four saves against WSU, gave up just one goal in the 180 minutes of the tournament. Junior Zach Weiss was named the Dayton Flyer Marriott Invitational MVP. He played central midfielder for the entire 180 minutes, scored the game winner against Denver and also had an assist against the Pioneers. UD had four players named to the all-tournament team: senior Florian DeCamps, juniors Alex Torda and Zach Weiss and freshman Jack Pearson.

# HEAD COACH DENNIS CURRIER



With a 27-18-10 record at Dayton over the previous three seasons, Dennis Currier has continued the Flyers' success on-and-off the field based on the principals of dedication, a commitment to excellence, discipline and open communication with his players.

Four former Flyers under Currier's reign have played professionally in North America and Europe. Dasan Robinson, who was drafted and signed with the Chicago Fire of the MLS, also was invited to the U.S. National Team tryouts in January.

Other Flyers in the professional ranks include Omar Jarun who was drafted by the USL's Atlanta Silverbacks, Terry Alvino, who earned a starting role for the USL's

Minnesota Thunder, and Lubo Bogdanov who signed with Cheml in the first division of the Czech Republic.

Currier helped Dayton finish the 2007 season 10-4-5 overall and advanced to the opening round of the 2007 Atlantic 10 Men's Soccer Championship. Using an old-fashioned method of hard-work, team play and good defense, the Flyers finished the season on a six-game unbeaten streak, had two players selected to the All-Atlantic 10 and NSCAA/adidas® Middle Atlantic Region teams and finished No. 8 in the regional rankings.

As a team the Flyers have enjoyed home field dominance under Currier's direction. UD went 7-0-2 at Baujan Field and has played well over a two-year span going 8-0-4 in its last 12 home games dating back to 2006.

In his first year as UD's coach, Currier led the Flyers to an 11-5-4 overall record in 2005, finishing tied for second in the Atlantic 10. Currier, named UD's head coach on January

24, 2005, opened the 2005 season with a 2-1 exhibition win over No. 18 Ohio State. The Flyers also won their season opener, 3-2, at Cincinnati and won both games of their home tournament, the Dayton Marriott Flyer Classic. Currier charged his team with continuing the Flyers' excellence at its home facility and the team responded with a 6-1-1 record at Baujan Field in 2005. He guided the Flyers to a six-game unbeaten streak in conference play, enabling UD to grab a tie for second in the conference. UD then rolled over Charlotte in the quarterfinals of the Atlantic 10 Championship, 3-1, before a 1-1 draw with Saint Louis that saw the Flyers eliminated on penalty kicks, 5-4. Four of Currier's Flyers earned All-Conference honors in the Atlantic 10 in 2005.

As head coach of Incarnate Word for four seasons, Currier's squads racked up a record of 62-15-7. His first team at UIW in 2001 was 12-8-1, and won the first of four straight conference championships. In 2002, Currier guided the team to a 16-1-3 record, a No. 12 national ranking and the school's first NCAA tournament bid.

Currier has coached eight NSCAA All-Americans, two NSCAA Scholar All-Americans, three conference Players of the Year and recruited three players who went on to be named conference Freshmen of the Year.

Before his stop at Incarnate Word, Currier coached for seven seasons at Harris-Stowe State College in Saint Louis, Mo., where he amassed a 126-34-5 record. Harris-Stowe was ranked nationally from 1996 to 2000, and advanced as far as the 2000 NAIA national semifinals. While at Harris-Stowe, Currier was named Regional Coach of the Year three times. During his 15-year career, Currier's coaching record stands at 215-67-23.

Off the field, Currier and the Flyers mentor students in elementary school, give free soccer lessons and visit patients at children's hospitals.

Currier is a 1992 graduate of the University of Southern Mississippi. He and his wife Tonya are the parents of two daughters: Sydney and Morgan Elizabeth.

## GETTING NOTICED

After its hot start, the Flyers received recognition in the latest NSCAA/adidas® National NCAA Rankings. The Flyers (2-0) knocked off Denver, 3-1, and Wright State, 1-0, to win the Dayton Marriott Invitational. They were rewarded with a vote in the national rankings. The Flyers are also currently ranked No. 5 in the Middle Atlantic NSCAA/adidas® Regional Rankings. Charlotte is currently at the top of the regional rankings, followed by Saint Louis, Holy Cross and Lehigh.

The Flyers will play in their third regular season tournament when they travel to North Carolina for the UNCW Courtyard by Marriott Classic. UD takes on UNC-Wilmington on Friday, Sept. 12 at 7:30 p.m. ET. Dayton plays Coastal Carolina on Sunday, Sept. 14 at 1 p.m. ET.

## FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

Freshman Jack Pearson scored his first collegiate goal, the game-winner in UD's 1-0 win over Wright State (Aug. 31)

to claim the Dayton Flyer Marriott Invitational. Junior Zach Weiss, named MVP of the Invitational, also scored his first collegiate goal, the game-winner in Dayton's 3-1 victory over Denver (Aug. 29).

## CINCINNATI REUNION

UD sophomore Josh Albers and freshman Michael Deyhle were members of the Cincinnati United Premier Club, along with Badger freshman Austin Spohn of Cincinnati. They were crowned the Tampa Bay Sun Bowl ('04) and Disney Showcase ('06) champions. The trio also contributed to back-to-back Ohio South State Cup Championships (2005-2006).

## WISCONSIN HOMECOMING

Three Flyers hail from Wisconsin; freshman defender Alex Frenz of Whitefish Bay, freshman goalkeeper Patrick Hardt of Greendale, and freshman Mario Falsetti of Elm Grove. The three live in the suburbs of Milwaukee, a little over an hour from Madison, Wisc.

## SEASON OPENER STATS

The Flyers are off to a 2-0 start for the second consecutive season. UD has started its season with a 2-0 mark or better in seven seasons, two of those under current Head Coach Dennis Currier. Currier is 3-1 in season openers at UD. The Flyers are now 23-24-6 all-time in their season openers after downing Denver, 3-1, in their first game of 2008.

## 400 – PREPARE FOR GLORY

The Flyers are on the cusp of reaching 400 victories in the history of the program. Dayton currently has 387 wins since the program began in 1956.

## TOURNEY TYRANNY

The Flyers will play in four tournaments during the regular season in 2008, including the Dayton Flyer Marriott Invitational UD won on Aug. 29 & 31. Dayton plays in Wisconsin's Middleton Sports & Fitness Invitational this weekend on Sept. 5 & 7. The Flyers follow that with the UNCW Courtyard by Marriott Classic on Sept. 12 & 14 where they will play UNC-Wilmington and Coastal Carolina. UD wraps up the regular season tourneys with the Dayton Flyer Courtyard by Marriott Tournament on Sept. 19 & 21. The Flyers will host Butler, Marshall and Robert Morris.

## EARLY SCORING FRENZY

The Flyers have accounted for 10 goals in their first three games of 2008, including their two exhibition wins. UD took out Kentucky, 3-2, as senior Simeon Zapryanov blasted the game-winner from 35 yards out with less than three minutes to play in regulation. Senior Florian DeCamps and freshman Luke Baker each notched a goal in the exhibition opener as well. Freshman Lucas Young scored two goals, while DeCamps and junior Ryan Hartman each put away a score in the Flyers 4-1 win over Central Arkansas. Juniors Alex Torda and Zach Weiss, along with senior Florian DeCamps, each scored a goal against Denver.

## FIFTH DIMENSION

Dayton was selected to finish fifth in the Atlantic 10 in a preseason poll of the league's head coaches conducted by the A-10. Last season UD posted a 10-4-5 record and advanced to the conference tournament as the sixth and final seed, and was knocked out in the quarter-finals on penalty kicks against Final Four participant UMass, the only draw of the regular and postseason for the Minutemen. The six-team A-10 Men's Soccer Championship will be held Nov. 13-16 at Rooney Field on the campus of Duquesne University.

## TORDA NAMED TO HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

Junior men's soccer player Alex Torda made Dayton history. The talented midfielder was named to the Missouri Athletic Club's 2008 Hermann Trophy Watch List. He is the first-ever Flyer athlete to earn a spot on the prestigious list which is comprised of 48 of the best men's Division I intercollegiate soccer players. Considered the highest individual honor in intercollegiate soccer, the recipient of the MAC's Hermann Trophy is selected by Division I head coaches who are current members of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA). A list of 15 semifinalists is selected by a coaches committee in November, with three finalists announced in early December.

## DAYTON'S SOCCER HISTORY

This is the 52nd season of Dayton Flyers men's soccer. UD showcases an all-time record of 387-348-58 (.524). The Flyers have had a winning record in nine of the last 11 seasons. UD also advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 1997 and 1998. Head coach Dennis Currier ranks sixth on the Flyers' all-time list in coaching victories at 29, just four behind Jerry Butcher. There have been 793 Flyer men's soccer games in its 51-year history. No. 800 will be held at Baujan Field when UD hosts SIU-Edwardsville on Sept. 26.

## GWG-JOE

Senior Joe Olwig has scored four game-winning goals in his career, tying him for 10th all-time in UD's record book.

## YI JOINS UD MEN'S SOCCER STAFF

Alex Yi joined the University of Dayton men's soccer program as an assistant coach for the 2008 season. Yi will work primarily with the Flyer defense. A former standout at UCLA with international playing experience, Yi retired from the Major League Soccer's FC Dallas in April of 2008. Prior to that he played for Royal Antwerp of the Belgian Jupiler League, a feeder club of Manchester United. Yi played for the U-17, U-20, and U-23 United States youth national teams, and started all five games in the 1999 Football World Youth Championship where the U.S. finished fourth in New Zealand. He was part of the inaugural class of the USSF's Bradenton Academy, along with other players such as Landon Donovan, DaMarcus Beasley, and Oguchi Onyewu. Upon graduating from the Bradenton Academy, he attended UCLA, where he became a highly-decorated soccer player in 2000 and 2001, starting in 41 games. Yi was named the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and also earned second team All-Pac-10 honors. He was named a third team NSCAA All-American as a sophomore, as well as the PAC-10 Player of the Year and was a nominee for the Hermann Trophy.

## TOAST OF TEXAS

There are four players from the Lone Star State on UD's

roster. Juniors Randy Dennis (San Angelo), Sonny Renner (Keller) and Alex Torda (Dallas), along with freshman Jonny Phipps (Plano), all hail from Texas.

## THREE OF A KIND

In his Dayton coaching career Dayton, Dennis Currier's teams are 13-0-0 when scoring three or more goals, including the Flyers' 3-1 victory on Aug. 29 against Denver in the first round of the Dayton Flyer Marriott Invitational.

## MASTERS OF THEIR DOMAIN

Since 1992 the Flyers have excelled at Baujan Field with a 92-34-11 record, good for a .743 winning percentage. Last season UD went 7-0-2 at home. Since becoming the exclusive home to UD soccer, Baujan Field has grown into one of the top soccer venues in the Atlantic 10 Conference. Dayton twice has played NCAA Play-In games at the historic venue – 1997 and 1998.

## GREAT GRAD RATES

The University of Dayton had nine sport programs record a perfect 100 percent Graduation Success Rate in the latest GSR Report released by the NCAA. Success in the classroom is nothing new for UD student-athletes. The Flyers combined cumulative grade point average is above a 3.0. In addition, UD has had 27 Academic All-Americans in the previous six years. Dayton continued its long tradition of success in the classroom by placing 99 student-athletes on the Atlantic 10 Commissioner's Honor Roll for the Spring 2008 semester.

### SPRING INTO ACTION

The Flyers concluded the 2008 spring season with a 1-1 tie over the Akron Zips, who are currently ranked 5th in the NSCAA/adidas pre-season national poll, and a 1-0 victory against Ohio Wesleyan. UD finished the spring season 4-1-3 overall.

### FIT TO BE TIED

The Flyers finished 2007 with five ties, the most in school history. The previous high was four draws when the Dennis Currier's Flyers were 11-5-4 in 2005 and also in 1990 when UD went 11-7-4. The Flyers finished the 2007 season on a six-game unbeaten streak. Currier has 11 ties in his three-year career at UD, the most of any Flyer coach.

### ALEXANDER THE GREAT

Junior Alex Torda was named to the 2008 Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference team. Named UD's Most Valuable Player in 2007, Torda scored six goals and had five assists, tallying 17 points as a midfielder during his sophomore season with those efforts earning him First Team All-Atlantic 10 honors. Torda also garnered a First Team selection on the 2007 NSCAA/adidas Division I All-Region, Mid-Atlantic Team and was named First Team, All-Ohio by the Ohio Collegiate Soccer Coaches. Torda is making the climb up UD's record books and currently ranks 15th with .706 points per game.

### RAVE ROOKIE REVIEW

Sophomore Josh Albers was the only Flyer to earn the A-10 Rookie of the Week award in '07. The Cincinnati native led all freshmen Flyers in scoring and tied for fourth on the team in goals scored.

### DOWN-RIGHT DEFENSIVE

Juniors Randy Dennis, Ryan Handbury and Sonny Renner return after starting every game on the back line in 2007 and helping UD to six shutouts on the season. At one point in the season, the Flyers did not allow a goal in 282:25 consecutive minutes of play.

### INTERNATIONAL HOUSE OF FLYERS

UD has an international flavor on the 2008 roster with seven players from overseas. The European players include graduate student Daniel March, junior Ryan Handbury and freshmen Luke Baker and Jack Pearson, who all hail from the United Kingdom. Senior Simeon Zapryanov is from Bulgaria and fellow senior Florian DeCamps from France. Junior Isaac Kissi is from Ghana.
