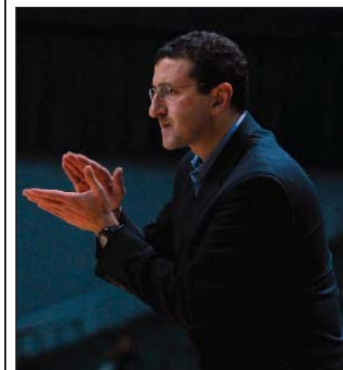

JIM JABIR



Jim Jabir was tabbed as the 2007-2008 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year in his fifth season with the Flyers. He has led Dayton to the third best turnaround in the nation to this point of the season with an improvement of 12 games from last season. UD enters the WNIT with a modern program record 25 victories and earlier this season earned its first-ever votes in the AP Top 25 Poll.

FLYER FACTS...

The University of Dayton women's basketball team will make its second ever trip to the postseason as it has been selected to take part in the Women's National Invitation Tournament. Dayton will travel to Bowling Green on Thursday. Game time for the matchup between the Flyers and Falcons has been set for 7 p.m. ET on Thursday.

Dayton was an at-large selection and will face Bowling Green which had an automatic berth after winning the MAC Regular Season Championship. The winner of the Dayton/Bowling Green game will travel to Michigan State to face the Spartans in the WNIT Second Round on Saturday at 2 p.m. ET.

UD's only other trip to the postseason as a Division I program came in 2000 when Dayton hosted Florida in a WNIT First Round matchup. The Flyers lost to the Gators, 97-93.

"This is a testament to our coaches and players commitment to building a winning program here at UD," Head Coach Jim Jabir said. "Rewarding this team with postseason play is a positive step in the growth of Dayton women's basketball."

Dayton is in the midst of its best season in modern history with a program record 25 victories. The Flyers were tied for fourth in the Atlantic 10 standings and advanced to the A-10 Semifinals for only the second time ever under the direction of 2007-2008 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year Jim Jabir. UD earned its first ever votes in the AP Top 25 Poll this season and won 16 consecutive games at one point, which was the longest winning streak in school history.

The Flyers are led by a group of seven seniors including A-10 Second Team selection Nikki Oakland. Oakland also earned A-10 All-Championship Team honors after becoming the 17th player in UD history to join the 1,000 Point Club during the Flyers' run to the A-10 Semifinals.

2007-2008 ATLANTIC 10 COACH OF THE YEAR

**Fifth Season at UD (69-80, .463) • A-10 Conference Record (30-46, .395)
20th Season Overall (288-304, .487)**

Hard-working. Compassionate. Dedicated. These are just a few words that come to mind when talking with Jim Jabir. On April 8, 2003, the University of Dayton introduced Jabir as the women's basketball team's eighth head coach and first male head coach in the history of the program.

Jabir was named the 2007-2008 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year after mentoring the Flyers to a modern-program record 23-7 regular season ledger including an 11-5 mark in games decided by 10 points or less. Dayton will be the fifth seed in this weekend's Atlantic 10 Championship after being picked eighth in the conference's preseason coaches poll. UD has improved by 11.5 victories over last season on the strength of a school-record 16-game winning streak that was the longest in the nation at one point. The Flyers earned their first ever votes in the AP Top 25 Poll this season as they were listed in two different weeks. The honor is the third Coach of the Year award for Jabir in his 20 seasons as a collegiate head coach and his first at Dayton.

The Flyers have been one of the most improved teams in the nation under the direction of Jabir. UD is in the midst of the third best improvement nationally from 2006-07 until now and had the fourth best single-season turnaround in the nation in the 2004-05 season with an improvement of nine wins over the previous campaign. Jabir and Dayton continued the trend in 2005-06 with an improvement of five more wins, giving UD the second best improvement over a two-year span in the nation.

"I am going to be the hardest working coach out there," states Jabir. "I want people to fear playing the University of Dayton."

The 2005-06 season also saw two different Flyers earn Atlantic 10 All-Conference accolades as UD advanced finished sixth in a conference that sent five teams to postseason play. Dayton also advanced to the Quarterfinals of the A-10 Tournament and finished with a winning record for the first time in five years.

UD returned to the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals at the conclusion of the 2006-07 season marking the third time in school history that the Flyers had advanced past their opening round in the Atlantic 10 Tournament. Dayton played close games throughout the 2006-07 campaign as 15 of its 31 games were decided by single digits despite having just one senior in the starting lineup.

Jabir came to UD after spending one season as an assistant at Colorado. In his last season at CU, the Buffaloes (24-8) advanced to the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Tournament and were ranked as high as 23rd in the ESPN/Coaches' Poll and 24th in the Associated Press Poll. Jabir was primarily responsible for the development of CU's post players, including the Buffaloes' first-ever First Team All-Big 12 selection.

Jabir had been a head coach for 16 seasons prior to coaching at CU with an all-time career mark of 220-223. His broad coaching experience ranges from the Big East Conference to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.

The Brooklyn, NY native began his coaching career as an assistant at Nazareth College (1984-85) and at Buffalo State (1985-86). Jabir was instrumental in leading the Bengals to a 23-3 slate, the SUNYAC title, a 22-game winning streak, an NCAA regional tournament appearance and a national ranking (No. 3) during the 1985-86 season.

After one season as an assistant, Jabir became the head coach at Buffalo State during the 1986-87 season at the age of 24. He led that team to a 14-11 record and guided the Bengals to the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) championship and an appearance in the Division III Tournament.

Jabir matriculated to Siena College from Buffalo State, where he served as the head coach of the Saints for three seasons (1987-90) and compiled a 50-29 record. Jabir's teams posted three consecutive winning seasons. In his first season, Jabir was responsible for the development of Siena's first-ever Freshman All-American.

After his stint at Siena, Jabir spent six years at Marquette University becoming one of the most successful coaches in the history of the program, elevating the Golden Eagles into the national spotlight. After posting a 7-20 record during his inaugural year (1990-91) at Marquette, Jabir guided his team to four consecutive winning seasons, two 20-plus winning seasons and three post-season appearances, including back-to-back bids to the NCAA Tournament. In 1994-95, Marquette won the Great Midwest Conference Tournament, the first tournament championship in school history. This followed the 1993-94 campaign in which Jabir compiled a program-best 22-7 overall record and its first trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Before his stint at Colorado, Jabir was at the helm of Providence College for six seasons, 1996-2002. During his last three years, the Friars' record improved with each season and in his final season, the Friars finished 13-15 overall and eighth of 14 schools in the prestigious Big East, its highest finish ever since the Big East went to a one division format.

Jabir was a two-time Reebok/Great Midwest Conference Coach of the Year while at Marquette. Jabir is a 1984 graduate of Nazareth College in Rochester, New York, where he received a degree in English. He also earned his Masters degree in Student Personnel Administration from Buffalo State in 1986. Jabir and his wife Kathy have three children, Lauren, Shane and Jackson.

DAYTON IN THE WNIT

The Flyers are making just their second ever postseason appearance in their modern (Division I) history. UD also played in the WNIT in 2000 and lost in the First Round to Florida on March 15, 2000 at UD Arena (97-93).

UD VERSUS BGSU

Dayton has a 10-12 record all-time against Bowling Green but the two teams have not met since Dec. 12, 1992 when the Falcons beat the Flyers, 94-68, at UD Arena.

UP NEXT FOR THE FLYERS

The winner of the Dayton/Bowling Green WNIT First Round matchup will travel to East Lansing, MI to face Michigan State on Saturday in a 2 p.m. ET Second Round game. UD is 2-5 all-time against MSU, but the Flyers won the last meeting between the two schools on Dec. 17, 2000 at UD Arena (61-57).

JABIR HEADLINES A-10 AWARD WINNERS FROM UD

After leading Dayton to the third biggest improvement in the nation over the regular season, Flyer Head Coach Jim Jabir was tabbed as the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year. Three other Flyers were also honored as Nikki Oakland was a Second Team All-Conference selection, Kristin Daugherty was an All-Rookie Team pick and Karah Cloxton was named to the Academic All-Conference Team.

DAYTON ONE OF NATION'S BEST TURNAROUNDS

The Flyers are once again one of the most improved teams in the nation this season. They currently own the third best turnaround in the nation from last season with an improvement of 12 victories from the 2006-2007 season until now. Jim Jabir credits a senior class that has helped the team improve from 3-25 the season before they arrived to a school-record 23-7 overall record this season:

"I think that watching them develop starting with them as freshman and seeing them all the way through is one of the reasons why I coach. It's really gratifying seeing people grow up and change. I think they have had a change in me too. We've had a very honest and open relationship for all four years. When I got here marquee players didn't want anything to do with us. We had no tradition and nothing to sell. They came here and they weren't highly recruited kids but they had a morale character, they were good kids from good families and they believed strongly in what we were trying to do. They gave me a chance and I gave them a chance and together it's turned into something special."

"I'm very very proud of the growth they've had and I think more than anything this season is an example of what kids that come together can do and who work really hard and really truly believe in developing a culture and leaving a legacy. The things we talk about all the time with them are culture and legacy and they and their family should be very proud of what they have accomplished."

GREAT YEAR TO BE A FLYER

The University of Dayton is in the midst of its best ever year in its athletics history. UD's four "ball sports" from the fall (football, volleyball, men's & women's soccer) and its two basketball teams have combined to win 78.72 percent of their games this season. The next best mark in school history came in 2002 when the same group won 69.15 percent of their games through the same time span.

FLYERS EARN NATIONAL ATTENTION

UD picked up its first ever votes in the AP Top 25 Poll on Dec. 24. Dayton also earned one vote in the Jan. 7 AP Top 25 Poll and three votes in the Jan. 14 AP Poll. The Flyers' 16-game winning streak, which ended on Jan. 19, was tied for the longest in the nation with #1/1 UConn and was the longest-ever in program history.

EXPERIENCE PAYS OFF IN 2007-2008

Dayton boasts one of the most experienced rosters in the Atlantic 10 Conference with seven seniors overall including six that have played at least 100 collegiate games in their careers. Ashley Armstrong and Kiki Lund are scheduled to play in their 120th game against BGSU, which is the ninth most all-time in Flyer history. Brittany Holterman will play in 119th career game on Thursday followed by Nikki Oakland (117th) and Karah Cloxton (110th) in Red and Blue. Also, Kathy Guin will make her 117th collegiate appearance following stints at Texas-Pan American and NE Oklahoma A&M before coming to Dayton before the start of the 2006-2007 season.

Jabir on the Senior Class: "I'm going to miss all eight seniors because they're great people. Our program is what it is today because of what they have done for us. It's going to be hard to replicate that and to move on from there but nothing that happens in the future could happen without what they laid as the foundation."

FLYERS RACK UP THE WINS

Dayton took just 15 games to surpass its win total from all of last season (12) due to a school-record tying 13-game winning streak (which finished at 15 straight wins). The Flyers had 14 wins before New Year's Day, which is the most ever in school history. The next best start in school history was in 1983-1984, when UD had 10 wins before Jan. 1 while racking up a school-record 12 consecutive victories to start the season. On Feb. 9 Dayton racked up its 19th win of the year versus Fordham marking a new modern (Division I) school-record for wins in a season.

ATTENTION FROM THE FLYER FAITHFUL

An average of 1,604 fans per game saw the Flyers play in their 13 home games at UD Arena in 2005-06. During the 2004-05 season, Dayton drew 1,240 fans per game to UD Arena which was a Regional host of the 2007 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship and will host again in 2010. This season, the Flyers averaged 1,745 fans per game including a single-game season-high of 2,325 versus Rhode Island on Feb. 17. UD also drew 2,288 for the A-10 opener against Temple on Jan. 12.

CLOSE CALLS THE NORM FOR DAYTON

UD holds a 25-8 record this season, but the five of the Flyers' losses came by single digits this season while 11 of their victories have come by 10 points or less including one-point wins against Wisconsin-Milwaukee, San Diego and Xavier as well as two-point road victories at Eastern Michigan, La Salle and Saint Joseph's. Last season, the Flyers had 15 of their 31 games decided by single digits and Dayton was 4-11 in those games. UD had a seven-game losing streak in which each game was decided by eight points or less. The average margin in each game of the streak was just 3.7 ppg including one-point defeats at UT-Martin and Wright State.

THE EUROPEAN INFLUENCE

The freelance style of Dayton's offense comes from a theory of attacking the defense with momentum and fluidity. UD Head Coach Jim Jabir got the idea for the new offense from former Marquette men's basketball player Tony Miller. Miller (point guard from 1991-95) and Jabir (coach from 1990-96) were both at Marquette and have kept in touch while Miller has been playing in Europe for several years. Miller came to Dayton and taught Jabir and his staff the new system before the Flyers' 10-day trip to Europe during summer 2005.

AN UP TEMPO ATTACK

With 13 active players on its roster, Dayton plays an up tempo style that pushes the ball up the court and challenges opposing defenses to keep up the pace. The Flyers rank third in the A-10 with an average of 66.3 ppg this season, which also ranks 108th nationally. UD scored just 65.3 ppg (7th in A-10) last season and 64.4 ppg (4th in A-10) in 2005-2006. Dayton has connected on 806-of-1929 (.418) shots from the field this season (third in A-10, 85th nationally).

FLYERS PILING UP THE POINTS

After scoring at least 80 points just once during the first two years (2003-2005) of Jim Jabir's tenure at Dayton, the Flyers have nearly broken the century mark in each of the past two seasons. UD scored 95 points on Jan. 8, 2005 in a win over Saint Louis (95-73) and put up 96 points in a victory over Memphis on the opening weekend of the 2006-2007 season. The 96 points scored on Nov. 11, 2006 was the most for the Flyers during a non-overtime game in 20 years. It also tied for the most by an A-10 team last season. Dayton has scored 80 points or more seven times this season and is 7-0 in those games.

DAYTON DISHING OUT THE ASSISTS

Dayton ranks second in the A-10 and 40th nationally with 15.27 assists per game this season including 10 games with at least 20 assists as a team. The Flyers recorded a season-high of 23 against both Akron and St. Francis (PA), 21 at #16/13 George Washington, Richmond and Saint Louis, as well as 20 each versus Western Michigan, Cincinnati, Cornell, Central Michigan and Saint Joseph's. UD has been efficient this season with 504 assists on 806 made shots (.625) from the field overall including an season-best 84 percent rate with 21 assists on 25 made shots against #16/13 George Washington's "blizzard" defense. Dayton also posted 20 assists on 24 made baskets (.833) in a win over Saint Joseph's, 18 assists on 24 baskets (.750) in the win over Indiana and 23 assists on 29 baskets (.793) in the victory over St. Francis (PA). The Flyers ranked second in the A-10 and 34th nationally in 2005-2006 with 16.0 apg and were fourth in the A-10 with 14.3 apg last season.

IN RANGE FROM LONG RANGE

Dayton has connected on 182-of-544 (.335) shots from three-point range this season after making 148-of-544 (.272) shots from three-point range last season to rank sixth in the Atlantic 10 Conference in three-point field goals made. This season, UD ranks 4th in the A-10 and 108th nationally in three-pointers per game (5.52) and 6th in the conference and 89th in the nation in three-point field goal percentage (.335). Dayton's 182 made three-point shots this season are the most ever in program single-season history.

SETTING THE STANDARD

Dayton has hit at least one three point shot in 220 consecutive games dating back to Jan. 2, 2001, which leads the Atlantic 10 Conference.

LONG DISTANCE DEDICATION

The Flyers have taken just over one out-of-every four shots from behind the arc this season. UD has attempted 544-of-1929 (.282) field goals from downtown in 2007-2008 after putting up 544-of-1882 (.289) shots last season from three-point range. That persistence led to a UD single-game record of 12 three-point shots made at Dartmouth on Dec. 30, 2006. The Flyers also made 11 treys in the A-10 Quarterfinal victory over Charlotte on March 8. Dayton made the third most treys in a single-season as a team (148) and attempted the second most three-point shots (544) last season. UD finished with its third worst shooting performance from beyond the arc last season (.272).

THREE BEATS TWO FOR UD

Dayton hit 11-of-21 (.524) from three-point range in a 77-53 victory over Charlotte in the A-10 Quarterfinals. In fact, the Flyers shot better from long range (.524) than it did from inside the arc as it made 11-of-31 (.355) shots from two-point range. UD also hit 10-of-20 (.500) shots from three-point range and 16-of-34 from two-point range in a one-point win at San Diego earlier this season. Dayton made six or more three-point shots on 12 occasions last season and UD had a 5-7 record in those games. So far in 2007-2008, the Flyers have made six or more treys 14 times with 11-3 record in those contests.

FREE THROW FRENZY

The Flyers have shown dramatic improvement in their free throw shooting during the 2007-2008 season. UD has made 393-of-565 (.696) shots from the free throw stripe this season, which is ninth best in the Atlantic 10 Conference and ranks 147th in the nation. Dayton was 22-of-27 from the charity stripe on Saturday against Charlotte. UD was 13-for-15 from the line in a comeback attempt at New Mexico on Nov. 10 and 9-for-12 in a 45-43 victory at La Salle on Jan. 16. The Flyers also made 22-of-30 free throws at Duquesne on Jan. 19. The upswing for the Flyers began during A-10 play last season when UD made 159-of-214 (.743) free throws, which was sixth best in the A-10.

WALKING THE LINE

Dayton has been at its best from the free-throw stripe in the closing minutes of games this season. UD has shot 103-of-147 (.701) from the line in the final five minutes of regulation and overtime this season, which is an improvement from its 70.0 percent shooting overall. Karah Cloxton went 4-for-4 in the final minute of play to give the Flyers a one-point win at UW-Milwaukee. Classmate Brittany Holterman was sent to the stripe with 10.8 seconds left and Flyers down by one at San Diego. The senior drilled both shots to give Dayton the win on the road. Also, Nikki Oakland went to the line with 3.3 seconds left in a tied game and hit both shots to push UD past La Salle for another road victory. Dayton was 3-for-6 in the final five minutes of play in its win over UMass on Mar. 7.

CONTROLLING THE ROCK

UD's fast paced offense has not come without a focus on valuing the basketball. Dayton holds a 1.03 assist-to-turnover ratio as a team this season which is second in the conference and ranks 21st nationally. Senior guard Karah Cloxton ranks second in the A-10 and ranks 7th in the nation with an assist-to-turnover ratio of +2.13. The Flyers are also fourth in the Atlantic 10 with a +0.76 turnover margin per game. At the end of the 2005-06 regular season, Dayton had the third fewest turnovers per game (19.0) in the program's history for a single-season. The Flyers are averaging just 14.88 turnovers per game this season, which is the best ever mark in UD single-season history, while forcing their opponents into 15.64 mistakes per game.

TAKING A STAND

Another reason for Dayton's turnaround is its improved defense. UD has given up only 58.4 ppg this season (4th best in A-10, 55th best in the nation) after allowing 66.3 ppg last season. The Flyers are 24-3 when holding their opponent to 70 points or less this season. This season, Dayton has allowed 54.8 ppg in its wins and 71.1 ppg in its losses.

FIVE VERSUS ONE

UD Head Coach Jim Jabir preaches team defense with all five players guarding the ball at all times and that theory has led to success this season for the Flyers. Dayton's defense has held its opponents to 35.8 percent (707-of-1975) shooting from the field this season to rank second in the A-10 in field goal percentage defense and 17th nationally.

YOU CAN'T DRIVE 55

Dayton had held its opponent to 55 points or less 15 times this season and has a 15-0 record in those games. UD held Wright State (46) and Clemson (43) to under 50 points in back-to-back games, which is the first such stretch in Dayton's modern (Division I) history. The Flyers repeated the feat two other times during conference play. The last Dayton team to hold its opponents to under 50 consecutively was the 1982-1983 squad. The feat occurred against Xavier (Feb. 1, 80-46) and Marquette (Feb. 5, 81-47).

BRINGING ANOTHER DEEP BENCH

As a result of its fast paced offense, 6 of the 13 active players on the UD roster have played in every game this season.

CAN'T STOP THE BLOCK

Dayton is second in the A-10 and 29th nationally in blocks at 4.73 per game this season. UD's 156 blocked shots this season is the most in program history. Sophomore Kelly Keil leads the Flyers with 65 blocks in 31 games played (2.10 bpg) this season. Keil ranks second in the A-10 and 28th nationally in blocked shots. UD ranked fourth in the Atlantic 10 with 114 blocks last season (3.7 bpg), which was the fifth most in UD single-season history.

LUND CONNECTS FOR THREE

After hitting just four three-point shots in her first 10 games of the 2006-2007 season, Kiki Lund delivered 10 treys in the first five games during the 2007-2008 campaign and has 69 overall this season. After making 32 treys all of last year, Lund is 69-for-161 (.429) from long range in 2007-2008. She ranks 18th nationally in three-point shooting (first in A-10) and averages 2.09 threes per game (second in A-10).

LUND LIVES DOWNTOWN

Senior Kiki Lund has made 153 three-point shots in her career, which is the third most all-time at UD. She is also the all-time leader in career three-point accuracy at .391. Lund is 22 treys shy of second place all-time at UD (Steph Mathu - 175, 1993-1997). She scored a season-high 19 points on 5-for-8 shooting from beyond the arc in a win at San Diego. Lund also made five treys in a victories at UW-Milwaukee and Xavier as well as four against Wright State and Charlotte in the A-10 Quarterfinals. Her single-game career high is six against both Loyola-Chicago (6-for-6) as a sophomore and Duquesne (6-for-7) as a junior.

HOLTERMAN HUSTLES HER WAY TO LEADING ROLE

Senior Brittany Holterman is second on the Flyer squad in scoring this season at 10.6 ppg and has scored in double figures in 20 games. She opened the season with 20 points on 8-for-13 shooting to go along with six rebounds, five steals, two blocks and two assists against Northwestern. On Feb. 9 versus Fordham she collected her second career double-double with 12 points and 12 boards.

HOLTERMAN ENGINEERS A WINNING TEAM

Brittany Holterman, a senior engineering major, has scored in double figures 20 times this season while collecting multiple offensive rebounds 15 times, multiple assists 16 times and multiple steals on 12 occasions. The team leader in minutes played (30.0 mpg) has spent at least 30 minutes on the court 18 times this season while still shooting .531 from the field and holding a 1.02 assist-to-turnover ratio.

BRIT HELPS DAYTON SIDESTEP TOREROS

Senior Brittany Holterman lifted visiting Dayton over San Diego, 68-67 on Nov. 25 with a pair of clutch free throws. With the Flyers down by one point, Holterman was fouled and made both free throws to give UD a lead. Then after a Torero timeout, Holterman and the Flyer defense did not allow USD to even attempt a shot in its own frontcourt and held on for a one-point win.

HOLTERMAN HAS BIG DAYS AGAINST TEMPLE

Brittany Holterman had her best day in a Flyer uniform with 21 points against Temple last season. She made 9-of-12 shots from the field and collected eight rebounds including four on the offensive glass to go along with three assists in 38 minutes. Holterman also put up 12 points on 5-for-9 shooting from the field in a win over the Owls on Jan. 12 of this season. She added four assists and two rebounds in 39 minutes of play.

KARAH TAKES OVER AT THE POINT

Karah Cloxton is averaging 4.39 apg after dishing out eight helpers with only one turnover in a win over Western Michigan on Nov. 11. Cloxton also tallied eight assists with one mistake against Saint Joseph's and URI. She posted season-highs of nine assists against both Indiana and GW. She ranks 3rd in the A-10 in assists as well as 2nd in assist-to-turnover ratio (+2.13). Cloxton also has the 7th best assist-to-turnover ratio in the nation while ranking 64th in assists. She already has 145 this season (7th in UD single-season history) after handing out 89 helpers last season. Her career-high of 13 assists, including nine in the second half, came against Charlotte as a junior.

CLOXTON LIFTS FLYERS PAST PANTHERS

Senior Karah Cloxton hit four free throws in the final minute to give Dayton a 56-55 win at Wisconsin-Milwaukee on Nov. 19, 2007. After making both attempts while going to the free throw line for the first time on the night with 47 seconds left, Cloxton pulled down a defensive rebound on the next possession. She was fouled and made both shots with 14.4 seconds left to give UD a victory.

CLOXTON NAMED ESPN THE MAGAZINE ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT SECOND TEAM

Senior Karah Cloxton was named to the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District Second Team as announced by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) on Feb. 7. The senior guard has the highest GPA on the women's basketball team with a 4.0 and is a member of the Atlantic 10 Commissioner's Honor Roll. Cloxton, an exercise science and fitness management major, will attend medical school at either Marshall or West Virginia with goals of becoming an orthopedic surgeon after graduation.

ARMSTRONG MOVES INTO THE LINEUP

Ashley Armstrong is known as one of the best perimeter defenders on the Flyer roster and that ability has earned her a spot in the lineup. This season, she is fifth on the team with 0.67 steals per game. In her first start of the 2007-2008 season, Armstrong tallied seven points, five rebounds, four assists and two steals in 23 minutes of action at New Mexico. She also averages 1.39 assists per game including a career-best eight in a win over Akron on Dec. 2.

ASHLEY AT HOME ON THE FREE THROW LINE

Ashley Armstrong ranked fourth on the team in free throw shooting last season. She made 31-of-40 (.775) attempts from the charity stripe in 2006-2007 and is 25-of-36 (.694) so far this season.

ANOTHER 20-POINT GAME FOR NIKKI

Senior Nikki Oakland has tallied seven career 20-point scoring efforts including five this season. She tallied 20 points in just 22 minutes played on 8-for-11 shooting against New Mexico on Nov. 10. She finished with a career-high 32 points against Akron on Dec. 2 and added 21 points and 11 rebounds at Drexel as well as 20 points and three blocks versus Richmond. Oakland started the A-10 Championship with 20 points and 13 rebounds against UMass in the First Round.

A DOUBLE THREAT

Nikki Oakland has tallied 11 double doubles this season including both UD wins at the 2008 A-10 Championship, which is good for the fourth most in the Atlantic 10 Conference. She finished with 10 points and a season-high 12 rebounds in the win over La Salle on Jan. 16.

AN ALL-AROUND TALENT

Senior Nikki Oakland is one of only three players to be ranked in the Top 15 of the Atlantic 10 Conference in scoring (11th, 13.8 ppg), rebounding (7th, 8.0 rpg), field-goal percentage (6th, .511) and blocked shots (8th, 1.27 bpg). The two-time Atlantic 10 Player of the Week is also 60th nationally in field-goal percentage.

A GRAND ACHIEVEMENT

Senior Nikki Oakland became the 17th member of Dayton's 1,000-Point Club during the Flyers' 77-53 rout of Charlotte on March 8 in the Quarterfinals of the 2008 A-10 Championship. Oakland, who now has 1,014 career points (16th all-time) also ranks among the Top 10 players in UD history in rebounding (654), field-goal shooting (.493) and blocked shots (146).

QUALITY MINUTES FROM NIKKI

Nikki Oakland averaged one point scored in every 2:10 of time she spent on the court last season. So far in 2007-2008, she has scored 455 points in just 903 minutes, good for one point every 1:59. Oakland scored the first 14 points of the game for Dayton in a span of just 6:35 as UD beat Akron 85-64 on Dec. 2, 2007.

NIKKI ZIPS HER WAY TO 32 POINTS

Forward Nikki Oakland tallied the first 14 points of the game for Dayton and finished with a career-best 32 overall to earn Atlantic 10 Player of the Week honors following a win over Akron on Dec. 2. She added 10 rebounds for her second straight double-double while connecting on 13-of-19 shots from the field.

OAKLAND CLEANS THE BOARDS

Nikki Oakland leads the team with 8.0 rebounds per game in 2007-2008 including a career-high 13 against UMass in A-10 Tourney play and 12 versus La Salle and Charlotte in the A-10 Quarterfinals. She also had 11 rebounds against Drexel, St. Francis (PA), Eastern Michigan, Clemson and Rhode Island as well as 10 boards each against Cincinnati and Akron. She is seventh in the Atlantic 10 in rebounding this season.

GUIN GOES BIG AGAINST AKRON

Kathy Guin scored a season-high 14 points off the bench in a 21-point win over Akron on Dec. 2, 2007. She hit a trio of three-point shots in the first half and finished a perfect 5-for-5 from the field overall in the game to go along with three assists, four rebounds and a steal.

GUIN GETS OFF TO A GOOD START

Kathy Guin dished out eight assists in the first half en route to a career-high nine helpers overall against Duquesne last season. Her nine assists overall were the second most by any Atlantic 10 player in a single game last season. Also her eight in the first half were also one shy of the most in UD history for a half.

KG KILLS THE TIGERS

Kathy Guin came off the bench this season to lead all scorers with 13 points in just 18 minutes of action during Dayton's 81-43 rout of Clemson on Dec. 18. The point guard dished out just two assists, but connected on 5-of-8 shots on her own while pulling down three rebounds and grabbing one steal.

ROSCHE ROLLS INTO DAYTON

Forward Marie Rosche was born in Senegal and came to the US to play basketball as a sophomore at Westtown (Pa.) HS where she was a three-time All-League pick in basketball, track & field and soccer. UD looks for her to use the same athletic ability that led her to a Private School State Title in the High Jump and to the League Championship on the hardwood.

LINDSEY GOOD FOR A DOZEN

Aundrea Lindsey posted 12 points while shooting a perfect 3-for-3 from the field in just her second collegiate game on Nov. 11, 2006 against Memphis. She was also 5-of-6 from the free throw line.

KELLY DOUBLES UP THE BIG RED

Kelly Keil posted her first career double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds to go along with five blocks against Cornell on Dec. 29. It marked the third time this season that she reached double figures in rebounds and was the eighth of 16 times overall that she tallied multiple blocks.

KELLY SWATS AWAY THE EXPLORERS

Kelly Keil tallied 28 blocked shots last season, which was the most ever by a UD freshman. She broke the A-10 Opening Round freshman record with six blocks in UD's win over La Salle last season.

Keil leads UD in blocks this year with 65 in just 31 games played including four against Wright State, St. Francis (PA) and #16/13 George Washington. She is on track to finish with 66 blocked shots this season, which would be the third most in Flyer single-season history. Her 2.31 blocks per game ranks as second best in the Atlantic 10 Conference and 28th nationally.

KENDEL, AN ALL-TOURNEY TALENT

Kendel Ross was named to the All-Tournament Team at the Dayton Flyer Classic after finishing with nine points, eight rebounds and three assists against Cornell. She followed with 10 points, eight rebounds, three assists and one block against Central Michigan. After spending her summer playing for the Canadian National Team, Ross leads all Flyer reserves in assists (1.67 apg) and steals (0.85 spg) while ranking second in scoring (7.0 ppg) and rebounds (4.5 rpg).

ROSS STEPS UP AT GW

Making just her seventh career start and first ever in conference play, Kendel Ross had her best day in a Flyer uniform at #16/13 George Washington on Jan. 29. She posted a career-best 16 points including 14 in the first half against the Colonials. Ross hit 5-of-9 shots from the field including 2-of-3 from three-point range to go along with six rebounds, three assists and one steal.

TISZA BACK IN THE FLYER LINEUP

Jen Tisza returned to the rotation in the paint for UD after missing all of last season due to injury. After a medical redshirt forced her to miss her freshman year, Tisza appeared in 16 games during the 2005-2006 campaign and scored 21 points while pulling down 18 rebounds. She posted a season-best seven points and seven rebounds at Loyola-Chicago earlier this season.

DAUGHERTY DELIVERS FOR DAYTON

A two-time Ms. Ohio as a prep, Kristen Daugherty has already made a big impact for the Flyers this season. The two-time A-10 Rookie of the Week is averaging 9.4 ppg (3rd on team) and 5.0 rpg (2nd on team). She led River View High School to State Titles as both a junior and senior and finished as River View's all-time leading scorer with 1,800 career points. Daugherty averaged 20.0 ppg, 8.0 rpg and 4.3 apg as a senior and was ranked among the Top 35 forwards nationally in the 2007 recruiting class by scout.com.

KRISTIN GOES FOR 20 THREE TIMES

Kristin Daugherty has scored 20 points or more three times this season including twice in a three-game span. She scored 17 of a team-high 20 points in the second half of UD's 59-57 comeback win at Eastern Michigan on Dec. 21. She tallied 10 in a row at one point to take the Flyers from down eight to up two in the final minutes. Daugherty then put up 14 points in the second half to score a season-high 26 points during an 86-71 victory over Central Michigan. She hit on 5-of-8 shots from three-point range in the win over the Chippewas. Daugherty also scored 20 points at Duquesne on Jan. 19 while making 6-of-12 shots from the field and going 7-for-8 from the free-throw line.

KRISTIN STARTS STRONG AGAINST CLEMSON

Freshman Kristin Daugherty was not intimidated in her first collegiate game against an ACC opponent. She scored 10 points in the first 8:25 as UD built a 49-16 halftime lead on Clemson en route to an 81-43 victory. Daugherty hit four of her first five shots from the field including a three-pointer, a fade away jumper from the baseline and a drive to the hoop from the right wing.

GAINETO SIT FOR FLYERS

Ebony Gainey will not play for the women's basketball team due to a congenital medical condition that was discovered just before the start of the season.

"We are disappointed for Ebony because she was looking forward to helping us win this season," Flyer Head Coach Jim Jabir said. "We still feel fortunate to have her as a part of our family because signing her was a major step towards building a championship program."

Gainey was a two-time All-Ohio selection at Meadowdale High School. She took home AP Division I Special Mention honors as a senior after averaging 11.6 points, 10.5 rebounds, 7.7 assists, 6.1 steals and 4.5 blocks per game while racking up five triple-doubles. She garnered AP Honorable Mention All-Ohio honors as a junior after averaging 15.4 points per game. Gainey was named the SWPOL Player of the Year as a sophomore after nearly averaging a triple-double with 10.8 points, 10.3 rebounds and 8.0 assists per game. She ranked among the Top 70 players nationally in the Class of 2007 according to the Blue Star Report.

TOURNEY TOWN

The NCAA Division I Men's Tournament will made its start at UD Arena this season for the seventh year in a row. The NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee has announced that the University of Dayton Arena will host the NCAA Opening Round Game in 2008. UD has hosted the game since its inception in its current form in 2002. Dayton will also be a First and Second Round site for the 2009 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship as well as a 2010 Women's Regional. When the 2008 NCAA Tournament is over, UD Arena will have been an NCAA site in 22 of the last 39 years and will have hosted 75 NCAA Tournament games. That will make UD Arena the third-most prolific NCAA Tourney venue behind Municipal Auditorium in Kansas City (83) and the Huntsman Center in Salt Lake City (81).

DAYTON WOMEN INK SEVEN DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD *Flyer Recruiting Class One of Top 40 Nationally According to BlueStar Report*

DAYTON, Ohio - Head Coach Jim Jabir welcomed his largest ever recruiting class with the addition of six signed National Letters of Intent to the Dayton women's basketball program during the early signing period. The Flyers will welcome De'Sarae Chambers, Patrice Lalor, Kayla Moses, Casey Nance, Justine Raterman and Brittany Wilson to the UD family for the 2008-2009 season.

Dayton's 2007 class is not just filled with a large quantity of players, but quality as well. All four of the Ohio natives made the list of Top 25 prep seniors in the State by the Ohio Girls Basketball Report. Also, all three of the Kentucky prep players were listed among the best players in the Bluegrass State by the Rick Bolus' High Potential® Basketball Recruiting Service, Inc. Overall, the Flyer class was ranked No. 39 nationally by the Blue Star Report.

Chambers, a 5-9 guard from Mason County (KY) High School, was recently named to the "Tremendous 26", a list of the top players in the State of Kentucky according to a High Sports website. At the conclusion of last season, she was selected as the 2007 Ledger Independent All-Area Girls' Player of the Year. Chambers led the team and the area in points per game (17.6) and free throw percentage (82.8 percent). The Lady Royals' all-time leading scorer, she broke the 2,000-point barrier early last year.

Lalor, a 5-6 guard from Toledo's (OH) Notre Dame High School, averaged 13.7 points, 4.9 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 3.9 steals per game in earning first-team All-City League honors for the third straight season as a junior. She was also a second-team all-district selection in Division I. During her career, Lalor has helped the Eagles to a 46-16 overall record, two CL playoff berths including one league final.

Moses, a 5-4 guard from Scott County High School in Georgetown, Ky., led her prep team to the District Championship last season with a 25-4 record and was an Honorable Mention All-State selection. She averaged 15.0 points, 3.3 steals and 3.7 rebounds per game as a junior.

Nance, a 6-4 forward from Revere High School in Akron, Ohio, averaged 15.0 points, 14.0 rebounds and 4.3 blocks per game last season for a 15-7 Revere team that finished third in its league. She was an Honorable Mention All-State selection as a junior.

Raterman, a 6-1 forward from Versailles (OH) High School, is ranked as 10th best forward in the nation by HoopGurlz.com as well as the 35th best player overall. She averaged nearly 17 points and 10 rebounds per game while leading the Tigers to the OHSAA Division III state semifinals last season. Raterman was also a Second Team All-Ohio selection.

Wilson, a native of Louisville's (KY) Manual High School, was joined by fellow Dayton signee De'Sarae Chambers on the Blue-Chip All-Star "Elite" AAU team that finished second in the adidas Deep South Tournament. The 5-11 forward was also named MVP of the Tourney.

"Ashley is the kind of kid that I call the glue kid. She does all the little things. She guards the other teams best perimeter player, very smart intelligent player, she going to get her hand on that loose ball, get the key rebound, she's going to do the little things that don't go noticed but are very very important to the team. And because of that she's started all but two games this year for us and we've relied on her quite a bit and she's been a great team player for us."



FORWARD BRITTANY HOLTERMAN

I don't know if I love basketball enough to do something like that. And then to have an ACL and rehab from something like that. I'm very proud of Jen. Jen's got a lot of courage and a lot of strength and to be able to do those things is a tremendous thing and I'll always be indebted to her."

TEAM MANAGER MEGHAN BERTOVICH

"Meghan has been an amazing person for us. Wise beyond her years, she is very responsible; she's really helped the coaches in so many different ways, more than just a manager. She's done stuff on the road, stuff with tape exchange, very responsible. She's going to make a great commissioner of the A-10 some day. I tell her she's going to be my boss one day telling me to quiet down."

FLYERS OUTLAST UMASS 57-51 TO ADVANCE TO A-10 QUARTERFINALS

March 7, 2008

PHILADELPHIA - All-league second team selection Nikki Oakland led the Flyers in double scoring with 20 points and hauled in 13 rebounds to lead fifth-seeded Dayton past No. 12 Massachusetts 57-51 at SJU Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse in the first round of the Atlantic 10 Championships.

Oakland's 20 points came on 7-of-14 shooting to go with a team-high three blocks, two assists and steal. Brit-tany Holterman joined Oakland in double figures with 10 points and was just two rebounds shy of a double-double with eight.

Freshman Kristin Daugherty scored eight points and Kendel Ross chipped in with seven points, three steals, and two assists for Dayton.

For UMass, Kate Mills led the way with a double-double of 19 rebounds and 17 points. Pam Rosanio and Cerie Mosgrove collected 11 points each for the Minutewomen.

It was a close game as both teams finished with 42 rebounds overall. Massachusetts held a 23-of-65 edge from the floor. Dayton finished 21-of-60. Foul trouble hurt UMass as the team committed 19 personal fouls to Dayton's six. UD finished 11-of-14 (64.7 percent) from the line.

Rosanio got things started for UMass after connecting on a layup and sinking a free throw for the three point play after a Cloxton foul. Oakland would respond with a jumper but the Minutewomen would extend their advantage as Mills began lighting it up.

UD remained scoreless for nearly four minutes until Marie Rosche scored on a breakaway layup at 11:57 to get the team back in it. Ross would net a three on the next time down the court to give the Flyers their second lead of the game 13-11 with 11:23 to play in the half. However, UMass would not let up putting together a 7-0 run as Stephanie Lawrence sparked the Minutewomen's push with a basket at 10:10 and Mosgrove capped it with a three at 8:57.

Dayton would not lie down though, closing the margin to within two points after two throws from Oakland, with the score closing in at 26-24 with 3:15 on the clock. UD would knot it up with a minute left before the break after Oakland sunk a basket. UMass did not get another shot up and on the next possession Whitney McDonald drew a foul and Holterman was sent to the line to give the Flyers a 27-26 lead heading into the intermission.

Poor shooting hindered the Flyers in the first frame as the team shot 31.3 percent from the floor and went a dismal 1-for-12 from three point range. However, UD went 6-of-8 from the charity stripe as UMass fouled nine times during the half compared to Dayton's two.

Dayton came out in the second with more intensity. Daugherty put up a shot two minutes in and Armstrong hit a three and then was fouled on the next possession for another point to extend UD's lead.

UMass didn't get back in it until nearly four minutes into the half as Stefanie Gerardot collected two points on a jumper. Holterman came on strong for Dayton with three consecutive baskets that included two jumpers and a free throw moving the score to 38-30 at the 13:54 mark. Oakland netted a three at 6:35 and followed it with three consecutive baskets to extend the Flyer edge. Dayton would never relinquish its lead eventually sealing the victory 57-51.

DAYTON ROUTS FOURTH-SEEDED CHARLOTTE 77-51 IN A-10 QUARTERFINALS

March 8, 2008

PHILADELPHIA - Forward Nikki Oakland scored her 1,000th career point and senior guard Karah Cloxton scored a career-high 20 points as the fifth-seeded University of Dayton women's basketball team defeated fourth-seeded Charlotte, 77-51, in quarterfinal action at the 2008 Atlantic 10 Championship.

Cloxton led the way for UD by scoring her career-high 20 points on 6-of-11 shooting from the field and 4-of-4 shooting from the line. Oakland tallied her 11th career double-double and second in as many days with 13 points and 12 rebounds.

Kendel Ross added 15 points and snared six rebounds on the afternoon, while teammate Brittany Holterman collected eight boards. Kiki Lund was 4-of-6 from three point range finishing with 12 points overall.

Free-throw shooting was instrumental in the Flyers' win as Dayton boasted 22-of-27 shooting (.815) from the line. UD also lit it up with 11 treys on 52.4 percent shooting from beyond the arc compared to the 49ers 12.5 percent (2-of-16). UD also won the battle of the boards, 44-to-36, and held a 30-to-20 edge on the defensive glass.

Aysha Jones was the only player to finish in double figures for Charlotte with 10 points and teammate Wendy Stywalt tallied a team-high six boards.

Charlotte took an early lead with a barrage of baskets two of which came from Sabrina Gregory. Kristin Daugherty buried a long-range three four minutes in, but Charlotte kept coming on strong with seven different players scoring in the first nine minutes of play to lead 17-10 with 11:32 left in the half. Back-to-back three's from Lund would shrink Charlotte's advantage 19-16 and Ross would tie it up on the next time down the court with a line-drive three of her own.

Dayton took its first lead of the game behind Oakland's free throw at the four minute mark, which was also her 1,000th career point. She is 17th player in Flyer history to join the 1,000-Point Club. The Flyers began a late rally that beginning with two free throws by Ross and a basket on the next possession. Oakland would score soon after on another two throws and a jumper with 1:42 left.

Cloxton would give the Flyers their largest lead of the frame after sinking two free throws with 26.2 seconds on the clock as UD took a 35-27 edge into intermission.

Free throw shots proved to be pivotal in the first half as Dayton finished 12-of-13 from the line while also hitting on 5-of-14 shots from beyond the arc.

Charlotte stumbled out of the gate in the second half with three fouls in just a little over a minute, but would score first on a mid-range shot from Whitney Hoey.

49ers would cut the lead to four points behind three consecutive baskets from Ray, Stywalt, and Danielle Burgin, 42-38 with 13:44 to go.

UD kept up the impressive shooting from beyond the arc as Cloxton and Ross lit up with two three's in less than a 30-second time span and Lund hit a trey at 8:24 to give UD a 17 point lead, 58-41.

After a struggle under the basket, Kendel would go up and net a shot with 3:57 on the clock.

From that point on the Flyers never looked back eventually winning the game 77-53.

FLYERS FALL TO NO. 1 SEED TEMPLE IN ATLANTIC 10 SEMIFINALS, 56-51

March 9, 2008

PHILADELPHIA - Senior Kiki Lund was the lone Flyer to score in double figures as the fifth-seeded Dayton Flyers fell to No. 1 seed Temple 56-51 in the semifinals of the 2008 Atlantic 10 Women's Basketball Championships.

Leading Dayton in its second ever appearance in the A-10 Semifinals, Lund scored 10 points while freshman Kristin Daugherty added nine of her own in the game. Seniors Nikki Oakland and Brittany Holterman were held to just six points a piece as Dayton finished 22-of-55 (40 percent) from the floor and 3-of-16 (18.8 percent) from three point range.

Temple had three players in double figures including Lady Comfort who tallied a double-double of 11 rebounds and 10 points. Ashley Morris led all scorers with 14 points, while teammate Lindsay Kimmel finished with 12 points on 4-of-7 shooting from beyond the arc.

It was a back-and-forth battle that featured eight ties and four lead changes. The Owls finished an impressive 6-of-12 from three point range on 50 percent shooting and also went 6-of-14 (42.9 percent) from the line. Dayton led in bench points 18-11 and also held an edge in points off turnovers 14-9, but Temple won the battle in second chance points 7-2, fast break points 6-0, and out-rebounded UD 41-32.

Temple's Kimmel opened the scoring burying a three at 19:15 as the Owls would continue to build an early advantage on baskets from Comfort and Morris. Armstrong would tie it up for UD for the first time in the game, 9-9 with a fast break layup at 14:44, but Temple would keep it going scoring two more baskets in a little over a minute.

Dayton reserve Kelly Keil stepped it up sinking back-to-back shots to even it up once more, 15-15, but Holterman's jumper at 10:47 would give UD its first lead of the game (17-15).

With 10 minutes left to play in the half, both teams traded baskets as the frame featured seven ties and four lead changes. Four of the seven ties in the first half happened in the last 10 minutes of play and the teams would head into the locker-room with the score knotted at 28-28.

Temple limited Dayton to just 16.7 percent shooting (1-of-6) from three point range, but Dayton shot 12-of-25 (48 percent) from the floor compared to the Owls 13-of-32 (40.6 percent) in the half.

The second frame started the same way the first ended with two lead changes and a tie in the first five minutes.

Kimmel hit back-to-back treys in a little over a minute to give Temple a little breathing room.

But it wouldn't last long because Dayton's Daugherty would hit one of her own on the next time down to keep the score close, 38-37 with 15:27 on the clock.

However, the Owls edged their way back and would take a six point lead after a layup from Landry at 10:31 (45-39).

The two teams remained scoreless for more than four minutes until Kimmel drained a three pointer at 7:56 to extend Temple's edge to nine points, 48-39.

Dayton was still without a field goal for more than eight minutes firing off eight miscues during that time.

Temple continued the pace with their biggest lead of the game coming after a layup from Landry, 52-39 with 5:16 left to play.

Dayton would pull within four points after Cloxton drove in and connected on a fast break layup and was fouled for the additional point, but the Flyers would not overcome the deficit eventually losing 56-51 to the Temple Owls.
