Kelly Keil has become one of Dayton's most prolific shot blockers in just her second season wearing a Flyer uniform. Keil has tallied a team-high 57 blocks this season, which also ranks second in the A-10 overall. She has swatted 85 shots in only 51 career games played to rank third all-time in blocked shots and first in career blocks per game (1.67 bpg) in UD history.

Dayton closes a three-game homestand on Wednesday as it plays host to Richmond. UD is looking to extend a four-game winning streak and continue their quest for a first-round bye in the Atlantic 10 Championship. Tipoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. ET for Girl/Boy Scout Night. The game can be followed with Gametracker as well as FREE Live Video and Live Audio (1610 Information Radio) at www.DaytonFlyers.com.

The Flyers (21-5, 7-3 A-10) enter tonight's game in fourth place in the A-10 standings just one game back of a three-game tie at first place that includes Temple and Xavier, which were victims of Dayton earlier this season. If UD was to win its final four games, it would clinch its first-ever bye in the A-10 Tournament that is scheduled for March 7-10 on the campus of Saint Joseph's University.

Dayton has allowed just 45.8 points per game during its four-game winning streak while outscoring the competition by 11 points per contest. The trio of Nikki Oakland (14.3 ppg, 8.5 rpg), Kristin Daugherty (11.0 ppg, 7.0 rpg) and Brittany Holterman (10.0 ppg, 7.5 rpg) have paced the Dayton during the stretch while point guard Karah Cloxton has averaged 6.0 assists per game with only 2.3 turnovers per contest.

Dayton holds just a 3-7 record all-time against Richmond including a 66-63 loss on the road last season to the Spiders. The Flyers have won two of five meetings at UD Arena including their last win in the series on Jan. 15, 2006 with a 67-62 decision.

Nazareth '84

**Fifth Season at UD (65-77, .458) • A-10 Conference Record (28-44, .389)
20th Season Overall (284-301, .485)**

Hard-working. Compassionate. Dedicated. These are just a few words that come to mind when talking with Jim Jabir. On April 8, 2003, the University of Dayton introduced Jabir as the women's basketball team's eighth head coach and first male head coach in the history of the program.

The Flyers have been one of the most improved teams in the nation under the direction of Jabir. UD had the fourth best single-season turnaround in the nation in the 2004-05 season with an improvement of nine wins over the previous campaign. Jabir and Dayton continued the trend in 2005-06 with an improvement of five more wins, giving UD the second best improvement over a two-year span in the nation.

"I am going to be the hardest working coach out there," states Jabir. "I want people to fear playing the University of Dayton."

The 2005-06 season also saw two different Flyers earn Atlantic 10 All-Conference accolades as UD advanced finished sixth in a conference that sent five teams to postseason play. Dayton also advanced to the Quarterfinals of the A-10 Tournament and finished with a winning record for the first time in five years.

UD returned to the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals at the conclusion of the 2006-07 season marking the third time in school history that the Flyers had advanced past their opening round in the Atlantic 10 Tournament. Dayton played close games throughout the 2006-07 campaign as 15 of its 31 games were decided by single digits despite having just one senior in the starting lineup.

Jabir came to UD after spending one season as an assistant at Colorado. In his last season at CU, the Buffaloes (24-8) advanced to the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Tournament and were ranked as high as 23rd in the ESPN/Coaches' Poll and 24th in the Associated Press Poll. Jabir was primarily responsible for the development of CU's post players, including the Buffaloes' first-ever First Team All-Big 12 selection.

Jabir had been a head coach for 16 seasons prior to coaching at CU with an all-time career mark of 220-223. His broad coaching experience ranges from the Big East Conference to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.

The Brooklyn, NY native began his coaching career as an assistant at Nazareth College (1984-85) and at Buffalo State (1985-86). Jabir was instrumental in leading the Bengals to a 23-3 slate, the SUNYAC title, a 22-game winning streak, an NCAA regional tournament appearance and a national ranking (No. 3) during the 1985-86 season.

After one season as an assistant, Jabir became the head coach at Buffalo State during the 1986-87 season at the age of 24. He led that team to a 14-11 record and guided the Bengals to the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) championship and an appearance in the Division III Tournament.

Jabir matriculated to Siena College from Buffalo State, where he served as the head coach of the Saints for three seasons (1987-90) and compiled a 50-29 record. Jabir's teams posted three consecutive winning seasons. In his first season, Jabir was responsible for the development of Siena's first-ever Freshman All-American.

After his stint at Siena, Jabir spent six years at Marquette University becoming one of the most successful coaches in the history of the program, elevating the Golden Eagles into the national spotlight. After posting a 7-20 record during his inaugural year (1990-91) at Marquette, Jabir guided his team to four consecutive winning seasons, two 20-plus winning seasons and three post-season appearances, including back-to-back bids to the NCAA Tournament. In 1994-95, Marquette won the Great Midwest Conference Tournament, the first tournament championship in school history. This followed the 1993-94 campaign in which Jabir compiled a program-best 22-7 overall record and its first trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Before his stint at Colorado, Jabir was at the helm of Providence College for six seasons, 1996-2002. During his last three years, the Friars' record improved with each season and in his final season, the Friars finished 13-15 overall and eighth of 14 schools in the prestigious Big East, its highest finish ever since the Big East went to a one division format.

Jabir was a two-time Reebok/Great Midwest Conference Coach of the Year while at Marquette. Jabir is a 1984 graduate of Nazareth College in Rochester, New York, where he received a degree in English. He also earned his Masters degree in Student Personnel Administration from Buffalo State in 1986. Jabir and his wife Kathy have three children, Lauren, Shane and Jackson.

FLYERS EARN NATIONAL ATTENTION

UD picked up its first ever votes in the AP Top 25 Poll on Dec. 24. Dayton also earned one vote in the Jan. 7 AP Top 25 Poll and three votes in the Jan. 14 AP Poll. The Flyers' 16-game winning streak, which ended on Jan. 19, was tied for the longest in the nation with #1/1 UConn and was the longest-ever in program history.

GREAT YEAR TO BE A FLYER

The University of Dayton is in the midst of its best ever year in its athletics history. UD's four "ball sports" from the fall (football, volleyball, men's & women's soccer) and its two basketball teams have combined to win 81.35 percent of their games this season. The next best mark in school history came in 2002 when the same group won 70.90 percent of their games through Feb. 19.

FLYERS RACK UP THE WINS

Dayton took just 15 games to surpass its win total from all of last season (12) due to a school-record tying 13-game winning streak (which finished at 15 straight wins). The Flyers had 14 wins before New Year's Day, which is the most ever in school history. The next best start in school history was in 1983-1984, when UD had 10 wins before Jan. 1 while racking up a school-record 12 consecutive victories to start the season. On Feb. 9 Dayton raked up its 19th win of the year versus Fordham marking a new modern (Division I) school-record for wins in a season.

EYE OF THE FLYER

Dayton has a 4-0 record against teams from Philadelphia this season with wins at Drexel (60-50), La Salle (45-43) and Saint Joseph's (56-54) as well as a 62-49 victory over Temple at UD Arena. The Flyers will make one more trip to the City of Brotherly Love for the 2008 A-10 Women's Basketball Championship, March 7-10 at SJU Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse.

OAKLAND, A TWO-TIME A-10 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior forward Nikki Oakland has been named the Atlantic 10 Player of the Week twice this season. She earned her first award on Dec. 3, one day after putting up a career-high 32 points against Akron while shooting 13-of-19 from the field and pulling down 10 rebounds. Oakland followed took home A-10 honors the following week (Dec. 10) after averaging 19.0 ppg and 10.0 rpg in wins over Indiana and Drexel.

DAUGHERTY ADDS THREE MORE A-10 HONORS

Freshman forward Kristin Daugherty has been named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week three times this season. She began her collegiate career by being named the A-10 Rookie of the Week on Nov. 12. The Fresno, Ohio native also earned back-to-back honors on Dec. 24 and Dec. 31. She is one of only two people to record three A-10 Rookie of the Week honors this season.

CLOSE CALLS THE NORM FOR DAYTON

UD is off to a 21-5 start, but the three of the Flyers' losses came by single digits this season while nine of their victories have come by 10 points or less including one-point wins against Wisconsin-Milwaukee, San Diego and Xavier as well as two-point road victories at Eastern Michigan, La Salle and Saint Joseph's. Last season, the Flyers had 15 of their 31 games decided by single digits and Dayton was 4-11 in those games. UD had a seven-game losing streak in which each game was decided by eight points or less. The average margin in each game of the streak was just 3.7 ppg including one-point defeats at UT-Martin and Wright State.

ATTENTION FROM THE FLYER FAITHFUL

An average of 1,604 fans per game saw the Flyers play in their 13 home games at UD Arena in 2005-06. During the 2004-05 season, Dayton drew 1,240 fans per game to UD Arena which was a Regional host of the 2007 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship and will host again in 2010. This season, the Flyers average 1,907 fans per game including a single-game season-high of 2,325 versus Rhode Island on Feb. 17. UD also drew 2,288 for the A-10 opener against Temple on Jan. 12.

AN UP TEMPO ATTACK

With 13 active players on its roster, Dayton plays an up tempo style that pushes the ball up the court and challenges opposing defenses to keep up the pace. The Flyers rank third in the A-10 with an average of 66.8 ppg this season, which also ranks 104th nationally. UD scored just 65.3 ppg (7th in A-10) last season and 64.4 ppg (4th in A-10) in 2005-2006. Dayton has connected on 643-of-1531 (.420) shots from the field this season (third in A-10, 83rd nationally).

FLYERS PILING UP THE POINTS

After scoring at least 80 points just once during the first two years (2003-2005) of Jim Jabir's tenure at Dayton, the Flyers have nearly broken the century mark in each of the past two seasons. UD scored 95 points on Jan. 8, 2005 in a win over Saint Louis (95-73) and put up 96 points in a victory over Memphis on the opening weekend of the 2006-2007 season. The 96 points scored on Nov. 11, 2006 was the most for the Flyers during a non-overtime game in 20 years. It also tied for the most by an A-10 team last season. Dayton has scored 80 points or more six times this season and is 6-0 in those games.

DAYTON DISHING OUT THE ASSISTS

Dayton ranks second in the A-10 and 43rd nationally with 15.3 assists per game this season including eight games with at least 20 assists as a team. The Flyers recorded a season-high of 23 against both Akron and St. Francis (PA), 21 at #16/13 George Washington, and 20 each versus Western Michigan, Cincinnati, Cornell, Central Michigan and Saint Joseph's. UD has been efficient this season with 398 assists on 643 made shots (.619) from the field overall including an season-best 84 percent rate with 21 assists on 25 made shots against #16/13 George Washington's "blizzard" defense. Dayton also posted 20 assists on 24 made baskets (.833) in a win over Saint Joseph's, 18 assists on 24 baskets (.750) in the win over Indiana and 23 assists on 29 baskets (.793) in the victory over St. Francis (PA). The Flyers ranked second in the A-10 and 34th nationally in 2005-2006 with 16.0 apg and were fourth in the A-10 with 14.3 apg last season.

THE EUROPEAN INFLUENCE

The freelance style of Dayton's offense comes from a theory of attacking the defense with momentum and fluidity. UD Head Coach Jim Jabir got the idea for the new offense from former Marquette men's basketball player Tony Miller. Miller (point guard from 1991-95) and Jabir (coach from 1990-96) were both at Marquette and have kept in touch while Miller has been playing in Europe for several years. Miller came to Dayton and taught Jabir and his staff the new system before the Flyers' 10-day trip to Europe during summer 2005.

IN RANGE FROM LONG RANGE

Dayton has connected on 140-of-416 (.337) shots from three-point range this season after making 148-of-544 (.272) shots from three-point range last season to rank sixth in the Atlantic 10 Conference in three-point field goals made. This season, UD ranks 7th in the A-10 and 115th nationally in three-pointers per game (5.4) and 7th in the conference and 85th in the nation in three-point field goal percentage (.339). Dayton's 140 made three-point shots this season is the fifth most in program history.

LONG DISTANCE DEDICATION

The Flyers have taken just over one out-of-every four shots from behind the arc this season. UD has attempted 416-of-1531 (.272) field goals from downtown in 2007-2008 after putting up 544-of-1882 (.289) shots last season from three-point range. That persistence led to a UD single-game record of 12 three-point shots made at Dartmouth on Dec. 30, 2006. The Flyers also made 10 treys at San Diego earlier this season. Dayton made the third most treys in a single-season as a team (148) and attempted the second most three-point shots (544) last season. UD finished with its third worst shooting performance from beyond the arc last season (.272).

SETTING THE STANDARD

Dayton has hit at least one three point shot in 213 consecutive games dating back to Jan. 2, 2001, which leads the Atlantic 10 Conference.

THREE BEATS TWO FOR UD

Dayton secured a 62-46 win over Drexel last season by making 7-of-21 shots from three-point range. In fact, the Flyers shot better from beyond the arc (.333) than the Dragons did from the field overall (.276) in the game. Dayton made six or more three-point shots on 12 occasions last season and UD had a 5-7 record in those games. So far in 2007-2008, the Flyers have made six or more treys 11 times with an 8-3 record in those contests.

FREE THROW FRENZY

The Flyers have shown dramatic improvement in their free throw shooting during the 2007-2008 season. UD has made 311-of-448 (.694) shots from the free throw stripe this season, which is ninth best in the Atlantic 10 Conference and ranks 144th in the nation. Dayton was 13-for-15 from the line in a comeback attempt at New Mexico on Nov. 10 and 9-for-12 in a 45-43 victory at La Salle on Jan. 16. The Flyers also made 22-of-30 free throws at Duquesne on Jan. 19. The upswing for the Flyers began during A-10 play last season when UD made 159-of-214 (.743) free throws, which was sixth best in the A-10.

WALKING THE LINE

Dayton has been at its best from the free-throw stripe in the closing minutes of games this season. UD has shot 82-of-116 (.707) from the line in the final five minutes of regulation and overtime this season, which is an improvement from its 70.0 percent shooting overall. Karah Cloxton went 4-for-4 in the final minute of play to give the Flyers a one-point win at UW-Milwaukee. Classmate Brittany Holterman was sent to the stripe with 10.8 seconds left and Flyers down by one at San Diego. The senior drilled both shots to give Dayton the win on the road. Also, Nikki Oakland went to the line with 3.3 seconds left in a tied game and hit both shots to push UD past La Salle for another road victory.

CONTROLLING THE ROCK

UD's fast paced offense has not come without a focus on valuing the basketball. Dayton holds a 1.0 assist-to-turnover ratio as a team this season which is second in the conference and ranks 20th nationally. Senior guard Karah Cloxton ranks second in the A-10 and ranks 9th in the nation with an assist-to-turnover ratio of +2.34. The Flyers are also third in the Atlantic 10 with a +0.9 turnover margin per game. At the end of the 2005-06 regular season, Dayton had the third fewest turnovers per game (19.0) in the program's history for a single-season. The Flyers averaged just 17.43 turnovers per game last season, which was the best ever in UD single-season history, while forcing their opponents into 18.67 mistakes per game.

TAKING A STAND

Another reason for Dayton's turnaround is its improved defense. UD has given up only 58.0 ppg this season (4th best in A-10, 50th best in the nation) after allowing 66.3 ppg last season. The Flyers are 21-0 when holding their opponent to 70 points or less this season. This season, Dayton has allowed 54.0 ppg in its wins and 75.2 ppg in its losses.

YOU CAN'T DRIVE 55

Dayton had held its opponent to 55 points or less 13 times this season and has a 13-0 record in those games. UD held Wright State (46) and Clemson (43) to under 50 points in back-to-back games, which is the first such stretch in Dayton's modern (Division I) history. The Flyers repeated the feat two other times during conference play. The last Dayton team to hold its opponents to under 50 consecutively was the 1982-1983 squad. The feat occurred against Xavier (Feb. 1, 80-46) and Marquette (Feb. 5, 81-47).

BRINGING ANOTHER DEEP BENCH

As a result of its fast paced offense, 6 of the 13 active players on the UD roster have played in every game this season.

CAN'T STOP THE BLOCK

Dayton is second in the A-10 and 28th nationally in blocks at 4.8 per game this season. Sophomore Kelly Keil leads the Flyers with 57 blocks in 24 games played (2.39 bpg) this season. Keil ranks second in the A-10 and 24th nationally in blocked shots. UD ranked fourth in the Atlantic 10 with 114 blocks last season (3.7 bpg), which was also the fourth most in UD single-season history. Nikki Oakland also accounted for 49 blocks last season to rank third in the A-10 at 1.69 bpg.

LUND CONNECTS FOR THREE

After hitting just four three-point shots in her first 10 games of the 2006-2007 season, Kiki Lund delivered 10 treys in the first five games during the 2007-2008 campaign and has 52 overall this season. After making 32 treys all of last year, Lund is already 52-for-122 (.426) from long range in 2007-2008. She ranks 20th nationally in three-point shooting (third in A-10) and averages 2.00 threes per game (third in A-10).

LUND LIVES DOWNTOWN

Senior Kiki Lund has made 136 three-point shots in her career, which is the third most all-time at UD. She is also the all-time leader in career three-point accuracy at .386. Lund is 39 treys shy of second place all-time at UD (Steph Mathu - 175, 1993-1997). She scored a season-high 19 points on 5-for-8 shooting from beyond the arc in a win at San Diego. Lund also made five treys in a victory at UW-Milwaukee and four against Wright State.

KIKI DOWNS LOYOLA THE FIRST TIME AROUND

On Nov. 22, 2005, Lund connected on 6-for-6 shots from three-point range at Loyola-Chicago, which tied the UD single-game record for most three-point field goals made without a miss. It was also the most makes in the nation during the 2005-06 season without a miss. Lund tallied a career-high with 20 points against the Ramblers.

LUND LIGHTS UP DUQUESNE

Kiki Lund has had a pair of big nights from three-point range over the past two seasons including a 6-for-7 effort against Duquesne on Jan. 28, 2006. It was the second most treys in a game last season by an A-10 player and tied for the fifth best single-game percentage (.857) in the nation. She made all five shots from downtown in the first half and her first six overall to finish with 18 points, four rebounds and three assists. In fact, her five treys in the first half were more than she made in the first 10 games of the season combined (four).

HOLTERMAN HUSTLES HER WAY TO LEADING ROLE

Senior Brittany Holterman is second on the Flyer squad in scoring this season at 10.9 ppg and has scored in double figures in 17 games. She opened the season with 20 points on 8-for-13 shooting to go along with six rebounds, five steals, two blocks and two assists against Northwestern. On Feb. 9 versus Fordham she collected her second career double-double with 12 points and 12 boards.

HOLTERMAN ENGINEERS A WINNING TEAM

Brittany Holterman, a senior engineering major, has scored in double figures 17 times this season while collecting multiple offensive rebounds 11 times, multiple assists 12 times and multiple steals on 10 occasions. The team leader in minutes played (29.8 mpg) has spent at least 30 minutes on the court 14 times this season while still shooting .545 from the field and holding a 0.8 assist-to-turnover ratio. Holterman is 12th in the A-10 in steals (1.5 spg) and 3rd in field goal percentage.

BRIT HELPS DAYTON SIDESTEP TOREROS

Senior Brittany Holterman lifted visiting Dayton over San Diego, 68-67 on Nov. 25 with a pair of clutch free throws. With the Flyers down by one point, Holterman was fouled and made both free throws to give UD a lead. Then after a Torero timeout, Holterman and the Flyer defense did not allow USD to even attempt a shot in its own frontcourt and held on for a one-point win.

BRIT JOINED THE STARTING LINEUP IN 2006-07

After two seasons as UD's best "sixth man", Brittany Holterman earned a spot in the starting lineup last season and proved she belonged with 8.8 ppg and 5.9 rpg which ranked third and second on the team respectively. Holterman posted 15 points on 6-of-11 shooting to go along with five rebounds, three assists, two steals and one block in UD's win over Winthrop. She also pulled down eight rebounds while scoring 16 points on 7-for-11 shooting against Loyola-Chicago last year.

HOLTERMAN HAS BIG DAYS AGAINST TEMPLE

Brittany Holterman had her best day in a Flyer uniform with 21 points against Temple last season. She made 9-of-12 shots from the field and collected eight rebounds including four on the offensive glass to go along with three assists in 38 minutes. Holterman also put up 12 points on 5-for-9 shooting from the field in a win over the Owls on Jan. 12 of this season. She added four assists and two rebounds in 39 minutes of play.

KARAH TAKES OVER AT THE POINT

Karah Cloxton is averaging 4.5 apg this season after dishing out eight helpers with only one turnover in a win over Western Michigan on Nov. 11. Cloxton also tallied eight assists with one mistake against Saint Joseph's and Rhode Island. She posted season-highs nine assists against both Indiana and George Washington. She ranks 3rd in the A-10 in assists as well as 2nd in assist-to-turnover ratio (+2.30). Cloxton also has the 9th best assist-to-turnover ratio in the nation while ranking among the Top 100 in assists per game. She already has 117 assists this season after handing out 89 helpers at point guard last season. Cloxton also took away 35 steals in '06-07. In 2006-2007, Cloxton was 16th in the A-10 with 2.9 apg and had an Asst./TO ratio of 1.6.

CLOXTON LIFTS FLYERS PAST PANTHERS

Senior Karah Cloxton hit four free throws in the final minute to give Dayton a 56-55 win at Wisconsin-Milwaukee on Nov. 19, 2007. After making both attempts while going to the free throw line for the first time on the night with 47 seconds left, Cloxton pulled down a defensive rebound on the next possession. She was fouled while collecting the ball and made both shots with 14.4 seconds left to give UD a victory.

CLOXTON NAMED ESPN THE MAGAZINE ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT THIRD TEAM

Senior Karah Cloxton was named to the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District Second Team as announced by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) on Feb. 7. The senior guard has the highest GPA on the women's basketball team with a 4.0 and is a member of the Atlantic 10 Commissioner's Honor Roll. Cloxton, an exercise science and fitness management major, will attend medical school with goals of becoming an orthopedic surgeon after graduation.

AN EARLY BIRTHDAY PRESENT FOR CLOXTON

One day before her 21th birthday, Karah Cloxton was giving gifts to her teammates in the form of a career-high 13 assists against Charlotte. Her output on Feb. 3, 2006 was just one shy of the most assists in UD single-game history. Her 13 was the second most in the A-10 and 15th most in the NCAA during the '05-06 season. Cloxton also tallied eight helpers in the second half alone which was one shy for the school record for assists in a single-half. She added 11 points for her first career double-double.

ARMSTRONG MOVES INTO THE LINEUP

Ashley Armstrong is known as one of the best perimeter defenders on the Flyer roster and that ability has earned her a spot in the lineup. This season, she is fifth on the team with 0.7 steals per game. In her first start of the 2007-2008 season, Armstrong tallied seven points, five rebounds, four assists and two steals in 23 minutes of action at New Mexico. She also averages 1.5 assists per game including a career-best eight in a win over Akron on Dec. 2.

ASHLEY AT HOME ON THE FREE THROW LINE

Ashley Armstrong ranked fourth on the team in free throw shooting last season. She made 31-of-40 (.775) attempts from the charity stripe in 2006-2007 and is 21-of-29 (.724) so far this season.

ANOTHER 20-POINT GAME FOR NIKKI

Senior Nikki Oakland has tallied five career 20-point scoring efforts including three this season. She tallied 20 points in just 22 minutes played on 8-for-11 shooting against New Mexico on Nov. 10. She finished with a career-high 32 points against Akron on Dec. 2 and added 21 points and 11 rebounds at Drexel.

A DOUBLE THREAT

Nikki Oakland has tallied eight double doubles this season, which is good for the fourth most in the Atlantic 10 Conference. She finished with 10 points and a season-high 12 rebounds in the win over La Salle on Jan. 16.

AN ALL-AROUND TALENT

Senior Nikki Oakland is one of only two players to be ranked in the Top 15 of the Atlantic 10 Conference in scoring (11th, 13.8 ppg), rebounding (8th, 7.7 rpg), field-goal percentage (7th, .516) and blocked shots (8th, 1.2 bpg). The two-time Atlantic 10 Player of the Week is also 65th nationally in field-goal percentage.

OAKLAND OWNS THE TIGERS

Nikki Oakland scored a then career-high 29 points in just 31 minutes played as UD nearly overcame a double-digit second-half deficit against Clemson last season. She had 15 of her 29 points in the second half and finished with nine rebounds, four blocks and a steal as well. This year, she put up 12 points and 11 rebounds in a 81-43 rout of Clemson at UD Arena.

QUALITY MINUTES FROM NIKKI

Nikki Oakland averaged one point scored in every 2:10 of time she spent on the court last season. So far in 2007-2008, she has scored 358 points in just 687 minutes, good for one point every 1:55. Oakland scored the first 14 points of the game for Dayton in a span of just 6:35 as UD beat Akron 85-64 on Dec. 2, 2007.

NIKKI ZIPS HER WAY TO 32 POINTS

Forward Nikki Oakland tallied the first 14 points of the game for Dayton and finished with a career-best 32 overall to earn Atlantic 10 Player of the Week honors following a win over Akron on Dec. 2. She added 10 rebounds for her second straight double-double while connecting on 13-of-19 shots from the field.

OAKLAND CLEANS THE BOARDS

Nikki Oakland led Dayton and ranked 12th in the Atlantic 10 Conference in rebounding last season at 6.7 rpg. She pulled down a career-high 13 rebounds at St. Bonaventure and recorded six double-figure rebounding games. Oakland leads the team with 7.7 rebounds per game in 2007-2008 including 12 versus La Salle. She also had 11 rebounds against Drexel, St. Francis (PA), Eastern Michigan, Clemson and Rhode Island as well as 10 boards each against Cincinnati and Akron. She is 8th in the Atlantic 10 in rebounding this season.

NIKKI OWNS THE PAINT

Nikki Oakland ranked third in the A-10 in blocks per game at 1.69 per game last year. She has the second most blocks in UD history with 136 career blocks and had the fifth most in UD single-season history (49) last season.

GUIN GOES BIG AGAINST AKRON

Kathy Guin scored a season-high 14 points off the bench in a 21-point win over Akron on Dec. 2, 2007. She hit a trio of three-point shots in the first half and finished a perfect 5-for-5 from the field overall in the game to go along with three assists, four rebounds and a steal.

GUIN GETS OFF TO A GOOD START

Kathy Guin dished out eight assists in the first half en route to a career-high nine helpers overall against Duquesne last season. Her nine assists overall were the second most by any Atlantic 10 player in a single game last season. Also her eight in the first half were also one shy of the most in UD history for a half. Guin scored 11 first-half points at Clemson and 10-of-14 points in the first half against Charlotte. She followed with seven assists and 12 points against Saint Louis. She also dished out six assists while scoring 12 points in a win over Rhode Island. Guin averaged 7.3 points per game and 3.2 assists per game last season overall. She ranked 11th in the A-10 in assists per game and seventh in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.3).

KG KILLS THE TIGERS

Kathy Guin came off the bench this season to lead all scorers with 13 points in just 18 minutes of action during Dayton's 81-43 rout of Clemson on Dec. 18. The point guard dished out just two assists, but connected on 5-of-8 shots on her own while pulling down three rebounds and grabbing one steal.

GUIN IS ALSO A STRONG FINISHER

Kathy Guin hit two game-winning baskets last season for the Flyers against Akron and Saint Joseph's: On Nov. 26, Guin had an assist and the game-winning three-pointer in the final 40 seconds of the game as Dayton tallied a 58-57 comeback win at Akron on Nov. 26. Guin finished with just 5 points and 4 assists, but dished out an assist on a layup by Brittany Holterman with 40 seconds left to knot the score. Then after Akron hit a pair of free throws, Guin drilled a trey with 8.2 left to give UD a one-point victory. Then trailing by two with 11 seconds left against Saint Joseph's, UD inbounded the ball and traveled the length of the court where Guin got a pass from Kiki Lund and drained a trey from the left side with 1.4 seconds left on the clock to give Dayton a 78-77 victory over the Hawks on Senior Day at UD Arena. Guin finished with 13 points after making her first three-point shot of the afternoon.

ROSCHER ROLLS INTO DAYTON

Forward Marie Rosche was born in Senegal and came to the US to play basketball as a sophomore at Westtown (Pa.) HS where she was a three-time All-League pick in basketball, track & field and soccer. UD looks for her to use the same athletic ability that led her to a Private School State Title in the High Jump and to the League Championship on the hardwood.

MARIE MAKES THE MOST OF HER TIME

Marie Rosche scored 2.1 ppg and pulled down 2.0 rpg while averaging 7.0 minutes of action last season. She came off the bench to score a career-high 10 points in 19 minutes of action against St. Francis (Pa.) on Jan. 3. She finished with 8 points and a career-best 9 rebounds during the 06-07 opener at Louisville.

LINDSEY GOOD FOR A DOZEN

Aundrea Lindsey posted 12 points while shooting a perfect 3-for-3 from the field in just her second collegiate game on Nov. 11, 2006 against Memphis. She was also 5-of-6 from the free throw line.

KELLY DOUBLES UP THE BIG RED

Kelly Keil posted her first career double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds to go along with five blocks against Cornell on Dec. 29. It marked the third time this season that she reached double figures in rebounds and was the eighth of 14 times overall that she tallied multiple blocks.

KEIL KOMES OUT AGAINST THE TERRIERS

Kelly Keil had one of the best games of her Flyer career against Boston University at the 2006 Blue Sky Classic. Keil finished with nine points, nine rebounds and an assist in 19 minutes of action against the Terriers. She added seven points in 15 minutes at Charlotte. Keil also had six points and seven rebounds at Rhode Island as well as six points and nine rebounds vs. SJU and UMass.

KELLY SWATS AWAY THE EXPLORERS

Kelly Keil tallied 28 blocked shots last season, which was the most ever by a UD freshman. She broke the A-10 Opening Round freshman record with six blocks in UD's win over La Salle. Keil leads UD in blocks this year with 57 in just 24 games played including four against Wright State, St. Francis (PA) and #16/13 George Washington. She is on track to finish with 67 blocked shots this season, which would be the third most in Flyer single-season history. Her 2.4 blocks per game ranks as second best in the Atlantic 10 Conference and 24th nationally.

KENDEL, AN ALL-TOURNEY TALENT

Kendel Ross was named to the All-Tournament Team at the Dayton Flyer Classic after finishing with nine points, eight rebounds and three assists against Cornell. She followed with 10 points, eight rebounds, three assists and one block against Central Michigan. After spending her summer playing for the Canadian National Team, Ross leads all Flyer reserves in assists (1.6 apg) and steals (0.8 spg) while ranking second in scoring (6.5 ppg) and rebounds (4.5 rpg).

ROSS STEPS UP AT GW

Making just her seventh career start and first ever in conference play, Kendel Ross had her best day in a Flyer uniform at #16/13 George Washington on Jan. 29. She posted a career-best 16 points including 14 in the first half against the Colonials. Ross hit 5-of-9 shots from the field including 2-of-3 from three-point range to go along with six rebounds, three assists and one steal.

ROSS PROVES TO BE A FINE IMPORT

Kendel Ross led the Flyer reserves in scoring (5.4 ppg), rebounding (4.0 rpg) and minutes played (17.1 mpg) last season. She recorded her first collegiate double-double with 11 points, 10 rebounds including seven offensive boards, a block, and an assist against Fordham. Ross almost had another double-double against Long Island with 10 points, nine rebounds and two assists in 27 minutes played. Ross also posted a season-high 14 rebounds and six steals against Loyola-Chicago. Her season-high in scoring came in just her second career start with 14 points against St. Francis (Pa.). She also had 14 points at Rhode Island.

TISZA BACK IN THE FLYER LINEUP

Jen Tisza returns to the rotation in the paint for UD after missing all of last season due to injury. After a medical redshirt forced her to miss her freshman year, Tisza appeared in 16 games during the 2005-2006 campaign and scored 21 points while pulling down 18 rebounds. She posted a season-best four points during the regular season against #22 Temple and followed with four rebounds in a rematch with the Owls two weeks later in the 2006 A-10 Tournament.

DAUGHERTY DELIVERS FOR DAYTON

A two-time Ms. Ohio as a prep, Kristen Daugherty has already made a big impact for the Flyers this season. The two-time A-10 Rookie of the Week is averaging 10.1 ppg (3rd on team) and 5.4 rpg (2nd on team). She led River View High School to State Titles as both a junior and senior and finished as River View's all-time leading scorer with 1,800 career points. Daugherty averaged 20.0 ppg, 8.0 rpg and 4.3 apg as a senior and was ranked among the Top 35 forwards nationally in the 2007 recruiting class by scout.com.

KRISTIN STARTS STRONG AGAINST CLEMSON

Freshman Kristin Daugherty was not intimidated in her first collegiate game against an ACC opponent. The 6-0 forward came strong out of the gate to score 10 points in the first 8:25 as UD built a 49-16 halftime lead on Clemson en route to an 81-43 victory. Daugherty hit four of her first five shots from the field including a three-pointer, a fade away jumper from the baseline and a drive to the hoop from the right wing.

KRISTIN GOES FOR 20 THREE TIMES

Kristin Daugherty has scored 20 points or more three times this season including twice in a three-game span. She scored 17 of a team-high 20 points in the second half of UD's 59-57 comeback win at Eastern Michigan on Dec. 21. She tallied 10 in a row at one point to take the Flyers from down eight to up two in the final minutes. Daugherty then put up 14 points in the second half to score a season-high 26 points during an 86-71 victory over Central Michigan. She hit on 5-of-8 shots from three-point range in the win over the Chippewas. Daugherty also scored 20 points at Duquesne on Jan. 19 while making 6-of-12 shots from the field and going 7-for-8 from the free-throw line.

GAINEY TO SIT FOR FLYERS

Ebony Gainey will not play for the women's basketball team due to a congenital medical condition that was discovered just before the start of the season.

"We are disappointed for Ebony because she was looking forward to helping us win this season," Flyer Head Coach Jim Jabir said. "We still feel fortunate to have her as a part of our family because signing her was a major step towards building a championship program."

Gainey was a two-time All-Ohio selection at Meadowdale High School. She took home AP Division I Special Mention honors as a senior after averaging 11.6 points, 10.5 rebounds, 7.7 assists, 6.1 steals and 4.5 blocks per game while racking up five triple-doubles. She garnered AP Honorable Mention All-Ohio honors as a junior after averaging 15.4 points per game. Gainey was named the SWPOL Player of the Year as a sophomore after nearly averaging a triple-double with 10.8 points, 10.3 rebounds and 8.0 assists per game. She ranked among the Top 70 players nationally in the Class of 2007 according to the Blue Star Report.

TOURNEY TOWN

The NCAA Division I Men's Tournament will make its start at UD Arena this season for the seventh year in a row. The NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee has announced that the University of Dayton Arena will host the NCAA Opening Round Game in 2008. UD has hosted the game since its inception in its current form in 2002. Dayton will also be a First and Second Round site for the 2009 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship as well as a 2010 Women's Regional. When the 2008 NCAA Tournament is over, UD Arena will have been an NCAA site in 22 of the last 39 years and will have hosted 75 NCAA Tournament games. That will make UD Arena the third-most prolific NCAA Tourney venue behind Municipal Auditorium in Kansas City (83) and the Huntsman Center in Salt Lake City (81).

DAYTON WOMEN INK SEVEN DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD Flyer Recruiting Class One of Top 40 Nationally According to BlueStar Report

DAYTON, Ohio - Head Coach Jim Jabir welcomed his largest ever recruiting class with the addition of seven signed National Letters of Intent to the Dayton women's basketball program during the early signing period. The Flyers will welcome De'Sarae Chambers, Cierra Harris, Patrice Lalor, Kayla Moses, Casey Nance, Justine Raterman and Brittany Wilson to the UD family for the 2008-2009 season.

Dayton's 2007 class is not just filled with a large quantity of players, but quality as well. All four of the Ohio natives made the list of Top 25 prep seniors in the State by the Ohio Girls Basketball Report. Also, all three of the Kentucky prep players were listed among the best players in the Bluegrass State by the Rick Bolus' High Potential® Basketball Recruiting Service, Inc. Overall, the Flyer class was ranked No. 39 nationally by the Blue Star Report.

Chambers, a 5-9 guard from Mason County (KY) High School, was recently named to the "Tremendous 26", a list of the top players in the State of Kentucky according to a High Sports website. At the conclusion of last season, she was selected as the 2007 Ledger Independent All-Area Girls' Player of the Year. Chambers led the team and the area in points per game (17.6) and free throw percentage (82.8 percent). The Lady Royals' all-time leading scorer, she broke the 2,000-point barrier early last year.

Harris, an Akron, Ohio native from Firestone HS, was an honorable mention all-state selection as a junior after leading her team to the City Series Championship and taking home All-District and All-City Series honors. She averaged 12.5 points, 13.2 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.0 steal per game for Firestone High School last season. The 6-1 guard/forward was also named to the addidas AAU All-America Team.

Lalor, a 5-6 guard from Toledo's (OH) Notre Dame High School, averaged 13.7 points, 4.9 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 3.9 steals per game in earning first-team All-City League honors for the third straight season as a junior. She was also a second-team all-district selection in Division I. During her career, Lalor has helped the Eagles to a 46-16 overall record, two CL playoff berths including one league final.

Moses, a 5-4 guard from Scott County High School in Georgetown, Ky., led her prep team to the District Championship last season with a 25-4 record and was an Honorable Mention All-State selection. She averaged 15.0 points, 3.3 steals and 3.7 rebounds per game as a junior.

Nance, a 6-4 forward from Revere High School in Akron, Ohio, averaged 15.0 points, 14.0 rebounds and 4.3 blocks per game last season for a 15-7 Revere team that finished third in its league. She was an Honorable Mention All-State selection as a junior.

Raterman, a 6-1 forward from Versailles (OH) High School, is ranked as 10th best forward in the nation by HoopGurlz.com as well as the 35th best player overall. She averaged nearly 17 points and 10 rebounds per game while leading the Tigers to the OHSAA Division III state semifinals last season. Raterman was also a Second Team All-Ohio selection.

Wilson, a native of Louisville's (KY) Manual High School, was joined by fellow Dayton signee De'Sarae Chambers on the Blue-Chip All-Star "Elite" AAU team that finished second in the addidas Deep South Tournament. The 5-11 forward was also named MVP of the Tourney.

As Sunday afternoon gave way to evening, University of Dayton women's basketball coach Jim Jabir did something he has not previously done.

Sing on key?

"No way!" laughed Nikki Oakland, his senior center. "He sings at the top of his lungs and he has a terrible singing voice. He loves to dance, and he can't dance a bit."

That's too bad because Jabir's finally got something to sing and dance about at UD.

With Sunday's 86-71 victory over Central Michigan in the title game of the Dayton Flyer Classic at UD Arena, the Flyers have won 13 straight games. That ties a school record and gives UD the second longest active winning streak in NCAA Division I women's basketball.

It's also one more victory than the team had all last season and far better than the 3-25 effort of just four seasons ago. Last week, the Flyers finally started getting votes in the AP Top 25 poll.

"We had not spoken about any of that — never — we just didn't mention it," Jabir said. "After each win, all we talked about was the next game."

"But after (Sunday's) game I sat them down and said, 'I know we need to stay focused — and there are still a lot of things to fix — but when you work as hard as you have, you need to understand the scope of what you've done.'

"And that's when I brought up the school record, the AP votes, the fact that Saturday night our RPI was 43. With all of that, I wanted them to celebrate it a little bit and, in the process, it might give ourselves a little more confidence to know 'this is who we are ...' "

He let those last words hang. Maybe he's still a little in disbelief or he just likes hearing their sweet sound or probably it's just that he knows how tough it's been for everyone to get here.



He took over a program that, in the words of athletics director Ted Kissell, was "badly broken." With players he did not recruit and walk-ons to replace those hold-overs who quit, Jabir went 3-25.

The following year he had his first recruits on campus — this year's seniors — but he promptly endured some life-threatening health issues that kept him from coaching the first six games.

That year ended 12-16. Then came a 17-12 season before going 12-18 last season.

"I don't think tough even begins to describe what it's been like for my class," said senior guard Ashley Ambrose. "But we all stayed and bought into his vision and I can't describe just how wonderful it feels right now."

FAMILY EXAMPLE

So how did it happen?

For that you need to go back to Brooklyn some 35 years ago. That's where Jim Jabir got the most important lesson he imparts to his team today.

His dad immigrated to the United States from Lebanon and, as Jim put it, "scratched and clawed to make a living." Then he got sick — melanoma — and the family's financial burdens fell on his wife, Rose.

"My mom's an unbelievable person, she's very strong," Jabir said. "She worked 80 hours a week. She rode the subway every morning to her (receptionist) job in Manhattan, then came home late and did work for Gimbel's (department store).

"A man would show up at our house in the evening with a huge box of women's slips and she'd pin them up at the dining room table, sometimes 'til 1:30 in the morning. By 6, she was back on the train. She did it to keep our family going.

"It's an example I want to embrace for my own life and something I want to pass onto my own children and my players, too. If there are things that you want — if you aspire for something bigger than yourself — it's going to take effort, commitment, focus. It's going to take lots of work. No one's going to give you anything.

"For myself, I've always had the assumption that people are smarter than you, better than you, but you can outwork them and that will pull you through."

That philosophy worked a lot of places for him. At 24 — just a couple of years removed from his own playing days at Nazareth College — he became the head coach of Buffalo State's women's team and led it to the NCAA Division III tournament.

Then came successful rebuilding projects at Siena and Marquette, before he took over the under-funded women's program at Providence and struggled through six losing seasons. He moved on to Colorado as an assistant for one year — helped them to the Sweet Sixteen — and was promptly hired by Kissell to take over a program that had had just one winning season in the past 10 years.

IT'S ALL GOOD

Implementing his plan at UD became more difficult that second season when, just a few weeks before the 2004 opener, he was diagnosed with arrhythmogenic right ventricular dysplasia (ARVD), a rare, heredity heart problem that causes sudden-death syndrome, especially in athletes.



He nearly died twice in the hospital, once before his racing heart was brought under control and then when he was administered a drug to which he was allergic. He ended up missing the first six games of the season, but surgically fitted with a defibrillator, he finished the year without incident.

Since then he said he's been "zapped" just once.

"It happened three, maybe two months ago," he said. "It didn't have anything to do with my disease. It's just the upper chamber was out of sync for some reason and my defibrillator picked it up and zapped me.

"It literally threw me against the wall of my bathroom and more than anything that scared me. I went back and lay in bed next to my wife. I lay awake all night on my back just listening to my heart beat. I remember telling her, 'I really don't want to die.'

"My cardiologist tells me it was nothing to worry about — no big deal at all — and I'm just fine."

And he's not just talking about his health. He and wife Kathy have three good looking kids and his 13-2 basketball team has never looked better.

Besides that senior class — four of whom are starters and two others who are top reserves — he has a freshman star in Kristin Daugherty, the MVP of last weekend's four-team Flyer Classic, and then there's the highly-regarded recruiting class committed for next season.

So with all this good fortune are singing and dancing the only areas in which Jabir still doesn't measure up?

Well, not exactly,

Turns out his coaching success is even eclipsed in his own home.

"Our 10-year-old son Jack plays in Bellbrook and Kathy is his team's assistant coach," Jabir said with a smile. "She's in charge of bench decorum and discipline and that's a tough job with 10 year olds.

"And now she comes to me and says, 'Can you show me some post moves? We've got to get Jeremy posting up better.' "

So how's it working?

"As a coach," he said with grin, then a shrug, "she's got a better winning percentage than I do."

Last March before the NCAA Tournament, I had a little fun writing about Orville and Wilbur Wright, as one of the women's regionals was in their hometown of Dayton.

But I thought then, and had over the years, that it was odd that the Dayton Flyers had never made an NCAA Tournament appearance in women's basketball.

Consider that the Flyers were the AIAW Division II national champions in 1980. There were NCAA regionals held in Dayton in 1998 and 2003, too, so the school had shown interest in the game by bidding for those. And there is lots of high school girls' basketball talent in the state of Ohio.

So you would think that somehow, since the NCAA Tournament began in 1982, the Flyers would have put together a good-enough team, caught a break here or there, and made the field.

But it hasn't happened ... yet. Which brings us to the Flyers' current season, where they were riding a 16-game winning streak entering Saturday's game at Duquesne.

In the "it figures" category, I wrote about the Flyers, filed the piece ... and they promptly lost to Duquesne. It was "upset day" in the Atlantic-10, as George

Washington was upended by Temple.

Anyway, even though Dayton's streak is over, it's worth taking a look at how it began and what's going with women's hoops in the Wright brothers' hometown.

Dayton started in November with two losses in a tournament at New Mexico, falling to Northwestern and the host school. Unlike Bugs Bunny, however, the Flyers did not take a wrong turn at Albuquerque.

They won their last game in that tournament, over Western Michigan, and didn't lose again until Saturday.

"The run has been great, but we don't talk about it a lot," coach Jim Jabir said. "The town is really starting to get invested in [the team], which is great."

Jabir is a Brooklyn, N.Y., native who started his career at Buffalo State, then went to Siena and Marquette. From 1990-96 with the Golden Eagles, his teams made the NCAA Tournament twice.

But as a native New Yorker, he'd grown up following the Big East. So when a job opened at Providence, he took it.

It didn't work out, and after six seasons without a winning record, Jabir said he was starting to not like the person he was becoming. Losing and disappointment were wearing on him.

He was offered a sales job in Providence, and he went home to his family and asked if he should take it. He explained to his three children it would mean they could stay in the town they liked and that he would not be away from home so much.

But his oldest, daughter Lauren, said, "No, Dad. We love that you're a coach."

So then Jabir took a step that many head coaches wouldn't – but it was a great move for him.

"Ceal Barry at Colorado remembered me from Marquette and offered me an assistant's job," he said of the Buffs' former head coach. "I'll forever be grateful to Ceal. She's an amazing teacher, just how simple she makes things for players to understand."

Jabir relished the year in Boulder, where his role was working with players and not being "the heavy" as all head coaches have to be at times. It re-charged his batteries, and then the head coaching job at Dayton opened in 2003.

His first season was a long one: 3-25. But after records of 12-16, 17-12 and 12-19, the Flyers are now 16-3. And thoughts of that first NCAA Tournament are realistic.

Senior forward Nikki Oakland hit two free throws with 3.3 seconds left Wednesday to give the Flyers a 45-43 victory at LaSalle. Oakland, who's from San Diego, leads Dayton with 13.5 points and 7.8 rebounds per game.

"Nikki could have gone to a couple of Pac-10 schools, but she came here," Jabir said. "Both her mom and dad are Marines, retired, and she's just so tough. The kid has a rod in her back, because she had scoliosis, and she takes more charges than anyone."

Also averaging in double figures for Dayton are Brittany Holterman (11.1) and Kristin Daugherty (10.6).

Daugherty is a freshman from Fresno, Ohio, and led her River View High team to Ohio state titles as a junior and senior.

"It's been a gratifying experience as a coach to see the growth here," Jabir said. "It's been so much fun."
