# DAYTON FLYERS WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

## HEAD COACH JIM JABIR

Hard-working. Compassionate. Dedicated. These are just a few words that come to mind when talking with Jim Jabir. On April 8, 2003, the University of Dayton introduced Jabir as the women's basketball team's eighth head coach and first male head coach in the history of the program.



Jabir was named the 2007-2008 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year after mentoring the Flyers to a modern-program record 25-9 record including an 12-6 mark in games decided by 10 points or less. Dayton tied for fourth in the Atlantic 10 Regular Season standings and defeated Massachusetts and Charlotte on its way to its second ever berth in the A-10 Semifinals.

The Flyers then went on to earn its second postseason berth in modern history with a trip to the WNIT to cap one of the best seasons in program history. UD improved by 13 victories from 2006-2007 to 2007-2008 on the strength of a school-record 16-game winning streak that was the longest in the nation at one point. The Flyers also earned their first ever votes in the AP Top 25 Poll in 2007-2008 as they were listed in two different weeks.

The Flyers have been one of the most improved teams in the nation under the direction of Jabir. In addition to the strides made in 2007-2008, UD had the fourth best single-season turnaround in the nation in the 2004-2005 season with an improvement of nine wins over the previous campaign. Jabir and Dayton continued the trend in 2005-2006 with an improvement of five more wins, giving UD the second best improvement over a two-year span in the nation.

"I am going to be the hardest working coach out there," stated Jabir. "I want people to fear playing the University of Dayton."

The 2005-06 season also saw two different Flyers earn Atlantic 10 All-Conference accolades as UD advanced finished sixth in a conference that sent five teams to postseason play. Dayton also advanced to the Quarterfinals of the A-10 Tournament and finished with a winning record for the first time in five years.

UD returned to the Atlantic 10 Quarterfinals at the conclusion of the 2006-07 season marking the third time in school history that the Flyers had advanced past their opening round in the Atlantic 10 Tournament. Dayton played close games throughout the 2006-07 campaign as 15 of its 31 games were decided by single digits despite having just one senior in the starting lineup.

Jabir came to UD after spending one season as an assistant at Colorado. In his last season at CU, the Buffaloes (24-8) advanced to the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Tournament and were ranked as high as 23rd in the ESPN/Coaches' Poll and 24th in the Associated Press Poll. Jabir was primarily responsible for the development of CU's post players, including the Buffaloes' first-ever First Team All-Big 12 selection.

Jabir had been a head coach for 16 seasons prior to coaching at CU with an all-time career mark of 220-223. His broad coaching experience ranges from the Big East Conference to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.

The Brooklyn, NY native began his coaching career as an assistant at Nazareth College (1984-85) and at Buffalo State (1985-86). Jabir was instrumental in leading the Bengals to a 23-3 slate, the SUNYAC title, a 22-game winning streak, an NCAA regional tournament appearance and a national ranking (No. 3) during the 1985-86 season.

After one season as an assistant, Jabir became the head coach at Buffalo State during the 1986-87 season at the age of 24. He led that team to a 14-11 record and guided the Bengals to the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) championship and an appearance in the Division III Tournament.

Jabir matriculated to Siena College from Buffalo State, where he served as the head coach of the Saints for three seasons (1987-90) and compiled a 50-29 record.

**Notes:** Justine Raterman was named a McDonald's All-America nominee after finishing her career as Versailles' all-time career leader in points, field goal shooting and rebounds. She led Versailles to the 2007-2008 State Championship with a perfect 28-0 record averaging 18.0 ppg and 9.1 rpg. Raterman also shot 62.5 percent from the field and 82.2 from the free-throw line while dishing out 2.6 apg and taking away 2.2 spg.

**10 DE'SARAE CHAMBERS • G**

**Notes:** De'Sarae Chambers finished as the all-time leading scorer in Mason County school history and averaged 21.7 ppg last season. She made 56.5 percent of her shots from the floor as well as 56.3 percent of her shots from three-point range while hitting at an 82 percent clip from the free throw line. Chambers also pulled down 8.0 rebounds per game. She was named the KABC 10th Region Player of the Year.

**42 BRITTANY WILSON • F**

**Notes:** Brittany Wilson was named to the All-Tournament Team after leading her squad to the State Semifinals and a 30-6 record this past season at Manual. She was also the MVP of the Regional Tournament and a First Team All-State selection by the Courier Journal. Wilson averaged a double-double of 18.7 ppg and 11.5 rpg to go along with 2.9 spg and 2.1 apg as a senior. She will redshirt the 2008-09 season due to injury.

**Notes:** Casey Nance was a Second Team All-State selection and the Tri-County Coaches Association Player of the Year after averaging a double-double with 14.8 ppg and 16.2 rpg as a senior. She led Revere to an 18-5 record and a berth in the District Semifinals while recording 3.8 bpg, 1.6 apg and 1.3 spg. Nance was also a First Team All-Tri-County, All-League and All-District honoree.

**Notes:** Sophomore transfer Elle Queen played in all 32 games and started 29 last season at Colorado State. She ranked third on the team in both scoring and rebounding as a freshman. Queen was a four-year letterwinner in basketball at Minnetonka High School where she earned First-team all-district honors her sophomore, junior, and senior years. She holds the school's record for rebounding and steals. She will sit out this season due to NCAA eligibility rules.

Moses also earned All-Tournament honors at the District and Regional Tournaments.

Lalor was a Toledo City League All-Academic Team pick and was also a First Team selection by the All-Toledo City League and All-District VII Team.

**Notes:** Staci Willis joins Dayton's roster as a walk on. Willis hails from Cincinnati, Ohio where she was an open role player at Walnut Hills. She produced some of her best statistical numbers in 2006 (9.7 points per game and shot at a 40.9% clip from three-point range). She helped her team to a 21-3 overall record last year (10-0 in conference play).

Jabir's teams posted three consecutive winning seasons. In his first season, Jabir was responsible for the development of Siena's first-ever Freshman All-American.

After his stint at Siena, Jabir spent six years at Marquette University becoming one of the most successful coaches in the history of the program, elevating the Golden Eagles into the national spotlight. After posting a 7-20 record during his inaugural year (1990-91) at Marquette, Jabir guided his team to four consecutive winning seasons, two 20-plus winning seasons and three post-season appearances, including back-to-back bids to the NCAA Tournament. In 1994-95, Marquette won the Great Midwest Conference Tournament, the first tournament championship in school history. This followed the 1993-94 campaign in which Jabir compiled a program-best 22-7 overall record and its first trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Before his stint at Colorado, Jabir was at the helm of Providence College for six seasons, 1996-2002. During his last three years, the Friars' record improved with each season and in his final season, the Friars finished 13-15 overall and eighth of 14 schools in the prestigious Big East, its highest finish ever since the Big East went to a one division format.

Jabir was a two-time Reebok/Great Midwest Conference Coach of the Year while at Marquette. Jabir is a 1984 graduate of Nazareth College in Rochester, New York, where he received a degree in English. He also earned his Masters degree in Student Personnel Administration from Buffalo State in 1986. Jabir and his wife Kathy have three children, Lauren, Shane and Jackson.

## 2008 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL MEDIA DAY

The 2008-09 University of Dayton women's basketball team kicked off the upcoming basketball season with the start of practice last Friday with its annual media day at the Athletics Practice Facility on UD's campus.

Flyer fans will get their first look at the men's and women's basketball teams on Saturday, Oct. 25 at the Red & Blue Games from UD Arena. Admission is free and open to the public. Doors open at 9 a.m. ET and the first 500 fans in attendance will receive complimentary donuts and milk. Free vouchers will also be given to the Flyer Football game as Dayton hosts Valparaiso Crusaders at 1 p.m. ET from Welcome Stadium.

## SEASON PREVIEW

The Dayton's women's basketball team experienced its most successful season in modern history in 2007-2008 with votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll, a modern-program record for wins in a season (25), a berth in the Atlantic 10 Championship semifinals and a trip to the postseason WNIT. UD made the third largest improvement in the nation from 2006-07 to last season for its first postseason appearance in eight years. Dayton won 16 consecutive games at one point, which was the longest winning streak in school history.

Now the challenge for the 2008 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year Jim Jabir is to continue the strides made last season following the loss of seven seniors, including four starters, which led the team to a 25-9 overall record.

"We're excited to start a new era in our program, to take another step," said Coach Jabir. "We have a very talented and young group and we're eager to start new traditions. We have a new group and a lot of possibilities and we're excited about those possibilities."

Of the 14 players on the roster, six are returnees, including Atlantic 10 All-Rookie selection Kristin Daugherty. Daugherty started all but three games as a freshman and ranked third in both scoring (9.3 ppg) and blocked shots (0.56 bpg) and was second in rebounding (5.0 rpg). Her ability to play in the paint and hit shots from the outside will be key for the Flyers in a fast-paced offense that ranked third in the A-10 in scoring and included a school-record 186 made three-point shots last season.

Daugherty will be joined by junior Kendel Ross who has been one of Dayton's top options off the bench for the past two seasons. Ross led the Flyer reserves in rebounding (4.4 rpg) and field goal percentage (.464) against A-10 opponents last season and is expected to move into a starting role in 2008-09 after battling for a spot on the Canadian National Team over the summer.

That duo will be asked to lead a group of newcomers that make up one of the Top 40 recruiting classes in the nation according to the BlueStar Report. The class includes McDonald's All-America nominees De'Sarae Chambers and Justine Raterman as well as All-State selections Patrice Lalor, Kayla Moses, Casey Nance and Brittany Wilson. Staci Willis and transfer Elle Queen also join the roster.

Jabir feels confident about the team's preparation leading up to the start of the season. "I think the preseason has gone well. Everyone has worked really hard. The newcomers have bought into our program and have adopted our work ethic. We're strong. We're ready to get going."

The 2008-2009 campaign will tip-off with an exhibition game versus the Ohio Legends on Nov. 6 (5:30 p.m. ET) at UD Arena. The Flyers will open up the regular season on the road at the WorldVision Classic hosted by Texas. Dayton will face Texas in the second game of the tournament on Nov. 15 at 7:30 p.m. ET.

## OFF TO A FRESH START

Dayton's incoming class is not just filled with a large quantity of players, but quality as well. All three of the Ohio natives made the list of Top 25 prep seniors in the State by the Ohio Girls Basketball Report. Also, all three of the Kentucky prep players were listed among the best players in the Bluegrass State by the Rick Bolus' High Potential® Basketball Recruiting Service, Inc. Overall, the Flyer class was ranked No. 39 nationally by the Blue Star Report.

## BEST YEAR IN HISTORY

The University of Dayton women's basketball team had one of the best seasons in recent history in 2007-2008 in part because of a seven-member senior class. Dayton made the third largest improvement in the nation and finished with a modern school-record 25 victories to earn a berth in the WNIT. The Flyers were tied for fourth in the Atlantic 10 standings and advanced to the A-10 Semifinals for only the second time ever under the direction of 2007-2008 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year Jim Jabir. UD earned its first ever votes in the AP Top 25 Poll and won 16 consecutive games at one point, which was the longest winning streak in school history.

## DAYTON ONE OF NATION'S BEST TURNAROUNDS

The Flyers are once again one of the most improved teams in the nation after last season. They owned the third best turnaround in the nation last season with an improvement of 13 victories from the 2006-2007 season.

## JABIR, 2008 A-10 COACH OF THE YEAR

After leading Dayton to the third biggest improvement in the nation over the regular season, Flyer Head Coach Jim Jabir was tabbed as the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year. It's the first time in program history a head coach has ever earned the honor while at Dayton.

## START ME UP

Kendel Ross, one of Dayton's best bench performers over the past two seasons, appeared in all 30 games in 2007-08 putting up double digits in all but two. Ross is expected to earn a spot in the starting line up this season after ranking third on the team in overall and three-point field goal percentage last year. She led all reserves in minutes played (19.3 mpg), assists (1.6 apg) and steals (0.7 spg). The Canada native made 50 percent (50-of-100) of her shots from the field and 86.7 percent (13-of-15) of her free throws during the second half of games last year.

## O'CANADA, O' CANADA

In the summer of 2006, Kendel Ross helped lead the Canadian Junior National Team to a silver medal in the FIBA America's U18 Championship Qualifier in Colorado Springs, Colorado. She average 9.4 ppg, 9.2 rpg, and 26.0 mpg. She also helped lead Canada to a third place finish at the 2006 FIBA Americas U20 Championship averaging 8.4 ppg and 3.2 rpg.

## **KENDEL, AN ALL-TOURNEY TALENT**

Kendel Ross was named to the All-Tournament Team at the Dayton Flyer Classic last December after finishing with nine points, eight rebounds and three assists against Cornell. She followed with 10 points, eight rebounds, three assists and one block against Central Michigan. In 2007-08, Ross led all Flyer reserves in assists (1.67 apg) and steals (0.85 spg) while ranking second in scoring (7.0 ppg) and rebounds (4.5 rpg).

## **ROSS STEPS UP AT GW**

Making just her seventh career start and first ever in conference play, Kendel Ross had her best day in a Flyer uniform at #16/13 George Washington on Jan. 29, 2008. She posted a career-best 16 points including 14 in the first half against the Colonials. Ross hit 5-of-9 shots from the field including 2-of-3 from three-point range to go along with six rebounds, three assists and one steal.

## **ONE OF THE BEST**

It could easily be said that sophomore Kristin Daugherty had the best season of any Flyer freshman in over a decade after starting 27 of 30 regular season games in 2007-08. The Atlantic 10 All-Rookie selection finished the regular season sixth in single-season scoring and seventh in rebounding amongst UD freshmen all-time. A three-time A-10 Rookie of the week, reached double figures in scoring 12 times including a double-double of 14 points and 12 rebounds in Dayton's win over A-10 Regular Season Champ Temple.

## **DAUGHERTY DELIVERS FOR DAYTON**

A two-time Ms. Ohio as a prep, Kristin Daugherty made a big impact for the Flyers during the 2007-2008 season. The three-time A-10 Rookie of the Week averaged 9.4 ppg (3rd on team) and 5.0 rpg (2nd on team). She led River View High School to State Titles as both a junior and senior and finished as River View's all-time leading scorer with 1,800 career points. Daugherty averaged 20.0 ppg, 8.0 rpg and 4.3 apg as a senior and was ranked among the Top 35 forwards nationally in the 2007 recruiting class by Scout.com.

## **KRISTIN GOES FOR 20 THREETIMES**

Kristin Daugherty scored 20 points or more three times last season including twice in a three-game span. She scored 17 of a team-high 20 points in the second half of UD's 59-57 comeback win at Eastern Michigan on Dec. 21, 2007. She tallied 10 in a row at one point to take the Flyers from down eight to up two in the final minutes. Daugherty then put up 14 points in the second half to score a season-high 26 points during an 86-71 victory over Central Michigan. She hit on 5-of-8 shots from three-point range in the win over the Chippewas. Daugherty also scored 20 points at Duquesne on Jan. 19, 2008 while making 6-of-12 shots from the field and going 7-for-8 from the free-throw line.

## **KRISTIN STARTS STRONG AGAINST CLEMSON**

Sophomore Kristin Daugherty was not intimidated in her first collegiate game against an ACC opponent. She scored 10 points in the first 8:25 as UD built a 49-16 halftime lead on Clemson en route to an 81-43 victory. Daugherty hit four of her first five shots from the field including a three-pointer, a fade away jumper from the baseline and a drive to the hoop from the right wing.

## **ROCKIN' AND ROSCHEN'**

As a reserve post player, last season Marie Rosche provided solid defense and a spark off the bench while averaging 5.6 mpg. She appeared in 18 of 30 regular season games playing seven minutes or more six times averaging 1.1 rpg and 0.8 spg.

## **ROSCHEROLLS INTO DAYTON**

Forward Marie Rosche was born in Senegal and came to the US to play basketball as a sophomore at Westtown (Pa.) HS where she was a three-time All-League pick in basketball, track & field and soccer. UD looks for her to use the same athletic ability that led her to a Private School State Title in the High Jump and to the League Championship on the hardwood.

## **OFF THE BENCH**

Aundrea Lindsey came off the bench in 18 of 30 games last year averaging 5.8 mpg. She used a quick first step to shoot 43.9 percent from the field. She tallied five points in 12 minutes of action during a victory against Western Michigan. The native of the Windy City made all three free throw attempts to score seven points in 13 minutes at Loyola-Chicago. She scored a season-best eight points on 4-for-8 shooting from the floor against Clemson.

## **LINDSEY GOOD FOR A DOZEN**

Aundrea Lindsey posted 12 points while shooting a perfect 3-for-3 from the field in just her second collegiate game on Nov. 11, 2006 against Memphis. She was also 5-of-6 from the free throw line.

## **GAINEY TO SIT FOR FLYERS**

Ebony Gainey will not play for the women's basketball team due to a congenital medical condition that was discovered just before the start of the 2007-08 season.

"We are disappointed for Ebony because she was looking forward to helping us win this season," Flyer Head Coach Jim Jabir said. "We still feel fortunate to have her as a part of our family because signing her was a major step towards building a championship program."

Gainey was a two-time All-Ohio selection at Meadowdale High School. She took home AP Division I Special Mention honors as a senior after averaging 11.6 points, 10.5 rebounds, 7.7 assists, 6.1 steals and 4.5 blocks per game while racking up five triple-doubles. She garnered AP Honorable Mention All-Ohio honors as a junior after averaging 15.4 points per game. Gainey was named the SWPOL Player of the Year as a sophomore after nearly averaging a triple-double with 10.8 points, 10.3 rebounds and 8.0 assists per game. She ranked among the Top 70 players nationally in the Class of 2007 according to the Blue Star Report.

## **UNBRIDLED SPIRIT**

A 5-9 guard from Mason County (KY) High School, De'Sarae Chambers, finished as the all-time leading scorer in school history and was nominated for McDonald's All-America honors after averaging 21.7 ppg last season. She made 56.5 percent of her shots from the floor as well as 56.3 percent of her shots from three-point range while hitting at an 82 percent clip from the free throw line. Chambers also pulled down 8.0 rebounds per game while leading Mason County to a 24-8 record and a runner-up finish in the Regional Tournament. She was also named the KABC 10th Region Player of the Year as well as the Kenton County All-Tournament Team.

## **A PAT ON THE BACK**

Patrice Lator, a 5-6 guard from Toledo's (OH) Notre Dame High School, was an Honorable Mention All-State selection despite missing the final 11 games of the season due to injury. She led her team to a 9-0 record before her injury with 13.1 ppg, 6.6 apg, 4.4 spg and 4.2 rpg. Lator was a Toledo City League All-Academic Team pick and was also a First Team selection by the All-Toledo City League and All-District VII Team.

## **FROM THE BLUEGRASS STATE**

Kayla Moses, a 5-4 guard from Scott County (KY) High School, was a Third Team All-State pick by the Courier Journal after helping her team to a 16-14 overall record this past season. Scott County was a Regional Semifinalist behind 21.9 ppg, 4.9 rpg and 3.1 apg by Moses this season. She also shot nearly 76 percent from the free throw line while being named to the All-Ith Region Team. Moses also earned All-Tournament honors at the District and Regional Tournaments.

## **COURTIN' CASEY**

Casey Nance, a 6-4 guard from Akron's (OH) Revere High School, was a Second Team All-State selection and the Tri-County Coaches Association Player of the Year after averaging a double-double with 14.8 ppg and 16.2 rpg as a senior. She led Revere to an 18-5 record and a berth in the District Semifinals while recording 3.8 bpg, 1.6 apg and 1.3 spg. Nance was also a First Team All-Tri-County, All-League and All-District honoree.

## **IT'S IN THE GENES**

Casey Nance's father, Larry Nance, played in the NBA for both the Phoenix Suns and the Cleveland Cavaliers. Also known as "Leapin' Larry", Mr. Nance was the first-ever Slam Dunk Champion in 1984.

## **RATTLIN' RATERMAN**

Justine Raterman, a 6-1 forward from Versailles (OH) High School, was a McDonald's All-America nominee after finishing her career as the school's all-time career leader in points, field goal shooting and rebounds. She led Versailles to the 2007-2008 State Championship with a perfect 28-0 record after averaging 18.0 ppg and 9.1 rpg. Raterman also shot 62.5 percent from the field and 82.2 from the free-throw line while dishing out 2.6 apg and taking away 2.2 spg. She was a First Team All-State selection while also being named the Darke County and MAC Player of the Year.

## **OH H WILSON!**

Brittany Wilson, a 5-11 forward from Louisville's (KY) Manual High School, was named to the All-Tournament Team after leading her squad to the State Semifinals and a 30-6 record this past season. She was also the MVP of the Regional Tournament and a First Team All-State selection by the Courier Journal. Wilson averaged a double-double of 18.7 ppg and 11.5 rpg to go along with 2.9 spg and 2.1 apg as a senior. Wilson will redshirt the 2008-09 season due to injury.

## **QUEEN OF THE COURT**

Sophomore transfer Elle Queen comes from Colorado State where last season she saw action in all 32 games, starting 29 of them. She ranked third on the team in both scoring and rebounding as a freshman. She tallied a season-high 16 points on 5-for-12 shooting from the floor and grabbed seven rebounds in a win over UNLV in the opening round of the Mountain West Conference Tournament.

She was as four-year letterwinner in basketball and two-year letterwinner in track at Minnetonka High School where she earned First-team all-district honors her sophomore, junior, and senior years. She was second team all-mention her senior year, all-state honorable mention her junior and senior seasons and helped lead Minnetonka to a conference championship. She holds the school's record for rebounding and steals. She will sit out one year do to NCAA transfer rules.

# DAYTON FLYERS WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

## **WILLIS WILLS HER WAY**

Freshman Staci Willis joins Dayton's roster as a walk on. Willis hails from Cincinnati, Ohio where she was an open role player at Walnut Hills. She produced some of her best statistical numbers in 2006 (9.7 points per game and shot at a 40.9% clip from three-point range). The Flyer rookie helped her team to a 21-3 overall record last year (10-0 in conference play).

## **ATTENTION FROM THE FLYER FAITHFUL**

An average of 1,604 fans per game saw the Flyers play in their 13 home games at UD Arena in 2005-06. During the 2004-05 season, Dayton drew 1,240 fans per game to UD Arena which was a Regional host of the 2007 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship and will host again in 2010. Last season, the Flyers averaged 1,745 fans per game including a single-game season-high of 2,325 versus Rhode Island on Feb. 17, 2008. UD also drew 2,288 for the A-10 opener against Temple on Jan. 12, 2008. The Flyers ranked second in the A-10 last season in attendance, runner-up to Charlotte.

## **THE EUROPEAN INFLUENCE**

The freelance style of Dayton's offense comes from a theory of attacking the defense with momentum and fluidity. UD Head Coach Jim Jabir got the idea for the new offense from former Marquette men's basketball player Tony Miller. Miller (point guard from 1991-95) and Jabir (coach from 1990-96) were both at Marquette and have kept in touch while Miller has been playing in Europe for several years. Miller came to Dayton and taught Jabir and his staff the new system before the Flyers' 10-day trip to Europe during summer 2005.

## **AN UP TEMPO ATTACK**

Dayton plays an up tempo style that pushes the ball up the court and challenges opposing defenses to keep up the pace. The Flyers ranked third in the A-10 with an average of 65.9 ppg in 2007-08. UD scored 65.3 ppg (7th in A-10) last season and 64.4 ppg (4th in A-10) in 2005-2006. Dayton connected on 826-of-1972 (.419) shots from the field last season (third in A-10).

## **FLYERS PILED UP THE POINTS**

After scoring at least 80 points just once during the first two years (2003-2005) of Jim Jabir's tenure at Dayton, the Flyers have nearly broken the century mark in each of the past two seasons. UD scored 95 points on Jan. 8, 2005 in a win over Saint Louis (95-73) and put up 96 points in a victory over Memphis on the opening weekend of the 2006-2007 season. The 96 points scored on Nov. 11, 2006 was the most for the Flyers during a non-overtime game in 20 years. It also tied for the most by an A-10 team in 2005-06.

## **SETTING THE STANDARD**

Dayton has hit at least one three point shot in 221 consecutive games dating back to Jan. 2, 2001, the longest streak in the Atlantic 10 Conference.

## **TOURNEY TOWN**

The NCAA Division I Men's Tournament will make its start at UD Arena this season for the eighth year in a row. The NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee has announced that the University of Dayton Arena will host the NCAA Opening Round Game in 2009. UD has hosted the opening round game since its inception in its current form in 2002. Dayton will also be a First and Second Round site for the 2009 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship as well as a 2010 Women's Regional. UD Arena has been an NCAA site in 23 of the last 40 years and has hosted 75 NCAA Tournament games.
