The University of Dayton women's soccer team will be heading to Ypsilanti, Mich. to battle Michigan in a non-conference match at 5:30 p.m. ET. Due to ongoing construction of the new U-M Soccer Complex, the match will be played at Eastern Michigan's Sciocluna Field.

SCOUTING MICHIGAN

The Wolverines (1-2-1) are coming off their first win of the season, a 1-0 victory over Miami on Aug. 31. Michigan was picked to finish seventh in the Big Ten Coaches Poll. Michigan's freshman class was voted as the top recruiting class in the Big Ten Conference, placed No. 16 nationally in Soccer Buzz Magazine and was recognized as the second best recruiting class in the Great Lakes Region. The Flyers are 0-4 in the all-time series with the Maize and Blue.

FLYER HISTORY

The women's squad finished 2007 with a 13-4-4 record and went 6-2-3 in the Atlantic 10. The Flyers secured a fifth place finish in the league, ending the year in dramatic fashion losing to the Fordham Rams on a penalty kick shootout (4-3) in the semifinal round of the A-10 Championship. Dayton women's soccer owns an overall record of 311-140-33 since it became a varsity program in 1984.

RAVE RANKINGS

UD received seven votes in the NSCAA/adidas® National Rankings and are ranked fifth in the NSCAA/adidas® Great Lakes Region Poll. The Flyers remain ranked seventh of 60 teams in the Great Lakes Region by Soccer Buzz Magazine.

SECOND TO NONE

Five-time Atlantic 10 tournament champion Dayton was selected to finish second in the 2008 Women's Soccer Pre-season Coaches Poll. In 2007 the Flyers finished with an overall record of 13-4-4, including a 6-2-3 mark in the A-10. The Flyers, five-time winners of the A-10 Tournament Championship and eight-time regular season champs, secured an A-10 Championship playoff berth for the 12th consecutive season. While Dayton lost eight seniors to graduation, seven starters return from last season's campaign. The six-team A-10 Women's Soccer Championship will be held Nov. 6-9 at Robert R. Hermann Stadium on the campus of Saint Louis University.

KEY RECRUITING

The University of Dayton women's soccer team 2008 recruiting class was ranked 72nd nationally as announced by Soccer Buzz Magazine. The Flyers incoming class is second among Atlantic 10 schools and is among the nation's Top 100 for the fifth straight year.

GETTING AN ENGLISH EDUCATION

The Flyer women's soccer squad welcomed their first-ever international student-athlete in freshman Josie Grant, a midfielder from Wigton, Cumbria, England.

HEAD COACH MIKE TUCKER



Entering his 14th season at the helm in 2008, University of Dayton head coach Mike Tucker has built the Flyers into one of the Atlantic 10 Conference's premier programs during his tenure. The two-time A-10 Coach of the Year boasts a 187-73-15 lifetime record and a .707 winning percentage. The Flyers have won the Atlantic 10 more

often than not under Tucker, as UD has tallied eight regular season conference titles in 13 seasons, five conference tournament championships, five NCAA tournament appearances, and a trip to the NCAA "Sweet 16."

In 2007, the women's squad finished 13-4-4 overall and 6-2-3 in the Atlantic 10. Beginning with the Gopher Invitational, the Flyers started on an 8-1-2 stretch, carrying into late October to position the team for a run in the conference tournament. For the second straight year, Coach Tucker relied on his youth to step

up and add quality minutes for the Flyers. Versatility was key in Dayton's successful season as 13 different players scored at least a goal during the year and 10 Flyers scored at least two goals. The Flyers secured a fifth place finish in the league, ending the year in dramatic fashion losing to the Fordham Rams on a penalty kick shootout (4-3) in the semifinal round of the A-10 Championship. Although Dayton will lose eight seniors to graduation, including Conference Defender of the Year in goalkeeper Nikki Reed; among the team's returnees is A-10 Offensive Player of the Year Mandi Bäck, who once again led the team in shots (101), points (30), goals (14), and game-winners (5).

In 2004, Dayton made its fifth NCAA Championship appearance, won its eighth A-10 regular season crown and its fifth A-10 tournament title. UD, which was ranked 20th in the final top 25 poll, set a school record with its 20-2 mark. The Flyers also took the nation's longest winning streak -- a team-record straight 20 games -- into the Big Dance.

He has a long tradition of molding his student-athletes

into winners both on the field, and more importantly in the classroom. Under Tucker, the Flyers have captured 10 straight Team Academic Awards (team GPA of 3.0 or higher) from the NSCAA, while six Flyers have earned Academic All-District recognition and three have been named Academic All-America.

A career that began with a 9-9-1 campaign in 1995, the talent he has inked in his 13-year tenure has completely rewritten the UD record books. Eleven of Tucker's recruits have recorded either single-season or career top 10 performances. Additionally, of the top 10 scoring performances by a freshman since 1988, 10 of them have been achieved by a player he recruited. Tucker took the helm in 1995, the same year the University of Dayton entered the Atlantic 10 Conference. Although he endured an up-and-down first season, he began laying the groundwork for the future.

Tucker goes back to the roots of the UD women's soccer program. His daughter Lori played for, while Tucker was an assistant for, UD's first women's soccer head coach, Tom Schindler. When Schindler was succeeded by Bill Glisson, Tucker remained with the program as the top assistant. Tucker followed Glisson to become the school's third women's head coach and the sport's first full-time head coach.

RECAP OF THE ILLINI CHALLENGE CUP

The Flyers (2-1) played their second nationally-ranked Big Ten opponent in as many weeks when they faced Illinois. Dayton beat Indiana (No. 26 at the time UD played them) 4-1 in their season opener. UD fell to No. 18 Illinois, 1-0, in overtime of the championship game of the Illini Challenge Cup. The setback to the Illini is the first overtime loss for the Flyers since Oct. 29, 2006 at Charlotte, a 3-2 loss in double overtime. Since then the Flyers have been 6-0-4 in overtime matches. They advanced to the championship by upending Pittsburg, 3-2 in double overtime. Sophomores Kelly Blumenstein and Jerica DeWolfe and freshman Kelsey Miller were named to the Illini Challenge Cup all-tournament team

TERRIFIC TUCKER

Head Coach Mike Tucker's Flyer squads are 103-20-6 in A-10 play. He is the only active in the A-10 to achieve more than 100 wins. UD has won seven of the 13 conference regular season titles. In addition, his teams have won the A-10 Tournament Championship five times (1996, 1999, 2001, 2003, 2004), also earning an NCAA berth each of those years.

BÄCK AND MILLER HONORED

Junior forward Mandi Bäck was named the Atlantic 10 Player of the Week and freshman defender Kelsey Miller was named Atlantic 10 Co-Rookie of the Week for Aug. 18-24. Bäck earned the honor for the second time in her career after tallying two goals in Dayton's 4-1 victory over No. 26 ranked Indiana on Aug. 22. The Hoosier back line boasted Hermann Trophy Watch List candidate Kelly Lawrence, but Bäck was the star in this match. The reigning A-10 Offensive Player of the Year scored in the 6th minute and in the 58th minute against the nationally-ranked Hoosiers. She now has 23 career goals to her credit. Miller started at central defender, one of four freshmen who started the Flyers' season opener against Indiana, and played the entire 90 minutes.

Miller and the Flyer defense allowed the No. 26 Hoosiers just four shots on goal and was up to the task and held 2007 All Big-Ten selection Kristin Arnold (10 goals in 2007) to just one shot. Miller has a strong soccer defensive family lineage - her brother Ryan played for Notre Dame and was drafted by the Columbus Crew, and her brother Andy is a starting defender and senior at Wisconsin.

MORE HONORS FOR BÄCK AND MILLER

Mandi Bäck was named to the Soccer Buzz Magazine Elite Team of the Week for her efforts in the Flyers' 4-1 win over nationally-ranked Indiana. Bäck is joined on the Elite Team this week by her sister Britni, a junior forward for the Zips who became the first-ever Akron women's soccer player to achieve the honor. This is the second time in her career that Bäck was named to the esteemed Elite Team of the Week. Kelsey Miller was named to the Soccer America Women's Soccer Team of the Week for her performance in UD's 4-1 win over IU. Miller started at central defender in the Flyers season opener at Baujan Field. She was one of four freshmen who started the opener and played the entire 90 minutes. Soccer America's Team of the Week honors the top 11 performers around the nation for their efforts over the previous week and is considered one of the top honors available during the regular season.

GALLAVANTING GIBSON

Midfielder Colleen Gibson was named to the NSCAA/adidas All-Great Lakes Regional Third Team and First Team All-Ohio as a sophomore last season.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Flyer's will return to Baujan Field to play Cincinnati on Tuesday, Sept. 9 at 7:30 p.m. ET.

2007 IN REVIEW

DEFENDERS OF THE HOUSE

The Flyers, having won .667 of their season games, only fell twice in the 2007 season on their home turf. UD's Baujan Field annually ranks among NCAA leaders in attendance for women's soccer. The Flyers were second in the A-10 conference with an average of 685 fans per game. Senior NIKI REED and sophomores MANDI BÄCK and COLLEEN GIBSON were among 11 Division I women's soccer players to be named to Ohio Collegiate Soccer Association's (OCSA) 1st Team All-Ohio. Aside from the University of Toledo, Dayton was the only team to have three of its athletes to receive this acknowledgement.

The Flyers tallied three four-game WINNING STREAKS during the '07 campaign, including two pre-season victories over Michigan and London City Supernova.

OVERTIME SUCCESS

The Flyers played in 14 overtime periods over a span of eight games (six double overtime periods). Not once did the Flyers lose in an overtime matchup, and only three of the eight games were settled with a tie.

A-10 ACADEMIC HONORS

Junior midfielder AMANDA GALLOW earned A-10 Academic Team Honors with a 3.91 grade point average. Her success in the classroom mirrored her performance on the field, as she started all nine games in which she played and recorded two goals and an assist as a junior.

GAMEWINNERS

Colleen Proffitt and Mandi Bäck made game-winning goals their forte as they each secured two Flyer over-time victories in the 2007 campaign. Freshman Lauren Maybury tallied her first collegiate goal with a game-winning shot in extra minutes against Loyola Marymount. Of the 21 games played throughout the course of the season, the Flyers only allowed their opponents two or more goals in four contests. Goal keeper and A-10 Defensive Player of the Year NIKI REED protected the net, finishing the season with eight shut-outs (second in conference) and holding the foe to under two goals in .810 of their matchups.

A-10 ACCOLADES

Including Niki Reed and Mandi Bäck who earned A-10 Defensive and Offensive players of the year (respectively), the Flyers had a total of SIX ATHLETES TO EARN A-10 ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS in 2007. Courtney Sirmans and Niki Reed were members of the A-10 All Championship team. Reed, Bäck and Colleen Gibson were named to the All-Conference first-team. Kelly Blumenschein represented UD on the A-10 All-Rookie team and Amanda Gallow earned Academic All-Conference honors.

BÄCK TO BÄCK

For the second consecutive season, Mandi Bäck led Dayton in shots (101), points (30), goals (14), and game-winners (5). She was named to the Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference team, as selected by the league's head coaches. Bäck, the 2007 A-10 Women's Soccer Offensive Player of the Year, was named to the NSCAA/adidas All-Great Lakes Regional Third Team.
