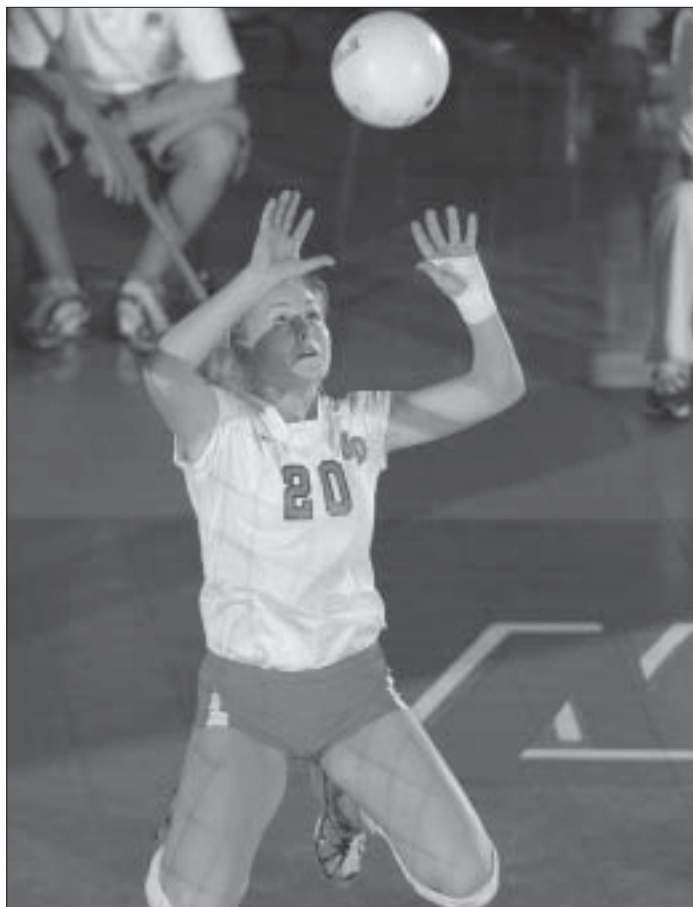

2003...UD's starting setter in all 36 matches...Posted 1,125 assists which ranked fourth in the Atlantic 10...Second on the team with 35 service aces...Also posted 336 digs and 65 kills...In the season opener against Tulsa, she tallied a career-high 51 assists while adding nine digs and three kills...Had 18 matches with 30 or more assists...Tallied career-high of five kills against Fairfield, Temple and Xavier...Had 45 assists and 10 digs in UD's First Round NCAA Tournament win at Michigan State...Posted career-high of 24 digs against then-No. 24 Loyola Marymount...Named All-Tournament at the Raider Challenge.

2002...Named to the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie squad...Competed in 111 games, posting 649 assists and 178 digs...Her 5.85 assists per game ranked 10th in the Atlantic 10...Tied for team lead with 34 service aces...Earned A-10 Rookie of the Week honors after an 18-assist, six-dig, and four service ace performance against Xavier...Posted a season-high 49 assists against Virginia in the Dayton Flyer Classic...Had 10 or more assists in 24 matches...Had 32 assists against Wright State...Tallied 37 assists and eight digs against Xavier...Had career-best six service aces against George Washington...Posted season-best three kills against Cincinnati.

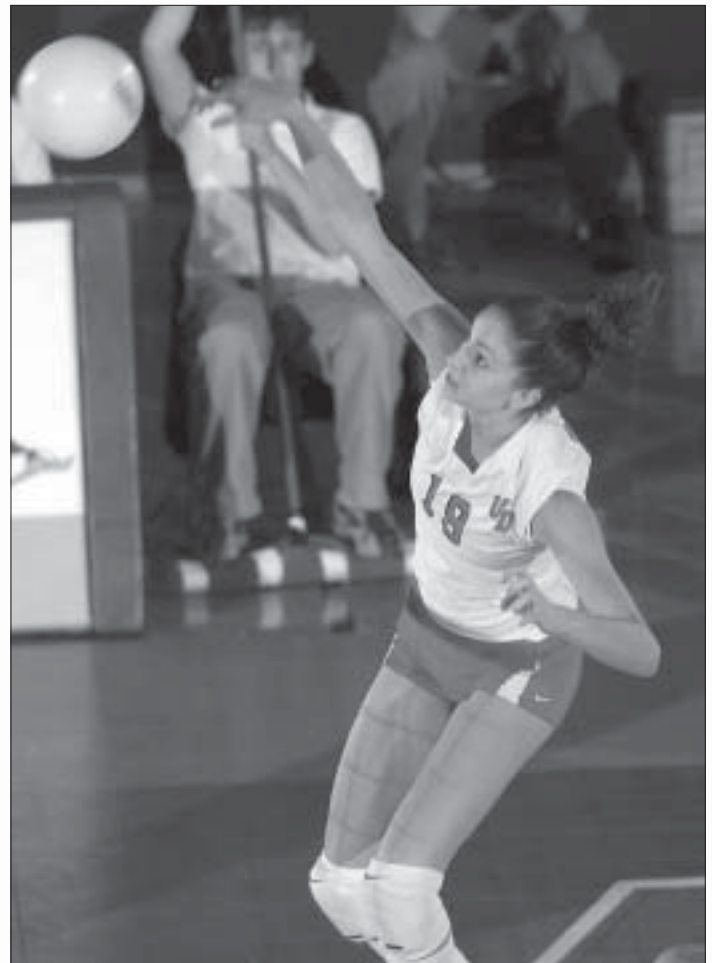
Coch Horsmon on Faye...Faye has become one of the most dominating players in the conference...Her game will continue to improve by learning the mental aspects of the game and consistency...Improved strength will also take Faye to a level played only by the elite players in the country...Faye will be given the opportunity to win a great deal of matches this year.

2004...AVCA Honorable Mention All-America...AVCA All-Northeast Region...A-10 All-Conference...A-10 All-Championship Team...Named A-10 Player of the Week four times...Played in 108 games and all 32 matches for the Flyers...Ranked 28th nationally in both blocks per game (1.47 bpg) and hitting percentage (.377)...both marks led the A-10...She led the A-10 in points per game at 5.45...Ranked second on the team and third in the conference in kills per game (4.44 kpg)...She had the second best single-season hitting percentage ever in UD history...Her 46 solo blocks are the fourth most in school history...Also her 113 block assists and 480 kills are each the sixth most in UD single season history...She set the NCAA record for single-match hitting percentage at La Salle on Oct. 9 when she hit 24 kills in 30 attempts and no errors for an .800 mark...One of only two players in the A-10 to record 30 kills in a match against GW on Nov. 12...Had a Fitzgerald Fieldhouse record while leading UD to a 3-1 upset over Pittsburgh with eight solo blocks at the Panther Classic...Posted 18 kills and seven blocks in the A-10 Championship Match versus Xavier...Finished with 28 double-digit kill matches, 16 with at least 5.0 blocks and 23 with over 15.0 points scored.

2003...Named AVCA Northeast Region and Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year after averaging 2.48 kills and a league-best 1.37 blocks per game...Played in all 131 games for the Flyers...Posted a then career-high of 15 kills against both Michigan State in the NCAA First Round and Rhode Island...Had 13 matches with 10 or more kills...Her 1.37 blocks per game ranked first in the A-10...Posted career-high of 11 blocks on three occasions...Her 10 block assists against Temple were also a career-high...Had a then career-high four solo blocks at Minnesota...Named A-10 Rookie of the Week six times...Her 140 block assists are the most ever by a Flyer in a season...Her .321 hitting percentage ranked second on the team and second in the A-10...Earned All-Tournament honors at the Pittsburgh Invitational.

HIGH SCHOOL...Named to the All-Ohio First Team as a senior...Shelby County League and District 9 Player of the Year...Three-time *Dayton Daily News* All-Area pick...Three-time All-League honoree...Third Team All-Ohio selection as a sophomore and junior...Left Fort Loramie holding six school records including kills in a career (776), season (259) and in a match (29)...Also holds season records for solo blocks (111) and total blocks (187)...Was also named League and District Player of the Year in basketball...Finished hoops career with 1,131 points, second in school history...Also finished fifth in the long jump and seventh in the high jump at the state track and field meet.

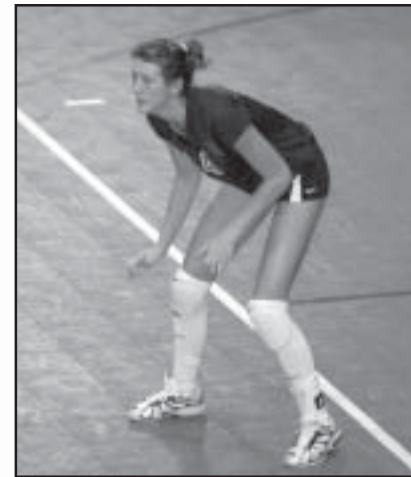
Coach Horsmon on Courtney...Courtney had a great second half of her 2004 season and was a major contributor defensively...She is a versatile player who could learn to play many positions.

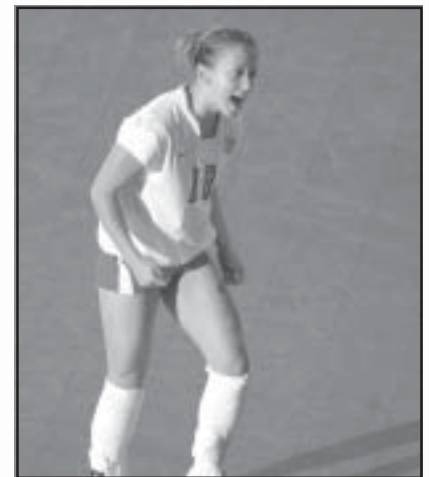


Coach Horsmon on Angela...Angela brings a tough, hard nosed attitude to the team and will challenge for time at libero.
