- Quintin Hoch-Bullen had a team-high 59 points (41 g, 18 a) with Julia Feiss scoring a team-high 45 goals and Kendra Lanuza tallying a team-high 28 assists.
- On defense, Kennedy Milburn (42 gb, 21 ct) and Katherine Fischer (22 ct, 39 gb) were first and second on the team in ground balls.

- All-Summit League First-Team member Chris Korte was selected to compete in the NCAA Regional in the Selection Show on May 3.
- Korte is the first Pioneer to be selected to compete in NCAA Regional since Petter Mikalsen in 2015.
- The Littleton native finished up the first round of the NCAA Regional tied for 51st with a score of 4-over.
- The senior did record an eagle in his first round on No. 18, a 586-yard par 5.

NOTABLE:

- Denver won its 24th National Championship in program history in March in Steamboat Springs, Colo.
- Denver earned 604 points to win the title by 41 points. The Pioneers were balanced in scoring in 2018, earning 299 points from their alpine team and 305 from the Nordic side. DU's women recorded 316 points, led by two National Championship performances from freshman Amelia Smart, while the Denver men earned 288 points. The Crimson and Gold had 17 All-America performances, including 10 first team selections.

NOTABLE:

- Jessica Dreesbeimdieke shot a bogey-free 2-under 70 in her final round of the NCAA Regional on May 9.
- Newlove was the Pioneers' highest finisher, tying for 34th at 2-over for the 54-hole tournament.
- Weinstein and Dreesbeimdieke each tied for 40th.
- The Crimson and Gold's 12th-place finish tied last year's mark at the NCAA Regional, the lowest at the tournament since 2010.
- Denver finished the year setting a new program record for stroke average at 296.06.

NOTABLE:

- DU finished the season ranked No. 15 nationally, making it four straight years that Denver has ended the season ranked inside the top 15 and 19 straight seasons inside the top 25.
- Freshman Lynnzee Brown represented DU at the NCAA National Championships, extending the program's streak of seasons with at least one gymnast at NCAA Nationals to 19.
- DU finished with an average attendance of 2,701, which is now the second-highest in program history.

DENVER PIONEERS

NOTABLE:

- Denver currently holds a 194-point lead on Providence (as of April 26) for the top spot in the Division I-AAA standings as the Pioneers look to pursue their 10th I-AAA Directors' Cup in the last 11 years for the most successful athletics program without football.
- Denver will still receive points from MLAX, WLAX, WGOLF, WTEN and MGOLF
- Skiing's 24th National Championship in March was Denver's 33rd overall national title and made Denver one of five athletic programs in the country to win at least one NCAA DI title in each of the last five years.
