- Trevor Baptiste became the first faceoff specialist picked No. 1 overall in the MLL Draft last week. He was also the first Pioneer to be taken No. 1, and joined with the sixth overall pick Sean Mayle to become the first Denver duo to be taken in the first round of the same draft.
- The Pioneers will look to go 26-0 in BIG EAST regular season play in their first five years this week, while honoring a total of 11 seniors prior to the game.

- Denver won its 24th National Championship in program history last month in Steamboat Springs, Colo.
- Denver earned 604 points to win the title by 41 points. The Pioneers were balanced in scoring in 2018, earning 299 points from their alpine team and 305 from the Nordic side. DU's women recorded 316 points, led by two National Championship performances from freshman Amelia Smart, while the Denver men earned 288 points. The Crimson and Gold had 17 All-America performances, including 10 first team selections.
