## BRIEF SEASON OUTLOOK

Last season Duquesne was the surprise of the Atlantic 10 in advancing to within six points of the school's first NCAA Tournament bid since 1977. The Dukers, who entered the season as the youngest team in the nation, posted 21 wins - the school's most since 1971 - in advancing to the Atlantic 10 Championship final before losing 69-64 to Temple. Duquesne was rewarded with an NIT bid, the school's first post-season appearance since 1994.

Eleven players, including eight of the top nine scorers, return from that team. Fourth-year head coach Ron Everhart is hoping the experience gained will help ease the loss of leading scorer and 2009 team leader Aaron Jackson (19.3 ppg.).

Junior forward Damian Saunders (13.1, 7.6) leads a group of four returning starters. The 6-7 Connecticut native led DU in rebounding and blocks (83) and set a DU single-season record with 71 steals. Saunders enters 2009-10 with the unique career stat line of having more assists (125), steals (116) and blocks (122) than turnovers (100).

Junior swingman Bill Clark (12.9, 5.0), showed marked improvement in leading the team with 66 3-pointers made in '09. Clark was at his best in conference play where he averaged 15.4 ppg. and shot a team-best .542.

Sophomore Melquan Bolding (9.9, 4.4), a member of the A-10 All-Rookie Team, excelled in the post-season, averaging 14.8 ppg. in five games.

Jason Duty, DU's lone senior and fourth returning starter, finished fourth in the A-10 in 3-point shooting percentage (.414). Duty, who leads all returnees with 79 games played, was rewarded this off-season with a scholarship after playing his first three seasons as a walk-on.

Sophomore point guard Eric Evans (9.8, 2.2a), a four-time A-10 Rookie of the Week in '09, will fill the shoes of Jackson. Multi-talented sophomore swingman B.J. Monteiro (3.3, 1.3 in 30 games) is also expected to provide depth at both guard and forward.

Incoming freshmen Andre Marhold (6-6, F) and Sean Johnson (6-2, G) will bolster the front and backcourt respectively. In addition 6-8 Rodrigo Peggau, who played in five games last season as a freshman before undergoing season-ending knee surgery, is expected to be back. Added size will come in the form of sophomore Morakinyo Williams, a 7-0, 270-pound transfer from Kentucky, who will be eligible in 2009-10.

## DUQUESNE OFFSEASON QUICK NOTES

- Sophomores guard Eric Evans and swingman Melquan Bolding were both named to the 2009 Pittsburgh Basketball Club Pro Am Summer League all-league team. Evans averaged 16 points and a little under three assists and three rebounds per game, while Bolding averaged 17 points and five rebounds per game. The league featured players from area Division I schools including Pitt and Robert Morris among others.

- Senior guard Jason Duty was awarded a scholarship for the 2009-10 season in May. Duty, who joined the team as a walk on in November of 2006, was one of four players to start all 34 games last year. The Cranberry Township, Pa. native finished fourth in the Atlantic 10 in 3-point shooting at 41.4 percent (55-of-133) and hit at least one 3-pointer in 28 games while averaging 7.4 ppg. in 2008-09. He shot a team-best 82.9 percent from the foul line and handed out 45 assists in 24.8 minutes per game. Duty, Duquesne's lone senior in 2010 has played in 79 games with 49 starts in his three seasons

at DU. Off the court Duty, an accounting major with a 3.75 GPA, earned spots on both the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District 2 Basketball Team as well as the Atlantic 10 Men's Basketball All-Academic Team.

- Forward Rodrigo Peggau, who underwent successful knee surgery last December, was cleared to participate in individual workouts the in early September. Peggau, who played in four games last year prior to opting for season-ending surgery, will be classified as a redshirt freshman in 2009-10.

- The 2009-10 season marks the debut of 7-0, 270-pound Kentucky transfer Morakinyo Williams. Williams, who was signed by Tubby Smith, played in five games in 2007-08 for Billy Gillispie at UK before transferring to Duquesne in June of '08. Williams, who was a Top 100 recruit out of Bishop Ireton High School in Alexandria, Virginia, sat out the 2008-09 season and has three years of eligibility remaining. The Solihull, England native played for the Great Britain U20 team which competed in the European Division B Championships in Targu Mures, Romania last summer. He practiced with the Duquesne team in 2008-09.

- A total of five players from the 2007-08 Duquesne team - the one that ended a streak of 13 consecutive losing DU seasons with a 17-13 record - are currently playing professionally overseas. They are: Kieron Achara (Angelico Biella - Italy), Aaron Jackson (Antalya - Turkey), Reggie Jackson (Newcastle Eagles - Great Britain), Shawn James (Bnei-Hasharon - Israel) and Gary Tucker (Science City Jena - Germany). All but Aaron Jackson and Tucker, who both signed in July, competed overseas this past season.

- Duquesne, which opens the season at home on Nov. 13 vs. Nicholls State, will face an Atlantic 10-tying high five NCAA tournament teams in non-conference play in Binghamton, Pitt, Radford, Robert Morris and West Virginia. La Salle is the only other conference school that will face as many 2008-09 NCAA tournament teams in non-league play. In all, the Dukes will face 11 teams (12 games) against teams that made post-season appearances last year (eight NCAA, one NIT, one CBI and one CIT).

- Rising sophomores Aleksandar Milovic (0.6 ppg. in eight games) and Shawntez Patterson (0.0 ppg. in four games) transferred out of the Duquesne program in the spring. Milovic is now at the University of Hawaii and Patterson is at Pensacola Junior College. Junior walk on Jimmy Sherwood, who left the team last December is currently enrolled at Arkansas Tech where he will have two seasons of eligibility remaining. Fellow walk on Lucas Newton, who also left the team last December, is back on the roster for 2009-10. He will be classified as a junior.
