2010-11 SEASON REVIEW



The 2010-11 season, Duquesne's fifth under head coach Ron Everhart, was a roller coaster ride that ended with the school's third consecutive postseason appearance. Along the way, DU (19-13) won 11 in a row, saw the court stormed following a road loss and received votes in the Associated Press Top 25 - all things that hadn't occurred on the Bluff since the heyday of the program in the early 1970s. Everhart blended a pair of 1,500-point

scorers in Damian Saunders and Bill Clark with an all-freshman backcourt of T.J. McConnell and Mike Talley to produce a team that finished tied for fourth in the Atlantic 10 Conference - the school's best league finish since 1994 (T3rd). The Dukes stood at .500 (5-5) on Christmas Day following a double-overtime home loss to eventual NCAA Tournament participant George Mason. A 91-64 New Year's Eve win over Northwestern State started an 11-game win streak that saw the Dukes bury opponents by an average of 18.8 points per game. Included in that streak - during which every win was by a double digit margin - was a 78-66 win over No. 19 (AP) Temple. DU sent shock waves through the A-10 by jumping out to a 22-2 lead against the Owls. The streak, which was the school's longest since 1971, ended on a last-second 3-pointer at St. Bonaventure after which the Bonnies student body stormed the court. The last time many around the program could remember a team storming the court following a win over Duquesne was on Dec. 9, 1969 when the No. 7 (AP) Dukes were defeated at Nebraska. The win streak caught the attention of national media as writers from both *Sports Illustrated* and *USA Today* paid visits to campus as the Dukes received votes in the AP poll for three consecutive weeks from Jan. 24 through Feb. 7 (research could not determine the last time DU received votes in the poll). DU found itself tied for first in the A-10 as late as the second week of February, before a 71-63 loss to Xavier in front of a sellout crowd of 10,509 at CONSOL Energy Center on Feb. 13 dropped the Dukes into second. DU rallied for a win at UMass before suffering back-to-back one-point losses at Dayton and to Rhode Island at home. The Dukes, despite dropping six of their last eight, managed to secure a bye to the A-10 Championship by finishing with a 10-6 conference record. Saint Joseph's, the No. 12 seed, upset the fourth-seeded Dukes 93-90 in the second round. DU accepted a bid to the College Basketball Invitational where it became the only team in the 17-game tournament to win a road game. The season ended with a 77-75 loss at eventual CBI champion Oregon. The margin between a good and great season was a thin one for the Dukes. Eighteen of the 19 wins were by double-digit margins, conversely DU suffered nine losses by six or fewer points including six that came down to the last possession (losses of three or fewer points). Clark (16.3 ppg., 1,628 career points, 680 rebounds, 227 3-pointers) and Saunders (12.6 ppg., 1,511 career points, 1,019 rebounds, 300 blocks, 277 steals) were both named Second Team All-Atlantic 10. While Saunders, who set school records for steals, blocks, games (127), starts (116) and dunks (166) was named A-10 Defensive Player of the Year for the second season in a row. McConnell (10.8 ppg., school record 91 steals) was named ECAC & Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year.

NOTES FROM THE DUKES CLIPBOARD

• Duquesne, which played in the National Invitation Tournament in 2009 & College Basketball Invitational in 2010, made its third-straight postseason appearance in 2011 (CBI). It was the first time since 1968-71 (NIT, NCAA, NIT & NCAA) that DU made three consecutive postseason appearances.

• DU, which has gone 10-19, 17-13, 21-13, 16-16 & 19-13 in five seasons under head coach Ron Everhart, has posted 15+ wins in four straight years for the first time since 1968-73. Duquesne was coming off a 3-24 season, and had finished above .500 once (1994) in the 21 years prior to Everhart taking over in 2006-07.

• This was just the second time in the past 30 years Duquesne won 18 games. Both have come under Ron Everhart. (The other was two years ago when the 21-13 Dukes advanced to the A10 title game.)

• Duquesne used a starting lineup that went 5-10 (Mike Talley), 6-0 (T.J. McConnell), 6-5 (B.J. Monteiro), 6-5 (Bill Clark) & 6-7 (Damian Saunders) for the majority of the season

• The Dukes led the nation in assists (17.8 app.), steals (9.9 spg.) and turnover margin (+6.7). DU also ranked among the Top 20 in assist/turnover ratio (15th at +1.33), scoring offense (16th at 77.9 ppg.) blocked shots (19th at 5.3 bpg.) and scoring margin (20th at +9.9 ppg.).

• Duquesne, which averaged an Everhart Era "low" 70.3 ppg. in 2010, returned to their running ways, averaging 77.9 ppg. (16th nationally) in 2011. Everhart's Dukes have led the Atlantic 10 in scoring in three of his first five seasons (2007, 2008 & 2011).

• Duquesne's ten Atlantic 10 wins tied the school record set in 1980-81 (10-3) and matched in 1990-91 (10-8). DU's tied for fourth place finish in the A-10 was the school's best since the 1994 NIT team finished tied for third.

• This was just the second time since 1971 that Duquesne won eight road games (8-7). The other was in 2009 (8-7).

• Everhart's Dukes have posted 29 road wins in five seasons. Of the 29 wins, 22 have been by double digits. In the 10 seasons prior to Everhart's arrival, Duquesne went 17-106 on the road with three double-digit victories. All eight of DU's road wins in 2011 (8-7) were by double-digit margins.

• Duquesne, which had an 11-game win streak snapped on Feb. 5 at St. Bonaventure, went 9-0 in the month of January. The last time Duquesne went undefeated in January was in 1970-71 when the NCAA Tournament Dukes (21-4), in the midst of a 15-game win streak, went 14-0 to start the New Year (they won their final game in December, went 7-0 in January and won their first seven in February). The 11-game win streak was the longest since 1970-71.

• Duquesne opened 8-0 in conference play for the first time in school history. The previous best was 3-0 by Ron Everhart's 2008-09 NIT Dukes. The eight-game conference win streak was the longest in school history. The previous best was five A-10 games in a row in 1980-81 and 2006-07.

• Duquesne won five in a row on the road (Dec. 8 through Jan. 26) for the first time since a two-season streak of five that ended in December of 1985. DU's four A-10 road wins tied the most in school history (1981 & 2009 are the others).

• Duquesne was the only team to win a CBI road game (the other teams in the field were a combined 0-16). The Dukes traveled to Missoula, Mont. to defeat Montana 87-76 in the first round. The then 21-10 Grizzlies entered the game 13-1 at home. The win it was DU's first post-conference tournament win since a 75-73 victory over Charlotte in the First Round of the 1994 NIT at the Palumbo Center. It was DU's first post-conference tournament win at a road or neutral site since a 75-72 NCAA Tournament East Regional consolation game win over St. John's at Cole Field House in College Park, Md. on March 15, 1969. It was also the first career post-conference tournament win for Ron Everhart.

• Five of the seven Duquesne opponents that earned bids to the 2011 NCAA Championship (Pitt, West Virginia, George Mason, Richmond & Temple), advanced to the second round. Of the seven, one was guaranteed to lose since Penn State faced Temple in the opening round. The Dukes defeated the then-No. 19 (AP) Owls, 78-66, on Jan. 15 - Duke was the only team to defeat the Owls by a larger margin in 2011. Xavier joined Penn State as the other first round loser on DU's 2011 schedule. Six of DU's 13 losses came to NCAA Tournament teams.

• Eighteen of Duquesne's 19 wins were by double digits, with eight by 20 or more. On the other hand, 10 of DU's 13 defeats were by single digits, including six one-possession losses (three or fewer points). The Dukes held a lead at some point in every game in 2011. DU managed to build at least a seven-point lead in 28 of 32 games.

- Duquesne led at the half in 25 of 32 games (trailing vs. Pitt, at St. Bonaventure, at Saint Louis, at Richmond, vs. Saint Joseph's at the A-10 Championship and at Oregon & tied at La Salle).

- DU tied the school record with 17 steals at Houston Baptist. In that game Bill Clark tied the single-game mark with seven (Clark shares the record with five other players). The Dukes matched the team mark for the second time in four games at La Salle on Jan. 19 and did it again at UMass on Feb. 16.

- The Dukes had five or more double-digit scorers in 12 of their 19 wins.

- Duquesne, which is assisted on over 65 percent of its field goals, averaged 17.8 assists per game - the seventh-highest in Atlantic 10 history. Five players handed out 70 or more assists.

- Six players attempted at least 70 3-pointers. Every returning player from 2010 shot a better percentage from the arc in 2010-11 than he did last season.

- The Dukes played their first 10 games (5-5) without junior point guard Eric Evans, who underwent foot surgery on Oct. 27. Evans, who had streaks of 66 games (every game of his DU career) and 32 starts snapped by the injury, was cleared to resume practice on Dec. 21. He saw action for the first time vs. Northwestern State on Dec. 31. Duquesne went 14-8 following Evans' return.

- The 2011 senior class of Bill Clark, Damian Saunders and Dave Theis, which was the first to not experience a losing season since 1972-75, was responsible for 73 total wins. The 73 victories were the most over a four-year period since 1970-73 (74 victories).

- Fifteen hundred-point scoring seniors and second team All-Atlantic 10 picks Damian Saunders and Bill Clark led the way for the Dukes in 2011. Saunders, who finished his career as DU's career blocked shot (300), steals (277), games played (127), games started (116) and dunks (166) leader, also ranked 11th in career points (1,511) and third in career rebounds (1,019). Clark, whose 227 career 3-pointers ranked third all-time, ranked 7th on the scoring list with 1,628 points and 10th in career rebounds (680). Saunders and Clark, who never experienced a losing season at Duquesne, finished their careers ranked first and second in career games played (127 for Saunders and 126 for Clark).

- 2010-11 marked the first time in school history that two players with 1,500 points played side-by-side in the same game (Saunders and Clark both reached the 1,500-point mark prior to the season-ending CBI loss at Oregon).

- The 6-7 Saunders finished his career as **THE ONLY PLAYER IN NCAA HISTORY** to post more than 250 assists (281), steals (277) and blocks (300) in a career. Saunders, who averaged over 2.0 per game in all three categories, had more assists, steals and blocks than turnovers (251) in his career.

- Saunders, one of just four two-time A-10 Defensive Players of the Year (2010 & 2011), broke the DU career steals record with his 219th theft against George Mason on Dec. 22. Saunders (72 steals) and T.J. McConnell (91 steals) were the only A-10 players to average over 2.0 spg.

- Saunders became Duquesne's all-time leading shot blocker with his four rejections at Penn State on Dec. 4. The old mark of 229 was set by 6-10 Derrick Alston in 114 games from 1991-94. Saunders broke the record in his 101st game.

- Saunders finished his career with 36 career double-doubles, the third-most on record at Duquesne. He posted nine in 2011. All of his 36 double-doubles came in his last 94 games.

- True freshmen T.J. McConnell and Mike Talley started 25 times side-by-side in the backcourt. McConnell (39) and Talley (37) ranked second and third on the team in 3-pointers made. The duo finished with 216 assists and 103 turnovers (2.1-to-1 ratio) between them.

- 2011 A-10 Rookie of the Year T.J. McConnell's five Rookie of the Week mentions tied the school record set by Robert Mitchell in 2006-07 ... McConnell (91 steals in 32 games) broke the Atlantic 10 freshman record for steals (86 set by Temple's Pepe Sanchez in 31 games in 1996-97) and the Duquesne the school record of 89 set by Damian Saunders in 32 games last year.

- Duquesne averaged 9,123 fans for its three home games at the new CONSOL Energy Center. A crowd of 8,059 was on hand for the WVU game, 8,802 - including a game-day walk-up of over 1,000 turned out for the Dayton game and a sellout crowd of 10,509 witnessed the Xavier game. The new home of the Pittsburgh Penguins, located one block from the Palumbo Center, opened its doors in August 2010.

- DU received votes in the AP poll for three weeks from Jan. 24 through Feb. 7.

McConnell played just nine minutes in the second half of the lopsided win ... it was his third career game ... nearly did it again with 12 points, 8 rebounds, 9 assists and 5 steals in the 70-64 win over St. Bonaventure on March 2 ... handed out five or more assists in a game 14 times and led the team in assists a team-high 20 times ... became just the third freshman in school history - and first since Kenya Hunter (10) vs. Detroit on Feb. 20, 1993 - to hand out double-digit assists with 10 at Fordham ... did not turn the ball over in 30 minutes against the Rams ... finished fourth on Duquesne's freshman single season assist list with 140 ... his 979 minutes played were second only to Tom Pipkins' freshman record 1,138 in 1994 ... went 23-of-46 from the 3-point arc in his first 15 games, went 11-of-42 from 3-point (.262) in next 14 before finishing the year by going 5-of-9 in DU's last three games ... his 3-point shooting percentage (.402) was the second-best by a DU freshman ... had 68 assists and 17 turnovers in 16 Atlantic 10 games (4.0-to-1 ratio).

LIGHTS OUT!: Duquesne shot 88.2 percent (15-of-17) in the second half of its 81-71 win at University of Wisconsin-Green Bay on Dec. 8. The Dukes were one make away from tying the NCAA record for field goal percentage in a half of 94.1 percent set by North Carolina vs. Virginia on Jan. 7, 1978 (16-of-17 in the second half). The only two DU players to miss a shot in the second half were B.J. Monteiro (missed layup at 17:41) and Bill Clark (missed 3-pointer at 10:46). Duquesne made its last eight field goal attempts. For the game, Duquesne was 15-of-24 from the arc. Ironically, Bill Clark, Duquesne's leading scorer, was 0-of-3 from the arc in 22 foul-plagued minutes. Clark didn't score until the 2:52 mark of the second half. Duquesne, which ranked last in Division I in 3-point shooting in 2010 (282nd at .261) was 256-of-712 (.360) in 2010-11.

PALUMBO FACELIFT: The A.J. Palumbo Center showed off a new look in 2010-11 as the result of a \$1.8 million renovation project completed late in the summer of 2010. Chair back seats were installed from top-to-bottom on the north side of the arena, replacing wooden bleachers that were located behind the team benches. In addition, treads, risers and chair backs were replaced on

the lower level of the south side of the facility replacing chair backs that dated to the building's opening in 1988. A custom designed center-hung Daktronics video board and four lower level corner scoreboards were also installed. The new chair back seating, which includes 560 premium seats that sold out prior to the season, changed the Palumbo Center's capacity from 5,358 to 4,406. The improvements marked the second Palumbo Center renovation project in the past five years. In 2006, men's and women's basketball as well as administrative staff offices, a recruiting suite, a state-of-the-art video breakdown room, a student-athlete-only strength and conditioning and athletic training rooms were constructed at a cost of \$2 million on the concourse level.

AND MORE TO COME: In late December, DU announced plans for the Janice and James Schaming Athletic Center. The project, which began on April 1, includes a renovation of the men's and women's basketball and volleyball locker rooms as well as a redesign of the lower corridor of the Palumbo Center. The \$1.3 million project, which is expected to be completed by mid-summer, was being funded by private donations - including a lead gift from Janice and the late James Schaming (B`55).

A NEW SECOND HOME: This season the Dukes broke in their new home away from home in the brand new CONSOL Energy Center located one block from the DU campus. The home of the NHL's Pittsburgh Penguins, which officially opened its doors in August of 2010, will serve as the venue for second and third round games of the 2012 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship to be hosted by Duquesne. Duquesne, which played four games at CONSOL (vs. Pitt and home games against West Virginia, Dayton and Xavier), has a dedicated locker room in the facility. The arena, which has the capability to seat as many as 19,100 for basketball, also has a curtaining system to allow for flexible capacity. The Dukes played before a sellout crowd of 10,509 vs. Xavier on Feb. 13. It was DU's largest crowd for a home game - against an opponent other than cross-town rival Pitt - since 12,222 saw the Dukes take on No. 8 (AP) Maryland on Feb. 21, 1973 at Pittsburgh's then-Civic Arena. DU drew 8,059 for the WVU game and 8,802, including a game day walk-up over over 1,000, for the Dayton game.

MAKING A POINT

DU, which has led the A-10 in scoring in three of five seasons under Ron Everhart, saw its scoring average drop by nearly nine points in 2009-10. In the offseason, Everhart emphasized plans for the Dukes to return to their "rip and run" style. Here is a summary of DU's scoring under Everhart:

LEAGUE FINISH: Duquesne finished the regular season tied with George Washington for 4th in the Atlantic 10 with a 10-6 record. The Dukes secured the No. 4 seed at the Atlantic 10 Championship by virtue of their 84-59 regular season GW at the Palumbo Center on Feb. 2. DU's 10 wins tied the school record set in 1981 (10-3) and tied in 1991 (10-8). The fourth place finish was the best by a Duquesne team since the 1994 squad finished in a three-way tie for third with an 8-8 record. DU went 6-2 at home and 4-4 on the road in conference play. The four conference road wins tied the school record. The Dukes posted the first 8-0 conference start in school history. The eight consecutive conference wins were also a school best.

A-10 CHAMPIONSHIP: Duquesne, which earned a first round bye with its highest seed since 1981 (No. 4) was upset in the second round by No. 12 Saint Joseph's 93-90 in overtime. There were eight ties and eight lead changes in the game that saw DU rally from an 11-point deficit with 8:35 left to take a three-point lead at the 29 second mark. SJU tied it on a dunk with one second left in regulation. The Dukes fell behind by six in OT only to cut it to one with nine seconds left. T.J. POSTSEASON HONORS

SECOND TEAM ALL-CONFERENCE Damian Saunders & Bill Clark

Damian Saunders and Bill Clark are the first Dukes to earn second team All A-10 honors since Bryant McAllister in 2005 & 2006. It is the first time since 1986 (Rick Suder first team & Dwayne Rawls second team) Duquesne has had multiple all-conference honorees. Saunders was an honorable mention pick in 2009 and first team choice last season. This is the first postseason honor for Clark.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR ALL-DEFENSIVE TEAM Damian Saunders

Saunders joins UMass' Stephane Lasmé (2006 & 2007), Richmond's Tony Dobbins (2003 & 2004) and Temple's Pepe Sanchez (1998 & 2000) as the only two-time Atlantic 10 Defensive Players of the Year. Saunders became the first player in Duquesne history to earn conference Defensive Player of the Year honors in 2010. This is the fourth time in five years under Ron Everhart that a DU player has earned a spot on the league All-Defensive Team. The others are: Kieron Achara (2007), Shawn James (2008) and Saunders (2010). The defensive team was established in 1997.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR ALL-ROOKIE TEAM T.J. McConnell

Is the third player in school history to be named A-10 Rookie of the Year joining Bruce Atkins (1979) and Robert Mitchell (2007). McConnell, who was named Rookie of the Week a school record-tying five times, is the fourth player to earn all-rookie team honors in five seasons under Ron Everhart. McConnell is just the third player in the 15-year history of the Atlantic 10 All-Defensive Team *not* to earn a spot on the squad despite leading the conference in steals. The others are his current teammate Damian Saunders (2009) and Charlotte's Leemire Goldwire (2008).

CLARK & SAUNDERS NABC ALL-DISTRICT 4

Duquesne seniors Bill Clark and Damian Saunders were named All-District 4 by the National Association of Basketball Coaches on March 9. Clark was named First Team and Saunders, a First Team pick last season, was named to the Second Team. It is the first time since Derrick Alston and James Hargrove were named Second Team in 1992 that two Dukes received NABC honors in the same season. Clark is the 13th Duquesne player to be named First Team NABC All-District joining Saunders (2010) and former teammate Aaron Jackson who was named in 2009. Other DU first-team selections include: Derrick Alston (1994), Mark Stevenson (1990), Rick Suder (1986), Norm Nixon (1977), Willie Somerset (1962, 1964 & 1965), Sihugo Green (1954, 1955 & 1956), Dick Ricketts (1953, 1954 & 1955), Jim Tucker (1954), Chuck Cooper (1950) and Ed Dahler (1950). This is the first time since 1954-56 (Jim Tucker, Dick Ricketts and Sihugo Green) that Duquesne has had three different players named First Team NABC All-District in consecutive seasons. Saunders is the first two-time All-District pick since Alston, who was Second Team in 1992 and First Team in 1994. He is the ninth player in school history to earn NABC All-District in multiple seasons.

HEAD COACH RON EVERHART 257-246 (.511) in 17 seasons overall; 83-74 (.529) in five seasons at Duquesne

From 10 wins in 2007 to the school's first winning season in 14 years in 2008 to consecutive postseason appearances in 2009, 2010 & 2011, Ron Everhart clearly has the Duquesne men's basketball program headed in the right direction. In five seasons defined by steady progress, he has taken a floundering program - one that won just three games in 2005-06 - to one that finished six points shy of an NCAA tournament bid in 2008-09 and was tied for first in the Atlantic 10 and receiving votes in the AP Top 25 at the midpoint of the 2010-11 season. After ending a streak of 13 consecutive losing seasons with a 17-13 record in 2007-08, he followed that by posting a 21-13 mark and NIT appearance in 2009. In 2010, Everhart's Dukes won 16 games in earning a College Basketball Invitational bid. In 2011, DU reeled off 11 wins in a row - including the first eight in Atlantic 10 play - and received votes in the Associated Press Top 25 for three consecutive weeks before finishing 19-13 an earning a second consecutive CBI bid. Everhart was named NABC District 4 Coach of the Year for his effort. DU's 73 wins over the past four seasons are the most over a four-year period since 1970-73. The Duquesne turnaround is nothing new for the man who reversed the fortunes of the men's basketball programs at both McNeese State and Northeastern prior to returning "home" to take the reins at Duquesne in

March of 2006. At Northeastern, he inherited a program that averaged fewer than nine wins in the six seasons prior to his arrival and produced 19, 21 and 19 victories in his final three years. In his five seasons at the Boston, Mass. school, the Huskies averaged 16.4 wins. At McNeese State, Everhart ended a streak of six consecutive sub-.500 seasons by leading the Cowboys to a 15-12 mark in 1995-96 - his second season at the Lake Charles, La. school. His seven-year stay culminated with a 22-9 record and Southland Conference regular-season title in 2000-01. The 2000-01 Cowboys, who

won 19 of their last 20 games before losing the Southland Conference championship game by a point, earned the school's first postseason bid in 12 years when they accepted a bid to the NIT. Everhart, who was named Southland Conference Coach of the Year in 2000-01 and America East Coach of the Year in 2004-05, has produced at least one first team all-conference player in 11 of his 17 seasons as a head coach. Aaron Jackson, who flourished under Everhart, was the first Duquesne player in 11 years to earn first team All-Atlantic 10 honors when he was named in 2009. Damian Saunders earned first team honors in 2010 making it the first time since 1980 (B.B. Flenory) and 1981 (Bruce Atkins) that Duquesne has had first team All-A-10 players in back-to-back seasons. Everhart, a top evaluator of talent, had at least one all-rookie team player in four of five seasons at Northeastern and has coached four in his five seasons at Duquesne (A-10 Rookie of the Year Robert Mitchell in 2007, Damian Saunders in 2008, Melquan Bolding in 2009 and A-10 Rookie of the Year T.J. McConnell in 2011). In addition, DU has had four A-10 all-defense team picks (Kieron Achara in 2007, Shawn James in 2008 and Damian Saunders Defensive Player of the Year in both 2010 & 2011) and had at least one all-academic team honoree (Kieron Achara in 2008 & 2008 and Jason Duty in 2009 & 2010) in four of the past five seasons. Everhart's impact on the program can also be measured in the number of Atlantic 10 honorees he has produced. In five seasons under Everhart, DU has had 12 A-10 players of the week and 19 rookies of the week (31 total). In the 12 seasons prior to Everhart's arrival, Duquesne earned a total of 19 weekly honors.

EVERHART'S ACCOMPLISHMENTS AT DUQUESNE

SEASON ONE – 2006-07

- Defeated a pair of NCAA Tournament second round teams in Boston College (98-93 in OT) and Xavier (93-91).
- Ended a 17-game non-conference road losing streak with a 72-71 win at Saint Francis, Pa.
- Five road wins were the most by a Duquesne team since 1994-95. It was just the third time in 21 years a DU team won five road games.
- Tied the 26-year-old school record for consecutive Atlantic 10 wins (five) with late January/early February victories over Dayton, Temple, Xavier, at St. Bonaventure & at La Salle (the record was set in 1980-81).
- Won back-to-back road games (at Saint Francis, Pa. & at Boston College) for the first time since December of 1994.
- Became the first team in school history to score 90 or more points in four (and five) consecutive games.
- Swept Dayton, Temple & Xavier in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Posted the highest point total by a Duquesne team in the 48-game series versus Temple (96-92), the 96-game series with St. Bonaventure (111-92) and the 59-game series versus La Salle (111-105).
- Set a new road scoring record in a 111-92 win at St. Bonaventure. The previous record for points in a road game was in a 109-66 win at Geneva on Feb. 18, 1953. The 111 points were the second-highest point total in the 40-plus year history of St. Bonaventure's Reilly Center (only No. 3 (AP) Saint Joseph's scored more in a 114-63 victory at SBU on Jan. 24, 2004).
- The 111 points at St. Bonaventure, in addition to being DU's highest point total in 19 years, was Duquesne's first 100-point game in 10 years (the last coming in a 102-92 win over Radford on Jan. 4, 1997).
- The 19-point margin of victory at St. Bonaventure eclipsed a 17-point win (72-55) at Rhode Island on Jan. 21, 2004 as the largest margin of victory ever by a Duquesne team in an A-10 road game.
- Followed the St. Bonaventure game with 111 more points in a 111-105 win at La Salle, giving the Dukes their first back-to-back 100-point games since 1988-89.
- Shattered school records for 3-pointers made (239) and attempted (722) in a season. The previous marks were 178 made (in 1999-00 & 2004-05) and 567 attempted (in 1999-00).

SEASON TWO – 2007-08

- Ensured Duquesne's first winning season since 1993-94 (17-13) with a 63-61 win at Dayton on Feb. 13.
- DU's 17 wins were the most since '94 and the 17 regular-season wins were the most since the '81 NIT Dukes (20-10) entered the Eastern 8 Tournament with an 18-8 record.
- Put together winning streaks of six and five games, making it the first time since 1961-62 that a Duquesne team had two streaks of five or more wins in the same year.
- The Dukes went 11-4 at home, marking just the second time in 27 years that a DU team won 11 or more at home (the Dukes were 12-3 in 1993-94 and 14-2 in 1980-81).
- Went 10-3 in non-conference games. The 10 wins were the second-most in school history and the

.769 winning percentage was the best ever by a Duquesne team in non-league play.

- DU opened the season 6-0 marking the first time since 1979-80 that a Dukes team began the season with six-straight wins. The six-game win streak was the longest by a Duquesne team since 1980-81.
- Ended a 10-game series losing streak with a 102-88 win over Saint Joseph's. DU's 102 points were the most ever scored by either team in the 43-game series history.
- Duquesne's seven Atlantic 10 wins (7-9) were its most since the 1993-94 Dukes finished 8-8 in conference play.

SEASON THREE – 2008-09

- Led the Dukes to within six points of their first NCAA tournament bid since 1977 in advancing to the A-10 Championship final for the first time since 1981.
- Duquesne's 21 wins were its most since the 1970-71 team went 21-4.
- Took the Dukes to their first post-season appearance since 1994 in earning an NIT bid.
- Defeated four NCAA tournament teams including then No. 9 (AP) Xavier at home, Dayton on a neutral court at the Atlantic 10 Championship and Radford and Robert Morris on the road.
- Posted just the fourth plus-.500 conference record in Duquesne's 32 seasons of conference competition at 9-7. The nine A-10 wins were the most since 1991.
- Put together Duquesne's first back-to-back winning seasons since 1980 & 1981.
- Ended a 24-game losing streak against ranked teams with a 72-68 win over #9 (AP) Xavier on Feb. 7. It was DU's first win over a ranked team since 1997 (at #16 Xavier) and first over a top 10 team since December of 1992 (over #10 Florida State). The #9 Musketeers were also the highest ranked team to fall to the Dukes since an 88-87 win over #9 Providence on Jan. 31, 1974.
- Posted eight road wins and winning road record for the first time since the 1970-71 team went 8-2 and tied the school record (set in 1981) with four A-10 road victories.
- Guided the Dukes to a 4-0 start for the second consecutive season. This was the first time since 1985-86 (5-0) & 1986-87 (4-0) that Duquesne opened 4-0 in back-to-back years.
- Opened 3-0 in Atlantic 10 Conference play for the first time in school history.
- Had a winning record in non-conference play (9-4) for the second consecutive season (DU was 10-3 in 2007-08). It marked the first time since 1993 & 1994 that Duquesne had a winning non-league record in back-to-back seasons.
- Posted nine wins prior to Jan. 1 for the second consecutive season (9-4 in 2008-09 and 9-3 last year). The last time Duquesne had nine pre-January wins prior to Ron Everhart's arrival was in 1968-69 (9-1). The school record for pre-January wins is 10 (10-0 in 1953-54).
- Posted win No. 10 on Jan. 7, marking the first time DU put together back-to-back double-digit win seasons since 1991-95 (five in a row).
- Won three straight road games (at Radford, at Robert Morris & at St. Bonaventure) for the first time since Nov./Dec. 1985.
- Posted Duquesne's largest-ever margin of victory in an Atlantic 10 road game in an 89-68 (+21) win at Fordham.

- Ended an 11-game losing streak at UMass (dating back to 1989) with a 94-77 win.

SEASON FOUR – 2009-10

- Led Duquesne to its second consecutive post-season appearance in earning a bid to the College Basketball Invitational. It was the first time since 1980 & 1981 (both NIT) that DU made back-to-back postseason appearances.
- Guided the Dukes to 15+ wins for the third consecutive season. It was the first time since 1968-73 (six times) that Duquesne won 15 or more games in three-straight years.
- Posted Duquesne's first win in a Big Ten arena in 10 all-time tries with a 52-50 victory at Iowa on Nov. 17. It was also DU's first win over a Big Ten team since 1973.
- Snapped a streak of 13 consecutive losses in the state of North Carolina with back-to-back wins over Binghamton and Arkansas-Monticello at the O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Classic in Cullowhee, N.C. DU's last win in the Tar Heel State (including neutral-site games) was on Jan. 14, 1937 over NC State.
- Guided the Dukes to a 4-0 start, marking the third consecutive season DU has began the year 4-0 or better (4-0 last year and 6-0 in 2007-08). The last time that happened was from 1961 through 1963.
- Posted Duquesne's first win at George Washington since 2000 with a 70-63 win on Feb. 6. The victory ended a six-game losing streak in the nation's capital.
- Won 10 or more home games for the third-straight season. The last time that was done was from 1968-74 (seven times).

SEASON FIVE – 2010-11

- Posted Duquesne's first win at Saint Joseph's since Feb. 15, 1992 and in the process ended a nine-game road losing streak to the Hawks.
- Had a winning non-conference record (9-7) for the fourth consecutive season. It marked the first time in school history the Dukes have been above .500 in non-league play in four-straight seasons.
- Posted his second win over a ranked team with a 78-66 home victory over No. 19 (AP) Temple.
- Pulled off a "Philly Sweep" with wins over Saint Joseph's, Temple and La Salle as DU jumped out to a school-best 8-0 conference start.
- Led the Dukes to a 11-game win streak, the school's longest since 1970-71.
- Guided DU to its best conference finish (tied for fourth) since 1994 (tied for third).
- Tied the school record for conference wins (10) and conference road wins (four).
- Duquesne received a votes in the AP poll for three consecutive weeks: Jan. 24, 31 & Feb. 7. (*Research could not determine the last time DU also received votes.*)
- Led DU to a postseason appearance (CBI) for the third consecutive season. It was the first time since 1968-71 (four times) that a Duquesne team made four-straight postseason appearances.
- Posted DU's first post-conference tournament win since 1994 (NIT) with an 87-76 first round win at Montana in the CBI.
- Was the first DU coach since Red Manning in 1972 to be named NABC District Coach of the Year.

EVERHART'S HONOREES

Ron Everhart inherited a Duquesne program that had won a total of 17 road games in the 10 seasons prior to his arrival. In his five seasons, Everhart's Dukes have posted 29 road wins. Of the 29 wins, 22 have been by double digits. From 1996-97 through 2005-06 Duquesne posted a total of three double-digit road victories:

(12/22/06) ... won back-to-back road games for the first time since December of 1994 when they followed the Saint Francis win with a 98-93 OT victory at Boston College on Dec. 28 ... the win was the first by a Duquesne team in an ACC arena (in 12 tries prior to the win) ... DU also set a school road scoring record in a 111-92 win at St. Bonaventure and matched it in a 111-105 win at La Salle.

YEAR TWO: Opened on the 2007-08 road at Rice and responded with an 86-59 win ... the 27-point margin of victory was the largest in a road game since an 87-58 win at Robert Morris (+29) on Dec. 22, 1994.

YEAR THREE: Posted the school's most road wins (8-7) since 1970-71 (8-2), clinched the school's first winning road record since '71 and tied the school record for A-10 road wins with four ... won three straight road games (at Radford, at Robert Morris & at St. Bonaventure) for the first time since Nov./Dec. of 1985.

YEAR FOUR: Posted the first win in a Big Ten arena in 10 all-time tries (52-50 victory at Iowa's Carver-Hawkeye Arena) ... ended a six-game losing streak, dating back to 2000, at George Washington ... led the Dukes to their first win against a North Carolina school in that team's arena for the first time since 1937 with an 83-77 win at Charlotte ... DU had lost 14 games in a row in Tar Heel State gyms since a 53-33 win at NC State on Jan. 14, 1937.

YEAR FIVE: DU's 36-point win at Bowling Green (90-54) was the largest margin in a road game since a 127-85 (+42) win at Saint Peter's on Feb. 17, 1973 ... posted DU's first win at Saint Joseph's since Feb. 15, 1992 - ending a nine-game road losing streak vs. the Hawks ... won three consecutive conference road games for the first time in school history ... won five road games in a row for the first time since December of 1985 ... tied the school record with four conference road wins ... posted DU's second winning road record (8-7) since 1971.

ROAD WINS

DU has posted at least five road wins in four of five seasons under Ron Everhart (5-9 in 2007, 5-8 in 2008, 8-7 in 2008-09 and 8-7 in 2010-11) ... the last DU team to win five road games prior to Everhart's arrival on the Bluff was the '95 squad (5-8) ... the last time DU posted eight road wins prior to the '09 season was in 1970-71 (8-2).

MAKING STRIDES

Duquesne was 3-24 with an RPI of 308 the year before Ron Everhart's arrival on the Bluff. In his first season, Everhart took a team that had two returning players (Kieron Achara and Aaron Jackson) and was rocked by a preseason campus shooting to a 10-19 record including five consecutive A-10 regular season wins. In 2007-08, he led the Dukes to the school's first winning record since 1994 at 17-13 as DU's RPI improved to 130. Three years ago, despite losing his top five scorers from the 17-win team, Everhart guided one of the nation's youngest teams to 21 wins and a 75 RPI. DU's RPI hovered around the 100 mark since.

RECAP: B.J. Monteiro and Rodrigo Peggau posted their first career double-doubles as Duquesne used a balanced attack to defeat outmanned Bluefield State (0-2) 110-67 in the Dukes' season opener at the Palumbo Center. Monteiro, Sean Johnson and freshman Mike Talley led Duquesne with 17 points each. Bill Clark had 15, Peggau 14 and freshman T.J. McConnell added 13 as the Dukes never trailed in posting their highest point total in a season opener since a school record 129 in a 129-59 win over Howard on Nov. 9, 2007. Duquesne led 50-24 at the half against the Division II Big Blues who had just seven players in uniform. Eight players hit at least one 3-pointer for the Dukes who finished 16-of-39 from the arc. Talley led the way with five. Johnson, who had three 3-pointers, scored 15 of his career high-tying 17 in the second half. Peggau had a game- and career-high 12 rebounds. Monteiro's 10 boards were also a career best. Bluefield State, which shot 51.1 percent for the game, hit 17-of-25 second half field goal attempts, but the Big Blues couldn't gain any ground as Duquesne hit 61 percent of its shots in the second 20 minutes. Duquesne reached the 100 point mark on a Talley 3-pointer with 3:45 left. Talley's three also gave the Dukes their largest lead of the game at 100-52. Nine of the 10 players who saw action had at least one assist for Duquesne whose 30 assists tied for third-most in school history. Clark led the way with a career-high nine. McConnell added six along with a game-high four steals. DU outrebounded Bluefield State 54-26 and outscored the Big Blues 24-2 in second chance points.

NOTES: Duquesne was without returning starters Eric Evans (Oct. 27 foot surgery, out 6-8 weeks) and preseason first team All-Atlantic 10 forward Damian Saunders (suspension) ... DU's 16 3-point field goals were the second-most in school history ... the 30 assists tied the third-highest total on record ... it was the ninth time 126 games that a Ron Everhart Dukes team scored 100 or more ... only Red Manning (23 in 385 games) has coached more triple-digit scoring Duquesne teams.

RECAP: A standout effort by senior Bill Clark was not enough as Robert Morris (2-1) rallied from a 13-point first half deficit to defeat Duquesne (1-1) 69-63 at the Sewall Center. Karon Abraham and Russell Johnson led the Colonials with 15 and 13 points respectively to outshine Clark who hit 5-of-12 3-point attempts in scoring a game-high 22. There were a total of five ties and three lead changes over a nearly 10 minute span of the second half before Coron Williams buried a 3-pointer to put the Colonials up 61-58 with just under four minutes left. Duquesne cut it to one on a B.J. Monteiro layup with 3:05 to go before Johnson slipped a screen for a wide open layup to put the Colonials up 63-60 on their next possession. Duquesne trailed by three with 31 seconds left, but couldn't close the gap as RMU hit 3-of-4 free throws over the final 31 seconds to seal the win. The Dukes, who went 10-of-28 from the 3-point arc for the game, missed three 3-point attempts in the final 36 seconds. T.J. McConnell was the only other Duke in double figures with 12 points. Forward Damian Saunders finished with seven points, eight rebounds and three blocks for DU. RECAP: Damian Saunders posted his 31st career double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds and Bill Clark added a game-high 23 as Duquesne posted its school record sixth consecutive Atlantic 10 victory - and ninth-straight win overall - 91-72 win at Fordham. T.J. McConnell, who added 14 points, became the first Duquesne freshman since 1993 to post double-digit assists with 10 for the Dukes. B.J. Monteiro added 15 points and Mike Talley scored all 11 of his in the second half for DU. Chris Gaston had 15 points and 11 rebounds for Fordham. Duquesne, which entered the game ranked second nationally in assists per game, assisted on 25 of 31 field goals. DU, who was leading the nation in turnover margin, had six turnovers. Duquesne hit its first seven shots in jumping out to a 16-9 lead. The DU lead reached 15 on an Eric Evans layup with 9:45 to go before Fordham mounted a 16-5 run to pull within four at 35-31 on a Marvin Dominique layup at the 5:11 mark. Saunders, who had 12 in the first half, answered with a 3-pointer and a steal and layup by McConnell gave the Dukes a 40-31 lead a little over a minute later. DU led 45-36 at the half despite going 7-of-14 from the foul line. Fordham pulled to within six just over a minute into the second half before Clark answered with one of his four 3-pointers. The Rams pulled to within single digits at 68-59 with 7:56 to go before Clark added another 3-pointer. Duquesne steadily pulled away from that point on, with the lead reaching 22 with 2:22 to go. DU, which shot 47.0 percent, outscored Fordham 22-7 off turnovers in limiting the Rams to 38.2 percent shooting.

NOTES: McConnell became the third freshman in school history to post 10 assist in a game and first since Kenya Hunter did it twice in 1993 (Feb. 20, 1993 at Detroit was the last) ... Clark had four steals and McConnell had two steals and four assists to bring his Atlantic 10 assist-to-turnover ratio to 34-to-3. Dayton, which shot 57.1 percent in the first half, was held to 33.3 percent in the second to finish at 44.3 percent. Duquesne shot over 50 percent in each half to finish at 50.8 percent. RECAP: Sean Johnson led five players in double figures with a career high-tying 19 points as Duquesne advanced to the second round of the College Basketball Invitational with an 87-76 win at Montana. T.J. McConnell had 15 points and four steals, Bill Clark scored 13 and B.J. Monteiro and Damian Saunders had 11 each for DU. Saunders, who was playing despite a stomach flu, added five steals and five blocks as the Dukes handed the Grizzlies just their second home loss in 15 games. Duquesne, which led by as many as 22 in the first half, shot 54.2 percent against a UM team that entered the game ranked 14th nationally in scoring defense (60.1 ppg.) and 15th in field goal percentage defense (39.4%). There was one tie and three lead changes before Johnson put the Dukes up for good with a 3-pointer at the 14:31 mark of the first half. DU used its speed and quickness to up the lead to 22 on a Monteiro jumper before Montana closed the half with a 10-2 run to make it 49-35. Nine of the 10 Dukes who played scored in the first half and all 10 had at least one rebound. The Grizzlies cut it to six on a Gordon Wood follow with 9:14 left before Clark answered with a 3-pointer. The Dukes led by seven with 7:42 left before Clark began a 6-0 run with a pair of free throws. Andre Marhold, who scored all of his career high seven points in the second half, added a layup and Monteiro scored off a pass from McConnell to give DU a 74-61 lead. Montana would get no closer than 10 the rest of the way.

NOTES: The win was Duquesne's first in post-conference tournament play since a 75-72 victory over Charlotte in the opening round of the 1994 NIT at the Palumbo Center. It was also DU's first post-conference tournament win on the road or at a neutral site since a 75-72 NCAA Tournament East Regional consolation game victory over St. John's at Cole Field House in College Park, Md. on March 15, 1969 ... DU's 87 points were the most given up by the Grizzlies this season ... T.J. McConnell's third steal broke the school's single season record of 89 set by Saunders last year.

Johnson, a 71.4 percent free throw shooter, missed the first, made the second and intentionally missed the third. UO's Joevan Catron, who had 14 points and 11 rebounds, corralled the rebound as time expired. Bill Clark, whose 3-pointer with 1:55 left and layup with 10 seconds to go cut Oregon's lead from six to one, finished with a team-high 19 points. Johnson had 13 and Damian Saunders added 11 points, 10 rebounds and three blocked shots. The Dukes, who got a 3-pointer at the first half horn from Johnson to cut Oregon's lead to nine, held the Ducks to 29 percent shooting in the second half and 39.3 percent for the game. Duquesne, which had five more field goals - including four more 3-pointers - than Oregon, was outscored 20-4 from the foul line as the Ducks shot 26 free throws to DU's eight. DU, which went 13-of-28 from the 3-point arc, jumped out to a 13-6 lead and was up 19-15 before Tyrone Nared started a 21-5 run with a jumper. Sim, who scored all of his 12 first-half points during the run, hit a 3-pointer to give the Ducks a lead they'd never relinquish. Duquesne cut it to 50-49 on an Eric Evans 3-pointer with 14:07 to go, but Oregon built the lead back to eight just over three minutes later on back-to-back 3-pointers. The Dukes cut it to three four times and to two once before Catron put Oregon up six on a layup with 2:08 left. It was then that Clark put together his personal 5-0 run to cut it to one. E.J. Singler, who scored six of his 11 points from the line, hit two free throws with seven seconds left before Johnson drew the 3-shot foul from Armstead.
