# 2008 DUQUESNE FOOTBALL OUTLOOK

Duquesne returns 13 starters - including five first-team all-Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League picks from last year's 6-4 MAAC co-championship squad - as it makes the move to the Northeast Conference in 2008.

Duquesne, which granted only need-based financial aid for football playing student-athletes as a member of the MAAC, adopted an athletics-based aid model in February.

Fourth-year head coach Jerry Schmitt, who was named Coach of the Year twice in three seasons of MAAC competition, is looking forward to the challenges presented by the conference change.

"The move to the NEC was well received on the recruiting trail," said Schmitt. "There was also a renewed focus among our returning players during spring camp. We are looking forward to the challenges ahead."

In addition to the 18 scholarships awarded in February, the program will also benefit from a renovation of Rooney Field. The renovation project, which began the week after DU's final home game last season, includes the construction of permanent grandstand seating and concession stands in addition to the installation of a new playing surface.

Duquesne won or shared a total of 11 championships (1995, 1996, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007) while posting a 75-9-0 record in 14 seasons of competition in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. The Dukes, who also earned a mid-major National Championship in 2003 and competed in three ECAC Bowls while a member of the MAAC, are hoping past success will translate into more of the same in the highly-competitive NEC.

Junior quarterback **Kevin Rombach (Harrisburg, Pa./Central Dauphin)** and tackle **J.T. Stefanik (Uniontown, Pa./Laurel Highlands)**, both first team all-conference picks last year, return to lead the Dukes offense. Rombach, who started the last eight games of the 2008 season, completed a school record 61.1 percent of his passes for 2,410 yards and 20 touchdowns, while Stefanik led a young offensive line that returns three starters.

Senior **Greg Hough (Gibsonia, Pa./Pine-Richland)**, who led the Dukes with 801 yards rushing (4.2 ypc.) and five touchdowns last season, is also back - this time as a linebacker. Hough, who started his DU career as a fullback in 2005, was a first team All-MAAC linebacker in 2006 when he finished second on the team in tackles. His move back to defense opens the running back position to both 5-11, 200-pound sophomore **Cleodis Williams (Carlisle, Pa./Carlisle)** and 5-10, 205-pound junior **Brian Smoot (Harrisburg, Pa./Harrisburg)**. Williams sat out last season (academics) while Smoot finished with 28 carries for 104 yards in seven games.

Senior **Alex Roberson (Waynesboro, Ga./Curtis Baptist Upper School)**, a second team All-MAAC pick, will help ease the loss of All-American receiver Bruce Hocker who finished his career with a school record 162 catches for 2,595 yards and 33 touchdowns. Roberson returned from a serious knee injury to catch 34 passes for a team-high 686 yards (20.2 ypc.) last season.

Defensively, junior first team All-MAAC lineman **Mykol Gardiner (Cleveland, Ohio/Benedictine)** and fellow first team all-league pick **Aaron Strader (Pittsburgh, Pa./Westinghouse)** lead a group that returns seven starters including converted fullback Hough. Gardiner had a team-high 7.5 sacks last season, while Strader led the Dukes with four interceptions and seven passes broken up. **Nathan Totino (Pittsburgh, Pa./Seton-La Salle)**, the 2008 MAAC co-Defensive Rookie of the Year, is DU's top returning tackler with 93 last season.

The placekicking game is in good hands with **Mark Troyan (Ford City, Pa./Ford City)**. Troyan - a first-team All-MAAC pick - enters his senior season with a Duquesne career record 32 field goals. Schmitt will have to find a replacement for four-year starting punter David Kovalcik (Chantilly, Va./Chantilly), who finished his career second on DU's all-time list with a 37.4 yards per punt average.

"I am very pleased with the progress the team made this spring," said Schmitt. "We had quite a few younger players compete for higher positions on the depth chart. The development of our younger players, combined with the hard work of the veterans, made it a successful spring."

#### QB • KEVIN ROMBACH, Jr. (6-1, 205)

Completed a school record .610 percent of his passes last season ... has 25 career TD passes with just eight interceptions ... is 8-2-0 all time as a starter.

#### WR • ALEX ROBERSON, Sr. (6-3, 200)

Led Duquesne with 686 yards receiving in 2007 ... averaged 20.2 ypc. ... topped the 100-yard mark four times in DU's last seven games ... is poised to fill the shoes of departed All-American WR Bruce Hocker.

#### CB • AARON STRADER, Sr. (6-3, 190)

Three-year starter ... started in the backfield in 2005 & 2007 and at linebacker in 2006 ... making the move back to linebacker this season ... was first team All-MAAC as a linebacker in 2006 when he finished second on the team in tackles and returned an interception a school record 98 yards for a touchdown at La Salle.

#### G • STEVE KUHNS, Jr. (6-3, 315)

Has started every game in his Duquesne career (20 in a row entering this season) ... two-time second team All-MAAC.

#### OT • J.T. STEFANIK, Sr. (6-5, 270)

Has started the past 20 games at left tackle after making the switch to offense following his freshman season ... helped DU average 406.8 yards per game last year.

#### PK • MARK TROYAN, Sr. (5-9, 185)

Already holds the school record for career field goals with 32 (old record was 23) and points by a kicker with 186 (previous mark was 159) ... has had at least 10 field goals in each of his first three seasons (10, 10 & 12) ... averaging 62 points per season for his career.

# 2008 DUQUESNE FOOTBALL QUICK NOTES

## A RENEWED COMMITMENT – NORTHEAST CONFERENCE IN 2008

Duquesne, a member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League since 1994, will begin participation in the Northeast Conference Football League as an associate member starting with the 2008 football season. With the move to the NEC, Duquesne offered 18 scholarships beginning in February of 2008 and will increase that number by two for the ensuing three years. Duquesne granted only need-based financial aid for football playing student-athletes as a member of the MAAC. The NEC competed as a non-scholarship member of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision until 2006 when the conference adopted an athletics-based aid model. "I think this move will cause prospective student-athletes to look at Duquesne University a little differently," said head coach Jerry Schmitt. "Not only will they see Duquesne's high academic standards, but they'll also see the enhanced commitment to the football program. From a competitive standpoint, we always strive for improvement. We are excited for the opportunity to compete against the quality programs in the NEC." Duquesne started its program in 1902 and competed at the highest level - winning a pair of New Years Day Bowl games (1934 Festival of Palms and 1937 Orange) - before disbanding following the 1950 season. DU returned at the Club level prior to the 1969 season and won a National Club Championship in 1973. The Dukes competed at the NCAA Division III level from 1979-92 before moving up to the non-scholarship Football Championship Subdivision in 1993. Duquesne is 14-7 all-time against the NEC - including a 10-2 mark since 2003. DU's 12-10 win over Monmouth in the 2003 ECAC Classic clinched that season's mid-major National Championship. The NEC Football League, which was established in 1996, includes full time conference members Central Connecticut State University, Monmouth University, Robert Morris University, Sacred Heart University, Saint Francis (Pa.) University and Wagner College along with associate member the University at Albany.

## THE 2008 SCHEDULE

Duquesne will welcome four first-year league opponents to newly renovated Rooney Field in 2008 as seven games against Northeast Conference foes highlight the 2008 10-game schedule.

The Dukes open the season at night at Bucknell on Sept. 6. It will be the tenth time in 12 seasons that the Dukes and Bison, members of the Patriot League, will meet.

In week two, Duquesne hosts its first NEC opponent when Saint Francis, Pa. visits for a night game on Sept. 20. It will be the first game on Rooney Field which is currently undergoing a renovation that includes the construction of permanent grandstand seating and concession stands in addition to the installation of a new playing surface.

The Dukes will then play the two teams that met in last year's Gridiron Classic on consecutive weekends. Dayton, the 2007 Pioneer Football League champion, visits on Sept. 27 followed by 2007 NEC champ Albany on Oct. 4. Dayton defeated Albany 42-21 in the inaugural Gridiron Classic - which matches the champions of the PFL and NEC - last November.

Four of DU's final six games will be on the road beginning with conference games at cross-town rival Robert Morris (Oct. 11) and at Central Connecticut (Oct. 18).

Duquesne hosts Sacred Heart on Oct. 25 before heading to Smithfield, R.I. to complete the non-conference portion of the schedule at Bryant University on Nov. 1. Bryant, which qualified for the NCAA Division II playoffs in 2006 and 2007, will be in its first season of its four-year transition to Division I. The Bulldogs, who will face six Northeast Conference schools in '08, will officially join the NEC in 2012.

DU will travel to Staten Island, N.Y. to play Wagner on Nov. 8 before closing out the 2008 campaign at home against Monmouth on Nov. 15.

## SCHEDULE QUICKNOTES

\* This will be Duquesne's first season as an associate football-playing member of the Northeast Conference. DU is 14-7 all-time against current NEC schools.

\* DU will open the '08 home schedule with a 7:00 p.m. game against NEC opponent Saint Francis, Pa. on Sept. 20.

\* The Dukes will play back-to-back home games against defending conference champions in late September/early October (Sept. 27 vs. defending Pioneer Football League champ Dayton and Oct. 4 vs. defending NEC titleholder Albany).

\* The Dukes will play five times at home, with three coming in the first four weeks of the season.

\* DU's three non-conference games will be against one Patriot League school (Bucknell), one Pioneer League school (Dayton) and one school in its first season of transition to NCAA Division I (Bryant).

## DUQUESNE VERSUS THE NEC

Duquesne is 14-7 against the Northeast Conference (record vs. the schools listed below was when each school was in the NEC), including a 6-4 mark on the road. All but three of the 10 road games have been in the state of Pennsylvania (against Robert Morris and Saint Francis, Pa.). The only NEC schools DU has faced in the regular season are Monmouth (2007), Sacred Heart (2006 & 2007), Saint Francis, Pa. (1996, '97, '98, '05, '06 & '07) and Robert Morris (1994, '95, '98, '03, '04, '05, '06 & '07). Four of the meetings came in the ECAC Bowl/Classic (1996 vs. Robert Morris, 2001 vs. Sacred Heart, 2002 at Albany and 2003 vs. Monmouth). The Dukes are 10-2 versus the NEC since 2003. Last year the Dukes went 3-1 vs. the NEC with wins over Sacred Heart, Saint Francis and Robert Morris and a loss at Monmouth:

One meeting with Central Connecticut and three other games with Wagner came before the formation of the NEC in 1996 ... Duquesne is 29-5 all-time vs. St. Francis, 6-0 since SFU became a football-playing member of the NEC ... Duquesne played Wagner in 1992 (when the Dukes competed as a D-III school), 1993 (its first season in I-AA) & the 1995 ECAC Bowl ... four of the six NEC road wins have come at Saint Francis (the others were in 2006 at Robert Morris and 2007 at Sacred Heart) ... the only other NEC schools Duquesne has played on the road are Albany (0-1 - 2002 ECAC Classic) and Monmouth (0-1 last year).

.610 . . . School record percentage of passes completed by quarterback Kevin Rombach last season (177-of-290). Rombach, a junior-to-be, threw for 20 TDs with just six interceptions on the season. For his career Rombach has completed .614 of his tosses with a 3.1-to-1 touchdown pass to interception ratio (25-to-8).

1 . . . Number of Dukes currently in the National Football League. Cornerback Leigh Bodden, an All-American at DU from 1999-02, is starting his sixth NFL season - and first with the Detroit Lions. Bodden was originally signed as an undrafted free agent by the Cleveland Browns on May 2, 2003.

3 . . . Number of 100-yard rushing games posted by Greg Hough at running back last season. Hough, who played fullback as a freshman, was a first team All-MAAC outside linebacker in 2006. Hough, who returned an interception a school record 98 yards for a touchdown in '06, is moving back to linebacker this season.

5 . . . Number of different Duquesne receivers who have totaled 1,000 receiving yards in the past nine years.

6 . . . Number of MAAC championship teams fourth-year head coach Jerry Schmitt was part of at Duquesne both as an assistant (1995, 1996 & 1999) and head coach (2005, 2006 & 2007).

8 . . . Number of wins Duquesne has over Patriot League schools (all since 1999). No current or former MAAC, Pioneer League or Northeast Conference school has won more than five games versus teams from the Patriot League.

9 . . . Number of consecutive MAAC titles won by the Dukes (1999 through 2007) in their last nine years in the league. DU completed its final season in the MAAC in 2007.

14 . . . Number of consecutive winning seasons posted by the Duquesne program. Only two other FCS schools (Eastern Kentucky and Montana) have longer streaks.

16.9 . . . Career average yards per catch average for senior All-America candidate receiver Alex Roberson. Roberson, who has 10 career TD catches, averaged 20.2 yard per catch on 34 grabs last season. He topped the 100-yard mark four times in his last seven games played.

18 . . . Number of scholarships Duquesne granted in February of 2008 in conjunction with the school's move to the Northeast Conference as an associate football-playing member. DU will start play in the NEC this fall.

+26.7 . . . Duquesne's average margin of victory in MAAC play from 1999 through 2007 (1,869-to-571 in 48 games). The Dukes won nine consecutive league titles during that stretch.

39 . . . Number of consecutive MAAC wins posted by the Dukes from Oct. 23, 1999 (a 62-50 loss at Iona) to Oct. 28, 2006 (a 17-13 home loss to Iona). The conference win streak tied for second-longest in NCAA Division I-A or I-AA history.

75-9-0 . . . Duquesne's all-time record in the MAAC from 1994-2007.

157 . . . Number of passes Duquesne has intercepted since the start of the 1999 season (96 g.). Over that span, DU has surrendered just 99 opponent TD passes while registering 2,505 yards and 20 touchdowns on interception returns only.

## A NEWCOMER OF NOTE

Connor Dixon (South Park, Pa./South Park), the No. 2 quarterback at Michigan State last season, signed a financial aid agreement with Duquesne in mid-June and will be eligible to play for the football team this fall. Dixon, who in his only collegiate appearance completed 3-of-5 passes for 37 yards and a touchdown against UAB in Michigan State's opener last season, redshirted in 2006. The 6-4, 200-pound Dixon was ranked among the nation's top quarterbacks by Rivals.com (No. 17) and Scouts, Inc. (No. 37) after leading South Park to a 16-0 record and Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association Class AA state championship in 2005. Dixon is the second Football Bowl Subdivision quarterback to transfer to Duquesne in the past 10 years. Tony Zimmerman transferred from the University of Pittsburgh following his freshman season and set 14 school records in leading the Dukes to a 26-7 record and two Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League championships in three years as a starter from 1998-00. Zimmerman, who threw for 7,313 yards and 73 touchdowns in 33 career games, still holds the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision career record for highest percentage of passes for touchdowns.

## 14-STRAIGHT WINNING SEASONS

DU, which won 39 consecutive MAAC games between 1999 and 2006, ranks behind only Eastern Kentucky (30) and Montana (22) among Football Championship Subdivision schools with 14 consecutive winning seasons.

## A DUKE IN THE NFL

Duquesne currently has one player on a National Football League roster in Detroit Lions cornerback **Leigh Bodden**, who will be beginning his sixth season this fall. Originally signed as a free agent by the Cleveland Browns, Bodden established himself as a special teams standout before starting 11 times and picking off six passes for the Browns in 2005. He started all nine games for which he was healthy in 2006 and in 2007 Bodden tied for fifth in the NFL with six interceptions, a team-high for Cleveland, and was one of only eight players in the league with at least six picks. Additionally, Bodden tied for second in the NFL with a total of nine individual takeaways (six interceptions and three fumble recoveries), and his three fumble recoveries tied for third in the league (tied for first among defensive backs). He was the only player to record at least three interceptions and recover three fumbles. Bodden, who was traded to Detroit for Shaun Rogers following the 2007 season, was named as the 178th-best player in the NFL by *Sports Illustrated's* Peter King in the magazine's 2007 NFL Preview issue. In his preview of the Browns, King said of Bodden and then-teammate Kamerion Wimbley, "*Bodden and Wimbley had breakout years in '06; you may not have heard of them, but they're on their way to becoming premier players.*" Two year's ago, outspoken Cincinnati wide receiver Chad Johnson singled out Bodden as the NFL cornerback who did the best job of covering him. Bodden signed a four-year contract extension with the Browns in the summer of 2006. The Maryland native was a two-time AP All-American for the Dukes from 1999-02. His 28 career interceptions rank tied for second on the all-time I-AA list. Bodden was signed as an undrafted free agent by the Browns on May 2, 2003. Bodden is the first Duke to stick with an NFL team since Al Demao played in 12 games for the Washington Redskins in 1953. Demao, who was named one of the Redskins 70 greatest players in 2002, was the last of 43 Dukes to play in the NFL between 1933 and 1953.
