2009 HONORS CANDIDATES

All-America

LB • NATHAN TOTINO, Jr. (5-10, 200)

2008 First Team All-NEC linebacker ... two-year starter ranks third among active NCAA FCS players with a career 10.7 tackles per game average ... his career average of 5.8 solo tackles per game is the best in the FCS ... finished last season ranked fifth nationally with 12.22 tackles per game ... had his season cut short by a knee injury suffered in game nine at Wagner ... underwent offseason knee surgery which kept him out of spring practice ... has 11 career double-digit tackle games including 23 (13 solo) against Albany last season ... the 23 stops tied the most by an FCS player last season and were the most by a Duquesne player since the Dukes moved up to the FCS level in 1993 ... also had 16 tackles in the season opener at Bucknell ... ranked fourth nationally among FCS freshmen with a 9.30 tackles per game average in 2007 when he was named the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Defensive co-Rookie of the Year.

All-Conference

TE • SEAN BUNEVICH, Sr. (6-4, 230)

Caught 25 passes for 454 yards for a team-best 18.2 ypc. average in seven games prior to being lost for the season due to a knee injury ... underwent offseason knee surgery and did not participate in spring drills ... was named Second Team All-NEC despite missing the final three games of the season ... had eight catches for 163 yards, including a 41-yard score vs. Albany ... added a 22-yard TD catch at Bucknell ... had three catches of 40 or more yards in 2008 ... averaging 18.9 yards per catch for his career (40-756-5) ... was Second Team All Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference as a sophomore ... exactly half of his 40 career catches have covered 20 or more yards (including 12 last season).

G • STEVE KUHNS, Sr. (6-3, 315)

Has started every game in his Duquesne career (30 in a row entering this season) ... was a two-time second team All-Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference pick as a freshman and sophomore.

OT • RON DUNN, So. (6-5, 300)

Talented young lineman started the final nine games last season at right guard ... expected to take over at the all-important left tackle spot this year.

DE • TYLER SCRUGGS, Jr. (6-2, 235)

Started the final five games at defensive end in his first season of college football ... tied for second on the team with 5.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks ... tied for the team lead with three fumbles forced and led the team with four QB hurries ... originally attended West Virginia on a baseball scholarship.

2009 DUQUESNE FOOTBALL

Duquesne returns 15 starters - including a pair of All-Northeast Conference picks - from last year's 3-7 squad as it enters its second season in the NEC. This is also the second year that the Dukes, who granted only need-based financial aid for football playing student-athletes as a member of the defunct Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League from 1994-2007, have granted scholarships in the sport of football.

Duquesne, which adopted an athletics-based aid model in February of 2008, now has two scholarship recruiting classes in the fold.

"We are steadily increasing our talent level," said fifth-year head coach Jerry Schmitt, who was named Coach of the Year twice in three seasons of MAAC competition. "But it is going to take some time to catch up to the rest of the league."

Last year, 25 freshmen saw action with 19 starting at least once. In all, 56 of the 85 players on the season-ending roster were freshmen and sophomores. For 2009, Schmitt and his staff have added a 24-man recruiting class. Schmitt is hoping to continue to mold the young talent into a cohesive, competitive unit.

"We had a very productive spring," said Schmitt. "We were missing a few key players who were rehabbing injuries, but it was encouraging to see other players stepping up."

The injured players Schmitt was referring include first team All-NEC junior linebacker **Nathan Totino (Pittsburgh, Pa./Seton-La Salle)** and second team All-NEC senior tight end **Sean Bunevich (North Ridgeville, Ohio/North Ridgeville)** who are both recovering from off-season knee surgery. In addition, junior quarterback **Connor Dixon (South Park, Pa./South Park)**, who started eight games last season after transferring in from Michigan State, did not participate in spring drills as he recovered from shoulder surgery.

Veteran senior quarterback **Kevin Rombach (Harrisburg, Pa./Central Dauphin)** took the majority of snaps at quarterback this spring. Rombach, who has thrown for 3,262 yards with a 61.2 completion percentage in his DU career, was a first team All-Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League pick in 2007. The Harrisburg, Pa. native, who started the last two games of 2008, has 27 career touchdown passes to his credit. He threw for 231 yards and scores of 61, 43 and 34 yards in the spring game. Dixon, who battled shoulder soreness late last season, completed 52.1 percent of his passes for 1,899 yards and 20 touchdowns in starting the first eight games of 2008.

Senior tackles **Matt Kikta (Upper St. Clair, Pa./Upper St. Clair)** and **Steve Kuhns (Lafayette, N.Y./Christian Brothers Academy)** are back to anchor an offensive line that returns five starters. The duo leads all Duquesne returnees with 30 consecutive starts apiece. Kuhns has moved to guard to make way for talented sophomore **Ron Dunn (Abington, Mass./Milford Academy)** at the all-important left tackle spot. Dunn started the final nine games last season at right guard.

Senior running back **Cleodis Williams (Carlisle, Pa./Carlisle)** will look to benefit from the experience up front. Williams led the Dukes with 849 yards rushing, including four 100-yard games, last season.

Bunevich, who played in seven games prior to suffering a season-ending knee injury, is DU's top returning receiver with 25 catches for 454 yards and a team-best 18.2 yards per catch. Senior **Michael Rasky (Irwin, Pa./Penn-Trafford)**, who caught 22 passes for 313 yards and four touchdowns in 2008 is also back.

Sophomore **Akeem Moore (Pittsburgh, Pa./Brentwood)**, who picked off three passes for 111 yards as a true freshman safety last season, has made the move to receiver to help ease the loss of three-year starter Alex Roberson, who led the Dukes with 40 catches for 614 yards and seven touchdowns last season. Moore showed a glimpse of his potential with a 34-yard touchdown reception in DU's spring scrimmage.

Newcomer **Dave Williams (Monroeville, Pa./Gateway)**, a first year transfer from Michigan State, will be looked to add a new dimension to the Dukes offense. The 5-9, 175-pound Williams, who played in five games in two seasons at MSU, was a member of the *Pittsburgh Tribune-Review*

Terrific 25 after gaining 1,538 all-purpose yards and posting 18 touchdowns as a senior at Gateway High School in suburban Pittsburgh. He scored eight times via reception, five by rush, three by punt return and twice by kickoff return and averaged 48.0 yards per touchdown.

Defensively, Totino, whose career average of 10.7 tackles per game ranks third among NCAA FCS returnees, will lead the way. Totino, who was injured in the second-to-last game of 2008, leads all active FCS players in solo tackles per game at 5.8. His 23-tackle game versus Albany tied the season high for tackles in a game by an FCS player in 2008.

Senior **Mykol Gardiner (Cleveland, Ohio/Benedictine)**, a three-year starter, is back at defensive end. Gardiner had 3.5 sacks last season to bring his career total to 17.5.

Junior defensive end **Tyler Scruggs (South Park, Pa./South Park)** was one of Duquesne's most productive linemen despite not joining the starting lineup until the sixth game of last season. Scruggs, who originally attended West Virginia on a baseball scholarship, tied for second on the team with 5.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. He also tied for the team lead with three fumbles forced and led the team with four quarterback hurries in his first season of college football.

Junior safety **Willie Milhouse (Waldorf, Md./Thomas Stone)**, whose 58 tackles last season ranked fourth on the team, will lead the secondary.

"We had some great competition in the spring" said Schmitt. "We also had some young guys step up and play well in the spring scrimmage. I was pleased with our effort and intensity and hope we can carry that over to the fall when the new recruiting class reports."

2009 DUQUESNE FOOTBALL QUICK NOTES

A RENEWED COMMITMENT – DU'S SECOND SEASON IN THE NORTHEAST CONFERENCE: Duquesne, a member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League from 1994 to 2007, is beginning its second season as an associate member of the Northeast Conference Football League. With the move to the NEC, Duquesne offered 18 scholarships beginning in February of 2008 and will increase that number by two for the ensuing three years. Duquesne granted only need-based financial aid for football playing student-athletes as a member of the MAAC. The NEC competed as a non-scholarship member of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision until 2006 when the conference adopted an athletics-based aid model. "I think this move will cause prospective student-athletes to look at Duquesne University a little differently," said head coach Jerry Schmitt when the Dukes joined the NEC. "Not only will they see Duquesne's high academic standards, but they'll also see the enhanced commitment to the football program. From a competitive standpoint, we always strive for improvement. We are excited for the opportunity to compete against the quality programs in the NEC." Duquesne started its program in 1902 and competed at the highest level - winning a pair of New Years Day Bowl games (1934 Festival of Palms and 1937 Orange) - before disbanding following the 1950 season. DU returned at the Club level prior to the 1969 season and won a National Club Championship in 1973. The Dukes competed at the NCAA Division III level from 1979-92 before moving up to the non-scholarship Football Championship Subdivision in 1993. The NEC Football League, which was established in 1996, includes full-time conference members Central Connecticut State University, Monmouth University, Robert Morris University, Sacred Heart University, Saint Francis (Pa.) University and Wagner College along with associate member the University at Albany.

THE 2009 SCHEDULE: A 1,157-mile trip to Thibodaux, Louisiana to face Nicholls State, highlights the non-conference portion of the 2009 Duquesne football schedule. In all, the Dukes, who return 15 starters from last year's 3-7 team, play five games at home and six on the road as they begin their second season as members of the Northeast Conference.

The Dukes open under the lights at Rooney Field against Bucknell on Sept. 5, marking the eighth time in the past 13 years Duquesne will face Bucknell in the season-opener. The Bison, a member of the Patriot League, defeated Duquesne 48-42 last year at Bucknell. The following weekend, Duquesne will make its first trip west of the Mississippi since a 1947 game at Saint Louis to face Nicholls State. The game will be Duquesne's first against a member of the Southland Conference.

DU stays on the road for the first of seven games against NEC opponents when it heads to New Jersey to face Monmouth on Sept. 19. The Dukes, who handed Dayton one of its three losses last season, travel to UD to face the Flyers on Sept. 26.

Duquesne begins a stretch of six consecutive NEC games with a Homecoming match-up against local rival Robert Morris on Oct. 3. The following weekend, the Dukes head to upstate New York to face defending NEC champion Albany.

DU hosts Central Connecticut State on Oct. 17 before making the short trip to Loretto, Pa. to play in the first night game in DeGol Field history on Oct. 24 at Saint Francis, Pa. The Dukes return home to play Wagner on Halloween before taking a week off. DU heads to Fairfield, Conn. to play Sacred Heart on Nov. 14 before concluding the season at home with a non-conference game versus Bryant on Nov. 21. Bryant, which qualified for the NCAA Division II playoffs in 2006 and 2007, will be in its second season of its four-year transition to Division I. The Bulldogs, who will face all eight Northeast Conference schools in '09, will officially join the NEC in 2012.

- The Dukes will also play the first night game in the history of Saint Francis, Pa.'s DeGol field when they play at SFU on Oct. 24.
- Duquesne will be making its first trip west of the Mississippi since 1947 when it plays at Nicholls State on Sept. 12. Nicholls State, a member of the Southland Conference, is located in Thibodaux, La.
- The Dukes will play five times at home, with three of the first four games coming on the road.
- DU's four non-conference games will be against one Patriot League school (Bucknell), one Southland Conference school (Nicholls State), one Pioneer League school (Dayton) and one school in its second season of transition to NCAA Division I (Bryant).

DUQUESNE BY THE NUMBERS

1 . . . Number of Dukes currently in the National Football League. Cornerback Leigh Bodden, an All-American at DU from 1999-02, is starting his seventh NFL season - and first with the New England Patriots. Bodden was originally signed as an undrafted free agent by the Cleveland Browns on May 2, 2003.

3 . . . Team high number of interceptions made by Akeem Moore last season as a true freshman starter at safety. Moore, who returned the picks a total of 111 yards, has moved to offensive side of the ball and will be on the receiving end of passes this season.

4 . . . Number of 100-yard rushing games posted by Cleo Williams last season. Williams, a senior-to-be who last saw action as a freshman in 2005, sat out the 2006 and 2007 seasons while attending to academic issues. Williams averaged 4.5 yards per carry in his first extended action since '05.

5 . . . Number of different Duquesne receivers who have totaled 1,000 receiving yards in the past 10 years.

6 . . . Number of MAAC championship teams fifth-year head coach Jerry Schmitt was part of at Duquesne both as an assistant (1995, 1996 & 1999) and head coach (2005, 2006 & 2007).

8 . . . Number of wins Duquesne has over Patriot League schools (all since 1999). No current or former MAAC, Pioneer League or Northeast Conference school has won more than five games versus teams from the Patriot League.

9 . . . Number of consecutive MAAC titles won by the Dukes (1999 through 2007) in their last nine years in the league. DU completed its final season in the MAAC in 2007.

14 . . . Number winning seasons Duquesne has posted in the past 15 years.

18 . . . Number of scholarships Duquesne granted in February of 2008 in conjunction with the school's move to the Northeast Conference as an associate football-playing member. The 2009 recruiting class is the second to receive scholarships.

+26.7 . . . Duquesne's average margin of victory in MAAC play from 1999 through 2007 (1,869-to-571 in 48 games). The Dukes won nine consecutive league titles during that stretch.

30 . . . Team high number of consecutive starts made by senior offensive linemen Steve Kuhns and Matt Kikta. Both have started every game in their DU careers.

39 . . . Number of consecutive MAAC wins posted by the Dukes from Oct. 23, 1999 (a 62-50 loss at Iona) to Oct. 28, 2006 (a 17-13 home loss to Iona). The conference win streak tied for second-longest in NCAA Division I-A or I-AA history.

75-9-0 . . . Duquesne's all-time record in the MAAC from 1994-2007.

167 . . . Number of passes Duquesne has intercepted since the start of the 1999 season (106 g.). Over that span, DU has surrendered just 111 opponent TD passes while registering 2,786 yards and 20 touchdowns on interception returns only.

A NEWCOMER OF NOTE

Dave Williams (Monroeville, Pa./Gateway/Michigan State), who played in five games in two seasons at Michigan State, transferred to Duquesne in January and participated in spring drills. Williams, a 5-9, 175-pound receiver, should help ease the loss of senior Alex Roberson (40-614-7 in 2008). Williams, who had two catches for 45 yards in DU's spring scrimmage, has two seasons of eligibility remaining. He appeared in two games for Michigan State in 2008 (Eastern Washington and at Northwestern) and three in 2007 (UAB, at Notre Dame and at Wisconsin) after redshirting in 2006. He was named MSU's Scout Team Offensive Player of the Year in 2006 and had four catches for 55 yards in the Spartans' 2007 spring game. Williams was named Pennsylvania MVP in the Big 33 Football Classic after catching touchdown passes of 38, 25 and 22 yards - the 38-yarder was thrown by current DU quarterback Connor Dixon, who transferred from Michigan State prior to the 2008 season. Williams accounted for 141 all-purpose yards in the June 2006 Big 33 game. He was a member of the *Pittsburgh Tribune-Review* Terrific 25 after gaining 1,538 all-purpose yards and posting 18 touchdowns as a senior at Gateway High School in suburban Pittsburgh. He scored eight times via reception, five by rush, three by punt return and twice by kickoff return and averaged 48.0 yards per touchdown. He caught 21 passes for 600 yards (28.6 ypc.), rushed for 224 yards on 32 carries (7.0 ypc.) and averaged 29.9 yards on 16 kickoff returns and 19.7 yards on 12 punt returns as a senior.

A DUKE IN THE NFL

Duquesne currently has one player on a National Football League roster in New England Patriots cornerback **Leigh Bodden**, who will be beginning his seventh season this fall. Originally signed as a free agent by the Cleveland Browns, Bodden established himself as a special teams standout before starting 11 times and picking off six passes for the Browns in 2005. He started all nine games for which he was healthy in 2006 and in 2007 Bodden tied for fifth in the NFL with six interceptions, a team-high for Cleveland, and was one of only eight players in the league with at least six picks. Additionally, Bodden tied for second in the NFL with a total of nine individual takeaways (six interceptions and three fumble recoveries), and his three fumble recoveries tied for third in the league (tied for first among defensive backs). He was the only player to record at least three interceptions and recover three fumbles. Bodden, who was traded to Detroit for Shaun Rogers following the 2007 season, was named as the 178th-best player in the NFL by *Sports Illustrated's* Peter King in the magazine's 2007 NFL Preview issue. In his preview of the Browns, King said of Bodden and then-teammate Kamerion Wimbley, "*Bodden and Wimbley had breakout years in '06; you may not have heard of them, but they're on their way to becoming premier players.*" Three year's ago, outspoken Cincinnati wide receiver Chad Johnson singled out Bodden as the NFL cornerback who did the best job of covering him. Bodden signed a four-year contract extension with the Browns in the summer of 2006. The Maryland native was a two-time AP All-American for the Dukes from 1999-02. His 28 career interceptions rank tied for second on the all-time I-AA list. Bodden was signed as an undrafted free agent by the Browns on May 2, 2003. Bodden is the first Duke to stick with an NFL team since Al Demao played in 12 games for the Washington Redskins in 1953. Demao, who was named one of the Redskins 70 greatest players in 2002, was the last of 43 Dukes to play in the NFL between 1933 and 1953.
