FIRST-PLACE DUKES NEED A LITTLE HELP: Duquesne (8-2, 6-1)

remained in a first place tie for the Northeast Conference title with Albany (7-3, 6-1) by virtue of its 29-15 win at Sacred Heart last Saturday. To win the NEC's automatic bid to the Division I Football Championship, the Dukes will need help from those same Pioneers this week. The only way the Dukes can qualify is with an Albany loss. DU can garner the automatic bid outright with a win over Robert Morris (2-8, 2-5) this Saturday at 12:10 (WMNY-AM 1360) combined with an Albany home loss to Sacred Heart (1:00 p.m.). If the Dukes and Great Danes both win, there would be co-Champions, however, UAlbany would move on to the playoffs by virtue of its 38-10 win over DU on Oct. 8. There is one other scenario that would give the Dukes the bid with a loss: losses by Duquesne and Albany and wins by Bryant (7-3, 5-2) (vs. CCSU at 12:00) and Wagner (3-7, 3-4) (vs. Monmouth at 12:00) would create three-way ties for both first and fourth. Since Albany, Bryant and Duquesne would own 1-1 records against each other, the three would move to the next tiebreaker which is record against the three schools tied for fourth (potentially Monmouth, Sacred Heart and Wagner). Duquesne would have a 3-0 record against that group, while Albany would be 2-1. Bryant, which is still in its transition to NCAA Division I, is not eligible for the NEC's automatic bid. DU enters Saturday's game having won four in a row. RMU has dropped its last five.

DUKES AND COLONIALS: Duquesne has

won of six of the past nine meetings in the series which is tied at 6-6 ... DU has won the last five on Rooney Field ... in the last Rooney Field meeting, Duquesne saw a 27-0 third quarter lead cut to seven before adding a fourth quarter Larry McCoy TD run to defeat the fast-closing Colonials 34-20 ... quarterback-turned-receiver Connor Dixon threw for 201 yards and two TDs and McCoy ran for 107 yards and two scores to lead the Dukes ... last year, Myles Russ ran for 154 yards and a pair of touchdowns and Jeff Sinclair threw for a score and ran for two more as Robert Morris defeated Duquesne 34-11 at Joe Walton Stadium ... RMU held McCoy to 81 yards rushing in the win ... Duquesne head coach Jerry Schmitt is 4-2 vs. RMU, including a 3-0 mark on Rooney Field.

DU AMONG FCS LEADERS: Duquesne enters the Robert Morris game leading

the nation in pass defense at 138.9 ypg. The DU secondary has allowed just nine TD passes while posting nine interceptions. The Dukes are also in the Top 20 in total defense (5th at 284.1 ypg.), pass efficiency defense (8th at 102.0), scoring defense (14th at 19.1 ppg.) and rushing offense (17th at 208.38 ypg.). Individually, running back Larry McCoy (263-1,275-11) ranks 8th in rushing (127.5 ypg.) and Jared Williams is tied for 15th in interceptions/g. (.40). Duquesne leads the NEC in rushing offense, total defense, scoring defense, pass defense, pass efficiency defense and kickoff return average (20.97).



2011 PLAYERS TO WATCH

28 • RB • LARRY MCCOY, Jr. (5-11, 215)

2010 second team All-NEC ... entered the year with the top career rushing average among returning juniors (currently 103.8 ypg.) ... his 21.1 career carries per game average ranks fourth in the FCS ... ranked 11th nationally in yard per game last season (117.4) on his way to 1,291 yards ... averaging 5.0 ypc. for his career ... had six 100-yard games in 2010 and has added a DU single-season record eight more this year ... has 18 career 100-yard games including 14 in his last 18 games ... one of just three FCS underclassmen with over 3,000 yards (3,373).

77 • OT • RON DUNN, Sr. (6-6, 320)

2010 second team All-NEC ... has started a team-high 41 consecutive games on the offensive line including the last 32 at left tackle ... has helped clear the way for junior RB Larry McCoy who has topped the 100-yard mark 18 times in the past three seasons.

6 • QB • SEAN PATTERSON, Jr. (6-1, 200)

Threw for 2,050 yards and 20 touchdowns in his first full season as a starter ... completing 54.7 percent of his passes for is career ... is 15-6 as a starter over the past two seasons ... 10th leading rusher in the NEC ... has six multiple touchdown pass games this season (13 for his career).

10 • WR • CONNOR DIXON, Gr. (6-5, 212)

Michigan State transfer came to Duquesne in 2008 as a QB ... shoulder injuries forced him to make the move to receiver eight games into the 2009 season ... was granted a rare sixth year of eligibility the day before the opener at Bucknell ... caught a TD pass on his first play from scrimmage despite having not practiced with the team since November of 2010 ... was a second team All-NEC pick last season (43-602-5) ... has caught a pass in every game (25 through Sacred Heart) since moving to receiver.

32 • S • SERGE KONA, Jr. (5-11, 223)

DU's top returning tackler made the move from linebacker - where he started all 11 games in 2010 - to safety in the spring ... had 64 stops (36 solo), including a team-high 12 tackles for loss as a sophomore ... also forced a team-best three fumbles and broke up three passes ... had 17 tackles for loss at LB ... entered the year tied for 5th nationally among returnees in career fumbles forced per game (0.18).

90 • DE • ALEX INDA, Sr. (6-2, 267)

Has started the past 32 games on the defensive line ... led all DU linemen with 55 tackles (25 solo) and tied for the team lead with 3.0 sacks in 2010 ... recovered a team-best three fumbles for 38 yards ... also forced two fumbles and added six tackles for loss ... broke up four passes and had five quarterback hurries.

QUICK HITS

• The Dukes are 10-2 in their past 12 NEC games dating back to last season. DU was 5-13 in its first 18 NEC games while integrating a scholarship model.

• DU's 5-3 conference record and third place finish in 2010 were its best in its first three seasons of Northeast Conference play. The Dukes' five wins were one more than they had in their first two NEC seasons combined: DU went 2-5 (6th) in the NEC in 2008 and 2-6 (7th) in 2009. The Dukes will finish no worse than tied for second this season.

• Duquesne's four-game win streak earlier this season (at Dayton, Valparaiso, at Saint Francis and Bryant) was the school's longest since a five-game streak in 2007. That streak has been matched with wins over CCSU, Wagner, at Monmouth and at Sacred Heart. The streaks are DU's longest since moving to the NEC in 2008. The 2007 season was DU 's last in the MAAC.

• The DU defense has allowed just one touchdown in the past eight quarters - a 13 yard run by Sacred Heart's Greg Moore last weekend. The score followed a DU turnover that gave the Pioneers the ball at the Duquesne 24. Second-year defensive coordinator Dave Opfar and the defensive staff have taken a unit that ranked 83rd in total defense in 2009 to a group that finished 50th last season. DU enters the RMU game leading the FCS in total defense.

• DU has posted back-to-back road wins in NEC play for the first time (16-0 at Monmouth and 29-15 at Sacred Heart).

• Duquesne has won six in a row at home. It is the longest home streak since six in a row at home in 2005 (last four games) & 2006 (first two games). The last time DU won seven in a row at home was from 2002 into 2004 when Duquesne reeled off a Rooney Field record 16 in a row.

• Three of Duquesne's games have been decided in the final minute. DU dropped its opener at Bucknell when the Bison scored a TD and extra point with 57 seconds left in a 27-26 win. The next weekend, Charlie Leventry kicked a field goal with 30 seconds left and Jared Williams blocked and returned a blocked field goal as time expired in a 22-13 victory at Dayton. On Oct. 15, Sean Patterson capped a 90 yard drive with a four yard run with 42 seconds left in a 28-21 win over CCSU.

• QB Sean Patterson is 12-3 in his past 15 starts. The junior lefty has thrown for 32 touchdowns with 11 interceptions over that span.

• Patterson became the first DU quarterback to rush for 100 yards since the Dukes moved to the FCS level in 1993 with his 111 yards on 12 carries against CCSU on Oct. 15. Patterson's last run in that game, a 4-yard TD with 42 seconds left, proved to be the game-winner. Patterson currently ranks 10th in the NEC in rushing with a 42.9 yards per game average. He is averaging 5.6 yards per carry.

• Receiver Connor Dixon has caught 10 touchdown passes in DU's past seven games. Thirteen of his 35 receptions in 2011 have gone for scores.

• Duquesne ended the nation's longest FCS win streak at 10 with its 22-13 victory at Dayton on Sept. 10. DU, which has won four of its last five meetings with the perennial Pioneer Football League power, was the last team to defeat UD before the Flyers began their 10-game streak.

• DU amassed 628 yards of total offense in its 49-14 win over Valparaiso on Sept. 17. The total yards were the most since 647 in a 36-14 win over Siena in 2003. Duquesne's 427 rushing yards were its most since 457 vs. La Salle in 2003. Larry McCoy (21-164) and Bill Bair (16-154) both topped 100 yards marking the first time since Oct. 26, 2002 that two Dukes ran for 100 yards in the same game (Kyle Postell: 17-130 & Mike Hilliard: 20-122 at La Salle). It was the first time since a 55-0 win over Siena on Oct. 27, 2001 that two Duquesne players rushed for over 150 yards in the same game (Donte Small 27-186 & Josh Rue 16-158)

• DU was the first team to shut out Monmouth (16-0 win on Oct. 29) since Stony Brook did it on Sept. 25, 2004.

• The Dukes held Sacred Heart to 229 yards - 117 below their season average, in the 29-15 win on Nov. 12.

• Twenty-five of DU's 36 touchdown drives this season have covered 60 or more yards.

• Junior running back Larry McCoy eclipsed the 1,000-yard mark for the season and 3,000-yard mark for his career with his 149-yard, three-touchdown performance against Wagner on Oct. 22. McCoy has a school record eight 100-yard games in 10 starts this season.

• DU had to find a replacement for kicker Eric Duale who chose not to return in 2011. Duale was one of the most improved players in the NEC last year with a team-high 73 points. The junior-to-be converted 14-of-18 field goal attempts and 31-of-32 extra points last season. Charlie Leventry, who has handled punting duties for the past two seasons, is 11-of-16 on field goal attempts (with four of 40 yards or longer, including a school-record 51-yarder vs. Wagner) with 64 points through 10 games. Leventry, a two-time NEC Special Teams Player of the Week, is averaging 36.7 yards per punt with 20 of 45 punts placed inside the 20 and just two touchbacks.

• Pittsburgh native Gary Dunn, who spent the previous 14 years at Morehead State, is in his first season as DU's offensive coordinator. Dunn replaces former DU quarterback Niel Loebig who moved with his wife to Florida. Loebig was on the staff for five seasons including the last two as offensive coordinator. Dunn, who was the OC at Morehead for his final 11 seasons, regularly recruited the western Pennsylvania area for the Eagles.

• DU's first scholarship class, signed in February of 2008, makes up the majority of this year's junior and senior classes. Duquesne offered 18 scholarships to the first class. That number has been increased to the current number of 28.

• A major renovation of the home locker room as well as coaches offices located in the fieldhouse located off the east end of Rooney Field was completed over the summer. The newly named Keller Fieldhouse project comes on the heels of a renovation of Rooney Field which was completed in 2009.

• The Dukes have lost four starters/key reserves for the season: receiver **Akeem Moore (Pittsburgh, Pa./Brentwood)** torn ACL at practice on Sept. 21; defensive end **Reggie Eiland (Accokeek, Md./Gwynn Park)** ankle injury on Sept. 22; running back/return specialist **Ryan Ho (Pearl City, Hawaii/Kamehameha Schools)** dislocated ankle in the opener at Bucknell and receiver/return specialist **David Thomas (Ocala, Fla./Trinity Catholic)** broken foot vs. Valparaiso. One other, linebacker **Tyler Zimmer (Harrison City, Pa./Penn-Trafford)**, who was forced to leave the Valparaiso game with an ankle injury, was back in uniform at Sacred Heart (after missing six games).

SHU LEFTOVERS: The win was Duquesne's third in a row over Sacred Heart ... it was also DU's third consecutive victory at Fairfield, Conn. ... this is Duquesne's second four-game win streak of the season ... the DU defense, coming off a 16-0 shutout of Monmouth two week's ago, gave up just one short-yardage touchdown on the afternoon ... the Dukes held Sacred Heart to 229 yards - 117 under its season average ... **Larry McCoy (Wytheville, Va./George Wythe)** ran for 149 yards on 30 carries ... it was his school record eighth 100 yard game of the season breaking the record of seven he shared with Mike Hilliard (2002 & 2003), Donte Small (1999 & 2000) and Bill Green (1995) ... it was also the 18th career 100-yard game for the DU junior ... only all-time leading rusher Donte Small (21) has more career 100-yard games ... McCoy ranks third on DU's all-time rushing list with 3,373 yards ... **Connor Dixon (South Park, Pa./South Park)** extended his streak of consecutive games with at least one catch to 25 with 6 catches for 95 yards including touchdowns of 33 & 35 yards ... the 6-5, 212-pound graduate student has caught at least one pass in every game since moving from quarterback to receiver eight games into the 2009 season ... Dixon has caught a touchdown pass in eight of 10 games this season ... 13 of his 35 catches in 2011 have gone for touchdowns ... the 13 scores this season are the fifth-most in school history, three behind the school record of 16 set by Bruce Hocker in 2006 ... first-year Ohio State transfer **Dorian Bell (Monroeville, Pa./Gateway)** earned NEC Defensive Player of the Week honors after posting a season-high 8 tackles (6 solo) including two tackles for loss ... the sophomore linebacker also added a quarterback hurry and broke up three passes ... defensive lineman **Alex Inda (San Fernando, Calif./St. Genevieve)** had a game-high nine tackles including a big sack late that ended Sacred Heart's final attempt at a comeback.

POINTS IN THE POLLS

DU, which appeared in the "others receiving votes" category of the Sept. 12 Sports Network FCS Top 25 poll with an NEC-best 10 points following its win at Dayton, disappeared from the poll for two weeks following a 49-14 win over Valpo & 41-14 victory at Saint Francis, Pa. The Dukes were back the week of Oct. 3 - following a 31-28 win over Bryant - with an NEC-best 17 points. The Dukes were also tied for 36th in the Oct. 3 FCS Coaches Poll with six points. DU was dropped from both polls following its loss at Albany on Oct. 8 before reappearing in the Sports Network poll with four points on Oct. 24. DU received a season-high 51 points this week (34th in poll):

18 . . . Number of career 100-yard rushing games posted by Larry McCoy. Only one person - all-time leading rusher Donte Small (4,260 yards from 1998-01) has posted more 100-yard games (21) since DU moved to the FCS level in 1993. McCoy opened the 2011 season with five consecutive 100-yard games.

18 . . . Number of scholarships Duquesne granted in February of 2008 in conjunction with the school's move to the Northeast Conference as an associate football-playing member. The 2011 recruiting class is the fourth to receive scholarships. DU's scholarship total for football currently rests at 28.

21 . . . Number of consecutive games in which Larry McCoy has rushed for at least 74 yards.

25 . . . Number of consecutive games in which grad student receiver Connor Dixon has caught a pass. Dixon, who transferred to DU from Michigan State as a quarterback, has caught at least one pass in every game since changing positions eight games into the 2009 season. He has at least one TD in eight of 10 games this season.

34 . . . Number of touchdown passes thrown by Sean Patterson in his past 16 games. Patterson, who had five TDs and seven interceptions in his first five games of 2010, threw for 15 scores with just three picks in his last six. He has 19 TDs and eight interceptions in 2011.

246 . . . Number of yards Larry McCoy rushed for at CCSU last season. McCoy, who averaged 10.2 ypc., had runs of 51, 48 and 46 yards in posting the fifth-highest rushing total in school history. It ranked as the seventh-most yards gained by an FCS player in a game in 2010.

458 . . . Number of yards Larry McCoy needs to pass Pedro Bowman (3,830 from 1981-84) and move into second place on DU's all-time rushing list. McCoy enters the RMU game with 3,373 career rushing yards.

ON THE MOVE: Key position changes from last season: junior **Serge Kona**, a starter in all 11 games last season at outside linebacker, is at safety ... senior **Brian Layhue**, who started all 11 games at right tackle last season, moved to tight end in the spring ... Layhue played tight end in 2008 & 2009 ... redshirt freshman **Rich Piekarski**, who reshirted as a quarterback in 2010, has also moved to safety ... junior **Matthew Glose** moved from fullback to linebacker in week two.

A WELCOME ADDITION: Duquesne was informed roughly 30 hours before the season opener that receiver **Connor Dixon (South Park, Pa./South Park)** was granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA. The appeal request was based on an illness and injury Dixon suffered in 2006 and 2007 respectively at while Michigan State, which limited his participation during his first two college seasons. A second team All-NEC pick in 2010 who had not practiced with the team since last November, Dixon jumped in a car with his father and met the team in Williamsport, Pa. in time for dinner the night before the opener at Bucknell. The offensive coaches quizzed him on the playbook and Dixon, a former quarterback, passed with flying colors. He entered the game in the second quarter and caught a 14-yard touchdown pass on 3rd-and-goal on his first play to give DU a 13-3 lead. The 6-5 Dixon, who had 43 catches for 602 yards and five TDs last season, went on to add a second catch of seven yards in limited action. With a week of practice under his belt, Dixon added a 10 yard TD catch at Dayton. He posted his third TD (a 66 yard catch-and-run) against Valparaiso before exploding for four catches for 175 yards and two scores (87 & 40 yards) at Saint Francis. Dixon, who caught a 41 yard pass on the first play of the game, had three catches for 168 yards and the two scores in the first quarter alone. He was named NEC co-Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 26) for his effort. Dixon, who has caught a pass in 25 consecutive games since moving from quarterback to receiver, is averaging 19.3 yards per catch (35-675-13) this season. He is averaging a touchdown every 2.7 receptions since his return.

AND ANOTHER: A second former Big Ten player was added to the active roster when linebacker **Dorian Bell (Monroeville, Pa./Gateway)** made his Duquesne debut against Bryant on Oct. 1. Bell, a sophomore transfer from Ohio State, was suspended for the Dukes' first four games before having his eligibility reinstated by the NCAA on Sept. 27. Bell was ineligible for violation of an NCAA regulation that occurred while he was a student-athlete at Ohio State. Bell, rated as a five-star recruit by rivals.com as a senior at nearby Gateway High School, redshirted for OSU's 2009 Rose Bowl and Big Ten championship team. He had nine tackles in eight games as a back-up linebacker last season. Bell, who began practicing with the team in late August, entered the Bryant game in the first quarter. He finished with six stops including a tackle for loss and added a quarterback pressure in his first game action since Nov. 27, 2010 vs. Michigan. He had a season-high eight tackles including two TFLs and added three pass break-ups and a quarterback hurry in earning NEC Defensive Player of the Week following the Nov. 12 win at Sacred Heart. Bell is the highest profile player to transfer to DU since quarterback Tony Zimmerman came to the Bluff from the University of Pittsburgh in 1998. Zimmerman, who was rated as one of the top prep quarterbacks in the nation following his senior season at Penn-Trafford High School, went on to throw for 7,313 yards and 73 touchdowns while breaking 14 school records in three seasons as a starter for the Dukes from 1998-01.

PAT ON THE BACK: Junior **Sean Patterson (Toledo, Ohio/St. John's Jesuit)**, who threw for 2,050 yards and 20 TDs in his first season as a starter, is back under center for the Dukes. The 6-2, 210-pounder, who became the fifth player in school history to throw for over 2,000 yards in a season last year, has thrown for 1,771 yards and 19 scores in 2011. Patterson, who earned NEC Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 12 after amassing 310 yards of total offense in the win at Dayton, added 365 yards of total offense (290 yards passing and a career-best 75 rushing) to go along with four first-half TD passes in DU's 41-14 win at Saint Francis. Patterson, a dual threat, has 429 yards rushing with 4 TDs.

A LITTLE EXPERIENCE: For the first time in recent memory, the Dukes entered a season with an upperclass-laden roster. Of the 88 players on the roster (as of Sept. 3) the class breakdown is as follows: seniors (19) (*including grad students*), juniors (16), sophomores (13) and freshmen (40) (*freshman numbers are skewed due to the inclusion of redshirts*). Of the 2011 returnees, 31 started at least once last season. Of the 45 position players listed on the opening-day 2-deep, 16 were seniors and 13 were juniors. Three true freshmen have seen action so far: back-up cornerback **Devin Williams (Concord, Calif./De La Salle)**, kick returner **David Thomas (Ocala, Fla./Trinity Catholic)** and long snapper **Brent Calvin (Gibsonia, Pa./Pine-Richland)**. Thomas was lost for the season with a broken foot suffered in week three vs. Valparaiso.

IN THE TRENCHES: DU's experience is best reflected in the offensive line, where four starters are back from last season (the fifth starter, Brian Layhue, moved from offensive tackle to tight end). The o-line started intact for all 11 games last season and the first nine of this year. Here are the returning starters with number of consecutive starts in parentheses: 6-5, 305, LT Ron Dunn (41), 6-3, 274 LG Eric Warning (21), 6-2, 307 C Cameron Downey (32) and 6-2, 268 LG Jamaal Thomas (40). The experience has posted dividends as RB Larry McCoy has a school single-season record eight 100-yard games and the Dukes are averaging 388.1 yards of total offense per game, including 208.8 ypg. on the ground.

THE REAL McCOY: Junior **Larry McCoy (Wytheville, Va./George Wythe)**, the nation's 11th-leading rusher last season (117.4 ypg.), posted all six of his 100-yard games in DU's final eight outings of 2010. The 5-10, 220-pound Virginia native has been a model of consistency over the past two seasons with between 74 and 246 yards on no fewer than 18 carries in any game. McCoy was the top returning junior career rusher (95.4 ypg. entering the season) in the FCS. He picked up where he left off with 112 yards on 30 carries in the season-opening loss at Bucknell. He added 113 yards in the win at Dayton and 164 on 21 totes vs. Valpo. McCoy made it four-straight 100-yard games with 23-153-1 at Saint Francis. He added 153 more yards on a career high-tying 34 totes vs. Bryant. McCoy, who only played three quarters vs. both Valpo and SFU ranks eighth nationally - and second in the NEC - with a 127.5 yards per game average.

POWER SERGE: Junior **Serge Kona (Gaithersburg, Md./Gaithersburg)**, the Dukes' leading returning tackler (64 stops, 36 solo) made the move from linebacker to safety in the spring. The 5-10, 215-pounder - who has established himself as one of the NEC's hardest hitters, has shown a nose for the football in his first two seasons on the Bluff. In his first two seasons, the Maryland native amassed 17 tackles for loss, broke up four passes, forced three fumbles and recovered two. Kona, who is also returning kickoffs and punts in 2011, was named to the preseason All-NEC team. With Kona at safety, DU enters the Robert Morris game ranked first nationally in pass defense (138.9 ypg.) and 8th in pass efficiency defense. Kona notched his first double-digit tackle game this season with 10 stops, including two TFL, vs. CCSU and earned NEC Defensive Player of the Week after forcing three fumbles - two of which led to scores - in the Dukes' 16-0 win at Monmouth. The DU secondary has as many interceptions as touchdowns passes surrendered (nine).

MR. CONSISTENT: Senior linebacker **Chris Oliver (Washington, D.C./Calvin Coolidge)**, who entered the season with 34 career tackles, has amassed a team-high 82 stops in 2011 (24 more than any other Duke). Oliver who did not post a tackle for loss in his first three seasons on the Bluff, leads the team with 7.5 (for -22 yards) this season. Oliver, who has totaled eight or more stops in seven games, has led the team in tackles five times.

HOME SWEET HOME

Duquesne is 75-22-0 all time at Rooney Field including winning streaks of 16, 14 and 10 games. Duquesne owns non-conference home wins over Bucknell (three times), Lafayette (twice), Dayton (twice), VMI, Butler, Morehead State and Fordham among others over the past 14 seasons. DU is 29-11 in non-conference home games (11-2 under Jerry Schmitt) on Rooney Field.

SOMETHING TO SPRAGG ABOUT: Senior receiver **Isaac Spragg (Westfield, Va./Valley Forge Military Academy)**, who entered the season with eight catches for 67 yards in 22 career games, exploded for nine catches for 100 yards and a TD (22 yds.) in the season opener at Bucknell. The catches, yards, touchdowns and long catch (the 22-yard TD) were all career bests. He added six receptions for 93 yards at Dayton (including a new career-long 42-yarder) and matched his career-best with nine catches for 95 yards vs. Wagner. Spragg leads the team with 52 catches for 565 yards and four scores. He has caught at least three balls in every game this season.

NO HO: Duquesne suffered a serious loss when sophomore **Ryan Ho (Pearl City, Hawaii/Kamehameha Schools)** suffered a dislocated ankle on a kickoff return with 1:43 left in the first half of the season opener at Bucknell. Ho, who entered the year as the backup to Larry McCoy at running back, ranked fourth nationally - and led the NEC - with a 29.4 yard kickoff return average as a true freshman in 2010. The Dukes lost a second talented return man when true freshman **David Thomas (Ocala, Fla./Trinity Catholic)** was lost for the season with a broken foot suffered in the win over Valparaiso.

NO MOORE: The Dukes also lost one of their top returning receivers when junior **Akeem Moore (Pittsburgh, Pa./Brentwood)** tore an ACL in practice on Sept. 21. Moore, who caught 22 passes for 322 yards and two TDs last season, had three catches for 21 yards through three games prior to the injury. It is the second season-ending injury in three years for Moore who missed the final nine games of 2009 after suffering internal injuries following a catch in game two at Nicholls State.

CAPTAINS: The team named four permanent captains prior to the 2011 season in senior receiver **Joe Cangilla (Allison Park, Pa./Hampton)**, senior defensive back **Khiry Carter (Philadelphia, Pa./West Philadelphia Catholic)**, senior offensive lineman **Ron Dunn (Abington, Mass./Milford (N.Y.) Academy)** and junior linebacker/special teams captain **Zach Richert (Gibsonia, Pa./Pine-Richland)**. **Connor Dixon (South Park, Pa./South Park)** was added as a fifth captain after gaining his sixth year eligibility the day before the season opener at Bucknell.

IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY: Duquesne is 17-14 in non-conference games under seventh-year head coach Jerry Schmitt with wins over Robert Morris (three times prior to joining the NEC), Dayton (three times), Bucknell (twice) and Fordham (twice). At home, the Dukes are 11-2 in non-league play, while on the road Schmitt's Dukes have fashioned a 6-12 mark. DU snapped a seven-game skid in non-conference road games with a 22-13 win at Dayton on Sept. 3, 2011. The win snapped Dayton's FCS-best win streak at 10. DU is opened with back-to-back road games for the first time since 2006 (at Bucknell and at Robert Morris). The last time the Dukes opened with two games outside of the greater Pittsburgh area was in 2000 (at VMI and at La Salle).

DEEP WESTERN PA. ROOTS: Every coach on the Duquesne staff either played high school football in the Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic League (WPIAL) or at Duquesne University. The two coaches on the current staff who did not play high school ball in Western Pa., played collegiately at Duquesne (defensive backs coach Jeremy McCullough and running game coordinator/running backs coach Matt Stansfield). A NEW LOOK FOR THE OFFENSE: **Gary Dunn**, who served as offensive coordinator for 11 of his final 14 seasons at Morehead State, took over as DU's offensive coordinator in February. Dunn, who also worked with the offensive line at MSU, coached three All-Americans and 21 first team All-Pioneer Football League players, in guiding an Eagles offense that regularly ranked among the nation's Football Championship Subdivision leaders in numerous NCAA statistical categories. In 2000, MSU led the nation in both scoring and total offense. The 2005, Eagles ranked 12th in total offense (433 ypg.) and 18th in scoring offense (33.9) and last season Morehead finished 10th nationally in passing offense at 270 yards per game. Dunn, a Pittsburgh native, replaces Niel Loebig who was on the DU staff for five seasons - including the 2010 campaign as offensive coordinator. Dunn's recruiting area while at Morehead State included southwest Pennsylvania, southwest Ohio and central Kentucky. Among the three All-Americans he coached was Pittsburgh Schenley High School product David Dinkins who set or tied 19 school records at MSU from 1998-00.

MORE ON THE DUKES: This is Duquesne's fourth season as a scholarship-granting football program and fourth season as an associate member of the Northeast Conference. With the move to the NEC, Duquesne offered 18 scholarships in February of 2008. That number has increased to 28 this season. Duquesne granted only need-based financial aid for football playing student-athletes as a member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League from 1994 through 2007. The NEC competed as a non-scholarship member of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision until 2006 when the conference adopted an athletics-based aid model. This is the second season the NEC regular season champion will be an automatic qualifier for the Division I Football Championship.

Myles Russ ran for 154 yards and a pair of touchdowns and Jeff Sinclair threw for a score and ran for two more as Robert Morris stayed perfect in Northeast Conference play with a 34-11 win over Duquesne at Joe Walton Stadium.

The Colonials outgained the Dukes 355-191 in upping their record to 7-1 overall and 6-0 in the NEC. DU dropped to 5-4 over and 3-3 in conference play.

Larry McCoy ran for 81 yards for the Duquesne.

The Dukes got on the board first when Eric Duale drilled a 34-yard field goal into a headwind with 3:57 left in the first quarter. The Dukes gained possession when Serge Kona stripped Russ of the ball and Horvin Latimer recovered at the DU 47.

RMU took advantage of a 19-yard Duquesne punt to take a 7-3 lead on a nine-yard run by Sinclair.

DU drove to the Robert Morris 27, but a 45-yard field goal attempt by Duale sailed wide right.

The Colonials broke the game open with pair of touchdowns in the final 2:28 of the first half. Sinclair scrambled for a five-yard score to cap a 10 play, 73 yard drive. RMU then forced a DU punt and two plays later Sinclair found Shadrae King with a 32-yard touchdown pass to make it 21-3 with 21 seconds left in the half.

RMU outgained the Dukes 156 to 23 in the second quarter.

Duquesne forced punts on RMU's first two possessions of the second half but did not come away with any points as a 29 yard Duale field goal attempt was again wide right.

Russ made it four consecutive touchdowns for RMU when he punched it in from six yards out to make it 27-6 with 13:31 to go. Russ became RMU's all-time leading rusher on the play.

The Dukes scored their lone touchdown when Sean Bunevich made a one-handed, four-yard catch of a Patterson pass on 4th-and-2 with just under 10 minutes left. Dave Williams caught a two-point conversion pass to make it 27-11.

Russ closed out the scoring with a 6-yard run with 3:21 left to cap six-plus minute drive.

Nathan Totino led the Dukes with 11 tackles. Alex DiMichele led RMU with a game-high 13 stops.

Duquesne saw a 27-0 third quarter lead cut to seven, but held on to defeat fast-closing Robert Morris 34-20 at Rooney Field.

Connor Dixon completed 19-of-31 passes for 201 yards and two touchdowns for the Dukes who outgained the Colonials 408-312. Jeff Sinclair threw for 219 yards and two scores for RMU.

Larry McCoy posted his second consecutive 100-yard game with 107 yards and two touchdowns for the Dukes.

DU took the opening kickoff 87 yards as Dixon completed six of nine passes, the last of which was a seven-yard TD toss to Dave Williams.

Rolf Bathold gave Robert Morris excellent field position when he picked off a Dixon pass and returned it 49 yards to the Duquesne 17. Duquesne's defense held, as RMU's Garrett Clawson, kicking into a crosswind gusting 20 to miles per hour, missed wide left on a field goal attempt from 35 yards out.

The Colonials stopped another Dukes drive early in the second quarter when Robert Williams forced a Cleo Williams fumble that was recovered by RMU's Gavin Marshall at the DU 23.

Duquesne's Willie Milhouse returned an interception 22 yards to the RMU 37 and redshirt freshman Sean Patterson, making his first career appearance, drove the Dukes to the one before Marek Lapinski put the Dukes up 14-0 on a one-yard plunge. Patterson completed an 11-yard pass and rushed twice for 23 yards on the drive.

The Dukes upped the lead to 20-0 when McCoy scored on an 11-yard run with under a minute left in the half. Joe Cangilla keyed the 77-yard drive with two catches for 43 yards.

Duquesne added another score when Dixon hit Jay Spinks with a 12-yard touchdown pass on DU's first possession of the second half. Dixon converted a 3rd-and-19 with a 24-yard run to keep the drive alive.

Robert Morris got on the board when Sinclair hit Shadrae King with a 19-yard touchdown pass to make it 27-7 with 7:09 left in the third quarter.

Sinclair added a nine-yard touchdown run after a Duquesne muffed punt gave the Colonials the ball on the Duquesne 15.

The Colonials added a third consecutive score when Sinclair found Sherrod Evers with a 53-yard bomb to make it 27-20 with 10:05 left. The score was preceded by a Duquesne personal foul that gave RMU a first down.

Duquesne answered with a 57-yard drive capped by a 13-yard McCoy run for the game's final points. Cangilla's 25-yard catch on 3rd-and-19 was the drive's big play.

Brandon Wesley scored on a quarterback keeper with 57 seconds left and Alex Eckard added the extra point to give Bucknell a 27-26 win over Duquesne at Lewisburg, Pa.

Wesley's run came on a fourth down play which capped an 82 yard drive.

The win ended a two-game Duquesne series win streak and left the Dukes winless in seven tries at Bucknell.

Larry McCoy gained 112 yards on 30 carries and Sean Patterson added a pair of touchdown passes for Duquesne.

Jeremiah Young ran for 105 yards and Wesley, who completed 11-of-21 passes for 173 yards, added a touchdown pass to lead the Bison.

A 20-yard punt return by true freshman David Thomas set up a 22-yard Patterson to Isaac Spragg touchdown pass the put the Dukes up 6-0 nine minutes into the game.

Bucknell answered with a 21-yard Alex Eckard field goal to make it 6-3 after one quarter.

On the first play of the second quarter, Patterson scrambled 31 yards to the Bucknell nine before hitting Connor Dixon with a 14-yard TD pass on third-and-goal to make it 13-3. It was the first play of the game for Dixon, who was granted a sixth year of eligibility the afternoon before the game. It was also the first play since November of last season for Dixon who did not practice with the team while awaiting a decision on his status.

The Dukes made it three scores in three possessions when Charlie Leventry connected on a 27-yard field goal to make it 16-3.

Duquesne looked to be in control when a Patterson pass intended for tight end Brian Layhue was tipped and returned for a 24 yard touchdown by Bucknell linebacker Tim Bolte to make it 16-10 with 1:52 left in the half.

The Bison held and drove 59 yards in 49 seconds to take a 17-16 halftime lead when Wesley hit Gabe Skwara with an 11-yard touchdown pass.

DU took the second half kickoff and drove 60 yards in eight plays to take a 23-17 lead on a four-yard McCoy run.

Bucknell took 6:52 off the clock in driving to the Duquesne two yard line before settling for a 19-yard Eckard field goal to pull within three with just over five minutes left in the third quarter.

Richie Piekarski covered a fumbled punt at the Bucknell 23 that resulted in a 34-yard Leventry field goal that made it 26-20 entering the fourth quarter.

Neither teamed managed a drive of significance until Wesley completed passes of 27 and 19 yards and Young added a 19-yard run to move the Bison into DU territory. Bucknell faced a third-and-15 from the DU 22 when Duquesne was flagged for pass interference giving BU first-and-goal on the Dukes 10. DU held until Wesley's fourth down run.

Senior Isaac Spragg, who had eight catches in 22 career games entering the game, finished with nine catches for 100 yards. Patterson was 19-of-35 for 188 yards.

Derrick Lakins, Chidozie Oparanozie and Khiry Carter led DU with eight tackles each. Zach Richert added a pair of sacks.

DU outgained Bucknell 342-308 and had a 20-13 advantage in first downs.

Jared Williams blocked Nate Miller's 50 yard field goal attempt with two seconds left and returned it 48 yards for a score as Duquesne scored nine points in the final 30 seconds to end Dayton's FCS-best 10-game win streak with a 22-13 victory over the Flyers at Welcome Stadium.

Duquesne took a 16-13 lead on a 24 yard Charlie Leventry field goal with 30 seconds left. Leventry's field goal, his third of the game, capped a 52-yard drive that started with 3:37 on the clock.

Sean Patterson, who finished 19-of-34 for 254 yards, opened the drive by hitting Isaac Spragg on passes of 13 and nine yards before carrying 13 yards to the UD 24. Larry McCoy, who topped the 100-yard mark for the eighth time in 10 games - and second time in as many games in 2011 - took it to the eight on a 16 yard run to set up Leventry's kick.

Dayton quarterback Will Bardo drove the Flyers 21 yards to the 33 to set up Miller's final attempt.

McCoy led all rushers with 113 yards on 26 carries. Brooks Roorback had a career-high seven catches for 48 yards and Spragg finished with 93 yards on six receptions for the Dukes.

Taylor Harris led Dayton with 110 yards on seven carries. Bardo finished 13-of-31 for 124 yards.

Duquesne was the last team to defeat the Flyers, nearly one year ago to the day on Sept. 11 of the 2010 season, 35-31 at Rooney Field.

Dayton got on the board first when Harris bounced outside and raced 83 yards for a score with 5:26 left in the first quarter.

Both teams missed scoring opportunities in the opening 30 minutes as Leventry was wide left on a 25 yard attempt on DU's first possession and Miller missed a 40 yard attempt following a Steve Wirkus interception early in the second quarter.

Patterson made it two consecutive turnovers when he coughed up the ball while being sacked at the DU 47. The Flyers looked poised to add to their lead when Tyler Zimmer broke through to block a 33 yard Miller field goal attempt.

DU then drove 81 yards to tie it when Patterson hit Connor Dixon with a 10 yard touchdown pass on third-and-goal with 47 seconds left in the half.

The Dukes outgained the Flyers 276-175 and enjoyed an over seven minute advantage in time of possession in the first half that saw two drives stopped by turnovers.

Miller broke the tie with a 42 yard field goal on Dayton's first possession of the second half.

The lead was short-lived as Jared Williams picked off back-up quarterback Zachary Splain and returned it to the Dayton 26 setting up a career-long 40 yard field goal by Leventry.

Duquesne got out of the blocks quickly, scoring on its first four possessions in posting a 49-14 home opening win over Valparaiso at Rooney Field.

The Dukes (2-1) outgained the Crusaders (0-3) 628 to 188 in extending Valpo's FCS-long losing streak to 23 games. The total yards were the most by a DU team since 647 in a 36-14 win over Siena in 2003.

Larry McCoy led DU with 164 yards rushing on 21 attempts as the Dukes ran for 425 yards. Bill Bair came off the bench to add a career-high 154 yards as DU had two 100-yard rushers in the same game for the first time since a 46-0 win at La Salle in 2002.

It was the first time Duquesne had two 150 yard rushers in the same game since 2001 when Donte Small ran for 186 and Josh Rue 158 in a 55-0 win over Siena.

Sean Patterson completed 12-of-18 passes for 181 yards and three touchdowns and ran for another in just over two quarters of action for the Dukes.

Duquesne punted twice in scoring touchdowns on seven of 10 possessions.

Patterson capped a 15 play game-opening drive with a three yard run then found Connor Dixon with a 66 yard touchdown pass as the Dukes outgained the Crusaders 178-31 in the opening 15 minutes.

McCoy added a one-yard scoring run early in the second quarter to make it 21-0. Patterson then capped a 13 play, 86 yard drive with a four yard touchdown pass to Ethan Dorsey to make it 28-0 at the half. McCoy went over the 100-yard mark on his 15th carry with just under six minutes left during the 86 yard drive.

Bair scored on a 19 yard run and Patterson hit Isaac Spragg with a six yard touchdown pass with 8:25 left in the third quarter before giving way to back-up Marty Mitchell.

Valpo broke up the shutout on a 10 yard pass from Nick Malantis to Kelvin Smarwt late in the third quarter.

In a matchup of the NEC's top two running backs, it was Duquesne quarterback Sean Patterson who stole the spotlight with four first-half touchdown passes as Duquesne opened Northeast Conference play with a 41-14 win at Saint Francis, Pa.

Patterson, who finished with a season-high 290 yards, threw touchdowns of 87, 40, 17 and 50 yards in the first half as the Dukes (3-1, 1-0) scored on six of seven possessions in posting 553 yards of total offense.

Saint Francis dropped to 1-3 overall and 0-2 in the NEC.

Duquesne's defense was outstanding in holding the Red Flash to 182 yards, including just 45 through the air. SFU had 99 yards before the Dukes went to their second team defense after three quarters.

Patterson hit Connor Dixon with a 41 yard pass on the game's first play to set up a 40 yard Charlie Leventry field goal that gave Duquesne a 3-0 lead less than two minutes in.

DU made it scores on consecutive possessions when Leventry added a 33 yard field goal at the 7:53 mark.

Saint Francis, which went three-and-out on its first two possessions, caught the first break of the game when Serge Kona fumbled a punt on the Duquesne 14 yard line.

Five plays later, quarterback John Kelly punched it in from one yard out to give the Red Flash a 7-6 lead.

The lead was short-lived as Patterson found Dixon for an 87 yard touchdown on the next play to put the Dukes up 13-7 with 3:09 to go in the first quarter.

Jared Williams intercepted a Saint Francis flea flicker attempt to set up Patterson-to-Dixon again, this time for a 40 yard score.

Dixon, who had three catches for 168 in the opening quarter, finished with 175 yards on four receptions.

Khiry Carter picked off back-up quarterback Corey Nielsen on the first play of the second quarter leading to a 17 yard Patterson to Brian Layhue touchdown that made it 27-7.

DU added another long-distance score when Isaac Spragg took a swing pass 50 yards for a score to make it 34-7 at the half.

The Dukes outgained the Red Flash 442-79 in the opening 30 minutes.

McCoy capped a nearly seven minute drive with a two yard plunge to make it 41-7 with just under six minutes left in the third quarter.

McCoy went over 100 yards on a 29 yard touchdown run with 6:39 to go in the third quarter.

Wagner ended the run of 31 consecutive Duquesne points in a one-yard Doscher run with just over three minutes left in the third quarter.

McCoy followed a Seahawks fumble with his third touchdown of the half - another 1 yarder - to make it 37-14 early in the fourth quarter.

Doscher hit Wandy Saintilan with a 62 yard touchdown with just under seven minutes to go to close out the scoring.

Chris Oliver led the Dukes' defense with nine tackles. Seven players combined for six tackles for loss led by Mike Passodelis with 1.5 as DU held Wagner to 107 yards on the ground.

Wagner's Williams, who entered the game ranked ninth nationally with a 111.8 yards per game average, was held to 81 yards on 20 carries.

Quarterback Sean Patterson ran for a touchdown and threw for another as Duquesne battled heavy rain, snow flurries and driving winds to post a 16-0 win at Monmouth.

With the victory, the Dukes moved to 7-2 overall and 5-1 in the Northeast Conference. Monmouth, which was shut out for the first time since 2004, fell to 4-4 overall and 3-2 in the NEC.

Larry McCoy rushed for 110 yards on a career high 35 carries for the Dukes, who outgained Monmouth 227-175. Patterson attempted just 15 passes as the weather challenged both offenses. He completed six for 68 yards and added 35 more yards on the ground. Isaac Spragg was the game's top receiver with three catches for 42 yards.

Duquesne scored on its second possession when Patterson capped a 72 yard drive with a 19 yard scamper. Charlie Leventry's PAT attempt was blocked as the 6-0 lead held entering the second quarter. McCoy keyed the scoring drive with six carries for 30 yards.

Safety Serge Kona, who forced three of Monmouth's five fumbles, set up DU's next score when he jarred the ball loose at the MU 37. Patterson led the Dukes 21 yards on eight plays to set up a 33-yard Leventry field goal to make it 9-0 with 2:04 left in the half.

Kona forced another fumble - this one on the Monmouth 13 - on the Hawks' next possession. Two plays later, Patterson found Spragg for an 18-yard touchdown strike to end the day's scoring.

The Duquesne defense, which held Monmouth zero yards on eight plays in the third quarter, limited the Hawks to just 51 passing yards. It also forced four of Monmouth's five fumbles, three of which the Dukes recovered. Jared Williams picked off a pass at the MU one with a minute left to seal the shutout. Khiry Carter had nine tackles (seven solo) as did Horvin Latimer (three solo). Kona added six stops including a team-high 1.5 tackles for loss.

DUQUESNE 29, SACRED HEART 15

Duquesne jumped out to a 21-6 halftime lead and relied on a standout defensive effort the rest of the way to defeat Sacred Heart 29-15 at Fairfield, Conn.

The win enabled the Dukes (8-2, 6-1) to keep pace with Albany (7-3, 6-1) at the top of the Northeast Conference standings. Duquesne will enter the final week of the regular season needing a win over Robert Morris combined with an Albany loss to Sacred Heart to earn the NEC's automatic bid to the FCS Championship playoffs.

Albany controls its fate by virtue of its 38-10 win over DU on October 8.

Larry McCoy ran for 149 yards and a pair of touchdowns in posting his school-record eighth 100 yard game of the season and Connor Dixon caught touchdown passes of 33 and 35 yards as the Dukes posted back-to-back road wins for the first time in NEC play.

Sean Patterson completed 13-of-30 passes for 150 yards, including the two TD passes to Dixon, for DU.

The Duquesne defense, which was coming of a 16-0 shutout of Monmouth two week's ago, allowed just one short-yardage touchdown drive in holding a Sacred Heart offense that was averaging 346 yards to just 229.

Duquesne scored first when McCoy capped a 71 yard drive with a 3 yard run mid-way through the first quarter. Sacred Heart cut it to one when Michael Zambarano sacked Patterson, forcing a fumble that was recovered by Justin Emblar in the end zone. SHU missed the extra point making it 7-6 after one quarter.

The second quarter was all Duquesne as Patterson found Dixon for touchdown passes of 33 and 35 yards. The 33 yard pass culminated a nearly eight-minute, 95 yard drive set up by a Jared Williams interception and the second score - which came with 56 seconds left - covered 75 yards and gave the Dukes a 21-6 lead at the half.

Sacred Heart got back in the game when Niko Sierra picked off a Patterson pass and returned it for an apparent touchdown on the second play of the third quarter. The score was taken away by a personal foul, but SHU still managed to capitalize when Chris Rogers ran it in from 13 yards out four plays later to make it 21-13.

SHU blocked a Charlie Leventry punt out of the end zone for a safety to cut the margin to six with 2:21 left, before Alex Inda broke through to sack Tim Little on 4th-and-10 setting up a game-clinching six yard McCoy run and two point conversion to make it 29-15 with 1:47 left.

Inda led the defense with nine tackles while Dorian Bell and Chidozie Oparanozie added eight stops each.
