### DUKES AND BLUE DEVILS:

Duquesne (7-3, 4-1) enters Saturday's game with a chance to tie for NEC regular season title with Saint Francis U (7-3, 5-0) ... the Dukes would need a win combined with a Red Flash loss at Wagner ... SFU has already clinched the NEC automatic qualifier to the NCAA Playoff by virtue of its 14-10 win over the Dukes on Oct. 21 ... this is the 10th meeting in the series with CCSU that dates back to 1993 ... the Blue Devils lead 5-4, however DU has won four of the past five, including the last three in a row ... in games at New Britain, CCSU leads 4-1 ... Duquesne quarterback Dillon Buechel enters Saturday's game needing 239 yards to become DU's all-time passing yardage leader ... Buechel (10,016) trails only Neil Loebig (10,254 from 2001-04) ... senior linebacker Christian Kuntz (29.5 career) needs a .5 sacks to become the NEC's all-time leader ... his 10.5 sacks this season are

two shy of tying the school single-season record held by Ryan Tolan (12.5 in 2004) ... last year, Duquesne gained 524 yards, including 215 on the ground, in posting a 27-10 win over CCSU in the NEC opener on Rooney Field ... Buechel completed 23-of-38 passes for 323 yards to lead the passing game ... the Dukes held the Blue Devils scoreless in the second half in turning a 14-10 lead into a 27-10 win ... DU head coach Jerry Schmitt is 4-4 vs. CCSU.

**A CLOSER LOOK:** Duquesne is 2-2 on the road with wins at Jacksonville and Wagner ... CCSU is 2-2 at home with wins over Bowie State and Sacred Heart ... both the Dukes and Blue Devils have scored an NEC-best three defensive touchdowns ... CCSU has turned it over 23 times (14 fumbles lost and nine interceptions) ... DU has turned it over 19 times ... the Blue Devils are allowing an NEC-high 245.8 yards passing per game ... the Dukes lead the NEC in pass defense at 180.5 ypg. ... Duquesne ranks second to CCSU in passing offense (264.8 ypg for CCSU to 256.1 ypg. for DU) ... CCSU's Jacob Dolegala and DU's Dillon Buechel rank one-two in the NEC in passing yards per game (264.3 to 256.1) and total offense (263.9 to 245.0) ... Dolegala is averaging 23.8 completions per game.

## 2016 DUKES TO WATCH

### QB • DILLON BUECHEL, Sr. (6-4, 200)

Three-year starting QB entered his senior campaign second all-time at Duquesne in career completions, completion percentage and passing yards and fourth in career touchdown passes ... set single-season highs for completions (228), yards (2,871) and touchdowns (24) in 2015 ... registered his first career 400-yard game and tied the school record for touchdown passes in a game with six in the FCS playoff game at William & Mary ... had two additional 300-yard games as a junior ... put together the top freshman season by a Duquesne quarterback in 2013, setting school records for passes completed (217) and attempted (373) in throwing for the sixth-highest yardage total in school history (2,569) ... completed 58.2 percent of his passes for 14 TDs ... was named second team All-NEC in 2014 ... was one of 20 players named to the initial Jerry Rice Award Watch List ... earned NEC Rookie of the Week three times ... ranked 23rd nationally - and second among freshmen - in passing yards per game (233.5).

### WR • WAYNE CAPERS, Sr. (6-1, 211)

Top returning receiver for the Dukes in 2016 after leading the team with nine receiving touchdowns in 2015 ... was second on the receiving corps with 51 receptions and 804 yards last year ... led DU with 15.8 yards per catch ... played in all 12 games, making 11 starts ... had seven catches for 81 yards and three TDs in DU's FCS Playoff game at William & Mary ... the seven catches tied his career high and the three scores were a career-best (both surpassed this season) ... was a multi-dimensional player for the Dukes in 2014 after transferring in from Arizona, switching from defensive back to wide receiver ... his father, Wayne Capers, was the second round pick of the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 1983 NFL draft ... Wayne, Sr., an All-Big 8 receiver at Kansas, had a four year NFL career (two with Pittsburgh and two with Indianapolis).

### LB • CHRISTIAN KUNTZ, Sr. (6-2, 228)

Earned All-American honors last season in leading the FCS in tackles for loss (26 for -114) ... entered the 2016 season fifth all-time at Duquesne in career sacks ... led the nation in tackles for loss (1.8/g.) in 2013 in becoming just the fifth Duquesne player to be named Sports Network All-American (Third Team) ... was the first sophomore in school history to earn All-American honors from any affiliate and was the only Duke named First Team All-NEC in 2013 ... tied for the team lead with 74 tackles (32 solo) and led the Dukes in tackles for loss (19.5) and sacks (9.0) as a sophomore ... suffered an off-the-field knee injury in the spring of 2014 and missed the season.

### LB • NATHAN STONE, Jr. (6-0, 254)

Two-time all-conference linebacker moved from OLB to ILB in 2016 ... has started every game of his collegiate career ... entered the season with 10.0 career sacks ... averaging just under seven tackles per game for his career ... in 2015 was fourth on the team with 59 tackles ... in 2014 led the Dukes and was third in the NEC in tackles with 100 (53 solo) in being named to the ECAC FCS All-Star Team, NEC First Team All-Conference and NEC Defensive Rookie of the Year ... was also a Jerry Rice Award Watch List finalist

## QUICK HITS

• Duquesne, which is coming off an 8-4 (5-1/1st in NEC) season, was the unanimous choice to repeat as Northeast Conference Champion in a vote of league coaches. The Dukes (7-3, 4-1) enter Saturday's game one game behind league-leading Saint Francis U (7-3, 5-0).

• The Dukes are in their 12th season under head coach Jerry Schmitt. Schmitt, who has led DU to six conference titles in 11 years, received a five-year contract extension on August 31, securing him on the Bluff through the 2020-21 school year. The Pittsburgh native led the Dukes to three Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League titles before the program moved to the NEC and began granting scholarships in 2008. The two-time MAAC Coach of the Year has led DU to three NEC titles in the past five seasons, including the school's first outright championship and NCAA appearance last year.

• DU is 30-17 in NEC play over the past six-plus seasons. The Dukes went 4-11 in their first two years in the conference while making the transition to a scholarship model.

• Six Dukes were named 2016 Preseason All-NEC: senior QB Dillon Buechel, senior WR Wayne Capers and junior OL Ben Huss were all named on offense and senior LB Christian Kuntz, senior DL Jake Radziukinas and junior LB Nathan Stone were tabbed on defense. DU's six selections were the most of any NEC team (Saint Francis U and Sacred Heart had four each on the 27-man team).

• A.J. Hines' 189 yards rushing vs. Dayton on Sept. 17 was the second-highest total by a DU running back since the program moved to the FCS level in 1993. The freshman record of 195 yards was set by all-time leading rusher Larry McCoy at Nicholls on Sept. 12, 2009. Hines, whose 118.1 yards/g rank sixth nationally, has topped the 100-yard mark six times on the way to earning NEC Rookie of the Week honors a conference record nine times.

• Senior consensus All-America linebacker Christian Kuntz enters Saturday's game with 29.5 career sacks. The sack total, which ranks first on DU's all-time list, also ranks fifth among all active FCS players. Kuntz, who has led the nation in tackles for loss twice (2013 & 2015), had six TFLs, including three sacks, in the Sept. 17 win over Dayton. He was named NEC Defensive Player of the Week for his effort. He won the award again this past weekend after posting two sacks, including one on which he forced a fumble and recovered it in the end zone.

• Senior quarterback Dillon Buechel is also climbing in the Duquesne record book. Buechel holds the school record for attempts and completions and currently ranks second in passing yards (10,016), completion percentage (.578) and third in TD passes (72). With his 394 yards at Jacksonville, Buechel passed his offensive coordinator - Anthony Doria - and Sacred Heart's Dale Fink (8,803 yards from 2007-10) to become the NEC's all-time passing yardage leader. Doria threw for 8,544 yards at Saint Francis U from 2003-06.

• Senior Austin Crimmins is putting together the top kicking career in Duquesne FCS annals. The Ebsenburg, Pa. native already has 17 more field goals (56) than any player in school history. In addition, his 38.5 career punting average is on pace to break the current mark of 37.6 set by Orlando Bellisario from 1997-99. Crimmins' 295 points are the most by a DU kicker.

• Senior right tackle Larson Graham leads the Dukes with 45 consecutive starts. No other player on the offensive side of the football has started more than 22 in a row). Defensively, inside linebacker Nate Stone has the most consecutive starts at 34.

## SOMEBODY'S WATCHING

A pair of Dukes are on STATS national Watch Lists. Freshman RB **A.J. Hines** was named to the STATS **Jerry Rice Award** Watch List (top FCS Rookie) on October 25, while senior quarterback **Dillon Buechel**, who was also on the Rice Award list as a freshman, was named to the **Walter Payton Award** Watch List this week. The Payton Award is presented annually to the FCS offensive player of the year.

## TRENDING

• Freshman **A.J. Hines** has been named NEC Rookie of the Week a conference record nine-times. Hines, who is ranks sixth nationally with a 118.1 ypg. average, enters the CCSU game with 1,181 yards. He is the first DU freshman to rush for 1,000 yards in a season at the FCS level (since 1993).

• All-American **LB Christian Kuntz** DU's all-time sacks leader (29.5), needs 0.5 sacks to claim the NEC all-time sacks mark.

• **QB Dillon Buechel** (10,016) needs 239 yards to break the DU record for career passing yardage set by Neil Loebig (10,254 from 2001-04). He is two TD passes shy of passing Tony Zimmerman (73 from 1998-00) to move into second place on DU's career list (Buechel has 72/school record is 103 by Niel Loebig).

• Leading tackler **Carter Henderson** (79/7.9) has scored via interception return (23 yds vs. Dayton) and fumble return (16 yds vs. Kennesaw State) this season.

• **Austin Crimmins'** 56 career field goals currently rank tied for most in both NEC history and among active FCS kickers.

• Two DU receivers - **Wayne Capers** (9-235-4 at Jacksonville) and **Blair Roberts** (8-153-4 vs. Bryant) have tied the school record for TD receptions in a game this season.

• Duquesne head coach **Jerry Schmitt** notched his 100th career win vs. Robert Morris on Oct. 15. Schmitt is in his 17th season as a head coach and 12th at DU.

• **Duquesne** leads the NEC in fewest penalty yards per game (50.1). DU has led the conference in fewest penalty yards/g. four times (and been second twice) in its first eight years as an NEC member.

**LAST GAME:** Duquesne held Sacred Heart to season lows in total offense (225 yards) and points (10) in a 31-10 win ... SHU's previous lows were 278 yards vs. Saint Francis and 16 points in a 16-10 win over Robert Morris ... Duquesne had a 35:35 to 24:25 advantage in time of possession ... with his nine yard completion to Wayne Capers in the fourth quarter, Dillon Buechel became the second player in school history to surpass 10,000 yards passing ... Buechel, who went 21-of-37 for 238 yards and 1 TD, now has 10,016 passing yards ... the only DU player with more is four-time first team All-MAAC QB Neil Loebig, who threw for 10,254 yards from 2001-04 ... Buechel (72) pulled within one of Tony Zimmerman (73 TDs from 1998-00) for second place on DU's all-time career list ... Christian Kuntz became Duquesne's all-time sack leader when he took down R.J. Noel for a 16-yard loss with 2:30 left in the first quarter ... he tied the NEC career mark with a strip sack on Noel with 11:06 left ... Kuntz covered the fumble for the score that made it 31-10 ... Kuntz has 29.5 sacks for his career the sack total is tied with Jeff Covitz (Bryant, 29.5 from 2011-14) for the most in NEC history ... running back A.J. Hines saw a streak of five consecutive 100 yard games snapped with 86 yards in 18 carries ... Hines' two touchdowns (of 3 and 2 yards) give him 11 on the season.

Wide receivers coach/recruiting coordinator **Bret Colbert** is the nephew of Steelers general manager Kevin Colbert. The Steelers regularly practiced on Rooney Field in the 1990s. The team paid for a bubble that covered 80 yards of the field during the winter months. The team moved off campus following construction of its South Side practice facility.

Caught 9 passes for 235 yards (26.1 ypc.) and a school record-tying four TDs (11, 65, 44, 15) in a 54-35 win at Jacksonville. The 235 yards were 10 shy of tying the highest total in school history.

**Blair Roberts, Gr., WR Oct. 31**  
Caught 8 passes for a career-high 153 yards in tying the school record for TD catches with four (15, 7, 43, 13).

**NEC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK**

**A.J. Hines, Fr., RB Sept. 12**  
Carried 11 times for 74 yards (6.7 ypc) and three touchdowns (16, 41, 2) to lead the Dukes to a 30-19 win over Bucknell. He became the first Duke to rush for three touchdowns in a game since Larry McCoy did so at Valparaiso on Sept. 15, 2012.

**A.J. Hines, Fr., RB Sept. 19**  
Rushed 29 times for 189 yards and two scores (10, 37) in the 34-20 win over Dayton. It was the most yards rushing by a DU freshman since all-time leading rusher Larry McCoy ran for 195 at Nicholls on Sept. 12, 2009. Averaged 9.2 yards per carry in the second half (12-110) to help the Dukes erase a 20-15 halftime deficit.

**A.J. Hines, Fr., RB Sept. 26**  
Accounted for 152 all-purpose yards in a 36-28 loss to Kennesaw State. Ran for a game-high 91 yards on 25 carries and added four catches for 61 yards.

**A.J. Hines, Fr., RB Oct. 3**  
Carried 28 times for 134 yards and added an 11-yard TD reception in DU's 54-35 win at Jacksonville.

**A.J. Hines, Fr., RB Oct. 17**  
Carried 27 times for 182 yards and added an five catches for 64 yards in DU's 31-24 win vs. Robert Morris.

**A.J. Hines, Fr., RB Oct. 24**  
Carried 25 times for 128 yards against a Saint Francis U defense that entered the giving up an average of 95 yards rushing/g. Added one-yard TD run.

**A.J. Hines, Fr., RB Oct. 31**  
Carried 30 times for 147 yards and a TD in a 35-31 win over Bryant. His 54 yard run helped set up what proved to be the winning score.

**A.J. Hines, Fr., RB Nov. 7**  
Carried 22 times for 136 yards including TD runs of 60 and 18 yards in a 28-20 win at Wagner.

**EVERYBODY'S ALL-AMERICAN:**

Senior linebacker Christian Kuntz received Preseason All-America laurels from four organizations. Kuntz, who received six postseason All-America accolades last season, was also the Northeast Conference Defensive Player of the Year. He led the nation in tackles for a loss in FCS in 2015 with 26 for a total of 114 yards while adding 72 total tackles (47 solo), four interceptions for 61 yards and two touchdowns, 11 sacks for a loss of 70 yards, six pass break-ups and six quarterback hurries.

**FBS INFLUENCE:**

Duquesne has 12 Football Bowl Championship players on the 2016 roster, nine of whom were on the Dukes' opening day two-deep. The FBS transfers include: senior WR Wayne Capers, Jr. (Arizona), sophomore QB Kareem Coles (Idaho), junior WR Jaquan Davidson (Pitt), sophomore LB Bryan Glover (Eastern Michigan), junior LB Carter Henderson (Penn State), junior WR Thomas Lucas (UConn), redshirt P/PK Mitch MacZura (Ohio State), junior WR Chavas Rawlins (West Virginia), graduate transfer WR Blair Roberts (Old Dominion), sophomore DB Brandon Stanback (Buffalo), senior LB Gary Wooten (Penn State) and sophomore DB Daquan Worley (Penn State).

**SIX DEGREES OF STEELERS:**

The Duquesne football program has had a long relationship with the Pittsburgh Steelers, with a number of links to the 2016 team. Steelers founder Art Rooney, for whom DU's home field is named, was a quarterback/kicker for the Dukes in 1920. His son, Dan Rooney, the Steelers current chairman, graduated from Duquesne. Dan's son, Art Rooney II, the current Steelers president, earned a law degree from DU.

**Wayne Capers** father, Wayne Sr., was a second-round draft pick of the Steelers in 1983 (Wayne was an All Big

## NINTH SEASON IN THE NEC:

Duquesne, a member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League from 1994 to 2007, is beginning its ninth season as an associate member of the Northeast Conference football league. With the move to the NEC, Duquesne offered 18 scholarships beginning in February of 2008. That number currently rests at 38. Duquesne granted only need-based financial aid for football playing student-athletes as a member of the MAAC. The NEC competed as a non-scholarship member of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision until 2006 when the conference adopted an athletics-based aid model. Duquesne started its program in 1902 and competed at the highest level - winning a pair of New Year's Day Bowl games (1934 Festival of Palms and 1937 Orange) - before disbanding following the 1950 season. DU returned at the Club level prior to the 1969 season and won a National Club Championship in 1973. The Dukes competed at the NCAA Division III level from 1979-92 before moving up to the non-scholarship Football Championship Subdivision in 1993. The NEC Football League, which was established in 1996, includes full-time conference members Bryant University, Central Connecticut State University, Robert Morris University, Sacred Heart University, Saint Francis University and Wagner College along with associate member Duquesne University.

**CAPTAINS:** Duquesne's captains for the 2016 season are senior QB Dillon Buechel (McKees Rocks, Pa./Montour), senior OL Larson Graham (Wyoming, Ohio/Wyoming), junior OL Ben Huss (Upper St. Clair, Pa./Upper St. Clair), senior LB Christian Kuntz (Pittsburgh, Pa./Chartiers Valley), senior DL Jake Radziukinas (Upper St. Clair, Pa./Upper St. Clair) and junior LB Nathan Stone (Scottsdale, Pa./Greensburg Central Catholic).

**NATIONAL EXPOSURE:** Duquesne has played a school record six games on ESPN3 this season: at Youngstown State, vs. Dayton, vs. Kennesaw State, at Jacksonville, vs. Robert Morris and at Saint Francis.

**ONE OF THE TOP 100 PROGRAMS OF ALL-TIME:**

Duquesne, which fielded its first football team in 1891, was ranked among The Associated Press' Top 100 programs in a unique ranking system released this summer. The AP, which has been ranking teams for the past 80 seasons, compiled an all-time Top 100 based on a formula that counts

poll appearances, No. 1 rankings and AP championships. The results placed Duquesne 97th. The Dukes are one of just 11 current Football Championship Sub-division programs to earn a spot on the list. DU, which competed at college football's highest level through 1950, appeared in the AP final poll in 1936 (14th), 1939 (10th) and 1941 (8th).

**ALOHA:** This August Duquesne announced that the team will be traveling to Honolulu for a game against Hawaii on Sept. 22, 2018. The game, which will be DU's second against an FBS program, will also be the program's first game west of the Rocky Mountains

since 1947, when the Dukes played at San Francisco. The furthest Duquesne has traveled since moving to the FBS level in 1992, was to Thibodaux, Louisiana to face Nicholls in 2009. Duquesne was just the third NEC team to face an FBS team when it traveled to Buffalo to take on the University at Buffalo in the 2014 season opener. In that game, DU led 28-24 with under 10 minutes left before Buffalo, a Mid-American Conference team which was coming off an 8-5 season and bowl appearance, scored a pair of late touchdowns to pull out a 38-28 win.

**SURPASSING A LEGEND:** In 2013, head coach Jerry Schmitt surpassed the legendary Elmer Layden on Duquesne's all-time coaching victories list. Layden - one of Notre Dame's famed "Four Horsemen" - coached at Duquesne for seven seasons from 1927-33. It was under Layden that the Dukes first became recognized as a national football power. After leading DU to a 10-1-0 record and an appearance in the 1934 Festival of Palms Bowl, Layden left Duquesne to take over head coaching duties at Notre Dame. Duquesne's all-time wins leader is Greg Gattuso, who preceded Schmitt at DU. Gattuso, who led the Dukes to eight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League titles and a I-AA Mid-Major National Championship in 2003, is currently the head coach at Albany.

**JERRY SCHMITT**

**Head Coach • 12th Season at Duquesne  
17th Season Overall**

Three Northeast Conference titles in the past five seasons and the University's first trip to the NCAA FCS Playoffs in 2015 highlight the resume of 12th year Duquesne football coach Jerry Schmitt.

Schmitt, who played an important role in the development of the Duquesne football program as an assistant from 1985-87 and again from 1992-99 saw three players sign free agent contracts with NFL teams last season and was also named a finalist for the 2015 STATS FCS Coach of the Year award.

The Pittsburgh native, who returned to the DU campus after spending five years as head coach at his alma mater, Westminster College, in New Wilmington, Pa., has overseen the program's move to the Northeast Conference and ensuing adoption of athletics-based aid in February of 2008.

It is a transition that has been an overwhelming success, as over the past five seasons, Schmitt's Dukes have won more overall games (35) and conference games (21) than any NEC school. In addition, DU - which has at least shared three of the past five NEC titles - is the only league school with four winning seasons in the past six years.

Schmitt wasted no time putting his mark on the program by leading the Dukes to three consecutive Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League championships and earning MAAC Coach of the Year two times in his first three seasons as head coach.

In 2011, Schmitt continued Duquesne's transition as a scholarship-granting associate member of the Northeast Conference by guiding the Dukes to a 9-2 record and NEC co-Championship with a 7-1 record.

The 2011 co-title was part of a gradual progression for the Dukes who finished the 2010 season with a 7-4 record and third place league finish with a 5-3 mark.

In 2013, Duquesne once again earned a share of the title - this time tying with Sacred Heart. The 2014 season saw the Dukes finish 6-6 overall.

In 2015, Duquesne went 5-1 in conference play, earning its first outright NEC title and the league's automatic bid to the FCS play-offs, Duquesne's first.

Under Schmitt, the Dukes have fashioned a 26-16 record in NEC play over the past six seasons after posting a 4-11 mark in their first two years while integrating a scholarship model.

In Schmitt's first season, the Dukes posted a 7-3 record (4-0 in the MAAC) - against the most challenging I-AA mid-major schedule a Duquesne team ever faced - and finished with a No. 3 national ranking in The Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Top 10. The 2005 Dukes finished ranked No. 1 nationally in I-AA total defense, rushing defense and pass efficiency defense.

In year two, Schmitt again led DU to a 7-3 record (3-1 in the MAAC) and eighth consecutive MAAC championship as the Dukes finished ranked sixth in The Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Top 10. The 2006 Dukes ranked second nationally in passing offense and 15th in total offense.

In 2007, Duquesne won a share of its ninth consecutive MAAC title in posting a 6-4 overall record. Five years ago the Dukes, in their first season as a scholarship program since the 1950s, went 3-7 in the school's inaugural season in the NEC and followed that with a 3-8 record in 2009.

In 2010, with DU's first scholarship class comprising a good portion of the sophomore and junior classes, the Dukes broke through with their third place NEC finish.

Winning titles at Duquesne is nothing new to Schmitt, who helped the Dukes to their first three MAAC championships in 1995, 1996 & 1999 and the school's first Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Bowl game in 1996, during his 11 years as an assistant.

The Pittsburgh native, who served under three different head coaches in Terry Russell (1985-87), Dan McCann (1992) and Greg Gattuso (1993-99), was the offensive coordinator for his last seven seasons at DU, during which time the Dukes posted a 53-21 record, won three titles and saw 16 different offensive players named First Team All-MAAC. He was promoted to assistant head coach by Gattuso prior to the 1994 season.

# 2016 DUQUESNE GAME SUMMARIES

## GAME #1

### YOUNGSTOWN STATE 45, DUQUESNE 0

Sept. 1, Stambaugh Stadium, Youngstown, Ohio

Records: Duquesne (0-1), Youngstown State (1-0)

partly cloudy - 69 degrees at kickoff

Youngstown State (1-0) scored on four of its first five possessions in jumping to a 24-3 lead and handed Duquesne (0-1) a 45-10 defeat in the season opener in Youngstown.

YSU opened the scoring on the first drive of the game as Ricky Davis connected with Darien Townsend on a 49-yard touchdown strike to make it 7-0 at the 13:01 mark. Following a Duquesne punt, the Penguins struck again as Zak Kennedy kicked a 27-yard field goal to make it 10-0 YSU at the 4:44 mark, capping a 14-play, 71-yard drive.

Duquesne got on the board on its second drive as Austin Crimmins split the uprights on a 43-yard field goal to make it 10-3 with 1:59 remaining in the first quarter. A personal foul on the kick return allowed the Dukes to start the drive at their own 43 yard line. On the second play of the drive Dillon Buechel connected with Blair Roberts on a 27-yard pass play to get the ball to the YSU 32, leading to the Crimmins field goal.

Youngstown State responded though early in the second quarter as Martin Ruiz ran it in from seven yards out, making it 17-3. A 39-yard pass play to open the drive and a personal foul by DU inside their own 15 yard line set up the score.

The Dukes closed out the first half with an impressive drive however, moving the ball 75 yards in 1:13 for a touchdown with 24 seconds left in the half. After Buechel connected with Wayne Capers on a 25-yard pass play to get the ball to the YSU 35, he hit Roberts with a 20-yard aerial to the 15 yard line before Duquesne called timeout with 36 seconds left. Buechel then found Capers for nine yards before going out of bounds, then hit on his fourth straight pass, finding Nehari Crawford in the left side of the endzone for a six-yard scoring strike to make it 24-10 at the half.

The Dukes were forced to punt on its first possession of the second half, but a YSU fumble on the return was recovered by Xavier Nelson and the Dukes took over at the Penguins 44-yard line. However, on the first play, Crawford fumbled on an end around, giving the ball back to YSU.

Youngstown State took advantage and found the end zone on a three-yard pass from Davis to Stefan Derrick, making it 31-10 at the 12:37 mark of the third quarter.

The teams then exchanged three fruitless possessions before YSU made it 38-10 on a one-yard run by Shane Kuhn with 14:11 on the fourth quarter clock, then followed that with a two-yard run by McCaster with 8:04 left to make it 45-10.

The Penguins outgained the Dukes 610-222. Buechel was 15-29 for 188 yards and a touchdown. Capers had five catches for 57 yards and Roberts had three receptions for 82 yards.

It was Duquesne's largest margin of loss (-35) since losing at Youngstown State, 59-17 (-42) on Sept. 21, 2013.

Defensively, Carter Henderson led the Dukes with 10 tackles (6 solo), followed by Christian Kuntz and Abner Roberts with eight each. Kuntz had two tackles for a loss, giving him 49.5 for his career. Crimmins had a field goal and an extra point on the evening for four points, giving him 232, one shy of tying the school record.

## GAME #2

### DUQUESNE 30, BUCKNELL 19

Sept. 10, Rooney Field, Pittsburgh, Pa.

partly cloudy, hot - 88 degrees at kickoff

Freshman A.J. Hines rushed for three touchdowns and senior Dillon Buechel threw for 342 yards as Duquesne won its ninth straight home opener with a 30-13 decision over visiting Bucknell Saturday evening at Rooney Field.

Hines had 74 yards on 10 carries and is the first DU running back to run for three scores since Larry McCoy did so against Valparaiso on Sept. 15, 2012.

Buechel was 28-51 for 342 yards, completing passes to eight different receivers. The 28 completions were Buechel's third highest of his career, however, it was the first time since Oct. 3, 2015 that he did not throw a touchdown pass in a game (7-game span).

Duquesne took the opening kickoff and drove the ball 67 yards on 17 plays, culminating in a 25-yard Austin Crimmins field goal to take a 3-0 lead, 8:17 into the first quarter. With the three points, Crimmins became Duquesne's all-time scoring leader with 235 points, eclipsing Mark Troyan's record of 233, set from 2005-08. He is now also the Northeast Conference record holder for field goals in a career with 48.

The Dukes captured a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter as freshman A.J. Hines scampered into the endzone from 16 yards out at the 12:06 mark. The score ended a 13-play 58-yard drive. Turnovers on three straight possessions followed midway through the period before Duquesne ended the half with a 10-play, 77-yard drive that culminated in a Crimmins 22-yard field goal with no time remaining on the first half clock, to give DU a 13-0 lead.

Bucknell lit its side of the scoreboard on the first drive of the second half as Joey DeFloria scored from the one to make it 13-7. DeFloria led all rushers with 98 yards on 24 carries. Hines found paydirt for the second time though with 13:55 left in the game, scoring from 41 yards out for a 20-7 score.

The Bison fumbled the ensuing kickoff, giving the Red and Blue the ball at the Bucknell 34. Six plays later Crimmins hit his third FG of the day, this time from 38 yards, to make it 23-7 Dukes with 11:43 to go. DeFloria scored again though, this time on a reception, to make it 23-13 DU with 7:34 remaining, following a missed two-point pass attempt.

The Dukes extended their lead to 17 points as Hines scored from the two for a 30-13 advantage with 6:11 left on the clock. The Bison then embarked on a 19-play, 73 yard drive, taking 4:19 off the clock as Matt Muh found Will Carter for an eight-yard TD pass to make it 30-19. Christian Kuntz secured the following on-side kick and the Dukes ran out the clock for the final margin.

Senior Blair Roberts led Duquesne in receptions with seven for 91 yards while sophomore Nehari Crawford led in receiving yards with 100 on six grabs.

Defensively, junior Carter Henderson led DU with eight tackles (5 solo) to go along with a fumble recovery and four quarterback hurries. Fellow junior Nathan Stone had seven stops (3 solo) as well as a forced fumble, a pass breakup and a QB hurry.

## GAME #3

### DUQUESNE 34, DAYTON 20

Sept. 17, Rooney Field, Pittsburgh, Pa.

cloudy, mild - 76 degrees at kickoff

In a battle of 2015 FCS Playoff teams, Duquesne took control in the second half to defeat Dayton, 34-20 on Rooney Field.

Freshman A.J. Hines rushed for 189 yards and two touchdowns and Wayne Capers had a career-high eight catches for 143 yards and a score as the Dukes erased a 20-9 late-second quarter deficit to pull out the victory.

Hines' 189 yards - 110 of which came in the second half - was the most by a DU freshman since all-time leading rusher Larry McCoy ran for 195 yards at Nicholls State on Sept. 12, 2009.

Duquesne outgained Dayton 231-50 in outscoring the Flyers 19-0 in the second half.

An eventful first quarter was highlighted by 20 points, 248 yards, 13 penalties, a 59-yard run by a quarterback and a blocked kick to result in a 14-6 lead Dayton lead after just 15 minutes of play.

Dayton opened the scoring with a one-yard run by Jack Adams on the first drive of the game, making it 7-0 Flyers just 2:59 into the contest. Duquesne responded on its first drive as Dillon Buechel connected with Blair Roberts on a 13-yard touchdown strike. Austin Crimmins' kick was blocked, making it 7-6 Dayton at the 6:22 mark.

The Flyers found paydirt again as Alex Jenner scored from one yard out with 4:54 left in the quarter, making it 14-6 Dayton. The drive was highlighted by a 59-yard run by QB Alex Jeske to the Duquesne one yard line. Crimmins narrowed the DU deficit to 14-9 with a 32-yard field goal at the 12:28 mark of the second quarter, but Dayton's William Will hit field goals from 27 yards and 45 yards to make it 20-9 with 1:08 left in the half.

The Dukes ended the first half scoring though on a four-play, 65-yard drive capped off by a Hines 10-yard scoring run to make it 20-15. That play was set up by 35-yard completion from Buechel to Capers and a 20 yard run by Hines.

After nearly seven scoreless minutes of football to open the second half, linebacker Carter Henderson picked off a Flyer pass and returned it 23 yards for a touchdown to make it 21-20 Dukes, following a failed two-point conversion attempt. On the ensuing kickoff, Troy Gethers forced a fumble on the return, which was recovered by Justice Rawlins, giving Duquesne the ball at the Dayton 20.

On the next play, Buechel connected with Capers on a 20-yard scoring strike and after a blocked extra point attempt, it was Duquesne 27, Dayton 20 with 4:58 left in the third quarter. The only score of the fourth quarter came on a 37-yard touchdown run by Hines, making it 34-20 with 7:33 left in the contest.

Buechel finished the day 18-39 for 227 yards with two touchdowns and his first interception of the season. Roberts had four catches for 59 yards and a score and Riley Redman had nine carries for 63 yards.

Defensively, Christian Kuntz made a team-high nine tackles (5 solo), including three sacks for a loss of 15 yards and six tackles for a loss of 20 yards. He also added a forced fumble, a pass breakup and a QB hurry. Andy Struttmann was next in tackles with six (2 solo) while Daquan Worley picked off his first pass of the season. Nathan Stone had four stops (2 solo) and a sack of five yards.

### KENNESAW STATE 36, DUQUESNE 28

Redshirt freshman Daniel David came off the bench to throw for 172 yards and a pair of touchdowns and Kennesaw State turned four Duquesne turnovers into 17 points to hold on for a 36-28 win over the Dukes at Rooney Field.

David, who played the entire second half for injured starter Chandler Burks, completed 7-of-10 passes. He had attempted four passes in KSU's first four games.

Dillon Buechel completed 21-of-37 passes for 295 yards and a pair of touchdowns for Duquesne, but was picked off a career-high four times, including twice by Dante Blackmon.

There were three lead changes in a first half that ended with Duquesne up 17-16.

Kennesaw took the lead for good on its first possession of the second half, when David found Justin Sumpter all alone behind the DU secondary for a 67-yard score.

DU cut the lead to 22-20 on a 31-yard Austin Crimmins field goal - his second of the game - with 6:46 left in the third quarter.

KSU snuffed a DU fake punt attempt to take over on the Duquesne 32 with 14:10 remaining. Two plays later, Darnell Holland took it around left end 28 yards for a score to make it 29-20.

Kennesaw picked off Buechel for the final time to take over at the DU 21 with just under eight minutes to go.

Daniel then found Sumpter, who finished with a game high seven catches for 165 yards, for a 15-yard touchdown to make it 36-20.

Duquesne answered when Buechel drove the team 63 yards in 1:44 to make it 36-28 on a 39-yard TD pass and two-point conversion toss both to Nehari Crawford.

Kennesaw took over with 4:54 left and managed to run out the clock and preserve the win. David hit Sumpter for a big 28-yard gain on a 2nd-and-14 play to enable the Owls to run out the clock.

Kennesaw turned a pair of Duquesne turnovers into 10 second quarter points to take a 16-10 lead. With Duquesne up 10-6, Blackmon picked off a Buechel pass to set up a 24-yard Jordan Geno-vese field goal. On the Dukes' next possession, Blackmon stepped in front of a Buechel pass and took it 57 yards for a score and a 16-10 lead.

The Owls recovered the ensuing onside kick, but Duquesne held as Genoveses' 41-yard field goal attempt sailed wide right. DU'S Christian Kuntz sacked KSU quarterback Chandler Burks for a loss of 14 yards on the play prior to the field goal miss.

Burks suffered an injury on the sack and did not return.

Duquesne took over on its own 24 and drove the length of the field in 1:23 to take a 17-16 halftime lead on a 29-yard scoring strike from Buechel to Wayne Capers.

The teams scored one touchdown each in the first quarter, with Burks capturing a 75-yard drive with a one-yard plunge to take a 6-0 lead. DU answered when Carter Henderson scooped up a fumble and took it 16 yards for a score to give the Dukes a 7-6 advantage.

Crimmins added a 26-yard field goal early in the second quarter that made it 10-6.

Kennesaw State outgained Duquesne 459-388.

Dillon Buechel threw for 394 yards and a school record-tying 6 touchdowns to lead Duquesne to a 54-35 win at Jacksonville.

Buechel, who completed 23-of-32 passes, including a streak of 16 in a row at one point, threw four of the strikes to Wayne Capers who finished with 235 yards on 9 catches. Capers' four TD catches also tied a school record.

Buechel, coming of a career-high four interceptions in DU's 36-28 loss to Kennesaw State last week, threw touchdown passes on his seventh, ninth, eleventh, fifteenth and sixteenth passes during the streak that ended with a fourth quarter interception.

Duquesne trailed 14-13 when Buechel began his completion streak and led 48-28 when the streak ended.

Jacksonville, which scored three times off Duquesne turnovers, turned a DU fumble into a 22-yard Pernell Rattray touchdown run to take a 7-0 lead just three minutes in.

Duquesne answered with a 45-yard Austin Crimmins field goal, followed by an 11-yard Buechel to Capers TD to take a 10-7 lead after one quarter.

The Dolphins then mounted a 13 play, 75 yard drive to go back on top 14-10 on a one-yard Rylan Wells plunge.

Crimmins capped a 14 play drive with a 40-yard field goal to make it 14-13 with 4:10 left in the half.

DU forced a punt and took over on its own 35 with 1:50 to go in the half, when Buechel took charge, completing 6-of-6 passes for 59 yards as the Dukes took the lead again on an 11-yard Buechel to A.J. Hines touchdown pass with 41 seconds left.

The Dukes outgained the Dolphins 270-113 in the first half, with Buechel 13-of-20 for 191 yards.

Buechel picked up where he left off, finding Capers for a 65 yard TD pass on DU's third play of the second half to make it 27-14.

DU made it 34-14 when Buechel found Capers again, this time from 44 yards out.

Jacksonville responded with a 65 yard drive that ended in a 5-yard Jared Morris run. The Dukes fumbled on their next possession and Wells hit Morris with a 35 yard TD pass on the next play to make it 34-28 with 6:30 to go in the quarter.

Buechel then found Capers again for a 15 yard score and followed that with a 12 yard TD pass to Nehari Crawford to end a 79 yard drive with 13:35 to go.

C.J. Lewis ended Buechel's streak with an interception that resulted in a 3 yard Ulysses Bryant touchdown run that made it 48-35.

Duquesne's Riley Redman ended the scoring with a 5 yard run with 1:15 to go.

DU's 54 points were its most since a 56-14 win over La Salle on Nov. 5, 2005.

The Dukes, who finished with 32 first downs, outgained the Dolphins 619-233. Hines led all rushers with 134 yards on 28 carries.

Carter Henderson led the Dukes with 10 tackles, including 2.5 for loss. Nate Stone added 8 stops for DU.

Dillon Buechel threw three touchdown passes as Duquesne overcame a pair of first quarter turnovers to hand head coach Jerry Schmitt his 100th career win, 31-24, over Robert Morris on Rooney Field.

The Dukes, who outgained the Colonials 491-155, took their only lead on P.J. Fulmore's touchdown run with 7:54 left.

A.J. Hines led the Dukes with 182 yards rushing and Fulmore added 75 more as DU outgained RMU 233-33 on the ground.

Buechel, who completed passes to nine receivers, finished with 258 yards on 22 completions.

The DU defense held RMU without a third down conversion on the evening.

Robert Morris wasted no time turning a fumbled punt into a score when Joe Carroll found Tim Vecchio for a 17 yard touchdown pass with 6:09 left in the first quarter.

RMU was the beneficiary of another short field, when the Dukes fumbled a second punt, this one on the Duquesne 13 on the final play of the first quarter. The DU defense held the Colonials to a 23-yard Connor Shennan field goal that made it 10-7.

DU followed the RMU score with a 10 play drive to tie it on a 32 yard Austin Crimmins field goal.

Crimmins lined up for a 47 yard field goal attempt with just over one minute left in the half, when Robert Morris' special teams came up with their third big play, when Marcelis Branch blocked and returned the kick 63 yards for a score to make it 17-10 with 1:01 to go in the half.

The Dukes answered with a 77 yard drive that ended when Buechel found Kellon Taylor with a six yard touchdown pass to tie it with 10 seconds left.

The Dukes outgained the Colonials 258-75 in the opening 30 minutes.

Trey Edwards got behind the DU secondary on RMU's second possession of the second half and Carroll found him for a 65 score to put the Colonials up 24-17.

Duquesne then took it 75 yards in 11 plays - nine of which were runs - to tie it on an eight yard Buechel to Blair Roberts touchdown pass.

Anthony Dougherty then picked off a Carroll pass and returned it to the RMU 19. The Dukes moved to the RMU two before Taylor was called for offensive pass interference on an apparent TD catch. The Dukes were flagged for another penalty, and Buechel was sacked setting up a fourth-and-goal from the 27 that the Dukes could not convert.

DU forced a punt and drove 62 yards, primarily on the legs of Fulmore, who gave DU its first lead on a 9 yard run with 7:54 left.

## GAME #7

light rain - 48 degrees at kickoff

Zack Drayer scored from one yard out with 50 seconds left to give Saint Francis a 14-10 win over Duquesne at DeGol Field.

Drayer's run capped a 10 play, 63 yard drive.

Saint Francis, which had just three plays of 10 yard or more prior to its final possession, got a 22-yard completion from Drayer to Kamron Lewis and a 20-yard run from Marcus Bagley to move to the Duquesne one, setting up Drayer's game-winning sneak.

The Dukes took over on its own 33 and moved to the SFU 36 in the closing seconds before Jalen Wells picked off a Dillon Buechel pass at the 20 to end it.

Duquesne, which held Saint Francis to 57 yards on its first five possessions of the second half, took a 10-7 lead on an A.J. Hines run with 8:43 left in the third quarter.

DU ran for 172 yards against a SFU defense that entered the game giving up 95 yards per game on the ground, Hines topped the 100-yard mark for the fourth time in five games with 128 yards rushing on 25 carries.

The Red Flash, who came into the game with an FCS-best 30 sacks, did not get to Buechel, who finished 13-of-34 for 150 yards.

Duquesne, behind a pair of completions from Buechel to Blair Roberts, drove 71 yards to the Saint Francis two on its first possession, but came away empty when Austin Crimmins' 20-yard field goal attempt sailed wide left.

The Dukes managed to break the scoreless tie when Crimmins capped a 15 play drive with a 26 yard field goal mid way through the second quarter.

DU was driving late in the first half when Brandon Ponder stepped in front of a Buechel pass at the Duquesne 17. On the next play, Drayer hit Lewis on the right sideline. Lewis slipped a pair of DU tacklers near midfield and took it 83 yards to the Duquesne one. Drayer took it in on the next play to give the Red Flash a 7-3 halftime lead.

The two exchanged punts to open the second half, before Jonathant Istache picked off a Drayer pass and returned it 26 yards to the SFU 42. Buechel then hit Wayne Capers with a 33 yard pass to the nine. Three plays later, Hines took it in to give the Dukes their 10-7 lead.

Duquesne, which had an over nine-minute advantage in time of possession, outgained Saint Francis 322-251. The Dukes had 19 first downs to 10 for the Red Flash.

Lewis finished with 135 yards on four catches for SFU.

A match up of the two top-scoring teams in the Northeast Conference didn't disappoint as Duquesne rallied from a 24-7 second-quarter deficit to defeat Bryant 35-31 on Rooney Field.

Duquesne's Dillon Buechel and Bryant's Dalton Easton, who entered the game leading the NEC with 14 and 15 touchdown passes respectively, threw for four TDs each as the two teams combined for 752 yards. Buechel's four strikes went to Blair Roberts, while Easton's four scores went to Keenan Thompson.

Roberts, who finished with a career-high 153 yards, tied the school record with his four TD receptions.

A.J. Hines added 147 yards and a touchdown rushing as the Dukes amassed 495 yards of total offense.

Roberts caught a seven yard TD pass with 1:58 left in the first half to make it 24-14. The Dukes added a pair of scores in the third quarter - the second a 43 yard pass from Buechel to Roberts - to take their first lead at 28-24. DU followed the fourth Easton-to-Thompson hook-up with a 13 yard Buechel-to-Roberts score with 9:15 left for the final margin.

Hines carried 11 times for 66 yards in the fourth quarter to help the Dukes eat up the clock.

The Dukes outgained the Bulldogs 324-79 in the second half.

Bryant got on the board first, going 97 yards on an opening possession that ended with a 32 yard TD pass from Easton to Thompson.

Duquesne answered with a 75 yard drive that finished with a 15 yard pass from Buechel to Roberts.

Bryant put together another 10 play drive, this one ending on a 26 yard Ricky Perez field goal that made it 10-7.

The Bulldogs forced the game's first turnover when Thomas Costigan came off the edge to strip Buechel of the ball and recover it at the DU five. Easton wasted no time converting the miscue by hitting Thompson on the next play to give BU a 17-7 lead.

Costigan then picked off a Buechel pass, giving the Bulldogs the ball on the Duquesne 22. Easton again made it a one-play drive, hitting Thompson to give Bryant its second touchdown in under a minute.

DU cut the lead to 24-14 when Buechel capped a 10 play drive with a seven yard TD pass to Roberts just before the half.

On the Dukes' first possession of the second half, Buechel found Wayne Capers for a 50 yard gain to the Bryant four and Hines punched it in from one yard out to make it 24-21.

Duquesne took its first lead when Buechel found Roberts for a 43 yard touchdown on a 3rd-and-19 play with two minutes to go in the third quarter.

Easton found Thompson for the fourth time, this one from 14 yards out, to make it 31-28 early in the fourth quarter.

Hines went over the 100-yard mark for the fifth time in six games on a 54-yard run to the Bryant 26. The Dukes faced a 2nd-and-25 following a penalty and converted on a 28 yard shovel pass from Buechel to P.J. Fulmore. Buechel then found Roberts for a fourth score from 13 yards out to re-take the lead.

Jake Radziukinas led the DU defense with 10 tackles including 1.5 tackles for loss. Andy Sruttmann added a pair of sacks for the Dukes.

A.J. Hines ran for 136 yards and a pair of touchdowns as Duquesne erased an early 10-point deficit to take over sole possession of second place in the Northeast Conference with a 28-20 win at Wagner.

Hines scored on runs of 60 and 18 yards to bring his season rushing yardage total to 1,095, making him the first Duquesne freshman to top 1,000 yards at the Football Championship Subdivision level.

Blair Roberts added 110 yards receiving, including an 18 yard touchdown catch, for the Dukes.

Abner Roberts and Nate Stone had 10 tackles each for the Dukes, who finished with three sacks.

Senior linebacker Christian Kuntz had one of the three, a school record-tying 27.5th of his career on Wagner's final possession.

The Dukes held the Seahawks to 56 yards on their final 20 plays of the second half.

Wagner scored on its first two possessions to jump out to an early 10-0 lead. James Cooper capped a game-opening 52 yard drive with a field goal followed by a 10 yard TD run by quarterback Alex Thomson.

Duquesne got on the board when Hines broke off a season-long 60 yard run for a touchdown with 42 seconds left in the first quarter.

Wagner, which had 247 yards in the half, went 80 yards in nine plays, with Denzel Knight punching it over from one yard out to make it 17-7 early in the second quarter.

Dillon Buechel connected with Roberts for a 46 yard gain to the Wagner 18, setting up a five yard run by P.J. Fulmore that made it 17-14 at the half.

Thomson hit John Williams with a 43 yard pass after DU kept the Seahawks' drive alive by being offside on a WC punt. Cooper followed the completion with a 39 yard field goal that gave the Seahawks a seven-point lead mid-way through the third quarter.

Duquesne took its first lead when Buechel capped an 83 yard drive with an 18 yard touchdown pass to Roberts with just under two minutes left in the third quarter. The 12 play drive was kept alive by pass interference and roughing the passer penalties on the Seahawks.

The Dukes forced a three-and-out and took 7:27 off the clock with an 85 yard drive that ended with an 18 yard Hines touchdown run on a 4th-and-2 play.

Wagner took over on its own four with 1:36 left, but couldn't move the ball as Thomson was sacked twice, the first coming from Kuntz, who tied the DU career record on the play.

Abner Roberts sealed the win with an interception after Thomson was sacked for a second time, this one by Jake Radziukinas.

## GAME #10

In a matchup of the two top passers in Northeast Conference history, it was the Duquesne defense that stole the show, holding Sacred Heart to season lows in total yardage and points in a 31-10 win at Rooney Field.

DU linebacker Christian Kuntz had a pair of sacks to break the Duquesne career record and tie the NEC career mark as the Dukes held the Pioneers to 225 yards.

Duquesne's Dillon Buechel, who went over the 10,000 career yard passing mark early in the fourth quarter, finished with 238 yards passing, while Sacred Heart's R.J. Noel, who entered the game a little over 900 yards behind Buechel, was held to 93 yards through the air.

Freshman running back A.J. Hines ran for 86 yards and a pair of touchdowns for the Dukes, who finished with 381 total yards.

Duquesne converted a pair of fourth downs - one on a Kuntz run out of punt formation, and the second on a 21 yard pass from Buechel to Blair Roberts to set up a 4 yard Hines touchdown run.

Sacred Heart, which had just 62 yards of total offense in the first half, jumped on a Hines fumble at the Duquesne 12, but could only gain three yards before settling for a 25 yard Alec Finney field goal that made it 7-3 with 4:20 left in the half.

Duquesne answered with a 68 yard drive capped by a 2 yard scoring run by Hines. Hines had two big plays on the drive, an 18 yard reception and a 32 yard run to the SHU two.

The Dukes made it 21-3 early in the third quarter when Buechel hit Wayne Capers with a 24 yard touchdown pass to end a 12 play drive.

Sacred Heart put together its first extended drive of the game, going 68 yards in 10 plays to make it 21-10 on a 4 yard touchdown pass from Noel to Andrew O'Neill with 5:12 left in the third quarter.

DU came right back with a 38 yard Austin Crimmins field goal.

Kuntz, who became Duquesne's all-time sack leader when he took down Noel for a 16 yard loss late in the first quarter, tied for the NEC all-time lead with a strip sack of Noel that he covered in the end zone that made it 31-10 with 11:06 left.
