ARTHUR J. ROONEY ATHLETIC FIELD

Located high atop the Bluff in the center of the Duquesne University campus, Arthur J. Rooney Athletic Field is one of the most unique athletic facilities in the nation.

Bordered by Academic Walk on one side and Mellon Hall of Science and Keller Fieldhouse on either end, Rooney Field offers scenic views of downtown Pittsburgh, the Monongahela River and Pittsburgh's historic South Side.

Bolstered by a two-phase, \$4 million renovation completed in 2011, the lighted, Sportexe turf-covered facility celebrates its 25th full-season anniversary in 2017.

The completion of Rooney Field in 1993 - named in honor of Duquesne University football letterman and founder of the Pittsburgh Steelers National Football League team, Art Rooney - enabled the Dukes to play football on campus for the first time since 1929.

Foresight and planning turned a former staff and faculty parking lot into what is now the focus of the Duquesne campus. Initial space limitations caused Rooney Field to be one of the few in college football that run east-to-west. Workers had to cut down approximately six feet to finish the playing surface. The excavation created both excellent sight lines and the terrace effect that allowed for concrete bleachers on the Academic Walk side of the field and grassy knoll on the Bluff Street side of the field.

The first phase of renovation work, completed late in the summer of 2008, included the creation of permanent grandstand seating on Bluff Street – replacing temporary bleachers that had been installed for the previous 14 football seasons.

Permanent concession stands and restrooms were also added to the south side of the field in 2008. The Academic Walk sideline also gained additional seating.

The Rooney Field playing surface was also replaced with Sportexe synthetic turf prior to the 2008 season.

Keller Fieldhouse, which was formally dedicated with a ribbon-cutting ceremony on August 6, 2011, made up the second stage of the renovation. The project included expansion of the football locker room, renovation of the athletic training room and construction of a new football coaching suite. The renovation was funded by private donations and is named after Jerome C. Keller, E'65, H'91, who provided a lead gift for the facility.

The Leigh Bodden Atrium, provided by a generous gift from DU's nine-year NFL veteran defensive back, was added to the entrance of Keller Fieldhouse in October of 2015.

In addition, two new scoreboards were installed during the summer of 2011 replacing ones that were part of the original construction of the field.

Rooney Field also features a two-tier press box, funded largely by a contribution from the Eugene P. Beard family, which was completed in the summer of 1995.

In addition to serving as home for the DU men's and women's soccer and lacrosse teams, numerous other activities are held on Rooney Field. Various camps, team practices and intramural activities keep the field in constant use.

Rooney Field has enjoyed the national spotlight as the host of a number of televised games, beginning with a Halloween 1994 win over Iona that was viewed by a national ESPN2 audience.

The Dukes enter the 2017 season with a 99-27-0 record on Rooney Field, including eight undefeated seasons (1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2005, 2011, 2013 and 2015).

1994 • Second scoreboard added to east end zone atop Towers Pool. Portable bleachers installed on the press box side for each season (ended in 2007).

1995 • Permanent press box constructed.

2002 • AstroPlay surface installed (removed following 2007 season).

2008 • Permanent grandstands, rest rooms and a concession stand added to press box side of the field. Additional seating added on Academic Walk. Sportexe playing surface installed.

2011 • Completion of Keller Fieldhouse which included expansion of the football locker room, and construction of new coaches offices. In addition, new scoreboards were installed on the east and west sides of the field.

2015 • Leigh Bodden Atrium in Keller Fieldhouse dedicated.

FROM JOSEPH F. RISHEL'S "THE SPIRIT THAT GIVES LIFE" (1997)

"In 1891, football, which at the time was called 'American rugby,' was among the first team sports organized. In the first few years of competition, the school played athletic clubs, YMCA teams, as well as other local colleges. The regulations that were later to characterize intercollegiate athletics had not yet been formed when the college hired a football coach in 1898.

"The Holy Ghost father's ideal, according to the Pittsburgh College Bulletin, was 'to keep the body in a sound state to compensate for the strains of study.'"

THE NORTHEAST CONFERENCE

Duquesne formally accepted an invitation to join the Northeast Conference as an associate football-playing member on Jan. 22, 2007 and began offering athletics-based aid in February of 2008. Prior to joining the NEC, Duquesne granted only need-based financial aid for football playing student-athletes as a member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.

The NEC Football league, which has a current membership of seven teams: Bryant, Central Connecticut State, Duquesne, Robert Morris, Sacred Heart, Saint Francis, Pa. and Wagner, was established in 1996. The league competed as a non-scholarship member of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision until 2006 when the conference adopted an athletics-based aid model.

The league gained national respect by earning automatic qualifier status for the NCAA Division I Championship in 2010. Co-champion Robert Morris was the NEC's first representative as part of the first expansion of the football bracket in 21 years. The league has shown its competitive balance by sending six different teams to the NCAA playoffs in its first seven seasons as an AQ (Robert Morris, Albany, Wagner, Sacred Heart twice, Duquesne and Saint Francis U).

The NCAA Division I Championship bracket currently stands at 24, with 10 conference winners guaranteed automatic bids and 14 others gaining entry on an at-large basis. The top eight teams are seeded and receive first-round byes. The remaining 16 teams will bid to host first-round games, with geography and travel costs playing a role when pairings are determined.
