HEAD COACH SUZIE McCONNELL-SERIO

Women's Basketball Hall of Famer and Pittsburgh native Suzie McConnell-Serio, one of the most highly-decorated players in the history of women's basketball, owner of over 300 wins as a high school head coach and former WNBA Coach of the Year, was named the ninth head coach in the history of the Duquesne women's basketball program in April of 2007.

It did not take long for McConnell-Serio to make an impact, as she took a team picked to finish 13th in the Atlantic 10 Conference and guided it to a 15-15 record and a seventh place tie in league standings with a 6-8 mark. McConnell-Serio, who inherited a team coming off its worst season since 1993, (7-20 in 2007) led the Dukes to their second most improved season in school history (6.5 games). Additionally, DU improved 79 positions in the RPI, which was the most since 2001. McConnell-Serio's success on the floor was recognized by league officials as Kristi Little was named Atlantic 10 Defensive Player of the Year as well as being named to the A-10 Third Team All Conference and All Defensive Team.

McConnell-Serio was one of the most successful high school coaches in the state in compiling a 321-86 (.789) record and winning three Class AAAA state titles and four District 7 (WPIAL) championships in 13 seasons at Pittsburgh's Oakland Catholic High School.

As a professional coach, she guided the WNBA Minnesota Lynx to back-to-back playoff appearances - including the first in franchise history - in 2003 and 2004 and was named WNBA Coach of the Year in 2004.

McConnell-Serio attended Pittsburgh's Seton-La Salle High School prior to beginning an outstanding playing career as a point guard at Penn State University. In four seasons at PSU (1984-85 through 1987-88), McConnell-Serio helped the Nittany Lions to a 95-33 record and four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances. In the process, she was named the school's first First Team All-American while setting NCAA Division I records for career assists (1,307), assists in a season (355 in 1987) and season assist average (11.8 in 1987). Her assist total and assist per game average led the nation in both 1986 & 1987.

Following her collegiate career, McConnell-Serio was a double medalwinner as part of both the 1988 and 1992 United States Olympic teams. In 1988 she helped the U.S. to a gold medal in Seoul and in 1992 she was a bronze medalist in Barcelona. She also won a gold medal as a member of the 1991 U.S. World University Games team.

McConnell-Serio was chosen in the second round (16th overall) of the 1998 WNBA Draft by the Cleveland Rockers and went on to earn Newcomer of the Year and All-WNBA First Team honors in

McConnell-Serio, who averaged 10.2 assists per game for her career, also holds NCAA records for assists in a season (355 in 1987), and season average per game (11.8 in 1987). She led the nation in assists and assists per game in both 1986 & 1987.

1988 - Became the first First Team All-American in Penn State women's basketball history. Also named winner of the Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award given to the outstanding female senior collegian 5-8 or under.

her first season in the league. She also won the Kim Perrot Sportsmanship Award twice (1998 & 2000) in her three seasons in the WNBA.

McConnell-Serio took the reigns of the Oakland Catholic program in 1990-91 and won her first of three Class AAAA State Championships in 1993. In 13 years, McConnell-Serio averaged over 24 wins per season. She added additional state titles in 2001 & 2003 and runner-up finishes in 2000 & 2002. Nearly a dozen of her former players went on to earn NCAA Division I scholarships.

In January of 2003, McConnell-Serio returned to the WNBA as head coach of the Minnesota Lynx and took a team that finished 10-22 in the previous season to an 18-16 record and first-ever playoff appearance. One year later, she took a team picked to finish last in the Western Conference by a number of preseason publications and made a return trip to the playoffs and in the process was named the 2004 WNBA Coach of the Year. The '04 Lynx, who earned a franchise-best No. 3 seed in the Western Conference, tied franchise records for wins (18), home victories (11) and road wins (7) all set in McConnell-Serio's first season. In addition, Minnesota enjoyed a franchise record six-game winning streak.

McConnell-Serio, who completed her degree in education at Penn State in 1988, has won numerous awards throughout her career. She was named to the USA Today All-Time Women's Basketball Team and was also named one of Sports Illustrated's Top 50 Pennsylvania Athletes of the Century.

She was a member of the 10-person USA Basketball Executive Committee from 2001-04 and was inducted to the Western Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame in 2001. She was also the first Dapper Dan Sportswoman of the Year winner in 1999.

And the October 29, 2007 issue of *Sports Illustrated* listed McConnell-Serio as the best 5-4 basketball player, male or female, of all-time. McConnell-Serio and her husband, Pete - who along with Suzie was born and raised in the Brookline area of Pittsburgh - are the parents of four children: Peter (18), Jordan (14), Mandy (12) and Madison (11).

BACK ON THE BLUFF: Assistant coaches **Dan Burt** and **Blaine Patterson** return to Duquesne for their second season on the women's basketball staff. Burt brings 10 years of Division I experience to the Dukes' bench. He came to Duquesne from Bucknell where he was an assistant for three seasons (2004-07). He was also an assistant for three seasons at both West Virginia (1998-2001) and UNC Wilmington (2001-04). Patterson, known for his extensive knowledge of video editing and game preparation, spent three seasons at Illinois prior to coming to Duquesne. While at Illinois, he served as assistant to the head coach in 2004-05 and as an assistant coach under Theresa Greutz in 2005-06 and 2006-07. Director of Basketball Operations **Katie Kestler** also returns to the staff this season.

I REMEMBER YOU: New to the staff this season is assistant coach **Carmen Bruce**. The former standout guard played two seasons for the Red and Blue and finished her career with 290 assists, which is currently ninth all-time in DU history. Last season, Bruce served as a graduate student in the Duquesne athletics marketing department.

ABOUT MOREHEAD STATE: Established in 1887 as the Morehead Normal School, the school changed its name to Morehead State Normal School and Teachers College in 1926, Morehead State Teachers College in 1930, Morehead State College in 1948 and Morehead State University in 1968. MSU is located in Morehead, Kentucky in the foothills of the Daniel Boone National Forest in Rowan County, midway between Lexington, Kentucky and Huntington, West Virginia. Morehead State is one of only four universities in the U.S. to offer a Bachelor of Science degree in space science. Notable Morehead State Alumni include former New York Giants quarterback Phil Simms, game show host Chuck Woolery, ESPN's Mike Gottfried and country singer/actor Billy Ray Cyrus.

SINGIN' THE BLUES AGAINST THE BLUEGRASS STATE: Duquesne has not faired well against teams from Kentucky. The Dukes have gone wineless in two attempts against the University of Kentucky and are 0-5 vs. Western Kentucky. Their lone win was last season against Morehead State.

LAST TIME AGAINST MOREHEAD STATE:

Kristi Little and Keri Pryor each had career-highs of 19 points and Suzie McConnell-Serio notched her first win as a college head coach in Duquesne's 69-52 victory over Morehead State Nov. 10, 2007. Little came within one steal of a double-double as her nine steals was also a career-high for the Dukes who led from start to finish. Anitha Smith-Williams led the Eagles with 18 points. DU came out of the gates early in the first half as an Amanda Peck layup gave Duquesne their largest lead of the half 16-4 with 11:36 remaining in the first half. MSU came back with a 19-6 run to trim the Dukes lead to one point at 24-23. This would be the closest Morehead State would come as the Dukes took 40-34 lead into halftime. The Dukes lead swelled to 20 points with 8:06 remaining in the contest, and MSU would only get as close as 15 points as a Jocelyn Chandler layup closed out the scoring to give DU the 69-52 victory.

DUKES IN SEASON OPENERS: Tonight marks the 36th all-time season opener for the Duquesne women's basketball team. The first-ever game for the program was Dec. 12, 1973 at Seton Hill.

KEEPING IT KEYSTONE: Of the 12 players on Duquesne's roster, nine hail from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in **Vanessa Abel** (Scottsdale, Pa./Southmoreland), **Jaclyn Babe** (Pittsburgh, Pa./Mt. WHAT A WEEK!: Not only was Little named Atlantic 10 Player of the Week during the final week of the 2007-08 season, but she also became the first Duke to be named the conference's defensive player of the year. Additionally, she was named to the A-10 Third Team All-Conference and All Defensive Teams.

PICKING UP WHERE SHE LEFT OFF: Little's accomplishments last season have already translated over to this season. She was voted to the A-10's preseason All-Conference First-Team.

LUCKY 7's: Little enters the 2008-09 season with 777 career points. She needs 223 to become just the 19th member of the Duquesne 1,000 point club.

SCORING SAMANTHA: After missing all but two games her freshman season with an injury, Pollino has made an incredible return. She finished the 2007-08 regular season seventh in the A-10 with a .515 shooting percentage and tied for eighth in offensive rebounds with 2.5 per game. She scored in double figures in both of DU's exhibition games.

PRYOR ON FIRE: Pryor missed six games due to an arm injury last season, but that did not slow her down. She finished the season averaging just under 10 point per game. In the two exhibition games, she averaged 11.5 ppg including a double-double of 12 points and 10 rebounds against Team Essence.

PECK'S IN EFFECT: One of the Dukes' most improved players last season, Peck had a strong finish in the exhibition season. She had a game-high 13 points and four blocks in the Dukes' 92-40 win over Clarion.

ON THE REBOUND: After sitting out last season under NCAA transfer rules, Pyle has made quite an impression so far. She pulled down 11 rebounds in both exhibition games and added 12 points against Clarion.

ROCKIN' RACHEL: Frederick, who also sat out last season under NCAA transfer rules, is looking forward to returning to the hard-

wood. The junior who played her first two years at Ohio University was the 2005-06 Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year as well as being named to the All-MAC third team.

TERRIFIC THOMPSON: In Duquesne's two exhibition games, Thompson has shot an outstanding 8-11 from the floor. Her .727 shooting percentage was the team's best.

KOOL KELLY: Britcher opened the exhibition with a 14-point effort against Team Essence. In the two games, she averaged 11 points and was 9-18 from the floor (9-18).

LAUREN NOT YET SCORIN': Due to a back injury, Reinshuttle was forced to miss the Dukes' two exhibition games. The sophomore came off the bench in 29 of DU's 30 games last season.

AWESOME ALEX: Gensler had a strong showing against Team Essence and Clarion. She scored 10 points in each game in just 41 total minutes.

FIRST #1: Babe is the first Duquesne women's basketball player in program history to don uniform number 1. She missed the Dukes' first exhibition game, but played 21 minutes and had a pair of assists against Clarion.

READY BUT NOT YET ABEL: This season, Abel will be reshirted. The 5-5 guard will be eligible for the 2009-10 season.

D-ING UP: Duquesne's defense yielded only 33 points against North Carolina Central Jan. 7, 2008. This was the fewest points the Dukes have allowed since they began Division I play in 1983-84. The best defensive performance came Feb. 1, 1974 when the then Duchesses gave up 14 points to Indiana University of Pennsylvania.
