## HEAD COACH MICHAEL SCERBO

Mike Scerbo is in his third season as the head coach of Duquesne's lacrosse program. Scerbo is just the second mentor in the 11-year history of the DU lacrosse program. He took over the Duquesne position in August of 2005 after a four-year stint as an assistant coach at Ohio State from 2002 to 2005.

He led the Dukes to an 11-5 record in his first year with the Dukes and finished tied for fourth in the Atlantic 10 posting a 4-3 league mark. He saw five of his players earn Atlantic 10 All-Conference honors which included two first team picks - Kelly Mulford and Krista Mann, a second team selection - Stacie Pollock, an honorable mention - Courtney Tamasitis and an All-Rookie pick - Kathleen McNish. Krista Mann was tabbed as the Atlantic 10 Defensive Player of the Year and three players (Caroline Gallagher, Mann, Tamasitis) earned a spot on the Academic All-Conference squad.

In his second season at the helm, a young squad with 11 freshmen posted a 7-10 record, 2-5 in the A-10 while earning the second-most conference honors with nine. Pollock and McNish were named first team All-Atlantic 10. In addition, Tamasitis and Tyneshia Harris were named second team All-Atlantic 10. Sarah Cates, Janna Faulkner and Meghan Frederick were named to the conference rookie team. Keri Drexel and McNish were named to the Atlantic 10 Academic All-Conference team.

At Ohio State, Scerbo helped guide the Buckeyes to a pair of NCAA tournament appearances (2002 & 2003) and one American Lacrosse Conference title (2003). OSU won a school-record 14 matches in 2003 (14-4) and posted an 11-5 record in 2002. The Buckeyes were ranked 11th nationally by the IWLCA in 2003 and 12th at the conclusion of the 2002 slate - Scerbo's initial campaign at OSU. Ohio State was 36-30 overall during his tenure.

Prior to his move to Columbus, Ohio, Scerbo served as the head women's lacrosse coach at Limestone College in Gaffney, S.C. for five seasons. He was head coach of Limestone's first team in 1997 and quickly developed the program into a national contender. His squad was ranked in the Division II Top Ten from 1998-2001, while producing numerous All-Americans and several Deep South District Team and North-South Senior All-Star Team members. Scerbo posted a 33-24 record at Limestone College including a 10-1 mark - good for a No. 2 national ranking - in his final season in 2001. In October 2007, he was inducted into Limestone's Hall of Fame.

Professionally, Scerbo has chaired the IWLCA Division II Coaches' Poll Committee and was also a member of the NCAA Division II Women's Lacrosse Committee. He played a vital role in the development of the NCAA Division II Women's Lacrosse National Tournament, which debuted in 2001. Scerbo, who is regarded as one of the bright, up-and-coming women's lacrosse coaches in the country, was nominated by his coaching peers for the prestigious IWLCA National Division II Coach of the Year award in 2001. Aside from coaching, Scerbo was also an Associate Athletic Director and an Admissions Representative at Limestone College.

A 1995 graduate of SUNY Oswego with a bachelor's degree in biology, Scerbo was the assistant women's lacrosse coach at his alma mater in 1996, working with the offense and goalies. He played three years of college lacrosse at Division I State University of New York at Stony Brook as an attackman and concluded his playing career at Oswego in 1995.

Scerbo and his wife Jessica live in Coraopolis.

**SUPER SEVEN:** The Duquesne women's lacrosse team was well represented on the 2008 Atlantic 10 All-Conference teams. **Kat McNish** was named the 2008 Atlantic 10 Student-Athlete of the Year as well as being named to the All-Conference first team. **Tiny Harris** joined McNish on the first team. **Ashley Wood** and **Shannon Hadaway** were named All-Conference second team and **Liz Fey**, **Courtney Lambert** and **Liz Walker** were named to the All-Conference rookie team. Janna Faulkner, along with McNish was named to the All-Academic team.

**KOOL KAT:** **McNish** finished the regular season leading Duquesne in points (71) and assists (42). She was second on the Dukes with 29 goals. She became DU's all-time assist leader with her 101st career assist against Richmond (4/6). She leads the Atlantic 10 Conference in assists and is third in points. She was named A-10 co-player of the week two times this season (4/7 and 4/21). **McNish** currently ranks fourth in the NCAA in assists and 14th in points. She is currently fourth among the NCAA Division I active career assist leaders with 110.

**STEPPIN' UP SENIORS:** The senior defensive duo of **Harris** and **Caitlin Kistler** has combined for 51 ground balls, 36 draw controls and 24 caused turnovers this season. The pair has held opponents to under 11 goals per game in Atlantic 10 play.

**KNOCK ON WOOD:** After missing all but three games last season, **Wood** has made an incredible comeback. She has set career-highs in goals with 36, assists with nine and points with 45. **Wood** is sixth in the A-10 in goals and shots.

**SUPER SHANNON:** While at Ohio University last year, **Hadaway** missed the 2007 season when the Bobcats cancelled their season weeks before it began. **Hadaway** chose to transfer to Duquesne where is tied for third on the Dukes with a career-high 26 goals.

**SCORING SARAH'S:** **Sarah Cates** and **Sarah Carson** are tied for fifth on the Dukes with 19 goals apiece this season. **Cates**, a member of the 2007 A-10 all-rookie team, has started all 16 games and has set a person-best this season with five assists. **Carson** scored a career-best five goals at St. Bonaventure (4/11) and has increased her scoring by 54 percent from 2007.

**MARVELOUS MEGHAN:** **Meghan Frederick**, a 2007 A-10 all-rookie team selection, set career-bests in assists with 20 and points with 39 this season. Her six points at Robert Morris (3/5) was a career-high.

**WALKER WINS:** Dukes' keeper **Liz Walker** was named A-10 rookie of the week March 10 and March 17.

**ABOUT TEMPLE:** Founded in 1884 by Dr. Russell Conwell, Temple College was chartered in 1888 and became Temple University in 1907. The school's sports teams are called the Owls: this name comes from Temple's early days, when it was a night school. Notable Temple Alumni include sports talk radio host Tony Bruno, actor/comedian Bill Cosby, musicians Daryl Hall and John Oates, actor/comedian Bob Saget, actor Tom Sizemore, former National Hockey League President Gil Stein and actress Patricia Wettig. Temple has produced dozens of professional athletes including Raheem Brock, Dan Kleko, Joe Kleko, Mike McGann, James Parrish, Al Singleton, Rian Wallace of the National Football League and Rick Brunson, Mardy Collins, Steve Javie, Eddie Jones, Mark Macon, Aaron McKie and Pepe Sánchez of the National Basketball Association and Candice Dupree and Kamesha Hairston of the Women's National Basketball Association.

**LAST TIME AGAINST TEMPLE:** A pair of late Temple goals held off a second half Duquesne surge as the Owls handed Duquesne a 12-9 loss in their Atlantic 10 Conference opener March 30. After falling behind 3-0 in the first five minutes of the match, Kat McNish got the Dukes on the board with an unassisted goal at the 24:31 mark. Down 5-1, DU came back with four consecutive goals from Sarah Cates, Sarah Carson, Shannon Hadaway and Ashley Wood to tie the score at 5-5 with 7:56 remaining in the first half. Temple regained the lead 1:22 later on Berkley Summerlin's goal and took a 7-5 lead into halftime after a late goal from Chelsea Rosiek with 14 seconds left. The Owls scored three of the next four goals, including two by Nicole Caniglia which game her five for the match, to open up a 10-6 lead with 23:18 remaining in the match. Goals by Hadaway, Janna Faulkner and Meghan Frederick got the Dukes within one goal at 10-9 with 5:12 left. A pair of Whitney Richards goals closed out the scoring as Temple held the Dukes scoreless the rest of the way as the Owls took the conference opener 12-9.
