

East Carolina Post-Game Notes

2009 NCAA Chapel Hill Super Regional Game Two: North Carolina 9, East Carolina 3

Team Notes:

- East Carolina ends the season 46-20 overall and falls to 0-6 in three Super Regional series.
- ECU was outscored 19-4 in the series, marking the fewest runs in a Super Regional for the Pirates (previous: 5 vs. South Carolina in 2004).
- The Pirates fall to 50-82 all-time against nationally-ranked opponents since 1998.
- ECU reached double-digits in hits for the 47th time in 66 games with its 10 hits on the afternoon.
- The Pirates scored two of its three runs in the eighth inning with two outs to push its season total to 229, which was 40.5 percent of their run production (229-of-565). Also, the three runs in the eighth marked the 130th time this season they have plated at least two runs in an inning.
- The loss marks the end of six Pirates careers in the purple and gold (Trent Ashcraft, Stephen Batts, Britton Cole, Bailey Daniels, Brandon Henderson and Drew Schieber). The senior class combined for three NCAA regional appearances, three consecutive 40-plus win seasons, a C-USA regular season title and posted a 161-90 overall record.

Individual Notes:

- **Trent Whitehead** set the single-season record for hits in when he singled in the eighth to push his yearly total to 105 passing former Pirate standout Darryl Lawhorn (104 in 2002).
- **Ryan Wood** singled in the eighth to collect his 100th hit of the season and later scored on Henderson's base knock to finish his career with 225 runs, which extended his school record. He finished his career with 285 base hits, which is third all-time at ECU.
- **Kevin Brandt** allowed three runs on six hits in five-plus innings while striking out five. In three games against North Carolina, Brandt has allowed just two runs in 15 innings with 18 strikeouts, 11 hits and four walks. Brandt picked off Mark Fleury in the second inning at first, which was the fifth time this season he has picked off a runner tying Seth Maness for the team and Conference USA lead.
- **Seth Simmons** made his 33rd appearance out of the bull pen in the sixth, which ranks fifth on the single-season charts.
- **Brandon Henderson** drove in two runs in the eighth and pushed his career total 156, which ranks seventh all-time at East Carolina.
- **Kyle Roller's** RBI ground out in the eighth was the 75th of the season, which moved him into a tie for second on the single-season charts. He now has 155 for his career, good enough for eighth place on the school's all-time list.
