East Carolina Game Notes:

- East Carolina will face Binghamton in an elimination game Sunday at 2 p.m.
- ECU's 43-18 overall record is the best since the 2004 season when the Pirates posted a 50-11 slate through 61 games.
- All nine batters in the ECU starting lineup recorded a hit.
- ECU reached the double-digit mark in hits for the 43rd time this season with 14.
- Freshman Corey Thompson hit his first career home run. It was the Pirates' only extra base hit of the game. Thompson's home run was the team's 99th of the year, one shy of tying the school record of 100 set by the 2004 squad.
- Sophomore Trent Whitehead moved into second place on the school's single-season hits list with 99 and extended his hitting streak to a personal-best 14 games with his 2-for-5 performance.
- Junior Devin Harris collected his 18th multi-hit game of the season and second two-hit game of the day.
- Senior Drew Schieber and junior Jared Avchen each recorded two hits.
- Senior Ryan Wood extended his ECU career record for base on balls to 148.
- Pirate pitchers surrendered a season-high four home runs. It was just the sixth time that ECU allowed double digit runs.
- Seth Maness dropped his second consecutive start falling to 9-2 on the season. He worked 6 2/3 innings allowing six runs on 11 hits with three strikeouts and a walk. It was the 19th time in his career he has worked into the seventh inning in 29 starts
- The 10-run loss tied the Pirates' largest margin of defeat this season (lost to Georgia Southern, 14-4).
- **Attendance:** 4,595 (8th largest at Clark-LeClair Stadium).
- **Current Hit Streaks:** Trent Whitehead (14), Drew Schieber (8), Ryan Wood (7), Dustin Harrington (3). **Career Multi-Hit Games:** Drew Schieber (47), Devin Harris (19), Jared Avchen (12). **Career Multi-RBI Games:** Corey Thompson (1).

South Carolina Game Notes:

- South Carolina advances to the championship game Sunday at 6 p.m.
- The Gamecocks recorded their 10th consecutive 40-win season.
- The Gamecocks improved to 16-4 all-time against East Carolina.
- Freshman Adam Matthews recorded his first two-home run game of his career. It was the eighth time this season that a Gamecock player homered twice in a game. Matthews has hit three home runs in his past three games played.
- Matthews collected a season-high four hits.
- Junior Justin Dalles homered for the third time in the past seven games. Dalles recorded his second four-hit game of the year and 10th multi-hit game.
- Junior Justin Dalles hit two home runs in a game for the second time this season and registered a career-high seven RBIs. His seven RBIs are the most by a Gamecock player this season.
- Senior Andrew Crisp moved into a tie for third place on the school's all-time games played list (236).
