## C-USA NOTEBOOK

### EAST CAROLINA

East Carolina advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time since 2004, but dropped a pair of games at No. 5 North Carolina to end the season at 46-20. The 46 wins tied for the third-highest total in school history. The Pirates hosted the Greenville Regional and won it in dramatic fashion over No. 22 South Carolina in the championship game. Sophomore OF **Devin Harris** hit a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth to tie the game and then singled in the winning run in the 10th to give East Carolina a 10-9 win. East Carolina finished the year with a starting lineup that saw all nine players hit .311 or better, including three that batted over .352. ECU was led by senior All-American 2B **Ryan Wood's** .379 average. Sophomore OF **Trent Whitehead** had a league-high 105 hits and was second on the team with a .376 average. The Pirates scored 565 runs on the season, which broke the school record of 516 set in 1999. On the season, ECU hit 108 home runs, which is also a new school single-season mark (old record was 100 in 2004). The 108 homers are the second-most in C-USA history, trailing only the 128 hit by Tulane in 1998. Sophomore RHP **Brad Mincey** leads Conference USA with 10 victories, while sophomore RHP **Seth Maness** and freshman LHP **Kevin Brandt** are tied for second with nine. The Pirates placed a league-high seven players on the C-USA All-Conference team, including five first team selections. Junior RHP **Chris Heston** earned Newcomer of the Year honors, the second straight year that award has gone to an ECU pitcher (Justin Bristow in 2008). Heston was 7-0 with a 4.17 ERA and 88 strikeouts with just 32 walks.

### HOUSTON

The Cougars won a pair of games at the Conference USA Tournament before being eliminated by cross-town rival Rice in the first-ever meeting between the schools outside the state of Texas. Junior LHP **Donnie Joseph**, a first team All-Conference USA selection, earned saves in both of Houston's tournament wins and finished the season with 11 saves. The 11 saves tied for third on the school's single season list with **Chase Dempsay**, who saved 11 in 2008. Joseph led the team with 75 strikeouts in 50 innings pitched, while holding a 2.16 ERA. Junior LHP **Wes Musick** tied for the team lead in victories with five. He has 19 wins in three seasons and has registered more than twice as many strikeouts (219) as walks (103) over that time. Sophomore SS **Blake Kelso** topped the squad in batting average (.335), hits (85), runs scored (45) and doubles (16), while adding three triples and 23 RBI. Despite missing a month with a face injury when he was hit by a pitch, sophomore C **Chris Wallace** led the team in home runs (9), while adding 10 doubles and 34 RBI. The Cougars rebounded from a 3-14 opening start to the season by going 24-17 the rest of the way.

### MARSHALL

Marshall fell to Rice and Houston in the C-USA Championship to finish the season at 22-32. Sophomore C/1B **Victor Gomez** earned first team All-Conference USA honors after finishing the regular season with a league-high 18 home runs. The 18 home runs marked the fifth-highest single-season total in school history. He also batted .332 with 13 doubles and a team-best 62 RBI. Senior OF **Nate Lape** also hit double-digit home runs, smacking 11 round-trippers, while batting .284 with 36 RBI. Junior RHP **Austin Coan** tied the school record for saves with eight. Coan had 45 strikeouts (third on the team) and 23 walks in 38.2 innings pitched. Junior 3B **Josh Valle** batted a team-best .337 on the season with a team-high 14 doubles. He was even stronger in league action, where he hit .420 with 18 RBI in 24 games. Senior OF **Adam Yeager** ranked third in C-USA in stolen bases with 26 in 34 attempts. In only two seasons at Marshall, he holds the school record with 73 stolen bases.

### MEMPHIS

The Tigers closed out the season at 21-32 overall, 7-16 in league play. Outfielder OF **Drew Martinez** and second baseman **Adam McClain** both were named to the Conference USA All-Freshman team. Martinez led the team in batting average (.305) and on-base percentage (.390), while he hit 11 doubles and stole nine bases. He is the first freshman to lead a Memphis team in hitting since Shane Young hit .413 to lead the 1981 Tigers. McClain made 45 starts, batting .293 with 11 doubles, six homers and 26 RBI. He highlighted his rookie season with a Memphis-best 17-game hit streak (4/1-4/24) and hit safely in 25 of the last 28 games. Junior LHP **Brennon Martin** paced the Tiger pitching staff in victories with six, and posted a 4.24 ERA. He struck out 59 batters and walked just 18 in 83 innings pitched. Senior RHP **Matt Yokley** closed out his Tiger career with a school-record 18 saves.

### RICE

The Owls advanced to the Super Regionals for the fifth straight season, before dropping two games at No. 1 LSU. The Owls made their 15th consecutive NCAA appearance and hosted a regional for the eighth time in nine years. At 43-18, the Owls won 40 or more games for the 15th straight season. Rice went 4-0 at the C-USA Tournament, knocking off host Southern Miss in the championship game to earn a conference title (regular season or tournament) for the 14th consecutive season. Since its first Conference USA baseball season in the spring of 2006, Rice's regular-season record in C-USA league games is 81-15 (.844). Freshman 3B **Anthony Rendon** was the first player in league history to be named C-USA Freshman of the Year and Player of the Year. He also was named C-USA Tournament Most Valuable Player and *Collegiate Baseball* named him as its 2009 National Freshman of the Year. Rendon led the conference with a Rice freshman

record 20 home runs, is batting a league-high .388 and leads the Owls with 72 RBI (second in C-USA). Despite missing a month with an injury, junior RHP **Ryan Berry** finished 7-2 with a 2.42 ERA and 68 strikeouts with 19 walks in 81.2 innings pitched. He was named first team All-Conference USA for the third straight season. Sophomore LF **Michael Fuda** began the year hitting .120 in limited duty, but was inserted into the starting lineup around the start of conference play and raised his batting average to .359, second on the team.

### SOUTHERN MISS

After winning the Atlanta Regional and the Gainesville Super Regional, the Golden Eagles have advanced to the College World Series for the first time in school history. Southern Miss is the only number three seed to advance to the CWS or Super Regionals. USM, which reached the championship game of the C-USA Baseball Tournament for the third time in seven years before dropping a back-and-forth contest to Rice, 8-6, have won 12 of its last 15 games. Sophomore RHP **Todd McInnis** became the first Southern Miss player to be named C-USA Pitcher of the Year. He is 9-4 with a 3.61 ERA (fourth in C-USA) and 86 strikeouts to just 31 walks. McInnis ranked among the league leaders in several categories in conference play, including wins (tied for third with 4), innings pitched (fifth with 46.2) and strikeouts (fifth with 43). In 27 appearances, sophomore RHP **Collin Cargill** is 4-3 with a 3.32 ERA and a league-leading 13 saves. Outfielder **Kameron Brunty** was named to the C-USA All-Freshman team and has a team-best 23 multi-hit outings this year. He is second on Southern Miss with a .342 average and has never hit below .333 this season. Senior OF **Bo Davis** was named first team All-Conference USA and is hitting a team-high .371 with a team-best 14 home runs and 53 RBI. Davis hit three of the Golden Eagles 12 home runs in the Atlanta Regional and added another in the second game at Gainesville. Southern Miss was 23-12 when All-Conference senior SS **Brian Dozier** (.394, 13 2B, 4 HR, 39 RBI) was lost for the season with an injury. Without him in the lineup, Southern Miss went 5-9 in the first 14 games before winning 12 of its last 15.

### TULANE

The Green Wave won a pair of games at the C-USA Tournament, including eliminating regular season champion East Carolina, to finish the season at 34-25. Tulane finished tied for third place in the Conference USA standings and the Green Wave won their final six series' in C-USA play. Junior 1B **Sam Honeck** earned first team All-Conference USA honors after batting .313 with a team-best 16 home runs and 70 RBI. Freshman C **Jeremy Schaffer** was named to the All-Freshman team and earned first team All-C-USA honors. He finished a stellar rookie season batting .311 with eight doubles, 14 home runs and 54 RBI. Junior IF **Josh Prince** grabbed second team all-league honors after batting a team-best .353 with 15 doubles and a C-USA-leading 48 stolen bases. The 48 stolen bases tie him with former Tulane OF **Jonny Kaplan** (2003) rank for fourth on the league's single-season list. Sophomore RHP **Conrad Flynn** earned his team-leading eighth victory of the season in the C-USA Tournament. In 87 innings pitched this season, he has 58 strikeouts and only seven walks. Sophomore RHP **Nick Pepitone** led Tulane in saves with nine and sported a 3.26 ERA in 23 games for the Green Wave. In 511.2 innings pitched, Tulane's pitching staff struck out 391 batters while walking just 148.

### UAB

The Blazers won their opening game at the C-USA Tournament over Houston before falling to Rice and UH. UAB finished the season at 31-26, marking the first 30-win season by the Blazers since 2005. UAB has posted 30 wins in a season only twice in the last decade, winning 30 games in 2004 and 31 in 2005. The Blazers closed out the regular season by taking two-of-three games against then-No. 4 Rice, marking the highest-ranked opponent that the Blazers have ever won a series against. Senior OF **Brint Hardy** stole 46 bases, while being thrown out only three times. Despite playing just three seasons at UAB, he stole 88 bases, finishing only three stolen bases shy of the school's career record. Hardy was a first team All-Conference USA selection after batting .326 with 12 doubles, five home runs and 50 RBI. Junior C/DH **Digger Towe** earned second team all-league honors after leading the team in batting at .353, while adding 15 doubles, nine home runs and a team-best 61 RBI. As a team, UAB stole 114 bases this season, while only being caught stealing 21 times. Sophomore LHP **Shay Crawford**, who turned in an impressive performance in the opening round win over Houston, finished with a team-high 71 strikeouts and just 36 walks in 77 innings pitched.

### UCF

The Knights fell to East Carolina and Tulane at the C-USA Baseball Tournament and finished the season 22-35. UCF posted a 9-8 in its final 17 league games down the stretch en route to its highest win total in C-USA play since joining the league in 2006. Freshman C **Beau Taylor** was named to the All-Freshman team and batted .335 with 15 doubles, four homers and 23 RBI in just 42 games played. He also had a league-leading 23 runners caught stealing to his credit. Junior 2B **Shane Brown**, a second team All-C-USA selection, was UCF's top performer at the plate this season. He paced the club in batting average (.341), while smacking 20 doubles and driving in 44 runs. He also had a 22-game hitting streak, the second-longest in school history, from March 4-April 7. Senior 1B **Kiko Vazquez** (.305, 13 HR, 42 RBI) closed out his career ranked sixth on the school's career home run list with 29. This season's squad produced the most doubles (123) and the highest slugging percentage (.469) since the 2001 UCF team.

## C-USA BASEBALL AWARDS

Rice third baseman **Anthony Rendon** became the first player in Conference USA history to be named Freshman of the Year and Player of the Year in the same season to headline the league's top individual awards, as announced on Tuesday in Hattiesburg, Miss., the site of the 2009 Conference USA Baseball Championship. Southern Miss sophomore right-hander **Todd McInnis** was named the league's Pitcher of the Year, while Newcomer of the Year honors went to East Carolina junior right-hander **Chris Heston**. The Keith LeClair Coach of the Year award returned to the East Carolina family, as Pirate head coach **Billy Godwin** won the award that is named for the former ECU skipper who courageously battled ALS (Lou Gehrig's Disease) before his passing in 2006. Voting was done by a panel consisting of each head coach, each team's sports information director and a media representative from each city.

Regular season champion East Carolina had the most total All-Conference selections with seven, including a league-best five first-teamers. Rice had six total All-Conference picks, while Houston had four and Tulane and UAB each produced three. Seven of the league's nine teams had at least one representative on the first team. Memphis, Rice and UCF led the way with two selections apiece to the All-Freshman team, which included at least one player from eight schools.

## USM'S EWING NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

Southern Miss senior second baseman **James Ewing** has been selected as a second team Academic All-American by ESPN the Magazine and the College Sports Information Directors of America. It marks the ninth time in the last 12 years that Conference USA has had at least one baseball player earn Academic All-American honors.

Southern Miss' storybook ride through the NCAA tournament will continue in Omaha. The Golden Eagles stunned Florida in the second game of the Gainesville Super Regional, coming back from a five-run deficit to pull out a frantic 7-6 win Sunday, securing the first College World Series berth in program history.

The Golden Eagles win gives C-USA a team in the College World Series for the fifth straight season. Conference USA joins the Pac-10 and SEC as the only leagues to have a team in the C-USA field for each of the last five years.

For the first time in the league history, three Conference USA baseball teams advanced to NCAA Super Regional play. East Carolina and Rice joined Southern Miss in reaching Super Regional play, with the Pirates losing to No. 5 North Carolina and the Owls fallig at No. 1 LSU.

Conference USA was the only multiple-bid conference that advanced all of its teams into Super Regional play. Only the ACC and SEC join C-USA in having more than one team among the 16 squads that participated in Super Regionals.

\*East Carolina and Southern Miss hit more home runs (12 each) than any of the regional squads.

## QUICK NOTES ON C-USA IN 2009

\*For the fifth consecutive season, Conference USA will have a team in the College World Series. Southern Miss will be making the first appearance in school history, following Rice (2006-08) and Tulane (2005) in advancing to Omaha. C-USA is joined by the Pac-10 and SEC as the only conferences that have had a representative in the CWS in each of the last five seasons.

\*For the first time in the league history, three Conference USA baseball teams advanced to NCAA Super Regional play.

\*Two Conference USA teams hosted regionals for the first time. East Carolina hosted the Greenville Regional, while Rice hosted the Houston Regional.

\*For the first time in league history two different C-USA teams not only defeated, but shut out the No. 1 ranked team in the country in the same season. Rice defeated then-No. 1 Texas A&M, 2-0 on Feb. 28 and East Carolina blanked top-ranked North Carolina, 4-0 on Apr. 22.

\*Seven of the nine Conference USA baseball teams posted at least one win over a nationally-ranked non-conference opponent in 2009. Five teams have defeated at least one top 10 team.

\*Seven different players have been named All-Americans, while five different players were named Freshman All-Americans.

\*Four different C-USA players have been named National Players of the Week in 2009. East Carolina's Kyle Roller, Rice's Ryan Berry, UAB's Digger Towe and UCF's Shane Brown have each earned National POW accolades this season.

\*Two Rice players (Rick Hague and Anthony Rendon) and two Tulane players (Nick Pepitone and Jeremy Schaffer) have been invited to the Team USA tryouts, a team that will be coached by Tulane head coach Rick Jones.

\*Five different teams have won at least 31 games, two of the winningest teams in college baseball in East Carolina (46) and Rice (43).

## NCAA REGIONAL HOSTS

For the first time in league history, Conference USA had two schools host NCAA Baseball Regionals. Regular season champion East Carolina and tournament champion Rice both hosted and won regionals from Friday, May 29-Monday, June 1. Conference USA's regular season champion has hosted a regional in all but one year since the field was expanded to 64 teams in 1999.

East Carolina hosted a regional for the first time since 2004 when the regular season champion Pirates won the regional played in Kinston, N.C. It was the third time that ECU has hosted in regional play. Rice played host to an NCAA Regional for the eighth time in the last nine years.

## RICE'S RENDON NAMED NCBWA DISTRICT VII PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Rice freshman third baseman Anthony Rendon has been named the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association District VII Player of the Year, the organization announced today. The NCBWA awards District Player of the Year in nine districts around the country and District VII covers Texas, Arkansas and Louisiana. Rendon is the only freshman among this year's nine District Players of the Year and it marks the eighth time in nine years that C-USA has produced an NCBWA District Player of the Year.

Rendon won District VII Player of the Year honors after being named the 2009 National and Conference USA Freshman of the Year. He is the fifth Conference USA Player to earn National Freshman of the Year honors, following Rice's Ryan Berry (2007), East Carolina's Darryl Lawhorn (2002) and Tulane's Michael Aubrey (2001) and James Jurries (1999). Rendon, who was also a national semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy as well as the Golden Spikes Award, is the first player in Conference USA history to be named both the Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year in the same season.
