Virginia Cavaliers vs. East Carolina Pirates

Individual Notes:

- Consecutive starts streaks continued: James Pinkney (30), Eric Graham (27), Matt Butler (16-first at center), Kasey Ross (16) and Mark Robinson (16).
- Three Pirates recorded their first career starts: C.J. Wilson (DE), Jay Ross (DT), Cory Dowless (OG) and Kort Shankweiler (FB).
- Ryan Dougherty had three punts on the night for 167 yards. He recorded a career-long 72 yard punt in the first quarter. It was the longest since Jared Preston booted a 74-yarder against Houston (Nov. 9, 2002). For his career he now has 203 punts for 8,657 yards. Dougherty had six kickoffs for 369 yards with two touchbacks.
- Dougherty scored his second career TD on a fake FG attempt in the fourth quarter. First career TD was against Wake Forest (Sept. 20, 2003).
- Kort Shankweiler's seven-yard reception in the first quarter was the first of his career. He finished with three catches for 19 yards.
- James Pinkney tied a career-long rush of 25 yards in the first quarter. His five-yard TD run in the second quarter was the first of the season and the eighth of his career. He finished with 42 yards on ten carries. In the air he threw for 224 yards (17-of-30) marking the 20th time in his career that he reached the 200-plus plateau, which ties David Garrard for the second most in school history and trails Marcus Crandell (21).
- Brandon Fractious 20-yard run in the first quarter was a career-long. His 12 yard TD run in the second quarter was the first of the season and third of his career. He finished the game with 102 yards the second 100-plus performance of his career (107 vs. UCF Oct. 29, 2005).
- Brandon Simmons recorded his first career touchdown in the first quarter, a five-yard run up the middle. He had 17 rushes for 57 yards, both career-highs. He also hauled down his first career reception in the second quarter for 11 yards and finished with two catches for 18 yards.
- Bobby Good returned three punts for 27 yards with a career-long of 13.
- Jay Sonnhalter picked up his first career reception in the first quarter (22 yards). He finished the game with two receptions for 38 yards.
- Robert Lee extended his consecutive PAT streak to 42 games with four tries in the game tying Rob Imperato (1989-90) for the school record for consecutive PATs. On all levels he has made 70 straight PAT's (42-ECU and 28-Trinity Valley Community College). On the night he was 1-for-3 on FG attempts (32 made, 40 and 24 missed). For his career he is 22-for-27.
- Bobby Good extended his streak to ten games with at least one catch dating back to Oct. 22, 2005 (Memphis). He finished the game with five catches for 102 yards, the third of his career. The last time he had a 100-plus yard receiving game was on Nov. 26, 2005 (104 vs. UAB). His 44-yard reception in the second quarter was a season long.
- Kevin Roach extended his streak to eight games with at least one catch dating back to Nov. 12, 2005 (Tulsa) finishing with 26 yards on two catches.
- Scotty Robinson recorded his second career sack in the second quarter for a six-yard loss and finished with three total tackles.

- **Team Notes:**
- Attendance: 35,541
- ECU improves to 6-3 all-time against ACC opponents at home.
- ECU extended its streak to 105 games with out being shutout. The last time they were shutout was on Oct. 4, 1997 when Syracuse blanked the Pirates 56-0 in the Carrier Dome.
- ECU had five receivers with 10-plus yard receptions: Jay Sonnhalter (22, 16), Bobby Good (17, 44, 12, 24), Kevin Roach (17), Brandon Simmons (11), Phillip Henry (17).
- ECU rushed for 208 yards on the night marking the second time this season they eclipsed the century mark (177 vs. Memphis, Sept. 16, 2006).
- ECU's 24 first half points is the most during the Skip Holtz era and the most since they scored 38 against Army (Oct. 5, 2002).
- ECU's 17-point half-time lead is the largest since Oct. 5, 2002 vs. Army (38-17).
- ECU's 304 yards of total offense in the first half is the most since they had 376 vs. Cincinnati on Nov. 10, 2001.
- In the third quarter Ben Parziale blocked Ryan Dougherty's punt marking the first time since Wake Forest of last year (Sept. 17, 2005) that has happened.
- ECU's 9:02 TD drive in the fourth quarter is the longest TD drive of the season.
- With Brandon Fractious' 102-yards on the ground it marks the second time this year ECU has had a 100-yard rusher (Chris Johnson 106 vs. Memphis).
- ECU extended its streak to 16 consecutive games with at least 200-plus yards passing.
- ECU had 432 yards of total offense marking the fifth time in the last nine games they accomplished that feat.
- ECU had its six-game streak snapped where they forced at least two turnovers.
