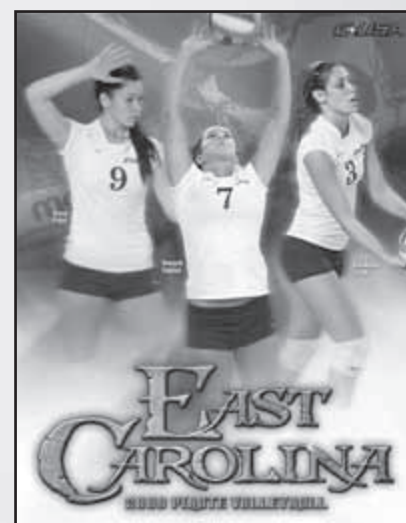

## Steve Ballard

*Chancellor*



**C**hancellor Steve Ballard, since his arrival in Greenville in May 2004, has focused on measures designed to enhance East Carolina University's role as the University For North Carolina. On an array of topics, from student success to research productivity to athletics, he has emphasized excellence and leadership.

While leading the fastest-growing university in North Carolina, Ballard has committed to providing every student with excellent training in the classroom, practical experiences in the community and region, and the opportunity to develop leadership

skills. He has hired nationally known leaders in athletics, research, finance, and diversity. He has overseen a record-breaking building boom on campus and the addition of over 500 new faculty positions. New campus facilities under his administration include the East Carolina Heart Institute, the Family Medicine Center, the new School of Dentistry, and over \$20 million in new athletic facilities.

His other strategic directions include providing classroom leaders for the 21st century for public schools in North Carolina and the rest of the nation; artistic and cultural leadership; economic development; and medical innovation.

Before joining East Carolina as the university's tenth chief executive, Ballard served as provost at the University of Missouri at Kansas City. Previous academic

appointments had taken him from Oklahoma to the East Coast.

Ballard spent his childhood in Galesburg, Illinois, then attended the University of Arizona, where he graduated with distinction in 1970 with a bachelor's degree in history. As shortstop and captain of the University of Arizona baseball team, he earned three varsity letters and played in the College World Series during his senior year.

His teaching and research have centered on leadership in the public sector, research and development and the innovation process, public policy, and the utilization of scientific and technical knowledge. He has authored five books and more than one hundred professional articles and manuscripts on such topics as innovation process, energy and natural resources, and managing growth and change.

## Terry Holland

*Athletics Director*



**A** glorious new era officially began at East Carolina University during the early autumn of 2004 with the naming of Terry Holland, a Clinton, N.C. native, to the athletic director's position – a selection which has already impacted the Pirate Nation with an unparalleled sense of energy, enthusiasm and optimism.

From campuses in Davidson to Charlottesville and Greenville, and in many basketball arenas across the nation and globe, Holland has created a legacy and earned a reputation as a well-respected leader in collegiate athletics for nearly four decades. In the aspect of athletics administration, he has left enduring marks as director of programs at Davidson and Virginia, and currently has ECU on the right course to reach unprecedented heights in both intercollegiate competition and academic success.

In just four-plus years, Holland's fingerprints are firmly secured on the revitaliza-

tion of a once-proud football tradition with the hiring of Skip Holtz as the head coach in December, 2004. Holtz has guided the Pirates to three consecutive bowl appearances and the program's first conference championship since 1976 after inheriting a program which had posted three consecutive losing seasons and a 3-20 ledger the previous two campaigns prior to his arrival. In addition, the on-the-field success has enabled East Carolina to enjoy unprecedented record-breaking numbers at the turnstiles as well – breaking stadium standards for total attendance (2007) and average attendance (2008) in back-to-back seasons.

The renewed passion and spirit has resulted in unmatched internal and external support as Pirate Club membership has soared past 12,000 and fund-raising scholarship dollars climbed above \$5.0 million for the first time in department history.

Holland started at Virginia on April 1, 1974 as head men's basketball coach, and over the next 16 seasons became the most successful coach in Cavalier history, with a record of 326-173. He helped lead the

Cavaliers to a pair of Final Four appearances (1981 and 1984) and a National Invitational Tournament title (1980) while earning two Atlantic Coast Conference Coach-of-the-Year awards.

In 1990, he returned to his alma mater, Davidson College, to become its athletic director, but five years later he was back in Charlottesville to take on the athletic director duties at Virginia.

Holland has remained active in basketball circles over the years. He was a member of the powerful NCAA Basketball Committee, chairing the panel in 1997. He served on the Senior National Team Committee of USA Basketball from 1992 through 1996, and currently chairs the organization's Collegiate Committee, which he has served on since 1997.

Holland, an avid fishing enthusiast, was born April 2, 1942 in Clinton, N.C. He and wife Ann are the parents of two daughters, Kate (36, a 1995 graduate of Wake Forest) and Ann-Michael (33, a 1997 graduate of Virginia). They are also grandparents of two boys, Holland and Harrison, born to Kate and her husband Steve Baynard.



# East Carolina University

## Points East

For more than 100 years, East Carolina University has been quietly fulfilling its mission of service.

Hand in hand with the people of its region, ECU values where it has been and what the future holds.

Through partnerships with local government, educational and health-care institutions, and the private sector, the university is building on everyday successes with the promise of many more to come. Today, as it reflects on the past century and the breakthroughs and achievements that have



touched North Carolinians and citizens beyond, it continues to prepare more professional educators, nurses, and allied-health practitioners than any other university in North Carolina. The Brody School of Medicine, distance-education programs, and innovative research help attract more students to the university and send them into their chosen fields as talented professionals and leaders.

Below is a sampling of the university's recent achievements, triumphs and distinctions. East Carolina University. Tomorrow starts here.

- ECU is in the midst of the most far-reaching fund-raising campaign in its history, with a goal of \$200 million by 2013. The funds will be used to, among other goals, build scholarship and research programs, create distinguished professorships, and construct new facilities.
- ECU officials broke ground last fall on the new Family Medicine Center, which will have more than 60 exam rooms, a pharmacy, laboratory, a geriatric center, better parking and other amenities. It's projected to open in late 2010.
- Some of ECU's facilities hosted stops during the 2008 presidential campaigns. Democratic candidates Barack Obama and Joe Biden visited campus during the presidential primaries and in the fall, respectively. Republican vice-presidential candidate Sarah Palin also headlined a rally at the university.
- Academic Analytics ranked ECU's communication sciences and disorders program and the kinesiology, exercise science, and rehabilitation program fourth and ninth, respec-

tively, in the nation. The 2007 index compiled national rankings for faculty productivity for 375 universities that have PhD programs.

- The ECU Brody School of Medicine and Eastern Neurosurgical and Spine Associates have merged, a move expected to improve services for patients in the East, as well as expand research into the neurosciences.

- The Wright Fountain, a centerpiece of ECU's campus and history, has been rebuilt with structural and aesthetic improvements. It was rededicated on March 30. The original fountain was dedicated in 1932 to Robert H. Wright, the university's first president, and rededicated to Martin L. Wright in 1951.

Two graduate programs at ECU have been named by U.S. News & World Report in the magazine's annual best graduate schools edition. The ECU College of Nursing is listed in the nursing programs section, and the ECU College of Education is listed in the library science programs.

## Outreach

- Carmen Russoniello, a professor of recreational therapy and director of the Psychophysiology Lab and Biofeedback Clinic, is using a new program to help Marines recover from issues ranging from balance problems to Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder. The program brings six soldiers to ECU and allows a therapist to visit wounded soldiers at Camp Lejeune.
- ECU established its first diversity-based scholarship offered through a college, thanks to an endowment gift by alumnus and Trustee Danny Scott. The \$2,300 scholarship will be awarded annually to a College of Business student who not only has the financial need but also contributes to education diversity and shows academic excellence. The first recipient was announced in April 2009.
- A \$1.2 million grant from the National Science Foundation is enabling ECU to support a three-year program called TechMath to link businesses and higher education with underserved high school students and their

teachers in rural northeastern North Carolina. More than 30 local business partners will participate in the program that benefits 70 high school teachers and 70 students from 10 counties.

- Jacquelyn Sauls, an ECU pediatric hematology and oncology specialist, directs Rainbow Services programs that allow children to exchange the anxiety of having an illness with sailing, swimming, and canoeing. Camp Rainbow and Camp Hope took in about 80 children with a variety of sicknesses, including cancer, hemophilia, and sickle-cell disease.
- An ECU professor organized and drew nearly 100 people to the Fourth Annual Congenital Heart Disease Awareness Day in Greenville, including teenagers and children with congenital heart disease. Parents also got to meet with health professionals from Pitt County Memorial Hospital and the American Heart Association.
- In eastern North Carolina, 122 new homeowners in 18 counties benefited from ECU's "Upgrade & Save" heating-efficiency program and collectively saved nearly \$80,000. Administered by professor Leslie Pagliari, the program switches out standard electric furnaces and air-conditioning units with energy-efficient heat pumps.

## Research

- Rickey Hicks, professor and chair of the Thomas Harriot College of Arts and Sciences' chemistry department, was awarded more than \$400,000 to research peptides that could be used to treat infections resulting from bacterial and biological warfare agents. Hicks is working with the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research in Silver Spring, Maryland. The research is funded by the Defense Threat Reduction Agency.
- Five ECU maritime studies graduate students traveled to Stockholm, Sweden, to help catalog the Vasa, an ill-fated 17th-century royal Swedish warship. The work is part of a project between the ECU maritime studies program and the Swedish National Maritime Museums.
- ECU researchers were awarded more than \$2 million in the form of nine grants by the National Institutes of Health to continue research that studies pancreatic cancer and cell transport to aspects of the metabolic process in diabetes.

- Nearly a decade of research landed Kathleen Row, chair of ECU's psychology department, a spot in PBS's documentary, *The Power of Forgiveness*. Row has studied how forgiveness can affect a person in more ways beyond spirituality. When participants were questioned about a time when someone had wronged them, their heart rates and blood pressures went up. Those levels were quicker to return to normal for subjects who had practiced forgiveness.
- ECU biologist Kyle Summers published research that shows a link between evolution and schizophrenia—genes linked to the condition are more likely to show evidence of natural selection than those not associated with the disease. Summers' findings were published in the *Proceedings of the Royal Society of London*.
- An ECU biologist was part of a team that surveyed local vegetation and the possible effects of climate and environmental changes. The team's goal is to create permanent plots featuring vegetation and soil that can be studied over time and after natural occurrences, such as hurricanes.
- A five-year grant is helping Brody School of Medicine researchers find ways to control *Pseudomonas aeruginosa*, a bacterium responsible for nearly 10 percent of hospital and chronic lung infections in nearly 90 percent of patients with cystic fibrosis. The National Institutes of Health awarded the \$1.6 million grant.
- ECU researchers and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration teamed up to study three German submarines wrecked off the coast. The U-boats were sunk in 1942 during the Battle of the Atlantic. The vessels were surveyed and photographed without

disturbing the wreckage.

- Dr. Charles Ewen, East Carolina professor of anthropology and director of the ECU Archaeology Laboratories, and a group of graduate students found the remains of a 1740s-era brick cellar in Bath, North Carolina. A Bath history buff, Ewen considers this find important to mapping the original town founded in 1705. So far, Ewen and his students have covered more than two-thirds of Bath.

### Faculty

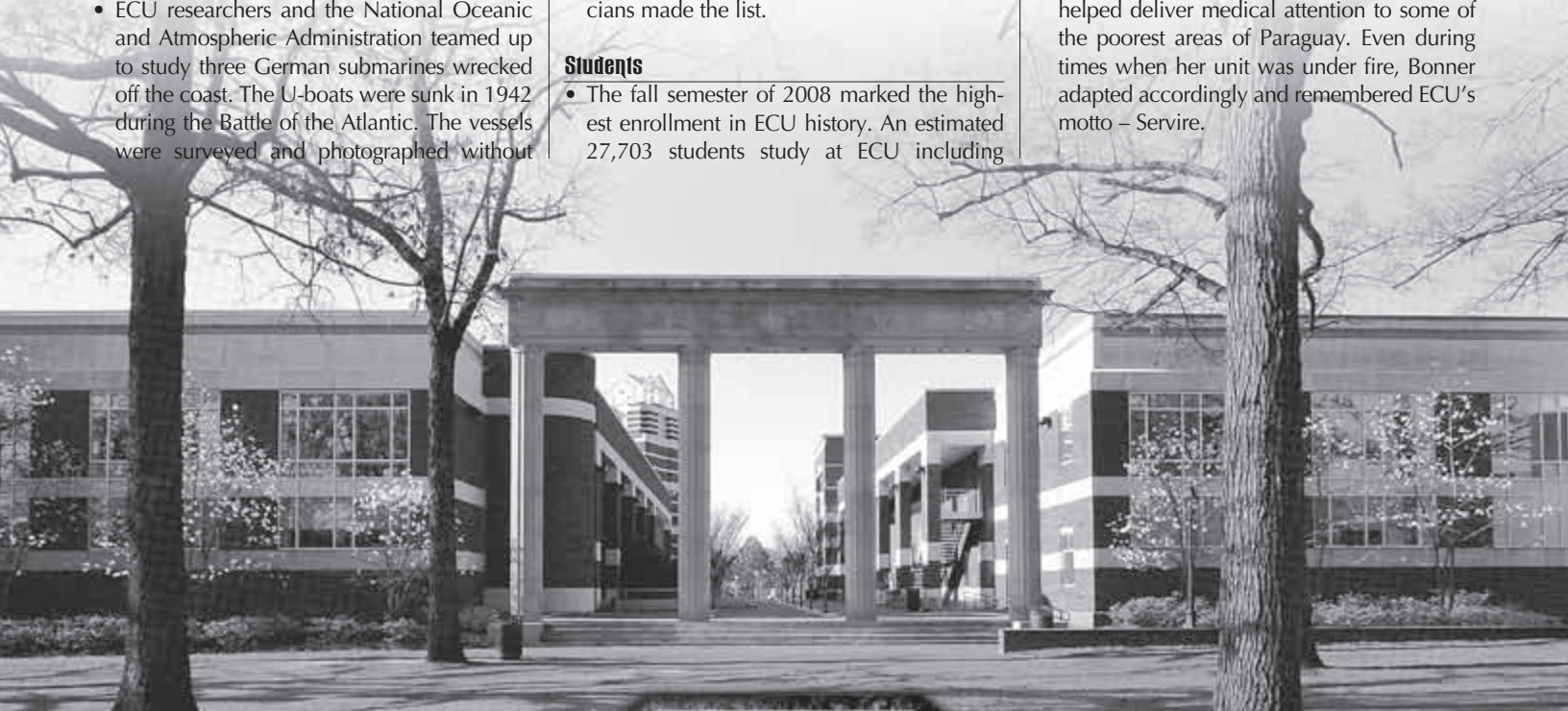
- Two ECU finance professors—Stanley Eakins, associate dean for the College of Business, and Samuel Tibbs, an associate professor—won the 2008 Charles H. Dow Award from the Market Technicians Association for their work in exploring trends in the stock market. The award also honored the paper's co-author, William DeShurko, president of the Ohio-based 401 Advisor, LLC.
- Jody Baumgartner, assistant professor of political science and an expert on the vice presidency of the United States, was invited to Washington to have dinner with Vice President Joe Biden and several other faculty members from around the nation.
- Best Doctors Inc. chose more than 30 physicians from ECU's Brody School of Medicine to include in their 2007–2008 "Best Doctors" list. The group surveys more than 30,000 physicians in the United States. Approximately 5 percent of North Carolina physicians made the list.

### Students

- The fall semester of 2008 marked the highest enrollment in ECU history. An estimated 27,703 students study at ECU including

20,882 undergraduates, 6,535 graduates, and 6,190 distant education students. East Carolina also achieved a 20 percent minority student enrollment.

- An estimated 3,400 students received diplomas from ECU after completion of the 2008 spring semester. Of the graduates, 2,400 were undergraduates, 910 were graduates/professionals, and 74 were awarded medical degrees. East Carolina's first physical therapy doctoral students and the country's first three medical family therapy doctoral students were also awarded degrees.
- Six students from the Brody School of Medicine at East Carolina University have received Schweitzer Fellowships for 2009. The students, who have finished their first year of medical school, commit to a year of service with a community agency, devoting more than 800 hours to local communities lacking access to adequate health services.
- Thirteen ECU construction management students traveled to China before the 2008 Beijing Olympics to study the architecture of the country. The students learned that their degree from one of the best construction management programs in the southeastern United States could land them jobs all over the world.
- ECU education student Ashley Bonner was awarded the Air Force Commendation Medal from the 916th Aerospace Medicine Flight for her service in a Paraguay trip with the U.S. Air Force Reserve. Bonner helped deliver medical attention to some of the poorest areas of Paraguay. Even during times when her unit was under fire, Bonner adapted accordingly and remembered ECU's motto – *Servire*.



# Greenville, N.C.



Cited as one of the 50 “Best Towns in America” and one of the 50 Best Metro Areas for Quality of Life, Greenville is the commercial, educational, medical, and cultural center of eastern North Carolina. As a university community with a strong business/manufacturing base, the area is characterized by a diversified economic base, a low cost of living, an excellent educational system, a large regional health care complex, abundant cultural and recreational opportunities, and a mild climate.

Greenville is one of the fastest growing cities in the state. Founded as the Town of Martinsborough,

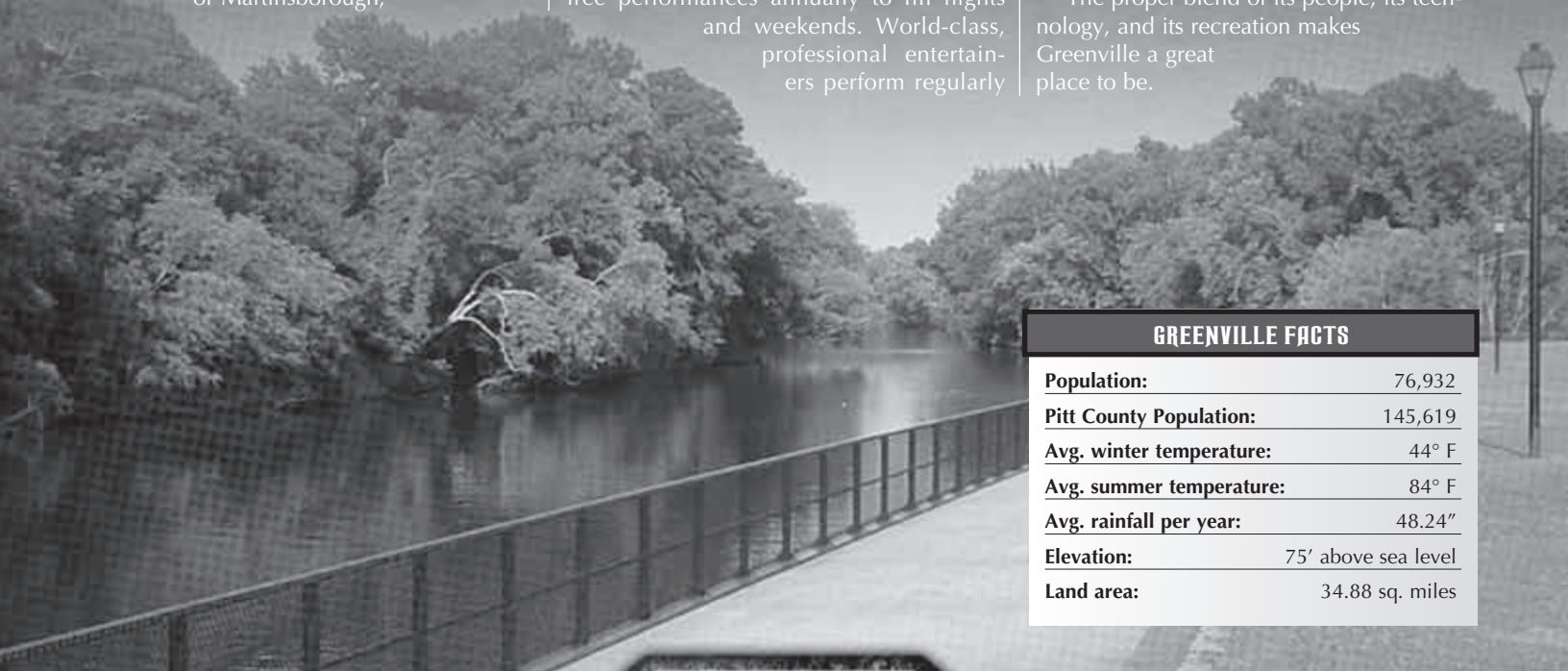
Greenville has seen its population grow from just over 29,000 in 1970 to nearly 80,000 in 2009.

One of the most unique characteristics of the area is the wide assortment of leisure and cultural activities. Parks, rivers, golf courses, historic old towns, coastal sounds, and the famous beaches of the Outer Banks offer many recreational outlets. The presence of the School of Music and the School of Art at ECU provides the cultural diversity of a major metropolitan area. Local amateur musical, theatrical, and dance groups offer more than 200 free performances annually to fill nights and weekends. World-class, professional entertainers perform regularly

in clubs and concert facilities. The Wellington B. Gray Gallery on campus and the Greenville Museum of Art house excellent permanent exhibits as well as hosting traveling exhibitions.

Greenville citizens enjoy outdoor recreation all year long thanks to a moderate climate. There are four distinct seasons, none too harsh to enjoy. Winters are short and usually mild, with the average January temperature around 45 degrees. The long summer is not too hot due to a gentle east ocean breeze making the average July temperature 86 degrees.

# Athletic Facilities

## Bagwell Field at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium



Dr. Leo Jenkins announced the original plan for ECU's current football facility on Oct. 7, 1961. Within a year, \$283,387 had been raised. With the funds in hand, Ficklen Stadium was built. The James Skinner Ficklen Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Sept. 21, 1963, as East Carolina defeated Wake Forest, 20-10.

The original stadium consisted of the permanent stands on the south side, a small press box, and the old lighting system, which was removed after the 1974 season. Total cost was \$300,000.

After graduating in the early 1970s, Al and Debby Bagwell have been gracious friends of the university with Al serving on the Pirate Club's Executive Committee in 1994-95 and being appointed to the University's Board of Visitors in 1998. The couple from Lake Gaston, Va., was honored in 1997 for their gift to the Pirate Club's Shared Visions Campaign. For their contributions, the Bagwell's had their name become a permanent mark on the ECU landscape as the field is now and forever will be recognized as Bagwell Field at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

## Minges Coliseum



After a complete \$12 million renovation process in the mid-1990s, Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum is now one of the top facilities for athletic events in the state and also has been the site of concerts, graduations, and many more events. The arena serves as the site for the North Carolina High School Athletic Association Eastern Regional Boy's Basketball Championships each year. The National Basketball Association and World Wrestling Entertainment have also visited Minges Coliseum.

The Pirate men and women's basketball teams train and compete in the arena, along with the volleyball squad. A second-story walkway across to the new Murphy Center allows easy access to games for recruits and special guests of the Pirate family.

## Lewis Field at Clark-LeClair Stadium



The newest gem on the ECU campus is Clark-LeClair Stadium, which arguably rates as one of the top collegiate baseball facilities in the nation. Construction began in May of 2004 and was completed in March of 2005. The design plan for the new facility, which was built on the old site of Harrington Field, increased its permanent seating capacity to 3,000 seats.

With an estimated price tag of \$11 million, Clark-LeClair Stadium nearly doubled Harrington Field's capacity of approximately 1,750 (excluding outfield areas). Among the features are an indoor batting tunnel, a VIP booth, picnic areas, coaches' offices and a new scoreboard (which was installed in February 2004). Player amenities include a spacious clubhouse and video system. To accommodate the writers and broadcasters covering the Pirates, a state-of-the-art press box features a main level, a TV booth, two radio booths, a Pirate Club deck and wireless internet connections.

## Ironwood Country Club



Ironwood is home of the East Carolina men's and women's golf program. The Lee Trevino Signature Golf Course is a true testament to Trevino's philosophies of golf course design and playability. The strategically placed rolling mound and delicate undulations of the bent grass greens take a step back in time, to the designers of the past that

knew golf was a game to be enjoyed by players of all skill levels. Our five tee choices assures that the beginning golfer experiences a fun, memorable round while our back tee give the best golfers a true challenge of their skills.

The Pirates practice their long game on a private practice tee on the far end of the range and will soon enjoy a practice putting green and chipping/pitching green designed exclusively for the Pirate golfers in 2008.

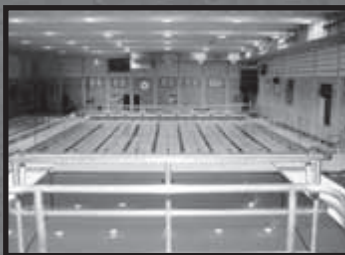

## Ward Sports Medicine Building



Ward Sports Medicine Building houses all athletic administrative offices and the Human Performance Laboratory as well as football, and men's and women's basketball offices. The sports medicine center, football locker room, ECU Athletics Hall of Fame and student development center are also located inside the three-story, 82,095-square foot structure.

## Minges Aquatic Center



Once host to several Olympic-style meets, Minges Natatorium still packs in several hundred for each Pirate home swim meet. With a diving well, electronic timing system and adjacent locker rooms, Minges Aquatic Center is one of the finest in the East.

## Bunting Field



The Pirates saw the completion of a new \$30,000 track prior to the 2000 outdoor season, which led to ECU holding the Pirates' first home track meet in more than 25 years. Bunting Field is also the home of the ECU women's soccer program.

# Strength and Conditioning



The Murphy Center, still considered one of the athletic department's newest facilities, is located between Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium and Minges Coliseum. It's one of the largest and best-equipped strength and conditioning centers in the country.

ECU's Board of Trustees approved the project in the spring 1997, thus putting it into the athletics department staff's hands to make this 52,475-square-foot, two-story strength and conditioning/Pirate Club multipurpose center a reality.

ECU's strength and conditioning programs for its student-athletes are based out of the 22,000-square-foot first floor of the \$13 million facility. The weight room has revolutionized the Pirates' strength and conditioning efforts.

The center opened for workouts in June 2002 and was dedicated at ECU's home football game on September 14, 2002.

"This is one of the top weight rooms in the country", says Director of Strength and



Conditioning Mike Golden. "It just shows the commitment that East Carolina has for its student-athletes. No expense was spared in the development of this facility. It consists of top of the line strength and speed equipment, a 50-meter four-lane indoor track, a turf area for agilitys, and another turf section for plyometric training. It has everything."

The second floor of the building features a

private dining area for recruits as well as a 9,000-square-foot banquet hall and a large terrace with a view of the football stadium for Pirate Club functions.

Scattered throughout the facility is a stunning array of photomurals, sports memorabilia and trophies.

Because of its location behind the Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium endzone and its connection to Minges Coliseum, the Murphy Center is an ideal place for Pirate Club members to socialize at both football and basketball games.

## ECU STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING

East Carolina University's volleyball student-athletes train for competition under the direct supervision of Director of Strength & Conditioning Mike Golden. The strength staff consists of assistants Danny Wheel, Nate Barnes and Mike Yartin.

Golden and his staff conduct workouts in the 22,000-square-foot weight room located inside the Murphy Center. The facility, which opened in spring 2002, more than tripled the size of the Pirates' previous workout area.

The objectives of the ECU Strength & Conditioning Program are to help in the development of speed, power, and strength. The weight room also plays a key role in injury prevention and rehabilitation, working hand in hand with the school's athletic training staff. The staff feels that a stronger, faster, and more powerful athlete will be better equipped to compete at the highest levels of NCAA competition.



# Student Development



At East Carolina University, athletic and academic excellence are inseparable goals for student-athletes. The University is committed to the academic success and graduation of students participating in its athletic programs. The Department of Athletics supports this commitment with extensive academic support services in order to maximize the success of every student-athlete.

Under the direction of the ECU Student Development Staff, Pirate student-athletes have reached new heights in academic achievement during the past few years, including having 10 student-athletes named to Verizon CoSIDA Academic All-America teams.

The ECU Athletics Department is committed to its Student Development Program and the understanding that student-athletes become well-rounded in all aspects of life. The primary goals for the Student Development Program are:

- *To support in the efforts of every student-athlete who attends ECU to earn a degree.*
- *To provide assistance for the student-athlete in the development of values, emphasizing the qualities of leadership.*
- *To enhance the interpersonal relationships and communication skills of the student-athlete.*
- *To facilitate the fulfillment of career and life goals of each student-athlete.*
- *To safeguard the academic integrity of the University by insuring compliance with all rules of the University and the NCAA.*

The NCAA and the Division I-A Athletic Directors Association have developed a life skills program for student-athletes to help them bridge the gap between college and the years after graduation.

The mission of the CHAMPS (Challenging Athletes Minds for Personal Success) program is to provide a personal development program designed to reach each student-athlete based on his or her individual needs. The focus of the program is on the student-athlete, as a whole person—academically, athletically and emotionally—and on their changing needs and skills during college and in the years after graduation.

Ultimately, the CHAMPS program is designed to help student-athletes realize higher academic achievement, a higher level of maturity, self-responsibility and greater overall success. As a participant in this program, ECU is dedicated to carrying out all the program's goals and commitments.

Among the Academic Development Services available for student-athletes are tutorial programs, study halls, academic skills development, and orientation. Additional programs such as leadership development seminars, a speaker's bureau and community service programs are an important part of the student development program.

The athletics department has set up several prestigious awards for ECU student-athletes. For the past nine years, PCS Phosphate has sponsored the ECU Outstanding Scholar-Athlete Award. The award is presented annually to a male and female athlete who best exemplifies both academic and athletic success. PCS Phosphate also recognizes an All-Academic team selected from the highest cumulative GPAs of each team.

Student-athletes also serve on the Student-Athlete Advisory Council, which is an advisory organization for the Office of Student Development and the Department of Athletics.

# Head Coach Pati Rolf

First Season • North Dakota State, '92



**P**ati Rolf enters her first season as head coach for the East Carolina volleyball program.

Rolf brings 21 years of head coaching experience to the Pirates, the last seven as head coach at Big East Conference member Marquette University. Her 412 career victories make her one of only 45 active coaches at the NCAA Division I level with at least 400 total wins.

Rolf is the 11th head volleyball coach in ECU history and directly succeeds Chris Rushing, who compiled a 68-59 (.535) overall record in four seasons.

Rolf compiled a 103-101 overall record, including a 49-46 mark in conference play, during her seven-year stay at Marquette. From 2004 to 2006, she led the Golden Eagles to three-straight winning seasons for the first time in program history and guided MU to the Big East Tournament semi-finals in 2006 and the Conference USA Tournament finals in 2004. Her 2004 squad also finished with 22 wins, the highest total in the program's Division I history.

Prior to her stint at MU, Rolf spent 14 years heading the University of Minnesota-Duluth program, where she compiled an overall record of 310-169 (.647). Her 310 wins rank among the top 25 in Division II history.

The four-time Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) Coach-of-the-Year guided the Bulldogs to a 165-20 (.892) NSIC record, a mark which also included 11 league titles. She led UMD to the NCAA Division II Regional Tournament three times (1991, 1994 and 1998) and averaged 22 wins a season during her 14 campaigns.

Prior to her stint at UMD, Rolf served as both the head coach at Fargo North High School in North Dakota (1987-88) and the head coach/director of the Red River Valley Junior Program in Moorhead, Minn. (1984-88).

Rolf has also gained coaching experience at the Junior Olympic level, serving as an assistant at both the 1992 and 1993 USA Volleyball Women's Junior Elite Camp in Colorado Springs and at the 1994 U.S. Olympic Festival in St. Louis.

Her commitment to understanding all facets of the game enabled Rolf to receive her Federation Internationale de Volleyball (FIVB) International Officiating Certificate in 2003, making her just one of 15 female international officials in the world. The Professional Association of Volleyball Officials (PAVO) Hall of Fame member has been a registered national volleyball official since 1990 and worked as a line judge in both the men's and women's volleyball competitions (including the women's gold medal match) at the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta.

In the summer of 2004, Rolf also officiated matches in St. Petersburg, Russia and at the World Military Games. In the summer of 2005, she served as an official at the 2006 World Championships Qualifying Tournament in Guatemala. The summer of 2007 saw her officiate at the Pan American Games in Brazil before Rolf gained even more experience by working a FIVB World League matchup between China and the United States in 2009.

A native of Hopkins, Minn., Rolf was a four-year volleyball letterwinner at North Dakota State University (1981-84) where she graduated with a bachelor's degree in university studies. As a senior, she captained the Bison

while gaining NCAA Division II All-Region and All-North Central Conference (NCC) honors. She distinguished herself in the classroom as well, earning NCC All-Academic honors twice. In October of 1999, she was inducted into the NDSU Athletic Hall of Fame.

By the time her career had concluded, Rolf set a NCAA Division II career record for matches played (239). She did not sit out a single set during those four seasons.

On May 8, 2006, Rolf added yet another honor to her resume as she was part of Hopkins (Minn.) High School's first Hall of Fame class. Rolf was a multi-sport letterwinner in the early 1980s at Hopkins and earned the Athena Award as the schools' top female athlete.

Rolf served on the board of directors of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) from 1995 through 1998 and has been a member of the National Ranking Committee since 1993. Additionally, she served on the Duluth Public Schools Board of Education from 1998-2002 and has been on the North Dakota State Alumni Association Board of Directors since 2009.

Rolf and her husband, Kent, are the parents of two children - son Graydon (22) and daughter Madison (15).



## Assistant Coach Katie Virtue

*Ohio State, '03 • First Season*

**V**irtue joins the volleyball program as an assistant coach for the 2009 season. A 2003 graduate of Ohio State University, she brings impressive credentials to ECU. As a setter and captain for the Buckeyes, Virtue quickly made her mark on the program, earning Big Ten Freshman-of-the-Year, league All-Freshman Team and *Asics/Volleyball Magazine* Freshman All-America accolades in 1999. She also garnered designation as a Big Ten All-Conference selection from 2000-02 as well as Asics Volleyball All-America status (2001), National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA) All-America honors (2002) and a Big Ten Sportsmanship Award nod (2002).



Verizon Academic All-District Second-Team status in 2001 and was a member of the National Society of Collegiate Scholars and Ohio State Dean's List.

Virtue boasts professional playing experience, having competed for Club Voleibol Sant Cugat in Sant Cugat, Spain while also representing the United States in the Sibillini Italian Tournament (2000-05), where she served as team captain, squad liaison and translator. Additionally, Virtue spent time with the United States national team in 2007.

Displaying a passion for developing younger players, Virtue donated time as a coach and counselor for the USA, Ohio State, Notre Dame, Nebraska and All-American volleyball camps while founding the "Setting with Virtue" program for high school students in 2006. She polished her craft as the head coach at St. Francis Desales High School (Columbus, Ohio) during the 2006-07 school year and turned in stints as an assistant at Schaumburg High School (Ill.), St. Francis High School (Ill.), Wheaton Warrenville South High School (Ill.) and New



Albany High School (Ohio).

Virtue earned her bachelor's degree in business administration with emphasis in marketing from Ohio State in 2003 while returning to the institution for her master of arts in counselor education in 2006.

## Assistant Coach Kelley Wernert

*East Carolina, '08 • First Season*

**W**ernert, a 2008 graduate of East Carolina, enters the coaching profession after turning in one of the best careers in Pirate program history. She is the all-time leader in kills with 1,620, sits 16th on the Conference USA career kill ledger and owns the school's top single-season kill mark, putting down 627 as a senior (2007). That final season, Wernert broke the Pirate single-match kill total with 31 at UNC Wilmington, earning her *CVU.com* National Player-of-the-Week honors. She also led ECU in kills, kills per game, attempts, service aces,



solo blocks, total blocks and points per game and was second in blocks per set. Additionally, Wernert turned in a Pirate career-best 27 double-doubles and notched double-digit kills in 28-consecutive matches and 60 of her last 64.

The former AAU All-American set up her senior campaign by turning in a strong junior year, which resulted in her selection to the All-Conference First Team. Wernert would repeat that performance in her final season while also garnering C-USA Preseason Team selection.

Marking its 15-year milestone during the 2009-10 season, Conference USA is still going strong. All C-USA institutions sponsor Division I-A football, along with several other men's and women's athletic programs, many of which compete regularly for NCAA Championships. C-USA sponsors competition in 19 sports - nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, tennis and indoor and outdoor track and field) and 10 for women (basketball, cross country, golf, softball, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field and volleyball).

The league sponsors numerous academic awards, including the Commissioner's Honor Roll and the Commissioner's Academic Medal, indicative of outstanding achievement in the classroom. C-USA annually awards 12 post-graduate scholarships, along with the Sport Academic Award, Scholar Athletes of the Year and the Institutional Academic Excellence Award.

The league has also had six national champions in NCAA track and field competition, one national champion in diving and numerous NCAA individual and team competitors in cross country, golf, swimming, tennis and track and field. Overall, Conference USA teams and individuals have made more than 500 NCAA appearances.

### Success Off The Field

C-USA institutions are among the nation's

best in academic performance among student-athletes, bolstered by the fact that student-athletes at league schools have a higher graduation rate than the general student population. Among C-USA's 5,000 student-athletes, there are champions off the playing field as well. In 14 years, 130 student-athletes earned national ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America honors, while 461 were named All-District. In addition, more than 17,000 student-athletes have been named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll or received the Commissioner's Academic Medal, indicative of outstanding achievement in the classroom.

### C-USA On TV

C-USA enjoys significant television exposure through its partnerships with ESPN Inc. and CBS College Sports Television Networks. The league entered into long-term agreements with both ESPN and CBS College Sports, which, combined, provides C-USA with significant national and regional exposure for football, men's and women's basketball, and all other conference sports. Additionally, the CBS College Sports agreement includes video-on-demand, Internet, broadband, national over-the-air and satellite radio, and wireless distribution as well as corporate marketing rights, and website production through CBS Interactive. The agreement with ESPN extends the conference's current regular season football package to include the broadcast of the conference's Football Championship Game. It also encompasses distribution of men's basketball and women's basketball on ESPN/ESPN2 and both tournament championship games.

### C-USA In The Community

The conference's footprint is concentrated with 12 members in nine states and a combined area population of nearly 17 million. More than 1.1 million living alumni represent C-USA schools across the nation. With a renewed commitment to community involvement, the conference has begun development of several initiatives to maintain strong ties in C-USA cities, as well as with fans and alumni across the country. C-USA schools also place a priority on giving back to their communities through volunteer service with local and national organizations.

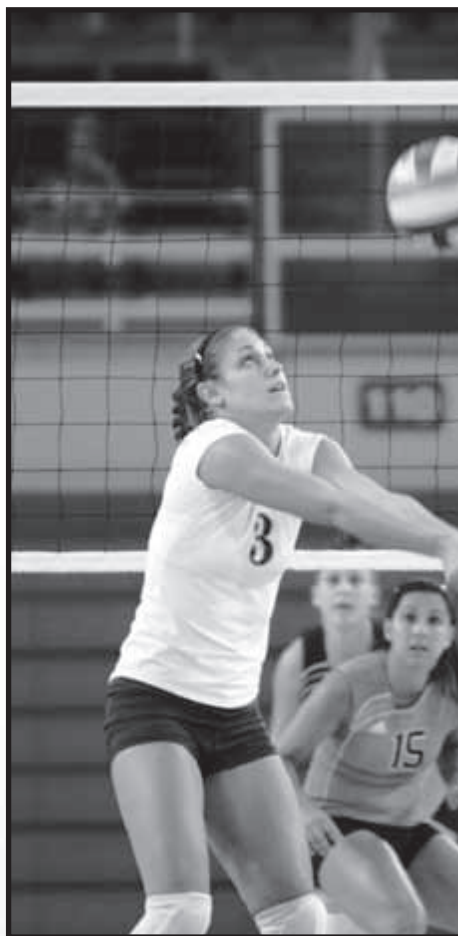

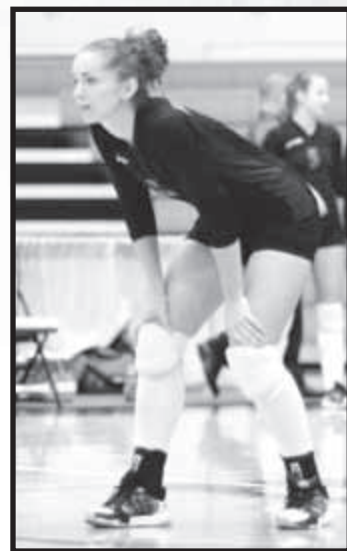
