Emmanuel College is pleased to announce the introduction of men's lacrosse. Lacrosse will be played at the club level in the spring of 2011 in preparation for NCAA competition in 2012.

"The addition of men's lacrosse allows Emmanuel to take full advantage of our new home field and offer a program in a sport that is one of the fastest growing in the country," said Pam Roecker, director of athletics and recreation.

Men's lacrosse will bring the total number of varsity programs at Emmanuel to 17 in 2011-2012 – nine women's and eight men's. The team will compete in the Great Northeast Athletic Conference (GNAC) and call the newly renovated Roberto Clemente Field home. As of 2011-12 there will be nine schools in the conference offering varsity men's lacrosse (seven GNAC and two associate members). In 2013 the winner of the GNAC conference will receive an automatic bid to the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament.

Emmanuel College has appointed Brendan McWilliams as the new head coach to lead the program in its inaugural season. Coach McWilliams comes to Emmanuel College after coaching stints at Tufts University, the University of Vermont, and most recently as the head coach at Kenyon College.

"I am extremely excited at the opportunity to continue my coaching career at Emmanuel College," said McWilliams. "For the student-athlete who is looking for a first-rate college experience in the heart of Boston, as well as the opportunity to play Division III college lacrosse, Emmanuel College is a great option."
