# FSU at UNCP — A Look Ahead

## Two Rivers Classic quickly becoming an enjoyable rivalry

For a rivalry to blossom, it helps to have the benefit of history on its side. But for a rivalry to start at all, it must have something memorable happen to force both those close to it and outside the sphere of influence to stand up and take notice.

With that in mind, the annual Two Rivers Classic is off to a prodigious start.

It was barely a year ago when the football programs from Fayetteville State and UNC Pembroke kicked off the new event that is the Two Rivers Classic. And after a 41-34 double-overtime thriller that Pembroke pulled off with a touchdown and a fourth-down stop at Luther "Nick" Jeralds Stadium, there is no denying the hype and the interest following the defending CIAA Champion Broncos and the Braves as they renew the burgeoning rivalry with the Classic's second edition at 6 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 4, at Pembroke.

Both teams come into the contest off of successful 2009 campaigns, which both resulted in NCAA Division II playoff appearances. And both teams expect to boast some of the same high-octane offensive firepower that fans have come to expect.

"We have a chance to be a pretty good offensive football team," says Fayetteville State Head Coach Kenny Phillips, the 2009 CIAA Coach of the Year. "Nobody knows how this thing is going to go on Saturday, but if practice is any indication of what Saturday is going to be like, it's going to be exciting offensively."

The Broncos have their share of weapons on that side of the line of scrimmage. Richard Medlin (Sr., Raleigh NC) returns as the leading rusher after running for 667 yards and a team-high 10 touchdowns a year ago. Medlin, who was the 2008 CIAA Special Teams Player of the Year, will be the featured back after sharing carries last season.

"We're going to ride Richard until Richard can't run anymore," Phillips says. "Richard is the guy who's going to be carrying the football. Of course, we've got some other things we can do, but he's going to be main guy running the football, and I think we're going to see some exciting things."

Transfer quarterback Robert Benjamin (Jr., Phoenix, AZ) is a dual threat under center and gives the Broncos an accurate arm as well as elusive athletic ability.

"I think Robert has the total package," says Phillips, who enters his 11th season coaching the Broncos. "He throws the ball very well, including the deep ball. And on top of that, he has the athletic ability that when things break down around him, he can make a defense very, very frustrated. When you have a quarterback that, when things break down and you go to tackle him and he's not there anymore, that's frustrating for you as a football team."

Guard Larry McDonald (Jr., Mebane, NC) likes what he sees from the Broncos' new quarterback.

"He's calm and collected in the pocket," McDonald says. "He doesn't holler; he's just a chill person. He brings all the leadership, calm and collected, to the whole offense. You're not as flustered. He's a great quarterback to have. He not only makes the offensive line look good, he makes the whole team look good."

But while the Broncos appear ready to hit the ground running offensively, the Braves bring excellent athleticism as well as valued

- "If we can have the Fayetteville community duplicate what they did a year ago — having the number of supporters we had at that football game follow us down to UNCP — it's going to be an exciting day. We hope to have the same kind of game, we just hope we can come out on top in this one."

experience. Quarterback Cory Smith, a Preseason Third Team All-American selection by D2Proday.com, is 19-4 in his career as a starter and last year completed 169 of 261 passes for 1,787 yards with 17 touchdowns and just five interceptions. Starting running back Travis Daniels, who rushed for 213 yards and two scores against Fayetteville State last year, finished the season with 1,042 yards and 11 TDs while Rashon Kennedy added 767 yards rushing and six TDs. Daniels and Kennedy combined to run for 314 yards against a strong Broncos defense in last season's meeting.

"They do a very good job of letting (Smith) manage the football game, and when you have the two quality running backs like they have back there, you can do a lot of things," says Phillips. "The running game can open up the passing game, and they do a real good job of having one set up the other. My impression is that (Coach Pete Shinnick) has done a very good job of getting that program off the ground, and now he's got it in the position where it is one of the top Division II football teams in the country."

So, perhaps, are the Broncos, who have on their roster one of the premier placekickers in the country in Austin Turner (Jr., San Diego, CA). Turner was the 2009 CIAA Special Teams Player of the Year after kicking 17 field goals, including a 49-yarder to go with seven touchbacks.

"The biggest confidence right now is in our special teams because we know we have a guy who can kick the football," says Phillips. "Anytime you have a guy who can kick it like Austin can kick the football, it gives you great joy to watch. You know once you get across the 50-yard line, if you can get to the 30, you have a chance to get three points."

Those three points may very well come in handy as the two teams figure to experience the kind of rough spots usually found in a season-opening game.

"The biggest thing in these early football games is to try to learn what kind of football team you have, because it's going to be a game that could be up and down," Phillips says. "It could be a game that's close to the end where somebody might kick a field goal to win it."

Players and coaches alike are expecting another edition to savor in the rivalry that is becoming the Two Rivers Classic.

"The game is going to be a hard-fought game. It's going to be a great game, and I'm looking forward to it," says McDonald.

**LAST MEETING: (Aug. 29, 2009)**

Fayetteville, NC - To conclude an exciting week of activities, UNC Pembroke's Jamal Williams pulled in a 21-yard touchdown pass from Cory Smith to go up 41-34 in the double overtime Two Rivers Classic. The Broncos (facing fourth down and 17 yards to go and its final chance at second tie or victory) scrambled all receivers from the 19-yard line and held it's breathe as Benjamin Williams escaped a collapsing pocket and dart toward the right side field. Hosting a homecoming-like capacity of 8,321 fans, Luther "Nick" Jeralds Stadium erupted with cheers and distress as Terrel Partlow tackled Williams on UNCP's seven-yard line to end the game. The Two Rivers Cup will now travel down I-95 to bask on the campus of UNC Pembroke until the rematch next year.

UNC Pembroke was first on the scoreboard with 1:34 remaining in the first quarter. Josh Throckmorton pulled in a four-yard pass from Smith for the 7-0 lead. On its first drive of the second quarter, Fayetteville State responded with a 60-yard scoring drive in less than two minutes. Benjamin Williams, who finished the game 235 yards of passing, connected with Kendon Doe for a 25-yard score. Williams threw the ball 28 times and connected on 16 of them. With no interceptions, he was sacked twice. The Braves went into halftime with a one touchdown lead after Rashon Kennedy walked into the endzone on a three-yard play.

With 14:41 ticking in the third quarter, RB Calvin Harris made good on a 30-yard pass from Ben Williams. As the Classic continued with spectacular highlights, the Braves once again moved ahead 21-14 with a three-yard scoring run from Travis Daniels with 8:37 left in the quarter. Harris scored his second touchdown of the night when he tipped through the defense on a 26-yard run at 6:24.

The fourth quarter began to dwindle away with a tied 21-21 score, until UNCP's Travis Daniels tilted the momentum in favor of the Braves. His 89-yard touchdown run filled the air with chants as his teammates hoisted him up with thanks and gratitude. Not to be out-done, Ben Williams took the next play from scrimmage 61-yards down the field with an air attack to Barry Dunn; which once again tied the score.

UNCP Kicker Taylor Baskett missed a 20-yard field goal attempt at the 11:04 mark of the fourth quarter. He would redeem himself with 42 seconds remaining in regulation with a boot through the uprights from 31 yards back and a 31-28 lead.

The final kickoff of regulation, landed in Jeffery Brooks hand on the FSU 12-yard line. The senior running back advanced the ball 31 yards up the field to start the Broncos drive on its 43-yard line with 30 seconds on the clock. Williams threw two incomplete passes to Kendon Doe; but the third time was a charm as he connected the third attempt for 12 yards on UNCP's 45-yard line. After a timeout with 12 seconds pounding away, Williams highlighted Doe as his favorite receiver as Doe hauled in a 23-yard pass that ended on the Braves 23-yard line. Kendon Doe led the receiving corps with five catches and 89 yards. Rushing the get the next play off, the referees whistled UNCP for having 12 men on the field.

With time for only one play, FSU had all the confidence in the world in its kicker Austin Turner. Turner nailed all four of his PAT kicks and punted the ball seven times for 320 yards. His longest punt was for 84 yards. Strong Safety and holder Jeffery Gowdy set the ball for Turner to foot it 34 yards and send the classic into overtime at 31-31.

With first possession in overtime, Turner gives the Broncos its final lead of 34-31 with a 19-yard field goal. Taylor Baskett hit his second field goal of the night from 21 yards out to stall the crowd from exiting Jeralds Stadium with a 34-34 tied score.

The Braves had an overwhelming 537 yards of offense to the Broncos' 365. The majority of its offense came from 353 rushing yards while FSU mustarded up 130. FSU out-threw UNCP 235-184, but the momentum swung in favor of the Braves with 9-of-18 third down conversions.

**OFFENSIVE LINEMAN — Bryan Garnett, Elizabeth City State** Height: 6-2 Weight: 330 Class: Sr Hometown: Charlotte, NC  
Comments: Garnett led an offensive line that blocked for 372 yards; including 277 in the air, only giving up one sack. ECSU's quarterback threw for 240 yards while the ECSU offensive line blocked for three touchdowns on the ground and two in the air.

#### RECEIVER — Corey Young, Virginia State

Height: 6-2 Weight: 180 Class: SO Hometown: Virginia Beach, VA  
Comments: Young led the Trojan receiver corps with 71 total yards; with his longest reception of 48. Young scored a 10-yard touchdown in the second quarter.

#### OFFENSIVE BACK — DaRonte McNeill, Elizabeth City State

Position: Tailback Height: 6-1 Weight: 205 Class: So Hometown: Elizabeth City, NC

Comments: McNeill carried the ball 19 times for 82 yards with an average of 4.2 yards per carry. He accounted for two touchdowns on the evening; one rushing, the other a 75-yard touchdown reception. He finished the day with two catches out of the backfield and only lost one rushing yard vs JCSU. McNeill finished with a game high 158 all-purpose yards.

#### DEFENSIVE LINEMAN — Malcolm Jenkins, Elizabeth City State

He is also credited with a fumble recovery, two pass breakups and eight quarterback hurries.
