FORDHAM FOOTBALL SCHOLARSHIPS AND THE PATRIOT LEAGUE

As a result of the awarding of football scholarships for the 2010 season, the following stipulations will apply to the 2010 Fordham season:

* The Rams will not be eligible for the 2010 Patriot League championship or the League's automatic bid to the NCAA FCS Playoffs (the Rams will be eligible for an NCAA FCS At-Large bid).

* Fordham will continue to be an associate member of the Patriot League in football but all games played by the Rams against other Patriot League institutions will not count in the league standings.

* Fordham student-athletes will not be eligible for regular season or end-of-year league awards.

* Fordham's matchups against Patriot League opponents will remain as League games, and will be included in the League-only statistics. Fordham will also be a part of the Patriot League overall statistics, and will be included as a Patriot League member in NCAA statistics.

* Fordham's student-athletes will continue to follow the same academic and eligibility requirements as other League members, meeting the League's academic index standards. Because of this, Fordham's student-athletes will still be eligible for academic honor roll recognition.

THE GAME: The Fordham University Rams open their 2010 schedule by traveling to Smithfield, R.I., to face the Bryant University Bulldogs in Bulldog Stadium on Saturday, September 4th, at 3:00 p.m.

Fordham enters the game off a 5-6 campaign last fall, the Rams' second straight 5-6 finish. Bryant enters its season opener after going 5-6 in 2009.

THE SERIES: This will be the second meeting between Fordham and Bryant on the gridiron, with the Rams taking the first matchup, 35-7, last year on Jack Coffey Field on October 10th... Xavier Martin led the Fordham offense, rushing for 122 yards on 19 carries with one score while quarterback John Skelton completed 18 of 32 passes for 182 yards and two touchdowns while also running 34 yards for another score... Jamal Haruna led the defense with eleven tackles while Cliff Stuckey added ten... Bryant is in its third year on the NCAA Division I level (the Bulldogs played on the NCAA Division II level from 1999 until 2007).

FORDHAM HEAD COACH - TOM MASELLA: The Rams will be led into the game by fifth-year head coach **Tom Masella (Wagner '81)**. He has a 21-24 overall record in his four years at Fordham, 38-50 overall in eight years as a head coach.

In 2007, Masella led the Rams to their second Patriot League title as Fordham went 5-1 in the conference, 8-4 overall. He was named the 2007 Patriot League Coach of the Year as well as the AFCA Regional Co-Coach of the Year. Masella was also a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, presented to the NCAA FCS National Coach of the Year.

Masella arrived at Rose Hill after serving as head coach at Central Connecticut State University for two years, leading the Blue Devils to back-to-back Northeast Conference (NEC) titles, the school's first ever football championships in 2004 and 2005. He led the squad to 15 wins over the two seasons, the most victories recorded over a two-year period by a Central Connecticut State football team in school history.

In 2005, the Blue Devils finished with a 7-4 record, tying for the NEC crown with a 5-2 conference record. Eleven of Masella's student-athletes received All-Northeast

RAMS JOIN 700 CLUB

With their win over Georgetown on October 5, 2002, the Fordham University Rams reached the 700 win club in their 104th season. The Rams are the fifth Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) team, and the first non-Ivy League school, to record 700 varsity wins. Overall, there are 12 Football Bowl Subdivision teams with over 700 wins as well as five FCS teams (Yale, Princeton, Harvard and Pennsylvania). Here is a complete list of schools with 700 wins:

Conference accolades in 2005, including one who was named Offensive Rookie of the Year and another who received Defensive Rookie of the Year honors.

In his first year in New Britain, Masella and the Blue Devils put together one of the most successful campaigns in program history, posting an 8-2 overall record and a 6-1 mark in Northeast Conference play. The conference record was good for a share of the NEC Championship, the first conference title in football in school history. For his efforts, Masella was named NEC Coach of the Year, becoming the first Blue Devil head football coach to garner Coach of the Year honors, while the Blue Devils also sported the Offensive Player and Offensive Rookie of the Year.

Masella is 1-0 all-time against Bryant.



BRYANT HEAD COACH – MARTY FINE: Bryant's **Marty Fine** (W. New Mexico '85) is in his seventh season as the head coach of the Bulldogs. He has a 39-24 record in his six years at Bryant, including a 5-6 mark last year. Overall, Fine is 68-37 in ten years as a head coach.

The Bryant football team has made tremendous leaps in only a short time under Fine. After guiding the Bulldogs to back-to-back conference championships and NCAA playoff appearances in 2006 and 2007, Fine has taken the Bulldogs into Division I where they have posted nine wins over Division I Football Championship Subdivision teams and 12 victories overall in the past two seasons.

The winningest coach in school history, Fine's Bulldogs have quickly become a competitive group in the Northeast Conference. In 2009, the Bulldogs averaged more than 300 yards of total offense and placed four players on the All-NEC team. Defensive end Don Smith finished fourth all-time in school history with 17 career sacks and earned All-New England honors. Senior running back Jerell Smith finished as the school's all-time leader in all-purpose yards and kick returns. A native of Tarrytown, New York, Fine was the offensive line and special teams coordinator at Iowa State in 2002 and 2003, coaching two all-Big XII Conference performers at the Ames, Iowa school, including Zach Butler who signed an NFL contract with the Carolina Panthers after graduation in 2002.

Fine is 0-1 against Fordham.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR: Fordham will look to win its second straight over Bryant and open the season with a win for the third time over the past four years... Bryant will look to open the season with a victory for the second consecutive year and the fifth time over the past six years... The Bulldogs will also be looking for their first win over a Patriot League school.

The Fordham offense did most of its damage through the air last year, averaging 337.1 passing yards/game, tops in the Patriot League and second best in the NCAA FCS, along with 151.7 rushing yards/game... The Bryant offense was well balanced last year, averaging 146.9 rushing yards/game and 155.3 passing yards per game... Fordham averaged 28.5 points/game in 2009 while the Bryant offense averaged 17.4 points/game last year.

Defensively, Fordham allowed 192.3 rushing yards/game along with 208.5 passing yards/game last fall while ranking 17th in the NCAA FCS with 2.55 sacks/game... The Bryant defense gave up an average of 145.9 rushing yards/game and 141.5 passing yards/game in 2009... The Fordham defense allowed 26.1 points per game in

2009 while the Bryant defense gave up 17.3 points per game last year.

FORDHAM IN SEASON OPENERS: The Fordham University Rams are 45-27 all-time in season-openers since 1920, 6-15 since moving to the NCAA FCS in 1989. They have won two of the past three openers, a 16-0 win over Rhode Island on Jack Coffey Field in 2008 and a 27-23 win over Rhode Island in Kingston in 2007. Last year, Fordham fell at Rhode Island, 41-28, to open the year.

CALDWELL CLIMBING CAREER RECEIVING LISTS: With his 1,252 receiving yards last year, the second best single season total in school history, senior wideout **Jason Caldwell** brought his career total to 1,733, good for seventh on the Fordham all-time list, 72 yards behind Ed Brown for number six on the list. Caldwell also has 115 career receptions, also seventh best on the Fordham career list, along with 15 receiving touchdowns, sixth best on the Fordham career register.

NEW QB: One constant over the past three years has been the starting quarterback position at Fordham. John Skelton, who was drafted in the fifth round of the 2010 NFL draft by the Arizona Cardinals, started each game at quarterback for the Rams since midway through his freshman year in 2006. But his graduation has forced the Rams to find a new starter, with sophomores **Ryan Higgins** and **Blake Wayne** fighting it out for the starting job.

Higgins played with the junior varsity last year while Wayne is a transfer from Diablo Valley Community College in California where he completed 84 of 146 passes for 1,520 yards and 15 touchdowns last fall. He is a graduate of De La Salle High School in Concord, California, completing 209 of 354 passes for 2,527 yards and 18 scores as a senior in 2008.

RAMS RETURN SEVEN STARTERS ON OFFENSE...: The Fordham offense returns seven starters from last year, led by 2010 preseason All-Americans **Jason Caldwell** (WR) and **Stephen Skelton** (TE). Joining them are running back **Xavier Martin**, and offensive linemen **Jonathan Sheridan** (C), **Lloyd Morrison** (RT), **Robert Kubacki** (LG) and **Adnan Vandyck** (LT).

AND SEVEN MORE ON DEFENSE: Defensively, the Rams return seven starters, led by captains **Jordan Bledsoe** (DL) and **Nick Magiera** (LB). They are joined by **Andy Okonkwo** (E), **Clifton Stuckey** (LB), **Bryson Wilson** (LB), **Isa Abdul-Quddus** (DB) and **Jamal Haruna** (DB).

PLUS ONE KICKER: Coming off a successful freshman year in which he earned First Team All-Patriot League honors after leading the league in punting average (41.9), sophomore **Patrick Murray** returns to handle both the punting and placekicking chores for the Rams in 2010.

RAMS NAME CAPTAINS: Seniors **Jordan Bledsoe** (LaGrangeville, N.Y. (Our Lady of Lourdes)), **Jason Caldwell** (Baltimore, Md./St. Paul's) and **Nick Magiera** (Carpentersville, Ill./Barrington) were named 2010 team captains by Fordham University head football coach Tom Masella at the conclusion of the 2010 spring practice season. In addition to the three, Masella also announced that there would be a game captain for each contest in the fall.

SEEING DOUBLE: The 2010 Fordham roster features three sets of twin brothers. They are sophomores **Daniel** and **James Avedesian**, seniors **Jamal** and **Ahmed Haruna** and seniors **Dozie** and **Namdi Onyeabor**.

MEET THE TRANSFERS: The Fordham Rams welcome four transfers to the 2010 team, two from Hofstra which dropped football following the 2009 season. Sophomore running back **Carlton Koonce** and sophomore receiver **Nick Talbert** arrive at Rose Hill after spending 2009 on Long Island with the Pride while sophomore

People arriving for tonight's Fordham-Bryant football game were greeted by bright Hollywood-type lights shining on Keating Hall, which was being used to film scenes for the movie, Wall Street 2. Just across the street from Keating Hall, under a different set of lights, the Fordham football team put together one of its best all-around games of the year, defeating Bryant, 35-7, on Jack Coffey Field.

The previous week, it was the Fordham offense on display as the Rams set a school record for total yards in a game. In this game it was the defense's turn to shine, holding Bryant to 219 yards of offense, despite missing two contributors to injury.

Even though the defense led Fordham, the Rams' offense wasn't quiet, gaining over 400 yards for the fourth time in five games this year. The offensive attack was well balanced as Fordham gained 244 yards rushing and another 183 passing.

"We finally played a complete game," said Fordham head coach Tom Masella. "I thought we played well on offense, defense and special teams. The kids played hard and it was nice to see that hard work pay off. Hopefully this is something we can build on for next week."

Senior quarterback John Skelton led the passing attack, completing 18 of 32 passes for the 183 yards and two touchdowns, both to his brother Stephen Skelton, while junior running back Xavier Martin paced the running game, gaining 122 yards on 19 carries with one score.

Martin enjoyed his second straight 100-yard rushing game and the tenth of his career.

quarterback **Blake Wayne** played at Diablo Valley Community College in California last year and sophomore tight end **Eli Tenuda** was a member of the Brown University football squad last fall.

THE NEW FOOTBALL LOCKER ROOM: When the football team arrived for the start of 2010 camp, they moved into a new home, the Beryl and John Lyons Football Locker Room. The new space features over 90 lockers, wide screen televisions and a theater-type viewing area for the team. The room also features two sealed lockers to honor Vince Lombardi and Bill Tierney. The room is approximately 4,800 square feet, more than four times larger than the old locker room.

The room will officially be dedicated on Friday, September 24th, the day before the Homecoming game against Assumption.

ZEBRAS PRESENT: For most of the second week of camp, head coach Tom Masella brought in officials to the practices. His goal was to cut down on the number of penalties called on the Rams in 2010. Last fall, Fordham was the most penalized team in the Patriot League, averaging 75 penalty yards/game.

RAMS GET BIGGER, STRONGER, FASTER: An all-time record of 89 Fordham football student-athletes gave up their summer to stay and train with the team and the results were record-setting as head strength and conditioning coach Ted Perlak tested the team prior to the start of summer camp.

The summer program consisted of running as a unit every morning at 7 AM and then lifting in groups in the afternoons. And that hard work paid off for some Rams as ten players set a school mark for this position. Nick Womack and Isa Abdul-Quddus each set school records in both the vertical jump and standing broad jump while Nick Magiera (back squat), Anthony Pesanello (vertical jump), Matt Sconiers (pro-shuttle), Cliff Stuckey (pro-shuttle), Mike Hickman ("L" drill), Brad Pierre ("L" drill), Stephen Skelton ("L" drill) and David More ("L" drill).

The Rams improved as a team since the March testing session, with 53 athletes hang cleaning over 275 pounds, 27 of them over 300, with the team average being 286 pounds. That's compared to 34 hang cleaning over 275 pounds in March. The top performers were Jordan Bledsoe, Mike Hickman, and Pat McGee, who each hang cleaned 355 pounds, Clifton Stuckey (345), Nick Magiera and Andrew Milmore (335), Isa Abdul-Quddus (330) and Bryson Wilson (325).

The team average bench press at the beginning of camp was 313 pounds, and increased from 309 in March and 291 last December. Fifty-one athletes benched over 300 pounds, 16 of them over 350. The top performers were Bledsoe (425), Billy Deluca and

Dan Kessler (405), Magiera and Andy Okonkwo (390), Chris Watkins (385), and Steve Skelton (370).

In the back squat, the team averaged 460 pounds, 14 pounds better than the 446-pound average in March and 55-pounds more than the December average of 405 pounds. Top performers included Magiera, who squatted 725 pounds for a new school record, Thomas Lloyd (615), Isaiah Leake and Okonkwo (590), Stuckey and Dan Parker (560), Bledsoe (555) and Milmore (550).

Performance testing was also conducted with 37 athletes recording a vertical jump of 30" or higher, almost doubling the 19 who accomplished the feat in March. Nick Womack set a new school record for defensive and offensive lineman with a leap of 38.5". Isa Abdul El-Quddus set a new school mark for skill players at 37.5", and newcomer Anthony Pesanello set a new school record for linebackers/tight ends with a jump of 34".

In the standing broad jump, 32 athletes jumped over 9'0", almost a three-fold increase from the 12 who did it in March. Womack (10'5") and Abdul-Quddus (10'3.5") each set another record for their respective positions, and Ben Daley set a record with a leap of 9'0" for the linebackers/tight ends unit.

Two records were broken in the agility testing as Matt Sconiers (offensive/defensive linemen) and Cliff Stuckey (linebackers/tight ends) set new marks in the pro-shuttle with times of 4.22 and 4.00, respectively, while David Moore just missed breaking Asa Lucas's record of 3.97 for skills players by running a 4.01 shuttle in the skill group. In the "L" drill three records were broken with Mike Hickman (offensive/defensive linemen) running a 6.82, Brad Pierre and Skelton (linebackers/tight ends) each clocking a 6.44, and David Moore (skills) a 6.28.

FORMER RAM KORNEGAY ENJOYS SUCCESS IN CFL: Former Fordham University defensive back **Tad Kornegay** is in his sixth year in the Canadian Football League, his fourth with the Saskatchewan Roughriders, appearing in his first CFL All-Star Game last year.

Through eight games, Kornegay has 12 tackles and one forced fumble for the 5-3 Roughriders.

After starting his CFL career as a free agent signee with Hamilton in 2005, Kornegay played for the Tigers Cats in 2006 and 2006 before being traded to the Rough Riders in 2007. He appeared in 15 regular season games his first year in Saskatchewan, starting nine games in the secondary, and dressed as backup a defensive back in West Final and Grey Cup championship as the Rough Riders won the 2007 title. On the year, Kornegay recorded 29 defensive tackles, six special team tackles and five pass knockdowns.

Kornegay was a standout with the Rams from 2001-04, capping his career by winning the 2005 Vincent T. Lombardi Award as Fordham's Male Athlete of the Year.

The Lombardi award was one of a long list of honors for Kornegay, a consensus First Team All-American in 2004. He was named 2004 First Team *Associated Press*, American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), Walter Camp Division I-AA and Sports Network I-AA All-American as well being named one of 40 players named to the I-AA.org All-Star Team. Kornegay was also a finalist for the 2004 Buck Buchanan Award as the NCAA I-AA Defensive Player of the Year as awarded by the Sports Network, finishing 14th in the voting.

In 2004, Kornegay was named First Team All-Patriot League for the second straight season, leading the league in interceptions with eight while twice setting a school varsity record with three

interceptions in a game. He first accomplished the feat against Duquesne on September 25th and then repeated it on October 9th versus Brown. The eight interceptions also tied for the second best single season performance in the Patriot League, tying Kornegay with Bucknell's Kevin Eiben who had eight picks in 2000. The league record is nine, set by Holy Cross' Dave Murphy in 1987.

The eight interceptions registered by Kornegay that fall tied for second best in the NCAA and was third best in Fordham single season history. For his career, Kornegay recorded 14 interceptions, tied for second best in Fordham history and third best in Patriot League history. Kornegay also broke up a team-high eight passes, second best in the conference, while recording 61 total tackles, 48 solo, third best on the squad, and registered two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

WHAT'S NEXT?: The Rams will open their 2010 home schedule next Saturday, September 11th, when they host the University of Rhode Island on Jack Coffey Field at 6:00 PM.
