2012 SEASON PREVIEW

There is no rebuilding year when you create a strong foundation of success like Fresno State baseball head coach Mike Batesole. The Bulldogs have earned Western Athletic Conference trophies for the past six consecutive years including four years of being both the regular season and tournament champions.

Batesole will be looking for his 600th career win (200th in the WAC) during the 2012 season. He has a 584-394-1 overall record and is currently 169-102 in WAC play for his career.

With only one year remaining in the WAC, the 'Dogs are looking to go out with a bang and earn their seventh top conference honor in seven years, the second longest streak in WAC history.

Despite losing 10 student-athletes to the 2011 Major League Baseball draft, Batesole and the Bulldogs are primed for a big WAC finale with a core group of key returners and a recruiting class ranked 19th in the nation by Baseball America.

Among the top returners are seniors Kenny Wise, Tom Harlan and Taylor Garrison. Wise, a first-team All-WAC selection last year played in 53 games, earning 40 starts. He finished the season with seven homers, 12 doubles and 26 RBI. Harlan and Garrison each spent considerable time on the mound in 2011. Harlan earned a 5-3 record as a starter with a 3.84 ERA in 63 innings pitched, while Garrison picked up three saves in 18 appearances with a 1.32 ERA in relief.

Other top returners include redshirt junior Trent Garrison and junior Austin Wynns. Trent Garrison, the twin brother of Taylor, started the first game of last season and recorded one putout before suffering a season ending injury. The Bulldogs are excited for his return to the field after he averaged .339 at the plate with five homers, 11 doubles and 46 RBI in 2010.

First-team All-WAC catcher Austin Wynns played in all 56 games, earning 54 starts, and finished the season with a .326 batting average. Wynns also scored 41 runs on 57 hits, including nine doubles, and knocked in 21 runs.

The Bulldogs will also be looking for Alaska League Top Prospect and Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American Aaron Judge to continue his play on the diamond in 2012. Named WAC Freshman of the Year, Judge was also first-team All-WAC. He played in 55 games, earning 49 starts in center field. Judge finished his inaugural season with a .358 batting average having scored 38 runs on 67 hits including 12 doubles, one triple and two home runs.

Fresno State welcomed 11 newcomers to the roster in 2012, including local standouts Jordan Brink, Jordan Luplow and Chris Mariscal.

All three were named to the Tri-River Athletic Conference first-team during their high school careers. Brink was named first-team All-Valley during his senior year after hitting .434 with six homers. Spending time on the mound, he also finished with a 2.85 ERA after picking up 78 strikeouts in 51 innings pitched.

Luplow spent most of his senior year rehabbing from a shoulder injury but hit .385 with one home run in four games played. He also played for the California Blaze during the summer to prepare for college ball.

Drafted by the Baltimore Orioles in the 41st round of the 2011 MLB draft, Mariscal finished his final high school season hitting .418 with four home runs and an All-Valley nod.

The 2012 schedule boasts 11 teams receiving votes for national ranking in Collegiate Baseball's preseason poll. It is highlighted by No. 3 Stanford, who won their regional in 2011, and No. 22 California, who made it to the College World Series last year.

Fresno State opens the season at home against Butler (Feb. 17-19) before hitting the road to face CSU Bakersfield (Feb. 22) and Pepperdine (Feb. 24-26). The Bulldogs will face No. 3 Stanford (Mar. 2-4) in the middle of their first home stretch. The longest home stand for the 'Dogs includes five different opponents in 13 games over a span of 16 days and includes CSU Bakersfield (Mar. 16-18), Kent State (Mar. 20-21), UC Riverside (Mar. 27) and New Mexico (Mar. 30-Apr. 1).

The Bulldogs last WAC opener happens in Hawai'i, Apr. 5-7. Fresno State's last WAC home opener is May 4-6 in a series against Sacramento State. They will also host Louisiana Tech (May 18-20) as their last home series before the WAC Championships in Mesa, Ariz. May 23-27.

**THE NITTY GRITTY**

**6-FOR-6 AND COUNTING**

Fresno State baseball has won top Western Athletic Conference honors for six of the past six years. Four of the years saw the Bulldogs take home both the regular season and tournament titles. Their streak of WAC championships is the second longest in conference history.

**It's KIND OF A BIG DEAL**

With a 584-394-1 overall record, head coach Mike Batesole is just 16 wins away from reaching 600 for his career. He has amassed over 300 wins at Fresno State in nine seasons at the helm and is 169-102 overall in Western Athletic Conference play.

**AM 940 KYNO HOME OF FRESNO STATE BASEBALL**

Fresno State Athletics announced that AM 940 KYNO will continue to be the flagship station of Bulldog baseball in 2012. Paul Loeffler returns for his 12th season as the voice of Bulldog baseball. He is joined by Ray O'Canto, who is entering his fifth year as an analyst. The duo's pregame shows start a half hour before first pitch.

**SMART 'DOGS**

Fresno State baseball had a team GPA over 3.0 at the end of the 2011 season with eight student-athletes earning Academic All-WAC. Overall, 53 student-athletes have earned academic honors from the WAC under head coach Mike Batesole's watch.

**BOYS OF SUMMER**

There are 12 Bulldogs on the 2012 roster who participated in summer baseball leagues. Sophomore Aaron Judge was named Alaska Baseball League Top Prospect. Senior Chris Mallory, junior Justin Haley and sophomore J.D. Salles won the Alaska League on the Peninsula Oilers. Redshirt senior Gene Escat earned a Far West League championship with the Humbolt Crabs.

**FORMER BULLDOGS IN MLB PLAYOFFS**

Doug Fister helped keep the Detroit Tigers postseason hopes alive in 2011 by leading them to their first win of the American League Championship Series against the Texas Rangers. Casey McGehee made a run for the World Series with the Milwaukee Brewers, as they faced the eventual champion St. Louis Cardinals. Fister will remain with the Tigers while McGehee was traded to the Pittsburgh Pirates for the 2012 season.

**RECRUITING CLASS RANKED 19TH IN COUNTRY**

Baseball America has been ranking the nation's top NCAA Division I recruiting classes for over a decade. This year they announced Fresno State had the 19th best recruiting class in the country. The newcomers join a program that has won a national championship, had six Western Athletic Conference championship seasons in the past six years and has a rich history of success.

**HOLDING ONTO HOMEGROWN TALENT**

The Bulldogs boast a 32-man roster of all California natives. Fresno State has made a point of pulling local talent into the fold. With nearly a third of the roster hailing from Fresno County, the 'Dogs have succeeded in doing just that.

**'DOGS RANKED 35TH IN PRESEASON POLL**

Coming off its sixth Western Athletic Conference championship season, the Fresno State baseball team was ranked No. 35 on College Sports Madness' top 44 college baseball teams list. The Madness also ranked the Bulldogs as the top team in the WAC.

**EIGHT SIGN NATIONAL LETTERS OF INTENT FOR 2013**

Head coach Mike Batesole announced the signing of eight players, all of whom will graduate from high school in the spring of 2012. This is the most decorated and accomplished class in recent memory. It is anchored by the best players in the San Joaquin Valley. The previous three classes were ranked among the top in the country. In 2009, the 'Dogs were ranked 10th nationally, while the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked 28th and 19th respectively.
