Fresno State travels to Palo Alto, Calif. for a three-game series with eleventh-ranked Stanford this weekend.

A Look Back

Seventh-ranked Cal State Fullerton swept a three-game series from the Bulldogs last weekend at Beiden Field ... On Friday night, Fullerton right-hander Wes Littleton tossed a complete game one-hit shutout in a 12- victory ... Littleton threw 75 pitches and limited the Bulldogs to a Chris Patrick walk in the first and a Ryan Haag single in the fourth ... However, Littleton faced the minimum 27 batters thanks to a pair of double plays ... For his efforts, Littleton was named *Collegiate Baseball's* National Pitcher of the Week ... Titan outfielder Danny Dorn went 5-for-5 with a homer, three doubles and a single in a 10-victory Saturday ... Dorn clubbed a three-run round tripper in the first to cap a five-run first for CSF ... Brandon Esparza's pinch-hit RBI single in the ninth inning snapped a string of 18 consecutive scoreless innings for the Bulldogs (dating back to the ninth inning at UC Irvine) ... The streak was four innings short of the school record of 22 set back in 1975 ... Kyle Boyer laced a two-run single in the ninth inning to snap a 4-4 tie and spark a six-run inning as the Titans completed the series sweep 10-4 Sunday ... Brian Pierce belted Fresno State's first homer of the season ... Casey McGehee added a two-run single in the fifth to tie the game at four in the Bulldogs' largest offensive output of the season (four runs, nine hits) ... The sweep was Fullerton's third in the last four meetings against the Bulldogs winning 11 of the last 12 games between the two schools .. Fresno State was outscored 32-5 over the three games.

FRESNO STATE VS. STANFORD: The Cardinal lead the all-time series 67-45 dating back to 1952 ... the two schools have played each other every season for the past 25 years (1978-2002) ... Stanford is 42-29 during that stretch ... Fresno State has not won a three-game series from the Cardinal since 1999 when it took two of three (0-1, 8-6, 5-3) to open the season in Palo Alto ... The last time the Bulldogs swept a three-game series from Stanford was 1974 (19-11, 5-4, 2-1) ... The two teams have met in postseason play six times (2000, 1997, '91, '88, '82, '67) including the 1988 College World Series where Stanford won the opener 10-4 ... The Bulldogs are 2-5 against the Cardinal in those games ... Mike Batesole has only faced Stanford twice and they both came in the 1996 West Regional (with Cal State Northridge) ... Stanford won the tourney opener 10-5 but Northridge bounced back to record a 4-3 win to eliminate the Cardinal and advance to the finals against Florida State.

Youth is Served

This season's pitching staff does not have a hurler who has started a game for Fresno State prior to this year ... Only three pitchers who played last year return (Chad Edwards, Matt Scott, David Bair) ... Those three accounted for three wins (Edwards 1, Scott 1, Bair 1), 37 appearances (Edwards 12, Scott 8, Bair 17) and 42.1 innings (Edwards 20.0, Scott 9.2, Bair 12.2) in 2002 ... Transfers Josh Glynn (Arkansas) and Donnie Bair (Louisiana Lafayette) are the only other Bulldog pitchers with experience at the Division I level ... Entering this year, Glynn (3) and Bair (3) provide all the starting experience (6) for this year's staff ... Five of the six pitchers that pitched for Fresno State in the season opener at UC Irvine had never pitched for the Bulldogs.

Bulldogs Picked Second in the WAC Preseason Coaches' Poll

Bulldog senior outfielder Joey Myers, junior second baseman Ryan Haag, junior third baseman Casey McGehee and senior utility player Scott Beshears were selected to the 2003 Preseason All-Western Athletic Conference team. In addition, the Bulldogs were predicted to finish second in the preseason coaches' poll. Fresno State and San Jose State tied for second place with 19 points. FS received one first place vote. The Bulldogs finished third in the WAC behind Rice and San Jose State with a 19-11 mark in conference play last season. For the seventh year in a row, defending conference champion Rice was tabbed to win the WAC regular season title. The Owls received 25 points including all five first place votes (coaches cannot vote for their own team) after making their third trip to College World Series in six years last season. Hawai'i and Nevada tied for fourth with 11 points followed by Louisiana Tech with five.

The Experts Weigh In

Baseball America's season preview picked Fresno State to finish second in the WAC behind defending conference champion Rice ... The publication also selected the Bulldogs as one of two teams (Rice) as projected NCAA Tournament participants ... Ryan Haag, Casey McGehee and Chris Patrick were selected to the all-conference team ... McGehee was rated as the seventh-best draft prospect in the league (98th overall in the class of 2003) and Haag was tabbed as the conference's top newcomer ... *Collegiate Baseball* has the Bulldogs finishing third in the WAC behind Rice and San Jose State ... McGehee and Haag were among the list of the league's players to watch.

A Look at Stanford

The Cardinal are off to a 3-5 start this season ... After winning the first two against Santa Clara, Stanford suffered a three-game sweep to Cal State Fullerton and lost two of three to Florida State last weekend ... Head coach Mark Marquess is in his 27th season at the helm of the Stanford baseball program ... Under his direction, Stanford has won two national titles, ten conference championships and has made 20 appearances in the NCAA Tournament ... The Cardinal are led by Preseason first-team All-American outfielder Carlos Quentin and third-team All-American outfielder Sam Fuld.

The Cupboard is Not Bare

In contrast to Fresno State's relative inexperience on the mound, the offense and defense remain primarily intact ... Five position starters highlight the list of eight position players returning from last year's team (Casey McGehee, Scott Beshears, Brian Pierce, Joey Myers and Chris Patrick) ... Kyle Atrat, Brandon Esparza and Will Thomas round out the list ... Those eight accounted for 53.5% (294/550) of the team's hits, 50.6% (157/310) of the team's RBI total, and 53.6% (181/338) of the Bulldogs' runs scored last season ... McGehee, Patrick and Beshears finished first, second and third respectively on the team in batting average ... the group does not lack experience either ... McGehee and Patrick played in all 59 of Fresno State's game with Myers (55), Pierce (50) and Beshears (46) right behind.

Among The Ranks

The Bulldogs were 3-14 against top-25 opponents last season ... against ranked foes on the road, Fresno State was 2-6 with victories at No. 16 Cal State Fullerton (10-4) and No. 21 Long Beach State (10-1) ... a 7-5 win against No. 1 Stanford accounted for the lone home victory as the Bulldogs posted a 1-8 mark at Beiden Field against the Cardinal (1-2), No. 19 Nebraska (0-3) and No. 2 Rice (0-3) ... This season, Fresno State is 0-3 against ranked foes with a three game sweep at the hands of No. 7 Cal State Fullerton last weekend.

Head Coach (First Year)
(Cal State Fullerton '90)



Mike Batesole is the third head coach at Fresno State since 1948. Batesole joins the Bulldogs after spending seven seasons at the helm at Cal State Northridge, where he compiled a 256-158-1 record. During his tenure, the Matadors captured Western Athletic (1996) and Big West Conference (2002) titles. Under Batesole, the Matadors made two NCAA Tournament appearances and were one game away from reaching the College World Series in 1996.

Batesole comes to Fresno State on the heels of one of the most successful seasons in his coaching career. He led CS Northridge to a Big West title with a 19-5 conference mark, earning him Big West Conference Coach of the Year honors. Last season, the Matadors finished first in the conference in home runs (89), RBIs (392), slugging percentage (.503), on-base percentage (.413) and walks (298). The squad featured nine All-Big West selections, including the conference's Player of the Year, Eric Verbryke. The Matadors were ranked as high as 15th in the national polls. His career record at Cal State Northridge ranks him second all-time in program history. His .620 winning percentage is the all-time best in school history. Batesole reached the 250-win mark May 5, 2002, with a 10-3 victory against Pacific.

In Batesole's seven years at Northridge, 34 of his players have made it to the professional ranks. Currently, 16 of his former players are playing professional ball, including American League All-Star Robert Fick (Detroit Tigers) and infielder Adam Kennedy (World Champion Anaheim Angels).

Batesole was a standout player at Oral Roberts, where he finished his career as the school's all-time home run leader and still holds the freshman home run record.

A native of Anaheim, Calif., Batesole played shortstop for Garden Grove High School, where he earned All-Garden Grove Conference and All-Orange County honors. He finished his senior season in 1982 with an incredible .500 batting average and 24 doubles.

Besides his awards as a player and coach, Batesole has also received recognition for his work in the community. He has twice been awarded ('97 and '99) the prestigious Performance Salary Step Increase Award from the California State Board of Trustees for "meritous performance in the area of teaching, professional accomplishments and service to the university community."

Batesole earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Cal State Fullerton in 1990 and received his master's degree in biomechanics in 1992. He lives in Fresno with his wife Susie and their four children, Kassy (14), Kally (12), Kody (8) and Korby (5).

Early Trends

Through the first four games of the season, the Bulldogs have recorded a .172 team batting average compared to a .309 clip for their opponents ... Opponents have 11 stolen bases to Fresno State's two (22 in 2002) ... FS hurlers have compiled a 6.50 ERA to its opponent's 1.50 mark ... The Bulldogs have yet to turn a double play this season (70 in 2002) ... Brian Pierce's homer on Sunday is the only one the team has hit this year (56 in 2002) ... Fresno State has matched its .966 fielding percentage in 2002.

McGehee and Patrick Earn All-WAC Honors

Casey McGehee led Fresno State in several offensive categories including batting average (.367), hits (88), runs scored (49), total bases (127) and slugging percentage (.529) to earn first team All-WAC honors last year ... His offensive prowess was best illustrated with a 31-game hitting streak, the conference season high and the second-longest in school history ... sophomore shortstop Chris Patrick garnered second-team all-conference honors after playing every inning for the Bulldogs last season ... He was second on the team in batting average (.300), runs scored (47), hits (72) and doubles (13) ... First round draft pick Ben Fritz was the WAC Pitcher of the Year and a first-team all-conference selection as a starting pitcher and utility player ... highlighting his performance on the mound was his strikeout to walk ratio (2.7:1) ... Fritz fanned 98 batters in 119.1 innings while walking only 36 ... at the plate, he led the Bulldogs with ten round trippers and 54 RBIs.

2002 Bulldogs in the WAC

The Bulldogs recorded a 19-11 mark in WAC play to finish third ... McGehee finished among the conference leaders in several offensive categories including batting average (third), runs scored (tied for seventh), total bases (second), hits (second), RBIs (tied for seventh) and on base percentage (tenth) ... Fritz was eighth in total bases (112), tied for fourth in doubles, fifth in RBIs, tied for fourth in homers ... on the mound, Fritz finished sixth in ERA (3.24), seventh in strikeouts (98), second in opponents batting average (.226) and innings pitched (119.1) ... Bob Runyon finished second with 119 strikeouts ... Runyon led the league with 142.1 innings pitched and tied for fourth with ten wins.

Keepin' it Close

Fresno State's one-run victory in the season opener continued the Bulldogs' success in close games last year ... FS was involved in 17 games with a run differential of two or less last season .. In those games the Bulldogs were 13-4 including 12-3 in WAC play ... Three of the four losses came at San Jose State ... The Bulldogs' only other loss came in the third game of the season when they dropped a 2-1 decision against Santa Clara ... Fritz went the distance in that game, but suffered his first loss of the season.

Beiden Field Ranks Among the Nation's Finest

In *Baseball America's* season preview, Beiden Field was ranked as the 18th best ballpark in collegiate baseball by the coaches ... Rice's Reckling Park was voted ninth best and Stanford's Sunken Diamon was tabbed as the 11th best in the country ... In a survey of the country's Sports Information Directors, Fresno State was 12th ... Hawai'i was tied for sixth, Rice was eighth and Stanford was ninth ... general aesthetics, facilities, fan amenities, playing conditions and tradition were among the list of criteria that voters were asked to consider.
