Bulldog Soccer

- In 2008, Fresno State made their third NCAA Tournament appearance in program history.

- The 'Dogs have won three WAC Tournament Championships and a WAC League Championship in the last five seasons.

- Played in the WAC Tournament title game five of the last six years.

Bulldogs Face UCF in NCAA Tournament

After winning the 2010 WAC Tournament, the Dogs earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament and face University of Central Florida on Nov. 11 at 8 p.m. This is the fourth time in school history that the Bulldogs have appeared in the NCAA Tournament.

Against Central Florida

The Dogs last faced UCF on the road in 2006. After two overtime periods the game ended in a 0-0 tie. UCF is one of three schools Fresno State has faced from Florida.

About the Knights

UCF received its fourth-straight at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament after a regular season run of 14-4-3. The Knights make their 15th trip to the NCAA Tournament. They have reached the Final Four twice. Tishia Jewel and Kim Newsome lead the team in goals with 10 each. Goalkeeper Aline Reis has allowed 18 goals this season and recorded five shutouts.

WAC Tournament Wrap Up

Fresno State won its second WAC Tournament title in three years after defeating top seed San Jose State in penalty kicks. The Dogs and Spartans played 110 minutes of scoreless soccer before the champion was decided in four penalty kicks from each team. The Dogs also shut out Idaho and Utah State en route to the final game. It is the first WAC title and NCAA appearance under second year head coach Brian Zwaschka.

Last Trip to NCAA Tournament

The last time the Bulldogs appeared in the NCAA College Cup was in 2008, which was the third time in school history the Dogs played in the tournament. Fresno State faced No. 1 seed and regional host UCLA. The Bruins won the game 5-0 ending the Bulldogs season with a record of 11-9-2.

WAC Tournament Tested

Since 2005, Fresno State has played in five of six WAC Tournament championship games. Three of the six years the Dogs have won and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. The last five years the Bulldogs have shutout eight opponents during the tournament and out scored their opponents 20-7. Fresno State has had 20 WAC All-Tournament selections in the last six tournaments. The last time the Dogs won the tournament was in 2008 over Utah State.

NCAA Tournament History

This is the fourth NCAA appearance for the Bulldogs. Fresno State has a tournament record of 0-3. The Dogs first appearance was in 1999 hosting Cal Poly. Fresno State lost the match to the Mustangs 2-1. The Bulldogs also made appearance in 2005 and 2008. The Dogs lost those matches 5-0 to Santa Clara and UCLA.

HEAD COACH BRIAN ZWASCHKA

Grand View College, 1994

Brian Zwaschka became the fourth Fresno State Women's Soccer head coach on April 6, 2009. He brings a wealth of soccer experience and knowledge to the program after spending the last six years as an assistant coach at Cal, Texas Tech and his alma mater Grand View University. He was also a collegiate and professional soccer player.

Zwaschka was an assistant for the last two years at Cal where his primary responsibilities were to oversee the program's performance-related tasks, including player development, fitness and wellness, nutrition, recovery, video, scouting, equipment and facilities. He also shared heavily in planning and conducting team and individual training, prospect evaluations and other recruiting duties.

In 2008, Zwaschka helped coach the Golden Bears to their fifth straight NCAA tournament appearance, and the tenth in eleven seasons. In his first season at Cal, the team posted a 15-5-1 record, advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament and earned a No. 11 national ranking.

Over the last two years, Zwaschka has helped train and develop players for the international stage. This includes Iceland National Team veteran, Katrin Omarsdottir, as well as US Women's National Team hopefuls in current U23 players Katie Oakes and Alex Morgan, and U20 National pool player Megan Jesolva. Morgan went on to score the winning goal in the FIFA U20 World Cup tournament held in Chile in 2008, additionally receiving the Silver Ball and the Bronze Shoe tournament awards.

The Award Goes To...

Two Bulldogs earned All-WAC honors at the conference Banquet. Senior Kaitlyn Revel was named first-team All-WAC for the third time in her career. Nicole Duff was named second-team All-WAC and it was the first league award for the senior. The Dogs also had four players named to the 2010 WAC All-Tournament team. Vanessa Gonzalez, Kendall VanDine, Lauren Lindstrom and Katie Lee were selected. Lee was named the WAC Tourna

Revel Earns National Honors

Kaitlyn Revel was named to the CS360 Primetime Performers of the Week by CollegeSoccer.com. She shut out three opponents in the WAC Tournament and recorded a goals against average of 0.00. Revel has not given up a goal in the last four games or 384 minutes.

Smart Dogs

Fresno State had four Bulldogs earn Academic All-District honors from CoSIDA. Megan Ashjian and Katie Lee were selected to first-team. This is the second year Lee has earned all-district honors. Kendall VanDine and Claudia Cardenas were named to the third-team. Ashjian and Lee are now nominated for Academic All-America honors.

Bulldogs in Extra Minutes

The Bulldogs have taken nine games into extra minutes including a streak of three consecutive overtime matches. The 'Dogs are 2-2-4 in overtime games, all have occurred this year. Fresno State earned a win over Texas State, Idaho, a loss against UC Davis and San Jose State and tied UC Santa Barbara, Boise State, Nevada and CSU Bakersfield.

Dogs Defense Shines

The Bulldog defense recorded their ninth shutout of the year against San Jose State. Fresno State defense has dominated the WAC in recent years. Since 2006 the Bulldogs have recorded a shutout in 27 of 41 WAC games. In those 41 WAC games the Dogs have allowed only 21 goals for goals against average of .51. In the last four years, Fresno State has compiled a record of 26-9-6 against teams from the WAC.

Dogs Gooooooool!

The Bulldogs have scored 23 goals in 22 games this season. Senior Nicole Duff leads the goal count with six goals. Other Bulldogs with goals are Laura Dodd, Molly Nizzoli, Kaite Lee, Claudia Cardenas, Vanessa Gonzalez and Janna Sadowitz. The 'Dogs scored a game-high three goals against Florida Atlantic University on Sept. 5. The record for most goals scored in a match is eight set in 2000 against Weber State. The most goals scored in a season is 39, which was also set in 2000. Former Bulldog Jill Pearson holds the record for most goals scored in a career (40), in a season (15) and in a game (4).

Setting Up the Goal

Fresno State has recorded 30 assists in 22 games. Leading the way is Lauren Lindstrom and Krissy Looney with four each. Also contributing assists in 2010 is Nicole Duff, Bradlee DeShane, Claudia Cardenas, Laura Dodd, , Kendall VanDine, Molly Nizzoli, Janna Sadowitz, Bianca Lopez, Katie Lee and Tara Boynton. Former Bulldog midfielder Ali Sill owns several assist records. Sill holds the record for career assists (23), single game assists (2) and single season assists (9). As a team the most assists recorded in a season is 34, which was set in 2007. The single game record is eight assists, which was done in 2003 against San Jose State.

Lee Scores First Goal

Senior Katie Lee scored her first career goal against Utah State at the WAC Tournament. The goal lifted the Dogs past the Aggies and into the WAC CHampionship game.

Revel Saves the Day

First-team All-WAC goalkeeper Kaitlyn Revel has 75 saves and eight shutouts this season. Revel has not allowed a goal in four games of 384 minutes. The senior has 322 career saves and is second in Fresno State History. Last season, Revel broke the all-time shutout record after her 24th career shutout versus Idaho. She has 32 career shutouts.

Duff No. 1 in Points

Senior Nicole Duff is leading the way offensively for the Bulldogs in 2010. She leads the team in points with 15 on the year. The forward has recorded a team-high six goals and three assists. Duff has recorded a single game-high of three points twice this season.

Gonzalez Adds Goal for Bulldogs

Sophomore Vanessa Gonzalez scored her first career goal against Florida Atlantic University on Sept. 5. She has two points on the season. Gonzalez has eight shots and three shots on goal.

Cardenas Strikes

Senior Claudia Cardenas has three goals and three assists for nine points. She scored the first goal of the 2010 season for the Bulldogs and she scored one of two goals against UTEP. Cardenas has six career goals at Fresno State.

DeShane Shatters Record

Senior Bradlee DeShane's career in a Bulldog uniform is winding down and as she hangs up her cleats she leaves behind a very impressive streak. Over the last three years, DeShane has consecutively started 61 games. She started every game during her sophomore, junior and senior years and played in 17 of 21 games her freshman year. DeShane has played 6,567 minutes in her career, which is the most in Bulldog history by a position player. Andrea Alires held the previous record at 5, 887 minutes.

Revel, VanDine Named Preseason All-WAC

Senior Kaitlyn Revel and junior Kendall VanDine were named to the 2010 Preseason All-WAC team. Both earned two All-WAC honors in their careers as Bulldogs. VanDine was selected twice as a second-team honoree and Revel earned first-team honors. VanDine helped the 'Dogs record five shutouts last season. All-time shutout leader, Revel, had four shutouts last year.

Smith Posts Second Shutout

In her first start of the 2010 season, senior goalkeeper Chrissy Smith recorded her second career shutout. She also had four saves against CSU Bakersfield. Smith played all 110 minutes of the overtime match.

Three Goals for Dodd

Laura Dodd has four goals and has seven points this season. She scored her first goal against UTEP. Her goal proved to be the deciding factor as the Dogs won 2-1. In her career, the junior has scored at least one goal a season.

New Leader of the Pack

Brian Zwaschka became the fourth Fresno State women's soccer head coach on April 6, 2009. In his first year, the Bulldogs went 6-13. He earned his first collegiate win against CSU Bakersfield on Sept. 13, 2009.
