THE SERIES - FSU vs. HOFSTRA

• Florida State and Hofstra will face-off for a three-game series in Tallahassee beginning Friday, February 17. The meeting marks the fourth time in the last five years these two teams have squared off in a weekend series including the fourth year in a row. This is the second time the Seminoles and Pride have faced each other on opening weekend (2009).

• The Seminoles are undefeated in the series having won all 13 previous meetings. FSU has outscored Hofstra 157-32 in the series as the Seminole pitching staff has held the Pride offense to three runs or less 10 times.

• The last time these two schools met to open the season, FSU swept the four-game series in 2009. The Saturday doubleheader was a tale of two stories as the Garnet and Gold scored a series-high 21 runs in game 1, while game 2 resulted in a one-run victory.

• Last year, the Seminoles tallied double-digit runs in all three games as each FSU starting pitcher went at least 5.0 innings. Gary Merians closed out the series with five innings of two-hit baseball en route to a career-high six strikeouts.

• The Seminole bullpen was equally impressive against the Pride in 2011 as eight different

pitchers combined to work 11.0 shutout innings of hitless baseball while walking just three and striking out 10.

• Offensively, FSU hit .369 as a team combining for 41 hits including 11 doubles and six home runs. The Seminoles finished the sweep of the Pride slugging .631. Defensively, the 'Noles committed just two errors in 122 fielding chances.

OPENING DAY

- Florida State embarks on the 2012 season winners of 13 in a row on opening day, while posting an all-time record of 56-7-1 (.883).
- Friday marks just the second time that FSU will play Hofstra on opening day. The Seminoles defeated the Pride 9-3 on Feb. 20, 2009.
- The Seminoles have suffered a loss on opening day just seven times in 64 previous seasons with two of those losses coming in Tallahassee.
- In 1998, the Garnet and Gold fell to Notre Dame at a neutral site marking the last time FSU has dropped a season opener.
- The last time FSU lost a season opener at home was 1981 when Georgia Southern defeated the Seminoles 3-2. Auburn handed Florida State its only other opening day loss at home back on March 20, 1958 as the Tigers swept the opening day doubleheader (4-3, 10-7).
- When it comes to home openers all-time, FSU is 60-4 (.938) with only one loss coming in the last 30 years.
- Under Hall of Fame head coach Mike Martin, FSU Baseball is 29-3 on opening day.

FIRST SERIES OF THE SEASON

- Florida State has not lost the first series of the season since 1981 - a streak of 30 consecutive series victories on opening day.
- In 64 years of FSU baseball, the Seminoles have only lost a season opening series twice. The last time the Seminoles lost a series to open the season came in 1981 when Georgia Southern took two of three games from Florida State. The only other time the Garnet & Gold lost a series to open the season came in 1958 when Auburn took both games of a two-game set.
- Overall, Florida State is 53-2-9 in season opening series.

STREAKING INTO 2012

- The season hasn't even started and there are already two players who will step into the batter's box on Friday against Hofstra looking to extend their current hitting streak.
- Jayce Boyd and Sean O'Brien are the lone Seminoles hoping to add to their hit streak in 2012:
 - Jayce Boyd - 6 (career-high = 15)
 - Sean O'Brien - 1 (career-high = 3)

CONSECUTIVE STARTS

- Senior James Ramsey enters Friday's season opener against Hofstra having started 133 consecutive games for the Garnet & Gold, the longest active streak on the team.
- Ramsey started every game in right field the last two seasons and will look to add to that total as he will start in centerfield for the 'Noles in 2012.
- Juniors Jayce Boyd and Justin Gonzalez will look to add to their consecutive games started totals as well as both Seminoles started all 65 games for FSU in 2011.
- Dating back to the ACC Championship game in 2010, Boyd has started 75 consecutive games at first base.

LEIBRANDT GETS OPENING DAY START

- Brandon Leibrandt will make his collegiate debut on Friday against Hofstra as he takes the mound as the Seminoles opening day starter.
- Son of former major leaguer Charlie Leibrandt, Brandon is set to make Florida State history on Friday as the first freshman to start an opening day game in the program's 65-year history.
- Dating back to 1966, 10 sophomores have been given the ball on opening day with former Seminole All-American Sean Gilmartin being the last sophomore pitcher to do so in 2010.

- While Leibrandt will become the first freshman to start an opening day game in school history, he will add another first to his young career join-

- Sean Gilmartin was the last freshman to earn a start on opening weekend pitching on Saturday in the second game of a doubleheader against Hofstra.

- Gilmartin earned the win working 6.0 innings allowing just one run on seven hits as he walked three and struck out four in a 3-2 FSU victory.

- The trio of Leibrandt, Miller and Compton will mark the youngest starting rotation to open a season since 2009 when head coach Mike Martin sent out three sophomores (Geoff Parker, John Gast and Mike McGee) and one freshman (Sean Gilmartin). Ironically enough, the Seminoles opened the 2009 season against the Hofstra Pride.

- Since taking over the reigns as head coach in 1980, there have only been three times that Mike Martin has opened a weekend series with a rotation consisting only of sophomores or freshmen.

- Success is synonymous with Florida State Baseball as the program enters its 65th year of existence in 2012.

- In 17 of the last 21 seasons, the Seminoles have claimed the ACC regular season title or finished with the best record in the league, won the ACC Tournament title or advanced to the College

World Series in Omaha, Neb.

- All of this is pretty impressive for a school that has the most wins and second highest winning percentage in Division I since 2000 and the second highest winning percentage all-time in Division I history.

- On top of all that, the most impressive stat is the fact that Florida State baseball has never endured a losing season in 64 years.

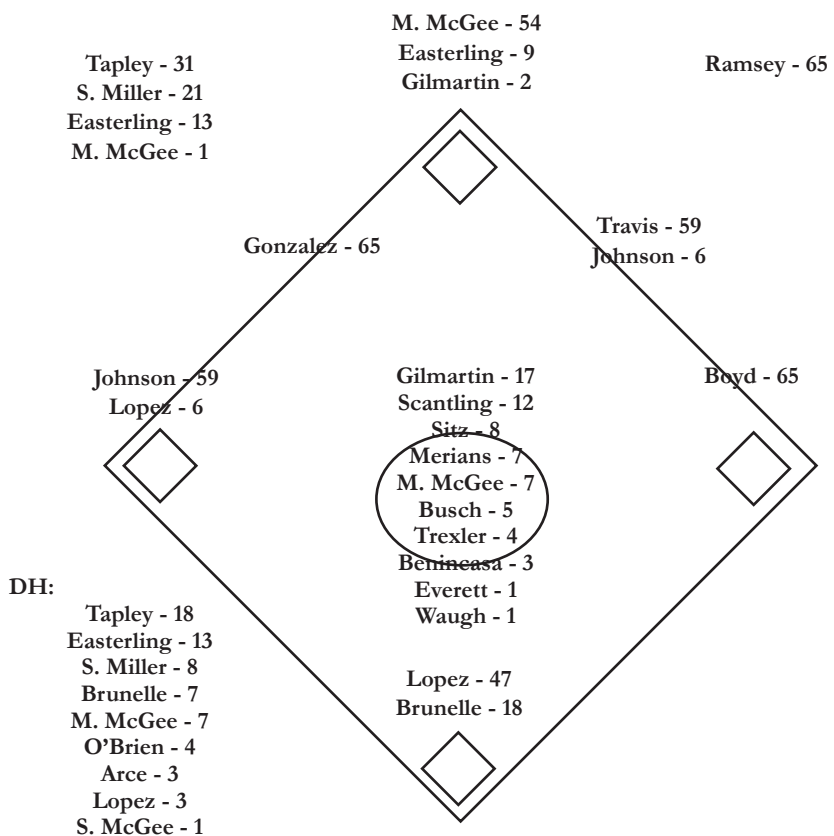
EL CAPITAN

- The decision to return to Tallahassee was not an easy one for outfielder James Ramsey, whose lifelong dream has been and will continue to be to play professional baseball. But the idea to come back to Florida State for his senior season, earn his degree and help lead the Seminoles back to the College World Series for the third time in the last five years was paramount.

- Ramsey has made 133 consecutive starts for Florida State with each one of those starts coming in right field dating back to the start of the 2010 season. But in 2012, Ramsey will be the Seminoles' starting centerfielder.

- Ramsey is on track to graduate in the spring of 2012 with a degree in finance from the prestigious College of Business and is an active participant in the community.

MAKING THE CONNECTION

- If you're a movie buff and can't get enough 'Six Degrees of Kevin Bacon,' then you're going to love a little 'Six Degrees of Seminole Baseball.'
- So I know you're asking yourself what's the FSU baseball connection between Friday's opening day starter Brandon Leibrandt and his dad, former major leaguer, Charlie Leibrandt...
- No, Charlie did not go to school at Florida State, but he was managed by former FSU head coach Dick Howser for three years with the Kansas City Royals (1985-86). In fact, Charlie was in the starting rotation the year the Royals defeated the St. Louis Cardinals to capture the 1985 World Series Championship.
- The rest of the connection is pretty easy. Howser was head coach at FSU in 1979 before leaving to take the managerial job with the New York Yankees in 1980. One of Howser's assistants in 1979 was Mike Martin, who succeeded Howser as head coach at FSU. And of course Martin will coach Brandon in 2012. So there is your 'Six Degrees of Seminole Baseball' or perhaps it should be 'Four Degrees.'

MARTIN APPROACHES MILESTONE

- Now in his 33rd season as head coach at Florida State, Mike Martin needs 27 wins to reach 1,700 career victories.
- In reaching career win No. 1,700, Martin would become just the fourth coach in all divisions to reach this historic milestone and the third to do so in Division I history.
- The elusive group among all divisions includes Gordie Gillespie (1,893), Augie Garrido - Texas (1,817), Gene Stephenson - Wichita State (1,763) and **Mike Martin (1,673)**. Gillespie is the only non-active coach on the list as he retired from St. Francis, Ill., (NAIA) in 2011.

FOR WHOM THE BELL TOLLS

- This year marks the first time since 1997 that

head coach Mike Martin had a change in his coaching staff with the addition of Mike Bell as associate head coach and the Seminoles new pitching coach.

- Bell returns to Tallahassee after spending a combined seven years with Tennessee (2005-07) and Oklahoma (2008-11).
- The FSU graduate played for the Seminoles in 1994 and 1995 compiling a 14-4 record with a 3.01 ERA in 26 appearances recording 120 strikeouts in over 137 innings of work.
- In addition to coaching Oklahoma to the 2010 College World Series and Tennessee in 2005, Bell also played with the Seminoles in back-to-back years in 1994 and 1995.
- In his seven prior seasons as a pitching coach, Bell has coached three pitchers that have been drafted in the first round of the MLB Draft including Luke Hochevar, who was selected as the first overall pick in 2006.

VETERAN INFIELD

- The Seminoles return all four starting infielders from last year's squad that posted a .972 fielding percentage, good for the third-best mark in school history.
- First baseman Jayce Boyd and shortstop Justin Gonzalez started all 65 games at their position last year, while Sherman Johnson made 59 starts at third base and six more at second. Devon Travis was the everyday starter for FSU at second base missing just six games last year due to injury.
- In fact, Boyd, Johnson and Travis enter 2012 as three-year starters at their respective positions. A feat that hasn't been matched by a player since Tony Thomas, Jr., started as the everyday second baseman for the 'Noles from 2005 to 2007.

GILMARTIN HONORED FRIDAY

- Sean Gilmartin, who was drafted by the Atlanta Braves with the 27th overall pick in the 2011 MLB Draft, will be on hand to throw out one of the ceremonial first pitches for Friday's home opener against Hofstra.
- Gilmartin will also be presented with his All-American award during the fourth inning on Friday.

2012 ACC PRESEASON POLL

If the Florida State baseball team wants to capture their sixth consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference Atlantic Division title in 2012 they will have to do so as the underdog. For the second year in a row, the Seminoles are tabbed to finish second in the ACC Atlantic Division as voted on by the league's 12 head coaches.

Florida State tallied 64 total points and received five first-place votes to win the Atlantic Division. Clemson received the nod as the favorite to win the division with 67 total points and seven first-place votes. Since the league moved to divisional play in 2006, Florida State has either won the title outright or claimed a share of the top spot the last five years (2007-11).
