Seminole Quick Hits

* Florida State is one of just two teams in Division I with 28 victories on the year as the Seminoles join the Arizona State Sun Devils (28-3) in that category. The ACC leads the nation with five teams registering 25 wins or more.

* In the latest national report by WarrenNolan.com, the Seminoles lead the nation in RPI and sit seventh in strength of schedule. The Atlantic Coast Conference is ahead of the Pac-10 for the third straight week as the highest RPI conference in the nation.

* Senior Ryan Strauss was named ACC Pitcher of the Week for the first time this season in 2008 as he led the Seminoles to a pair of wins over ranked opponents including No. 13 Florida and No. 14 Virginia. Strauss compiled 10 innings of work in two games allowing just one run on four hits as he walked just two and struck out 10. He started against the Gators and went 7.0 innings while throwing 3.0 innings in relief vs. UVA.

* With a win over Georgia Tech on Sunday, March 23, head coach Mike Martin became just the third coach in NCAA Division I history to reach 1,500 career victories. Martin currently sits with a record of 1,512-509-4.

* The Seminoles have hit 47 home runs through the first 31 games of the season. To put that number in prospective, it wasn't until game No. 58 of the 2007 season that the Seminoles hit their 47th home run. Thirteen different Seminoles have registered a home run this year while six different Seminoles hit a round tripper in the first game of a doubleheader against Duquesne to open the season.

* FSU ran out to a 10-0 start in the ACC marking the third best start in school history. It was the best start for the Seminoles since running out to a 13-0 mark in 1999. The all-time best start was in 1996 when Florida State began 17-0.

* Freshman center fielder Tyler Holt has reached base safely in all 31 games this season. Holt is tied for the national lead in walks with 36.

* The Seminoles set a season-high with nine stolen bases in a victory at Jacksonville on April 2. It was the most swipes in one game since stealing eight against West Virginia in 2004.

Setting The Series: Florida State vs. Boston College

Florida State will make its second career appearance in Chestnut Hill, Mass., this weekend as the Seminoles take on the Boston College Eagles in a three-game series at Eddie Pellagrini Diamond. FSU leads the all-time series 6-0 including a record of 3-0 on the Eagles' home turf. The Seminoles have outscored the Eagles 40-12 in those six games while holding BC to two runs or less in four games. Both teams are coming off a conference sweep last weekend with FSU and BC taking three games from Virginia and Duke, respectively. The Eagles are riding a season best seven win streak, while FSU has won six straight and 12 of its last 13 games.

Against The Eagles

Senior Dennis Guinn looks to pick-up where he left off last year against BC as he hit .700 (7-for-10) with four doubles, a triple, a home run, four runs and four RBIs. Guinn posted a series best 1.600 slugging percentage as he started all three games a season ago in left field. Buster Posey is a career .370 hitter against Boston College with a home run and two doubles. He has scored five runs and drove in five run in six games. Jack Rye has five hits in his career against Eagle pitching with two going for home runs. Tommy Oravetz has a pair of hits in six career at-bats.

On the mound, Ryan Strauss pitched seven shutout innings a season ago allowing just two hits while striking out four. Jimmy Marshall has two career appearances pitching two innings in 2006 and an inning in 2007. He has allowed two runs, one earned, on three hits with two strikeouts. Bo O'Dell pitched an inning last year striking out three of the four batters that he faced. Over the last two years, the Seminole pitching staff has posted a team ERA of 1.83 against Boston College limiting the Eagle hitters to a .234 batting average. In 54 innings of work, FSU has allowed just 11 earned runs and 12 walks while striking out 43.

In ACC Play

Dating back to the final series of the 2006 season, Florida State has won 15 of its last 16 ACC series including nine sweeps. The lone series the Seminoles lost during that span was to Clemson last year as the Tigers took 2-of-3 from FSU in Tallahassee. Already in 2008, Florida State has swept Maryland, Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech and Virginia and took 2-of-3 from Wake Forest to start the season 14-1 in the conference. FSU sits atop the Atlantic Division and currently has a 5.5 game lead over second place NC State. The Seminoles 10-0 start marked the third time in school history that FSU started a season undefeated through the first 10 games. It was FSU's best start in the conference since starting 13-0 back in 1999. In 1996, the Seminoles ran out to a 17-0 start.

Divisional Conference Breakdown

Now in its third season of using a division breakdown in the ACC, Florida State has posted a record of 26-9 against teams in the Atlantic Division including a mark of 11-6 on the road. FSU is 6-0 against Boston College since the conference adopted the two division format and 3-0 on the Eagles' home turf. The Seminoles are 28-11 against team in the Coastal Division. Last year, FSU claimed its first ACC Atlantic Division title en route to earning the No. 1 overall seed in the ACC Tournament. With a mark of 24-6 last year, the Seminoles set the school record for the most conference wins in a season surpassing the previous record of 22-2 set in 1999. The 24 victories also tied for the most wins recorded in ACC history (Clemson - 24 in 2006).

A Perfect 9-for-9 In Stolen Bases

Florida State set a season-high for stolen bases in a game Wednesday night against Jacksonville as the Seminoles were a perfect 9-for-9 in the stolen base category. Tyler Holt, Jason Stidham, Jack Rye and Luke Smierciak each swiped a pair of bases while Tony Delmonico had one. Holt broke a 2-2 tie in the top of the seventh as he successfully stole home. The nine stolen bases were the most in one game since FSU registered eight against West Virginia back on March 6, 2004. Entering Wednesday's contest against Jacksonville, Florida State had 18 steals in 33 attempts with a season-high of three against Duquesne. The school record for the most stolen bases in a game is 11 set three times - Virginia (1994), Richmond (1986) and Stetson (1957).

One-Run Games

Just passed the half way mark of the 2008 season and Florida State has already equaled its 2007 total of one-run games. Last year, the Seminoles posted a respectable 7-2 mark in one-run games. This year the Seminoles have been perfect going 9-0 with six of those games occurring in league play. Four of those six games have resulted in walk-off victories.

Florida State Starts Five Freshmen

For the first time all season, head coach Mike Martin put five freshmen in the starting lineup on Tuesday, March 18 at Florida. Center fielder Tyler Holt, third baseman Stuart Tapley and

pitcher/outfielder Mike McGee have all been regulars in the starting lineup this year. Joining the trio in the starting lineup in Gainesville were Jack Posey, making his third start at DH, and Luke Smierciak who was making his first collegiate start in right field.

11 Reaches 1500 Career Wins

Florida State's Mike Martin added yet another milestone to his already illustrious career as the Hall of Fame coach became just the third coach in NCAA Division I history to reach 1,500 career victories. With Sunday's victory over Georgia Tech, Martin joined Texas' Augie Garrido (1,651) and Wichita State's Gene Stephenson (1,630) atop that plateau. Martin owns a career record of 1,512-509-4 good for an all-time winning percentage of .748 which ranks third in the NCAA among active Division I coaches.

Seminole Pitching

Over the last 10 games, FSU has not yielded more than four earned runs in a single game. The Seminoles have allowed 23 earned runs in 93 innings, 32 walks and 85 strikeouts while going 9-1 during that span. In a three-game sweep of Virginia, six FSU pitchers combined for 33 strikeouts and just 11 walks.

Tommy O Packing The Offense

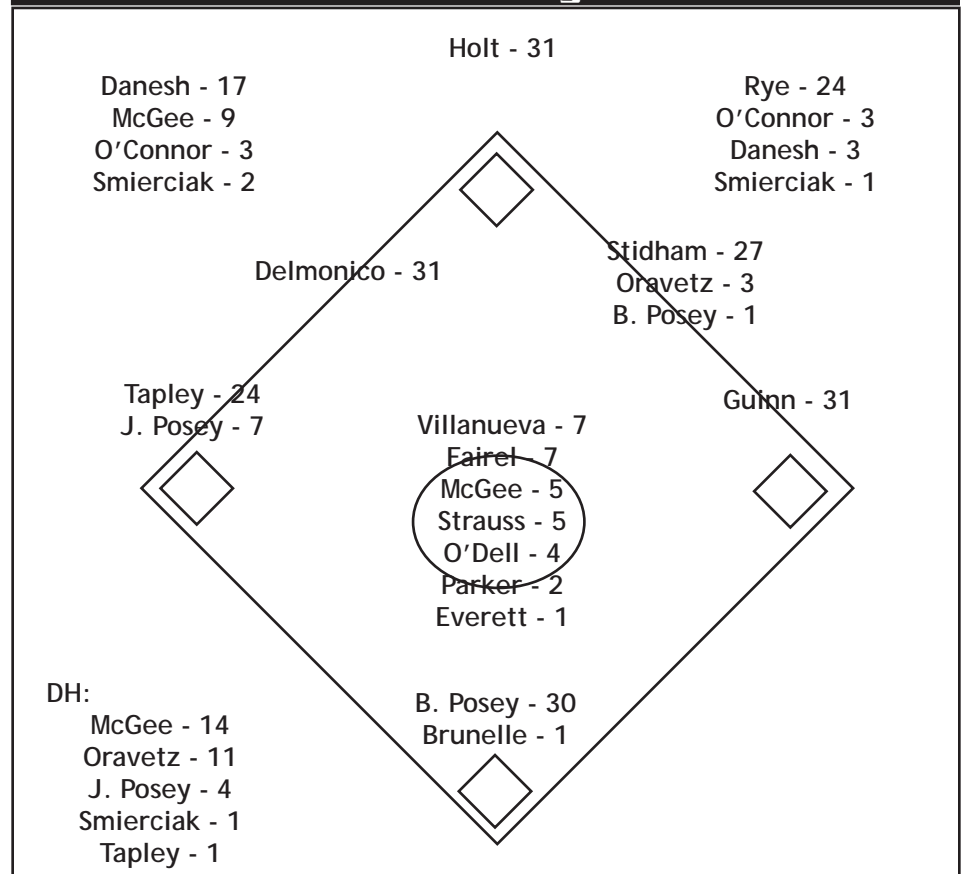
In his third year at Florida State, Tommy Oravetz is having his best year yet at the half way point of the 2008 season. The junior from Tallahassee, Fla., has appeared in 28 games this year and has set a season-high with 14 starts (11 at DH and 3 at 2B). Oravetz currently sits fourth on the team in hitting with a .375 average as half of his 21 hits have gone for extra bases. He has already set career season-highs for doubles (7), triples (2), home runs (2) and total bases (38). On top of all that, he is also the team's best hitter off the bench as he leads the Seminoles with four pinch hits in nine plate appearances.

National Recognition

Florida State leads the nation in walks with 220 and is just one of two schools to register more than 200 walks so far this season (Arizona State). The Seminoles also rank in the top 10 in eight other offensive categories including batting average (2nd), runs scored (2nd), hits (t-3rd), scoring (4th) slugging percentage (4th), doubles (6th), home runs (t-6th) and doubles per game (10th). The Seminoles rank 26th in ERA with a mark of 3.68.

Buster Posey ranks in the top 10 in seven offensive categories including a pair of top 5 rankings in total runs scored (t-2nd) and total bases (5). Tyler Holt is tied for the national lead in walks

Friday - Moves into the Seminole rotation in 2008 after pitching out of the bullpen as a freshman...posted a 2-0 record with a 2.94 ERA in 21 appearances in 2007...named ACC Pitcher of the Week after throwing eight dominating innings against Georgia Tech...Seminole offense averaging 12.6 runs per game in games that Fairel starts...average game time when Fairel starts is just over 2:39...the only pitcher in the ACC and just one of two in the nation with seven wins on the season...second in the ACC in ERA...earned his first career victory in his starting role debut against Duquesne; set career-highs in innings pitched (5.0) and strikeouts (7) against the Dukes...surpassed his previous career-high for innings pitched in his second start at Auburn working seven innings to run his record to 2-0 on the year...allowed two runs, one earned, on three hits...struck out three and walked three...tied a career-high with 7 innings pitched and 7 strikeouts vs. MD...did not allow a run while scattering 7 hits...for the third straight outing, set a career-high with eight innings and nine strikeouts to earn his fourth straight victory of the season with an 11-2 victory over GT...did not allow a hit until two outs in the fourth...registered 8 of his 9 strikeouts over the final four innings while striking out the side in the eighth...completed 7 innings for the fourth straight game in picking up his fifth win in five starts in 2008 against the Hokies...tied a season-high with 7 hits while giving up the most runs this season - 3 runs, 2 earned...against Wake Forest threw into the sixth inning for the fifth straight start...allowed two runs on six hits and tied a season-high with three walks in Winston-Salem...won his seventh consecutive game to start 2008 with a 10-3 win over Virginia...after giving up two runs on two hits in the first, shut down the Cavalier bats giving up zero runs while scattering four hits the rest of the way...reached the 7 strikeout plateau for the fourth time this year.

with 36 while he sits as the top freshman player in the country in walks (t-1st), walks per game (4th) and runs scored (t-16 overall). Dennis Guinn is tied for 12th in home runs. Sophomore Jason Stidham has the fewest strikeouts among Seminole starters and ranks 30th nationally as the toughest player to strikeout averaging just one strikeout in 18.8 at-bats. Matt Fairrel is one of only two players with seven wins to lead the nation and sits 22nd in ERA (1.72).

Walking Off Victories

Halfway through the season and Florida State has already recorded four walk-off victories in its final at-bat including two in the bottom of the ninth and two in back-to-back extra inning games. The two ninth inning victories came in back-to-back ACC games one against Maryland, the other against Georgia Tech. In a game that featured seven lead changes and two ties, freshman Stuart Tapley spoiled any chances of a Maryland upset in the series finale as he delivered a walk-off bases loaded single in the bottom of the ninth to give the Seminoles a 9-8 victory over the Terrapins. Tony Delmonico scored the game-winning run.

Ohmed Danesh followed that with a two-out, two-run bases loaded single in the first of three games against Georgia Tech. Luke Smierciak scored the game-winner after entering the game as a pinch runner replacing Dennis Guinn who drew a walk.

In consecutive 10th inning wins over Virginia, Jack Rye registered his third career walk-off victory with a bases loaded single scoring Luke Smierciak. In game two of a twin bill, Tyler Holt hit a chopper to third scoring Smierciak, who slid home in plenty of time on a play at the plate. Smierciak was hit by a pitch to lead off the 10th inning in both games. He has scored three of the four game-winning runs in 2008.

In its 62 game schedule a year ago, Florida State was involved in just one walk-off game, an 11th inning, 7-6 victory over Wake Forest. Jack Rye provided the heroics hitting an RBI single to defeat the Demon Deacons back on March 16, 2007.

Hot Start In 2008

For the second straight year, Florida State started a season undefeated at 12-0 before falling to Georgia 13-10 in the first of a two-game series. It marked just the third time in the Mike Martin era and the fifth time in the 61-year history of the program that FSU opened the season with a 12-0 record. In 1972 and 1985, FSU started 12-0 while in 1975 the Seminoles ran out to a 15-0 mark under then head coach Woody Woodward. Last year, Florida State set the school record for the best start in school history winning its first 23 games to start 23-0.

Walking On Sunshine

Florida State has showed great patience at the plate in the early portion of the season drawing a league-high 220 walks, 63 more than Miami who sit second with 157 base-on-balls. The Seminoles are the only team in the ACC to record more walks than strikeouts. FSU is on pace to draw 390 walks in 55 games. FSU has already registered double-digit walks in nine games this season including a season-high 14 in game two against Virginia Tech.

Double-Digit Hits

The string of double-digit hit games came to an end at 13 straight as the Seminoles were held to seven hits in an 8-3 victory over Georgia. Florida State continues to lead the ACC in hitting with a .352 batting average. The Seminoles have scored 305 runs on 385 hits as 139 of those hits have been of the extra base variety. FSU recorded a season-high 21 runs on 21 hits in a 19-run victory over Wake Forest in game one. The Seminoles have notched double-digit hits in 23 of their first 31 games. In 2007, FSU registered double-digit hits in 18 of its first 20 games including a streak of 16 straight. The Seminoles finished the season with 47 double-digit hit games. Last year's 16 straight double-digit hit games were the longest of record dating back to 1996.

Buster Posey - A "Jack" of All Trades

When Buster Posey arrived on campus as a freshman in the fall of 2005, he stepped in and filled a void at shortstop. Posey finished his first season in the spring of 2006 playing all 65 games at short, batting .346 with 85 hits and 48 RBIs en route to earning Freshman All-American accolades. In 2007, the Seminole coaching staff was faced with filling a void at the catcher position and once again looked to Posey. Having never played the position in his career, the Leesburg, Ga., native finished the year earning first team All-America and All-ACC first team accolades while becoming a finalist for the Johnny Bench Award, presented to the nation's top collegiate catcher. Then in 2008, FSU was in search of a closer after the departure of Danny Rosen and Luke Tucker. Once again, the coaching staff looked to Posey, who has stepped in nicely making three appearances on the year posting a 0.00 ERA with three strikeouts and two saves in two opportunities. In game two of a mid-week series against UNC Asheville, Posey checked one more position off the list as the junior right hander made his first collegiate start at second base. What else does Posey have in store for '08? Stay tuned!

Tops In The ACC

Junior Buster Posey leads the ACC in seven offensive categories including batting average (.458), hits (55), runs scored (44), triples (3), total bases (100), on base percentage (.554) and slugging percentage (.833). He also ranks in the top 10 in four other offensive categories including doubles (t-2nd), RBIs (t-3rd), home runs (4th) and walks (6th). Freshman Tyler Holt is tied for the league lead in walks with 36 while freshman Mike McGee is tied with Posey and eight other league members with three triples.

Posey At Third?

That's right there's been a Posey sighting at third base in 2008. And yes, I'm talking about Jack Posey. The younger Posey made his first start in the field in game one Friday, March 21 against Virginia Tech and started at third the entire weekend. He started at the hot corner while freshman Stuart Tapley was sidelined with an injured right wrist. Posey has seven starts at third base in 2008 and has committed just two errors in 39 opportunities. At the plate, Posey has registered six hits including a double, a home run and seven RBIs.

Walk It Out

Freshman Tyler Holt has stepped in nicely as the Seminole leadoff hitter in 2008. The Gainesville, Fla., native is tied with Wake Forest's Allan Dykstra for the national lead in walks with 36. Holt is averaging 1.16 walks per game. At one point in the season, Holt drew a walk in 13 consecutive games and has a base-on-ball in 24 of 31 in 2008. The freshman center fielder has reached base safely in every game this season while drawing two or more walks in 10 games. Twice this year he has registered three walks games. Holt is currently fourth on the team and ninth in the conference in on-base percentage with a .480 mark.

Rain, Rain, Go Away

Rain has played havoc on the Seminole schedule in 2008 as Mother Nature has forced five doubleheaders so far this season. Opening day was washed away by rain as was the Seminoles' exhibition game against the Philadelphia Phillies. FSU and Georgia got through 4.5 innings before rain postponed game one of a two-game mid-week series. Rain also forced the cancelation of the first conference game of the season against Maryland back on March 7. It wasn't until the following week that the Seminoles played their first Friday night home game of the 2008 season. FSU and UVa played a twin bill on Sunday, April 6 with both games being decided in 10 innings. Even before the Seminoles hit the field this week, rain has once again caused some early action as the Seminoles and Eagles were forced to play two on Friday due to wet weather approaching the Boston area this weekend.

ACC Honors

Just seven weeks into the season and Florida State has been honored six times by the ACC. Over the past two years, a Florida State student-athlete has been named either the ACC Player or Pitcher of the Week 15 times. In week one, freshman Mike McGee was named Co-Player of the Week sharing the honor with North Carolina's Dustin Ackley. McGee led the Seminoles in hitting with a .727 average collecting eight hits in 11 official at-bats. He scored three runs and drove in six while leading the team in both slugging percentage (1.273) and on-base percentage (.769).

Dennis Guinn picked up his second career ACC weekly honor as the senior first baseman led Florida State to a four-game sweep of Auburn. Guinn hit .563 for the series collecting nine hits, six RBIs, three home runs and a team leading slugging percentage of 1.188. In week five, Guinn was honored for the second time in 2008 for his performance against Florida and Virginia Tech. In those four games, Guinn hit .556 with six doubles and three home runs. He scored seven runs and posted 11 RBIs.

Matt Fairrel joined the list of honorees as the sophomore southpaw was named ACC Pitcher of the Week for the first time in his career. Fairrel earned his fourth victory of the season as he registered eight innings and nine strikeouts, both career-highs, in an 11-2 win over Georgia Tech. Eight of the nine strikeouts posted by Fairrel came in the final four innings as he finished the night striking out the side in the eighth.

This past week Buster Posey was honored as the ACC Player of the Week after leading the Seminoles with a .625 average recording 10 hits in 16 at-bats last week. He posted team-highs in runs scored (10), home runs (2), total bases (19), slugging percentage (1.188) and on-base percentage (.739). Against Wake Forest, Posey hit .700 (7-for-10) with two doubles and two home runs. He scored seven times and recorded four RBIs. He drew four walks, was hit by a pitch and did not strikeout in 15 plate appearances. Posey reached base safely in his first six plate appearances and 10 of his first 11 at-bats against the Deacons. He was a perfect 3-for-3 in game one with a double and two home runs. Posey set a career-high with five runs scored on Friday while scoring the game-winning run in the top of the 11th in the series finale.

Senior Ryan Strauss earned his first career honor picking up wins against No. 13 Florida and No. 14 Virginia. Strauss made his first start against Florida in Jacksonville allowing just one run on four hits in the win. Pitched three innings in relief in game one of a doubleheader against Virginia as the Tampa, Fla., native did not allow a run or a hit striking out six of the 10 batters that he faced.

Early Recognition

The preseason accolades have poured in for the Seminoles in 2008. Junior Buster Posey and senior Jack Rye most recently were named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List for National Player of the Year. Since the inception of the Golden Spikes Award back in 1978, a Florida State student-athlete has received the award three times as Mike Fuentes (1981), Mike Loynd (1986) and J.D. Drew (1997) have all won the award. No school in America has produced more winners of this prestigious award than Florida State.

Posey has also received first team All-America honors by Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America and Rivals.com, while earning third team recognition from the NCBWA. Rye has been honored as a second team All-American by Collegiate Baseball and Rivals.com. Posey joins senior Ryan Strauss and sophomore Jason Stidham as a watch list member for the Brooks Wallace Award - an honor given to the nation's top collegiate player. Posey was recently named to the Johnny Bench Award watch list, an award he was named a finalist for a season ago. Strauss was also recognized on the watch list for the Roger Clemens Award. The right hander out of Tampa, Fla., was also named one of 30 nominees for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award presented to the top senior Division I college baseball player who excels both on and off the field.

Two Out Runs...Two Out Hits

Picking up where they left off a season ago, the Seminoles continue to hit well with two outs in an inning posting an average of .354 with 128 hits in 362 at-bats. Through the first seven weeks, FSU has scored 98 runs on two outs which amount to 32.1% of the total run production in 2008. Senior Dennis Guinn leads the way with 15 two-out RBIs. Five Seminoles are hitting .400 or better with two outs while junior Tommy Oravetz leads all hitters with a .526 average. Junior Tony Delmonico leads the team with 15 two-out hits. In 2007, FSU hit .330 with two outs accumulating 243 hits in 736 two-out opportunities. Thirty-nine percent of the run production last season was scored with two-outs as the Seminoles scored 219 runs in 62 games.

Back-To-Back Jacks

Sophomore Jason Stidham and junior Buster Posey have been a solid one-two punch as the two, three hitters in the Seminole lineup. Twice this season the Seminole duo has hit back-to-back home runs. The first time occurred on March 28 against Wake Forest in the first inning, while the second time occurred on April 4 vs. Virginia in the eighth inning. Tyler Holt and Stidham provided the first back-to-back jacks of the season on opening day. The feat was performed against Duquesne in the fifth inning.

Wow...Now That's An Inning

After being shutout for seven innings against UNC Asheville in game two, Florida State erased a five-run deficit pushing across 10 runs in the bottom of the eighth to post its first come-from-behind victory of the season. The Seminoles sent 15 batters to the plate that inning registering five walks and seven hits including hitting for the cycle with two home runs, a triple, a double and three singles. The last time FSU scored 10 or more runs in a single inning came in the NCAA Regional elimination game against Stetson when the Seminoles put up 11 runs in the seventh in a 17-1 victory.

FSU Visits Hokie Spirit Memorial

The Florida State baseball team will pay respect to the lives lost during the tragic event that occurred on April 16, 2007 visiting the Hokie Spirit Memorial prior to the start of Friday's game against Virginia Tech. In honor of those lives lost, the FSU baseball team has been wearing a black patch on the left side of their ball caps and helmets and will continue to do so for the duration of the season. Today and everyday, we are all Hokies.
