The Series - FSU vs. Duke

- Following back-to-back mid-week contests against Florida and Jacksonville, the sixth-ranked Seminoles are back on the road as they travel to the Carolinas for the second weekend in a row and third time this year.
- FSU renews its rivalry with Duke as the two schools have not faced each other since 2007 when the Noles took 2-of-3 from the Blue Devils in Durham.
- This weekend's three-game series will take place in the Town of Cary at the USA Baseball Training Complex.
- Florida State leads the all-time series 60-18, while posting a mark of 19-7 when traveling to play Duke. The Noles have won 31 of the last 34 meetings against the Blue Devils.

• The Seminoles have never lost an ACC series at Duke in eight previous trips to Durham. Of those eight series, FSU has only swept all three games twice.

Scouting the Blue Devils

- Duke has split its last 10 games heading into the weekend series against Florida State. The Blue Devils are coming off a big series victory over Clemson last weekend.
- Senior Jeremy Gould is pacing the Duke offense posting a team-best .319 average in 34 games. He currently leads the team in hits (44) and doubles (12). Jake Lemmerman is the clubhouse leader in home runs (8) and RBI (30).
- Defensively, the Blue Devils boast the top fielding team in the ACC posting a .981 fielding percentage committing just 24 errors 34 games. On the mound, Duke's team ERA is 4.93.
- Duke is a perfect 5-0 in games played in Cary at the USA Baseball Training Complex in 2010.

Familiar Territory

- The Noles are no strangers to the USA Training Complex having played North Carolina in a weekend series back in 2008.
- The Tar Heels won that series two games to three as both teams scored 18 runs each.
- Tyler Holt is also very familiar with the grounds in Cary having roamed the outfield grass as a member of Team USA last summer. With Team USA, Holt hit .371 in 22 games tallying five doubles, 14 RBI and scoring 28 runs.

Consecutive Starts

- Junior Tyler Holt has started every game for the Garnet and Gold since arriving in Tallahassee as a freshman back in 2008.

- Holt has been the starting centerfielder at FSU for 165 consecutive games.
- The school record for consecutive games played is held by Link Jarrett, who appeared in 235 games in a row from 1991 to 1994.
- Paul Sorrento holds the FSU record for consecutive games played in a season with 84 in 1984.

Series Victory Over The Gators

- Florida State's 3-2 victory over Florida on April 13 in Tallahassee gave the Seminoles the regular season series as the Garnet and Gold won three of the four games.
- Both schools won on their home turf, while the Noles captured both games on neutral soil defeating the Gators 10-5 in Tampa and 7-2 in Jacksonville.
- The series victory for the Seminoles was the second in the last three years over the Gators.
- Prior to FSU's 2008 regular season series victory, FSU had not won a regular season series from UF since 2005.

- In commemorating the final season that the College World Series will be played in Omaha's Johnny Rosenblatt Stadium, the NCAA is asking baseball fans to help select the CWS Legends Team.
- The Legends Team will represent those student-athletes who had the best CWS performances in the 60 years the event has been played at Rosenblatt Stadium

ALS Awareness Night

- Seminole Baseball in conjunction with the Florida State University Department of Athletics and the ALS Association Florida Chapter is hosting ALS Awareness Night at the ball park on Wednesday, April 21 at 6:00 p.m., when FSU takes on Charleston Southern inside Dick Howser Stadium.
- Among many things surrounding the event, the game will feature a silent auction in which fans will be able to bid on a variety of items.
- In honor of this special event, the Seminole

players and coaches will wear special red jerseys for the game against the Buccaneers. Fans will then have a chance to bid on this authentic gear as the jerseys will be auctioned off for one week on Seminoles.com. The auction will begin Monday, April 19 at 12:00 p.m. and run through Monday, April 26 at 12:00 p.m.

Divisional Conference Breakdown

- Since the ACC adopted divisional play in 2006, the Seminoles have posted a league record of 90-39 (.698) and have captured three straight Atlantic Division titles.
- Dating back to 2006, FSU has posted a record of 51-13 against teams in the Atlantic Division including a mark of 25-7 at home and 26-6 on the road.
- Against Coastal Division teams, the Seminoles are 39-26 overall, 22-13 at home and 17-13 on the road.
- In the three seasons that FSU has won the divisional crown, the Seminoles are averaging over 21 wins in the ACC. This includes a school record 24 wins in league action in 2008 - tied for the most league wins with Clemson (24 - 2006).

On The Road In The ACC

- Florida State faced North Carolina in its first ACC road series of the season, taking 2-of-3 from the Tar Heels, while following that up with a series sweep over Wake Forest in Winston-Salem.
- Now in its 19th season of ACC play, the Seminoles have posted an all-time league road record of 151-79, good for a .657 winning percentage.
- During the first 18 seasons, the Noles have finished the year with a record of .500 or better 16 times (5-7 in 2000 & 7-8 in 2005).
- FSU's best all-time road record in terms of winning percentage came in 1999 when the Noles finished 11-1 (.917).
- After taking 2-of-3 from the Tar Heels in the Noles first ACC road series of the season, FSU has now won 14 of its previous 19 ACC road openers and are 37-17 all-time in league road openers
- When FSU faced UNC, it marked the fourth time that the Noles' road opener in the ACC came against the Tar Heels. The Seminoles have won three of those four road series and are 8-4 all-time when facing the Heels in their league road opener.
- The series sweep against the Deacs marked the sixth for the Seminoles in Winston-Salem and seventh series victory in 10 all-time trips to the Dash.

In Opening ACC Play

- For the second year in a row, Florida State dropped the ACC series opener as Virginia took 2-of-3 from the Seminoles in Tallahassee, March 12-14.
- Florida State had never lost an opening series in the ACC, a string of 17 consecutive series victories, until last year when the Seminoles dropped two of three from Boston College.
- Since joining the ACC back in 1992, FSU has posted an all-time record of 45-9 on opening weekend in league play.
- Before the series loss to BC, the last time the Garnet and Gold lost a game in an opening series was on March 15, 2002 at Virginia.
- Florida State is 14-4 against Virginia when opening ACC play including a record of 12-3 when playing inside Dick Howser Stadium.

Parker In Rotation After Short Rest

- Geoff Parker made his second start of the season on short rest in the series finale against Virginia Tech on April 4. His first start on short rest (5 days) came in the week that FSU played both Florida (3/2) & Georgia (3/7).
- Parker defeated Florida in Tampa back on March 2 throwing 5.1 innings allowing just one run as he struck out three. He then earned a no decision against Georgia working 4.0 innings as he struck out a then season-high six batters.
- On the second time around on short rest, Parker earned a pair of no decisions after working a combined 7.2 innings.
- Parker is no stranger to short rest as he led the

team in appearances with 31 as a sophomore. The right hander from Dade City, Fla., worked on back-to-back days six times last year and even made an appearance twice in a doubleheader against Grambling State. He earned a no decision in his first outing (1.0 IP) and picked up the win in his second outing (2.2 IP).

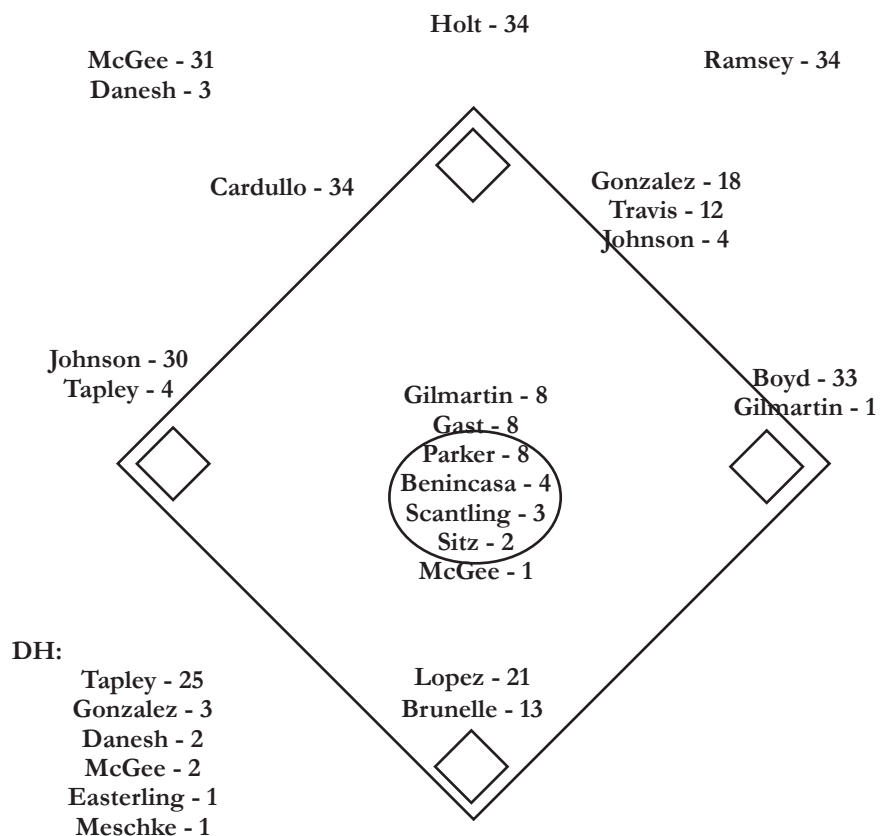
Holt Hits For The Cycle

- Fans at Dick Howser Stadium to see the series finale against Maryland on March 28 witnessed history as junior center fielder Tyler Holt hit for the cycle.
- Holt becomes the first Seminoles to perform the feat since Stephen Drew hit for the cycle at Wake Forest back on May 20, 2004 a game in which FSU won 11-10.
- It took Holt his first four at-bats to accomplish the feat as he went in order with a single, double, triple and home run.
- Holt collected a single down the right field foul line in the first, a double down the left field foul line in the second, a triple to gap in left center in the third and a home run to left in the fifth.

Brunelle Has Career Night

- Junior catcher Parker Brunelle had a career night against Stetson on March 24 as the Snellville, Ga., native set career-highs with four hits and two doubles, while tying career-highs for at-bats (5), runs scored (2) and RBI (3).
- Parker's four-hit performance was the first by a Seminole this year.

Brunelle Continues Hot Streak

- Since his career night against Stetson on March 24, Parker Brunelle put together a career-best seven-game hit streak.
- During the streak, Brunelle hit .414 (12-for-29) with 10 runs and 13 RBI. He recorded an RBI in six of those seven games which included four multi-RBI games and three, 3-RBI contests. Brunelle also scored a run in six of those games.
- On the season, Brunelle has already established season-highs in RBI (16), doubles (3) and home runs (3), while his 16 hits are just one shy of his season-high 17 set as a sophomore in 2009.

Noles Secure Series Victory At UNC

- With a pair of late inning rallies in games one and three against North Carolina, Florida State secured its first series victory against the Tar Heels in Chapel Hill since 2000.
- The last four victories for FSU in the series have all been decided in the ninth inning including a pair of walk-off victories in Tallahassee in 2009.
- The series victory by the Seminoles broke a streak of four straight series victories by the Tar Heels on their home turf. In 2000, FSU took 2-of-3 from UNC.

McGee's New Role

- With two years of experience serving as both a starter and a reliever, the Seminole coaching staff has turned to junior right hander Mike McGee as their new closer.
- McGee did not disappoint in his new role throwing 1.2 scoreless innings against North Carolina to earn saves in both of FSU's come-from-behind victories in game 1 and game 3.
- In nine relief appearances so far in 2010, McGee has worked 9.1 innings allowing just one run on four hits and two walks while striking out nine. He is 1-0 with 7 saves and a 1.08 ERA as a reliever.
- He currently ranks second in the ACC in saves.

Scantling Looms Large In First Start

- Sophomore Hunter Scantling took the mound for his first start of the season in the series finale against Maryland and second start against an ACC opponent.

- After giving up a leadoff home run on the very first pitch of the game, the right hander settled in nicely allowing just one more hit the rest of the way to earn his first victory of the season.
- Scantling finished the game working 5.0 innings allowing three runs, one earned, on two hits.
- In seven career starts, Scantling is 3-2 with a 4.50 ERA - 34 IP, 31 H, 21 R, 17 ER, 11 BB, 15 K

Sitz Set On A Starting Role

- Scott Sitz definitely made a case to remain in the Seminole starting rotation after throwing six scoreless innings against North Florida back on April 7 in his first collegiate start.
- The freshman right hander scattered just two hits and walked two while striking out a career-high four Osprey hitters.
- Sitz did not allow a base runner passed second base and retired the last seven batters that he faced before leaving after the sixth.

FSU Baseball - Among The Elite

- Success is synonymous with Florida State Baseball as the program enters its 63rd year of existence in 2010.
- In 16 of the last 19 seasons, the Seminoles have claimed the ACC regular season title or finished with the best record in the league, won the ACC Tournament title or advanced to the College World Series in Omaha, Neb.
- All of this is pretty impressive for a school that has the most wins in Division I since 2000 and the second highest winning percentage of all-time in Division I history.

For the third year in a row, the Florida State baseball team is favored to win the ACC's Atlantic Division title as voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. The Seminoles garnered 70 points including 10 first place votes to win the Atlantic Division crown. Since the league's inception of divisional play in 2006, the Seminoles have captured three of the four divisional titles including three straight in 2007, 2008 and 2009. This year marks the fifth year of divisional play in the ACC, as both the Atlantic and Coastal Divisions have produced two different winners. Florida State (2007, 2008 & 2009) and Clemson (2006) have shared the Atlantic title, while North Carolina (2006, 2007 & 2009) has won three Coastal Division crowns with Miami finishing on top in 2008.

- On Sunday, April 4, Martin earned career victory No. 1,600 with FSU's 9-6 win over Virginia Tech. Ironically on the same day, Wichita State head coach Gene Stephenson earned his 1,700th career win.
- Martin becomes just the fourth coach in all divisions to reach this historic milestone and third in Division I history.
- The elusive group includes Gordie Gillespie (1,835), Augie Garrido (1,745) and Gene Stephenson (1,704) - **Mike Martin (1,605)**.

Johnson Goes Big Against Hofstra

- Sophomore Sherman Johnson was named **ACC Player of the Week** for the first time in his career on March 1 putting the finishing touches on a fine weekend against Hofstra in week 2.
- The Tampa, Fla., native drove in a team-high 10 runs while going 5-for-8 at the plate with five runs scored as FSU swept a three-game series from Hofstra.
- Johnson, who started at both second and third in the series against the Pride, tied a career-high with three hits while establishing a career-high six RBI in game one. He finished a triple short of hitting for the cycle in the first game.
- His six RBI performance was the first by a Seminole hitter since Mike McGee drove in six runs in a 15-6 victory over Wake Forest on April 24, 2009.
- With two home runs against Hofstra, Johnson surpassed his career total (1) during his freshman season in 2009.

Cardullo Shines Versus SEC Foes

- Senior Stephen Cardullo was named **ACC Player of the Week** for the first time this season and second time in his career in leading FSU to a perfect weekend with wins over No. 5 Florida and No. 25 Georgia.
- Cardullo hit .600 (9-for-15) over the four games driving in eight runs and scoring five times while converting on all 11 of his fielding chances.
- Began the week with a 2-for-3 performance at the plate with a run and an RBI as he reached base on four of his five plate appearances in the win over the Gators in Tampa.
- The senior shortstop hit .583 (7-for-12) against Georgia driving in seven runs and scoring four times while posting a .667 on-base percentage.
- At one stretch during the series, Cardullo reached base in nine consecutive at-bats including all five times on three singles and two walks in a game two victory over the Bulldogs.

Holt's Cycle Leads To ACC POW

- For the second time in his career, Tyler Holt was named **ACC Player of the Week** sharing the honors with Georgia Tech's Derek Dietrich on March 29.
- Holt led FSU to a perfect 4-0 week including a weekend series sweep at home against Maryland to climb within one game of the ACC Atlantic Division lead. Holt hit .429 in the four games last

week reaching base in every game while scoring at least one run.

- Holt hit for the cycle in the series finale against the Terps while hitting home runs in back-to-back games bringing his season total to four.

Lopez On Bench Watch List

- Redshirt junior Rafael Lopez was one of 53 student-athletes named to the watch list of the 2010 Coleman Company-Johnny Bench Award - presented to the top catcher in the nation.
- The watch list will be narrowed down to 10 semifinalists, whom will be announced May 19, 2010.
- FSU's Buster Posey, a two-time finalist for the Bench Award, won the award in 2008.

Golden Spikes Recognition

- Florida State's Sean Gilmartin and Tyler Holt were named to the Golden Spikes Award watch list in 2010.
- The initial watch list includes 50 student-athletes with the list being narrowed to 30 on June 1.
- Florida State leads all schools with the most Golden Spikes Award winners at four:

Quick Start Noles

- For the third time in the last four years and for the sixth time overall, FSU started a season undefeated opening the 2010 campaign with a 12-0 record.
- During that undefeated start, the Seminoles outscored the competition 133-32.
- The 12-0 start marked the fourth time in the Mike Martin era that FSU opened the season on such a streak.
- In 2007, Florida State set the school record for the best start in school history winning its first 23 games.
 - 2007: 23-0
 - 1975: 15-0
 - 1972, 1985, 2008, **2010**: 12-0

A Give And Take Relationship

- One of the big reasons for FSU's 25-7 start is the team's ability to answer the call when the opposing team scores a run.
- Through 34 games, an opponent has scored a run in 83 of a possible 301 innings in which the opposing team has garnered an at-bat. Three times the opposing team has scored a run in the ninth thus not giving the Noles the opportunity to hit.
- The Seminoles have followed an opponents run with a run in their next at-bat 42 times.

Noles Drawing Blanks

- For the first time since 2008, the Seminoles shut out an opponent after blanking Hofstra 13-0 in game two of a doubleheader in week two.
- Three Seminole pitchers combined for the two-

hit shutout as the Garnet and Gold kept an opponent off the scoreboard for the first time since blanking NC State 1-0 back on May 16, 2008.

- John Gast scattered two hits over 5.0 innings, while Brian Busch and Andrew Durden each pitched a scoreless inning in relief in game completed after seven innings.

- FSU followed that performance with a one-hit shutout against Jacksonville on March 8. It marked the first nine-inning shutout of the season.

- The last time FSU posted multiple shutouts in a single season was in 2008 when the Seminoles registered three.

- The school record for shutouts in a season is 15 performed twice back in 1970 and 1975.

Double-Digit Figures

- The Florida State offense reached double-digit runs in nine of their first 12 games, while stringing together a streak of 10 straight double-digit hit games.

- Dating back to last year, the Seminoles had a run of 15 consecutive games where they registered double-digit hits before the streak came to an end with a six-hit night at Jacksonville on March 8.

- During the streak, FSU was averaging 14.4 hits

per game.

- In 2007, the Seminoles put together a streak of 16 straight games in which they reached double-digit hits, the longest of record dating back to 1996.

- In 2010, Florida State has scored double-digit runs 13 times, while recording 23 double-digit hit games.

- The Noles currently sit sixth in the ACC in hitting with a .303 team batting average.

Triple It Up

- A year ago the Seminole hit just 16 triples as a team with five players recording more than one.

- Through the 34 games of the 2010 season, the Seminoles are more than 93 percent of the way from matching last year's team triple total as nine players have combined to hit 15.

- The Seminoles are fourth in the ACC in triples with 15 including four off the bat of James Ramsey to lead all players.

- Sophomore James Ramsey tied a school record with two triples in Sunday's series finale against Georgia State. He became the sixth player in school history to perform such a feat and first since March 6, 2005 when Tony Thomas, Jr. hit two against Hawaii-Hilo.

• It wasn't until game 61 (NCAA Regional Championship game vs. Ohio State) of the 2009 season that FSU recorded its 15th triple of the season.

Walk It Out

• The first four hitters in the Seminole line-up did a great job of getting on base during the opening weekend series against Georgia State drawing 16 of the 23 total walks.

• Half of those walks turned into runs as hitters 1 through 4 in the Seminole line-up scored a total of eight times against the Panthers.

• James Ramsey led the Seminoles with six walks in the three-game series against GSU. He tied a career-high drawing three walks in back-to-back contests against the Panthers.

• FSU is second in the ACC with 209 walks. The Noles are averaging 6.1 walks per game.

Oh So Close For Tapley

• Junior Stuart Tapley put together a nice stretch over a four game span as the Orlando, Fla., native reached base on 12 consecutive plate appearances.

• The mark fell one short of the school record (13) set by Paul Sorrento in 1985.

One-Hit Performance

• Mike McGee, Tyler Everett and Daniel Bennett combined to throw a one-hit shutout in downing Jacksonville 2-0 on March 8.

• It marked the first one-hitter since opening day on January 28, 2005 when Mark Sauls, Kevin Lynch and Tyler Chambliss combined to one-hit Charleston Southern in a 2-1 FSU victory.

Limiting The Hits

• Already this year, the Seminole pitching staff has posted a one-hit and two-hit shutout. Twenty-one times this year, FSU hurlers have held the opposition to single-digit hits.

• The last time the FSU pitching staff posted a one-hitter and two-hitter in the same year was back in 2005 when the Seminoles opened the season holding Charleston Southern to just one hit on opening day followed by two hits in game two.

• FSU two-hit Wake Forest in the opening game of the series against the Deacs en route to a 10-1 victory in Winston-Salem

Hats Off To The Bullpen

• The Seminole bullpen got off to a great start in 2010 working a combined 11.0 innings through the first three games of the season en route to posting a 1-0 record and a 1.64 ERA.

• Seven different pitchers saw action out of the pen in FSU's opening weekend series against Georgia State including four newcomers - three freshmen and one JUCO transfer.

• The four newcomers (Robert Benincasa, Andrew Durden, Daniel Bennett and Scott Sitz) worked a combined 5.0 scoreless innings allowing just two hits and three walks while striking out six.

• The bullpen continued to impress in week 2 as 10 pitchers combined to work 12.0 innings allowing three runs, two earned, on five hits while

striking out 11.

• Through 34 games, the Seminoles bullpen is 11-3 with 10 saves and a 3.13 ERA posting 132 strikeouts in 135.0 innings of work.

• Against Hofstra, three pitchers made their Seminole debut, all in the series finale, including Tye Buckley, Corben Madden and David Trexler. The appearances for Madden and Trexler were their first in college.

• Robby Scott's first appearance as a Seminole came on the road at North Carolina as the junior southpaw struck out the only batter that he faced.

• Mike McGee is 7-for-7 while Daniel Bennett is 2-for-3 in save opportunities this year, ranking 2nd and t-10th, respectively in the ACC.

McGee Helping His Own Cause

• Twelve times in 2009, Mike McGee served as the Seminole starting pitcher and took a spot in the batting order. In those 12 games, McGee batted .489 (22-for-45) with seven doubles, six home runs, 17 runs, 22 RBI, five walks and seven strikeouts.

• Against Clemson on March 22, McGee started the game on the mound earning a no decision after going 6.0 innings, but finished the game with his bat, knocking a walk-off, three-run home run over the right field wall to give FSU the 7-4 victory.

• Twice McGee hit a pair of home runs in games in which he was the starting pitcher - vs. Clemson (3/22) and at Miami (4/5).

• Although McGee did not hit in his first start against Jacksonville on March 8, we went to left field after his six innings of work and made two plate appearances picking up a double in his first AB. McGee is hitting .500 on the year in games that he hits and pitches.

• McGee pitched 1.2 innings in relief to pick up the win in the series finale against Virginia. McGee started the game in left field and went 3-for-4 at the plate with a home run and two singles. He also drove in two and scored twice.

• In nine games that McGee has pitched in this year, the Port St. Lucie native is hitting .333 (11-for-33) with a home run, a double, four RBI and five runs scored.

Successful Opening Weekend

• Florida State opened the 2010 season with an 11-3 victory over Georgia State to extend its win streak on opening day to 12 straight games.

• With the win, the Seminoles pushed their record to 55-7-1 (.881) all-time on opening day.

• When it comes to home openers, FSU is 59-4 (.937) all-time with only one loss coming in the last 28 years.

• Under Hall of Fame head coach Mike Martin, FSU baseball is 28-3 on opening day.

• With a three-game sweep of Georgia State, FSU has now won 29 consecutive series to open the season - all-time FSU is 52-2-9 in season opening series.

From Football To Baseball

• Redshirt sophomore Taiwan Easterling has

traded in his shoulder pads for a bat, glove and some cleats this spring. Easterling, who was drafted by the Florida Marlins in the sixth round of the 2007 Major League Baseball Draft, has decided to once again give it a go on the diamond. The Hattiesburg, Miss., native hopes to return to form where he was tabbed Mississippi's Mr. Baseball as an outfielder/pitcher following his senior year at Oak Grove High School where he hit .455 with 13 home runs and 56 RBI.

Who Is That At Shortstop

- It what seems to be a common trend over the last few years on opening day - a new season usually means a new look at shortstop. Although this year's situation is a little different as the incumbent Stephen Cardullo made 47 starts at short in 2009, the beginning of the 2010 season will feature the Seminoles sixth starting shortstop on opening day in as many seasons when Cardullo takes the field against GSU on Friday.
- The last time Florida State started the same person at shortstop in consecutive seasons was Stephen Drew (2002-04).
- Since Stephen Drew's departure, the six starters at shortstop on opening day include Ryne Jernigan (2005), Buster Posey (2006), Mark Hallberg (2007), Tony Delmonico (2008), Jason Stidham (2009) and Stephen Cardullo (2010).

Seminole Leadership

- Florida State returns seven position starters including all four All-Americans in Stephen Cardullo, Sean Gilmartin, Tyler Holt and Mike McGee. The position starters combined to play in 418 games a season ago with five of those student-athletes appearing in 60 or more contests.
- Despite a small senior class comprised of just three student-athletes, the junior class is one of the largest in recent memory with 14 on the 2010 roster. Six transferred in from community college while nine played a significant role in the team's run to a berth in the NCAA Super Regional a season ago.

Preseason Accolades

- Four Seminole student-athletes garnered preseason accolades in 2010.
- Tyler Holt received first team recognition from three publications including Collegiate Baseball, NCBWA and Rivals.com and second team honors from Baseball America.
- Coming off an impressive freshman campaign, Sean Gilmartin enters his second season with the Garnet and Gold with high expectations. The NCBWA named him a first team All-American while grabbing third team honors from Collegiate Baseball.
- Mike McGee was honored as a preseason All-American from three different publications including second team accolades from Collegiate Baseball and three team honors from Baseball America and NCBWA.
- Stephen Cardullo received third team accolades from Collegiate Baseball.

A Look At The 2010 Class

- Florida State welcomes 16 new players this season, including 11 freshmen, four transfers and the addition of redshirt sophomore Taiwan Easterling. It is the second most freshmen listed on an opening day roster since 2005 when FSU opened the season with 13 freshmen.
- The Seminoles were recognized by *Collegiate Baseball* with the nation's 22nd best recruiting class in 2010.
- Since associate head coach Jamey Shouppe took over recruiting coordinator duties in 1990, FSU has had a class ranked in the top 25 each year while 13 of his classes have been ranked in the top 10.
- Five newcomers to this year's squad have been selected in the MLB Draft over the last three years. Those individuals include Taiwan Easterling (2007), Andrew Durden (2008), Robert Benincasa (2009), Jayce Boyd (2009) and Justin Gonzalez (2009).
- This year's class features four transfer students who come to Florida State with prior playing experience and will look to make an immediate impact for the Garnet and Gold in 2010. Those student-athletes include Daniel Bennett (Tallahassee Community College), Tye Buckley (Seminole Community College), Andrew Durden (Indian River State College) and Robby Scott (Broward Community College).

2010 HIGHLIGHTS

Entering his 31st season as Florida State's head coach, Mike Martin continues to cement his legacy as one of collegiate baseball's most prolific coaches. On January 5, 2007 his baseball legacy was secured as Martin was enshrined into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. With a victory over Georgia Tech on March 16, 2008, Martin earned his 1,500th career win becoming one of four coaches in NCAA Division I history to reach that mark.

The FSU alum has become the face of Florida State baseball having been associated with the Seminoles for 38 of FSU's 63 seasons. Of the 3,430 baseball games played in program history, Martin has been involved in 2,537 as a player, assistant coach and head coach. What is even more impressive is Martin's involvement in 1,871 of the 2,504 all-time victories at Florida State. In one way or another, Martin has been a part of more than 74.7% of FSU's victories.

Martin has won 15 conference championships since taking over as head coach in 1980 with 11 from the Metro Conference and four in the ACC. Since moving to divisional play in 2006, Martin has led the Seminoles to three consecutive ACC Atlantic Division titles in 2007, 2008 and 2009. FSU's run to a division title in 2008 was accomplished after Martin led the Noles to a league mark of 24-6, a school record for the most conference wins in team history. He is a six-time Metro Conference Coach of the Year and has been recognized as the top coach in the ACC six times as well. Seventy-six Florida State players have earned All-America honors under Martin, while 96 players have garnered first and second team All-ACC recognition. He has coached six players, Mike Fuentes, Mike Loynd, J.D. Drew, Shane Robinson, Tony Thomas, Jr. and Buster Posey, who were named National Players of the Year.

In 2010, Martin was named to Florida State University's list of 100 Distinguished Graduates in celebration of the FSU Alumni Association Centennial.
