## A LOOK at the HOFSTRA SERIES

Florida State and Hofstra square-off on the diamond for a three-game set at Dick Howser Stadium in the first-ever meeting between the two schools. The Seminoles start 6-0 for the 10th time in 28 seasons under head coach Mike Martin after posting a pair of three-game sweeps over Tenn. and UNC Asheville. Hofstra enters the series with an 0-3 mark after being swept at Auburn last weekend. The Pride finished last season with a record of 24-31-1, while posting a mark of 11-19 in the Colonial Athletic Association. Florida State has an all-time record of 33-3 against current schools in the CAA. Game one on Friday will be shown on ACC Select (<http://fsu.playonsports.tv>), while first pitch was changed to 3:00 pm. It will be FSU's third appearance on the web-based program in 2007 as the Noles won the first two meetings against Tennessee.

## THE PROBABLE ROTATION

**FRIDAY: Bryan Henry** looks to rebound from his last outing against UNC Asheville as he takes the mound in game one, Friday afternoon against Hofstra. Last weekend, the Tallahassee, Fla., native got a no decision against the Bulldogs as he worked four innings allowing six runs on seven hits. Henry looked as though he would pick up right where he left off in his impressive season debut against Tennessee as he struck out the first two UNC Asheville batters. He would finish the game with five strikeouts, while walking just two. Following a no decision, Henry has accumulated a 2-1 record in his career. In his first start of the 2007 season, Henry showed why he has been named a first team All-ACC honoree the past two seasons working six solid innings of shutout baseball allowing just four hits and no walks while striking out 11 Tennessee batters (one shy of his career-high set last year against Duke). It was the third time in Henry's career that he has reached double digit strikeouts (10 vs. Auburn 2005; 12 vs. Duke 2006). In 2006, the FSU ace was brilliant versus non-conference competition. Henry went 5-2 with a 2.26 ERA versus non-ACC teams. The senior right hander was even more impressive last year in the regular season versus FSU's non-conference opponents. Henry was a perfect 5-0 with a 0.72 ERA in those games striking out 41 and issuing just eight walks. During the 2006 regular season, non-conference opponents hit just .188 versus Henry in the regular season and he averaged almost 10 K's per nine innings. Last season Henry was tied for the NCAA lead with four combined shutouts and 10 of his 18 starts were quality starts.

**SATURDAY: Michael Hyde** is scheduled to make his 31st career start for FSU in game two of the Hofstra series. The senior right hander earned his second win of the season in as many appearances working five innings allowing five runs, three of which were earned, on five hits. Hyde's consecutive innings streak without giving up a run ended at 18.2 innings (dating back to last season) as the Bulldogs struck for three runs in the top of the first. In his first start of 2007, Hyde pitched a gem throwing 6.1 innings striking out a career-high 10 batters. The Tallahassee, Fla., native matched his previous career-high of seven strikeouts, set in February of 2005 against St. Joseph's, by the end of the fourth inning. Hyde posted a 9-1 record in 2006 and is 18-3 in his Seminole career. Hyde has just one loss in his last 33 appearances, a span including 23 starts. Last season his only loss came versus an SEC team as he lasted just 1.1 innings in a start versus the Gators. Before that defeat, Hyde hadn't lost since March 10, 2005 versus Hawaii. Hyde has been at his best in his career versus non-conference opponents though. Last year he led the team with a 7-1 record versus non-ACC teams while posting an ERA over a run and a half lower than his season ERA. His 2.78 ERA versus non-conference competition was the same as All-American Tyler Chambliss' ERA in those games. In non-conference action, opponents hit just .225 off of Hyde and he held right-handers to an incredible .183 batting average.

**SUNDAY: Ryan Strauss** returns to the starting rotation in game three against Hofstra as the junior right hander will make his fourth career start for the Seminoles and second of the season. Strauss got the win against Tennessee pitching a career-high five innings giving up four runs on six hits while striking out two Volunteer batters. The win was his first career win as a starter. The Tampa, Fla., native made a relief appearance in last Saturday's contest against UNC Asheville working two innings allowing one unearned run on one hit, while walking one and striking out one. In 18 at-bats with runners on base, Strauss has limited the opposition to just three hits, good for a batting average of .167.

The Seminoles have **scored 76 runs** through the first six games of the season an average of 12.7 runs per game. **That run production through the first six games is the third highest total to start a season in the 60 years of Seminole baseball.** Below is a listing of the top five seasons through the first six games in Seminole baseball history with the game scores in parenthesis.

## FAST STARTS

Starting a season undefeated in nothing new to the Seminole Baseball program. In fact, **Florida State has started a season with at least a 6-0 record 17 times in the program's 60-year history.** With head coach Mike Martin at the helm, FSU has started 6-0 10 times in this his 28th season wearing the Garnet and Gold and for the second time in the last three years.

## HOT STARTS

**Tony Thomas, Jr. and Jason Stidham** have gotten off to a fabulous start to the 2007 season. Both carry a six game hitting streak into the weekend series against Hofstra and rank one, two in batting average, hits and slugging percentage respectively, while tied for the team lead with six doubles.

Thomas leads the team in batting average hitting .696. He has posted 16 hits in 23 at-bats and has scored a team-high 15 runs. The junior second baseman is also just two doubles shy of matching last year's total of eight. He already has five multiple hit games and set a career-high with four hits in the series finale against Tennessee. Thomas is also a perfect 5-for-5 in the stolen base category.

As a freshman, Stidham has started all six games at third base and has been productive both at the plate and out on the field. He is currently hitting .522 (12-for-23) on the season, scoring eight runs and driving in seven. Stidham earned Freshman of the Week accolades by Rivals.com for his performance against Tennessee.

## FROM CATCHER TO PITCHER

**Sophomore Buster Posey** made his much anticipated pitching debut at Florida State in the third game of the series against UNC Asheville. Posey went from behind the plate to the mound in the top of the fifth and pitched a scoreless inning. The Leesburg, Ga., native induced a pair of groundball outs including an inning ending 6-4-3 double play.

**ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

**Tony Thomas, Jr., was honored by the league office on Monday, February 12 as the season's first Atlantic Coast Conference Baseball Player of the Week.**

Thomas went 8-for-11 (.727), posting an on-base percentage of .800 and a slugging percentage of 1.000 in Florida State's three-game sweep of UNC Asheville. Thomas reached base safely in five of six at-bats in game one going 2-for-4 with a single, a double, two walks and three runs scored. The offensive production continued for Thomas on Saturday as he went 3-for-4 with three singles, a hit-by-pitch and a stolen base. In the series finale against the Bulldogs, Thomas went to the plate in each of the first four innings recording a bunt single in the first, back-to-back doubles in the second and third innings and a walk in the fourth. The junior second baseman also stole a pair of bases to remain perfect on the season in five attempts. Thomas also got a hit in the first inning of each game this past weekend recording a double and two singles. He scored in the first inning in all three games.

**WHO NEEDS THE LONG BALL?**

Florida State has scored 76 runs on 92 hits through the first six games of the 2007 season, good for an overall team batting average of .405. **Of the 92 hits registered by the Seminole hitters, 23 have gone for extra bases including one triple and one home run. The lone home run came off the bat of junior right fielder Jack Rye,** who hit a three-run shot over the right field fence in the bottom of the fifth against Tennessee on opening day. The home run was the first Seminole dinger of the season and the 15th of Rye's career. First-year Seminole Mark Hallberg collected the only triple of the season connecting on the three-bagger in the bottom of the sixth of game one against Tennessee. Tony Thomas and Jason Stidham are tied for the team lead in doubles with six apiece.

**ROCKY TOP HIGHS**

In the three game series against Tennessee, **three Seminoles players posted individual career-highs** including second baseman Tony Thomas, Jr. and pitchers Michael Hyde and Ryan Strauss. Hyde, Saturday's starter, posted a career-high 10 strikeouts in 6.1 innings pitched. He matched his previous high of seven K's by the fourth inning. In Sunday's victory over the Vols, Thomas set a career-high with four hits, all singles, while Strauss threw a career-high 5.0 innings in earning his first win as a starter.

**RUNS IN BUNCHES**

Sure the Seminoles have scored 76 runs through the first six games, the third highest six-game total to start a season in school history, but what's more impressive is how they are scoring those runs. The Seminoles **have posted multiple runs in 19 innings** this season and have **scored at least one run in 26 of the 48 innings they have played.** The Seminoles have also registered double-digit runs in four consecutive games for the first time since 2004 when FSU scored 19 runs against Jacksonville and 16, 10 and 13 in a three-game sweep of Maryland.

### NATIONAL RECOGNITION

**Senior right hander Bryan Henry was named a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week on Monday, February 5, 2007** for his performance on opening day against Tennessee. The Tallahassee, Fla., native struck out 11 batters in six innings of work as the Seminoles beat the Volunteers, 9-2. The 11 strikeouts were one shy of his career-high set last year against Duke. Henry fanned eight of the first 10 batters he faced, while striking out the side in the first and third innings.

**Rivals.com recognized first-year third baseman Jason Stidham as the Freshman of the Week for his performance against Tennessee.** Stidham hit .500 going 5-for-10 at the plate with a pair of doubles. He scored two runs, drove in a pair and walked once in his debut with the Garnet and Gold. In his first collegiate at-bat, hitting in the number two hole, Stidham drilled a double to right. In game two against Tennessee, Stidham went 2-for-4 for the second straight game driving in a pair of runs as the Seminoles went on to shutout the Volunteers 4-0. In the series finale, the Palm Bay, Fla., native went 1-for-2 with a single, a walk and a run scored as Florida State swept the series from Tennessee with a 19-7 victory. The freshman third baseman was also perfect in the field converting on all four opportunities.

### LIMITING THE ERRORS

Although Florida State's streak of 36 consecutive innings without committing an error came to an end in the first inning against UNC Asheville, the defense has still been something to brag about. **Through the first six games of 2007, FSU has posted a fielding percentage of .978 committing just five errors in 231 total chances.** The Seminoles played error free ball in the first series of the season against Tennessee posting a perfect fielding percentage in 110 chances. The 2005 and 2006 squads rank as two of the top five best defensive teams in FSU history posting a .967 fielding percentage in each of the last two years. Here is a look at the top five fielding teams in school history dating back to 1973:

### HALLBERG HONORED

**In the series finale against Tennessee, junior shortstop Mark Hallberg was honored in the top of the second inning by the NCAA as the nation's toughest batter to strikeout last season.** Before transferring to Florida State from Illinois-Chicago, Hallberg was retired just six times on strikes all season in 217 at-bats, an average of one strikeout per 36 at-bats. The Wisconsin native was an all-conference first team selection with the Flames last year where he batted .373 and hit over .400 in league play. He was the only UIC player to start all 55 games a season ago.

### DOUBLE H

The one, two punch of Henry and Hyde worked to perfection in the first two games of the series opener against Tennessee as the two senior right-handers were a major reason for the Seminoles sweeping the Volunteers. **The two Tallahassee, Fla., natives combined to throw 12.1 innings of shutout baseball allowing just six hits, two for extra bases, two walks and one hit by pitch while striking out 21.** It was the first time in the last two seasons that two Seminole pitchers threw double-digit strikeouts in back-to-back games. The 11 strikeouts by Henry were one shy of his career-high set last year against Duke, while Hyde matched his previous career-high of seven by the end of the fourth-inning. He would finish the game with 10. Henry and Hyde have started a combined 61 games over the last three years with the Seminoles winning 75.4 percent of those contests (46-15).

### HYDE'N STREAK

With 6.1 scoreless innings against Tennessee, **senior hurler Michael Hyde pushed his scoreless streak to 18.2 innings.** Hyde made two postseason starts to close out the 2006 campaign and won both games without allowing a run. The Tallahassee native pitched 12 innings in the postseason and struck out nine batters. In Hyde's first start against Tennessee, the right hander struck out a career-high 10 batters. Unfortunately, Hyde's streak came to an end in his second start of the season against UNC Asheville. He gave up three runs in the first inning but pitched five solid innings to earn his second win in as many starts in 2007.

## NOTING THE SEMINOLES

- \* Florida State begins a season 6-0 for the 10th time in 28 seasons under head coach Mike Martin and for the second time in the last three years.
- \* Since Mike Martin took over the reigns as head coach in 1980, the Seminoles have opened a season sweeping the first two, three-game series six times. This year Florida State has taken the first two series defeating Tennessee and UNC Asheville.
- \* Florida State outscored UNC Asheville 44-15 last weekend as the Seminoles pounded out 49 hits compiling a weekend batting average of .422. Through the first six games, the Seminoles are hitting .405 with 92 hits in 227 at-bats. FSU has also scored 76 runs, an average of 12.7 runs per game.
- \* Of the 92 Seminole hits registered in 2007, 23 have gone for extra base hits including 21 doubles, one triple and one home run. Junior Jack Rye has hit the lone home run of the season, a three-run shot against Tennessee in the bottom of the fifth as Florida State rolled to a 9-2 victory.
- \* Mike Martin is just five wins away from moving into fifth place for all-time career wins in NCAA Baseball history. Former Virginia Tech and High Point head coach Chuck Hartman ranks fifth all-time with 1,445 victories. Martin is currently sixth with 1,441 wins.
- \* Florida State will chase its 29th consecutive NCAA Regional appearance this season.
- \* The Seminoles played in the program's 28th consecutive NCAA Tournament last season.
- \* FSU moved up in the rankings once again in week three and now sit 5th (10th LW) by Collegiate Baseball, 9th (14th LW) by Baseball America, and moved up in the Rivals.com poll for the second straight week with a ranking of 14 (20 LW). NCBWA and USA Today have yet to update their polls for the season. The Seminoles currently sit 15th by the NCBWA and 17th by the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' Poll.
- \* Of the 35 players on Florida State's 2007 roster, 31 have two years experience or less as Seminoles.
- \* The 2007 roster features just two players that were on the team when FSU last won an ACC Championship in 2004.
- \* The only Seminole who has played in each of the last three seasons is relief pitcher Brian Chambers. Chambers has made four relief appearances this season pitching 4.2 innings allowing just one earned run on three hits, while striking out five.
- \* The last time FSU began a season with just one fourth-year senior on the roster was 2004.
- \* Eight teams that played in the 2006 NCAA Baseball Tournament are on the Seminoles' schedule in 2007.
- \* Half of the 2006 College World Series field was made up of ACC teams and FSU will play weekend series with all four of those squads.
- \* Players who accounted for 47 of FSU's 69 homeruns in 2006 are back this year.
- \* Florida State has hit 55 or more homers for 12 straight seasons.
- \* For the fourth time in the last five seasons, the Seminoles fielded .964 or better. Through the first six games of 2007, Florida State has posted a fielding percentage of .978 committing five errors in 231 chances.
- \* The 2005 and 2006 squads rank as two of the top five best defensive teams in FSU history.
- \* Bryan Henry has a chance to become the first three-time All-ACC first team selection in school history.
- \* The Seminoles lost pitchers that accounted for 23 of the team's 44 wins in 2006.
- \* Seven of Florida State's top nine pitchers as far as ERA are back in 2007.

## WEEKLY RANKINGS

After completing its second straight three-game series sweep, Florida State has moved up in the national polls once again. FSU downed UNC Asheville this past weekend outscoring the Bulldogs 44-15 as the bats stayed hot for the Seminoles. Now at 6-0, FSU moved up five spots in Collegiate Baseball while jumping the same amount of spots in Baseball America. The Seminoles vaulted to No. 14 in Rivals.com after not being ranked in their preseason top 25 rankings. The NCBWA and the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' Poll did not publish updated rankings this past week. FSU is ranked 15th by the NCBWA, while the Coaches' Poll rank Florida State as the 17th best team in the nation.

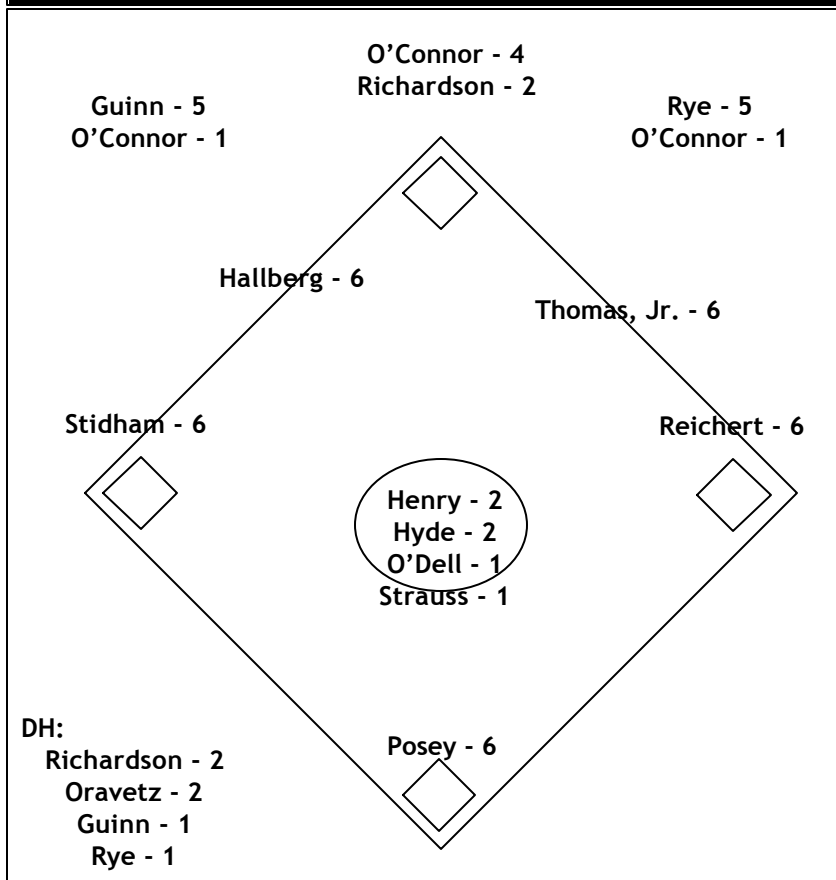
## TOP 10 IN THE LAST 10

Florida State's position among the nation's elite baseball programs is secure. **The Seminole baseball program has the second-highest all-time winning percentage, is second in average wins per season, second in consecutive NCAA Regionals and has more wins than any school since 2000.** Since 1990 FSU has more 50-win seasons than any school and more Top 10 finishes in the Collegiate Baseball poll. The Seminoles have been ranked by that organization for the past 314 polls. Since 1990 only two schools have been to more College World Series and only two have a higher winning percentage as well. FSU's baseball history is glorious but that just doesn't take into account the past 59 years. **In the January 29<sup>th</sup> issue of Baseball America magazine, FSU was rated the seventh-best program in the nation over the past 10 years.** The magazine compiled the top 64 teams since the NCAA moved to a 64 team postseason in 1996. The Seminoles finished ahead of all the original members of the ACC in the rankings and only two southern schools rated better according to the magazine's formula.

## HIGH EXPECTATIONS

With the move of 2006 Freshman All-American Buster Posey from short-stop to catcher, there was a big void in the middle of the Seminole infield. Along came Mark Hallberg. The Illinois-Chicago transfer has opened a lot of eyes around Mike Martin Field but also in the national media as well. **Baseball America rated Hallberg No. 15 on its list of America's top 25 transfers.** Hallberg is rated the third-best player to transfer to an ACC school. Hallberg was the hardest player in America to strikeout last season as he fanned just six times in 217 at bats. In his career, Hallberg struck out just 17 times in 454 at bats. **He was named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American in 2005 and chose to transfer to Florida State over LSU this past fall.**

## EARLY HONOREES

The preseason honors have been rolling in for Florida State players, specifically two-time All-ACC first team selection Bryan Henry and bullpen ace Luke Tucker. **Henry and Tucker were both named to the Roger Clemens Award watch list and NCBWA Preseason All-America list.** The aces of FSU's staff, Henry as a starter and Tucker out of the pen, were also pegged on the Rivals and SEBaseball preseason All-ACC teams. **Dennis Guinn opens 2007 on the watch list for the Brooks Wallace Award.** The junior from Haines City, FL burst on to the college baseball scene in 2006 with a breakout season in his first campaign as a starter. **Jack Rye joins Henry as the only Seminoles to be named a preseason All-ACC Team selection by both Rivals and SEBaseball.** Tucker was named a second team All-ACC preseason selection by SEBaseball. **Buster Posey was named first team preseason All-ACC by SEBaseball at catcher, a position he has never played at the collegiate level.** SEBaseball also named UIC transfer Mark Hallberg as the second-best newcomer in the ACC this season.

## ABCA HALL OF FAME

Legendary Florida State baseball coach Mike Martin has been honored in almost every way imaginable in his 28-year career as the FSU baseball head coach. He is a 10-time conference coach of the year. He has led his FSU teams to 27 consecutive NCAA Regionals, coached in 12 College World Series and won 15 conference championships. Hundreds of his players have won all-conference and All-American honors and 13 have been first round draft picks. As proud as he is of all those accomplishments, his induction into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in January of 2007 may have topped them all. Martin was enshrined in the ABCA/Louisville Slugger Hall of Fame at the annual convention held this year in Orlando. The Seminole coach was one of nine men enshrined in the hall this year. Martin was joined by his family and friends at the induction ceremony.

"It was a very humbling experience," said Martin of his enshrinement. "I was overwhelmed with joy. I got a chance to see people I haven't seen in a long time. It was very exciting. Rod Delmonico from Tennessee was there. I saw Duane Banks from Iowa who is a retired coach. It makes you reflect on so many things. This job has been an unbelievable blessing for me and my family. It has to do with the relationships I have accumulated over the years and it seems all are in the area of baseball."

## ACC PRESEASON POLL

Florida State was picked to finish second in the Atlantic Division behind 2006 College World Series team Clemson in the 2007 ACC Coaches Pre-Season Poll. FSU received one first place vote and had the fourth-most total votes from the conference coaches. While Clemson was the runaway winner for overall votes and as the predicted ACC Champion, Florida State, Miami and North Carolina were all bunched very close together for the 2-4 spots. The Tar Heels barely edged the Hurricanes as the predicted winner of the Coastal Division.

## ACC'S BEST FACILITY

Florida State players were not the only ones being honored this preseason. In SEBaseball's 2007 ACC Preview, **Dick Howser Stadium was named the best facility in the conference.** The home of the Seminoles finished ahead of Georgia Tech and Virginia's facilities. The facility recently underwent a \$12 million renovation and there have been new upgrades each year since the project was completed in 2004. Located on the campus of Florida State University, **the stadium has provided over two million fans with the feeling of having "the best seat in the house" to watch the finest in college baseball action.** Florida State's players and coaches enjoy the convenience and luxury of a clubhouse and locker room currently located behind the Seminole dugout. The Griffin Family Clubhouse was moved to the first base side for the 2004 season as the construction process was completed. **The main locker room was described by former Seminole and 2004 World Series Champion Doug Mientkiewicz as being 'better than 95% of the big league clubhouses' he has seen.** The locker room contains a personalized wooden locker for each player, a separate locker room for the Seminole coaches and trainers, and a video area where FSU players and coaches can watch film. The stadium also houses all of the baseball offices. The coaches' offices look over the stadium behind home plate. There is also a weight room and training area adjacent to the clubhouse. Each of the areas were expanded and improved during the renovation process.

## HE GOT IT

Mike Martin crossed another milestone off his to do list with his team's sweep of Minnesota. With the 12-4 win in the second game of the series, **Martin became only the eighth coach in NCAA history to reach the 1,400 win-plateau** and only the sixth active coach to do so. **Of the eight coaches with 1,400 wins Martin has the fourth-best winning percentage and the second-highest winning percentage among active Division I coaches.** Of the top 10 coaches across all divisions for wins, only four coaches have a winning percentage above .700 and Mike Martin is among that group. Martin passed another legend with FSU's three-game sweep over UNC Asheville this past weekend as he moved into sixth all-time passing Marietta's long time coach Don Schaly. **Overall, Martin ranks third in the DI 1,400-win club behind Stephenson and former Texas coaching legend Cliff Gustafson for winning percentage.**
