#### The Series - FSU vs. Florida

- Florida State and Florida square-off in game 2 of the inaugural Florida Four Tournament hosted by the New York Yankees and Tampa Bay Sports Commission on Tuesday, March 2 on Steinbrenner Field in Tampa, Fla.
- Tuesday's game marks the first of four meeting between these intra-state rivals and the first of two on neutral soil (in Jacksonville, 3/30). It marks the first time these two schools will meet in Tampa.
- FSU leads the all-time series 116-95-1, while UF has had the upper hand on neutral turf posting a mark of 7-4-0.
- Tuesday marks the 213th meeting between Florida State and Florida as the two schools have split the last 10 games. The Seminoles have defeated the Gators the last two times on neutral turf with FSU outscoring UF 13-4.

- Tuesday's showdown also features a meeting between two top 10 teams. The Noles and Gators rank 6th & 7th, respectively in Collegiate Baseball's top 30 poll, while UF is ranked 5th and FSU 6th in the latest Baseball America top 25.
- Tyler Holt, a product of Gainesville, has fared well against the Gators over his career hitting .462 (12-for-26) in seven games. Holt has posted eight runs, six walks, two RBI and is 4-for-5 in the stolen base category.
- Stuart Tapley and Jack Posey are the only current Seminoles to register a home run against Florida. Posey broke a 2-2 tie with a solo home run in the top of the fifth to give the Seminoles the one-run victory in Jacksonville last year. The home run could not have come at a better time as the heavens opened in the top of the sixth washing away the rest of the game. Tapley's home run came in a 10-2 victory in Jacksonville in 2008.

**Parker Takes The Hill Against UF**

- Geoff Parker will take the mound on Tuesday making his second career start against Florida.
- The junior right hander went 3.1 innings in earning a no decision against the Gators in Jacksonville back on March 31, 2009 in his first career start against UF.
- In three career appearances against UF, Parker is 0-0 with a 3.11 ERA. His career numbers vs. the Gators include: 8.2 IP, 5H, 5R, 3ER, 3BB, 9K
- Parker recorded five strikeouts in 2.2 relief innings down in Gainesville on March 17, 2009.

**Scouting the Gators**

- Florida is off to an undefeated start at 5-0 having swept USF in a three-game series to open the year, followed by a pair of mid-week victories over UCF and Siena.
- The Gators are coming off a bye weekend as their three-game series against LaSalle was cancelled as LaSalle was unable to get out of Philadelphia due to snowy conditions.
- Senior outfielder Matt den Dekker is pacing the Florida offense through the first five games hitting .500 with 12 hits in 24 at-bats.
- Defensively, the Gators will send out right hander Anthony DeSclafani to face the Seminoles on Tuesday. The sophomore right hander worked 4.1 scoreless innings in earning the no decision in the series finale against USF.

**Non-Conference Action**

- With six games already in the books, the Noles still have 20 non-conference games left to play in 2010 including three more against the Gators.
- FSU has posted an all-time record of 284-197-1 (.590) against current teams from the SEC.
- Since 2005, the Seminoles are 23-18 against SEC foes having played Arkansas, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi State and Tennessee.
- The Garnet and Gold has posted a winning record all-time against every member of the SEC except Arkansas (0-5).
- Tuesday's game against Florida marks the first of six more contests against an SEC school - 3 vs. UGA, 3 vs. UF.

**The Series - FSU vs. Phillies**

- Florida State visits Bright House Field in Clearwater, Fla., to take on the reigning National League champion Philadelphia Phillies on Wednesday evening with first pitch at 7:05 p.m.
- The Phillies downed the Seminoles 12-4 in

front of 4,676 fans as the two teams met for the first time in series history back in 2007. Florida State got off to a great start that year as Tony Thomas, Jr. deposited a 1-1 offering from 2006 first round draft pick Kyle Drabek over the wall in left field for an early 1-0 advantage.

- The two teams were set to play again in 2008 but Mother Nature had other plans washing away the game after rain hit the Clearwater area for an hour and 45 minutes.
- FSU has faced a Major League Club nine previous times overall and twice since 2001 when the Seminoles played the Florida Marlins (2001) and Phillies (2007). The Garnet and Gold are 2-7 all-time against professional teams having faced the likes of the Baltimore Orioles (0-1), New York Yankees (1-1), Atlanta Braves (1-1), Kansas City Royals, Florida Marlins (0-2) Tampa Bay Rays (0-1) and Phillies (0-1).

**FSU Baseball - Among The Elite**

- Success is synonymous with Florida State Baseball as the program enters its 63rd year of existence in 2010.
- In 16 of the last 19 seasons, the Seminoles have claimed the ACC regular season title or finished with the best record in the league, won the ACC Tournament title or advanced to the College World Series in Omaha, Neb.
- All of this is pretty impressive for a school that has the most wins in Division I since 2000 and the second highest winning percentage of all-time in Division I history.

• Sophomore Sherman Johnson was named **ACC Player of the Week** for the first time in his career on March 1 putting the finishing touches on a fine weekend against Hofstra in week 2.

• The Tampa, Fla., native drove in a team-high 10 runs while going 5-for-8 at the plate with five runs scored as FSU swept a three-game series from Hofstra.

• Johnson, who started at both second and third in the series against the Pride, tied a career-high with three hits while establishing a career-high six RBI in game one. He finished a triple short of hitting for the cycle in the first game.

• His six RBI performance was the first by a Seminole hitter since Mike McGee drove in six runs in a 15-6 victory over Wake Forest on April 24, 2009.

• With two home runs against Hofstra, Johnson surpassed his career total (1) during his freshman season in 2009.

### Noles Drawing Blanks

• For the first time since 2008, the Seminoles shut out an opponent after blanking Hofstra 13-0 in game two of a doubleheader in week two.

• Three Seminole pitchers combined for the two-hit shutout as the Garnet and Gold kept an opponent off the scoreboard for the first time since blanking NC State 1-0 back on May 16, 2008.

• John Gast scattered two hits over 5.0 innings, while Brian Busch and Andrew Durden each pitched a scoreless inning in relief in game completed after seven innings.

### Double-Digit Figures

• The Florida State offense is off to a quick start posting double-digit hits and runs in each of its first six games.

• Dating back to last year, the Seminoles have registered double-digit hits in 11 consecutive games and are averaging 15.0 hits per game during that span.

• In 2007, the Seminoles put together a streak of 16 straight games in which they reached double-digit hits, the longest of record dating back to 1996.

• The Noles currently sit second in the ACC in hitting with a .383 team batting average.

### Streaking Into 2010

• Entering Tuesday's contest against Florida, junior Stuart Tapley owns the longest current hit streak sitting at 11 games. Tapley is one game shy of tying his longest career hitting streak.

• James Ramsey joins Tapley as the only two Seminoles to have recorded a hit in all six ball games this year.

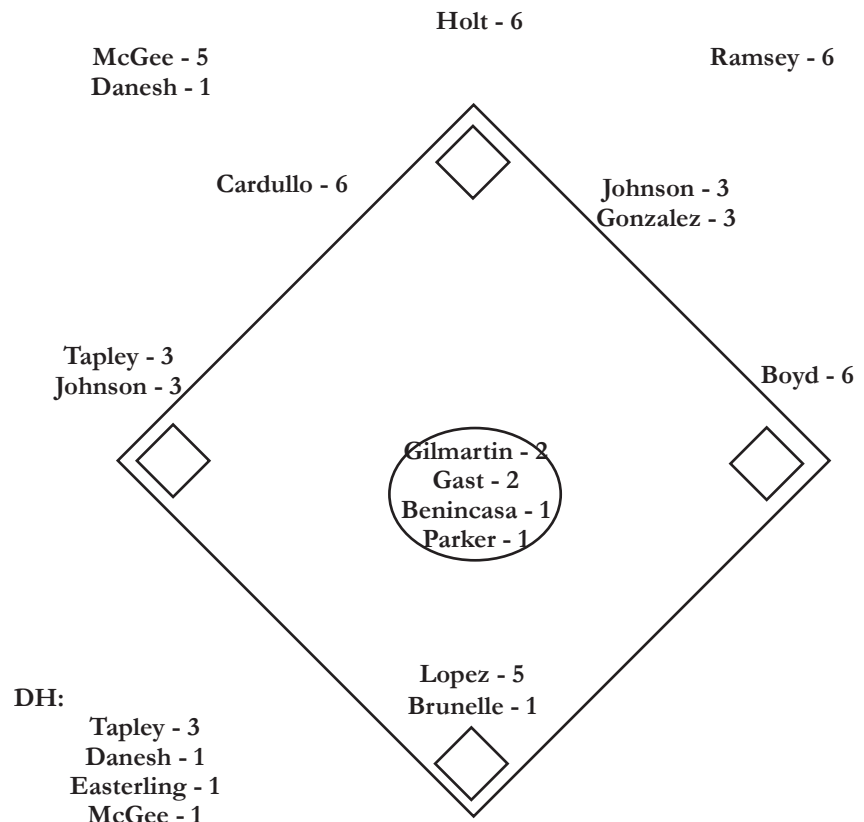

### Triple It Up

• A year ago the Seminole hit just 16 triples as a team with five players recording more than one.

• Through the first six games of the 2010 season, the Seminoles are already more than a third of the way to matching last year's team triple total as

five players have combined to hit six.

- Sophomore James Ramsey tied a school record with two triples in Sunday's series finale against Georgia State. He became the sixth player in school history to perform such a feat and first since March 6, 2005 when Tony Thomas, Jr. hit two against Hawaii-Hilo.

- It wasn't until game 28 (vs. Miami) of the 2009 season that FSU recorded its sixth triple of the season.

### Walk It Out

- The first four hitters in the Seminole line-up did a great job of getting on base during the opening weekend series against Georgia State drawing 16 of the 23 total walks.
- Half of those walks turned into runs as hitters 1-4 in the Seminole line-up scored a total of eight times against the Panthers.
- James Ramsey led the Seminoles with six walks in the three-game series against GSU. He tied a career-high drawing three walks in back-to-back contests against the Panthers.
- Through the first six games, the top five batters in the Seminole line-up (Holt, Ramsey, Cardullo, McGee and Tapley) have drawn 31 walks while striking out a combined six times.

### Hats Off To The Bullpen

- The Seminole bullpen got off to a great start in 2010 working a combined 11.0 innings through the first three games of the season en route to posting a 1-0 record and a 1.64 ERA.
- Seven different pitchers saw action out of the pen in FSU's opening weekend series against Georgia State including four newcomers - three freshmen and one JUCO transfer.
- The four newcomers (Robert Benincasa, Andrew Durden, Daniel Bennett and Scott Sitz) worked a combined 5.0 scoreless innings allowing just two hits and three walks while striking out six.
- The bullpen continued to impress in week 2 as 10 pitchers combined to work 12.0 innings allowing three runs, two earned, on five hits while striking out 11.
- Through six games, the Seminoles bullpen is

2-0 with a 1.57 ERA posting 26 strikeouts in 23.0 innings of work.

- Against Hofstra, three pitchers made their Seminole debut, all in the series finale, including Tye Buckley, Corben Madden and David Trexler. The appearances for Madden and Trexler were their first in college.

### McGee Helping His Own Cause

- Twelve times in 2009, Mike McGee served as the Seminole starting pitcher and took a spot in the batting order. In those 12 games, McGee batted .489 (22-for-45) with seven doubles, six home runs, 17 runs, 22 RBI, five walks and seven strikeouts.
- Against Clemson on March 22, McGee started the game on the mound earning a no decision after going 6.0 innings, but finished the game with his bat, knocking a walk-off, three-run home run over the right field wall to give FSU the 7-4 victory.
- Twice McGee hit a pair of home runs in games in which he was the starting pitcher - vs. Clemson (3/22) and at Miami (4/5).

### Successful Opening Weekend

- Florida State opened the 2010 season with an 11-3 victory over Georgia State to extend its win streak on opening day to 12 straight games.
- With the win, the Seminoles pushed their record to 55-7-1 (.881) all-time on opening day.
- When it comes to home openers, FSU is 59-4 (.937) all-time with only one loss coming in the last 28 years.
- Under Hall of Fame head coach Mike Martin, FSU baseball is 28-3 on opening day.
- With a three-game sweep of Georgia State, FSU has now won 29 consecutive series to open the season - all-time FSU is 52-2-9 in season opening series.

### From Football To Baseball

- Redshirt sophomore Taiwan Easterling has traded in his shoulder pads for a bat, glove and some cleats this spring. Easterling, who was drafted by the Florida Marlins in the sixth round of the 2007 Major League Baseball Draft, has de-

### Who Is That At Shortstop

It what seems to be a common trend over the last few years on opening day - a new season usually means a new look at shortstop. Although this year's situation is a little different as the incumbent Stephen Cardullo made 47 starts at short in 2009, the beginning of the 2010 season will feature the Seminoles sixth starting shortstop on opening day in as many seasons when Cardullo takes the field against GSU on Friday.

The last time Florida State started the same person at shortstop in consecutive seasons was Stephen Drew (2002-04).

Since Stephen Drew's departure, the six starters at shortstop on opening day include Ryne Jernigan (2005), Buster Posey (2006), Mark Hallberg (2007), Tony Delmonico (2008), Jason Stidham (2009) and Stephen Cardullo (2010).

### Consensus Preseason Top 10

- Florida State will open the 2010 season as a consensus preseason top 10 team.
- All five major baseball polls have the Seminoles

ranked in the top 10 ranging as high as No. 5 by ESPN/USA Today and as low as No. 9 by Baseball America.

The NCBWA ranked the Garnet and Gold at No. 6, while Collegiate Baseball and Rivals.com both have the Seminoles at No. 7 to open the season.

### 2010 Schedule

- Ten teams on this year's schedule recorded 30 or more wins a season ago. Seven schools earned a bid to participate in an NCAA Regional in 2009, while two teams played in the College World Series (North Carolina and Virginia). A total of five teams finished the 2009 season ranked in the Top 25.
- The Seminoles will compete in a 30-game ACC schedule for the fifth year in a row. The schedule features all but one league school (Georgia Tech). Since the ACC adopted divisional play in 2006, the Seminoles have posted a league record of 80-34 (.702) and have captured three straight Atlantic Division titles. Over the last four seasons, Florida State has fared well both at home and on the road in the ACC going 42-16 and 38-18, respectively.
- After a two-year hiatus, Florida State will travel to Clearwater, Fla., to face the Philadelphia Phillies on Wednesday, March 3. The game is scheduled for a 7:00 p.m. first pitch at BrightHouse Networks Field. In 2007, 4,676 fans packed the stadium to watch the exhibition match between the 'Noles and the Phillies.

### Seminole Leadership

- Florida State returns seven position starters including all four All-Americans in Stephen Cardullo, Sean Gilmartin, Tyler Holt and Mike McGee. The position starters combined to play in 418 games a season ago with five of those student-athletes appearing in 60 or more contests.
- Despite a small senior class comprised of just three student-athletes, the junior class is one of the largest in recent memory with 14 on the 2010 roster. Six transferred in from community college while nine played a significant role in the team's run to a berth in the NCAA Super Regional a season ago.

### Preseason Accolades

- Four Seminole student-athletes garnered pre-season accolades in 2010.
- Tyler Holt received first team recognition from three publications including Collegiate Baseball, NCBWA and Rivals.com and second team honors from Baseball America.
- Coming off an impressive freshman campaign, Sean Gilmartin enters his second season with the Garnet and Gold with high expectations. The NCBWA named him a first team All-American while grabbing third team honors from Collegiate Baseball.
- Mike McGee was honored as a preseason All-American from three different publications including second team accolades from Collegiate

Baseball and three team honors from Baseball America and NCBWA.

- Stephen Cardullo received third team accolades from Collegiate Baseball.

**A Look At The 2010 Class**

- Florida State welcomes 16 new players this season, including 11 freshmen, four transfers and the addition of redshirt sophomore Taiwan Easterling. It is the second most freshmen listed on an opening day roster since 2005 when FSU opened the season with 13 freshmen.
- The Seminoles were recognized by *Collegiate Baseball* with the nation's 22nd best recruiting class in 2010.
- Since associate head coach Jamey Shoupp took over recruiting coordinator duties in 1990, FSU has had a class ranked in the top 25 each year while 13 of his classes have been ranked in the top 10.
- Five newcomers to this year's squad have been selected in the MLB Draft over the last three years. Those individuals include Taiwan Easterling (2007), Andrew Durden (2008), Robert Benincasa (2009), Jayce Boyd (2009) and Justin Gonzalez (2009).
- This year's class features four transfer students

who come to Florida State with prior playing experience and will look to make an immediate impact for the Garnet and Gold in 2010. Those student-athletes include Daniel Bennett (Tallahassee Community College), Tye Buckley (Seminole Community College), Andrew Durden (Indian River State College) and Robby Scott (Broward Community College).

#### 2010 HIGHLIGHTS

Entering his 31st season as Florida State's head coach, Mike Martin continues to cement his legacy as one of collegiate baseball's most prolific coaches. On January 5, 2007 his baseball legacy was secured as Martin was enshrined into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. With a victory over Georgia Tech on March 16, 2008, Martin earned his 1,500th career win becoming one of four coaches in NCAA Division I history to reach that mark.

The FSU alum has become the face of Florida State baseball having been associated with the Seminoles for 38 of FSU's 63 seasons. Of the 3,404 baseball games played in program history, Martin has been involved in 2,511 as a player, assistant coach and head coach. What is even more impressive is Martin's involvement in 1,852 of the 2,485 all-time victories at Florida State. In one way or another, Martin has been a part of more than 74.5% of FSU's victories.

Martin has won 15 conference championships since taking over as head coach in 1980 with 11 from the Metro Conference and four in the ACC. Since moving to divisional play in 2006, Martin has led the Seminoles to three consecutive ACC Atlantic Division titles in 2007, 2008 and 2009. FSU's run to a division title in 2008 was accomplished after Martin led the Noles to a league mark of 24-6, a school record for the most conference wins in team history. He is a six-time Metro Conference Coach of the Year and has been recognized as the top coach in the ACC six times as well. Seventy-six Florida State players have earned All-America honors under Martin, while 96 players have garnered first and second team All-ACC recognition. He has coached six players, Mike Fuentes, Mike Loynd, J.D. Drew, Shane Robinson, Tony Thomas, Jr. and Buster Posey, who were named National Players of the Year.

In 2010, Martin was named to Florida State University's list of 100 Distinguished Graduates in celebration of the FSU Alumni Association Centennial.
