Seminole Quick Hits

* Florida State is tied for fifth in the nation in wins with 35. The Seminoles are one of seven ACC teams that have eclipsed the 30-win plateau in 2008.

* FSU continues its current eight-game road trip with a pair of mid-week contests against Stetson University in DeLand, Fla. The Seminoles are 12-4 on the road this year which stands as the ninth best road ledger at the Division I level.

* In the latest national report by WarrenNolan.com, the Seminoles are second in the nation in RPI and sit fourth in strength of schedule. The Atlantic Coast Conference is ahead of the Pac-10 for the sixth straight week as the highest RPI conference in the nation. Four schools rank in the top 10 including Miami (No. 1), FSU (No. 2), UNC (No. 3) and NC State (No. 7).

* The ACC leads the nation with the highest winning percentage in non-conference action at .789 posting an overall record of 198-53.

* In three of the five national polls, the ACC owns the top three spots in the nation with Miami, North Carolina and Florida State. The Hurricanes are the consensus No. 1 team in the nation while FSU is No. 3 in three of the five polls.

* A Seminole student-athlete has been honored with a weekly award from the ACC six times in 10 weeks this season. Senior Dennis Guinn has been named ACC Player of the Week twice along with Mike McGee and Buster Posey once. Matt Farel and Ryan Strauss have been named ACC Pitcher of the Week.

* With a win over Georgia Tech on Sunday, March 23, head coach Mike Martin became just the third coach in NCAA Division I history to reach 1,500 career victories. Martin currently sits with a record of 1,519-513-4.

* With a sweep of Boston College on April 11 and 12, FSU tied the school mark set back in 1996 for the best start in league play at 17-1. Already this season, FSU's 10-0 start in the ACC marked the third best start in school history.

Setting The Series: Florida State vs. Stetson

Florida State leads the all-time series 41-20, while posting an overall record of 13-8 inside Melching Field at Conrad Park. The Seminoles have won nine in a row in the series including the first two games played in Tallahassee back on March 25 & 26. Over the last three meetings dating back to last year's match-up in an elimination game at the NCAA Tallahassee Regional, FSU has outscored Stetson 47-6. During FSU's current win streak, six of the nine games have been decided by four runs or less.

The trip to Stetson is just the second visit for the Seminoles in DeLand since 1976. Back in 2005, the two schools played a pair of mid-week contests with FSU winning all four by a combined 10 runs. Both games at Stetson that year were decided by just one run. Florida State has won two in a row on the Hatters home turf.

Against The Hatters

Earlier this year, the Seminoles went 2-0 against the Hatters hitting .452 as a team while posting an ERA of 2.00. FSU received quality starts from both starting pitchers in freshman right hander Mike McGee and junior right hander Bo O'Dell earlier this season. McGee went seven innings giving up two runs on five hits. O'Dell shut out the Hatters over five innings of work allowing just two hits. He struck out four and did not walk a batter. At the plate, both McGee and Tony Delmonico drove in seven runs as the two Seminole hitters combined to hit .700 in the mid-week sweep.

Last year, the Seminoles warded off elimination by downing the Hatters in the NCAA Tallahassee Regional. FSU broke the game wide open with an 11-run seventh to take a commanding lead in the game. One run was all the help Ryan Strauss needed as the right hander kept the Hatters off the scoreboard scattering six hits over seven innings of work. He struck out four and walked only one as it was the longest outing for Strauss since he threw seven innings against Virginia Tech back on April 15, 2007.

Senior Jack Rye is 11-for-21 (.524) in his career against Stetson with five sacrifice hits including three sac flies. He has posted four doubles, six runs scored and three RBIs in seven career starts. Buster Posey collected three hits last year with a double, two RBIs and two runs scored and went 3-for-6 in the two game set earlier in the year with a double and two RBIs.

Ryan Strauss is a perfect 2-0 in two appearances against Stetson. He has not given up a run in eight innings of work. In 2005, he pitched an inning and faced the minimum to pick up the win in relief. Last year, Strauss threw seven shutout innings as he struck out four and walked just one. Ryan Vigue pitched a career-high two shut out innings in game two striking out a career best three. Jimmy Marshal and Tyler Everett threw a scoreless inning in relief, while Ben Francis pitched an inning and gave up an unearned run.

The Seminoles In Non-Conference Action

Following the two road games against Stetson, the Seminoles will play five more non-conference games, all at home, against Jacksonville (1) and Savannah State (4). The Seminoles are 16-2 in non-conference action including a perfect 4-0 versus schools from the Atlantic Sun Conference after taking the first two games at home against Stetson, a home game versus North Florida and one game on the road at Jacksonville. Over the last three years, Florida State has posted a record of 94-26 against non-league opponents featuring a mark of 22-1 against teams from the Atlantic Sun.

Seminoles Take Series From Gators

Thanks to a 4-2 victory over Florida on Tuesday, April 15, Florida State did something it hadn't done against the Gators since the 2005 season - win a regular season series against their intra-state rival. Behind a complete game effort from senior Ryan Strauss, the Seminoles took 2-of-3 from UF with wins in Tallahassee and at the Baseball Grounds in Jacksonville (10-2).

Posey In Rare Company

Buster Posey is having one of those seasons that many college baseball players only dream of having. The junior catcher leads the ACC in hitting with a .483 average while sitting at the top in five other offensive categories. He is also batting .524 in 21 league games to lead the ACC. When comparing his numbers nationally, Posey is the only player to rank in the top 3 in batting average (2nd), on-base percentage (2nd), hits (t-2nd), total bases (3rd) and slugging percentage (3rd).

A Perfect 9-for-9 In Stolen Bases

Florida State set a season-high for stolen bases back on Wednesday, April 2 against Jacksonville

as the Seminoles were a perfect 9-for-9 in the stolen base category. Tyler Holt, Jason Stidham, Jack Rye and Luke Smierciak each swiped a pair of bases while Tony Delmonico had one. Holt broke a 2-2 tie in the top of the seventh as he successfully stole home. The nine stolen bases were the most in one game since FSU registered eight against West Virginia back on March 6, 2004. Entering Wednesday's contest against Jacksonville, Florida State had 18 steals in 33 attempts with a season-high of three against Duquesne. The school record for the most stolen bases in a game is 11 set three times - Virginia (1994), Richmond (1986) and Stetson (1957).

One-Run Games

With over a dozen games left in the 2008 season, Florida State surpassed its 2007 total of one-run games. Last year, the Seminoles posted a respectable 7-2 mark in one-run games compared to this year's 10-2 record. FSU won its first 10 one-run games in 2008 before falling just short to Miami in an 11-10 loss. The second loss came in extra innings of the rubber game of the series against North Carolina. Ten of the 12 games have occurred against ACC teams while four (Maryland, GT and Virginia twice) have resulted in walk-off victories.

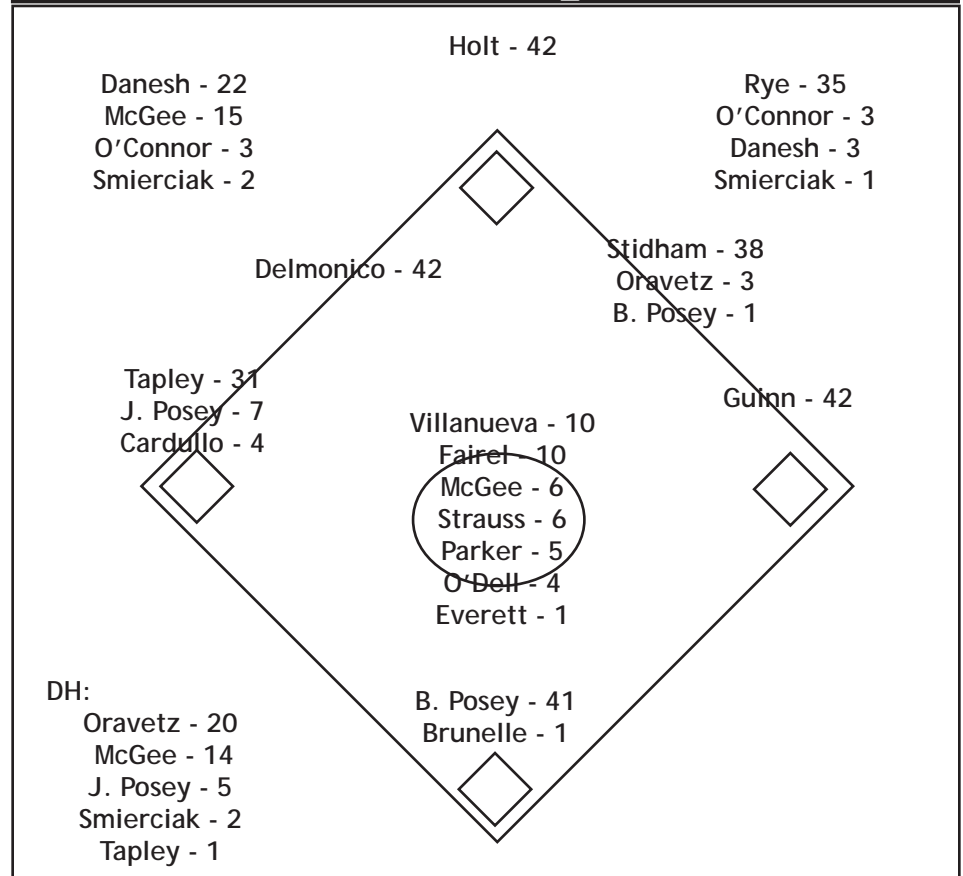
Packing Dick Howser Stadium

During the last five-game home stand that featured games against Florida, North Florida and Miami, a total of 30,179 fans packed Dick Howser Stadium. Three times last week, FSU set the stadium attendance record with largest crowd announced at 6,789 in Saturday's victory over the Hurricanes. The three-game series against Miami drew 19,062 breaking the previous three-game series attendance record of 18,045 set against Miami in 2006. Through 25 home games this season, a total of 128,591 have walked through the gates of Dick Howser Stadium. The Seminoles are currently averaging 5,143 fans per game which is on pace to break the single season home average record of 4,516 set in 2005. Home attendance has eclipsed the 5,000 mark 11 times this year with four figures ranking among the top 10 all-time crowds at Dick Howser Stadium.

Power Surge

The Seminole offense has showed a little more pop this year than in years past posting 58 home runs through 42 games. That number already surpasses the number of home runs hit last year (53) and in 2005 (55). The 2006 squad finished the year with 69 home runs. In terms of slugging percentage, this year's mark of .553 would stand as the third best in school history. The school record was set in 1982 when FSU registered a percentage of .568 in 74 games. Senior Dennis Guinn leads the home run barrage in 2008 with 12, matching his season total output during his sophomore campaign.

Tuesday - Freshman RHP Mike McGee will take the mound on Tuesday in his seventh start of the 2008 season and second career start against Stetson...in his first start against the Hatters, McGee tied a career-high with seven innings of work to earn his third win of the season...allowed two runs on five hits as he walked two and struck out a pair...gave up just one hit through the first five innings and at point retired eight straight Stetson hitters...moved to 5-1 on the year as he pitched five innings against North Florida in his last start...gave up a run on four hits...walked and struck out three...worked 6.2 innings against Jacksonville giving up four runs, three earned, on six hits; struck out four and walked just one.....made his collegiate debut on the mound against Duquesne...picked up the victory in his first start while taking a no hitter into the sixth inning vs. the Dukes...worked a career-high seven innings in his second start of the season against Auburn...did not allow a run while scattering three hits...took a no-hitter into the 5th inning...struck out a career-high five batters...pitched just 3.1 innings against Georgia, his shortest outing as a Seminole...gave up career-high in hits and runs and tied a career-high in walks with five...first Seminole starter to suffer a loss in 2008...worked out of the bullpen for the first time in 2008, pitching 2.0 innings against the Hokies in game 1...gave up a run on two hits...unleashed a season-high 2 wild pitches...pitched the final 2.2 innings in the series finale against Miami before curfew cut the game short...pitched in the fifth, sixth and seventh innings in limiting the Hurricanes to one run on three hits as the Seminoles bats began to heat up....struck out four Hurricane hitters in only 2.2 innings of work.

Florida State Starts Five Freshmen

On Tuesday, March 18 at Florida, head coach Mike Martin put five freshmen in the starting lineup for the first time all season. Center fielder Tyler Holt, third baseman Stuart Tapley and pitcher/outfielder Mike McGee have all been regulars in the starting lineup this year. Joining the trio in the starting lineup in Gainesville were Jack Posey, making his third start at DH, and Luke Smierciak who was making his first collegiate start in right field.

11 Reaches 1500 Career Wins

Florida State's Mike Martin added yet another milestone to his already illustrious career as the Hall of Fame coach became just the third coach in NCAA Division I history to reach 1,500 career victories. With Sunday's victory over Georgia Tech, Martin joined Texas' Augie Garrido (1,655) and Wichita State's Gene Stephenson (1,638) atop that plateau. Martin owns a career record of 1,519-513-4 good for an all-time winning percentage of .747 which ranks third in the NCAA among active Division I coaches.

Seminole Pitching

Sandwiched between the Virginia Tech and Miami series, a span covering 15 games, FSU did not yield more than five earned runs in a single game. The Seminoles allowed just 36 earned runs in 138 innings, 48 walks and 119 strikeouts while going 14-1 during that span. In a three-game sweep of Virginia, six FSU pitchers combined for 33 strikeouts and just 11 walks.

Strauss To Save The Day

Ryan Strauss matched his career save total in just one day as the senior right hander went 2-for-2 in save opportunities in FSU's doubleheader sweep of Boston College on Friday, April 11. Strauss pitched a scoreless ninth in both games to earn his first two saves of the season while running his career total to four. He added his third save of the season as he worked two scoreless innings out of the bullpen to wrap up FSU's victory over Miami in game two. Strauss tied Buster Posey for the team lead in saves earning his fourth in 2.1 innings of work in a 13-5 victory over North Carolina. Strauss entered the game with the tying run on deck in the seventh to earn save number four. As a team, Florida State is 10-for-10 in save chances this year.

Guinn Doubling Up

Dennis Guinn tied a career-high with three doubles in FSU's 13-5 victory over North Carolina. He became the first Seminole to hit three doubles this season and the first since he collected three doubles against Boston College back on March 23, 2007. The senior first baseman collected all three in his first four at-bats finishing the game 4-for-5 with three RBIs and two runs scored. Guinn now sits with 13 doubles in 2008 tying his season total from last year. He has amassed 43 during his four-year Seminole career.

Five-Hit Performance

Centerfielder Tyler Holt became the first Seminole this year to record five hits in a ball game as Florida State went on to defeat Boston College 8-6 in game one of a doubleheader back on Friday, April 11. The freshman from Gainesville, Fla., went a perfect 5-for-5 in the game with three singles, a pair of doubles, a career-high three RBIs, two runs scored and a stolen base. Holt's five-hit performance was the first since Mark Hallberg went 5-for-7 against Maryland in 2007. The last Seminole to record a perfect 5-for-5 at the plate was Tony McQuade back on April 20, 2003 against Miami.

Grand Slam Home Run

Tony Delmonico hit the first Seminole grand slam of the season in the series finale at Boston College to conclude a 17-2 victory for the Garnet and Gold. The home run also marked the first career grand slam for the junior shortstop. Two other Seminoles on the current roster have hit a grand slam in their college career including Dennis Guinn and Buster Posey. Guinn tied a school record belting three during his sophomore campaign. He shares that record with J.D. Drew and Jeremy Morris who both hit three grand slams in the 1997 season. Posey hit his first career slam last year down in Coral Gables in a 13-8 FSU victory. He finished that game with a career-high seven RBIs.

Tommy O Packing The Offense

In his third year at Florida State, Tommy Oravetz is having his best year yet. The junior from Tallahassee, Fla., has appeared in 39 games this year and has set a season-high with 23 starts (20 at DH and 3 at 2B). Oravetz currently sits with an average of .341 as more than half of his 31 hits have gone for extra bases. He has already set career season-highs for doubles (10), triples (3), home runs (3) and total bases (56). Against Boston College, Oravetz registered five hits including a pair of doubles, one triple and a home run. On top of all that, he is also the team's best hitter off the bench as he leads the Seminoles with four pinch hits in 10 plate appearances.

National Recognition

Florida State leads the nation in walks with 259, nine more than second place Arizona State. The Seminoles also rank in the top 10 in seven other offensive categories including batting average (2nd), hits (3rd), slugging percentage (5th), runs scored (5th), scoring (6th), doubles (8th) and doubles per game (10th). The Seminoles rank 29th in ERA with a mark of 3.85.

Buster Posey ranks in the top 20 in nine offensive categories including five top 5 rankings including batting average (2nd), on-base percentage (2nd), hits (2nd), slugging percentage (3rd) and total bases (3rd). Tyler Holt is tied for fourth nationally in walks with 39 and tied for ninth in walks per game (1.00). He sits as the top freshman player in the country in both categories. Dennis Guinn is tied for 30th in home runs with 12. Matt Fairel is tied for second in wins with eight.

Walk-Off Victories

More than halfway through the season and Florida State has already recorded four walk-off victories in its final at-bat including two in the bottom of the ninth and two in back-to-back extra inning games. The two ninth inning victories came in back-to-back ACC games one against Maryland, the other against Georgia Tech. In a game that featured seven lead changes and two ties, freshman Stuart Tapley spoiled any chances of a Maryland upset in the series finale as he delivered a walk-off bases loaded single in the bottom of the ninth to give the Seminoles a 9-8 victory over the Terrapins. Tony Delmonico scored the game-winning run.

Ohmed Danesh followed that with a two-out, two-run bases loaded single in the first of three games against Georgia Tech. Luke Smierciak scored the game-winner after entering the game as a pinch runner replacing Dennis Guinn who drew a walk.

In consecutive 10th inning wins over Virginia, Jack Rye registered his third career walk-off victory with a bases loaded single scoring Luke Smierciak. In game two of a twin bill, Tyler Holt hit a chopper to third scoring Smierciak, who slid home in plenty of time on a play at the plate. Smierciak was hit by a pitch to lead off the 10th inning in both games. He has scored three of the four game-winning runs in 2008.

In its 62 game schedule a year ago, Florida State was involved in just one walk-off game, an 11th inning, 7-6 victory over Wake Forest. Jack Rye provided the heroics hitting an RBI single to defeat the Demon Deacons back on March 16, 2007.

Hot Start In 2008

For the second straight year, Florida State started a season undefeated at 12-0 before falling to Georgia 13-10 in the first of a two-game series. It marked just the third time in the Mike Martin era and the fifth time in the 61-year history of the program that FSU opened the season with a 12-0 record. In 1972 and 1985, FSU started 12-0 while in 1975 the Seminoles ran out to a 15-0 mark under then head coach Woody Woodward. Last year, Florida State set the school record for the best start in school history winning its first 23 games to start 23-0.

Walking On Sunshine

Florida State has showed great patience at the plate throughout the season drawing a league-high 278 walks, 60 more than Miami who sits second with 218 base-on-balls. The Seminoles are the only team in the ACC to record more walks than strikeouts. FSU is on pace to draw 364 walks in 55 games. FSU has already registered double-digit walks in 10 games this season including a season-high 14 in game two against Virginia Tech.

Double-Digit Hits

The string of double-digit hit games came to an end at 13 straight as the Seminoles were held to seven hits in an 8-3 victory over Georgia. Florida State continues to lead the ACC in hitting with a .346 batting average. The Seminoles have scored 389 runs on 513 hits as 176 of those hits have been of the extra base variety. FSU recorded a season-high 21 runs on 21 hits in a 19-run victory over Wake Forest in game one. The Seminoles have notched double-digit hits in 32 of their 42 games this year. In 2007, FSU registered double-digit hits in 18 of its first 20 games including a streak of 16 straight. The Seminoles finished the season with 47 double-digit hit games. Last year's 16 straight double-digit hit games were the longest of record dating back to 1996.

Buster Posey - A "Jack" of All Trades

When Buster Posey arrived on campus as a freshman in the fall of 2005, he stepped in and filled a void at shortstop. Posey finished his first season in the spring of 2006 playing all 65 games at short, batting .346 with 85 hits and 48 RBIs en route to earning Freshman All-American accolades. In 2007, the Seminole coaching staff was faced with filling a void at the catcher position and once again looked to Posey. Having never played the position in his career, the Leesburg, Ga., native finished the year earning first team All-America and All-ACC first team accolades while becoming a finalist for the Johnny Bench Award, presented to the nation's top collegiate

catcher. Then in 2008, FSU was in search of a closer after the departure of Danny Rosen and Luke Tucker. Once again, the coaching staff looked to Posey, who has stepped in nicely making three appearances on the year posting a 0.00 ERA with three strikeouts and two saves in two opportunities. In game two of a mid-week series against UNC Asheville, Posey checked one more position off the list as the junior right hander made his first collegiate start at second base. What else does Posey have in store for '08? Stay tuned!

Tops In The ACC

Junior Buster Posey leads the ACC in four offensive categories including batting average (.465), total bases (130), on base percentage (.562) and slugging percentage (.818). He also ranks in the top 10 in seven other offensive categories including hits (2nd), RBIs (3rd), runs scored (t-3rd), doubles (t-4th), triples (t-5th), walks (6th) and home runs (t-8th). He is the only hitter in the ACC that is currently hitting over .400 with a minimum of three total plate appearances per game. Sophomore Matt Fairel leads the league in wins with an 8-1 record on the mound. He also ranks in the top 10 in ERA (5th), innings pitched (7th) and opponent batting average (10th). Dennis Guinn's 12 home runs is one shy of the ACC lead while Jimmy Marshall is tied for second in appearances with 24.

Posey At Third?

That's right there's been a Posey sighting at third base in 2008. And yes, I'm talking about Jack Posey. The younger Posey made his first start in the field in game one Friday, March 21 against Virginia Tech and started at third the entire weekend. He started at the hot corner while freshman Stuart Tapley was sidelined with an injured right wrist. Posey has seven starts at third base in 2008 and has committed just two errors in 39 opportunities. At the plate, Posey has registered six hits including a double, a home run and seven RBIs.

Walk It Out

Freshman Tyler Holt has stepped in nicely as the Seminole leadoff hitter in 2008. The Gainesville, Fla., native ranks fifth nationally and fourth in the ACC with 44 walks. Holt is averaging 1.05 walk per game. At one point in the season, Holt drew a walk in 13 consecutive games and has a base-on-ball in 29 of 42 games in 2008. The freshman center fielder has reached base safely in every game this season while drawing two or more walks in 12 games. Three times this year he has registered three walks in a single game. Holt is currently third on the team and seventh in the conference in on-base percentage with a .480 mark.

Rain, Rain, Go Away

Rain has played havoc on the Seminole schedule in 2008 as Mother Nature has forced five doubleheaders so far this season. Opening day was washed away by rain as was the Seminoles' exhibition game against the Philadelphia Phillies. FSU and Georgia got through 4.5 innings before rain postponed game one of a two-game mid-week series. Rain also forced the cancelation of the first conference game of the season against Maryland back on March 7. It wasn't until the following week that the Seminoles played their first Friday night home game of the 2008 season. FSU and UVa played a twin bill on Sunday, April 6 with both games being decided in 10 innings. Even before the Seminoles hit the field against the Eagles, threatening weather approaching the Boston area forced FSU and BC to play two on Friday.

ACC Honors

Now 10 weeks into the season and Florida State has been honored six times by the ACC. Over the past two years, a Florida State student-athlete has been named either the ACC Player or Pitcher of the Week 15 times. In week one, freshman Mike McGee was named Co-Player of the Week sharing the honor with North Carolina's Dustin Ackley. McGee led the Seminoles in hitting with a .727 average collecting eight hits in 11 official at-bats. He scored three runs and drove in six while leading the team in both slugging percentage (1.273) and on-base percentage (.769).

Dennis Guinn picked up his second career ACC weekly honor as the senior first baseman led Florida State to a four-game sweep of Auburn. Guinn hit .563 for the series collecting nine hits, six RBIs, three home runs and a team leading slugging percentage of 1.188. In week five, Guinn was honored for the second time in 2008 for his performance against Florida and Virginia Tech. In those four games, Guinn hit .556 with six doubles and three home runs. He scored seven runs and posted 11 RBIs.

Matt Fairel joined the list of honorees as the sophomore southpaw was named ACC Pitcher of the Week for the first time in his career. Fairel earned his fourth victory of the season as he registered eight innings and nine strikeouts, both career-highs, in an 11-2 win over Georgia Tech. Eight of the nine strikeouts posted by Fairel came in the final four innings as he finished the night striking out the side in the eighth.

This past week Buster Posey was honored as the ACC Player of the Week after leading the Seminoles with a .625 average recording 10 hits in 16 at-bats last week. He posted team-highs in runs scored (10), home runs (2), total bases (19), slugging percentage (1.188) and on-base percentage (.739). Against Wake Forest, Posey hit .700 (7-for-10) with two doubles and two home runs. He scored seven times and recorded four RBIs. He drew four walks, was hit by

a pitch and did not strikeout in 15 plate appearances. Posey reached base safely in his first six plate appearances and 10 of his first 11 at-bats against the Deacons. He was a perfect 3-for-3 in game one with a double and two home runs. Posey set a career-high with five runs scored on Friday while scoring the game-winning run in the top of the 11th in the series finale.

Senior Ryan Strauss earned his first career honor picking up wins against No. 13 Florida and No. 14 Virginia. Strauss made his first start against Florida in Jacksonville allowing just one run on four hits in the win. Pitched three innings in relief in game one of a doubleheader against Virginia as the Tampa, Fla., native did not allow a run or a hit striking out six of the 10 batters that he faced.

Early Recognition

The preseason accolades have poured in for the Seminoles in 2008. Junior Buster Posey and senior Jack Rye most recently were named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List for National Player of the Year. Since the inception of the Golden Spikes Award back in 1978, a Florida State student-athlete has received the award three times as Mike Fuentes (1981), Mike Loynd (1986) and J.D. Drew (1997) have all won the award. No school in America has produced more winners of this prestigious award than Florida State.

Posey has also received first team All-America honors by Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America and Rivals.com, while earning third team recognition from the NCBWA. Rye has been honored as a second team All-American by Collegiate Baseball and Rivals.com. Posey joins senior Ryan Strauss and sophomore Jason Stidham as a watch list member for the Brooks Wallace Award - an honor given to the nation's top collegiate player. Posey was recently named to the Johnny Bench Award watch list, an award he was named a finalist for a season ago. Strauss was also recognized on the watch list for the Roger Clemens Award. The right hander out of Tampa, Fla., was also named one of 30 nominees for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award presented to the top senior Division I college baseball player who excels both on and off the field. Just recently, Posey was named to the Dick Howser Trophy Watch List presented to the nation's top collegiate player.

Two Out Runs...Two Out Hits

Picking up where they left off a season ago, the Seminoles continue to hit well with two outs in an inning posting an average of .356 with 176 hits in 494 at-bats. Through the first 10 weeks, FSU has scored 132 runs on two outs which amount to 33.9% of the total run production in 2008. Senior Dennis Guinn leads the way with 22 two-out RBIs. Three Seminoles are hitting .400 or better with two outs while junior Buster Posey and freshman Luke Smierciak lead all hitters with averages at .522 and .500, respectively. Posey also leads the team with 24 two-out hits. In 2007, FSU hit .330 with two outs accumulating 243 hits in 736 two-out opportunities. Thirty-nine percent of the run production last season was scored with two-outs as the Seminoles scored 219 runs in 62 games.

Back-To-Back Jacks

Sophomore Jason Stidham and junior Buster Posey have been a solid one-two punch as the two, three hitters in the Seminole lineup. Twice this season the Seminole duo has hit back-to-back home runs. The first time occurred on March 28 against Wake Forest in the first inning, while the second time occurred on April 4 vs. Virginia in the eighth inning. Tyler Holt and Stidham provided the first back-to-back jacks of the season on opening day. The feat was performed against Duquesne in the fifth inning. Mike McGee and Stephen Cardullo added to the list in 2008 as both Seminole hitters went back-to-back to lead off the bottom of the fourth inning in Sunday's series finale versus Miami.

Wow...Now That's An Inning

After being shutout for seven innings against UNC Asheville in game two, Florida State erased a five-run deficit pushing across 10 runs in the bottom of the eighth to post its first come-from-behind victory of the season. The Seminoles sent 15 batters to the plate that inning registering five walks and seven hits including hitting for the cycle with two home runs, a triple, a double and three singles. The last time FSU scored 10 or more runs in a single inning came in the NCAA Regional elimination game against Stetson when the Seminoles put up 11 runs in the seventh in a 17-1 victory.

FSU Visits Hokie Spirit Memorial

The Florida State baseball team will pay respect to the lives lost during the tragic event that occurred on April 16, 2007 visiting the Hokie Spirit Memorial prior to the start of Friday's game against Virginia Tech. In honor of those lives lost, the FSU baseball team has been wearing a black patch on the left side of their ball caps and helmets and will continue to do so for the duration of the season. Today and everyday, we are all Hokies.
