## NOTING THE SEMINOLES

Florida State is ranked No. 1 by Collegiate Baseball for the sixth consecutive week. The Seminoles hold a 14-6 record while holding the top spot in the nation.

In the most played series in school history for both teams, Florida State heads south to face Miami for a three-game set. This weekend marks the 247th meeting between these two intra-state rivals as the Seminoles lead the all-time series 129-113-4. The two schools are deadlocked at 57-57-2 in games played at the University of Miami.

Florida State became the first team to reach the 30-win plateau in Division I this season. The Seminoles at 37-6 have the most wins and the highest winning percentage (.860) in the nation.

Bryan Henry was honored by the league office as the ACC Pitcher of the Week. Henry was masterful on the mound as he tied a season-high with eight innings allowing one run on four hits and eight strikeouts in FSU's 4-2 win over UNC.

Florida State leads the ACC in batting (.364) and fielding percentage (.974), while ranking fourth in the league in ERA at 3.23.

With 12 ACC games remaining, Florida State needs just two more wins to surpass last year's season total of 16 conference victories. Since joining the league in 1992, FSU is the only team in the ACC to post 14 or more league wins in each of the last 16 seasons.

**THE PROBABLE STARTERS FOR FLORIDA STATE**

**FRIDAY:** Senior **Bryan Henry** will make his 13th start of the season, all on Friday, as Florida State travels to face Miami for its third road conference series of the season. Henry is 10-0 on the year with an ERA of 2.24. He earned his fifth consecutive ACC victory last weekend beating No. 2 North Carolina as he pitched eight solid innings allowing a run on four hits. He struck out eight batters and walked two in handing UNC's Robert Woodard his first loss of the season and just his fourth career loss. Henry started the ball game setting down the first seven Tar Heels that he faced including three on strikeouts, two looking. He threw five innings in which he faced just three batters. The senior right hander has now posted at least seven or more strikeouts in eight of his last 12 starts this season and in seven of his last eight outings. Against Boston College, Henry also pitched eight innings allowing one run on four hits while striking out 10. He has allowed a run or less in eight of his 12 starts this season. Henry has pitched a season-high eight innings three times this season keeping Indiana scoreless on six hits, while giving up one run on four hits to both BC and UNC. He has worked three games this year where he has pitched at least six innings without issuing a free pass. Henry has made 24 career starts against league opponents posting a career record of 14-5 with an ERA of 2.64. He has registered 137 strikeouts against ACC teams and just 42 walks. In 2007, Henry is 5-0 in six ACC starts throwing 41 innings and posting an ERA of 2.41. His strikeout to walk ratio is 3.54 to 1 in league play this season. Henry is 1-1 in two career starts against Miami. He won his first start against the Hurricanes down in Coral Gables in 2005, while suffering a defeat at Mike Martin Field in 2006.

**SATURDAY:** Junior **Ryan Strauss** will look to make his 12th start of the season and his second start on Saturday against Miami. He has pitched at least six innings in nine of his 11 starts in 2007, while throwing into the seventh in four of his last seven outings. The Tampa, Fla., native set career-highs in innings pitched (8) and strikeouts (8) against Indiana. He threw seven innings in back-to-back league games earning victories over Wake Forest and Boston College and then returned home to pitch seven innings in a win over Virginia Tech. Strauss gave up just one run in his first two league games, before allowing four runs against Duke in an 8-5 victory. He held BC without a hit for the first six innings. Strauss is 8-1 on the year and has posted an ERA of 2.98 in 12 appearances. He has pitched two games in which he did not issue a walk. Last week against the Tar Heels, Strauss tied a season-low for innings pitched lasting just 3.2 innings. He set career-highes for runs allowed (5) and hits (10) in suffering his first loss of the season. Strauss got his first career win as a starter as he pitched five solid innings against Tennessee on opening weekend. This will be Strauss' seventh start against an ACC opponent and first career appearance against the Hurricanes. Strauss' first and only other Saturday start this season came against Siena, where he recorded a no decision after pitching five innings giving up three runs, all unearned, on five hits. The Seminoles won the game 8-3.

**SUNDAY:** TBA Possibles

\* **Michael Hyde** - Hyde has started 12 games for the Seminoles in 2007 and has posted an 8-2 record with an ERA of 2.69 - second lowest among starters. He started the season with eight straight victories, then dropped two in a row before recording back-to-back no decisions in his last two outings. He is tied for second on the team in victories (8) and in strikeouts with 49. Hyde has lost just three games in his last 23 starts dating back to last year. He has worked into the fifth inning in nine of his 12 starts including five games of pitching into the sixth. He worked a season-high 7.0 innings against Boston College.

\* **Bo O'Dell** - O'Dell has five starts to his credit in 2007, including a Sunday start against UNC Asheville back on February 11. The sophomore right hander is 3-1 on the year with a 4.91 ERA. O'Dell pitched a career-high six innings in a mid-week start against Jacksonville. He gave up just one run on five hits and struck out three for his third victory of the season. O'Dell has posted 24 strikeouts compared to just eight walks in 10 appearances this year.

\* **Caleb Graham** - Graham has made three starts on the season, all of them coming in mid-week match-ups. He holds a record of 1-2 with an ERA of 4.00. Graham pitched a career-high six innings in FSU's 6-0 win over North Florida. The sophomore right hander shut out the Ospreys for six innings allowing just two hits. Graham is limiting hitters to a .206 average in 27 innings of work. He has made 13 appearances on the year.

### MIAMI SERIES

In the most played series in school history for both teams, Florida State heads south to face Miami for a three-game set beginning Friday, April 27. This weekend marks the 247th meeting between these two intra-state rivals as the Seminoles lead the all-time series 129-113-4. The two schools are deadlocked at 57-57-2 in games played at the University of Miami. The Hurricanes have won four of the last six games in the series overall and four of the last six games played in Coral Gables. Since joining the ACC, Miami is 4-2 against Florida State taking 2-of-3 in both series in 2005 and 2006.

### THE HURRICANES IN 2007

Miami is coming off a sweep of Virginia Tech last weekend in Blacksburg, its first of the season. The Hurricanes have won four of seven ACC series to start 2007 and sit with a record of 11-10 in the league good for fourth overall in the Coastal Division. The Canes are 25-17 overall and 17-9 in games played inside Mark Light Field. Yonder Alonso has led the offensive charge for Miami this season as the sophomore first baseman is leading the team in hitting (.356), home runs (11) and RBI's (45). On the mound, the Hurricanes have posted a team ERA of 4.21 as eight different pitchers have started for Miami this year. Freshman southpaw Eric Erickson, who has started seven games in 2007, is the team leader in wins (5) and ERA (2.29).

### AGAINST THE HURRICANES

Brian Chambers is the only Seminole on the 2007 roster that has appeared in a game against the Hurricanes over the last three seasons. Jack Rye has handled Miami pitching pretty well over the last two years as he has posted an average of .389 (7-for-18) with four runs scored and six RBI's. Tony Thomas, Jr. is a career .250 hitter.

As a team, the Seminoles have posted an ERA of 2.94 despite maintaining a 2-4 record over the last two years. Bryan Henry is 1-1 as a starter. Travis Burge and Caleb Graham did not allow a run in three combined appearances a season ago.

### HENRY VS. THE CANES

On Friday night, senior Bryan Henry will be making his third career start against the Hurricanes at a place where he solidified his role in the starting rotation two years ago. In 2005, the Tallahassee, Fla., native, who had just three prior starts to his name, got his first start on the road in ACC play against Miami. He pitched eight innings and held the Hurricanes to just one run on four hits in a 13-1 FSU victory. He struck out four and walked none. The 12-run victory was the most lopsided win ever for the Seminoles at Miami tying the 1957 team, which defeated UM 15-3. Henry was the victim of an infield error in a 7-3 loss to Miami in Tallahassee

last year. The right hander went six innings allowing one earned run on six hits in the loss.

### FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY

Florida State is 15-3 in the ACC and has won all six, three-game series to start the 2007 season. The series against Miami is just the third three-game set on the road for the Seminoles this season. FSU is 4-2 away from home in 2007 collecting a pair of series victories over Duke and NC State. The Seminoles have posted series sweeps against Wake Forest, Boston College and Virginia Tech. The Seminoles lost at home for the first time in league play last Sunday to North Carolina and now stand with a record of 11-1 in Dick Howser Stadium. FSU started a season 9-0 at home for the fifth time overall and for the first time since 2002. In 2001 and 2002, the Seminoles went undefeated at home in conference play posting a perfect 12-0 record. This year Florida State won its first seven conference games before falling at Duke in game two of the series. It was the Seminoles' best start in ACC play since 1999 when the Garnet and Gold started 13-0. Since joining the ACC in 1992, FSU started league play winning its first six games just three times.

### HOME RUNS ON THE ROAD

Before Florida State's weekend series against Duke, the Seminoles had 12 home runs through the first 28 games. They left Durham with 21 round trippers in 2007. Yes, Seminole batters hit nine home runs vs. Duke, three in each series, including five by second baseman Tony Thomas, Jr. Thomas hit back-to-back homers in his first two at-bats in game one including the team's first lead off home run of the season. Tommy Oravetz hit his first collegiate homer, while Mark Hallberg hit his first round tripper as a Seminole. Fourteen of the 30 home runs hit by Florida State this season have come on the road including the nine hit against Duke. Three others have come on the road vs. the Gators including two in Gainesville and one in Jacksonville. The final two came against NC State in Raleigh.

### ACC ACCOLADES – PART VI

For the fourth week in a row and the sixth time this season a Seminole student-athlete was recognized by the conference office. Senior Bryan Henry became the first Florida State hurler to win Pitcher of the Week honors in 2007 after his masterful effort on the mound last Friday in a 4-2 Florida State victory over No. 2 UNC.

Henry matched his season-high in innings pitched for the third time this season with eight solid innings against UNC. He allowed just one run on four hits while striking out eight. Henry and the Seminoles handed UNC's Robert Woodard his first loss of the season and just his fourth loss in his career.

Henry joins Buster Posey (April 16), Brandon Reichert (April 9) and Tony Thomas, Jr., who has been named ACC Player of the Week three times in 2007 winning the award on February 12, March 5 and April 2.

### HENRY JOINS ELITE COMPANY

Bryan Henry collected his third career honor as ACC Pitcher of the Week with this week's announcement by the league office. He now becomes the third pitcher in FSU history to win ACC Pitcher of the Week honors at least three times joining Paul Wilson, who won the award a school record six times, and Mike Ziegler (3).

### WELCOME BACK LUKE

Luke Tucker made his first appearance of the season in game one against Virginia Tech in FSU's 14-1 victory. Tucker entered the game in the top of the seventh and was untouchable as he threw a scoreless inning issuing a walk, while striking out two. The senior right hander sat out the first half of the season after suffering an internal impingement to his right shoulder. Tucker found his way back to the mound after going through vigorous stretching programs to get his shoulder back into a routine of pitching everyday. He went back out on the mound in a mid-week contest against the Gators and got the Seminoles out of a bases loaded, two out jam in the seventh as he got Jared Kubin looking on strikes. In his third game of the season, he pitched 1.1 innings in game three against UNC and once again looked impressive. He faced five batters and allowed just one hit.

### INHERITING RUNNERS

Junior transfer Danny Rosen has provided the Seminole bullpen with a huge lift since arriving on campus as a walk-on this season. Rosen leads the team with seven saves in eight opportunities, but more importantly he has pitched

well in tough situations. In six of his 19 appearances, Rosen has inherited 13 runners allowing only two to score. Those two runs that scored came in his first appearance as a Seminole and in the second game of the season against Tennessee. Senior Brian Chambers has been just as effective in the same situation as he has inherited 13 runners on seven separate occasions allowing four to score.

### NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT

Tony Thomas, Jr. is having a season that only few can ever dream of as the Seminole second baseman ranks in the top 10 nationally in several statistical offensive categories. Heading into this weekend's game against Miami, Thomas ranks in five national categories including doubles per game, runs per game, batting average, slugging percentage and triples per game. Bryan Henry has the second most wins in the nation with 10, while he ranks 23rd with 80 strikeouts. Danny Rosen's 7 saves is good for 35th nationally.

### ON DECK FOR THE SEMINOLES

Florida State will have its work cut out with only 13 games remaining on the 2007 schedule. Of the five teams that are left, three of the remaining schools advanced to the College World Series a season ago including Miami (road), Clemson (home) and Georgia Tech (road). Three of the four schools have an RPI that rank in the top 40 including Clemson at No. 23.

### NO. 1 IN THE NATION

For the sixth straight week, Florida State remained No. 1 in the *Collegiate Baseball* top 25 poll. The Seminoles earned their first No. 1 ranking of the season as released by *Collegiate Baseball* on Monday, March 19. The Seminoles, who are coming off a series victory over No. 2 North Carolina last weekend, sit at 15-3 in the conference and 37-6 overall. FSU has posted a record of 14-6 while being ranked No. 1 in the nation. Florida State last held the top spot in the nation for six weeks starting on March 14, 2006.

### FIFTH PLACE ALL-TIME FOR #11

Chalk up yet another milestone for Florida State head coach Mike Martin. With the Seminoles 14-6 win over Florida in Gainesville back on February 20, Martin moved into sole possession of fifth place on the NCAA all-time wins list with 1,445 victories. Martin passed former High Point and Virginia Tech head coach Chuck Hartman on the list, who retired after 46 years as a collegiate head coach. Martin currently sits with 1,472 career victories.

### HE GOT IT

Mike Martin crossed another milestone off his to do list with his team's sweep of Minnesota last season. With the 12-4 win in the second game of the series, Martin became only the eighth coach in NCAA history to reach the 1,400 win-plateau and only the sixth active coach to do so. Of the eight coaches with 1,400 wins Martin has the fourth-best winning percentage and the second-highest winning percentage among active Division I coaches. Of the top 10 coaches across all divisions for wins, only four coaches have a winning percentage above .700 and Mike Martin is among that group. Martin passed another legend with FSU's 14-6 win over Florida in Gainesville as he moved into fifth place all-time passing former High Point and Virginia Tech head skipper Chuck Hartman. Overall, Martin ranks third in the DI 1,400-win club behind Stephenson and former Texas coaching legend Cliff Gustafson for winning percentage.

### 10 WINS FOR HENRY

With Friday's nights 4-2 victory over No. 2 North Carolina, senior Bryan Henry moved to 10-0 on the season in 12 starts. Henry becomes the 27th pitcher to reach the 10-win plateau in a single season since Florida State joined the ACC back in 1992. The win was also career victory No. 28 for Henry moving him into a tie with Jeff Gray (1981-84) for 10th place all-time on the career wins list at Florida State.

### BEST START IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Florida State's 23-0 start was by far the best start in school history, surpassing the team's previous best start by eight games. The Seminoles have started a season with at least a 10-0 record seven times in the program's 60-year history. In the second game against Siena, the Seminoles moved to 16-0 with an 8-3 victory over the Saints, breaking the school record for the best start ever. In 1975, under then head coach Woody Woodward, Florida State began the year 15-0. They finished the '75 season with a mark of 49-10 advancing to the College World Series and finishing the season with a ranking as high as No. 7 by Collegiate Baseball. 1975 also marked the first year as an assistant coach for current head coach Mike Martin. This is the best start in 28 seasons under the legendary ball coach.

### EARLY NOLE GETS THE 'W'

Florida State has managed to put runs on the scoreboard in the early goings of the 2007 season outscoring the opposition 159-66 in the first three innings. The Seminoles have scored 50 or more runs in five innings this season, including the first (55), third (59), sixth (57), seventh (56) and eighth (55) innings. Florida State has scored in every inning that they have seen an at-bat this season including a run in extra innings.

### RUNSA-PLENTY

The Seminoles have scored 400 runs through 43 games, an average of 9.3 runs per game. That run production through 43 games is the eighth highest total to start a season in the 60 years of Seminole baseball. The school record for most runs scored in a season is 752 set in 1982. That year the Seminoles advanced to the NCAA Regionals playing 74 games averaging 10.2 runs per game. Below is a listing of the top five seasons through the first 43 games in Seminole baseball history:

### RUNS IN BUNCHES

Sure the Seminoles have scored 400 runs through 43 games this season, the eighth highest 43-game total to start a season in school history, but what is impressive is how they are scoring those runs. The Seminoles have posted multiple runs in 99 innings this season and have scored at least one run in 166 of the 358 innings they have played.

### TWO OUT RUNS

When it comes to two out run production Florida State has produced so far this season. Through 43 games this season, the Seminoles have scored 162 runs with two outs. That's 40.5% of their run production in 2007 coming with two outs. FSU scored a season-high 11 runs with two outs twice. First coming in the series finale against UNC Asheville, a game the Seminoles won 15-1. The Garnet and Gold then scored 11 runs on two outs in a 15-3 victory over Duke in game one of the series in Durham. Against the Gators, FSU scored nine runs on two outs including four in the first two innings. The Seminoles scored another nine runs on two outs in a 10-2 win over Appalachian State in game two of that series. In the Seminoles first ACC series in 2007, Florida State outscored Wake Forest 22-10 as 12 of the 22 runs recorded came on two outs.

### AND TWO OUT HITS

Yes, you can say the Seminoles are off to their best start in school history and you can point to a lot of reasons why this has happened. But probably the most overlooked stat is what the team is doing with two outs in an inning. FSU is batting .340 as a team posting 173 hits in 509 two-out opportunities. Five Seminoles are batting .400 or better, eight have registered 10 or more hits and seven have tallied 10 or more RBI's. Junior Jack Rye leads the team with two out RBI's as 27 of his team leading 45 runs batted in have come in that situation. Rye also leads the team with 23 two-out hits.

### DOUBLE-DIGIT RUNS & HITS

The Seminoles got off to a hot start in 2007 as they scored double-digit runs in 13 of their first 17 games. FSU had a string of eight straight double-digit run games earlier this year. In the 60-year history of Seminole baseball, Florida State registered double-digit runs in eight consecutive games just twice, the last time coming in 2003 when the Seminoles strung together nine straight games of 10+ runs. FSU has posted 18 double-digit run games this year.

FSU has also posted double-digit hits in 36 of its 43 games played so far including a streak of 16 straight at one point in the season. Since 1996, the Seminoles have had a streak of eight or more double-digit hit games 10 times, including a more recent streak of 11 games in a row which came to an end in game two vs. UNC. This year's 16 straight double-digit hit games are the longest of record dating back to 1996. The previous best was 10 straight posted back in 2003.

### HOLD IT RIGHT THERE

Florida State is leading the ACC in limiting the opposition to the fewest number of stolen bases attempted in 2007. Opponents have attempted a league low 24 stolen bases against the Seminoles and catcher Buster Posey is a big reason for that. Through 43 games, Posey is throwing out 39.1% of attempted base stealers. He has had only 24 stolen base attempts against him all season. Posey has also picked off a pair of base runners on the season. To put the number in perspective, North Carolina is second in the ACC with 44 attempted stolen bases.

### FROM CATCHER TO PITCHER

Sophomore Buster Posey made his much anticipated pitching debut at Florida State in the third game of the series against UNC Asheville. Posey went from behind the plate to the mound in the top of the fifth and pitched a scoreless inning. The Leesburg, Ga., native induced a pair of

### 30 WINS AND COUNTING

With a 10-4 win over NC State in game one last Friday, Florida State became the first team to reach the 30-win plateau in Division I this season. The Seminoles at 37-6 have the most wins and the highest winning percentage (.860) in the nation. Vanderbilt has the second most wins in the nation with 35.

### LIMITING THE ERRORS

At one stretch during the season, Florida State went six games without committing an error, a span covering 63.2 consecutive innings. It is the longest errorless streak since 1993 when FSU went five straight games without posting an error. FSU also started the season with a streak of 36 consecutive innings without committing an error.

Through 43 games this season, FSU has posted a fielding percentage of .974 committing 42 errors in 1,644 total chances. The 2005 and 2006 squads rank as two of the top five best defensive teams in FSU history posting a .967 fielding percentage in each of the last two years. Here is a look at the top five fielding teams in school history dating back to 1973:

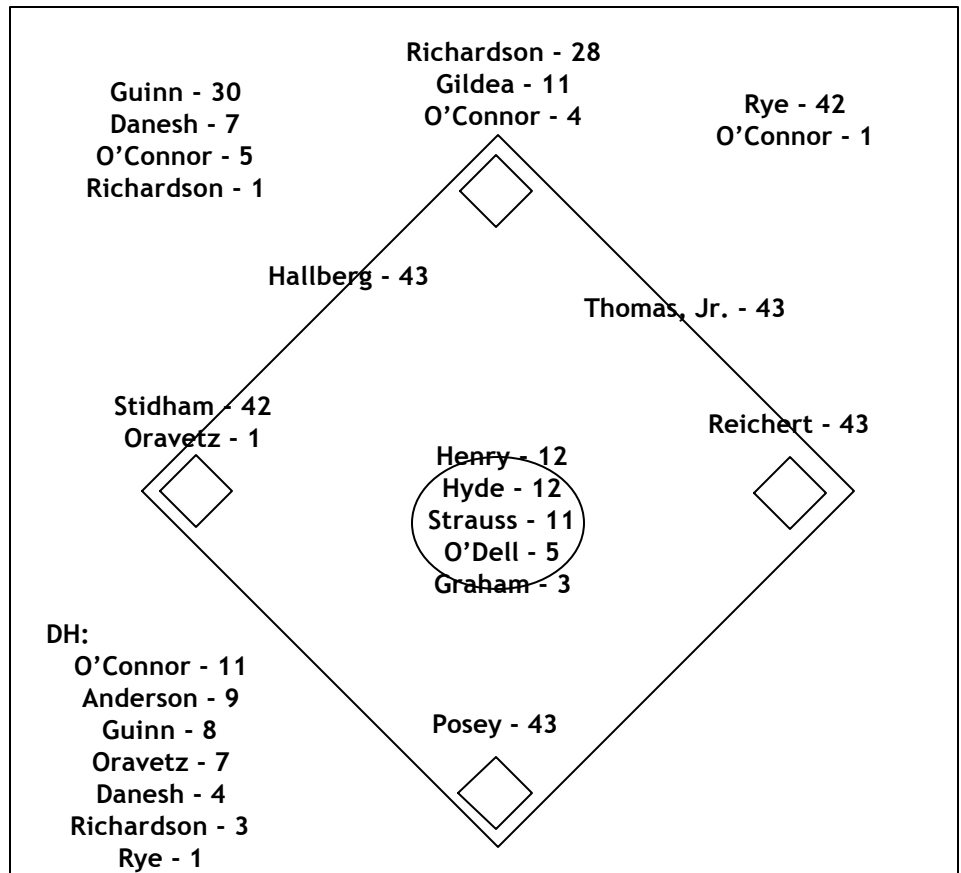
### SEEING DOUBLE

Florida State has hit 122 doubles through 43 games this season, that's an average of 2.84 doubles per game. If the Seminoles continue on their current doubles pace, they would hit 156 doubles, falling slightly off pace of the school record of 182 double hit in 72 games back in 1990, an average of 2.5 doubles per game that year.

### PERFECT FEBRUARY

Florida State posted a perfect 14-0 record in the month of February for just the fifth time in the 60-year history of Seminole baseball. It was the first time the Seminoles went undefeated in the first month of the season since 1979 when the Garnet and Gold went 2-0. The previous record for the best undefeated mark in the month of February was 5-0 registered back in 1976.

### ONE IS A LONELY NUMBER

Florida State was the last remaining unbeaten team in Division I baseball until a March 21 tilt against Jacksonville. JU handed the Seminoles their first loss of the season, snapping FSU's 23-game winning streak to start the season.

### WALK-OFF JACK

FSU played its first extra inning game of the season on March 16 against Wake Forest and came through with a victory defeating the Deacs 7-6 in 11 innings. Junior Jack Rye, who has come through in clutch situations for the Seminoles this season, provided FSU with its first walk-off hit of the season singling home the winning run with two outs in the bottom of the 11th. Rye registered his third RBI of the game as his single glanced off the glove of the leaping second baseman. The ball trickled away just enough to allow Rye to reach first and pinch runner Ryan Strauss to score from third for the game-winner.

### FSU IN THE ACC

Heading into the mid-week contest against the Gators, Florida State ranked as the top hitting and fielding team in the conference. FSU has posted an average of .364 through 43 games, while registering a team fielding percentage of .974. The Seminoles are fourth in the ACC in team ERA at 3.23.

Tony Thomas, Jr. leads the league in seven offensive categories, while ranking in the top 10 in three others including batting average (.453), stolen bases per game (4th) and home runs per game (10th). Listed below are the following categories that Thomas leads the ACC in:

### FIRST COLLEGIATE HOME RUNS

D'Vontrey Richardson and Jason Stidham each hit their first collegiate home run against the Florida Gators in the Seminoles 14-6 victory in Gainesville. Stidham connected on a solo shot in the top of the fifth off reliever Josh Edmondson. The freshman third baseman sent a 1-2 offering over the wall in right for his first digger of the season. Richardson hit a three-run shot in the top of the eighth to put a stamp on the Seminole victory. The freshman center fielder sent a rocket shot that cleared the bleacher seats in left for his first career round tripper.

Stephen Cardullo got in on the action as he hit his first collegiate home run against North Florida. The freshman from Coral Springs, Fla., took the first offering he saw from Osprey reliever Paul Morales and sent the ball over the wall in left center for a three-run shot.

Tommy Oravetz connected on his first collegiate home run in Florida State's series victory over Duke. Led off the ninth inning in game two with a solo shot over the wall in right center.

Ohmed Danesh registered his first collegiate home run in game two against North Carolina. Danesh blasted a solo shot over the right field to lead off the Seminole fourth.
